COUNTDOWN TO PUCK DROP

1K	In the final regular season series of 2023-24, Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson coached his 1,000th career game as a Division I head coach. The Irish rolled to a convincing 6-1 victory over Minnesota in the contest to celebrate the historic career of their leader, which spans 25 seasons over two programs; Lake Superior State University and the University of Notre Dame.
596	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has 596 career wins, which leads active NCAA Division I head coaches, spanning six seasons at Lake Superior State and now 20 seasons at Notre Dame. Jackson's win total ranks 10th all-time for most wins at the NCAA Division I level.
20	The Irish coaching staff of Jeff Jackson, Paul Pooley and Andy Slaggert enter year 20 coaching together in 2024-25. The trio of coaches started together in 2005 and have gone on to record great success with the program, including multiple Frozen Fours and two national championship games.
18	Catalino Family Head Hockey Coach Jeff Jackson has guided his teams at Lake Superior State and Notre Dame to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances, including winning NCAA Championships with the Lakers in 1992 and 1994, while guiding the Irish to their only four Frozen Four appearances in program history: 2008, 2011, 2017 and 2018.
17	Seventeen sets of brothers have now suited up for the Irish. Current Irish siblings include Henry and Danny Nelson while Justin Janicke (brother Trevor graduated in 2024) and Carter Slaggert (brothers Graham '22 and Landon '24) both have brothers who previously suited up for the Irish.
12	With Nate Clurman's NHL debut in late December, the Irish have 11 alumni currently competing in the NHL. The 2021 Notre Dame grad joins fellow Irish alumni Andrew Peeke (BOS), Dennis Gilbert (BUF), TJ Tynan (COL), Jake Evans (MTL), Spencer Stastney (NSH), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Bryan Rust (PIT), Cal Burke (VGK) and Ian Cole (UHC) in the show this season. Vinnie Hinostroza, who led the AHL in scoring through the halfway point was called up over the final weekend of 2024 and made his debut with the Nashville Predators on Dec. 30.
10	Veteran leadership: Notre Dame's roster features 10 seniors and graduate students in 2024-25. Current graduates Grant Silianoff and Zach Plucinski have spent all five seasons at Notre Dame and earned their undergraduate degrees in May 2024.
8	With the most recent being the 2019 Big Ten tournament title, Notre Dame has won eight conference championships in program history - each under Jeff Jackson (three regular-season).
6	The Irish have six draft picks on their roster in 2024-25 and have had at least one individual selected in each of the past 22 NHL Entry Level Drafts.
4	The Irish announced ahead of the season opener that four seniors and graduate students will serve as team leaders this year.

NOTES

QUICK HITS

- The Irish and Golden Gophers reunite for their second weekend series of the season this weekend as they get set to face off in Minneapolis, Jan. 17-18.
- In their last meeting, Brennan Ali and Axel Kumlín both boasted career nights as the two recorded for a goal and two assists each. Jack Larrigan also scored his first collegiate goal earlier this season against the Golden Gophers when the two teams first clashed inside Compton Family Ice Arena.
- In their most recent series, the Irish split a pair of games with then-No. 9/9 Michigan. After a 5-3 loss Friday night, the Irish responded with a dominant 7-4 victory Saturday.
- Fueled by Justin Janicke's first career hat trick, five individuals boasted multiple points in the contest while Owen Say made 37 stops in net to clinch the victory.
- The Irish led Michigan 2-1 after one period of play but it was a memorable second period that insured the victory. At 5:37 of the middle stanza, Hunter Strand tipped a shot in from Jimmy Jurcev to make it a 3-1 game. The primary assist was the first point of Jurcev's career.
- Janicke net his second of the night just 15 seconds after Strand's tally, to give the Irish a 4-1 lead and force the Wolverines to make a change in goal. Just 17 seconds later, and on their first shot since the change in goalie, Danny Nelson scored his first of the calendar year.
- The three goals in 32 seconds set a program record.
- With five points on the night, including his first career hat trick, Janicke became the first Irish skater to boast five points in a single game since Bobby Nardella in the 2018-19 season.
- Danny Nelson was on the ice for six of the team's seven goals Saturday night for a +6 on-ice rating which set a Big Ten Conference record. The sophomore center appeared on the box score three times Saturday night with a goal and two assists.
- On Friday night, Cole Knuble had a hand in all three Irish goals, picking up a goal and two assists. The team leader in points became the first Irish player to 20 points this season and now sits at 22 points in 18 games played thus far (8-14-22).
- Justin Janicke's six point weekend (3-3-6) also escalated him to 20 points. He now boasts 21 points through 22 games.
- The opening contest of 2025 marked Notre Dame's fourth-ever appearance in an outdoor contest, having previously played at Soldier Field (2013), Fenway Park (2014) and Notre Dame Stadium (2019).
- The Irish and Nittany Lions went to an eight-round shootout, the team's first shootout of the season, Friday night. After the Nittany Lions scored in the first round of the shootout, Hunter Strand evened it up in round two. Nicholas Kempf proceeded to stop seven straight shots in the shootout to clinch the victory after Ryan Helliwell scored in the eighth round to give the Irish the advantage.

- The Irish wore a new jersey for Friday’s contest with the design meant to replicate those of the iconic Chicago flag and the Chicago Cubs (MLB).
- Notre Dame’s signature leprechaun could be seen on the front of the white jersey inside the “C” of the Cubs organization while the striping on the sleeves takes an Irish twist on the city’s flag, replacing the notable red stars with gold shamrocks.
- The teams closed out the weekend on Sunday with the first game at Compton Family Ice Arena of the new year where the Irish fell 3-0 to Penn State.
- The Irish closed out the first half of the season with a trip to Columbus, Ohio to face the Buckeyes.
- In two games, Danny Nelson led the team with a pair of goals while Nicholas Kempf stopped a career-best 41 saves in Friday’s overtime contest.
- The Irish team returned 19 student-athletes from the 2023-24 roster, including 11 forwards, six defensemen and two goaltenders. The forwards include graduate senior Grant Silianoff and seniors Justin Janicke, Hunter Strand and Tyler Carpenter. Returning defensemen include four who appeared in the final series of the 2023-24 season in Michael Mastrodomenico, Paul Fischer, Zach Plucinski and Henry Nelson.
- Notre Dame returned two 20+ point scorers from a season ago as Danny Nelson (9-14-23) and Cole Knuble (9-11-20) are now in their sophomore seasons with the Irish.
- In total, eight returners posted double-digit points last season. In addition to Nelson and Knuble, Hunter Strand (4-15-19), Justin Janicke (4-12-16), Paul Fischer (2-14-16), Brennan Ali (3-10-13), Maddox Fleming (3-9-12) and Grant Silianoff (4-7-11) look to improve upon their double-digit performances a season ago.
- At the last line of defense, the Irish return Jack Williams in goal and added two new netminders to the mix in Nicholas Kempf (USNTDP) and Owen Say (Mercyhurst).
- The Irish added 10 new faces to the squad in 2024-25, including five freshmen and five transfers. The 10 newcomers consist of five forwards, three defensemen and two goaltenders.

CHICAGO’S COLLEGE TEAM

- Notre Dame and Chicago are steeped in tradition, with Chicago being home to many University students.
- Chicago, Illinois is also home to one of the largest University of Notre Dame alumni contingents in the Notre Dame Club Of Chicago.
- The current Irish hockey roster features six Chicago-area student-athletes in Jimmy Jurcev, Hunter Weiss, Brennan Ali, Paul Fischer, Tyler Carpenter and Nicholas Kempf.
- In addition to those six, the Notre Dame hockey program has a long history with the Chicago Mission with six current skaters being Mission alums (Brennan Ali, Tyler Carpenter, Paul Fischer, Nicholas Kempf, Carter Slaggert, Hunter Weiss)
- Associate head coach Brock Sheahan came to Notre Dame following a stint coaching in the Windy City. The previous Chicago Wolves (AHL) head coach also served as head coach of the USHL’s Chicago Steel where he developed current Irish senior forward, Tyler Carpenter.
- Back in his hometown, Nicholas Kempf earned the nod in net and made 39 official saves between the pipes - two shy of his career best. The rookie netminder went on to stop seven shots in eight rounds of a shootout to bring his unofficial save count to 46 on the evening.
- While in Chicago, the team met up with a handful of program alumni now based in the Chicago area, including Matt Eisler, Eric Condra, Mark Eaton, and Landon Slaggert.

NOTRE DAME VS. MINNESOTA

- In 78 all-time meetings between the Irish and Golden Gophers, Minnesota holds a 45-27-6 edge.
- At Mariucci, the Irish trail the all-time series by a 16-23-3 margin and earned a split with the Golden Gophers a season ago in Minneapolis.
- Earlier this season, Jack Larrigan net his first collegiate goal against Minnesota in game one of the season series.

- In game two of the weekend series at Compton Family Ice Arena, Axel Kumlin and Brennan Ali both earned career nights with three points each off a goal and two assists.

TEAM LEADERS

- Sitting at 22 points through 18 games played, Cole Knuble leads the team in the category and the sophomore now boasts 20+ point seasons in back-to-back years with the Irish.
- His 22 points ranks 21st nationally and ninth in the conference while his 14 assists is 12th best nationally.
- Knuble also leads the team in assists with 14 on the year while his eight goals sits one shy of the team-best.
- With nine goals this season, Danny Nelson and Justin Janicke currently lead the team in the category. Janicke's hat trick performance against Michigan on Jan. 11 was a career best for the senior.
- Janicke also scored the team's first shorthanded goal of the season in the win over Michigan en route to his three-goal night.
- Cole Knuble's game-winning goal in overtime against Wisconsin was his third of the season which leads the team.
- Blake Biondi's powerplay goal in Friday's contest against Michigan put him at four on the season - good for a team best.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

- The Irish were ranked 19th nationally in both the USCHO.com and USA Hockey/The Rink Live preseason polls.
- Prior to the start of Big Ten Conference play, Owen Say was named Co-Goalie of the Month by the HCA for the month of October. In the opening month of competition, the junior netminder went 3-0-0 in the crease and led the nation in both save percentage (.969) and goals against average (1.00).

NHL NOTES

- The Irish had 25 alumni invited to NHL training camps in September, including six individuals from the 2023-24 roster.
- The program was represented at over half of the NHL camps to take place, including three with the Boston Bruins - Andrew Peeke, Drew Bavaro and Ryan Bischel.
- Seventeen teams hosted Notre Dame alums during their respective training camps and seven featured multiple individuals with Irish ties.
- Landon Slaggert, who made his NHL debut in March 2024 following the conclusion of his senior season with the Irish, joined fellow Irish alum and classmate Ryder Rolston in Chicago at the Blackhawks' camp.
- Ian Cole and Robbie Russo became the program's first ever representatives within the Utah Hockey Club, competing in a handful of preseason games for the newest NHL franchise this fall. Cole became an unrestricted free agent in July 2024 and signed a one-year deal with Utah to become the first Irish alum in the organization's history.
- The Islanders training camp featured a pair of NHL veterans and Irish alums in Anders Lee and Kyle Palmieri. Lee has spent the entirety of his career with the Islanders organization and was the last Irish player to make his NHL debut in the same season as his collegiate career before Landon Slaggert did so in March 2024.
- Lee became the 15th captain of the Islanders in 2018-19 and this season will mark his

- Nate Clurman and Bryan Rust joined each other at the Pittsburgh Penguins training camp while Vinnie Hinostroza and Spencer Stastney were together in Nashville. Dennis Gilbert and Graham Slaggert were both present at the Buffalo Sabres' camp.
- TJ Tynan (Colorado Avalanche), Jake Evans (Montreal Canadiens), Nick Liefermann (Washington Capitals), Trevor Janicke (Calgary Flames), Cal Petersen (Philadelphia Flyers), Cal Burke (Vegas Golden Knights), Patrick Moynihan (Los Angeles Kings), Alex Steeves (Toronto Maple Leafs), Ryan Siedem (New York Rangers) and Tory Dello (Detroit Red Wings) all spent time at various NHL training camps as well this fall.
- With opening night rosters announced in early October for the NHL, the Irish had eight alumni named, including Andrew Peeke (BOS), Dennis Gilbert (BUF), Jake Evans (MTL), Spencer Stastney (NSH), Anders Lee (NYI), Kyle Palmieri (NYI), Bryan Rust (PIT), and Ian Cole (UHC).
- After a successful early start with the Colorado Eagles of the AHL, TJ Tynan was called up for eight games with the Colorado Avalanche. Tallying an assist against Nashville, it was his second career NHL point and first since the 2019-20 season.
- Cal Burke made his debut with the Vegas Golden Knights on Wednesday, Nov. 21, marking the ninth Irish alum to lace up his skates in the NHL this season. The 2020 graduate scored his first NHL goal in his second game with the Golden Knights (Nov. 23 vs. Montreal).
- On Sunday, Dec. 29, Nate Clurman made his NHL debut for the Pittsburgh Penguins, becoming the 43rd player in program history to reach the Show and 29th Irish alum during Coach Jackson's tenure.
- Vinnie Hinostroza made his debut with the Nashville Predators on December 30, 2024 and has since played four games with the Tennessee organization. After leading the AHL in points through the first half to earn the call-up, Hinostroza marked the 12th Irish alum to lace up his skates in the NHL this year.

FAMILY TIES

- The 2024-25 Notre Dame roster features quite a few family connections to the program and hockey world. One set of brothers is currently on the roster, in Henry and Danny Nelson, while two other current players have had brothers suit up for the Irish in the past. Senior Justin Janicke's brother Trevor spent five years with the Irish and recently signed with the Calgary Wranglers while sophomore Carter Slaggert's two older brothers Graham and Landon played their collegiate careers with the Irish and both now compete at the professional level.
- With the addition of the Nelsons last season, the Irish have had 17 sets of brothers lace up their skates together for the Irish.
- Carter Slaggert also joined the Irish in 2023-24, becoming the third Slaggert brother to appear in a game for the Irish. Oldest brother Graham currently plays in the Buffalo Sabres organization and skated two years alongside middle brother Landon before graduating. Landon was a 2024 graduate of Notre Dame and made his NHL debut for the Chicago Blackhawks in March 2024.
- Janicke and Slaggert's fathers both also attended Notre Dame, two of six families to ever have fathers and sons lace up for the Irish.
- The Slaggerts are part of the fifth set of father-son combinations to suit up for the Irish, joining their father and Ralph M. DiVietro Memorial Associate Hockey Coach Andy Slaggert.
- Justin and Trevor Janicke are the sons of Curtis Janicke, who played for the Irish from 1989-93, appearing in 125 games while scoring 46 goals and adding 98 assists for 144 points. Justin, Trevor and Curtis represent the sixth father-son duo to play for the Irish.
- Sophomore Paul Fischer is the nephew of Mike Gearan, a member of the first varsity hockey team at Notre Dame. Fischer honors his uncle by wearing his number during his career with the Irish, No. 16.
- Sophomore forward Cole Knuble is the son of former NHLer Mike Knuble, who spent 16 seasons in the NHL, including stints with Detroit, New York Rangers, Boston, Philadelphia and Washington. Cole was recently drafted by the Flyers' organization where his father

- The 2024 NHL draft saw Nicholas Kempf's name called in the fourth round (pick 114 overall) by the Washington Capitals.
- The selection in the 2024 NHL Entry Level Draft marked 22 consecutive years in which an Irish player has been picked dating back to 2004.
- With the fourth round selection, Kempf became the 98th player in program history to have his name called at the Draft and is the fourth ever Irish selection by the Washington Capitals.
- The sophomore class features four NHL draft picks in Danny Nelson (NYI '23; 2nd Rd., 49 overall), Cole Knuble (PHI '23; 4th Rd., 103 overall) and Paul Fischer (STL '23; 5th Rd., 138 overall) and Brennan Ali (DET '22; 7th Rd., 212th overall)
- Under Jackson, the Irish have had 52 NHL draftees, including three first round picks.

- The 2024–25 season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson’s 20 season behind the Irish bench. During his first 19 seasons, the program has enjoyed a great deal of success, including four trips to the Frozen Four and eight conference championships.
- Jackson has over 30 years of coaching experience and led Notre Dame to back-to-back Big Ten tournament championship seasons in 2018 and 2019 while also guiding the Irish to the 2018 national title game en route to being named the Spencer Penrose Award winner as the National Coach of the Year.
- Jackson was also named the Spencer Penrose award winner in 2007 and he is one of just 15 coaches to have earned the honor multiple times (dating back to 1951).
- Additionally, Jackson is one of only two coaches to have earned the honor multiple times in the last 20 seasons.
- Jackson’s Notre Dame teams have made 12 trips to the NCAA Tournament, advancing to the Frozen Four four times and playing in the 2008 and 2018 national title games.
- During his 20-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation’s top teams while playing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association, Hockey East and now Big Ten.
- Under Jackson, the Irish won the CCHA regular-season title twice (2006–07 and 2008–09) while earning three Mason Cup championships (2007, 2009 and the final one in 2013).
- Then, in the team’s first season in the Big Ten (2017–18), Notre Dame captured both the regular season and conference championships and followed up by once again winning the conference tournament in year two (2018–19).
- Jackson’s success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey — The Compton Family Ice Arena — one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.
- Since Jackson’s arrival, the Irish have had 48 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections.
- In that same span, 52 players from USA Hockey’s National Team Developmental Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.

- During Jackson’s tenure, the Irish have had nine players garner All-America honors — Ryan Bischel in 2023, Bobby Nardella in 2019, Cale Morris in 2018, Anders Bjork in 2017, Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007.
- In addition, 28 of Jackson’s Notre Dame players have gone on to play in the NHL.
- Jackson entered the 2024–25 season with a 25-year collegiate record of 589–318–98 for a .645 winning percentage, the third-highest winning percentage among all active coaches with five years or more in Division I (entering 2024–25).
- Entering the 2024–25 season, Jackson’s 589 career wins rank 10th all-time in Division I and leads all active NCAA Division I coaches.
