Mercedes Russell ranks No. 9 in the nation in field goal percentage, hitting 63.7 percent of her attempt.

TEAM NOTES

TENNESSEE VS. NOTRE DAME

■ No. 6/7 Tennessee (16-1, 4-1 SEC) makes one final stop on a challenging three-game road swing with a Thursday night visit to Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center to take on No. 5/5 Notre Dame (16-2, 5-1 ACC).

■ The Lady Vols' final regular-season non-conference contest is slated to tip at 7:02 p.m. ET.

■ This marks the 28th meeting between these schools in women's basketball, with UT holding a 21-6 advantage.

■ The Lady Vols will try to halt a three-game road losing skid in the series and end a 17-game homecourt winning streak by the Irish.

■ A year ago, Tennessee ended a six-game Notre Dame series win streak, defeating the (then) No. 6/6 Fighting Irish, 71-69, at Thompson-Boling Arena in Knoxville on a last second jumper by Jaime Nared.

■ **The Lady Vols' match-up with Notre Dame is the third of four straight UT contests vs. teams ranked in the AP Top 20; the second of three straight vs. top-10 foes and the first of two in a row against top-five opponents.**

■ This marks the second run of four straight ranked opponents during the Holly Warlick era. UT beat #22/NR North Carolina and #18/20 Texas, then lost to #3/3 Baylor and #1/1 Stanford in 2012-13 (her first year).

■ This set of foes is the highest ranked quartet Tennessee has played consecutively since UT swept #15/19 Notre Dame, #8/9 Texas A&M, #6/5 LSU and #4/4 Stanford in the 2008 Regional Final and Final Four en route to the Lady Vols' eighth NCAA title.

■ The Lady Vols split the first two tilts on the current road trip, falling at No. 17/16 Texas A&M, 79-76 in overtime, on Jan. 11 and beating No. 9/8 South Carolina in Columbia for the second straight season, 86-70.

■ Notre Dame also split its last two games, falling 100-67 at (now) No. 2/2 Louisville and bouncing back with an 89-60 home win over Boston College on Sunday.

■ The only other blemish on the Irish schedule was an 80-71 loss at UConn on Dec. 3.

■ Air time for games on the Lady Vol Radio Network generally occurs 30 minutes prior to tip-off.

UT LATELY AGAINST RANKED FOES

■ **Tennessee is 4-1 this season vs. ranked opponents, including 2-0 vs. top-10 foes and 1-0 vs. top-five teams.**

■ The Lady Vols were 5-4, 4-2 and 2-2 last year vs. ranked, top-10 and top-five squads.

■ Over the past two years, UT is 9-5 vs. ranked, 6-2 vs. top-10 and 3-2 vs. top-five opponents.

A PEEK AT UT'S SCHEDULE

■ Tennessee is in the midst of a grueling stretch featuring four ranked opponents in the span of 11 days.

■ **After the Notre Dame contest, UT returns home to face #3/3 Mississippi State on Sunday at 3 p.m. (ESPN2) with hopes of knocking off a top-three team on its home court for the second time this season.**

■ UT is 2-8 vs. AP top-three teams and 1-8 vs. USA Today top-three squads during the past six seasons, but it has beaten #2/4 Texas at home this season and it knocked off #3/2 Mississippi State in Starkville last year.

■ The last time a Tennessee team beat two top-three-ranked opponents during the same season was 2004-05, when UT defeated No. 2 Stanford at home and No. 1 LSU in the SEC Tournament title game.

■ The last time the Lady Vols beat more than one top-three team on its home court in the same season was 1997-98, when UT defeated No. 2/2 La. Tech, No. 3/3 UConn and No. 3/3 Old Dominion.

WE BACK PAT WEEK STARTS SUNDAY

■ Jan. 21 through Jan. 28 marks the seventh annual observance of We Back Pat Week.

■ The initiative began in collaboration with the SEC basketball coaches is dedicated to remembering legendary Tennessee women's basketball head coach Pat Summitt and bringing awareness to the Pat Summitt Foundation.

■ The Pat Summitt Foundation was created by Pat and (son) Tyler Summitt in 2011 to support organizations that deliver care to patients with Alzheimer's disease, provide resources for caregivers and families, and conduct research for treatment and a cure.

CEDES ROLLING DOUBLE-DOUBLES

■ With double-doubles in her last two games, Mercedes Russell has increased her season total to eight and her career total to 38.

■ She ranks third all-time at UT in career doubles behind Chamique Holdsclaw (57) and Candace Parker (45).

■ Russell set a UT record for double-doubles by a junior with 19 last year and her total of eight this season already ties her for 10th among all-time Lady Vol seniors.

■ A consistent performer, Russell has scored in double figures in all 17 games this season and in 47 of her last 49 starts.

"BIG GAME" JAIME NARED

■ Jaime Nared leads the Lady Vols with 15 games of 20 or more points during her career and seven this season.

■ Nared also has a knack for making big plays and playing big in big games.

■ Last season vs. Notre Dame she hit a jumper with 10.3 seconds remaining to lift the Lady Vols to a 71-69 upset of No. 6/6 Notre Dame.

■ She had 27 points and hit the game-winning free throws in the closing seconds of last season's win over No. 4 South Carolina.

■ She scored 30 last season in an upset of #3/2 Mississippi State and tossed in 28 vs. Louisville in the NCAA Tournament Second Round.

■ This season, she was critical in the victory over No. 2/4 Texas, posting a double-double of 15 points and 12 rebounds. She also had 28 points vs. Stanford and 21 vs. South Carolina on Sunday.

USA U23 TEAMMATES REUNITE

■ Tennessee's Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell and Notre Dame's Arike Ogunbowale were teammates this summer on the USA U23 National Team.

■ They joined forces to help the USA win the U24 Four Nations Tournament in Tokyo, Japan, with a 3-0 record.

■ Nared and Russell started all three games, while Ogunbowale was a key performer off the bench on a very balanced team.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT FROM NEWCOMERS

■ UT features three SEC All-Freshman candidates on its 2017-18 roster and a junior college transfer who have made key impacts to this team.

■ Tennessee's trio of forward Renna Davis (11.1 ppg., 7.8 rpg.), guard Anastasia Hayes (10.4, 3.0 rpg., 3.9 app.) and guard Evina Westbrook (10.1 ppg., 4.9 app., 3.1 rpg.) have helped fuel UT's 16-1 start, with Davis and Westbrook starting every game and Hayes serving as Holly Warlick's usual first choice off the bench.

■ Hayes has scored in double figures 11 times while Davis has done so nine times and Westbrook eight. Davis has four double-doubles to her credit, pulling down double-digit rebound totals six times.

■ Two-time JUCO All-American Cheridene Green averages 6.3 points and 4.9 rebounds while shooting 59% from the field. She has hit double figures in points 10 times, including two out of the last three games, and has pulled down double-digits in rebounds once.

■ The four rookies (including reserve post player Kasiyahna Kushkituah) and Green are supplying 45% of UT's points (654/1441), 41% rebounds (333/820) and 62% assists (189/304) thus far.

LADY VOLS AND ALUMS IN THE NEWS

■ Seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell, who were on the John R. Wooden Award preseason watch list, have advanced to the midseason list.

■ Signees Amira "Mimi" Collins, Zarielle "Zay" Green and Jazmine Massengill were chosen to play in the McDonald's All American Game. UT's fourth signee, Rae Burrell was nominated from the state of Nevada but was not chosen.

■ Collins, Green and Massengill are all on the Naismith midseason watch list.

■ Lady Vol alum Chamique Holdsclaw and former UT assistant coach Mickie DeMoss were recently named as finalists vying for spots in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame Induction Class of 2018.

■ Cindy Brogdon (1977-79) was named as Tennessee's 2018 SEC Basketball Legend. The three-time All-American and 1976 U.S. Olympian will be honored at the SEC Tournament in Nashville.

THE LATEST ON TENNESSEE

■ Tennessee's win over South Carolina was its second straight in Columbia after defeating the Gamecocks there last season. UT will try to earn a second consecutive win over Notre Dame on Thursday night.

■ UT (at 15-0) was one of only four remaining unbeaten teams in women's basketball until Texas A&M knocked off the Lady Vols on Jan. 11. Not bad for a team that went 20-12 last season and 22-14 the year before while struggling to find consistency.

■ That 15-0 start was the fourth best in school history, behind 39-0 (1997-98), 18-0 (2005-06) and 16-0 (1994-95) season-opening streaks.

■ It also was the Lady Vols' longest winning streak since reeling off 25 in a row from Dec. 18, 2010, to March 28, 2011.

■ The last time UT stood 16-1 through 17 games was in 2009-10, a year in which UT finished 32-3

and won the SEC with a 15-1 mark.

■ The Big Orange women have won 14 of 17 games by double-digit margins.

■ UT has led every game this season at the half, except for a tie vs. Auburn (30-30), and has owned a double-digit advantage at the intermission in 10 of 17 contests.

■ The Lady Vols have allowed only four opponents to score more than 71 points (Marquette - 99, Texas - 75, Vandy - 73, A&M 79) and have allowed only two teams to shoot better than 41 percent from the field (Vanderbilt, .491 & Marquette, .437).

■ Holly Warlick has started the same five players every game thus far. That quintet includes Jaime Nared and Renna Davis at the forward positions, Mercedes Russell at center and Evina Westbrook and Meme Jackson at guard.

■ **It's the longest Tennessee has opened a season with the same starting five since at least the 1977-78 season.** Box scores that season and prior do not indicate who started.

■ In Lady Vol history, the most recent long streak for the same starting five reached 11 games in 2007-08, when Pat Summitt chose the same lineup of Candace Parker, Angie Bjorklund, Nicky Anosike, Shannon Bobbitt and Alexis Hornbuckle to report for the opening tip. UT went 10-1 in that span and went on to win the NCAA title with a 34-3 record and the SEC title with a 14-0 mark. In game 12, in the team's visit to Chicago, Parker missed curfew and didn't get the starting nod vs. DePaul on Jan. 2, 2008.

■ UT has five players averaging double figures in scoring, including seniors Jaime Nared (17.7) and Mercedes Russell (17.2), and freshmen Renna Davis (11.1) and Anastasia Hayes (10.4) and Evina Westbrook (10.1).

■ Russell (7) and Nared (7) have led UT in scoring the most times, followed by Hayes (2), and Davis, Meme Jackson and Westbrook (1).

■ Russell has scored in double figures 17 times, followed by Nared (15), Hayes (11), Davis (9), Westbrook (8), Jackson (4), Green (4) and Dunbar (1).

■ The Lady Vols dished out 24 and 20 assists vs. Vanderbilt and Texas A&M, respectively, marking the first time UT has had back-to-back 20+ assist games vs. SEC foes since doing so vs. Alabama (22) and Arkansas (20) in 2015-16.

■ Tennessee has outscored its opponents in the points-in-the-paint category in 14 of 17 games, averaging a 43.1 to 30.2 difference.

■ The Lady Vols bested their foes in second chance points 12 times and tied twice. UT averages 15.6 second chance points, while its opponents tally 10.6 after South Carolina got 15 on Sunday.

■ Tennessee shot its (then) sixth-best field goal percentage of the season (48.6) vs. Vanderbilt, but surrendered its highest percentage (49.1) as well vs. the 'Dores.

STREAK BUSTERS

■ Tennessee has put an end to some negative streaks this season and last, as the Lady Vols elevate themselves back into the national conversation.

■ Last season, UT ended a six-game losing streak in the Notre Dame series, defeating the #6/6 Fighting Irish in Knoxville.

■ UT has a three-game road losing skid at Notre Dame it will have a chance to end on Jan. 18.

■ The Lady Vols ended a three-game skid vs. Texas this season with a home victory over the No. 2/4 ranked Longhorns.

■ UT ended a five-game venue losing skid at Stanford's Maples Pavilion, winning there for the first time since Dec. 4, 2005, with an 83-71 defeat of the No. 18/24 Cardinal on Dec. 21.

■ UT ended a two-game losing streak at Rupp Arena (the Kentucky women usually play in Memorial Coliseum) and beat UK in Lexington for only the third time in the last seven visits.

■ The Lady Vols brought an end to two more bad jags a year ago, ending three-game dry spells vs. #3/2 Mississippi State and #4/4 South Carolina, both on the road.

TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY

■ UT is 381-65 in SEC regular-season games through the South Carolina game, winning 18 championships and capturing 17 SEC tourney titles through the years.

■ During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 64-21 in league games, making Warlick the top-ranked active SEC coach in terms of winning percentage in league play at .753 among coaches with at least one season at a school.

■ South Carolina's Dawn Staley is the next coach behind Warlick at .680 (100-47), followed by UK's Matthew Mitchell at .636 (103-59).

■ In only her sixth year as a head coach, Warlick already ranks fourth in total league wins among active SEC coaches and has won regular season titles in 2013 and 2015, and a tourney crown in 2014.

■ Warlick's record stands 80-26 in non-conference games.

WHAT HAVE YOU DONE FOR ME LATELY?

■ Tennessee hit 48 percent from the field vs. two ranked teams last week.

■ Jaime Nared averaged 19.5 points and 6.0 rebounds, shooting 93 percent (13-14) from the free throw line last week.

■ Over her last three games, Russell's numbers include 23.3 points per game, 10.0 rebounds and 67 percent shooting from the field and 91 percent from the free throw line.

■ In SEC play, Russell leads the team at 19.2

ppg. and 8.6 rpg. while shooting 65 percent.

■ The last eight games, Evina Westbrook has averaged 13.3 ppg. The first nine, she put up 7.2 per contest.

■ Westbrook is averaging 14.2 ppg. and shooting 50 percent from the field and 42 percent on three-pointers in SEC action.

■ In SEC games, Cheridene Green has shot 70 percent from the field.

■ The Lady Vols shot 68.7 percent from the free throw line during the first nine games of the season and have hit at a 75.3 clip the past eight contests.

WARLICK CAREER SNAPSHOT

■ Holly Warlick picked up the 1,000th cumulative win of her coaching career with a huge victory over #10/10 Stanford on Dec. 18, 2016.

■ She improved her overall coaching record to 1,000-214 with that victory, including her stints as an assistant, associate head coach and head coach.

■ She now stands at 1,030-223 in her 37th season, including 144-47 as a head coach and 886-176 as an assistant coach at UT, Virginia Tech and Nebraska.

■ She picked up her 100th career win as a head coach on Feb. 4, 2016, defeating Arkansas in Knoxville, 75-57.

■ Warlick is 64-21 in SEC play, 8-4 during the SEC Tournament and 80-26 vs. non-conference foes.

■ Her NCAA Tournament record is 12-5.

■ She is 33-9 in games following losses during a season.

WARLICK 37-30 VS. TOP 25 TEAMS

■ During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 38-30 vs. ranked teams.

TENNESSEE NOTES VS. NOTRE DAME

■ Tennessee holds a 21-6 all-time record vs. Notre Dame, dating back to Nov. 25, 1983.

■ The Fighting Irish had claimed the last six encounters between these programs until UT pulled off the upset of the nation's No. 6/6 team, 71-69, a year ago in Knoxville.

■ UT will attempt to end a three-game road skid vs. UND.

■ That Irish run had begun when #9/7 Notre Dame defeated the #4/4 Lady Vols, 73-59, in an Elite Eight matchup in Dayton, Ohio, on March 28, 2011.

■ The Lady Vols are 9-2 all-time in Knoxville, 8-3 at Notre Dame and 4-1 at neutral sites vs. the Irish. The teams have never played an overtime game.

■ The series has returned to a typical home and home rotation) after Notre Dame played back-to-back games at Thompson-Boling Arena in 2013 and 2014, and UT visited Notre Dame in 2015 and 2016.

■ The series has typically alternated away and home games since its inception, but five of the last 16 matchups have come at neutral sites.

■ Holly Warlick is seeking her second win vs. Notre Dame as head coach in her sixth game vs. the Irish.

■ UT (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008) and Notre Dame (2001) have combined for nine NCAA Championships.

■ These two teams have played only seven games that were decided by 10 or fewer points, with Tennessee winning five of them. The scores were: 62-57 UT on 11/24/84, 71-63 UT on 12/9/85, 85-82 UT on 1/12/92, 74-64 UT on 3/30/2008, 77-67 ND on 1/28/13, 88-77 ND on 1/19/15 and 71-69 UT on 1/16/17.

■ #1/1 Tennessee hit 7-of-8 three-pointers for a school-record percentage of 87.5% in a 105-70 victory at Notre Dame on Jan. 7, 1994.

■ UT's Angie Bjorklund knocked down seven threes at Notre Dame on Jan. 5, 2008, tying a (then) school-record (now tied for fourth) for most threes by a Lady Vol in a single game.

■ Tennessee is 109-27 all-time vs. ACC schools, going 1-2 last season (L-Va. Tech, W-Notre Dame, L-Louisville).

LAST MEETING BETWEEN UT AND ND

■ Jaime Nared drained the winning jumper with 10.3 seconds remaining, Diamond DeShields scored 20 points and Tennessee clawed its way back to seize a 71-69 upset win over No. 6/6 Notre Dame on Jan. 16, 2017, at Thompson-Boling Arena.

■ After trailing for most of the game, the Lady Vols (11-6) flipped the script on Notre Dame (16-3) in an exciting fourth quarter. The win was Tennessee's first against Notre Dame since March 30, 2008, ending a six-game losing streak to the Fighting Irish.

■ DeShields' high-energy play at both ends of the floor to start the fourth turned a nine point deficit (62-53) into a two-point deficit (62-60). DeShields had eight points, five rebounds, one block and one assist in the fourth quarter to spark the Tennessee comeback while Notre Dame was just 3-for-14 in the fourth.

■ With under five minutes remaining, Schaquilla Nunn made back-to-back layups off offensive rebounds and UT trailed just 65-64. Mercedes Russell made two clutch free throws with 2:32 to go to keep it a one-score game and Meme Jackson buried a corner 3-pointer with 1:22 left to put the Lady Vols up 69-67.

■ Notre Dame's Lindsay Allen quickly answered with a jumper to tie the game at 69-69. On UT's next possession, Nared connected from 15 feet to put Tennessee up, 71-69.

■ DeShields was 7-of-17 from the floor and had six boards and four assists to go with her game-high 20 points. Russell had 13 points and four rebounds. Jordan Reynolds had 12 points on an efficient 6-of-10 shooting night to go with seven rebounds and four assists. Nared added 12 points, five boards and two assists.

■ Marina Mabrey led Notre Dame with 17 points and her 3-point shooting (3-for-5) and mid-range

shooting kept the Fighting Irish in control for most of the contest. Arike Ogunbowale added 14 points.

LAST TIME AT NOTRE DAME

■ Despite a strong start, No. 13/15 Tennessee could not keep pace with hot-shooting No. 3/3 Notre Dame on Jan. 18, 2016, falling to the Fighting Irish, 79-66, at Purcell Pavilion.

■ Diamond DeShields paced the Lady Vols (11-6) with 17 points on 7-of-13 shooting. Bashaara Graves posted a double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds. Jaime Nared added 11 points.

■ Tennessee committed 20 turnovers in the loss, marking the fourth-straight game the Lady Vols had 19 or more miscues. UT out-rebounded Notre Dame (17-1), 36-32. The Fighting Irish were 19-of-25 from the free throw line, while the Lady Vols were 8-of-14.

■ Notre Dame led by as much as 25 points in the fourth quarter. The Fighting Irish shot 61.5 percent (16-of-26) from the field in the second half. Brianna Turner led the way, scoring 12 of her 14 points after halftime.

■ ND had six players in double figures with Turner and Arike Ogunbowale tying for the team lead at 14 points each.

■ The Lady Vols drew to within five points in the third quarter when Graves made a layup with 6:28 on the clock. Notre Dame closed the third quarter with a 13-2 run, however, building an 18-point lead at 57-39 that would never be relinquished.

NOTRE DAME RESET

■ Notre Dame has four players scoring in double figures, led by Arike Ogunbowale at 19.7 ppg.

■ Jessica Shepard is second (15.2), followed by Jackie Young (13.8) and Marina Mabrey (12.4).

■ Like Tennessee, the Irish survived an overtime battle with Marquette, prevailing 91-85 on Dec. 20.

UT beat the Golden Eagles, 101-99 in OT, on Nov. 23 in the Cancun Challenge.

■ Notre Dame is very accurate from the field, shooting 48.6 percent as a team and averaging 83.7 points per game.

■ Notre Dame gets to the free throw line well, averaging 15.2 makes per game and hitting 74 percent.

■ The Fighting Irish have had to overcome the loss of several key players due to injuries, including Brianna Turner, Mikayla Vaughn, Lili Thompson and Mychal Johnson.

■ Head coach Muffet McGraw is in her 31st season at Notre Dame and owns a 781-229 record. She is 869-270 in 36 years overall.

■ The Irish have been to seven NCAA Final Fours and claimed the 2001 championship while finishing second in 2011, 2012, 2014 and 2015.

ND LAST TIME OUT (ND 89, BC 60)

■ No. 2/2 Notre Dame downed Boston College, 89-60, in a Sunday matinee at Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center.

■ The Irish (16-2, 5-1) used a dominant 30-point third quarter to surge past the Eagles (6-11, 1-3) for their fifth Atlantic Coast Conference win and 17th straight victory on their home court.

■ Jessica Shepard finished with 24 points and eight rebounds en route to her third game of the season with 20-plus points. Shepard has recorded double-digit points in 14 games this season.

■ Notre Dame came out of the gates firing on all cylinders, opening play with a 9-0 run against the Eagles. Arike Ogunbowale's seven points in the period led all Irish scorers and gave the Irish a 21-12 lead. She finished with 18 for the game, while Danielle Patterson and Marina Mabrey added 10 each.

■ The Irish parlayed 26 offensive boards into a 26-0 advantage in second chance points.

LAST GAME RECAP/NOTES

TENN. LAST TIME OUT (UT 86, USC 70)

■ Senior Mercedes Russell recorded a 16-point, 12-rebound double-double to lead No. 6/6 Tennessee to an 86-70 victory over No. 9/8 South Carolina on Sunday at Colonial Life Arena.

■ Jaime Nared added 21 points as the Lady Vols (16-1, 4-1 SEC) bounced back from their first loss of the season with a win over the defending national champions and their second consecutive victory in Columbia. UT was fueled by a balanced attack, with five different players reaching double figures.

■ Tyasha Harris put on an offensive display for South Carolina (14-3, 3-2 SEC) with a game-high 28 points and four assists. The Gamecocks were able to cut the deficit to four with under six minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, but Tennessee relied on strong defense and timely scoring to end the game on a 16-4 run.

■ UT's freshman trio of Evina Westbrook, Renna Davis, and Anastasia Hayes had a strong showing in the second half, combining for 29 points over the final 20 minutes. Westbrook finished with 14 points, including 2-for-2 shooting from behind the arc, as well as a game-high five assists, while Davis and Hayes netted 11 points apiece.

■ The fourth quarter proved to be the up-and-down affair that many expected in this top-10 matchup. South Carolina upped the pressure quickly, and went on a 7-0 run highlighted by an Alexis Jennings and-one put-back to bring USC back to within four. However, it would prove to be the closest the Gamecocks could get to the Lady Vols, who were able to close out the final six minutes with a 16-4 run. Westbrook continued her strong play through the late stages of the fourth quarter, scoring nine points during the run.

■ Jennings finished with 12 points and seven rebounds for the Gamecocks, while LeLe Grissett added 10 points with eight boards.

THREE FOR THE MONEY

■ Tennessee went 6-of-12 to shoot 50 percent from behind the arc against South Carolina. Evina Westbrook and Kortney Dunbar were a perfect 2-of-2 from three, while Meme Jackson contributed another two on the day. Dunbar hit two key treys during a three-minute appearance just before halftime.

SHARP SHOOTING

■ The Lady Vols posted a sizzling .564 field goal percentage at South Carolina, their second-best of the season. Tennessee came into the game shooting .471 on the year.

WHO YA GONNA GUARD?

■ Tennessee had five players in double figures and eight of the nine Lady Vols that saw action scored at least six points. This marks the fourth time this season Tennessee has had five players in double digits and keeps its streak of having at least three players score 10+ points perfect thus far this season.

BEST SEASON STARTS BY UT

■ Tennessee recorded its best start since 2005-06 and had the fourth-best opening effort in school history with its 15-0 record before losing to Texas A&M on Jan. 11.

■ The 16-1 mark is UT's best record through 17 games since 2009-10. That unit went 16-1 before dropping its second contest.

TENNESSEE IN THE NAT'L. RANKINGS

■ **UT stood at No. 6 in the AP Poll and fell one spot to No. 7 in the USA Today Coaches Poll, released on Jan. 15 and Jan. 16, respectively.**

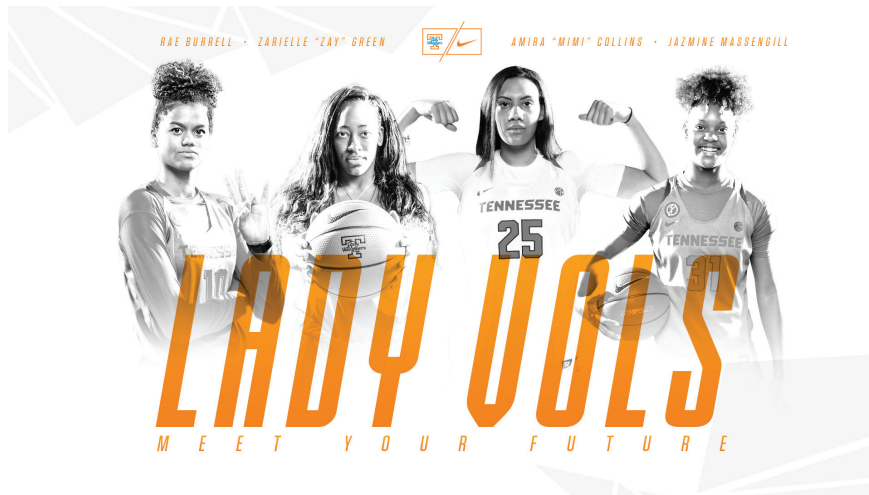

GETTING OFF TO GREAT STARTS

■ Tennessee has made a habit of getting off to great starts. A 383-226 first quarter tally over opponents backs that up.

■ UT has led at the end of the first quarter in 14 of 17 games, and it has led in three SEC games while trailing in one (A&M) and tying in one (Vandy).

■ The Lady Vols began the game vs. Vandy, 8-0.

■ **UT shot out to a 10-0 lead on Kentucky and ended the first period up, 26-7.**

■ Holly Warlick's squad surged to a 21-9 first quarter lead over Stanford en route to a 23-14 edge after the opening 10 minutes.

■ UT burst ahead 22-7 en route to a 27-16 first quarter advantage over Long Beach State.

■ The Lady Vols got out to 6-0 and 12-2 leads early against Texas.

■ The Lady Vols bolted to a 12-0 advantage against Troy, leading to a 34-15 first quarter score vs. the Trojans.

■ UT started the previous game 12-0 vs. Alabama State en route to a 30-12 first quarter, followed by a 31-14 second stanza on Dec. 3. The 31 was (then) the fourth-highest point total in a quarter in school history.

■ The Big Orange posted a 22-8 first period vs. UCA.

■ UT went up 10-0 to open the Marquette game.

■ The Lady Vols were up 6-0 on Oklahoma State en route to a 24-10 first quarter lead.

■ The Big Orange burst out to a 7-0 advantage over South Dakota en route to a 24-9 first quarter.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

■ On the season, Holly Warlick's squad has held opponents to an average of 63.1 points per game, with nine foes failing to score more than 61 and only six scoring above 70 (Marquette, 99, in OT; Texas, 75; Stanford, 71; Vanderbilt, 73; Texas A&M, 79 (OT); and South Carolina, 70).

■ **UT has held 15 opponents to 41 percent or lower field goal percentage this season.**

■ Tennessee faced foes who entered scoring 91.8 (Troy) and 93.0 (Texas) points per game and held those squads to 69 and 75, respectively.

■ The Lady Vols held S.C., which was averaging 82.1 ppg. to 70 and 40.6 percent shooting. Star A'ja Wilson missed that game, however, due to injury.

■ UT recently held Texas A&M to 36.5 percent from the field.

■ Troy hit only 29 percent from the field vs. UT, while Texas shot 36.8 percent.

■ UT held Stanford to 39.7 on its home floor.

■ Tennessee ranks No. 5 nationally and No. 2 in the SEC in field goal percentage defense at 33.5.

■ The Lady Vols are No. 1 nationally and first in the SEC in three-point field goal percentage defense at 23.2.

■ Tennessee set a school record for fewest points allowed in a second half, giving up only 10 to Central Arkansas on Nov. 30.

■ All 10 of those points came in the third quarter, as the Lady Vols shut out the Sugar Bears in the

FIRST NO. 1 SIGNING CLASS SINCE '08

■ Tennessee's 2017 women's basketball signing class was ranked No. 1 in the nation by several recruiting services, including espnW HoopGurlz and Prospectsnation.com.

■ The class is the highest rated of the Holly Warlick era, which was preceded by the No. 3 group from 2013 and a No. 6-rated class in 2014.

■ UT last signed a No. 1 class in 2008, when Glory Johnson (No. 3), Amber Gray (No. 4), Shekinna Stricklen (No. 8), Alicia Manning (No. 15), Alyssia Brewer (No. 20) and Briana Bass (No. 33) joined a program led by Pat Summitt with Warlick and current assistant Dean Lockwood as assistants.

■ UT signed four players, with each one ranked among the top 11 players in the country by Prospectsnation.com. Three of the four were rated in the top 12 by espnW HoopGurlz, with the other player ranked at No. 57.

■ New to the program are 6-0 guard Evina Westbrook of Salem, Ore./South Salem H.S. (No. 1 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 2 by Prospectsnation.com and espnW HoopGurlz), 5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes of Murfreesboro, Tenn./Riverdale H.S. (No. 6 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 9 by espnW HoopGurlz), 6-2 wing Rennia Davis of Jacksonville, Fla./Ribault H.S. (ranked No. 9 overall by Prospectsnation.com and No. 12 by espnW HoopGurlz) and 6-4 post player Kasiyahna Kushkituah of Atlanta, Ga./St. Francis H.S. (No. 9 by All-Star Girls Report/No. 11 by Prospectsnation.com/No. 57 by espnW HoopGurlz).

■ **Westbrook was picked by Sports Illustrated as the preseason 2018 Freshman of the Year.**

■ Under Holly Warlick, the Lady Vols were No. 3 in 2013, No. 6 in 2014, No. 13 in 2015 (signed #12 & #49 players), not ranked in 2016 (three late signees, including JUCO All-American Cheridene Green), and No. 1 in 2017.

■ The 2013 class included No. 1 Mercedes Russell, while the 2014 group had No. 6 Jaime Nared.

UT FOLLOWS WITH NO. 3 2018 CLASS

■ After landing the nation's number one class in 2017, Tennessee followed that up with a class ranked as high as No. 3 by recruiting experts.

■ **These are the best back-to-back signing classes for UT since a No. 5-rated unit in Pat Summitt's final season (2012 signing class) and a No. 3 collection in Warlick's first year as head coach (2013 signing class/Mercedes Russell - No. 1).**

■ Zarielle "Zay" Green, a 6-0 guard from Duncanville, Texas (Duncanville H.S.); Jazmine Massengill, a 6-0 point guard from Chattanooga (Hamilton Heights Christian Academy); and Amira "Mimi" Collins, a 6-3 forward from Waldorf, Md. (Paul VI Catholic H.S. [Fairfax, Va.]) signed Nov. 8. Rae Burrell, a 6-1 wing from Henderson, Nev. (Liberty H.S.) made it official on Nov. 10.

■ Green is the highest ranked player, standing 9th by Blue Star, No. 13 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 23 by ProspectsNation.com. She committed on Oct. 23 after making Knoxville her final visit.

■ Massengill is next, coming in 11th by ProspectsNation.com, No. 22 by Blue Star and No. 26 by espnW HoopGurlz. She made her intention to attend UT known on Jan. 15, 2017.

■ Collins, UT's first commitment of the group back on Dec. 7, 2016, is ranked No. 9 by ProspectsNation.com, while Blue Star and espnW HoopGurlz slot her at No. 50 and No. 69, respectively.

■ Burrell closed out UT's four-player class, committing on Nov. 6 following a visit to campus Nov. 3-5. A player whose stock is on the rise after an impressive summer tournament showing, she is rated No. 44 by espnW HoopGurlz and No. 119 by ProspectsNation.com.

final stanza, marking the first time UT had "pitched a shutout" in a quarter.

■ UCA finished with 34 points for the game, marking the 10th-lowest total ever scored by a Tennessee foe.

■ UT's forced Central Arkansas and Alabama State into 24 and 23 turnovers, respectively. Those totals are the highest this season.

IF THE SEASON ENDED TODAY...

■ Tennessee's rebound average (48.2) would rank No. 1 in Lady Vol history. The record is 46.9 (1992-93).

■ UT's scoring average (84.8) would rank No. 4 mark in school history.

■ Among all-time UT seniors, Jaime Nared (17.6) and Mercedes Russell (17.2) would rank No. 7 and No. 9 in scoring, while Russell (8.8) and Nared (8.5) would stand No. 6 and 10 in rebounding.

■ These all-time statistical rankings are listed on page 167-169 of the media guide.

FRESHMEN STARTERS

■ Tennessee has started freshmen Evina Westbrook and RENNIA DAVIS the first 17 games this season.

■ Only four times in history have the Lady Vols started two freshmen in the season opener, with that occurring this season as well as in 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, Bridgette Gordon) and 1980-81 (Pat Hatmaker, Mary Ostrowski).

■ Head coach Holly Warlick now has started five freshmen in season openers during her first six seasons, including Andraya Carter (2012-13 vs. Chattanooga), Alexa Middleton (2013-14 vs. Penn), Te'a Cooper (2015-16 vs. Central Arkansas) and RENNIA DAVIS and Evina Westbrook (2017-18 vs. ETSU).

■ Freshman guard Anastasia Hayes is one of the team's leading scorers and is second in assists, providing Tennessee with a starting-caliber guard coming off the bench.

■ There have been five previous years where multiple freshmen have been listed among the team's primary starters for the season, one of which included three newcomers (1984-85) in the starting lineup of record for the year.

■ Those years included 2008-09 (Glory Johnson, Shekinna Stricklen), 2004-05 (Nicky Anosike, Alexis Hornbuckle), 1997-98 (Tamika Catchings, Semeka Randall), 1985-86 (Sheila Frost, Bridgette Gordon) and 1984-85 (Karla Horton, Dawn Marsh, Kathy Spinks). The 2004-05 season would most likely have had a third rookie starter if Candace Parker hadn't sat out due to injury.

HOME SWEET HOME

■ This is the 31st season that the Tennessee women's and men's basketball teams have called Thompson-Boling Arena home, and the Lady Vols own a 437-35 mark (.926) in the venue.

■ UT is 84-12 (.875) there during Holly Warlick's sixth season at the helm and has won 11 straight at T-BA, dating back to last season.

■ The Lady Vols have a 590-59 (.909) home record in contests played at Thompson-Boling Arena, Stokely Athletics Center and Alumni Gym.

■ UT finished 13-3 at home in 2016-17.

■ Capacity at Thompson-Boling Arena is 21,678.

■ UT has led the nation in attendance 19 times in the past 26 years, finishing second the past three years after an 11-season run at No. 1.

■ Tennessee ranked second in the nation in home attendance last season with an average of 9,184 through 16 dates and currently ranks fourth at 8,342 per contest behind South Carolina (12,825), UConn (11,514) and Iowa State (9,732).

A CLOSER LOOK AT THE LADY VOLS

■ Tennessee returns two starters (Mercedes Russell, Jaime Nared) and another part-time starter (Meme Jackson) from last year's squad, which wound up 20-12 after falling in the NCAA Second Round. The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris.

■ This year's newcomers include the nation's No. 1 ranked recruiting class as well as a two-time JUCO All-American forward who redshirted last season due to a knee injury.

■ UT's consensus No. 1-ranked freshman class includes the No. 2 (6-0 guard Evina Westbrook), No. 7 (5-7 guard Anastasia Hayes), No. 12 (6-2 wing RENNIA DAVIS) and No. 57 (6-4 center Kasiyahna Kushkituah) players in the nation, as ranked in the HoopGurlz espnW 100. All four players were McDonald's All-Americans and are expected to see ex-

tensive playing time in their first collegiate season. Davis and Westbrook, as a matter of fact, earned starts in the Carson-Newman exhibition game.

■ Redshirt junior Cheridene Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before redshirting at Tennessee last season. The power forward should offer immediate help inside.

■ The 2016-17 Lady Vols defeated three of the four teams in last year's NCAA Final Four (Stanford, South Carolina, Mississippi State) and also toppled Elite Eight squad Notre Dame as well.

■ The Big Orange women were 10-6 in league play a year ago and finished fifth in the SEC standings.

■ UT lost starting guards Jordan Reynolds (WNBA 2nd Round) and Diamond DeShields (signed pro contract in June) as well as reserve forward Schaquilla Nunn (WNBA 3rd Round) to the professional ranks. Guard Alexa Middleton, a part-time starter, and redshirt sophomore guard Te'a Cooper are no longer with the program. Cooper missed all of last season with a knee injury.

BREAKING DOWN THE RETURNEES

■ Senior Mercedes Russell, a 6-foot-6 center from Springfield Ore., and classmate Jaime Nared, a 6-2 wing from Portland, Ore., are Tennessee's top returning players and should be in the conversation for All-SEC and All-America honors.

■ Russell and Nared are preseason first-team All-SEC picks by the coaches this season.

■ Additionally, Russell was a member of the five-player All-SEC First Team, as chosen by the media, and was a third-team preseason All-America pick by College Sports Madness.

■ Russell was named to the Preseason Lisa Leslie Award and Wade Trophy Watch Lists, while Nared was picked for the Preseason Cheryl Miller Award Watch List. Both players were on the John R. Wooden Award Preseason & Midseason Lists and the Citizen Naismith Trophy Watch List.

■ Russell was second on the team in scoring (16.1 ppg.) and led the squad in rebounding (9.7) a year ago while setting a Tennessee record for a junior with 19 double-doubles. She was named an honorable mention All-American by AP and the WBCA as well as earning second-team All-SEC.

■ Russell now ranks third at UT with 38 career double-doubles, a total that ranks her second among active SEC players behind South Carolina's A'ja Wilson.

■ Nared, meanwhile, was third in scoring and

second in rebounding for UT last season with 15.6 points and 6.9 rebounds per contest. She was second on the squad with 37 three-pointers and had eight double-doubles as a junior.

■ A second-team All-SEC pick by the coaches last season, **Nared hit the game-winning shot vs. #6/6 Notre Dame and game-clinching free throws vs. #4/4 South Carolina and #17/23 Kentucky in 2016-17. She also had a career-high 30 points in UT's upset of #3/2 Mississippi State in Starkville and 28 vs. #13/12 Louisville in the NCAA Second Round.**

■ Junior guard/forward Meme Jackson started 19 games a year ago and averaged 4.7 points and 1.8 rebounds while ranking fourth on the team with 24 three-pointers. Jackson is one of the team's quickest defenders and should help set the tone on that end this season.

■ Also back are 6-2 senior forward Kortney Dunbar, who has hit 50 three-pointers over the past three seasons, and 6-3 sophomore center Kamera Harris, who saw limited action a year ago but hopes to add depth in the paint in 2017-18.

GREEN READY AFTER REDSHIRT YEAR

■ Redshirt junior forward Cheridene Green is ready to play after sitting out last season rehabbing a knee injury suffered in 2015-16.

■ The 6-3 Green was a two-time All-American at ASA College in Brooklyn, N.Y., averaging 20.5 points and 16.5 rebounds per contest as a sophomore before having her season ended prematurely. She redshirted at Tennessee last season, and the power forward should offer immediate help inside for the Lady Vols.

■ Green was a first-team All-America selection in 2015-16 and second team in 2014-15.

■ She ranked first in the NJCAA in rebounds, third in blocks and eighth in scoring in 2015-16.

■ Green, from London, England, is the first international player in Lady Vol history and the fifth junior college transfer for the program, joining Zandra Montgomery (1977), Shannon Bobbitt (2006), Alberta Auguste (2006) and Jasmine Phillips (2012).

NARED, RUSSELL REPRESENT USA

■ Seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell were members of the USA U23 National Team that won the U24 Four Nations Tournament over the summer in Tokyo, Japan.

■ The Lady Vol duo started all three games and helped the USA defeat Australia on Aug. 12, 78-60; Canada on Aug. 13, 107-61; and host country Japan, 103-71, on Aug. 15.

■ Russell (6.3 rpg.) and Nared (5.0) were the team's top two rebounders on a 12-player roster with minutes distributed evenly.

■ Nared averaged 7.3 points per game, shooting 44 percent from the field, 33 percent on threes and 75 percent from the free throw line.

■ Russell tossed in 5.3 points per contest, shooting a team-leading 64 percent from the field.

■ It marked Russell's fourth appearance internationally with USA Basketball, while Nared enjoyed her first experience.

SENIORS DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS

■ Seniors Mercedes Russell and Jaime Nared had opportunities during the offseason to develop their leadership skills.

■ Nared capped a year of membership in the VOLeaders Academy with a leadership trip to Vietnam this summer, where UT student-athletes worked with children in orphanages, volunteered at sport skill camps and visited with university students.

■ The VOLeaders Academy, a first-of-its-kind program, is a dynamic partnership between the UT Center for Leadership and Service, the Center

for Sport, Peace and Society and the Tennessee Athletics Department.

■ Now in its second year, the program aims to inspire student-athletes to find ways to use their passion of sport and their influence to enact positive change that transcends their athletic success.

■ Russell, meanwhile, was one of 68 SEC student-athletes participating in a joint meeting of the SEC Student-Athlete Leadership Councils and the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) in July.

■ This marked the first joint meeting of these groups since they were introduced by Commissioner Greg Sankey in 2016. Leadership councils for the sports of football and men's and women's basketball were created to provide student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and conference office staff.

ALWAYS A CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

■ Tennessee's 2017-18 regular-season schedule will include 21 of 29 games vs. teams that saw postseason action a year ago.

■ Sixteen of those games are vs. 2017 NCAA Tournament teams, including NCAA national champion South Carolina (home and away), NCAA runner-up Mississippi State (home) and a third Final Four team in Stanford (away).

■ UT will play three defending regular-season league champions in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC) and Central Arkansas (Southland) during the 2016-17.

■ The Lady Vols must face seven defending conference tournament champs in South Carolina (SEC), Notre Dame (ACC), Central Arkansas (Southland), Stanford (Pac-12), Marquette (BIG EAST), Long Beach State (Big West) and Troy (Sun Belt).

■ Tennessee opens the season with seven of its first 10 games at home and the other three taking place in the Riviera Division at the Cancun Challenge in Mexico Nov. 23-25.

■ UT made its second in-season trip outside the U.S. during the Holly Warlick era and third overall, winning the Cancun Challenge Riviera Tournament with a 3-0 record. UT went 2-0 to win the Lucaya Division championship at the Junkanoo Jam at Freeport, Bahamas, during the 2013-14 season and went 3-0 during a tour of Italy during the summer of 2015.

■ UT will have 15 televised games, including seven on ESPN networks, seven on the SEC Network and another on the Pac-12 Networks. The other 14 games will be streamed live by various entities, including 11 of them on SECN+.

SIX McDONALD'S A-As ON ROSTER

■ Tennessee has six McDonald's All-Americans on its 2017-18 roster.

■ Those players are seniors Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell as well as freshmen Rennia Davis, Anastasia Hayes, Kasiyahna Kushkituah and Evina Westbrook.

■ This is the first time an entire Lady Vol signing class consisted only of McDonald's All-Americans.

■ The total of four McDonald's honorees ranks behind only the five in the 2004 and 2008 classes.

■ Russell was the 2013 McDonald's Game MVP, leading the West to victory with 16 points.

■ Nared led the West to a win in 2014 with 15 points but came up just short in MVP voting.

■ Davis, Hayes and Kushkituah helped the East defeat Westbrook's West squad, 80-74, in Chicago on March 29, 2017.

■ Tennessee now has had 31 McDonald's All-Americans on its rosters through the years.

■ Holly Warlick has signed nine McDonald's All-Americans as head coach and added another via transfer for 10 in her sixth season as head coach.

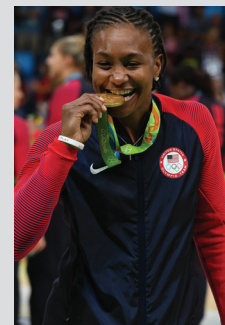

EVERY U.S. OLYMPIC TEAM HAS HAD A LADY VOL ON IT

VOL SCHOLAR PATCHES

■ Five of 10 players on this year's team are eligible to wear the Vol Scholar patch, which is an insignia on the back of the uniform that recognizes a student-athlete's academic success.

■ The patch is awarded to sophomore-and-above student-athletes who have earned either a cumulative 3.0 or a semester 3.0 in either of the previous two terms.

■ Kortney Dunbar, Kamera Harris, Meme Jackson, Jaime Nared and Mercedes Russell currently wear the patch on their uniforms.

LADY VOL LEGEND JOINS STAFF

■ Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Bridgette Gordon, who helped Tennessee capture the first two of its eight NCAA titles as a student-athlete, returned to her alma mater as an assistant on July 20, 2017.

■ Gordon, a 1988 U.S. Olympic gold medalist with 15 years of experience in the coaching ranks, came to Rocky Top from Wichita State, where she spent seven seasons, including the last three as the recruiting coordinator.

■ Gordon, who served as associate head coach a year ago, helped WSU land the highest-ranked recruiting class in program history when Blue Star Basketball rated the 2012-13 signing group at No. 47 in the nation.

■ In addition to her work as a gifted recruiter, Gordon helped the Shockers make their first three appearances ever in the NCAA Tournament while capturing the program's first three regular- and post-season conference championships. The Shockers advanced to postseason play five times during her stint in Wichita.

■ Prior to her role at WSU (2010-17), Gordon was an assistant and recruiting coordinator at Georgia State (2007-10) and at Stetson (2001-06) as well as serving as a WNBA scout in 2006-07.

UT SAYS GOODBYE TO FIVE PLAYERS

■ UT lost 2016-17 starting guards Jordan Reynolds (WNBA 2nd Round) and Diamond DeShields (signed pro contract in June) as well as reserve forward Schaquilla Nunn (WNBA 3rd Round) to the professional ranks.

■ Guard Alexa Middleton and redshirt sophomore guard Te'a Cooper are no longer with the program. Cooper missed all of last season with a knee injury after averaging 8.6 ppg. as a freshman in 2015-16.

■ DeShields was a two-time All-SEC performer and the team's leading scorer at 17.4 points per game a year ago.

■ Reynolds averaged 7.0 points, 5.2 rebounds and 4.5 assists starting at point guard, leading the SEC in assist-to-turnover ratio (2.7).

■ Nunn averaged 4.8 points and 4.4 rebounds in 32 games after transferring from Winthrop.

■ Middleton played in 32 games, starting 13, and averaged 7.9 points and 2.3 rebounds while hitting 42 three-points last season.

UT CONTINUES WNBA PIPELINE

■ Jordan Reynolds and Schaquilla Nunn became the 43rd and 44th Tennessee Lady Volunteers to become WNBA players.

■ Reynolds was taken with the 19th pick of the second round by the Atlanta Dream, while Nunn was chosen 25th overall in the third round by the San Antonio Stars during the April 2017 draft.

■ They became the 38th and 39th players in UT history and the seventh and eighth coached by Holly Warlick to be drafted by a WNBA team.

■ Warlick's draftees include Reynolds and Nunn (2017), Bashaara Graves (2016), Cierra Burdick, Isabelle Harrison and Ariel Massengale (2015),

Meighan Simmons (2014) and Kamiko Williams (2013).

■ Diamond DeShields, a 2017 graduate, signed with a professional team in Turkey, while 2016 graduate Nia Moore signed with a team in Poland.

LADY VOLS HAVE WON 35 SEC TITLES

■ Tennessee has won a combined total of 35 SEC Championships, claiming its 18th all-time SEC regular-season title in 2014-15.

■ That regular season co-championship came on the heels of Tennessee's SEC Tournament title during the 2013-14 campaign.

■ The Lady Vols have won SEC regular-season championships in four of the past eight seasons.

■ UT has 17 league tournament titles to its credit, including three straight from 2010 to 2012 and four of the last eight.

■ Since 1985, there have been only seven seasons where Tennessee didn't win at least a regular season or tournament title. Those came in 1986, 1987, 1991, 1997, 2009, 2016 and 2017.

■ The Lady Vols have swept SEC regular-season and tournament championships on eight occasions. Those years included 1980, 1985, 1994, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2010 and 2011.

■ Tennessee stands first in regular season and tournament titles in conference history with Georgia ranking second with seven regular season trophies and Vanderbilt standing sixth in tourney hardware with six pieces.

LADY VOLS EARN POSTSEASON ACCLAIM

■ The SEC coaches postseason awards were announced on February 28, and each member of Tennessee's "Big Three" was voted to the 2017 Coaches All-SEC Team.

■ Redshirt junior Diamond DeShields garnered first-team accolades, while junior Jaime Nared and redshirt junior Mercedes Russell were selected to the second team. This marked the first time any of the trio had been selected to the coaches all-conference squad.

■ When the WBCA announced its 2017 All-America Team, DeShields and Russell were awarded honorable mention honors.

■ The AP named DeShields and Russell to its All-SEC Second Team.

■ Senior Jordan Reynolds represented the Lady Vols on the SEC's Community Service Team.

■ Nared was named SEC Co-Player of the Week on January 31 after posting a then career-high 27 points to go with five rebounds, three assists and three steals as the Lady Vols upset #4 South Carolina in Columbia.

■ Russell earned SEC Player of the Week honors on Jan. 3 after averaging a double-double of 21.0 points and 10.0 rebounds to help UT stretch its winning streak to five games.

SIX MAKE SEC ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

■ UT had six on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.

■ The group included Diamond DeShields, Kortney Dunbar, Jordan Reynolds and Mercedes Russell, as well as newcomers redshirt senior Schaquilla Nunn and freshman Kamera Harris.

UT ONE OF THREE WITH FOUR TOP-10 WINS

■ Tennessee was one of only three teams during the 2016-17 regular season last year to beat four or more top-10 teams, and UT was unranked in all four wins.

■ Included are wins over two top-5 teams, marking the first time the Lady Vols have done that in a season since 2004-05 (two also).

■ The Lady Vols came from 11-down to defeat #10/10 Stanford in Knoxville on Dec. 18 (59-51). UT came from 15-down (14 in the third quarter) to beat #6/6 Notre Dame in Knoxville on Jan. 16 (71-

69). UT also came from nine down to defeat #4/4 South Carolina in Columbia on Jan. 30 (76-74) and cruised past #3/2 Mississippi State on Senior Day in Starkville on Feb. 26 (82-64).

■ The other teams accomplishing that feat were South Carolina (5) and UConn (4).

■ UT's victory over #3/2 Mississippi State on Feb. 26 was the highest ranked team the Lady Vols have beaten since #6/6 UT defeated #3/2 Stanford in Knoxville, 82-72 in overtime, on Dec. 19, 2010.

■ The victory over #3/2 MSU was the highest ranked squad Tennessee has beaten in a true road game since #2/2 UT took down #1/1 Duke at Cameron Indoor Stadium on Jan. 24, 2004.

■ The win over Notre Dame ended a six-game losing skid to the Fighting Irish. With victories over South Carolina and Mississippi State, the Lady Vols halted a pair of three-game losing streaks to their conference foes.

20 WINS IN 41 STRAIGHT SEASONS

■ UT finished with 20 wins in 2016-17, which was the 41st consecutive season the Lady Vols had reached the 20-victory plateau.

UT HAS MADE ALL 36 NCAA BRACKETS

■ UT is the only team to have played in all 36 NCAA Division I women's basketball tournaments.

■ The Lady Vols are 124-28 all-time in NCAA play, making the Elite Eight in three of the past five seasons.

■ UT has been to 34 Sweet 16s, 28 Elite Eights and 18 NCAA Final Fours in 36 seasons of NCAA play.

■ The Big Orange program ranks second in NCAA Division I women's basketball with eight national championships (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007, 2008).

In year six at the helm of Tennessee women's basketball, Holly Warlick has built a very impressive résumé in her young head coaching career. Her worksheet contains accomplishments few coaches have achieved in their entire careers, much less as first-time head coaches.

Those successes verify that Warlick was the right choice to take the reins at Tennessee and that she and her staff have the acumen to run a championship program. A disciple of the legendary Pat Summitt, Warlick has maintained the core values of her former coach, co-worker and friend while at the same time employing her own personality, style and competitive energy to coach today's players.

Whether as an All-America player from 1976-80, an assistant and associate head coach for 27 seasons from 1985 to 2012, or head coach from 2012 to present, Warlick has thrived during her more than three decades in the spotlight at Rocky Top. She enters her sixth year as head coach and 37th season of overall affiliation with the program hoping to build upon last season's NCAA Second Round finish.

Warlick was announced as head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as women's hoops legend Pat Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture the following day at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

Since that day, Warlick and her staff have worked tirelessly to maintain the program's lofty expectations. Despite being picked to finish as low as fifth in the SEC and 20th nationally, her first squad won the 2013 SEC regular season title and made the NCAA Elite Eight, finishing 27-8/14-2 despite injuries that forced players to miss a combined 53 games. Her 2014 edition went 29-6/13-3, winning an SEC Tournament title and making it to the NCAA Sweet 16.

In 2015, her third team reached the 30-win plateau at 30-6/15-1, claiming a share of the regular-season SEC crown and charting the second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in her three seasons. Her last two units have finished 22-14 and 20-12, advancing to the NCAA Elite Eight and Second Round, respectively.

During Warlick's first five seasons, eight Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Jordan Reynolds (2nd Rd.) and Schaquilla Nunn (2nd Rd.) were selected in 2017; Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd.)

went in 2016; Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd.), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd.) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd.) were chosen in 2015; Mercedes Simmons (3rd Rd.) was taken in 2014 and Kamiko Williams (2nd Rd.) was selected in 2013. Simmons was twice named SEC Player of the Year (2013, 2014) during her UT career.

On the international scene, Warlick is a gold medal coach, and two of her players joined her in earning that hardware. Warlick served as an assistant, while Mercedes Russell and Diamond DeShields played on the undefeated (6-0) 2015 USA World University Games Team in South Korea.

From 2012-17, Tennessee also has produced in the classroom, with 15 players earning a total of 32 spots on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In 2015, Cierra Burdick became Warlick's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, garnering second-team honors and also being named a UT Torchbearer, the most prestigious accolade a student at Tennessee can receive.

Warlick has been recognized personally for her performance. In 2013, members of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named her the Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year. She was selected by the AP and league coaches as the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Coach of the Year, and members of the Tennessee Sports Writers Association also chose her as TSWA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year that season.

In May 2017, Warlick was recognized for her years of distinguished leadership, volunteer activities, philanthropic work and professional accomplishments that have contributed to improving the quality of life in Tennessee. She was named the 2017 Tennessee Woman of Distinction at the 32nd annual Chattanooga Women of Distinction Awards luncheon.

Warlick and her staff also continue to build for the future on the recruiting trail. They have welcomed 10 McDonald's All-Americans in five signing classes (through spring 2017) and feature two of the top players in the 2013 (Mercedes Russell, No. 1) and 2014 (Jaime Nared, No. 6) signing classes. All four members of the No. 1-ranked 2017 signing class were McDonald's All-Americans, including the No. 2 player in Evina Westbrook and the No. 7 rated standout in Anastasia Hayes.

After Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball as an assistant on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23, 2011, announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, an SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

It's worth noting that Warlick was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she had held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first

time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki (Caldwell) Fargas, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

Warlick and Fargas created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$150,000. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips from the Badlands to Las Vegas and from Knoxville to Key West, Fla., New Orleans, Niagara Falls and, most recently in 2013 and 2014, Panama City, Fla.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Fargas presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund. At Tennessee's "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 17, 2013, three checks worth \$15,000 were presented by Champions for a Cause to the UT Breast Health Outreach Program, Kay Yow Cancer Foundation and the Brady James Foundation to help raise money for breast cancer research. Those presentations to organizations have become an annual event, thanks to fundraising efforts and the generosity of many.

Warlick also presented a special pink basketball to her sister, Marion Ferrill, prior to the start of that game in 2013. Ferrill was diagnosed with breast cancer in the fall of 2012 and was pronounced cancer free on Sept. 30 after undergoing surgery shortly after her diagnosis.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors, it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT.

It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as an All-America Lady Vol point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard ever to play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

- *UT ranks eighth among Power Five schools with a 12-5 NCAA Tournament record during the past five seasons.*
- *Warlick's career SEC (.750, 60-20) winning percentage ranks her first among all SEC women's head coaches.*
- *Tennessee has claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first five seasons, winning regular-season crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.*

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Tennessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees enshrined into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School, it was a dream-come-true.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including the 2016-17 season, Warlick has invested 36 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team as an assistant came from her work with the guards. Simmons, Ariel Massengale, Shekinna Stricklen, Kara Lawson, Angie Bjorklund and Shanna Zolman are just a few of the successful players Warlick helped recruit and coach as an assistant coach.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who ended up walking on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball.

Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (number 22) at the end of her career in 1980. Bearden, her prep alma mater in Knoxville, retired Warlick's high school jersey (also No. 22) prior to a home football game on Oct. 26, 2012.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 36 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player (1977, 1979, 1980) or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior sea-

son. As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).

A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick possesses vast international playing experience as well. In addition to being a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, which did not compete in the Moscow Olympics, Warlick and the 1980 U.S. team won gold at the 1980 FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

She also captured a gold medal playing for the USA at the 1979 FIBA World Championship, marking the first gold medal for the USA at the FIBA World Championships since 1957 and breaking a streak of five-straight golds by the USSR, a silver medal at the 1979 Pan American Games and gold at the 1979 R. William Jones Cup. Additionally, she served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the distinct honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville as it made its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga.

Post-collegiately, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Fargas.
