#10/#9 Irish Close Out Four-Game Run Versus Hockey East With A Visit From #15/#14 Boston College

- Notre Dame and Boston College meet for 29th time with John "Snooks" Kelley-Lefty Smith Trophy on the line Friday night.
- Irish coming off a big win at Boston University on Tuesday night, blanking the Terriers, 3-0, behind Brad Phillips 34-save performance.

NOTRE DAME WELCOMES BOSTON COLLEGE TO SOUTH BEND: The Notre Dame and Boston College hockey teams will renew their annual rivalry on Friday, Oct. 23 when the Eagles tangle with the Fighting Irish in a 7:35 p.m. game at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame, fresh off its 3-0 upset win at No. 3 Boston University, brings a 3-2-0 record into the game and is ranked 10th in the ÛSA Today/American Hockey Magazine poll and ninth by the USCHO.com poll. Boston College has played just once so far this season and dropped a 4-1 decision at Vermont on Sunday, Oct. 18. The Eagles are ranked 15th in the USA Today poll and 14th by USCHO.com. Friday's game will have live video streaming and can be found at und.com free of charge. Following the game, the winner

will be presented the John "Snooks" Kelley/ Lefty Smith Trophy that goes each year to the winner of the Boston College-Notre Dame hockey game. Following the single game with the Eagles, the Irish close out October with a pair of games versus Ohio State on Oct. 30-31 at the Joyce Center. Game times are 7:35 p.m. on Friday and 5:05 p.m. on Saturday - Halloween night.

IRISH AND THE EAGLES: Notre Dame and Boston College have met 28 times in the all-time series with the Eagles owning a 15-11-2 edge in those games. The Irish have won four of the last five meetings, dating back to the 2003-04 season. The lone Boston College win came in the 2008 NCAA Championship game, a 4-1 victory, at Denver, Colo. Last season, the two teams met at Kelley Rink with the Irish taking a 4-1 win on Nov. 7, 2008. Garrett Regan '09, Christian Hanson '09, Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.) and Kevin Deeth (Sr., Gig Harbor, Wash.) scored one goal each and Jordan Pearce '09 made 27 saves in the win.

BIG IRISH WINS: Three of the last four times that Notre Dame defeated Boston College, the Eagles were ranked No. 1 in the nation. On Oct. 23, 2003, the Irish knocked off BC, 1-0, at Conte Forum with David Brown **'07**, getting the shutout. The second meeting

TWO WEEKS IN HOCKEY EAST: With this week's games versus Boston University and Boston College, Notre Dame wraps up four consecutive games versus teams from Hockey East. The Irish faced Providence College twice at home last week, splitting with the Friars, losing 3-2 on Oct. 15 and then winning, 2-0, on Friday, Oct. 16. On Tuesday, Oct. 20, Notre Dame won at Boston University, taking a 3-0 decision against the Terriers. Following this weekend's game against BC, the Irish will have just two non-league games left on the docket with both of those coming in the Shillelagh Tournament versus Colgate and either Niagara or North Dakota.

STEALING THE SHOW: Junior goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) made a career-high 34 saves as he handed the Boston University Terriers a 3-0 loss Tuesday night at Agganis Arena. Phillips got all the offensive support he needed in the second period when Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.) and Ben Ryan (Jr., Brighton, Mich.) scored 12 seconds apart to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. Calle Ridderwall (Jr., Stockholm, Sweden) added a power-play goal in the third period for the 3-0 final score. Maday, Ryan and Ridderwall each had a goal and an assist in the game. Phillips made 27 of his 34 saves in the first and third periods, including 17 in the final stanza. Notre Dame was 8-for-8 killing penalties on the night and 1-for-6 on the power play. BU out shot the Irish, 34-16, in the game. The win was the first-ever for the Friars against Boston University.

SHUTOUT STREAK: With shutouts in the last two games (versus Providence, 2-0, on 10/16 and Boston University, 3-0, on 10/20), Notre Dame brings a 123:46 minute scoreless streak into Friday's game with Boston College. The last time the Irish gave up a goal in a game was on Oct. 15 when Providence's Aaron Jamnick scored at 16:14 of the third period in the Friars' 3-2 win over the Irish.

STREAK BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 shutout win over Boston University, snapped a streak of 99-consecutive games that the Terriers had not been shutout. The last time BU was shutout came on Dec. 2, 2006 when the Terriers shutout Boston College, 1-0. The win also marked the first time since Jan. 15, 2008 that Boston University lost a non-conference game, a streak of 10 consecutive wins.

A STUNNING START: Prior to Brad Phillips' 3-0 shutout at Boston University, freshman goaltender Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.) showed the way with a 2-0 shutout of Providence College in his rookie debut on Oct. 16. Johnson stopped all 29 shots he faced in blanking the Friars, 2-0, becoming the second Irish goaltender to record a shutout in his first career contest. He joins teammate Tom O'Brien (Sr., Mokena, III.) who picked up a shutout in his first start last season, a 7-0 blanking of Sacred Heart on Oct. 18, 2008.

SWEDE SCORER: Junior Calle Ridderwall has become one of college hockey's premier power-play performers. With two goals this season, both on the power-play, Ridderwall has now scored 19 goals since the start of the 2008-09 season with 13 of them coming on the power play.

CAT COUNTRY 99.9 FM: Is the home of Notre Dame hockey as Darin Pritchett will call all the action during the 2009-10 season. Cat Country 99.9 FM is part of the WSBT Radio group that has partnered with Notre Dame for the next five years to bring all the action of Notre Dame football, men's basketball and hockey. Pritchett begins his first full season behind the microphone and can be heard 20 minutes prior to the opening faceoff with the Notre Dame Hockey Pregame Show. Catch all the action on Cat Country 99.9 FM.



SWEEPLESS IN SOUTH BEND: For the second weekend in a row, Notre Dame found itself in a position of something that hasn't happened very often over the last four seasons - looking at a possible opponent sweep. Since Jeff Jackson took over behind the Irish bench for the 2005-06 season, the Irish have lost back-to-back games on a weekend just eight times. Five of those series losses came during the 2005-06 season with two coming in 2007-08 and one last year (2008-09). The last time the Irish dropped a weekend series came on Oct. 24-25, 2008 when they lost twice to Miami at the Joyce Center.

HOME ICE STRUGGLES: A year ago, the Irish were 13-3-2 at the Joyce Center and over the last three years were 37-9-7 on home ice. Already this season, the Irish are just 2-2-0 in their own barn. Last season, the Irish were 11-2 in one-goal games. After the Oct. 15, 3-2 loss to the Friars, the Irish already have two home losses on the year to go with a pair of one-goal losses.

ROAD WARRIORS: During the 2008-09 season, Notre Dame turned in a 14-2-1 record on the road, the best in the program's history. That included a nine-game road win streak and a 10-game unbeaten mark (9-0-1). The Irish got this season off to a good road start with the 3-0 win at Boston University.

OUT OF ACTION: Junior defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** has missed the first four games of the season due to a lower body injury. He will not play in this week's games against Boston University and Boston College.

BEST OF THE BEST: Over the past three-plus seasons, the Notre Dame hockey program is tops in the nation. Since the start of the 2006-07 campaign, the Irish have won 93 games and own a .731 winning percentage over that period. Notre Dame leads Michigan (89) in wins and winning percentage (.720). Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

CENTURY CLUB ADDITIONS: Two members of the 2009-10 Notre Dame hockey team are on the verge of moving into the "Century Club" for career points. Senior Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) comes into the Boston University game needing just one point to reach 100. He has played in 132 career games with 32 goals and 67 assists for 99 points. Deeth has started the year with a four-game scoring streak (0-4-4). Senior teammate Ryan Thang has now played in 127 career games, scoring 49 goals with 46 assists for 95 points. He needs just one goal to reach the 50 mark and a goal and four assists to join the 50/50 club for players with 50 goals and 50 assists in a career. To date, there are 43 players with 100 or more points in the Notre Dame record books.

CHART CLIMBING: With his power-play goal on Oct. 15 versus Providence, senior **Ryan Thang** moved into a tie for ninth place on Notre Dame's all-time power-play goal list with 22 in his career. The top 11 list:

BACK BETWEEN THE PIPES: Junior goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) returned to the Irish lineup, making his first start in the season opener versus Alabama-Huntsville, his first game since Jan. 19, 2008. The 6-2, 187-pound goaltender missed all of last season due to a knee injury suffered in the preseason that required surgery. Phillips, who made five starts in his freshman year (2007-08), stopped a career-high 28 shots in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville. As a freshman, Phillips was 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage to go with one shutout. He picked up his first win of the season on Oct. 20, when he stopped a new career-high 34 shots in the 3-0 shutout at Boston University. In three starts this season, Phillips is 1-2-0 with a 2.01 goals-against average and a .931 save percentage.

SPECIAL SPECIAL TEAMS: During the 2008-09 season, Notre Dame excelled on special teams. The Irish led the nation in power-play percentage, going 51-for-226 for a 22.6% success rate. On the penalty kill, Notre Dame was third overall, giving up just 20 power-play goals in 190 chances for an 89.5% success rate, just .3% behind national leader Yale as the Bulldogs were at 89.8%.

PICKING UP WHERE THEY LEFT OFF:

So far this season, the Irish have scored at least one power-play goal in each of their five games, going 6-for-30 for a 20.0% success rate. On the penalty kill, the Irish were third in the nation and so far this season, they have killed 26-of-27 chances for a 96.3% success rate. The Irish have now killed 20 consecutive penalties since

giving up a goal on the power play on opening night.

LIGHTING THE LAMP: When senior defenseman Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.) scored his power-play goal in the first period of the Oct. 10 game with Alabama-Huntsville, it was his first time lighting the lamp since his freshman year. Blatchford's last goal came on Jan. 20, 2007 when he scored versus Western Michigan. After that goal, Blatchford went 99 games without scoring. The Temperance, Mich., native would rather set them up than score them as he now has three career goals to go with 54 assists for 57 points. He was second on the team in assists in 2008-09 when he had 25 helpers on the year.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshmen forwards Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) and Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.) wasted little time getting on the scoresheet in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 9. Sheahan scored on his first career shot, scoring on the power play at 3:02 of the first period to give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. He joins Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.) im Wallace '06 as recent Notre Dame players to score on the first shots of their college careers. Palmieri joined in with a second-period power-play goal to get his first career score in his first game. He added a second goal on Saturday in the 3-1 victory. Palmieri led the team with 12 shots on goal for the weekend while Sheahan had 10 in the series.

HOT HAND: Junior center **Ben Ryan** has the hot hand for the Irish as he has recorded a goal and three assists for four points over the last two games. Ryan had a pair of assists in the 2-0 win over Providence on Oct. 16 and followed with a goal and an assist in the 3-0 win over Boston University.

REUNITED: The Irish trio of left wing **Calle Ridderwall**, center **Kevin Deeth** and right wing **Billy Maday** saw their first action together this season in the 3-0 win at Boston University. Ridderwall and Maday each had a goal and an assist in the win while Deeth won 15-of-23 faceoffs. A year ago, the trio combined for 37 goals and 56 assists for 93 points on the season.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Notre Dame senior captain Ryan Thang has been named one of 20 nominees for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, two members of the Irish hockey team - Erik Condra '09 and Jordan Pearce '09 - were selected as one of 10 finalists for the honor. For the 2007-08 campaign, captain Mark Van Guilder '08 made it to the list of 10 final-

ists. For the 2006-07 season, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. The list of 20 candidates will be narrowed down midway through the season with the final 10 going on a ballot to select the national winner.

START A NEW STREAK: Notre Dame saw its string of consecutive sellouts snapped on Oct. 15 versus Providence as a crowd of 2,471 saw the game. A sellout at the Joyce Center is 2,713. A new streak started the following night as a standing-room only crowd of 2,857 saw the Irish defeat the Friars, 2-0. Notre Dame has now sold out 12 of its last 13 home games, dating back to Dec. 13, 2008 versus Bowling Green. Last season, the Irish played in front of a sold-out Joyce Center in 13 of its 18 home games. The opening night crowd of 2,994 against Alabama-Huntsville is the largest crowd to see a home opener since 1995 as the buildings seating capacity was reconfigured following that year with 2,713 being a sellout since then.

CLOSE ONES: During the 2008-09 season, Notre Dame was 25-0-0 when leading after two periods of play. Already this season, the Irish are 2-1-0 when leading after two as they dropped the season opener, 3-2, a game that Notre Dame led, 2-1, after two periods of play.

NUMERO UNO: Notre Dame reached the top of the college hockey rankings twice during the 2008-09 season, marking the third and fourth time in the program's 42-year history that the Irish sat atop the national polls. From Dec. 1 to Jan. 26 (seven weeks), Notre Dame was ranked first in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO. com/CSTV polls. The Irish then reached the top spot one time in each poll the rest of the season the week of Feb. 23 in the USA Today poll and the week of March 16 in the USCHO.com rankings. Previously, Notre Dame reached number one in the nation status during the 2006-07 season. The Irish moved into the top spot in both polls on Feb. 5, 2007 and remained there for seven consecutive weeks through March 25. The Irish finished the year ranked fourth in the USA Today poll that covers the entire season and finished number one in the USCHO. com poll that ended with the finish

of the regular season. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 60 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers.

CAPTAINS: Senior left wing Ryan Thang will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2009-10 season. Joining Thang as alternate captains in '09-'10, are senior defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.), senior center Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.) and junior defenseman Teddy Ruth (Naperville, III.). Thang and Lawson served as alternate captains in 2008-09, while this is the first season as captain for Deeth and Ruth.

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson begins his fifth season behind the Irish bench in 2009-10. In his first four years he compiled a 103-48-14 (.667) record, highlighted by a 32-7-3 mark in '06-'07, a 27-16-4 record on the way to the first-ever Frozen Four appearance for the Irish in '07-'08 and last year's 31-6-3 campaign. The '06-'07 CCHA coach-of-the-year and Spencer Penrose Award winner as the national coach-of-the-year, Jackson enters the '09-'10 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with 10 or more years. His current overall record stands at 285-100-39 for a .718 success rate. His 285 wins rank him 12th on the list of active coaches. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop – Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA

tournament championships. Included in his 285 career wins are 50 postseason victories (50-15 in postseason) and a .769 winning percentage. In 10 trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 34-7 (.829). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 10-5 record at Notre Dame. In those 10 seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals nine times, winning six tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and two at Notre Dame).

STINGY IRISH: Over the last three seasons, the Irish have been ranked first in the nation twice in lowest goals-against average. For the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame was best in the nation with a 1.67 goals against. The Irish followed that in 2007-08 with a 2.13 goals-against average to rank fifth in the country and last year the goals-against average was best with a 1.73 average.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - junior goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) and freshmen forwards Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.) – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Phillips' uncle is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak '89, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988. Nugent's father, Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78, played hockey for the Irish between 1974-78, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. Kevin, Jr., becomes the second Notre Dame hockey player to follow his father to South Bend. He follows goaltender Rory Walsh '06 who followed his father, Brian Walsh '77 who was a teammate of the elder Nugent, playing for coach Lefty Smith. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman Brock Sheahan '08 who played for the Irish from 2004-08.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: The Irish played their first game this season versus a ranked team on Oct. 20, taking a 3-0 win versus third-ranked Boston University at Agganis Arena. Notre Dame was 5-5 during the 2008-09 season against nationally ranked teams.

ALL-AMERICANS: Two Notre Dame players were selected AHCA/Reebok All-Americans following the 2008-09 season. Current junior defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) was selected as a first team All-American while right wing Erik Condra '09 was selected second team. That marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish had two players selected All-American in the same year. The previous times came in 1972-73 when Eddie Bumbacco '74 and Bill Nyrop '74 were chosen and again in 1976-77 when Jack Brownschidle '77 and Brian Walsh '77 were honored.

CLUTCH SCORER: During his first three seasons at Notre Dame, senior left wing Ryan Thang has proven to be a clutch player. In those three seasons, Thang has amassed 13 game-winning goals, getting six in 2006-07, five in 2007-08 and two last season. He is currently tied for the top spot with 13 game-winning goals. That ties him with Rob Globke '04, Brian Urick '99 and Dave Poulin '82, with all three having 13 game winners.

DROP THE PUCK: For the fifth year in a row, Notre Dame hockey opened its season with the annual "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center for season ticket holders and fans. This year's event was held on Oct. 6 and featured Garth Snow, the general manager of the New York Islanders. A goaltender with the Islanders from 2001-06, Snow was on Long Island when Jeff Jackson was an assistant coach there. Snow joins Brian Burke, who was the executive vicepresident and general manager of the Anaheim Ducks at the time and the G.M. of the 2010 U.S. Olympic hockey team in 2008, Detroit Red Wings' player and current team vice-president Steve Yzerman (2007), Chicago Black Hawk and Versus/NBC TV analyst Ed Olczyk (2006) and Hall of Fame coach Scotty Bowman, who handled the honors at the first Drop The Puck reception on Sept. 6, 2005 with over 400 fans in attendance. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weis to address his team at practice that day, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan.

SHILLELAGH TOURNAMENT: Notre Dame will host the second ever Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, 2010 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The tournament will feature North Dakota, Niagara and Colgate. On Saturday, Jan. 2, North Dakota and Niagara will meet in the 3:05 p.m. (CT) game with the Irish facing Colgate at 6:05 p.m. (CT). On Sunday, Jan. 3, Colgate with face either North Dakota or Niagara at 2:05 p.m. (CT) with Notre Dame playing either the Fighting Sioux or the Purple Eagles at 5:05 p.m. (CT). The Irish won the first tournament last season with 3-1

wins over Union College and Minnesota-Duluth in the championship game.

SHOOTING IT OUT: The 2008-09 season was the first year that the CCHA used the shootout to determine the winner of games that remained tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime period. During the season, the Irish were involved in three shootouts, going 3-0 in all three games. Here's a look at Notre Dame's stats during the shootouts.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS:

For the first time in the program's history, two members of the Notre Dame hockey team were selected as ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-Americans on the at-Large team following the 2008-09 season. Senior goaltender Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska) was selected first team after recording a 3.816 gradepoint average in his double major of anthropology/pre-med. For Pearce, it marked the second consecutive year that he was named Academic All-American after taking second team honors in '07-'08. He was joined by fellow senior Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) who was a second team selection after turning in a 3.55 grade point with a double major in psychology and pre-med. Pearce became the second Irish player to be named twice as he joined Steve Noble '98 who was selected in 1997 (first team) and 1998 (second team). The Irish have had six players all-time named Academic All-American as Condra and Pearce are joined by Dan Carlson '01 (third team), Andy Jurkowski '00 (third team), Forrest Karr '99 (second team) and Noble in '97 and '98.

LORD STANLEY, LORD STANLEY: For the second consecutive season, a former Notre Dame defenseman played for a Stanley Cup winning team. This time it was Pittsburgh defenseman Mark Eaton who became the fourth Notre Dame player to hoist the Stanley Cup. Eaton, who played just one season for the Irish in 1997-98, joins Brett Lebda '04 who won the Stanley Cup versus Eaton's Penguins in 2008. They follow two other Notre Dame defenseman who have their names etched on the Cup three times - Bill Nyrop '74 and Don Jackson '78. Nyrop played on three Stanley Cup winners with the Montreal Canadiens (1975-78) and Jackson was a member of three Cup-winning teams with the Edmonton Oilers (1982-85). The Pittsburgh defenseman was honored by Notre Dame at halftime of the season-opening game versus Nevada on Sept. 5.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Notre Dame defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth were selected to play for Team USA in the 2009 World Junior Championships in Ottawa, Ont. The Irish now have 12 players to play on the Junior National Team with Cole making his second appearance. The defensive duo were part of a team that finished fifth. Cole had two goals and two assists for four points in six games while Ruth was scoreless in six contests. This past summer, defenseman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) and forward Kyle Palmieri were invited to the 2010 Junior National Evaluation Camp to try out for this winter's squad. Cole and Ruth join Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79), Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98), Dan Carlson ('98-'99), Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01), Brett Henning ('99-'00), David Inman ('99-'00), Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02), Brett Lebda ('01-'02) and Kyle Lawson ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have nine players on the 2009-10 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Two incoming freshmen added to the list this season. Left wing Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.) was a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall. Right wing **Kyle** Palmieri was a first round pick, 26th overall in the 2009 Draft last June. He became the second Notre Dame player ever selected in the first round. They join defenseman Sean Lorenz who also was selected in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. Defenseman Ian Cole was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues, who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman Teddy Ruth who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Ryan Thang was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender Brad Phillips rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh

round, 182nd overall. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** rounds out the group of nine players as he was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

HOMETOWNS: The 2009-10 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Junior Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) is the first Notre Dame hockey player from Sweden.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, oncampus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
