Irish Face Alaska Fairbanks In Final Regular-Season Series With Home Ice In The Upcoming CCHA Playoffs On The Line

Notre Dame will honor 2006 senior class on Saturday night following game; Josh Sciba is CCHA offensive player of the week following win and tie at Bowling Green.

IRISH AND NANOOKS BATTLE FOR HOME ICE: Notre Dame and Alaska Fairbanks close out the regular-season schedule on Fri.-Sat., Feb. 24-25 at the Joyce Center with home ice in the first round of the CCHA playoffs on the line. Friday's game will be televised live by Comcast Local and can be seen in South Bend on Comcast Channel 3. Check local listings for your local area. The two teams come into the weekend tied, along with Ferris State, for the eighth and final playoff spot with 24 points in the standings. The Irish and Nanooks are 10-12-4 in conference play while Ferris State is 9-11-6 on the year. The Bulldogs close the season with a home-and-home series versus Michigan. Notre Dame comes into the final weekend with a four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1) and a 12-16-4 overall record. Alaska Fairbanks is 14-13-5 on the season. The two teams are also one point behind seventh place Ohio State (25 pts.) and two behind fifth-place Northern Michigan (26 pts.) and Lake Superior (26 pts.) going into the final weekend of the season. The CCHA playoffs start on March 3-5 at campus sites. The first four teams get a bye with No. 5 hosting No. 12, No. 6 vs. No. 11, No. 7 against No. 10 and No. 8 getting the final home spot versus No. 9 in a best-of-three series. The four bye teams then host the four winners in a best-of-three series from March 10-12. The four winners advance to Joe Louis Arena.

IRISH VERSUS NANOOKS: Notre Dame and Alaska Fairbanks have met 35 times in the all-time series with the Nanooks holding a 17-15-3 edge. At the Joyce Center, Notre Dame is 8-5-1 versus Alaska Fairbanks. The two teams met twice last season in Fairbanks with the Irish winning the first game, 3-2, and dropping the second contest by an identical 3-2 score. The Irish are 1-0-1 in the last two meetings with Alaska Fairbanks at the Joyce Center. During the 2003-04 season, Notre Dame took a 3-2 decision before finishing with a 2-2 tie the following night. The Nanooks last win at the Joyce Center came on Feb. 2, 2002, the second game of a series sweep for Alaska Fairbanks.

STREAKING IRISH: The win and the tie last weekend versus Bowling Green gives Notre Dame its' second four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1) of the season. The Irish were 2-0-2 from Dec. 18 through Jan. 13 earlier this season. The last time the Irish went four games without a loss was from Feb. 13-28, 2004 when they swept Ferris State and Michigan in back-to-back weekend series. The last time Notre Dame went five games without a loss was Nov. 8-29, 2003 when the Irish were 3-0-2 with a tie at Michigan State, a win and a tie at home with Lake Superior and two wins at home versus Northern Michigan

ON A ROLL: Since starting the season with a 1-5-0 record, the Irish are 11-11-4 over the last 26 games. Since Dec. 3, Notre Dame is 9-7-3. On the road, the Irish opened the year going 0-5-1. Since Dec. 6, Notre Dame is 6-3-2 away from the Joyce Center.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Junior center **Josh Sciba (Westland, Mich.)** was named the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Feb. 19. In the two games versus Bowling Green, Sciba had three goals and an assist and was +1 with nine shots on goal. In Friday's 7-4 win, Sciba scored two goals, one on the power play and added an assist for his three-point game. In Saturday's 1-1 tie, Sciba scored the game-tying goal at 11:43 of the third period to give the Irish the tie. His power-play goal on Friday was his CCHA-leading 10th of the season.

SENIOR NIGHT: The University of Notre Dame will honor its graduating class of 2006 immediately following the game with Alaska Fairbanks on Saturday night. The seven seniors - **Matt Amado (Surrey, B.C.)**, **Tony Gill (Rochester, Minn.)**, **Chris Trick (Troy, Mich.)**, **Tim Wallace (Anchorage, Alaska)**, **Mike Walsh (Northville, Mich.)**, **Rory Walsh (Milton, Mass.)** and senior manager **Dave Preston (Ft. Collins, Colo.)** and their parents will be honored at center ice as they play their final regular-season home games at the Joyce Center.

BOWLING GREEN RECAP: Notre Dame took a 7-4 decision on Friday night versus Bowling Green and followed with a 1-1 overtime tie in Saturday's game. After missing Friday's game due to the flu, goaltender **David Brown** returned to action, stopping 34 of 35 shots in the 1-1 tie. The lone goal that he surrendered came on a first-period, power play by Alex Foster. Notre Dame tied the game at 11:43 of the third period when **Josh Sciba** notched his third goal of the weekend, putting the rebound of a **Matt Amado** shot past Falcon goaltender Jimmy Spratt for his team-best 17th goal of the year. Green out shot Notre Dame by a 35-32 margin. The Irish were 0-for-5 on the power play while Bowling Green was 1-for-4.

On Friday night, sophomore center **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** picked up the first hat trick of his career and added an assist for his first four-point game to lead Notre Dame to a 7-4 win. **Josh Sciba** scored two goals with an assist and **Erik Condra (Fr., Livonia, Mich.)** added four assists in the win. **Matt Amado** and **Wes O'Neill (Jr., Essex, Ont.)** each had a goal and an assist in the victory. Freshman goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)**, making his first start since Dec. 2, made a career-high 34 saves in picking up his fourth win of the season. Bowling Green got goals from James Unger, Mike Nesdill, Jeremy Bronson and Alex Foster as the Falcons battled back from 2-0 and 3-2 deficits before the Irish scored three goals in a 3:17 span midway through the second period to snap a 3-3 tie. On the night, Notre Dame capitalized on 3-of-7 power-play chances while Bowling Green was 1-for-7. Bowling Green out shot the Irish, 38-33 in the game.

CCHA GOALTENDER OF THE WEEK: Junior goaltender **David Brown** was named the RBK/CCHA goaltender of the week for the week ending Feb. 13. Brown stopped 55-of-58 shots (.948) in leading the Irish to a home-and-home sweep of Ferris State. In Friday's 4-1 win, Brown made 26 saves. On Saturday, at Ferris State, Brown stopped 29-of-31 shots on the way to a 3-2 win. All three goals against on the weekend came on the power play.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Goaltender **David Brown** continued his strong second half on Feb. 18 in the 1-1 tie with Bowling Green. The junior stopped 34 of 35 shots he faced, giving up just one power-play goal. In his last seven games, Brown is now 3-3-1 with a 1.42 save percentage and a .953 save percentage. In those seven games, he has given up just 10 goals while the Irish have scored 12 in those same seven games. Brown saw his streak of 23 consecutive games snapped on Feb. 17 when he was held out of the first Bowling Green game due to the flu. In those 23 games, Brown was 8-10-3 with a 2.32 goals-against average and a .921 save percentage. On the season, he is now 8-13-4 with a 2.58 goals-against average and a .912 save percentage.

PEARCE TO THE RESCUE: Freshman goaltender **Jordan Pearce** made his first start since Dec. 2 in the 7-4 win over Bowling Green. It was just his second appearance since that Dec. 2 start as junior David Brown started 22 straight until coming down with the flu last week. Pearce stopped a career-high 34 shots in the victory over the Falcons. On Jan. 21, at Northern Michigan, he came off the bench with the Irish trailing, 3-1, making 14 saves over the final 33:13 to pick up the 4-3 win. In his two appearances since Dec. 2, Pearce is 2-0-0 with a 3.86 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

A MARK FOR VAN GUILDER: Sophomore center **Mark Van Guilder** picked up the first hat trick of his career in the 7-4 win over Bowling Green on Feb. 17. Van Guilder scored twice on the power play and once at even strength. His four-point game, coupled with Erik Condra's four-assist night were the first four-point games by a Notre Dame player since **Aaron Gill '04** (3g, 1a) and **Rob Globke '04** (1g, 3a) had four points on March 18, 2004 in the CCHA Super Six in a 6-5 overtime loss to Ohio State. He now has five multiple-point games on the season and is third on the Irish roster in scoring with career highs in goals (8), assists (17), points (25), power-play goals (6), short-handed goals (1) and game winners (1).

ROOKIE SUCCESS: Freshman right wing **Erik Condra** picked up a career-high four assists in the 7-4 win versus Bowling Green on Feb. 17. The four-assist game was the first by a Notre Dame player since Nov. 2, 2001 when Connor Dunlop '03 had four in a 5-4 win at Northern Michigan. The four-point night extended his scoring streak to a Notre Dame season-high six games (2-8-10) with the streak ending the following night in the 1-1 tie. With six goals and 27 assists for 33 points, freshman **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** leads the Irish in scoring. His 33 points are the most by a Notre Dame freshman since **Jamie Ling '96** recorded 40 in his rookie year. Ling is also the last Notre Dame freshman to lead the team in scoring when he had those 40 points in the 1992-93 season.

NEW KID ON THE BLOCK: Freshman right wing **Erik Condra** not only leads Notre Dame in scoring, but also leads all CCHA rookies in scoring with six goals and 27 assists for 33 points on the year. He goes into the final weekend of the regular season four points ahead of Michigan defenseman Jack Johnson (8-21-29) in rookie scoring. Nationally, Condra is sixth among rookies with 33 points (1.03 ppg). He now has eight games this season with two or more points and owns Notre Dame's longest point streak of the season - six games (2-8-10). Condra is tied for 10th in the CCHA in scoring and is fourth in assists.

TOP CITIZEN: Notre Dame senior defenseman **Chris Trick (Troy, Mich.)** is one of seven finalists for college hockey's Humanitarian Award that is awarded each year to college hockey's top citizen. An assistant captain with the Irish, Trick oversees the team's community service projects. He has been a two-year member of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC) and has been the team's organizer for various community service projects the last two seasons. Away from Notre Dame, Trick has worked with the Michigan Amateur Hockey Association's (MAHA) Great Lakes Sled Dogs, a sled hockey program in Fraser, Mich, playing for the team, coaching and helping in fund-raising efforts. The Hockey Humanitarian Award is awarded every year at the NCAA Frozen Four in April.

IRON MEN: Senior right wing **Tim Wallace** has played in all 149 games during his four-year Notre Dame career. He is Notre Dame's all-time "Iron Man," for not having missed a game in his career. He comes into the weekend series with Alaska Fairbanks tied for eighth on the all-time games played list with Greg Meredith '80. The school record for total games played is 158 and held by Dan Carlson '01. Other Irish consecutive game streaks of 35 games or more include:

Mark Van Guilder - 70 games
Mike Walsh - 65 games

Van Guilder joins Wallace as the only two players with two or more years experience on the Irish roster who have not missed a game during their careers.

POWER-PLAY LEADER: Junior center **Josh Sciba** collected three goals and added an assist for four points in two games at Bowling Green. Sciba is second on the Irish in scoring with 17 goals and 13 assists of 30 points, all career highs. He also leads the Irish and the CCHA with 10 power-play goals, the most by a Notre Dame player since **Ben Simon '00** had 10 in the 1999-2000 season. That ties Sciba for 10th on the single-season power-play list with Simon and **Dave Poulin '82**, who did it twice in 1978-79 and 1981-82. Of Sciba's 30 career goals, 15 have come on the power play.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Notre Dame played in front of its third consecutive sellout crowd (2,763) at the Joyce Center in the Feb. 10, 4-1, win over Ferris State. The standing room only crowd was the fourth of the year for the Irish. Capacity crowds have watched the Irish on Jan. 14 (vs. Miami), Feb. 3 (vs. Michigan State) and last night. The first sellout came on Nov. 4 (vs. Michigan). The last time Notre Dame played in front of three consecutive sellouts was Feb. 14-28, 2004 when the Irish had a sellout crowd for Ferris State and two versus Michigan.

A WALSH FIRST: Senior **Mike Walsh** collected the first two-goal game of his career on Feb. 10 in the 4-1 win over Ferris State. His first goal of the game proved to be the game winner, his team-best fourth of the season. For his career, the game winner moved him into a tie for ninth on the all-time game winning goal list with **Dan Carlson '01** and **Kirt Bjork '83**. Three of his game winners have been the lone goals in 1-0 Irish wins. Nine of Walsh's 25 career goals have been game winners.

POWER-PLAY POWER: After struggling early in the season on the power play, Notre Dame has now scored at least one power-play goal in 12 of its last 15 games, including six with two or more. In those 15 games, the Irish are 20-for-87 on the power play for a 23.0% success rate. For the year, Notre Dame has 38 power-play goals in 204 chances (18.6%) in 32 games. Last season, the Irish had 23 power-play goals in 238 chances (9.8%) in 38 games. The Irish power play currently ranks third in the CCHA.

POWER-PLAY PRODUCER: **Wes O'Neill** leads Notre Dame's defense in scoring with six goals and 17 assists for 23 points, giving him career highs in assists and points after his 20-point (6g, 14a) season a year ago. Four of his six goals have come on the power play. His two-point games (1g, 1a) at Bowling Green on Feb. 17 gives him six games this season with two or more points and 11 for his career. The 2004 New York Islander draft choice has seen 17 of his points (4g, 13a) come on the power play. In his two-plus seasons with the Irish, O'Neill now has 14 goals and 41 assists for 55 points with 34 of those coming via the power play (10g, 24a).

WALLY'S WORLD: Senior right wing **Tim Wallace (Anchorage, Alaska)** is having a career-year for the Irish in 2005-06. His assist on Wes O'Neill's goal in the 4-1 win over Ferris State gives him career highs in goals (10), assists (11), points (21) and power-play goals (4). Wallace recorded his fifth multiple-point game of the year on Jan. 20 with a goal and an assist at Northern Michigan. The senior right wing has four two-point games on the year and one game with three points (2g, 1a) - a career high. He has a pair of two-goal games to his credit - Oct. 28 vs. Princeton and Dec. 18 vs. Lake Superior - giving him three for his career. Wallace continues to add to his "Iron Man" streak as he has now played in 149 consecutive games for the Irish.

A SERIES SWEEP: Notre Dame's sweep of Ferris State on Feb. 10-11 came three months to the day of the last Irish sweep. Notre Dame took two from Bowling Green (9-4 and 4-2) at home on Nov. 10-11 for their first series sweep of any kind and first back-to-back wins since Nov. 13-26, 2004 when the Irish won at Western Michigan and then at Alaska Fairbanks. The last time the Irish swept a road CCHA series came on Feb. 14-15, 2003 with a pair of 3-2 wins at Bowling Green, a span of three years and 12, two-game road series.

ROAD WARRIORS: With the win and tie at Bowling Green, Notre Dame is now 6-3-2 on the road in its last 11 road contests since a Dec. 6 win at Minnesota State. The Irish played six of their eight games in January on the road and finished the month with a 3-3-2 record. In the six road games, Notre Dame was 3-2-1. The Irish are 2-1-1 on the road in February.

DOUBLE-DIGIT SCORERS: With two goals on Feb. 10 versus Ferris State, left wing **Mike Walsh** now has 10 goals on the season to join **Josh Sciba** (13) and **Tim Wallace** (10) as double-digit goal scorers for the Irish. Last year, Notre Dame's top goal scorer had just six goals. The last time the Irish had three or more players with 10 or more goals was the 2003-04 season when five players had 10 or more goals on the year.

OPENING NIGHT TURNAROUND: In each of their last two CCHA series, the Irish have won the opening game to improve to 4-7-2 in the opening game of a CCHA series this season. In game two of the weekend, the Irish are 6-5-2.

PLAYING WITH THE LEAD: Notre Dame scored the first goal of the game in the Feb. 17 game at Bowling Green, giving the Irish three straight games of scoring first. They have scored the first goal 16 times this season and are 11-2-3. When the Irish lead after one period, they are 6-0-0. When they lead after two, Notre Dame is 11-0-3.

IRISH VERSUS TOP 15-RANKED TEAMS: Following the weekend series with Michigan State (Feb. 3-4), the Irish have now played 10 games this season versus teams ranked in the Top 15 nationally. In those games, Notre Dame is 0-8-2 with the two ties coming versus Miami (11/18 and 1/13). The last Irish win versus a ranked team came on Oct. 22, 2004 when the Irish knocked off then No. 1 Boston College, 3-2. The Nov. 19 tie at Miami snapped a 15-game losing streak versus ranked teams. Since that win versus BC, the Irish are 0-19-2 versus ranked teams.

SIX AND COUNTING: David Brown's 1-0 shutout at Ohio State (Jan. 28) was the sixth of his career and second of the season for the junior goaltender. He had four in his freshman year to set the single-season record. He is now tied for first on the career shutout list with **Morgan Cey '05**, as both now have six in their Notre Dame careers.

FAN FAVORITES: During their six road games in January, the Irish helped the opposition draw some of its biggest crowds of the year. On Jan. 6-7 at Nebraska-Omaha, the Mavericks drew back-to-back season-high crowds of 6,366 and 7,642. On Jan. 21 at Northern Michigan, the game drew the Wildcats' third biggest crowd of the year, 3,992. Last weekend at Ohio State, the two games drew the biggest crowds of the year with 10,857 on Friday and 11,141 on Saturday at Value City Arena. At the Joyce Center, the Irish have played in front of sellout crowds (2,763) in each of their last three games.

NOAH KNOWS: Defenseman **Noah Babin (Jr., Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.)** is second among Irish defensemen in scoring with three goals and 11 assists for 14 points. He now has career-highs in assists and points, surpassing last year's totals of five goals and six assists for 11 points. His three-point game (1g, 2a) against **L'Acadie**, Superior State (Dec. 18) was a career-high for the junior defenseman.

BACK-TO-BACK SHUTOUTS: Notre Dame has been involved in back-to-back 1-0 shutouts three times in their history. Last weekend marked the first time the two teams involved split the games. On Feb. 12-13, 1999, the Irish lost back-to-back 1-0 games at Michigan State and then at home with Ferris State. On Dec. 28-Jan. 3, 2003-04, the Irish won 1-0 games versus Maine and Findlay.

STREAK IS SNAPPED: Notre Dame's 1-0 shutout of Ohio State on Jan. 28 snapped a seven-game Buckeye win streak versus the Irish. It was the first Irish win since Oct. 10, 2003. The win also put a dent in Ohio State's recent domination of the Irish as the Buckeyes are now 13-2-3 versus Notre Dame in the last 18 meetings.

UNLIKELY HEROES: Notre Dame's 4-3 win at Northern Michigan produced a couple of unlikely heroes for the Irish in freshman goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)** and junior defense-

man **Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.)**. Pearce saw his first action since Dec. 2 at Western Michigan when he entered the game with 13:28 left in the second period and the Irish trailing 3-1. He stopped all 14 shots he faced in the game, including three on a five-minute power-play due to a major penalty with 3:49 left in the game, to pick up his first win since Nov. 10. Sawatske scored his first goal with the Irish on his ninth shot in a Notre Dame uniform for the game winner at 8:50 of the third period. The goal was Sawatske's first collegiate goal since Nov. 29, 2003 versus Michigan State when he was a member of the Wisconsin Badgers.

BATTLING BACK: Notre Dame's come-from-behind win at Northern Michigan on Jan. 21 was the first for the Irish this season. Notre Dame went into that game with an 0-13-0 record when trailing after two. It was the team's first come-from-behind win (when trailing, entering the third period) since Dec. 10, 2004, when they came from a 2-1 deficit to beat Michigan State, 3-2 in overtime.

FOUR IN THE NHL: At times during the 2005-06 season, Notre Dame has had four former players in the NHL at the same time. The four are: **Ben Simon '00 (Columbus)**, **Rob Globke '04 (Florida)**, **Brett Lebda '04 (Detroit)** and **Mark Eaton (Nashville)**. Simon and Globke are currently back in the American Hockey League during the Olympic break. Only one other time, have the Irish had more players in the NHL in one season. That came during the 1982-83 campaign when the Irish had five players see time in the NHL. That group included: **Jim Brown '82** (three games with Los Angeles), **Jack Brownschidle '77** (72 games with St. Louis), **Jeff Brownschidle '81** (four games with Hartford), **Don Jackson '78** (71 games with Edmonton) and **Dave Poulin '82** (two games with Philadelphia).

AHEAD OF PACE: With 83 goals in the first 32 games of the season, the Irish have already surpassed last season's mark of 60 goals that was recorded in 38 games. The 60 goals (1.58 per game) were the fewest ever scored by the Irish in a single season. Notre Dame is averaging 2.50 goals per game this season.

GETTING INVOLVED: Tom Sawatske became the third Notre Dame defenseman to score a goal this season with his third-period game winner versus Northern Michigan on Jan. 21. He joins Wes O'Neill (6) and Noah Babin (3) on the goal-scoring list for defensemen. For the year, O'Neill leads the team's defensemen in scoring with six goals and 17 assists for 23 points. Babin is second with three goals and 11 assists for 14 points. Sophomore **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** has a career-high eight assists. Senior **Chris Trick (Troy, Mich.)** has three assists. **Sawatske** has a goal and two assists for three points while sophomore **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** has one assist on the year. For the season, Notre Dame's defense has contributed 10 goals and 42 assists for 52 points on the year.

ALUMNI NOTES: Former Notre Dame goaltender **Forrest Karr '99** was named the director of athletics and campus recreation at the University of Alaska Fairbanks on Tues., Jan. 11. Karr joined the Nanook athletics' staff in 2004 as the school's compliance coordinator. On July 22, 2005, he became the interim athletics director at UAF, taking over for Dr. Cory Schwartz. He is a 1999 CCHA all-academic pick and a second team Academic All-American in the same season. A four-year letter winner for the Irish, Karr was 27-2525-6 in goal for the Irish with a 2.92 career goals-against average and a .899 save percentage. Two other former Notre Dame hockey players were busy during the Christmas holidays. **Morgan Cey '05**, who is currently a member of the Tampa Bay Lightning organization and playing in Johnstown of the ECHL was selected to play for Team Canada in the 2005 Spengler Cup Tournament in Davos, Switzerland from Dec. 26-31. Cey, who saw limited playing time, collected a silver medal as Canada finished second in the tournament. Former Irish scoring standout **Rob Globke '04** saw his hockey dream come true as he made his NHL debut with the Florida Panthers on Dec. 28 in a 6-4 win over Boston. Globke was recalled from the Rochester Americans of the AHL on Dec. 27. He scored his first NHL goal on Feb. 4 versus the Tampa Bay Lightning.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame has now recorded four ties this season, giving the Irish 52 overtime games since the start of the 1999-2000 season. In those games, the Irish are 7-6-40. During the 2004-05 season, Notre Dame played in nine overtime contests, going 1-2-6 in those games. The lone overtime win came on Dec. 10 versus Michigan State and was the first regular-season overtime win since Jan. 25, 2002, snapping a 16-game winless (0-2-14) skid in regular-season overtime games.

THE QUICKEST, THE LATEST AND THE FASTEST TWO: **Tim Wallace's** goal at 00:09 of the first period versus Western Michigan on Dec. 2 was the quickest goal at the start of a game in Notre Dame history. It broke the mark of 12 seconds set by **Sterling Black** on Jan. 6, 1990 versus Arizona. **Erik Condra's** goal with nine seconds left on the clock versus Minnesota State (Dec. 6) was the latest regulation-time, game-winning goal ever for the Irish, edging **T.J. Jindra's (Jr., Faribault, Minn.)** short-handed game winner against Boston College last season by six seconds (19:45). On Jan. 21 at Northern Michigan, **Erik Condra** and **Tom Sawatske** scored a pair of goals just eight seconds

apart in the third period of a 4-3 win. Condra scored a power-play goal at 8:42 of the third period and Sawatske scored off the following faceoff just eight seconds later at 8:50 for the game-winning goal.

TOPPING THE LIST: The University of Notre Dame is in first place in the 2005-06 National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) Cup all-sports competition after the fall sports seasons. The Irish recorded 412 points based on a third-place finish at the NCAA men's cross country championship, a seventh-place finish at the NCAA women's cross country championship, a quarterfinal appearance in women's soccer, a third-round appearance in men's soccer, a third-round appearance by the volleyball team and while football finished ranked 11th in the final *USA Today* Poll. The top five teams in the NACDA Director's Cup standings:

THREE FOR THE ROAD: Notre Dame's three-point weekend versus Nebraska-Omaha was the first road series for the Irish with three or more points since Jan. 17-18, 2004 when Notre Dame won and tied at Wisconsin. They followed that with a second three-point road weekend on Feb. 17-18 at Bowling Green. That's the most points the Irish have recorded in a CCHA road series since a sweep at Bowling Green on Feb. 14-15, 2003.

NO. 1 TEAMS: Through the first 30 games of the season, the Irish will have played 10 of them versus ranked teams. The Irish opened with No. 4 Colorado College and then played No. 9 Denver. The second week of the season, the Irish played No. 3 Michigan in a pair of games. On Nov. 18-19, the Irish played a pair of games versus No. 11/12 Miami at Oxford, Ohio. On Jan. 13-14, the Irish faced No. 3 Miami, getting a 2-2 tie and a 3-2 loss versus the RedHawks. All four of those teams have been ranked No. 1 in the nation at one time or another this year. The Irish dropped two games to No. 14 Michigan State last weekend.

LUCKY 13: Notre Dame scored 13 times in its two games last weekend versus Bowling Green. To put that number in perspective for the Irish and the goal-scoring woes they suffered in 2004-05, during January of 2005, the Irish played 11 games and scored just 12 goals.

NINE IS FINE: Notre Dame's nine goals versus Bowling Green on Nov. 10 were the most by the Irish since Nov. 20, 1998, a 9-5 win over Western Michigan at the Joyce Center.

INCOMING IRISH: Forward **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)**, one of four incoming recruits for Notre Dame for the fall of 2006, played in the United States Hockey League's 2006 Prospects/All-Star game that was held in Sioux City, Iowa on Feb. 7. Deeth, a member of the Green Bay Gamblers, leads the team in scoring with 16 goals and 32 assists for 48 points in 47 games this season and is ninth overall in the USHL. Three other incoming Irish recruits are also playing in the USHL this season. The list includes:

Christian Minella (Aurora, Colo.) who is currently playing for the USHL's Sioux City Musketeers. In 49 games for the Stampede, Minella has 18 goals and 11 assists for 29 points.

Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) is a defenseman with the Tri-City Storm. He has seven goals and 12 assists for 19 points in 42 games this season.

Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) is a forward who has played for the Sioux Falls Stampede and the Omaha Lancers this season. In 44 games, he has 16 goals and 22 assists for 38 points and is tied for 23rd in scoring in the league.

HATS OFF: Junior center **Josh Sciba** recorded the first hat trick of his career in the 9-4 win over Bowling Green on Nov. 10. Sciba scored two goals on the power play and added a short-handed marker to cap his evening. He followed that with a third power-play goal of the weekend when in Friday's 4-2 win over the Falcons. Sciba's hat trick was the first for a Notre Dame player since March 18, 2004 when **Aaron Gill '04** scored three goals in a 6-5 Irish loss to Ohio State in the first round of the CCHA Super Six. His hat trick was also the first for a Notre Dame player at the Joyce Center since **Aniket Dhadphale '99** scored three on November 13, 1998 in a 6-2 win over Bowling Green. Before Sciba's hat trick, the last five Irish three-goal efforts came on the road.

HIGH-SCORING AFFAIRS: After struggling to score goals in 2004-05, the Fighting Irish have now been involved in two games this season where they combined with their opponent to score 13 goals in a game. On Nov. 4, Notre Dame dropped an 8-5 decision to Michigan. On Nov. 10, the Irish prevailed, 9-4, versus Bowling Green. Previously, the last time Notre Dame and its opponent combined for 13 goals in a game was Dec. 5, 2003 when the Irish lost and 8-6 decision to Western Michigan.

HIGH FIVES: The last time that Notre Dame won a game by five goals was on March 16, 2003 when the Irish defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs. The Irish had five goals in the third period of the win over Bowling Green. The last time they scored five goals in a period came on Oct. 20, 2000 when they scored five second-period goals in a 6-4 win over Northeastern at the Joyce Center.

FAST START: Freshman **Erik Condra's** three-point game (0g, 3a) versus Denver was the first three-point game by an Irish rookie since **Brett Lebda '04** had five points (1g, 4a) versus Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 20, 2000. His three-point game was the first for the Irish since Nov. 5, 2004 when both **Mike Walsh** and **Cory McLean '05** had three points versus Bowling Green in a 4-4 tie.

BEATING THE BEST: In each of the last two seasons, the Irish have faced a No. 1 ranked team and each year they've come away with a victory. In 2004-05, Notre Dame knocked off the No. 1 ranked Boston College Eagles in South Bend by a 3-2 score. The previous year, the Irish traveled to Chestnut Hill, Mass., and knocked off the top-ranked Eagles, 1-0. GOING FOR THE GOLD: For the first time since the 1975-76 season, the Notre Dame hockey team will wear gold helmets. When head coach **Jeff Jackson** took over the program he wanted the hockey program to have an identity. Most people identify Notre Dame with the Golden Dome and the gold football helmets worn by the football team. Irish equipment manager **Dave Gilbert** contacted the various hockey equipment companies during the summer and Bauer was able to recreate the Irish helmets with the same gold metallic paint that is used on the helmets of the Notre Dame football team. These helmets feature white cages (except for players who wear visors) and like the football helmets have no other markings except for an American flag on the back.

FLUSHING AWAY THE LOSSES: When new Irish head hockey coach Jeff Jackson met with his team for the first time in the 2005-06 school year, they went over team rules, regulations, set up schedules and met with other administrators. At the end of the meeting, he gave the team's returning players an index card to write down everything that they hated from the previous season (a 5-27-6 year that ended in a 19-game winless skid - 0-17-2).

After doing that, the team went to where center ice would be at the Joyce Center rink and threw the cards into a waste basket to burn them, symbolizing that the previous year was done and it was time to move on. Jackson had the ashes placed in a jar that was kept in the locker room to remind everyone about the previous season.

"I thought that it was would be good to keep them as a reminder of what happens when you're not committed," said Jackson.

On Saturday night (Oct. 29) following the first period at home versus Princeton, after starting the season at 0-3 and coming off a bad second period performance the night before (in a 5-3 loss to the Tigers), Jackson walked into the locker room and before talking to the team, took the ashes into the restroom and flushed them down the toilet.

"With the first three games, our second periods were horrible, so we flushed last year away," said Jackson.

"They (the players) laughed a little, but the toilet flushed and last year is behind us. Those losses from last year were still lingering over the team and I'm just glad it's behind them and that now we can move on."

The Irish went out and scored two goals in the second period in the 2-0 win and the winless skid was over.

BACK BEHIND THE BENCH: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** returns to collegiate coaching this season for the first time since leaving Lake Superior State following the 1995-96 season. In six years with the Lakers, Jackson compiled a 182-52-25 career record with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. He came into the season as the NCAA's winningest active coach with at least five years experience with a .751 winning percentage. His 182 career wins (at the start of the year) ranked him 26th among active coaches. Included in his 182 wins are 36 postseason victories and a .837 winning percentage (36-7 in postseason). In CCHA postseason action, Jackson's teams were 24-2 (.923).

OPENING NIGHT STAND OUT: Senior right wing **Tim Wallace** has come up big on "Opening Night" for the Irish in his four seasons. On Oct. 21 at Colorado College, he continued a personal "Opening Night" streak with an assist versus the Tigers. During his four seasons at Notre Dame, Wallace has scored a point in the first game each season. In 2002, as a freshman, he scored a goal on his first career shot at Minnesota-Duluth. As a sophomore, he had a pair of assists in a 5-2 win at Ohio State. Last season, he set up Notre Dame's first goal of the season and this year he assisted on the lone goal versus Colorado College. In four season openers, Wallace has a goal and four assists for five points.

FIRST TIMERS: Freshman left wing **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** became the first Irish freshman to score a goal this season when he notched his first career goal at 3:59 of the second period. The goal was also the game winner. After getting no points in the first game of the season, **Erik Condra** burst on the scene with three assists in his second game of the year and now has five assists. Condra added his first career goal versus Michigan on Nov. 4. Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** had his first win and first shutout of the season on Oct. 29 versus Princeton. **Christian Hanson** scored his first goal and point with a third-period goal against Bowling Green. Defenseman **Tom Sawatske (Jr., Duluth, Minn.)** picked up his first assist on Nov. 5 at Michigan and his first goal on Jan. 21, a game winner versus Northern Michigan. **Justin White (Fr., Traverse City, Mich.)** has seen action in eight games and is still looking for his first points of the year.

MOVING ON: Over the last two seasons, Notre Dame has seen six of its players sign contracts with National Hockey League teams. Only Michigan (7) and Minnesota (6) have as many or more NHL signees. This past summer, goaltender **Morgan Cey (Wilkie, Sask.)** and former Irish forward **Yan Stastny (St. Louis, Mo.)** signed with the Tampa Bay Lightning and the Edmonton Oilers respectively. They joined 2003-04 signees - **Neil Komadoski (Ottawa Senators)**, **Brett Lebda (Detroit Red Wings)**, **Aaron Gill (San Jose Sharks)** and **Rob Globke (Florida Panthers)**. Komadoski, Globke and Stastny were selected in the NHL Draft (Stastny was a Boston Bruin pick) while Cey, Gill and Lebda were free-agent signees. Stastny played at Notre Dame from 2001-03 before playing professionally in Germany. He would have been a senior in 2004-05.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two Irish freshmen - forwards **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** - join seniors **Rory Walsh (Milton, Mass.)** and **Mike Walsh** as Irish hockey players with family ties to Notre Dame athletics. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-American honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. In two seasons, Regan had eight goals and 34 assists for 42 points in 60 games. Rory Walsh's father, **Brian ('77)**, was an all-American hockey player for the Irish. A center, the elder Walsh is Notre Dame's all-time leading scorer after recording 234 career points on 89 goals and 145 assists. Mike Walsh's father, **Max ('74)**, was an offensive lineman on the Notre Dame football team and a member of the 1973 national championship team. Rory Walsh is one of Notre Dame's goaltenders and Walsh plays left wing for the Irish.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame freshman **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** becomes the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

NHL DRAFTEES: This past August, the Irish had one player selected in the 2005 NHL Entry Draft. That player - **Kyle Lawson** - was a seventh round pick of the Carolina Hurricanes, 198th overall. Lawson signed a national letter-of-intent to attend Notre Dame during the early-signing period in Nov. of 2004. He then deferred until the start of the 2006-07 school year. Lawson will play this season in the United States Hockey League with the Tri-City Storm. The Irish have three players on this year's roster - senior **Mike Walsh** (New York Rangers)

and juniors **Wes O'Neill** (New York Islanders) and **David Brown** (Pittsburgh Penguins) - who have been drafted by NHL teams.

FROZEN TUNDRA: Notre Dame has had a steady flow of players in recent years that played their junior hockey with the Green Bay Gamblers of the United States Hockey League. Three members of the current Notre Dame team and a player who has signed a national letter-of-intent to attend next year have played in the Land of Lombardi. The trio is led by junior defensemen **Noah Babin (Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.)** and **Wes O'Neill (Essex, Ont.)**. The defensive duo were teammates there during the '02-'03 season. Another former Gambler is a member of the Irish sophomore class - defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. VeNard was a Gambler from 2001-04. Kevin Deeth, who will join the Irish in Sept. of 2006 is currently a member of the Gamblers.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM: Notre Dame's current roster includes six players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 15 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes senior **Tim Wallace** and juniors **Noah Babin, Michael Bartlett (Morton Grove, Ill.), Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.)** and **Josh Sciba (Westland, Mich.)**. The lone freshman is goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)**. A 16th alum will join the Irish in 2006-07 as defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** signed a letter-of-intent in November, 2004 and is playing this year in the USHL with the Tri-City Storm. Other former NTDP players who played at Notre Dame and their years in the national program include: **Brett Henning (1997-98), Michael Chin (1997-98), Connor Dunlop (1997-99), Paul Harris (1997-99), John Wroblewski (1997-99), Neil Komadoski (1998-2000), Brett Lebda (1998-2000), Rob Globke (1998-2000) and Derek Smith (2000-01).**

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: The CCHA begins its fourth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha.

Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams.

In 2005-06, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Miami and Ohio State four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Ferris State, Michigan, Michigan State and Western Michigan with two-game home series with Alaska Fairbanks and Lake Superior State. The Irish play two-game road series at Nebraska-Omaha and Northern Michigan.

STAR GAZING: Notre Dame's freshman class of 2005-06 features three players who played their junior hockey for the Lincoln (Neb.) Stars of the USHL in '04-'05. The trio includes goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska)**, defenseman **Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.)** and forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. They join sophomore right wing **Evan Rankin (Portage, Mich.)** who spent the '03-'04 season in Lincoln. Condra had 30 goals and 30 assists for 60 points for the high-flying Stars. Sawatske, a transfer from the University of Wisconsin, collected a goal and nine assists for 10 points in 34 games and Pearce was 22-10-4 with a 3.07 goals-against average and a .897 save percentage. Both Sawatske and Pearce were selected to play in the USHL Top Prospects game.

STORM WARNINGS: After bringing in three members of USHL's Tri-City Storm for the 2004-05 season, the Irish added a fourth player former Storm player **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** to this year's freshman class. Hanson joins sophomores **Brian D'Arcy (Western Springs, Ill.), Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** and **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** as Storm alums. All four were members of the 2003-04 Tri-City team that was the USHL regular-season champion and lost in the championship series to Waterloo. Hanson joins the Irish this season after leading Tri-City in scoring with 19 goals and 33 assists for 52 points on the year. He was the USHL's 2005 Curt Hammer Award winner, the fourth USHL player to win the award and them play at Notre Dame.
