## COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

20	The Irish had 20 alumni laced up their skates at NHL Training Camp in September. The individuals with Notre Dame ties included Alex Steeves and Andrew Peeke (BOS), Graham Slaggert (BUF), Jake Evans and Nate Clurman (MTL), Anders Lee and Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Dennis Gilbert (PHI), Bryan Rust and Cal Burke (PIT), Nick Leivermann (WSH), Landon Slaggert (CHI), T.J. Tynan (COL), Vinnie Hinostroza and Cal Petersen (MIN), Ryder Rolston and Spencer Stastney (NSH), Ian Cole (UTAH), Owen Say (CGY), and Justin Janick (SEA). Further, 10 Irish alumni saw their names featured on opening night rosters when the NHL season commenced.
17	Seventeen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish. Current Irish siblings include <b>Henry</b> and <b>Danny Nelson</b> while <b>Carter Slaggert's</b> (brothers Graham '22 and Landon '24) brothers previously suited up for the Irish.
10	The Irish had 10 program alums on NHL Opening Night rosters when the season started up last month. Those featured on NHL rosters so far this season include Ian Cole (UTAH), Jake Evans (MTL), Dennis Gilbert (OTT), Vinnie Hinostroza (FLA), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Andrew Peeke (BOS), Bryan Rust (PIT), Landon Slaggert (CHI), and Spencer Stastney (NSH).
8	The Irish have eight NHL draft picks on their roster this season and have featured at least one individual selected in the NHL Entry Draft for 23 consecutive seasons.
7	Fresh Faces: Notre Dame's roster features seven freshman in 2025-26, including five forwards and two defensemen and represent three countries in USA (Drew Mackie, Dasha Oliver, Charlie Pardue), Canada (Cole Brown, Caeden Carlisle, Pano Fimis) and China (Will Belle).
5	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Brock Sheahan was introduced as the fifth head coach in program history on March 17, 2025. The Notre Dame alum served two seasons as associate head coach alongside former Irish head coach Jeff Jackson, before taking over the program in the spring.
5	The Irish announced ahead of the season opener that five upperclassmen would serve as team captains this year. Senior Michael Mastrodomenico and junior Danny Nelson were voted co-captains by their peers while senior Axel Kumlin alongside juniors Paul Fischer and Cole Knuble were appointed alternate captains.
3	Three ND hockey players represented the Irish on the international stage over the holiday break. Junior forwards Cole Knuble and Danny Nelson were added to the U.S. Collegiate Selects Team competed at the Spengler Cup in Davos, Switzerland over the holidays while Nicholas Kempf was named a goaltender for Team USA at the 2026 World Junior Championships. A pair of Irish support staffers are also a part of that Team USA squad in Jessica Thibault (Director of Hockey Operations) and Patrick Dooley (Equipment Manager).
3	Two new faces joined the Irish coaching staff during the offseason as Mike Garman (associate head coach) and Andrew Oglevie (assistant coach) rounded out Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Brock Sheahan's staff. On October 27, Sheahan announced Tristan Musser as his newest assistant coach following the departure of Ralph M. DiVietro Memorial Associate Hockey Coach Andy Slaggert. Musser began his responsibilities with the team on Saturday, Nov. 1.
1	The 2025-26 season marks the first in Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Brock Sheahan's career.

## NOTES

### QUICK HITS

- The Irish entered a new era in 2025-26 as Brock Sheahan ('08) took over as Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach of his alma mater, becoming the fifth head coach in the program's modern history.
- Sheahan made his NCAA head coaching debut on Oct. 10 when the Irish took on the Sun Devils in game one of the Ice Breaker Tournament in Tempe, Arizona. Despite putting up 50 shots on goal in the opener, the Irish were unable to defeat the 15th-ranked Arizona State squad, and hosts of the tournament.
- The Irish recorded their first win of the season, and the first of Coach Sheahan's career, in their home-opener against St. Lawrence as they ran up eight goals on the visiting Saints. Notre Dame finished the home-opening weekend outscoring their opponent 11-2, including a 26-save shutout performance by Nicholas Kempf in goal. After allowing his first two shots faced in Thursday evening, Kempf proceeded to stop 45 consecutive shots over the two-game series to improve his season record to 2-2-0 between the pipes. The 3-0 blanking of the Saints in game two was the first collegiate shutout of sophomore netminder Nicholas Kempf's career.
- The Irish concluded their 2025-26 home slate with an overtime victory against then-fifth ranked Penn State on Saturday, February 28. The victory marked Coach Sheahan's first career win over a ranked opponent.
- A pair of senior night honorees connected on Saturday's game-winning goal against the Nittany Lions when senior Axel Kumlin forced a turnover with the back pressure to get Sutter Muzzatti the puck. Muzzatti posted up with the rubber to the right of the net and fed a pass back over to Kumlin who buried his shot for the 4-3 final. The win marked the team's first overtime win since January 2025 at Minnesota. The Irish were 0-2-5 previously in extra time this season.
- The Irish closed out the regular season with a pair of overtime victories at Ohio State, March 5-6, marking the first time in program history the team has won three consecutive games in overtime. The feat also marks the first time a team in the Big Ten Conference has needed extra time for three consecutive wins since the foundation of the league in 2013-14.
- Evan Werner's team-best 17th goal of the season gave the Irish the win in game one of the series at Ohio State before Pano Fimis' second collegiate game-winning tally completed the sweep Friday night. The rookie, Fimis, is now tied with Danny Nelson for game-winning goals this season.
- Junior defenseman got the game to overtime Friday with a last second shot on net with the puck crossing the goal line with 0.1 seconds left in regulation to make it 3-3. The goal marked the latest game-tying goal in program history.
- Thus far, six individuals have eclipsed the 20-point mark, while three skaters broke the 30-point mark in the final regular season series of the year. Evan Werner's four-point

night Thursday at Ohio State gives him 33 on the year (17-16-33) meanwhile Sutter Muzzatti ranks second with 32 (13-19-32). Cole Knuble's team-leading 22 assists, along with his nine goals, gives him 31 on the season - marking his second consecutive 30+ point season in an Irish sweater (9-22-31).

- Danny Nelson helped his team to the win Saturday against the Nittany Lions to close out the home slate with a pair of goals to put the Irish ahead in regulation throughout the night. After adding in his assist in Friday's tie, the junior captain was named Big Ten Second Star of the Week for his 200-foot game.
- Saturday's game at BGSU saw Nicholas Kempf record a career-high 48 saves in the 2-2 tie, excluding the additional 8 stops made in the shootout. In overtime inside Slater Family Ice Arena, Kempf turned aside all nine shots faced to keep the scoreboard even at the end of 65 minutes. He finished the weekend series with 76 official saves en route to the pair of ties against the Falcons.
- The current Irish roster features eight NHL draft picks with Will Belle's selection by the Toronto Maple Leafs in the 2025 NHL Entry Draft marking the 99th individual in program history to be drafted.
- Other draftees include Brennan Ali (DET '22), Danny Nelson (NYI '23), Cole Knuble (PHI '23), Paul Fischer (STL/EDM '23), Sutter Muzzatti (NSH '23), Cole Brown (NJD '23), and Nicholas Kempf (WSH '24).

**THANK YOU, SENIORS**

- Prior to their home finale with Penn State, the Irish honored the six members of their graduating student-athletes, three student managers and their radio play-by-play in an on-ice ceremony.
- Niko Jovanovic, Michael Mastrodomenico and Jack Williams closed out their collegiate careers after four seasons in an Irish sweater. Axel Kumlin joined his teammates in the senior class having spent the past two seasons in South Bend.
- Sutter Muzzatti and Luke Pearson joined the Irish prior to the start of the 2025-26 season for their graduate seasons.
- Muzzatti and Kumlin sent the graduating class out of Compton Family Ice Arena in style, connecting on the game-winner just 47 seconds into overtime to secure the victory for the Irish and close out the home season slate on a high note.

**NOTRE DAME VS. MICHIGAN**

- A storied rivalry continues this week when Notre Dame and Michigan clash in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals. The Irish trail the all-time series between the two historic programs, 77-96-6.
- Wednesday's matchup will mark the 176 meeting between these two teams, having previously met four times during the regular season.
- The Wolverines took the season series by a 4-0 margin, including one overtime win in South Bend.
- In those four games earlier in the season, junior forward and team captain Danny Nelson led the team in points with five (2-3-5) over the course of four games played.
- Three individuals, including Nelson, boast multiple goals against the Wolverines thus far in the 2025-26 season. Fellow juniors Brennan Ali and Evan Werner join their captain with two goals a piece.
- Freshman Caeden Carlisle net his first collegiate goal in the last meeting between the two teams, finding the back of the net off a feed from Jayden Davis at 17:33 of the second period. Davis had found twine earlier in the contest, knotting it up 1-1 at 7:19 of the first, to secure his first goal of the year.
- In just his second game played all year, Niko Jovanovic gave the Irish a goal in game one of the series in Ann Arbor in early January. It was his first of the year.
- Registering two apples in the series opener against the Wolverines, freshman Pano Fimis boasted his first multi-point game. He now holds 17 points on the year and ranks second on the team among all rookies (6-11-17).
- Dashel Oliver's two assists in game two at Michigan on Jan. 10 marked the freshman's

- Fellow freshman Drew Mackie recorded his first collegiate point against the Wolverines, picking up an assist in game one of the series at Michigan.

## INTERNATIONAL IRISH

- A handful of Irish icers spent the holiday break active on the international stage as Nicholas Kempf was named to Team USA's World Junior Championships team in Minnesota while Cole Knuble and Danny Nelson were tabbed to compete at the Spengler Cup in Davos, Switzerland.
- A pair of Irish staffers were also selected to the USA Hockey U20 team ahead of the WJC held in Minnesota as Jessica Thibault (Director of Hockey Operations) and Pat Dooley (Equipment Manager) were both asked to serve on staff for Team USA.
- Kempf made his first official start for the U20 team in a 2-1 victory over Switzerland on Dec. 27. The sophomore netminder stopped 16 shots in the contest to help his squad improve to an undefeated 3-0-0 record through the preliminary stage of competition. Against Finland in the Quarterfinals, he stopped 21 shots faced, as the team ultimately fell in overtime to the Finns.
- Across the pond, Knuble and Nelson helped their U.S. Collegiate Selects team to a Cattini Group win and spot in the Spengler Cup finals.
- Nelson recorded an assist on the game-winning goal in the team's semifinals 5-3 victory over Sparta Praha to advance to the championship.
- The U.S. Collegiate Selects team finished runners-up at their first Spengler Cup appearance. Nelson and Knuble both registered points in the tournament as Cole added an assist to his count in the Spengler Cup Final (Dec. 31).
- A pair of Irish alums are headed abroad this month as they participate in the 2026 Olympic Winter Games in Milan, Italy. John Wroblewski and Josh Sciba were selected to serve on the Team USA coaching staff for the women's ice hockey team later in February. Wroblewski ('03) serves as head coach of the women's team and Sciba ('07) was named an assistant. The pair have served on the coaching staff at four IIHF Women's World Championships previously, twice winning gold while adding a pair of silvers to their resume as well.
- Their time in Milan came to an end Thursday with Team USA clinching gold in a thrilling overtime victory over Canada. The duo led the women's team on a historic run, including setting a record for shutout minutes and outscoring their opponents 33-2 en route to the gold medal finish.

- After tallying his third four-point game of the season on Thursday night at Ohio State, Evan Werner's 33 points continues to pace all Irish skaters. A career year for the junior, Werner boasts a team-high 17 goals and adds 16 assists to his count which are his best marks collegiately in both categories.
- Picking up an assist on the game-tying goal at the buzzer in the regular season finale, Cole Knuble owns 22 apples on the season which leads the team. Additionally, he picked up his ninth goal of the season in that contest and boasts 31 on the year which

- A four-point weekend for graduate forward Sutter Muzzatti, including three points in game one at Ohio State, he sits second on the team in points with 32.
- Danny Nelson gave the Irish the 2-1 lead with six ticks remaining in the first period of game two against the Nittany Lions after drawing a penalty with less than 30 seconds to play in the frame. The goal marked the captain's seventh of the season on the man-advantage which leads the team.
- His seven goals on the powerplay rank 10th individually in the country and fourth among all Big Ten skaters.
- The Irish continue to rank among the nation's best on the powerplay, coming in fifth nationally with a 27.5-percent success rate. The Irish have tallied 30 powerplay goals this season, led by Danny Nelson's seven.
- Their 30 powerplay goals ranks among the best in the nation, coming in 10th overall and fourth in the conference.
- At center, Danny Nelson's 357 wins in the circle ranks 18th nationally. He finished the weekend series with Penn State posting 33 wins at the faceoff dot which ranked second among all centers last week while leading his team to a 65.6-percent clip in game two with the Nittany Lions.
- The team's first three centers all rank among the top-75 collegiately in faceoff wins, including Nelson.
- Sutter Muzzatti, who mans the second line, eclipsed 300 faceoff wins in the regular season finale at Ohio State. The graduate forward boasts 303 on the year for 47th overall.
- Freshman Pano Fimis' 264 wins in the circle ranks 74th nationally and 10th among all Big Ten centers.

**2025-26 CAPTAINS**

- The Irish announced five leaders ahead of the 2025-26 season, including co-captains and a trio of alternates.
- Senior defenseman Michael Mastrodomenico and junior forward Danny Nelson will share captain responsibilities this season after being appointed by their teammates to the role.
- Axel Kumlin, Paul Fischer and Cole Knuble will serve as the three alternate captains this season, as voted on by the team.
- The leadership group to don letters in 2025-26 have combined to skate in 329 games in their Irish careers and amassed 189 points.

**NEW FACES**

- The Irish bench has a new look this season as Brock Sheahan takes over at the helm after serving two years as an Associate Head Coach for the Irish.
- The Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach was elevated to his new role on March 17, 2025 and becomes the fifth head coach in program history.
- Sheahan is a 2008 graduate of the University of Notre Dame, having competed for the Irish from 2004-08. The defenseman appeared in 161 career games for the Irish and served as an alternate captain in his senior season.
- The Irish alum was a member of the team's first-ever NCAA Frozen Four and National Championship appearances, helping lead the team to the 2008 NCAA Frozen Four.
- Sheahan added two new additions to his coaching staff ahead of his first season at the head of the bench, retaining Ralph M. DiVietro Memorial Associate Hockey Coach Andy Slaggert and adding Associate Head Coach Mike Garman and Assistant Coach Andrew Oglevie in the off season.
- Sheahan and Garman coached together for multiple years in the USHL while on staff with the Chicago Steel. Upon Sheahan's departure to the Chicago Wolves of the American Hockey League in 2022, Garman took over as head coach of the Steel.
- Oglevie returns to his alma mater after two years as an assistant coach at Colorado College. He previously served as a volunteer assistant coach for the Irish during the

2022-23 campaign and will have an emphasis on player development in his new role with the Irish.

- On October 27, Sheahan announced the addition of Tristan Musser as assistant coach to replace outgoing Slaggert upon his retirement from the University on October 31 to pursue an opportunity in professional hockey.
- Musser joins the Irish after a stint in Buffalo serving five years as a scout for the Sabres organization.
- He is reunited with Sheahan and Garman who all coached together with the Chicago Steel from 2018-20, winning the Anderson Cup in 2019-20, awarded to the USHL's regular season champions.
- The Irish welcome 10 new faces to the roster in 2025-26, including seven freshmen and three transfers ahead of the new year. The freshmen hail from three countries (USA, Canada and China), three states (Alaska, Illinois and Indiana) and two provinces (Alberta and Ontario).
- Caeden Carlisle and Drew Mackie anchor the blueline for the freshmen class while five forwards join the team in Will Belle, Cole Brown, Pano Fimis, Dasha Oliver and Charlie Pardue.
- In addition to the rookie class, a pair of graduate students and a junior join the program for 2025-26. Graduate transfers include Sutter Muzzatti (forward; RPI) and Luke Pearson (goaltender; Yale) while Evan Werner (forward; Michigan) joins the Irish junior class after a season at Big Ten foe Michigan.

**NHL NOTES**

- When opening night rosters were submitted by all 32 NHL teams, the Irish were highlighted on nine, including Anders Lee and Kyle Palmieri both on the New York Islanders.
- In total, 10 former Irish student-athletes were named to their respective teams' opening night rosters.
- Those alumni include Ian Cole (Utah), Jake Evans (MTL), Dennis Gilbert (PHI), Vinnie Hinostroza (FLA), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Andrew Peeke (BOS), Bryan Rust (PIT), Landon Slaggert (CHI) and Spencer Stastney (NSH).
- Following a mid-November trade, Gilbert returned to Ottawa where he spent part of the 2024-25 season.
- The Irish had 20 alumni invited to NHL training camps in September, including two individuals from the 2024-25 roster.
- Notre Dame's captain a season ago, Justin Janicke made his training camp debut with the Seattle Kraken last month after signing his first professional contract with the Coachella Valley Firebirds of the American Hockey League.
- Netminder Owen Say made his NHL training camp debut with the Calgary Flames in September after signing an entry level contract with the NHL club last March.
- The 20 Irish alums represent 14 different NHL teams, with the Boston Bruins, Montreal Canadiens, New York Islanders, Pittsburgh Penguins, Minnesota Wild, and Nashville Predators all boasting multiple individuals with Irish ties.
- Alex Steeves, who spent the past four seasons in the Toronto Maple Leafs' organization, joins former teammate Andrew Peeke in Boston for 2025 training camp.
- Graham Slaggert remains in the Buffalo Sabres' organization after posting 12 goals and 12 assists for 24 points last season with their AHL affiliate, the Rochester Americans.
- Less than a year after making his NHL debut, former Irish captain Nate Clurman joins another former captain in Montreal, skating alongside Jake Evans the the Canadiens' camp this September.
- The New York Islanders once again boast a pair of Irish alums in Anders Lee and Kyle Palmieri, with both expected to make the team's opening night roster. Lee heads into his eighth season as the Isles' captain in 2025-26.
- Dennis Gilbert made his debut at the Philadelphia Flyers' training camp after an off season signing with the organization. Across the state, Cal Burke and Bryan Rust were both in attendance for the Pittsburgh Penguins' training camp.

- Recent Irish alumni, Ryder Rolston and Spencer Stastney were both in Nashville training with the Predators at camp in late September.

## FAMILY TIES

- The 2025-26 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world. One set of brothers is currently on the roster, in Henry and Danny Nelson, while one other current player had brothers suit up for the Irish in the past. Carter Slaggert's two older brothers Graham and Landon played their collegiate careers with the Irish and both now compete at the professional level.
- The Irish have had 17 sets of brothers lace up their skates together for the Irish, including two sets of brothers in 2025-26. Henry and Danny Nelson are in their third year as teammates at Notre Dame while Carter Slaggert appeared alongside his older brother Landon during his freshman season.
- Slaggert joined the Irish in 2023-24, becoming the third Slaggert brother to appear in a game for the Irish. Oldest brother Graham currently plays in the Buffalo Sabres organization and skated two years alongside middle brother Landon before graduating. Landon was a 2024 graduate of Notre Dame and made his NHL debut for the Chicago Blackhawks in March 2024.
- The Slaggers are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and Ralph M. DiVietro Memorial Associate Hockey Coach Andy Slaggert.
- Sophomore Paul Fischer is the nephew of Mike Gearen, a member of the first varsity hockey team at Notre Dame. Fischer honors his uncle by wearing his number during his career with the Irish, No. 16.
- Sophomore forward Cole Knuble is the son of former NHLer Mike Knuble, who spent 16 seasons in the NHL, including stints with Detroit, New York Rangers, Boston, Philadelphia and Washington. In 2023 Cole was drafted by the Flyers' organization where his father played during his early childhood. He wears No. 22 with the Irish to honor his father.
- Graduate student Sutter Muzzatti's father was a goaltender and skated in 62 career NHL games, appearing in games for the Calgary Flames, Hartford Whalers, New York Rangers, and San Jose Sharks. He also spent time in the IHL, AHL, DEL, SM-liiga, UHL and Italy, marking a professional hockey career spanning 18 seasons. Muzzatti's father, Jason, also represented both Team Canada and Team Italy on the international stage, including four trips to the World Championships with Team Italy as well as the 2006 Olympic Games in Turin, Italy.
- Irish goaltender Luke Pearson, a graduate transfer in 2025-26, hails from a NHL bloodline as well as his dad spent six seasons in the league and played 10 seasons of professional hockey following a three year OHL career.
- Pearson's father Rob played forward for NHL teams such as the Toronto Maple Leafs, Washington Capitals, and St. Louis Blues, appearing in 269 NHL contests and amassing 56 goals and 54 assists.
- Maddox Fleming's two sisters will lace up their skates this season for their respective NCAA Division I programs. Sister Delaney is a junior on the Cornell University women's hockey team

**CATALINO FAMILY HEAD HOCKEY COACH**  
**BROCK SHEAHAN**



- The 2025–26 season marks University of Notre Dame Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Brock Sheahan’s first season at the helm of the Irish bench.
- Sheahan spent the past two seasons serving as an associate head coach for his alma mater, working extensively with the defensive corp.
- Sheahan is a 2008 graduate of the University of Notre Dame and spent four years at the blue line for the Fighting Irish.
- During his tenure on the ice with the Irish, Sheahan helped lead his team to the program’s first-ever Frozen Four appearance and National Championship berth.
- In four seasons with the Irish, Sheahan appeared in 161 games and tallied 33 points off four goals and 29 assists.
- He served as an alternate captain during his senior season and was named the William Donald Nyrop Award winner, presented annually to the team’s top defenseman.
- Following his time as a student-athlete at Notre Dame, Sheahan went on to play professional hockey for five seasons before turning to coaching.
- Sheahan had professional hockey stints across North America and Europe, including time with the Wheeling Nailers (ECHL), Cincinnati Cyclones (ECHL), Houston Aeros (AHL), Ontario Reign (ECHL) and the SC Riessersee in Germany.
- After retiring as a player, Sheahan turned to coaching and got his start as a volunteer assistant coach in 2013–14 with the Irish.
- Following his one-year stint at his alma mater, Sheahan joined the coaching staff at Holy Cross, serving two years as an assistant coach before being promoted to Associate Head Coach prior to the 2016–17 season.
- In 2018–19 Sheahan took the associate head coaching position with the Chicago Steel of the USHL before taking over as head coach in 2019–20, a position he would hold for four years.
- During his time in the USHL, the Steel won two Anderson Cups, awarded to the league’s regular season champions (2019–20 & 2020–21), as well as capturing the 2021 Clark Cup championship.
- Assuming the role of head coach midway through the 2019–20 season, Sheahan posted a 100–27–12–3 regular season record at the helm of the Steel while adding an 8–3 record in the Clark Cup Playoffs.
- With the Steel, Sheahan was a key component in the development

- of 28 NHL Draftees with five first-round selections and collegiate hockey stars, including recent Irish graduate Tyler Carpenter.
- Following his time with the Steel, Sheahan spent one season as head coach of the Chicago Wolves of the AHL where he posted a regular season record of 35–29–5.
- In his first season back with the Irish as associate head coach, Sheahan was instrumental in the development of a young roster. His emphasis on player development led five graduates to sign professional contracts at the conclusion of the 2023–24 season, including a pair of NHL signees in Landon Slaggert (Chicago) and Drew Bavaro (Boston).
- He was elevated to Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach in March 2025 after two seasons as the associate head coach under his predecessor Jeff Jackson stepped down from the role at the end of the 2024–25 season after a 20-year career with the Irish.




