

2005 NOTRE DAME BASEBALL — vs. Villanova (April 26; 9:30 a.m. doubleheader)

MONDAY MORNING WAKEUP CALL – The Notre Dame baseball team (23-15, 9-4 BIG EAST) will play its second Monday doubleheader of the 2005 BIG EAST season and will be hoping for better results than the previous time (when the Irish lost twice at Rutgers) ... the Irish are in the midst of a 13-game homestand ... ND is slated to start sophomore RHP Dan Kapala is Monday's first game (series finale TBA) while VU will counter with sophomore RHPs Kevin Mulvey and Mike Loree ... Paul Mainieri, in his 11th season at ND and 23rd overall as a college head coach, heads into Monday's twin-bill game with an **802-466-2 career** record (.632) that includes **471-187-1 (.716) with the Irish** ... he recently became the 27th active Div. 1 coach with 800-plus career wins as a college head baseball coach.

HOT CORNER HOT STREAK – Freshman 3B Brett Lilley finally made an error at 3B (in the first game vs. Villanova ... Lilley has started at the hot corner during the current 9-1 streak (he started at second base in the first 28 games) ... since Lilley's shift to the hot corner, he and the other leftside infielder (junior SS Greg Lopez) have combined to make just one error each in 103 fielding chances ... ND's team defense also has surged with Lilley at third base, as the Irish own a .976 fielding pct. in the current 10-game run (10 errors) after a .950 fielding pct. and 54 errors in the first 28 games ... the ND defense has made 0-1 errors in nine of the past 10 games, plus a three-error game vs. Purdue.

TALL TOM TERRIFIC – Junior LHP Tom Thornton is the first pitcher in the 11-year Paul Mainieri era to toss three consecutive 9-inning complete-game victories ... Thornton's season ERA has dropped from 5.59 to 3.84 during his stretch of three straight 9-inning CGs ... he entered last week with the 6th-best conference ERA among BIG EAST pitchers, with that number dropping from 2.40 to 2.31 after the win over Villanova.

HOME-RUN HERO – Craig Cooper's 12th-inning HR beat Purdue last week at Coveleski Stadium (9-7) as he became the first ND player to hit a game-ending HR since the 2002 CWS game vs. Rice (when Brian Staviksy won that 5-3 game) ... Cooper's next at-bat produced a 1st-inning grand slam that sparked the 9-8 win over Valparaiso.

FIRST-INNING OFFENSE – Notre Dame now has totaled 36 first-inning runs in 38 games this season, scoring in th 1st inning of 16 games this season (nine games with multiple 1st-inning runs).

RECORD BOOK UPDATE – Matt Edwards has totaled 50 RBI this season while moving into 6th place on that ND career list, with 177 RBI (essentially in three seasons of action).

IT'S ALL THEIR FAULT – Notre Dame would be riding a 417-game scoring streak if not for one game, an 11-0 loss to Rutgers, late in the 2002 season ...that game ended ND's team-record scoring streak at 231 (stretching from 2/26/99-5/4/02) but the Irish have scored in every game since that loss (185) for the 2nd-longest scoring streak in the program's history ... ND has scored in virtually every game (all but six) of the 11-year Paul Mainieri era (99.09%; 655 of 661).

DYNAMIC DUOS – Notre Dame senior 1B Matt Edwards (.376, 5th) and freshman 3B Brett Lilley (.378, 6th) rank as one of the top hitting combos in the BIG EAST ... here's a look at the teams with multiple players among the BIG EAST's top-15 batting avg. leaders (stats are updated as on the April 24 games):

HBP HIGHWAY ROLLS ON – Notre Dame remains on pace for a record team hit-by-pitch total, with 79 HBPs in 38 games ... at 2.08 HBPs per game, that would factor out to 116 in the 56-game regular season, ahead of the team record of 106 (5th in NCAA history) that was set in '04 ... the NCAA record for HBPs in a season was set by Nevada in 1997 (125) ... freshman 2B Brett Lilley has racked up 17 HBPs, joining teammate Cody Rizzo (28 in '03, 21 in '04) as the only ND players with more than 15 HBPs in a season ... other 2005 HBP leaders include Rizzo (11), his fellow junior OF Alex Nettey (10) and junior SS Greg Lopez (10) ... Lilley, Rizzo, Nettey and Lopez likely will become the first four teammates in ND history to each total 12-plus HBPs in the same season ... one previous ND team had three with 12-plus HBPs (1993): Eric Danapilis (15, record until Rizzo's 28 in '03), Greg Layson (14) and Craig DeSensi (12) ... ND's 79 HBPs already ranks 2nd in ND history (the '93 team had 75) ... the past three ND teams have combined for 259 HBPs in 164 games (from '02-'04).

Old Reliable – Matt Edwards has logged 79 consecutive starts with the Irish and has played in 161 of 164 games during the past three seasons (starting 159), since returning from the broken leg that halted his freshman season early in '02.
