Jeremy Hazell scored 23 points and hit four three-pointers, making him the BIG EAST's all-time three-point leader. Earlier this season, Hazell became the fourth player in Seton Hall history to record 2,000 career points. The 6-foot-5 senior leads four players averaging in double-figures for the Pirates with 18.5 points per game and needs just two made three-pointers to become the BIG EAST's all-time leader.

#9 NOTRE DAME

The Fighting Irish have won eight of their last nine games including a 94-93 victory at Providence on Wednesday. Notre Dame won despite 52 points from the Friars' Marshon Brooks. The Irish's Ben Hansbrough had a team-high 32 points, while Tim Abromaitis added 28 points. Hansbrough leads four players currently averaging in double figures for Notre Dame with an



average of 17.9 points per game, third-best in the BIG EAST. The Fighting Irish are a perfect 15-0 at the Joyce Center this season.

MARQUETTE OUTLASTS PIRATES, 73-64

Senior Jeremy Hazell scored a game-high 23 points, but it was not enough as Marquette held on to defeat Seton Hall, 73-64, in Milwaukee on Feb. 19. Both teams shot very well from the field with the Golden Eagles firing at a 55.1% clip, compared to 45.6% for Seton Hall. The Pirates won the turnover battle, 15-to-10, but were out-rebounded, 40-to-22. Seton Hall's 22 boards were a season-low.

BIG EAST THREE-POINTER KING

With his four made three-pointers at Marquette on Feb. 19, senior Jeremy Hazell became the BIG EAST Conference's all-time leader in made three-pointers in conference games. The long-distance bomber currently has 192 career made three-pointers. He is also the all-time attempts leader with 575. Hazell bested Notre Dame's Colin Falls (189), the previous record holder.

TIED WITH DEHERE

Senior Jeremy Hazell is currently tied with Pirates' legend Terry Dehere with 315 career made three-pointers (all games) in Seton Hall history. He is already Seton Hall's all-time leader in three-pointers attempted. Hazell is also the Pirates' single-season leader in both categories.

SETON HALL - NOTRE DAME SERIES

Seton Hall and Notre Dame will face one another for the 25th time in history on Saturday. The Fighting Irish own a 16-8 all-time series lead. Last season, the teams played twice. The Pirates snapped a six-game losing streak against Notre Dame with a 90-87 victory on Feb. 11 at the Prudential Center. The Fighting Irish redeemed themselves, however with a 68-56 victory in the second round of the BIG EAST Championship on March 10.

SETON HALL NAMES LYONS NEW AD

Patrick G. Lyons was named Director of Athletics and Recreational Services at Seton Hall University on Feb. 22. Lyons comes to Seton Hall after spending the last seven years as Iona College's Director of Athletics and established its department as one of the top programs in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. He was the chief administrator for the Gaels' 21 NCAA Division I athletics programs. Lyons is expected to join the Pirates full-time on March 28.

HAZELL EYES THIRD PLACE

Senior Jeremy Hazell needs just seven points to move into third place on Seton Hall's all-time career scoring list. He's already one of only four players in Pirates' history with 2,000 career points and seven more would push him past Greg Tynes (2,059) into third place behind only immortals Terry Dehere (2,494) and Nick Werkman (2,273).

AGAINST THE RANKED

Notre Dame enters Saturday's game ranked #9 in the Associated Press Poll. Seton Hall is 66-218 (.232) all-time against teams ranked in the AP Top-25. The Pirates are 1-7 so far this year against ranked opponents. They were also 1-7 against ranked teams last year.

AGAINST #9

The Pirates are 4-11 all-time against teams ranked #9 in the nation. However, Seton Hall won its last game against a #9 opponent. The Pirates downed #9 Pittsburgh last year, 64-61, on Jan. 24. The last win prior to beating Pitt last year was over #9 Duke in the national semifinal on April 1, 1989.

FANTASTIC FUOUAN

Freshman Fuquan Edwin is having a break-out rookie campaign. He is currently averaging 8.0 points per game, the highest scoring average for a freshman since Jeremy Hazell tallied 12.8 points per game during the 2007-08 season. Edwin's 23 starts are the most for a freshman since Eugene Harvey started all 29 games during the 2006-07 campaign.

#15 VILLANOVA SQUEAKS PAST PIRATES, 60-57

Senior Jeremy Hazell scored a game-high 25 points and just missed a game-tying three-pointer as time expired, giving #15 Villanova a 60-57 win over Seton Hall on Feb. 15. The Pirates were out-shot, 48.8%-to-32.8% for the game from the floor. The only other Pirate in double-figures was Jordan Theodore, who finished with 10 points.

HEAD COACH KEVIN WILLARD

Career Record: 56-65 At Seton Hall: 11-16 BIG EAST Record: 5-10



Kevin Willard, was named the new head coach of the Seton Hall men's basketball program on March 29, 2010. He becomes the 19th head coach in Seton Hall history and joins the Pirates after three years as head coach of the lona College men's basketball team. In 2007, he inherited a Gaels team that had won just two games the prior season. Only three seasons later, Willard guided lona to a 21-10 overall record and was named Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the year.

"This is a historic moment for Seton Hall University," said Patrick Hobbs, Seton Hall Dean of the Law School, who has been overseeing the department of athletics since July. "Kevin Willard was our first choice and he is the right man to lead our men's program. On the same day to welcome Hall of Fame legend Anne Donovan to lead our women makes this one of the great days in Seton Hall Athletics history."

During his first year as a head coach, the 2007-08 season, the Gaels finished with 10 more victories than the previous year, one of the top turnarounds in NCAA Div. I. He instilled his foundation of up tempo, aggressive play with an emphasis on having fun playing the game of basketball to his young team.

"I'm really excited about this opportunity," Willard said. "It has been a goal of mine for a long time to have the opportunity to coach in the BIG EAST. It's an honor, considering the caliber of coaches in this conference. There is a great challenge ahead of us, but my staff and I are really looking forward to hitting the ground running and integrating ourselves into the Seton Hall University community."

Prior to the start of his career as a head coach, Willard served the previous six seasons as an assistant and associate head coach at the University of Louisville, where he was mentored by college coaching legend Rick Pitino. Willard also credits his father, Ralph, as one of his coaching influences. Ralph Willard is currently Pitino's associate coach at Louisville, but enjoyed a successful 19-year run as the head coach at Western Kentucky, Pittsburgh and Holy Cross.

"As president, I am thrilled that Seton Hall has in Anne Donovan and Kevin Willard two remarkable head coaches," Monsignor Robert Sheeran said. "Our men's and women's basketball programs are entering a new era, which will bring great student-athletes and renewed winning traditions to the University. In hiring these outstanding coaches, the University has demonstrated our commitment to competing with the best of the best in the toughest conference in the country, the BIG EAST. I look forward to Coach Willard and Coach Donovan leading our basketball teams with skill and commitment on and off the court."

At Louisville, Kevin Willard was responsible for assisting with the Cardinals' game preparations, scouting and preparing game plans. He also served as chief recruiting coordinator.

During his tenure, Louisville was ranked in the Top 25 for five seasons and reached the post season in each of his six years. The squad reached the NCAA Tournament on four occasions including a visit to the 2005 Final Four, the first time in 19 years that the Cardinals had advanced that deep into the post season. In his six seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals posted a phenomenal 142-58 record averaging nearly 24 wins per season.

"We are very pleased to welcome Kevin Willard to the Seton Hall family," said Director of Athletics Joe Quinlan. "His arrival marks a new beginning for our program. He is a man of great character and integrity and one who will provide exemplary leadership to our student-athletes."

Prior to Louisville, Willard worked with Pitino as a coaching associate with the Boston Celtics for four years. His duties with the Celtics included game and practice preparation, scouting and assisting the coaching staff in all basketball matters. He provided advance scouting, video tape breakdowns and assisted with individual workouts prior to games.

Willard was a collegiate basketball point guard, playing his last three years at Pittsburgh. He earned BIG EAST All-Academic honors while appearing in 75 games for the Panthers.

He played his freshman season at Western Kentucky, where he played in the Hilltoppers' backcourt and sank over 40 percent of his three-point goals.

Willard hails from New York, but played his high school basketball at Bowling Green High School (Ky.) while his father was the head coach at Western Kentucky. He earned Second Team All-State honors as a senior and helped his team to a combined 76-15 record in his final three prep seasons.

He is married to the former Julie Wagner and they have two sons, Colin, who was born in August, 2006 and Chase born in June, 2008.

THE TURNOVER BATTLE

Against Villanova, Seton Hall sported one of its most lopsided turnover battle wins of the year. The Pirates tied a season-high by forcing 22 Wildcats turnovers, but committed only three. For the season, Seton Hall ranks fifth in the BIG EAST in turnover margin at +2.48.

PIRATES WIN AT RUTGERS, 69-64

Seton Hall notched its third BIG EAST road win of the year with a 69-64 victory at Rutgers on Feb. 12. The Pirates shot 50.0% from the field for the game and forced 18 Rutgers turnovers. Jeremy Hazell, Jordan Theodore and Herb Pope all scored in double-figures for The Hall.

2,000 POINTS

With 19 points at Rutgers on Feb. 12, senior Jeremy Hazell joined Terry Dehere, Nick Werkman and Greg Tynes as just the fourth player in Seton Hall history to record 2,000 career points. He becomes the 30th player in BIG EAST Conference history to reach the milestone. Hazell accomplishes the feat despite missing 13 games earlier this season to injury.

EFFICIENT THEODORE

Junior Jordan Theodore had a strong all-around game at Rutgers on Feb. 12. The point guard came off the bench to record 18 points on 7-for-9 shooting, including 3-for-5 from three-point range. Theodore also grabbed four rebounds and dished out six assists with no turnovers.

The Pirates out-rebounded the Huskies, 42-to-33, but couldn't hold on to a 14-point lead with just under 14 minutes remaining. Both Jeremy Hazell and Jeff Robinson recorded double-doubles.

DEFENSE RULES; TEAMS COMBINE FOR 100 POINTS

The Pirates were held to just 17 first half points and eventually fell at #25 West Virginia, 56-44, in a defensive battle, Wednesday. Senior Jeff Robinson led the team with nine points. MILWAUKEE, WIS. – Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) scored a game-high 23 points, but it was not enough as the Seton Hall men's basketball team fell at Marquette, 73-64, on Saturday.

Hazell connected on four of 10 shots from three-point range, and in doing so, became the BIG EAST's all-time leader in career three-pointers made.

Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) was the only other Pirate in double-figures. He finished with 11 points.

The first half was very evenly matched with neither team grabbing more than a four-point lead. Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) found Robinson under the basket for a layup to give Seton Hall its first lead of the game at 11-10 with 13:57 left in the first half.

With the Pirates leading 16-14, Marquette's Jimmy Butler hit a three-pointer with 11:34 to go before halftime to put the Golden Eagles back in front.

Robinson hit a jumper to give Seton Hall its largest lead of the first half, 29-24, but Marquette would score the next five points to tie the game at 29 with 4:30 left in the first. Freshman Patrik Auda (Brno, Czech Republic) hit a three-pointer to put the Pirates back in front, 32-29, but the Golden Eagles would finish the half on a 7-0 run and take a 36-32 lead into halftime.

Both teams shot incredibly well in the first half. Marquette was 55.2% from the floor, while the Pirates shot 50.0%. Both Seton Hall's Jeremy Hazell and Marquette's Chris Otule led their teams with 10 first half points apiece.

Marquette's Jimmy Butler scored to give Marquette a 46-38 lead with 13:42 remaining, but Seton Hall would chip away and a jumper by Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) with 11:45 to go pulled the Pirates to within three, at 48-45. The Golden Eagles however, would go on a 12-2 run to give them a 60-47 lead with 6:43 remaining in regulation. During the run, Seton Hall's Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) fouled out.

The Golden Eagles' lead would grow to as many as 16 points with 5:01 remaining and the Pirates wouldn't come closer than nine points the rest of the way.

Marquette shot 55.1% from the field for the game, while Seton Hall shot 45.6%.

Five players scored in double-figures for the Golden Eagles. Jimmy Butler led the team with 16 points.

The Pirates were led by senior Jeff Robinson, who scored a gamehigh 15 points. Although there were 10 ties in the first half, there were none in the second as the Pirates expanded their two-point halftime lead into a nine-point victory. Seton Hall out-shot, out-rebounded and forced more turnovers than USF.

PIRATES FALL TO RICHMOND, 69-61

Seton Hall played another strong first half, and led at halftime 35-30, but could not hold off Richmond in the second half and fell, 69-61, on Dec. 26. Seton Hall shot a blistering 57.1% in the first half from the floor, but only 25.0% in the second frame. The Pirates out-rebounded the Spiders, 40-to-33.

DOUBLING UP

Senior Jeff Robinson notched his second double-double of the 2010-11 season with a season-high 17 points and 10 rebounds vs. Richmond on Dec. 26. The 6-foot-6 forward was an efficient 7-for-10 from the field and also dished out two assists in 37 minutes of action. Robinson is now averaging 12.1 points and 6.7 rebounds per game.

DAYTON RALLIES TO EDGE SHU, 69-65

Seton Hall dropped a 69-65 decision to Dayton on Dec. 22. The Pirates led by 14 at the intermission, but the Flyers used a 13-0 run in the second half to rally and edge Seton Hall for the four-point win. It what may be been Seton Hall's best first half of the year, the Pirates shot 50.0% and held Dayton to just 27.8%.

FIRST TEAM FOR HAZELL

Senior Jeremy Hazell was named to the 2010-11 Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team. A two-time All-BIG EAST honoree, Hazell is the conference's active leader in points, ppg, three-pointers made, steals and steals average.

HOLLOWAY RETURNS

Seton Hall legend Shaheen Holloway returns this year as the Pirates' Associate Head Coach for his third stint with the Seton Hall men's basketball team. A three-time All-BIG EAST performer, he's the Pirates' all-time leader in assists and captained the 2000 team to a birth in the NCAA Sweet-16 as a senior. After graduation, Holloway played professionally in Europe before returning to Seton Hall for one year in 2006 as a member the men's basketball staff. In 2007, he joined Kevin Willard's staff as an assistant coach at Iona College where he has remained for the last three seasons.



PIRATES DROP NJIT, 68-45

Seton Hall won its third straight game with a 68-45 victory over NJIT on Dec. 19. Freshman Fuquan Edwin led the Pirates in scoring for a second straight game with 14 points on 6-of-10 shooting and tied a career-high with nine rebounds. Seton Hall shot 50 percent from the field, while limiting NJIT to 30.4 percent and held a 21-7 edge in bench scoring.

EDWIN NAMED TOP ROOKIE

Freshman Fuquan Edwin was named BIG EAST Rookie of the Week on Dec. 20 after helping Seton Hall to a pair of victories the prior week. The 6-foot-6 forward averaged 15.5 points, 9.0 rebounds and 3.0 steals vs. Longwood and NJIT. It is the first Rookie of the Week award for a Pirate since Jeremy Hazell earned the distinction on Jan. 21, 2008. Edwin has started 23 of the team's first 27 games this season.

BETTER TO GIVE THAN TO RECEIVE

Junior Jordan Theodore dished out a career-high 10 assists in Seton Hall's victory over NJIT on Dec. 19. He notched his career-high in just 23 minutes and turned the ball over only twice. With a 4.4 assists per game average, Theodore currently ranks 10th in the BIG EAST.

AIR JORDAN

Point guard Jordan Theodore had arguably his best career game vs. Arkansas. The 6-foot junior scored a career-high 24 points and was a perfect 7-for-7 from the free-throw line.

PIRATES SHUT DOWN LONGWOOD, 78-51

Seton Hall notched its second straight easy victory with a 78-51 victory over Longwood on Dec. 13. With the win, the Pirates improve to a perfect 3-0 at the Prudential Center this season. Three Pirates scored in double-figures, Fuquan Edwin, Jordan Theodore and Jeff Robinson, who scored 17, 17 and 15 points respectively.

THEODORE NAMED TO HONOR ROLL

Junior Jordan Theodore was named to the BIG EAST Conference Men's Basketball Weekly Honor Roll on Dec. 13. Theodore averaged 20.5 points, 2.5 rebounds and 6.5 assists in week that saw Seton Hall go 1-1. Theodore scored a gamehigh and career-high 24 points in a 71-62 loss to Arkansas last Wednesday. In the Pirates' 104-79 victory at UMass, Theodore again led the team with 17 points. He also tied a career-high with eight assists and was 5-for-6 from the free throw line in just 23 minutes of action.

HAZELL SHOT

Injured All-America candidate Jeremy Hazell fell victim to an attempted robbery. Hazell, who has been out since Nov. 19 with a broken left wrist, was shot below his right arm on Christmas and spent the night at St. Lukes Hospital. Hazell has already rejoined the team.

EFFICIENT EDWIN

After scoring a career-best 13 points at UMass, Edwin responded with 17 points and a career-high nine rebounds vs. Longwood on Dec. 13. Edwin also recorded three steals and played a career-best 34 minutes.

FIRST DOUBLE-DOUBLE FOR POPE

Junior Herb Pope logged his first double-double of the 2010-11 season at UMass with 11 points and 13 rebounds. He also tied a career-high with five blocks. Pope entered the season as the BIG EAST active leader in double-doubles. He recorded a team-best 13 last season.

PIRATES ROUT UMASS

Seven players scored in double-figures as Seton Hall used a balanced offensive attack to rout Massachusetts, 104-79, in Amherst on Dec. 12. The Pirates led by 13 at the half and shot 73.1% from the floor in the second half to cruise to their first true road victory of the Kevin Willard era. Junior Jordan Theodore had his second straight strong performance with a team-leading 17 points and a career-high tying eight assists in just 23 minutes. Ferrakohn Hall, Fuquan Edwin and Patrik Auda all logged careerhighs in scoring with 15, 13 and 10 points respectively.

ONLY NICK WERKMAN

If Jeremy Hazell can average at least 20 points per game this season, he'll join only Nick Werkman as Pirates who have averaged at least 20 points per game in three different seasons. Currently, Hazell is one of just five Pirates (Werkman, Greg Tynes, Ken House and Dick Gaines) to have averaged at least 20 points per game for two seasons.

HOT SHOTS

After struggling to find offense in the absence of leading-scorer Jeremy Hazell for its first four games without the All-America candidate, Seton Hall's offense broke out in a big way at UMass. The Pirates scored 104 points and nine players scored six or more points. As a team, Seton Hall shot 60.0% (36-for-60) from the floor for the game marking the first time since Nov. 27, 2000 that the Pirates shot 60% or better. Even more impressive was Seton Hall's 73.1% from the floor in the second half. The Pirates were also 21-for-25 from the free-throw line and 11-for-22 from behind the three-point arc.

SEVEN IN DOUBLE-FIGURES

Seton Hall had seven players score in double-figures vs. UMass. Additionally, Keon Lawrence fell one point shy of being the eighth player in the game to score in double-figures. In the 27 seasons that this statistic has been kept at Seton Hall, no Pirates' squad had ever had seven players score in double-figures in the same game.

CZECH-MATE

Freshman Patrik Auda (Brno, Czech Republic) helped seal the Pirates victory at UMass with a pair of three-point plays in the span of 1:30 early in the second half. His second three-point play pushed the Seton Hall lead to 14 points. For the game, Auda scored a career-high 10 points, grabbed three rebounds, recorded two steals and was a perfect 4-for-4 from the free-throw line.

PRESEASON BIG EAST PREDICTIONS

Seton Hall is predicted to finish 11th in the 16-team BIG EAST Conference. Pittsburgh is the choice to win the 2010-11 BIG EAST men's basketball regular-season crown in the BIG EAST Preseason Coaches' Poll. The Panthers, who finished 25-9 overall and tied for second place in the conference at 13-5 last season, collected 12 first-place votes from the head coaches who did not place their own teams on their ballots. Villanova follows Pitt in the poll in second place. The Wildcats had 208 points which included one first-place vote. Syracuse, last year's regular-season league champion, was picked third. The Orange corralled a pair of first-place votes and a total of 187 points in the poll.

PRESEASON BIG EAST AWARDS

Georgetown guard Austin Freeman was named 2010-11 BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year by a vote of the league's head men's basketball coaches. Syracuse freshman Fab Melo was chosen BIG EAST Preseason Rookie of the Year. Coaches were not permitted to vote for their own players. In addition to Freeman, the Preseason All-BIG EAST First Team includes two members from last year's All-BIG EAST Second Team and two from the All-BIG EAST Third Team. All five hail from the New York Metropolitan area, including three from the Bronx, N.Y. Pittsburgh's Ashton Gibbs, Seton Hall's Jeremy Hazell, Connecticut's Kemba Walker, Villanova's Corey Fisher and West Virginia's Kevin Jones make up the First Team. The Preseason All-BIG EAST Second Team includes Georgetown's Chris Wright, Notre Dame's Tim Abromaitis, St. John's D.J. Kennedy, Marquette's Jimmy Butler and Syracuse's Kris Joseph.

BIG TV PRESENCE FOR BIG EAST

More than half of the 144 regular-season BIG EAST Conference men's basketball games will be seen on national television in the 2010-11 season, giving BIG EAST teams unprecedented exposure on the nation's leading television outlets as the league announced its composite schedule of conference games. In total, 73 of the 144 regular-season BIG EAST games will be on national television (either on CBS Sports, ESPN, ESPN2 or ESPNU). Each of the BIG EAST's 16 teams will make at least five national television appearances in conference games alone. The remaining conference games will be produced by ESPN Regional Television for the BIG EAST Network or carried on ESPN3.com. The 2010-11 season will be the fourth straight in which all 144 regular-season league games will be televised. Additionally, at least 40 games non-conference games will receive national exposure. Forty-five conference contests will be carried on ESPN or ESPN2. ESPNU, which has increased its reach to over 73 million homes, will carry at least 24 league games. CBS Sports will televise 10 more games involving BIG EAST teams. ESPN will continue to televise The BIG EAST Championship presented by American Eagle Outfitters from Madison Square Garden in New York.

SEC/BIG EAST INVITATIONAL

The fourth annual DIRECTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational will be held Dec. 8 and 11 in Louisville and Pittsburgh, ESPN Regional Television announced. The two-night men's college basketball event begins with a doubleheader Wednesday, Dec. 8, at Freedom Hall in Louisville, featuring Arkansas vs. Seton Hall at 7 p.m. ET on ESPN2, followed by Kentucky vs. Notre Dame at 9:30 p.m. on ESPN. On Saturday, Dec. 11, at the brand new CONSOL Energy Center in Pittsburgh, Rutgers will take on Auburn on ESPN2, followed by Pittsburgh vs. Tennessee on ESPN. Three of the SEC teams - Kentucky, Tennessee and Auburn - will play in the event for the second time, while Arkansas and all four BIG EAST teams are making their first SEC/BIG EAST Invitational appearances. The BIG EAST holds a 7-5 record in the first three years of the DIRECTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational.



NEWARK, N.J. – Seton Hall University president Monsignor Robert Sheeran announced Wednesday that effective for the upcoming 2007-08 season, the University's men's basketball team will play its home games in the new Prudential Center in Newark, N.J.

Sheeran made the announcement at a press conference at the Seton Hall Law School that also featured New Jersey Senate President Richard J. Codey, City of Newark Business Administrator Bo Kemp, Devils Arena Entertainment President and Chairman Jeffrey Vanderbeek and Prudential Center General Manager Dale Adams as speakers.

"Since the 1930s with our first branch campus downtown, Seton Hall has 'grown up' with Newark, has become a friend and partner with Newark – and has become a vital part of the city with our nationally recognized Law School," said Sheeran. "And there is much more to come with Seton Hall Basketball at the Prudential Center."

Prudential Center, set to open in October 2007, will feature 76 luxury suites, 2,330 club seats, 750 television monitors, a 4,800 square-foot, state-of-the-art exterior LED screen and a gourmet restaurant overlooking the event floor and an array of fan amenities and conveniences, including the richly appointed Fire and Ice Lounges for premium seat holders. Prudential Center will seat 17,625 people for hockey games, 18,500 for basketball games, and 19,500 for concerts.

The Seton Hall men's basketball team will play all of its home games at the Prudential Center, affectionately nicknamed "The Rock," and the Pirates women's basketball team will also play select games there in the future.

"We are thrilled to welcome Seton Hall University and their fans to Prudential Center," said Vanderbeek. "This world-class facility is going to be an exciting place to watch BIG EAST basketball, and we are glad to be the new home of the Pirates."

The men's basketball team will call the Prudential Center its home court after 26 seasons at Continental Airlines Arena in the Meadowlands.

"We are deeply appreciative of the tireless efforts of the management and staff of the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority during our long-standing tenure at the Meadowlands," said Seton Hall Director of Athletics Joe Quinlan. "The Prudential Center and the New Jersey Devils have offered us a warm welcome to their new home. We are looking forward to the opportunity to be a part of a new and exciting chapter of Seton Hall basketball history in Newark."

ARKANSAS OUTLASTS PIRATES, 71-62

Junior Jordan Theodore scored a career-high 24 points, but he was the lone Seton Hall player in double-figures and the Pirates fell to Arkansas, 71-62, in the DIRECTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational. Five Arkansas players scored in double-figures including Julysses Nobles who scored a team-high 19 points. Seton Hall out-played the Razorbacks in the second half, but the 12-point halftime deficit was too much to overcome.

WILLARD'S STAFF

Shaheen Holloway and Dan McHale, who were assistant coaches under Willard at Iona, have joined him at Seton Hall. Holloway returns as the Pirates' new associate head coach, while McHale is an assistant coach. Chris Pompey, formerly an assistant coach at New Mexico State, is also an assistant at Seton Hall. Stephen Sauers, who was the Pirates' director of basketball operations from 2006-08, returns in that capacity for Seton Hall this season. Grant Billmeier and Casey Stanley are coordinators of basketball operations. Khyl Farrison follows Willard to Seton Hall from Iona as strength & conditioning coach, while Ryan Whalen was tabbed to serve as video assistant.

Seton Hall turned in a strong defensive effort against Saint Peter's on Nov. 29 in a 69-49 victory. It marked the first time since the Pirates defeated Princeton, 79-41, on Jan. 29, 2007, that Seton Hall held its opponent to under 50 points scored. The Pirates also held the Peacocks to just 34.0% shooting from the floor and forced 15 turnovers. The Pirates achieved the milestone again vs. NJIT, giving up just 45 points on Dec. 19.

PIRATES POUND PEACOCKS, 69-49

The Pirates used a strong second-half effort to top Saint Peter's, 69-49, on Nov. 29 at Prudential Center. Seton Hall's bench was the story as it outscored the Peacocks' reserves 32-17, led by Jordan Theodore's 11 first-half points. Senior Keon Lawrence and freshman Patrik Auda each turned in their finest performances of the season. Lawrence scored five points and dished out five assists with no turnovers in 22 minutes of action. Auda grabbed five boards and was strong defensively with a steal and a blocked shot.

TAKING CARE OF THE BALL

Seton Hall showed great poise with the basketball vs. Saint Peter's. After committing a season-high 20 turnovers vs. Clemson in the Paradise Jam finale, the Pirates turned the ball over a season-low five times against the Peacocks. As a team, Seton Hall had 16 assists and just five turnovers.

CLEMSON DEALS PIRATES OT LOSS, 64-58

The Pirates rallied from an eight-point second half deficit to force overtime, but could not take the lead in the extra session and lost to Clemson, 64-58, in the consolation game of the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. Senior Jeff Robinson

was the only Pirate to score in double-figures. He finished with team-highs of 16 points and eight rebounds. As a team, Seton Hall placed fifth in the eight-team field.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM FOR ROBINSON

Senior Jeff Robinson was named to the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team. The 6-foot-6 forward averaged 15.0 points and 5.0 rebounds in Seton Hall's three tournament games.

SETON HALL FALLS TO XAVIER, 57-52

Xavier's Tu Holloway hit a fade-away three-pointer in the corner with just 17 second left as the Pirates fell to the Musketeers, 57-52, in the semifinals of the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam. Senior Jamel Jackson connected on a three-pointer to tie the score at 52, with just 50 seconds remaining setting up Holloway's dramatics on the ensuing possession. Senior Jeff Robinson led four Pirates in double-figures with 15 points. Junior Herb Pope had 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

PIRATES OUTLAST ALABAMA

Seton Hall trailed by as many as nine points in the first half, but came back and outlasted the Crimson Tide for an 83-78 victory in the first round of the 2010 Paradise Jam. The Pirates received a game-high 27 points from senior Jeremy Hazell. Herb Pope, Jeff Robinson and Jordan Theodore also scored in double-figures for the Pirates.

HIGH PERCENTAGES

In Seton Hall's victory over Alabama, both teams shot incredibly well from the floor, and in particular, from three-point range. The Pirates shot 55.1% from the floor for the game and shot an astounding 60.0% in the second half. Alabama meanwhile shot 53.4% for the game. Combined, the teams were 20-for-27 from three-point range. Seton Hall was 10-for-13, while the Crimson Tide were 10-for-14.

A FIRST IN 18 YEARS

The Pirates victory over Alabama marked their first victory over an SEC team since they defeated Tennessee on Nov. 21, 1992.

EFFICIENT HAZELL

Senior Jeremy Hazell erupted for a game-high 28 points in Seton Hall's victory over Cornell on Nov. 14. Most impressive was his shooting percentage. Hazell was an efficient 8-for-11 from the field, 4-for-6 from three-point range and a perfect 8-for-8 from the free-throw line.

PIRATES CRUSH CORNELL

New Seton Hall head coach Kevin Willard needed to only wait until game two to pick up his first victory as the Pirates defeated Cornell, 92-68, on Nov. 14. The Pirates shot 43.1% from the floor and pulled down 46 rebounds in the win.

MR. ROBINSON'S NEIGHBORHOOD

Senior Jeff Robinson had a nice bounce-back game vs. Cornell on Nov. 14. The 6-foot-6 senior picked up the first double-double for the Pirates this season with 16 points and a game-high 10 rebounds. It was Robinson's third career double-double and he did it in only 22 minutes of action.

ALL-AROUND AUDA

Freshman Patrik Auda had a fine all-around game in only his second in a Pirates' uniform vs. Cornell. Auda scored just one point, but grabbed five rebounds, blocked three shots and dished out two assists in 17 minutes of action.

NEAR TRIPLE-DOUBLE

On Nov. 14 vs. Cornell, Jordan Theodore scored 10 points, grabbed seven rebounds and dished out seven assists coming close to recording what would have been only the second triple-double in Seton Hall history. Eddie Griffin recorded the only triple-double on Dec. 4, 2000 vs. Norfolk State. Griffin had 21 points, 12 rebounds and 10 blocks.

HAZELL LEADS WAY IN OPENER

Senior Jeremy Hazell scored a game-high 17 points in the Pirates season-opener at #22 Temple. The All-America candidate was 6-for-15 from the floor including 2-for-5 from three-point range.

HAZELL LANDS ON WOODEN TOP-50

Senior Jeremy Hazell was named to The John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top 50 list as announced by The Los Angeles Athletic Club. The list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor. Only six other BIG EAST players were on the list.

PIRATES FALL AT #22 TEMPLE

Despite a furious late-game rally, the Seton Hall men's basketball team fell to #22 Temple, 62-56, in their 2010-11 season-opener, Nov. 12. The Owls led as many as 16 points with just 4:16 remaining in regulation, but the Pirates finished the game with a 12-2 run that saw Temple's lead dwindle to just four at 60-56 with 20 seconds remaining. Senior Jeremy Hazell led Seton Hall with 17 points and was the only Pirate to finish in double-figures in scoring.

CHARLESTON CLASSIC

The Pirates will be a part of the eight-team field at the 2011 Charleston Classic set to be held, Nov. 17-20, at Carolina First Arena in Charleston, S.C. In addition to the Pirates, participating schools include: Baylor, Georgia Tech, LSU, Saint Joseph's, Tulsa, Virginia Commonwealth and Western Kentucky. The 2011 Charleston Classic, a bracket-format tournament, will feature 12 games over the three days. Each team will compete in one game per day, advancing through a bracket-tournament format.

PIRATES SLAM WILLIAM PATERSON IN TUNE-UP

Seton Hall forced 20 turnovers and committed only five as the Pirates defeated William Paterson, 97-55, in exhibition action on Nov. 5. Junior Herb Pope scored 16 points and pulled down a game-high 20 rebounds. Freshman Fuquan Edwin also impressed in his debut in a Pirates uniform with 15 points, five rebounds and four steals. Jeremy Hazell (16 points), Ferrakohn Hall (13 points) and Jeff Robinson (11 points) also scored in double figures.

HAZELL A CANDIDATE

Senior Jeremy Hazell was selected as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in basketball. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence - community, classroom, character and competition.

A SETON HALL FIRST

Junior Herb Pope became the first Seton Hall player in history to finish the regular season as the BIG EAST leader in rebounds per game. The Aliquippa, Pa. native pulled down 11.1 rebounds per game in conference play, which was more than a rebound and a half ahead of the second place individual (Greg Monroe, 9.3 rpg).

POLYNICE TRANSFERS IN

A transfer from the University of Mississippi, Eniel Polynice received a waiver from the NCAA that has allowed him to play immediately for the Pirates and not have to sit out a year per standard transfer regulations. The 6-foot-5 guard graduated from Ole Miss earlier this year with one year of eligibility remaining. Because the University of Mississippi does not offer a graduate degree in his field of study (communications), Polynice was granted the ability to pursue additional education without penalty at an institution that does offer his preferred graduate program. Polynice was a member of the Rebels' program for four years, but was a medical redshirt during the 2008-09 season following knee surgery. He has played in 102 games and made 65 starts while averaging 7.8 points, 3.9 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game. A member of the UMAA Academic Honor Roll, Polynice is one of only three players in Ole Miss history to record over 700 career points, 300 rebounds and 300 assists.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

Two members of Coach Willard's first recruiting class will provide a distinct international flavor this year. Patrik Auda is a 6-foot-9 forward from Brno, Czech Republic and Aaron Geramipoor is a 6-foot-11 center from Manchester, England. Both played at the Canarias Basketball Academy in the Canary Islands. The left-handed Auda is considered to have a strong all-around game and is a good three-point shooter. Geramipoor possesses strong low-post moves and was the starting center on England's under-18 national team.

DESPITE RALLY, PIRATES FALL TO #22 TEMPLE, 62-56

PHILDELPHIA, PA - Despite a furious late-game rally, the Seton Hall men's basketball team fell to #22 Temple, 62-56, in their 2010-11 season-opener, Friday

The Owls (1-0) led as many as 16 points with just 4:16 remaining in regulation, but the Pirates finished the game with a 12-2 run that saw Temple's lead dwindle to just four at 60-56 with 20 seconds remaining

Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) led Seton Hall with 17 points and was the only Pirate to finish in double-figures in scoring. Junior Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) finished with five points and a team-high eight rebounds.

Seton Hall opened the season on the road for the first time since the start of the 2001-02 campaign. That year, the Pirates defeated San Francisco, 87-79. In a night of firsts, Seton Hall was also playing their first ranked opponent in a season opener since the start of the 1998-99 season

Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) scored seven of Seton Hall's first nine points including a threepoint play that gave the Pirates an early 9-7 lead with 15:23 to go in the first half.

Hazell got hot mid-way through the first half and scored six straight points for the Pirates to give them a four-point cushion at 17-13 with 11:47 before halftime. A Ferrakohn Hall (Memphis, Tenn.) free-throw gave the Pirates their largest lead of the half at 18-13, but then Temple exploded with a 21-2 run and give the Owls a commanding lead 34-20 with just 1:23 left in the first half. Four free throws by Eniel Polynice (Sarasota, Fla.) closed Seton Hall to within 10 points at the half, 34-24.

Seton Hall was held to just one field goal over the last 10:55 of the first half and shot just 27.3% from the floor in the first half. The Pirates were led by Hazell who had eight points and three rebounds.

Temple shot 46.9% in the first half and was led by Juan Fernandez with 10 points.

Out of halftime, the Pirates cut the Owls lead to seven on a Herb Pope three-pointer, but Temple responded with a 5-0 run to push their lead to 12 at 41-29 with 17:07 remaining in regulation.

A three-pointer by Hazell cut the Temple lead to nine, but Temple buckets by Lavoy Allen, Ramone Moore and Scootie Randall punched the Owls lead to 15 points, at 47-32 with 11:04 left in the game.

Temple's Rahlir Jefferson had a tip-in with 4:16 remaining which gave the Owls their largest lead of the night, 16 points, at 60-44. But Temple would score only two points the rest of the game setting up Seton

The Owls showed the same stout defense in this game that had them finish third in the nation last year in defensive scoring average. Temple held the Pirates to just 29.7% from the field for the game and blocked nine shots.

Ramone Moore led Temple in scoring with 14 points. Lavoy Allen had nine points and nine rebounds

PIRATES OUTLAST ALABAMA, 83-78, IN PARADISE JAM WIN

ST. THOMAS, USVI - Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) scored a game-high 27 points as the Seton Hall men's basketball team outlasted Alabama. 83-78. in the first round of the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam on Friday.

Hazell, an All-America candidate, was 5-for-6 from three-point range as the Pirates put on a three-point shooting clinic. In all, Seton Hall was 10-for-13 from behind the three-point arc and shot 55.1% from overall on the floor for the game.

Trailing 26-17, the Pirates went on a 7-0 run including three-pointers on back-to-back possessions from Hazell and Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) to pull Seton Hall to within two at 26-24 with 9:01 before halftime.

The Crimson Tide jumped back out to a seven point lead at 35-28, but the Pirates went on a 9-0 run highlighted by three-pointers from Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) and Hazell to give Seton Hall a 37-35 lead with 2:51 remaining in the first half.

Alabama ended the first half with a 7-0 run to send the Pirates into the locker room down five, 44-39.

Both teams scored at a blistering pace in the first half. Seton Hall shot 50.0% from the floor, while Alabama shot 58.6%. More impressive was the teams' three-point shooting. Alabama was 5-for-6, while Seton Hall was 6-for-7 from behind the arc.

Hazell led all scorers with 19 first half points. Senario Hillman led the way for Alabama with 16 points.

The hot shooting continued for both teams as the second half began. A Robinson three-pointer pulled Seton Hall to within one and four minutes later, a three-pointer by Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) gave the Pirates their first lead of the second half, 54-52, with 13:27 left to play in regulation.

Seton Hall exploded offensively mid-way through the first half. A 10-0 run, highlighted by the strong inside play of Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) and capped by yet another Hazell three-pointer, pushed the Pirates' lead to 67-55 with 8:25 remaining.

Alabama, however, came storming back with an 8-0 run of their own to pull the Crimson Tide to within four at 67-63 with 6:46 left.

A three-pointer by Alabama's Trevor Releford sliced the Pirates' lead to three, 73-70, with just 3:51 remaining, but alas the Crimson Tide would get no closer.

Seton Hall will continue play at the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands on Sunday, Nov. 21 when they take Xavier. Game time is scheduled for 8:30 p.m. Xavier defeated lowa, 86-73, on Friday. The Pirates will play a third and final game in the Paradise Jam on Monday, Nov. 22. It will be either the championship or consolation game of the Paradise Jam against either Old Dominion or Clemson.

COMEBACK FALLS SHORT AS XAVIER EDGES PIRATES, 57-52

ST. THOMAS, USVI - Xavier's Tu Holloway hit a fade-away three-pointer in the corner with just 17 second left as the Seton Hall men's basketball team fell to the Musketeers, 57-52, in the semifinals of the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam.

Senior Jamel Jackson (Brooklyn, N.Y.) connected on his only bucket of the game, a three-pointer to tie the score at 52, with just 50 seconds remaining setting up Holloway's dramatics on the ensuing possession.

Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) led four Pirates in double-figures with 15 points. Junior Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) had 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

Seton Hall played the game without its leading scorer Jeremy Hazell, who broke a bone in his left wrist during the Pirates' 83-78 victory over Alabama on Friday. Hazell was averaging 24.0 points per game and will miss the next 4-to-6 weeks while the injury heals.

In Friday's game both offenses were free-flowing. In Sunday's game against Xavier, however, points were much more difficult to come by for both teams.

Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) hit a three-pointer with 8:17 left in the first half to cut Xavier's early lead to one at 17-16, but the Pirates would not score for the next 6:34. During the drought, the Musketeers jumped out to a 25-16 lead on the strength of strong low-post play by Dante' Jackson and Kenny Frease.

The Musketeers led at the half, 28-18. Xavier's Tu Holloway was the only player in the game to score more than six points in the first half. He had 12 points.

The teams combined to go just 5-22 from three-point range in the first half. Seton Hall shot just 21.2% from the floor.

Seton Hall's Jeff Robinson scored the first two baskets out of halftime to pull the Pirates to within five, but Xavier's Tu Holloway caught fire to keep the Musketeers' lead comfortable. Holloway provided the only offense for Xavier through the half's first 13:18. His bucket with 9:52 remaining in regulation bumped the Xavier lead to 10 points, their largest of the game.

The Pirates would mount a comeback on the back of Herb Pope. The 6-foot-8 power forward scored six straight for Seton Hall and a pair of free throws by freshman Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) capped a 9-0 run to pull the Pirates to within one at 44-43 with 4:25 to play.

The Pirates fell down by six in the closing minutes, but again Seton Hall rallied which set up the final minute dramatics by Jamel Jackson and Tu Holloway.

Holloway scored 31 of Xavier's 57 total points.

Seton Hall shot significantly better in the second half, firing at a 52.2% clip. It finished with 33.9% for the game.

CLEMSON DEALS PIRATES OVERTIME LOSS, 64-58

ST. THOMAS, USVI - The Seton Hall men's basketball team rallied from an eight-point second half deficit to force overtime, but could not take the lead in the extra session and lost to Clemson, 64-58, Monday in the consolation game of the 2010 U.S. Virgin Islands Paradise Jam.

Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) was the only Pirate to score in double-figures. He finished with team-highs of 16 points and eight rebounds.

Seton Hall's offense struggled to get going early on. The Pirates made just one of their first eight shots and quickly found themselves down 10-2 to start the game. But thanks to the sharp shooting of Eniel Polynice (Sarasota, Fla.) and the strong inside of play of Ferakohn Hall (Memphis, Tenn.), Seton Hall battled back with an 8-2 run to pull the Pirates to within two at 12-10 with 11:35 to go before the half.

Clemson's Tanner Smith hit a three-pointer followed by a pair of free throws by Demontez Stitt and the Tigers' lead grew to 10 points with 6:11 remaining in the half, 20-10. The Pirates drought reached 6:09 until a pair of Robinson free throws ended it with 5:26 before halftime.

The teams traded baskets over the remaining minutes of the half and Clemson took a 26-19 lead into halftime.

The teams combined to go 3-for-20 from three-point range in the first half. Seton Hall was 0-for-9. Overall, the Pirates shot just 29.6% from the floor and uncharacteristically committed 11 turnovers.

The lone bright spot for the Pirates in the first half was the play of Ferrakohn Hall. The 6-foot-8 sophomore scored a team-high seven points.

Seton Hall had a spirited start to the second half. The Pirates started the half with a 13-3 run highlighted by a three-pointer from senior Jamel Jackson (Brooklyn, N.Y.), the team's first of the game, to tie the score at 30. After defensive stop, Eniel Polynice scored on a put-back to give Seton Hall its first lead of the game, 32-30, with 13:20 remaining in regulation.

A three-point play by Clemson's Devin Booker gave the Tigers a 41-36 lead, but the Pirates came storming back with six unanswered points to give Seton Hall a 42-41 lead with 5:10 to play.

With the Pirates leading 45-44, Booker scored on a layup to give Clemson the lead with just 30 seconds remaining. On the ensuing possession, freshman Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) scored on a running floater in the lane to put the Pirates back on top with only 19 seconds to go. Devin Booker was fouled going to the hoop by Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) and made one of two free throws with three seconds remaining to force overtime.

In the overtime, Clemson pulled away. The Tigers connected on 13-of-14 free throws in the extra session and Seton Hall never led.

Despite the loss, the Pirates out-shot, 38.3% to 29.3%, and out-rebounded, 41-to-40, the Tigers. Seton Hall committed a season-high 20 turnovers, however, compared to 14 for Clemson.

Seton Hall was only 2-for-21 from three-point range.

Demontez Stitt led the Tigers with 15 points.

THEODORE'S CAREER NIGHT NOT ENOUGH AS THE PIRATES FALL TO ARKANSAS, 71-62

LOUISVILLE, KY – Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) scored a career-high 24 points but he was the lone Seton Hall player in double-figures and the Pirates fell to Arkansas, 71-62, in the DIRECTV SEC/BIG EAST Invitational, Wednesday in Louisville, Ky.

Seton Hall (3-4), playing in its fourth game without leading scorer Jeremy Hazell, received a career game from Theodore who also dished out five assists against just one turnover and recorded four steals. He was also a perfect 7-for-7 from the free-throw line.

Keon Lawrence (Newark, N.J.) scored five of Seton Hall's first seven points as the Pirates jumped out to a quick 7-2 lead with 15:57 to go before halftime.

The Pirates held a slim 11-10 lead when Arkansas went on a 16-0 run capped by a three-pointer from Julysses Nobles. The Pirates were held scoreless for 4:19 before senior Jamel Jackson (Brooklyn, N.Y.) hit a three-pointer But on the ensuing possession, Nobles struck again with another three-pointer to push the Arkansas lead to 29-14 with 6:14 to go in the half.

AMHERST, MA - Seton Hall shot 73.1% in the second half and seven players scored in doublefigures as the Pirates cruised to an easy 104-79 victory over Massachusetts, Saturday in Amherst

Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) had his second straight strong performance with a team-leading 17 points and a career-high tying eight assists in just 23 minutes. Ferrakohn Hall (Memphis, Tenn.), Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) and Patrik Auda (Brno, Czech Republic) all logged career-highs in scoring with 15, 13 and 10 points respectively.

NEWARK, N.J. - The Seton Hall men's basketball team dropped a 69-65 decision to Dayton on Wednesday night at Prudential Center. The Pirates (6-5) led by 14 at the intermission, but the Flyers (10-3) used a big run in the second half to come up with the win.

Senior Eniel Polynice (Sarasota, Fla.) had his best all-around game in a Seton Hall uniform, scoring 13 points while dishing out five assists with two rebounds and two steals in 29 minutes off the bench. Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) led the team with 15 points.

A Polynice drive and kick to Robinson on the wing from beyond the arc put the Pirates back on top, 55-52, with 8:59 to go, but the Flyers built up a 66-59 lead by holding Seton Hall to just one field goal over the next 8:24.

Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) hit a long three-pointer from the left wing with just 23 seconds left, but Dayton hit foul shots down the stretch to hang on for the victory.

Matt Kavanaugh led the Flyers with 15 points of the bench. Chris Johnson had a double-double with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

Dayton out-rebounded the Pirates, 45-39, but scored 20 second-chance points compared to just seven for the Hall.

RICHMOND HOLDS ON TO DEFEAT PIRATES, 69-61

NEWARK, N.J. - The Seton Hall men's basketball team played another strong first half, but could not quite finish the job as Richmond topped the Pirates, 69-61, in a Sunday matinee. Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) led the squad with 17 points on 7-of-10 shooting and pulled down 10 rebounds.

Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) added 15 points and junior Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) chipped in with nine points and a game-high 12 boards.

After a back-and-forth start, Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) dropped in a three-pointer in the corner to give SHU (6-6) a 19-13 edge with 11:49 left in the first half. The Spiders (10-3) closed within a point on three occasions before finally regaining the lead, 28-27, on a Dan Geriot jumper from the foul line with 5:01 remaining in the half.

Robinson scored the next six points of the game to put the Pirates ahead by five, including a monstrous dunk off a set play set up by a nice feed by Pope. Senior Eniel Polynice (Sarasota, Fla.) converted on a back-door layup as time wound down in the half to give Seton Hall a 35-30 lead into the break.

Richmond used a 9-1 run to even things up, 39-39, at the 16:39 mark of the second, but a three-point play by Theodore gave the advantage back to the Pirates just 28 seconds later. The lead would change hands six times over the next six-plus minutes until a friendly roll on a Theodore jumper capped a 7-0 run, putting the Hall on top, 58-53, with 8:54 remaining.

The Pirates then went cold on offense for a 7:08 stretch and the Spiders jumped ahead 64-59 off of a pair of contested jumpers by Justin Harper with 2:47 to go. A second-chance putback by Robinson pulled the Pirates within three, but they would get no closer.

Harper led all scorers with 24 points, aided by 6-of-8 shooting from downtown.

SHU won the battle of the boards by a 40-33 margin. The Pirates shot a blistering 57.1 percent from the floor in the first half, but just 25 percent in the second.

PIRATES CLOSE OUT 2010 WITH 70-53 LOSS AT CINCINNATI

CINCINNATI, OHIO – Keon Lawrence scored a career-high 15 points, but the Seton Hall offense went cold late in the second half and the Pirates suffered their first BIG EAST loss at the hands of Cincinnati, 70-53, on New Years Eve.

Lawrence was 5-for-7 from the field and also led the Pirates with six rebounds.

Seton Hall had its share to overcome in Cincinnati. Senior leading-scorer Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) would miss his 11th straight game with a broken wrist. Freshman Aaron Geramipoor (Manchester, England) had yet to make his season debut due to Mononucleosis. Ferrakohn Hall transferred two weeks ago. Meanwhile, a pair of "healthy" players were ailing. Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) was dealing with a sore left foot and Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) was battling influenza. All things considered, Seton Hall was prepared to let go of the year 2010.

Cincinnati used an early run to take the lead. With the score tied at five, the Bearcats went on an 8-2 run capped by a three-pointer from Rashad Bishop to give Cincinnati a 13-7 lead. But the Pirates responded with an 8-2 run of their own. Freshman Patrik Auda (Brno, Czech Republic) found Keon Lawrence (Newark, N.J.) for an uncontested lay-up, and on their next possession, Lawrence drained a three-pointer to pull Seton Hall even, 15-15, with 12:46 remaining in the half.

With 8:35 left in the first half, freshman Fuquan Edwin (Paterson, N.J.) hit a three-pointer to put Seton Hall ahead, 23-22, its first lead since 2-0. Unfortunately for the Pirates, it would be their last field goal of the half. Cincinnati would outscore Seton Hall, 13-6, over the final 8:35 of the half and enter halftime with a 35-29 lead.

Although the halftime lead was just six points, Cincinnati dominated the first half box score. The Bearcats shot 46.7% from the floor compared to just 37.5% for Seton Hall. Cincinnati also out-rebounded the Pirates, 20-to-11, due in part to Herb Pope and Patrik Auda getting into early foul trouble.

The Cincinnati lead ballooned to nine when Larry Davis hit a three-pointer with 15:18 to go. The Pirates responded, however, and when Keon Lawrence stole the ball at midcourt and scored on an uncontested layup with 12:27 remaining, Seton Hall was down by only four, 42-38.

But from there, the Pirates would go on another lengthy field goal drought. With the Pirates mustering only occasional points from the free-throw line, Cincinnati's lead would grow to 15 points, 59-44, when Dion Dixon hit a jumper with 4:56 remaining.

Fuquan Edwin finally scored for Seton Hall on a long pass from Lawrence to end the field goal drought at 12:15, but there was only 13 seconds remaining.

Seton Hall shot 33.3% from the floor for the game and was out-rebounded 34-to-26

Sean Kilpatrick came off the bench to lead the way for Cincinnati with 14 points. Ibrahima Thomas had 12 points and a game-high nine rebounds.

NEWARK, N.J. - The Seton Hall men's basketball team led by as many as seven points in the second half, but a late flurry guided No. 23 Georgetown to an 80-75 win on Tuesday night. Preseason BIG EAST Player of the Year Austin Freeman scored a game-high 28 points on 10-of-13 shooting for the Hoyas (14-5, 3-4).

Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) led the Pirates (8-11, 2-5) with 21 points, shooting 9-of-13 from the field while grabbing seven boards. Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) had 17 points, six assists and no turnovers in 35 minutes of action. Junior Herb Pope (Aliquippa, Pa.) chipped in with 16 points and a game-high nine rebounds before

Hollis Thompson's three-pointer gave Georgetown its largest lead of the game, 43-33, iust 53 seconds into the second half before Seton Hall made its push for the upset. Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) scored 10 of his 15 points during a 19-2 run that turned the 10-point deficit into a 52-45 advantage with 12:13 left in the second half.

Pope and Robinson took over for the Pirates over the next eight-plus minutes, scoring a combined 15 points to help the Pirates maintain a two-possession lead for much of that stretch. A traditional three-point play by Robinson made it 73-67 with just 3:06 remaining.

Seton Hall missed its next six shots from the floor, and Pope picked up his fifth foul during a 9-0 Hoya run which gave them a 76-73 cushion with 27 seconds on the clock.

Theodore hit a jumper from the left corner with his foot on the three-point line with nine seconds left to pull the Pirates within one, but Georgetown converted on its last four free-throw attempts to put the game away.

After a back-and-forth start, the Hoyas jumped ahead, 20-17, on a layup by Julian Vaughn at the 8:49 mark of the first half. A pair of free-throws by Hazell cut the margin to one with 1:49 left before intermission, but Georgetown outscored the Hall 8-2 to close the period and take a 38-31 lead into halftime.

The Hoyas shot 59.3 percent in the first half and finished at 52.7 for the game. The Pirates shot 45.6 percent from the floor, but were just 2-of-18 (16.7 percent) from downtown. Seton Hall committed just eight turnovers for the game while forcing 15 Georgetown miscues

NEWARK, N.J. - The Seton Hall men's basketball team led by as many as 14 points in the second half, but a late run by Kemba Walker and #6 Connecticut helped the Huskies escape the Prudential Center with a 61-59 victory on Saturday night.

Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) scored a game-high 20 points and grabbed a season-high 11 rebounds. Senior Jeff Robinson (Trenton, N.J.) had 15 points and also had 11 boards. Walker led UConn with 19 points.

The Pirates were still clinging to a 57-55 lead with 2:57 remaining, but Walker knocked down a step-back three from the right wing to give Connecticut its first lead since the 5:47 mark of the first half

SHU squandered three opportunities to regain the lead, and Roscoe Smith knocked down a pair of free-throws with 19 seconds to go. Hazell's attempt to tie the game with six seconds left was blocked by Alex Oriakhi

Oriakhi hit 1-of-2 from the line after an intentional foul to give the Huskies a 61-57 lead. Edwin picked off an errant pass to make it a one-possession game with one second, but the Pirates could not stop the clock.

In the first half, a three-pointer by Walker put UConn up, 17-12, with 11:40 to go. Seton Hall answered with back-to-back threes by Hazell and Robinson and eventually took a four-point lead after another trifecta by Hazell.

With 3:29 left in the half. Walker connected with Jeremy Lamb for an uncontested dunk to even the score, 29-29. The teams traded buckets for the next three minutes, but the Pirates took a 37-32 lead into the locker room after Keon Lawrence (Newark, N.J.) found Robinson on the right wing from downtown with four seconds left.

SHU held a 42-33 edge on the glass and points in the paint were even, 28-28.

THEODORE, HAZELL LEAD PIRATES PAST RUTGERS, 69-64

PISCATAWAY, N.J. - Junior Jordan Theodore (Englewood, N.J.) was named the Joe Calabrese MVP for scoring 18 points and dishing out six assists as Seton Hall defeated Rutgers, 69-64, Saturday at the RAC.

The victory gives the Pirates a season split with their in-state rivals

Senior Jeremy Hazell (Harlem, N.Y.) scored a team-high 19 points and in doing so became only the fourth player in Seton Hall history to record 2,000 career points. The 6-foot-5 sharpshooter needed 14 points entering the game to reach the prestigious milestone.

The Pirates played the game minus two senior guards, Jamel Jackson and Keon Lawrence who were dismissed from the team earlier in the day for a violation of team rules and a continued pattern of conduct unbecoming of a representative of Seton Hall Athletics.

Rutgers' James Beatty hit a three-pointer to give the Scarlet Knights an early 11-5 lead, but Seton Hall responded with a 8-0 run to give the Pirates a 13-11 lead with 11:12 remaining in the first half.

The score remained close as Beatty and Seton Hall's Jordan Theodore traded three-pointers midway through the first half.

Seton Hall (11-14, 5-8) went on a 9-2 run capped by another Theodore three-pointer to give the Pirates their largest lead of the first half, 29-21. Seton Hall would take a 34-27 lead into halftime.

Theodore, who didn't start for only the second time this season, led the Pirates in the first half with 11 points on 4-for-5 shooting from the floor. Rutgers' Gilvydas Biruta led all scorers with 13 points.

The Pirates shot a blistering 48.3% in the first half, compared to 36.0% for Rutgers

Rutgers (13-13, 4-9) scored the first eight points of the second half and turned a seven-point halftime deficit into a one-point lead on Jonathan Mitchell's bucket with 16:42 remaining in regulation. Seton Hall however, would respond with a 12-2 run to put the Pirates ahead, 46-37, with 11:03 to play.

The Scarlet Knights clawed their way back over the next seven minutes and a basket by Mitchell with 4:20 remaining pulled Rutgers to within one at 52-51. But Seton hall would not relinquish the lead. With the Pirates clinging to a 54-53 lead after another made jumper by Mitchell, the Pirates held Rutgers to without a field goal for two crucial minutes. In that time, Seton Hall expanded its lead to seven, 62-55 with 1:49 remaining, on the strength of three made free throws by Jeremy Hazell.

Seton Hall shot 50.0% for the game, compared to 43.4% for Rutgers. Rebounding was even at 29 a piece, but the Pirates forced 18 Rutgers turnovers.

Jonathan Mitchell scored a game-high 24 points to lead Rutgers.
