Storylines

- The Irish will meet two first-time opponents this weekend in Illinois State and Missouri. Notre Dame has never played either team.

The Notre Dame women's soccer team will add a pair of new opponents to its all-time list when the Irish welcome Illinois State and Missouri to Alumni Stadium this weekend and continue to chip through the non-conference slate.

The Irish enter the weekend with a 3-1-0 record, dropping a 2-0 decision to Michigan last Thursday in Ann Arbor before defeating Western Michigan 3-0 on Monday at home. After struggling to find rhythm on offense against the Wolverines, the Irish put together a much sharper performance against the Broncos. Junior forward **Karin Muya** put together a great game against Western Michigan, scoring once and assisting on another for her first points of the season and since the 2014 season. She was aided by classmate **Meghan Doyle**, who scored her first goal of the season on a rebound of Muya's saved shot and led the Irish in shots with five and shots on goal with three. Senior midfielder **Cindy Pineda** was also impressive, assisting on Muya's goal for her first points since the 2013 season.

Setting The (Golden Dome) Standard

When it comes to powerhouse programs in women's college soccer, one need look no further than Notre Dame. The Fighting Irish have won three NCAA titles (1995, 2004, 2010) to highlight a resume that includes eight NCAA national championship match appearances and 12 trips to the NCAA College Cup semifinals (second-most in tournament history). Notre Dame has earned 23 consecutive NCAA Championship berths (1993-2015), the second-longest active streak (North Carolina, 1982-2014) and third-longest run all-time in tournament history.

In their history, the Fighting Irish have developed four Hermann Trophy winners and 52 All-Americans, including 19 first-team selections. Now in its 29th season in 2016, Notre Dame owns an all-time record of 523-108-31 (.814).

Scouting Illinois State

The Redbirds enter Friday's game with a 1-3-0 record, having snapped a three-match losing streak their last time out in a 4-0 win over Eastern Illinois. Illinois State dropped their first three matches to Wisconsin, Illinois and Marquette.

The Redbirds, who were picked to finish fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference during the preseason, have four one-goal scorers in **Brianne Richards**, **Lauren Koehl**, **Abby Basler** and **Kelli Zickert**. Koehl, who was a First-Team All-MVC pick in 2015, is the team points leader with an additional assist. Joining Koehl on the all-conference scrolls were returning senior defender

Paige Jarsombeck (second team), senior midfielder **Brooke Ksiazek** (honorable mention), and sophomore defenders **Riley Ebenroth** and **Megan Kozlow** (All-Freshman team).

The Irish and Redbirds have never met. Illinois State is a 10-time Missouri Valley Conference Champion, six-time MVC Tournament Champion and six-time NCAA Championship participant.

Scouting Missouri

The Tigers will host San Francisco on Friday before heading north to take on the Irish in the weekend wrapper. They enter the weekend with a 3-1-0 records, notching wins

Last Time Out

The Irish dropped their first game of the season Thursday on the road at Michigan, but got back in the win column on Monday against Western Michigan to remain undefeated at home.

Two defensive miscues led to goals for Michigan in an otherwise even match-up Thursday. The Wolverines led just 4-3 in shots at the half, while the teams tied at 2 in first-half shots on goal. The final stats were similarly close, as Michigan led 9-7 in shots and 5-3 in shots on goal and both teams managed to earn two corner kicks.

The Irish found their offensive attack against Western Michigan in a lightning-postponed match that was moved from Sunday to Monday. The Irish got on the board via a Bronco own goal — the second own goal that has benefitted the Irish this season — as **Kaleigh Olmsted** dribbled behind the WMU defense and struck a cross that careened off a defender into the goal. Notre Dame got its first credited goal from junior forward **Karin Muya** on a well-placed through ball from senior midfielder **Cindy Pineda** to give the Irish a 2-0 lead at the half. Junior forward **Meghan Doyle** wrapped the scoring with a rebound goal off a shot from Muya that was batted away by WMU goalkeeper Stephanie Heber.

Stacking Up

At No. 23, the Irish are one of seven Atlantic Coast Conference teams to appear in the final regular season NSCAA Division I Women's Soccer poll, along with No. 1 Florida State, No. 3 Virginia, No. 6 Clemson, No. 7 Duke, No. 8 North Carolina, and No. 16 Virginia Tech. All of those teams earned seeds in the 2015 NCAA Championship, while Boston College (receiving votes) also earned a bid to round out ACC representation.

Off On The Right Foot

Notre Dame holds a 25-3-1 (.879) record in season openers, including a 15-1-1 (.912) record on the road. In addition, the Fighting Irish have carried a 15-2-1 (.861) mark in season openers since 1999, outscoring the opposition by a 81-11 margin in those 18 matches (31-4 in the past 10 matches).

The (Almost) 2-0 Guarantee

Notre Dame is a combined 366-1-1 (.996) all-time when claiming a 2-0 lead, and has won 339 of its last 340 contests when going ahead 2-0 (since a 3-3 draw with Vanderbilt on Sept. 15, 1991, in Cincinnati). The only loss in that span was a 3-2 defeat in double overtime against

North Carolina (9/20/14).

In fact, just three of the past 247 Fighting Irish opponents to face a 2-0 deficit have won or even come back to tie, something achieved by five opponents in Notre Dame history: Duke on Oct. 17, 1993, in Houston (ND won 3-2), Connecticut on Nov. 10, 1996, in the BIG EAST final at old Alumni Field (ND led 2-0, later tied 2-2 and 3-3, ND won 4-3), Duke on Nov. 30, 2007, in the NCAA quarterfinals at old Alumni Field (ND won 3-2), Villanova on Oct. 12, 2008 in Villanova, Pa. (ND won 3-2 in OT), and most recently, North Carolina on Sept. 20, 2014 at Alumni Stadium (UNC won 3-2 in 2OT).
