No. 11/10 Notre Dame To Face Western Michigan In Home-And-Home Series Nov. 16-17

- Irish begin busy schedule with five games over a nine-day period.
- Notre Dame coming off a weekend split with No. 1 Miami; Irish win first game 2-1 before falling 3-1 in game two.
- Goaltender Jordan Pearce stops 64-of-68 shots versus RedHawks.

IRISH MEET WESTERN MICHIGAN IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES: The Notre Dame hockey team returns home after splitting a two-game series with No. 1 Miami last weekend. The Irish will face the Western Michigan Broncos in a home-and-home series on Nov. 16-17. On Friday night, Nov. 16, the Irish will play host to the Broncos at the Joyce Center in a 7:35 p.m. game. On Saturday, Nov. 17, the two teams will meet in Kalamazoo, Mich., at Lawson Arena at 7:36 p.m. Saturday's game will be televised live by Comcast Local with **Ben Holden** and **Sean Ritchlin** calling the action. The game can be seen in South Bend on Comcast Cable Channel 3. Notre Dame comes into the game ranked 11th in the *USA Today* Poll and 10th in the USCHO.com poll after knocking off top-ranked Miami last Friday, 2-1. The RedHawks returned the favor the following night with a 3-1 win. The Irish are 7-4-0 overall and 5-2-0 in the CCHA. Western Michigan comes into the series with a 3-5-0 record and the Broncos are 1-3-0 in conference play. WMU has lost three of its five games this season in overtime. The two teams have met 64 times in the all-time series with Western holding a 34-25-5 edge. At the Joyce Center, Notre Dame leads, 16-12-1 while at Lawson Arena, the Broncos have a 21-9-4 advantage. Last season, the two teams met twice at Lawson Arena with Western Michigan winning the first game, 3-2, and the Irish taking the second game, 3-0. The last time the Broncos won at the Joyce Center was March 13, 2004, a 4-0 win in the CCHA playoffs. Since then WMU is 0-2-0 in South Bend.

BUSY SCHEDULE: The series with Western Michigan begins a busy nine-day period that will see Notre Dame play five games. On Tues., Nov. 20, Notre Dame will play host to the Bowling Green Falcons in a 7:35 p.m. game at the Joyce Center. The Irish will then spend Thanksgiving in Troy, N.Y., on Nov. 23-24 as they participate in the 57th Annual Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Notre Dame will face Alabama-Huntsville in the opening game at Houston Field House at 4:00 p.m. on Nov. 23 while R.P.I. faces American International in the second game. The third-place and championship games will be played at 4:00 p.m. and 7:15 p.m. on Nov. 24. This is the second time this season that the Irish will play five games in a nine-day span as they did so between Oct. 18-27.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9 marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. In fact, the last four times that Notre Dame has faced a No. 1 team, the Irish have come away with the victory. WINNING AT MIAMI: Notre Dame's 2-1 win over the RedHawks on Nov. 9 snapped a six-game Irish winless streak (0-5-1) at Oxford, Ohio. The previous Irish win was on March 16, 2003 when they defeated Miami, 5-0, in game three of the first round of the CCHA playoffs to advance to Joe Louis Arena. Last Friday's win came in Notre Dame's first-ever appearance at Steve Cady Arena.

MIAMI RECAP: Notre Dame got first-period goals from **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** and **Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.)** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska)** made 32 saves in the 2-1 win over the No. 1 Miami RedHawks on Nov. 9. Hanson opened the scoring at 9:50 when he converted a **Robin Bergman (Fr., Stockholm, Sweden)** centering pass for his second goal of the season and second in as many games. Kissel got what proved to be the game winner at 16:11 after he and **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** forced a turnover behind the Miami goal. Kissel picked up the loose puck and fired it past Jeff Zatkoff for his first of the season. Miami would cut the lead to 2-1 at 2:25 of the second period on a goal by Nathan Davis. From there, Pearce slammed the door, finishing the game with 32 saves. The Irish were out shot, 33-20, in the game.

On Saturday night, the RedHawks stormed the Irish in the opening period, taking a 2-0 lead on goals by Nino Musitelli and Tommy Wingels as they out shot the Irish by a 16-4 margin with Pearce making 14 saves to keep Notre Dame in the game. Pat Cannone made it 3-0 in favor of Miami with the lone goal of the second period at 4:47. The Irish finally broke through at 2:13 of the third period when Evan Rankin jammed the rebound of an **Ian Cole (Fr., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** shot past Zatkoff for his fourth goal of the season. Notre Dame out shot Miami, 10-3, in the third but that would be the lone goal for the Irish as the RedHawks took the 3-1 win. Miami out shot Notre Dame, 35-28, in the game with Pearce turning in his second 32-save game of the weekend. Zatkoff finished with 27 saves on the night.

STRONG SCHEDULE: Notre Dame goes into the weekend series with Western Michigan having opened the season by playing five of its first 11 games versus nationally ranked teams. The Irish opened the year dropping a 4-1 decision to #14/#15 Wisconsin. They then split a series in South Bend with #5/#5 Denver, winning, 4-3

and losing, 3-1. Last weekend, Notre Dame split with #1/#1 Miami with a 2-1 win on Friday and a 3-1 loss on Saturday. The Irish are 2-3-0 against ranked teams this season.

TOUGH AS NAILS: Senior right wing **Evan Rankin** showed his toughness in the 3-1 loss to Miami on Saturday night at Steve Cady Arena. After taking a high hit in the second period that sent him to the locker room for stitches, Rankin returned to action in the third period to record his fourth goal of the season. The Portage, Mich., native has already equaled his goal output from last season when he had four goals and is one off his career high of five goals that he set during his freshman year in 2004-05.

THE PUCK STOPS HERE: Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** recorded back-to-back 32-save games in the weekend series at Miami. He faced 33 shots in the opening night, 2-1 win, and then saw 35 shots on Saturday night in the 3-1 loss at Oxford, Ohio. Pearce has started 10 of Notre Dame's 11 games this season with the 10 appearances being a career high. His six wins are the most in a season and he goes into the weekend with Western Michigan ranked second in the nation with 595:13 minutes played, just 6:14 less than the national leader, Michigan's Billy Sauer. Pearce owns a 2.22 goals-against average and a .916 save percentage with one shutout on the year.

GOOD NEWS AND BAD NEWS: Through 11 games this season, the Irish have some good news and some bad news to report. In Notre Dame's seven victories, the Irish have scored 28 goals for a 4.00 average. In the four losses, Notre Dame has scored just three goals for a 0.75 goals-per game mark. In the seven wins, the Irish have given up just 12 goals (1.71 goals-against average) while in the four losses, they have given up 13 goals (3.25 goals against).

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** collected his first goal of the season in the 2-1 win at Miami. The goal also proved to be the game winner. In Kissel's career, he has now played in 30 career games and has scored seven goals. Of his seven goals, four have been game winners. Last season, three of his six goals on the year were winning goals.

DYNAMIC DUO: Notre Dame's defensive duo of **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** have proven to be one of the CCHA's top defensive pairs through the first 11 games of the season. Both Irish defensive stalwarts are +9 for the season, meaning they have been on the ice for nine more goals scored by Notre Dame than the Irish have given up at even strength. That ties them for second in the CCHA with two other players and is one behind Miami's Mitch Ganzak who is +10 for the year.

POWERLESS: Notre Dame's power play was stopped in the series at Miami last weekend, going 0-for-7 in the two-game series. The previous weekend against Lake Superior, the Irish were 5-for-10 with the man advantage versus the Lakers.

HOT HAND: Junior center **Christian Hanson** picked up goals in back-to-back games for the Irish as he scored short-handed in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior on Nov. 2 and then had the first goal of the game in the 2-1 win over Miami on Nov. 9. Hanson has two goals and one assist through the first 11 games this season. The short-handed goal was the first of his career.

SENIOR CLASS HONORS: Notre Dame team captain **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** has been nominated for the Lowes Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Lowes Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career – 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 127 consecutive games played through the first 11 games this year.

PENALTY KILLERS: The Irish surrendered their fourth power-play goal of the season in Saturday's 3-1 loss to Miami. On the weekend, Notre Dame killed 8-of-9 RedHawk power plays. For the year, the Irish are second in the CCHA and seventh in the nation, having killed 50-of-54 opponent power-play chances for a 92.6% success rate.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked eighth in the nation by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. CONDRA CAPERS: Right wing **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** recorded the second, five-point game of his career in the Nov. 1, 7-3 win over Lake Superior. Condra scored twice and added three assists for five points on the night. His previous five-point game came on Jan. 5, 2007 at Robert Morris when he had a goal and four assists. Condra currently leads the Irish in scoring with four goals and six assists for 10 points in the first 11 games of the season.

ON THE MARK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain leads the Irish in goals (6) and power-play goals (4) this season.

LINING UP: Notre Dame's trio of **Erik Condra, Mark Van Guilder** and freshman **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** played on the same line for the first time this season against Lake Superior State. The trio combined for six goals and eight assists for 14 points over the two games. Bergman scored his first collegiate goal in the 7-3 win and had the first multiple-point game of his career in that game. He added an assist in the 4-1 win on Friday night for a three-point weekend. Condra had (3g, 3a) and Van Guilder added two goals and three assists for their weekend statistics. Bergman scored the lone point for the trio at Miami as he set up Christian Hanson's first period goal in the 2-1 win over the RedHawks.

NEW KID: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** made his first career start in goal for Notre Dame on Nov. 2 in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior State. Phillips stopped 16 of the 17 shots he faced, giving up just a five-on-three power-play goal in the game. Phillips did not make the trip to Miami due to illness.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's two wins on the road between Oct. 23 and Oct. 27 (at Bowling Green and Ferris State) gave the Irish seven-consecutive road wins, dating back to Jan. 19, 2007. The seven-consecutive road wins tied a program record that was set between Jan. 7 and Feb. 4, 1977. That seven-game streak also became part of the team's longest road unbeaten run as the Irish went 8-0-1 between Jan. 7 and Feb. 24 of that season. The streak was snapped on Oct. 28 in a 3-0 loss at Ferris State.

DYNAMITE DEETH: Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth**, held to just two assists in the first seven games of the season broke out of his slow start with a three-assist game in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. He picked up assists on VeNard's goal and then the two power-play goals by Van Guilder and Condra in the second period. The three-assist night was the first of his career while the three-point game was the third of his young Notre Dame career. Deeth rang up his fourth assist of the weekend as he helped set up a Kyle Lawson goal in the 4-2 win on Nov. 2.

SPECIAL MENTION: Notre Dame freshmen forward **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** earned special mention for CCHA rookie of the month honors for October after scoring two goals and adding five assists for seven points in his first month of play. Miami's Carter Camper took the rookie of the month honors over Ryan.

SEVEN HEAVEN: The seven goals scored by the Irish on Nov. 1 is the most they have scored in a game since March 9, 2007 when they also hung seven goals on Alaska in the first game of the second round of the CCHA playoffs. Notre Dame won that game, 7-1.

FRIENDLY CONFINES: The sellout crowd of 2,857 on Friday, Nov. 2 at the Joyce Center was the largest crowd to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. This week, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity.

HOME SWEET HOME: After four home games this season, Notre Dame is 3-1-0 at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records – 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

TICKLING THE TWINE: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** scored his first goal for the Irish since March 3, 2006 in the 7-3 win over Lake Superior. His last goal came against Alaska in the 2006 CCHA playoffs. He was goal less in 17 games last season and snapped a 25-game goal-less drought with his first-period marker on Nov. 1. The goal was the third of VeNard's career.

THE REAL THANG: Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** has now scored goals in five of Notre Dame's first 11 games this season. His goal against Lake Superior State was his fifth of the year and third on the power play. He has now scored 25 goals in his first 53 career games with 13 of them coming on the power play.

THE LAST TIME: Prior to the 3-0 shutout at Ferris State (Oct. 28), the last time that Notre Dame failed to score a goal in a game came on Nov. 18, 2006 when the Irish were shutout, 2-0, by Jeff Lerg at Michigan State.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: The Irish have had their share of success on the road over the last two seasons. This year, Notre Dame is 3-2-0 on the road. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better.

CCHA OPENERS: Notre Dame's 3-2 win at Bowling Green on Tuesday night opened the 17th season in the CCHA for Notre Dame. The Irish joined the conference in 1981-82, left following the '82-'83 season and then returned in 1992-93. The win over the Falcons in the CCHA opener gives Notre Dame an 8-7-2 all-time mark in conference lid lifters.

HOME OPENERS: The October 18 win over Denver in the home opener gives Notre Dame a 22-17-1 record in Joyce Center openers. The Irish have won two straight home openers after beating Minnesota State, 6-1, last season.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

BIG WIN: Notre Dame's win over Denver on Oct. 18 was the first this season for the Irish against a nationally-ranked team as they are now 1-2-0 on the year. A year ago, Notre Dame was 10-2-1 against ranked teams. The Pioneers were the highest-ranked team that Notre Dame has beaten at the Joyce Center since beating fourth-ranked Michigan State, 4-1, on Nov. 17, 2006.

FIRST TIMERS: Sophomore right wing **Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.)** made his first career appearance versus Denver (10/19). Carlin did not play in any games last year and lined up at right wing in his first appearance, getting one penalty for two minutes. Fellow sophomore **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** made his first appearance of the season since being sidelined in the first week of practice with an injury.

CCHA OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** was the CCHA offensive player of the week for the week ending Oct. 14. Van Guilder scored three goals in Notre Dame's two games at the Lefty McFadden Invitational. In the 4-1 loss to Wisconsin, Van Guilder scored a second-period, power-play goal to tie the game at 1-1. In Saturday's 4-0 victory versus Mercyhurst, Van Guilder scored a pair of goals, including one on the power play and one for the game winner. In the game, he set a career high with 12 shots on goal.

GETTING OFFENSIVE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** was a finalist last season for the CCHA's defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan is showing his offensive game as he already has five assists in the first 11 games of the season. For his career, Sheahan now has three goals and 22 assists for 25 points.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. They will be joined by junior forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

NEW KIDS: Six of Notre Dame's freshmen made their Irish debuts at the Lefty McFadden Invitational (Oct. 12-13). Leading the way was right wing **Ben Ryan** who recorded three assists in his first two games. Also playing in both games were forwards **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** and **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** along with defensemen **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Joining those five was right wing **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** who played his first game against Mercyhurst in the second game of the weekend. Goaltender **Brad Phillips** saw his first action on Nov. 2, making his first career start in the 4-1 win over Lake Superior.

SWEDISH CONNECTION: For the first time in the 40-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program, the Irish have two natives of Sweden on the roster. Freshmen **Robin Bergman (Stockholm)** and **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm)** join the roster this season. Both played last year in the USHL; Bergman for Cedar Rapids and Ridderwall for Tri-City. Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points. His 17 power-play goals were second in the league. Ridderwall led Tri-City in scoring with 27 goals and 35 assists for 62 points. He had 14 power-play goals and seven game winners, the most in the league in that category.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 3-2 overtime win versus Alabama-Huntsville in the NCAA Regionals on March 23, 2007 gave the Irish a 3-1-3 record in overtime last year. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two seasons under **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-7 in extra play.

Red Line Report rankings had Wisconsin first, followed by Boston University, Michigan, Boston College, **Notre Dame**, Minnesota, Ohio State and North Dakota. Four of Notre Dame's seven freshmen were drafted – **Ian Cole** (first round, St. Louis), **Teddy Ruth** (second round, Washington), **Ben Ryan** (fourth round, Nashville) and **Brad Phillips** (seventh round, Philadelphia).

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

DROP THE PUCK: For the third season in a row, the Irish opened the year with the "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center. This year's event took place on Oct. 10 with former Detroit Red Wings' great and current team vice-president **Steve Yzerman** serving as guest speaker. This year's reception took place prior to the annual Blue/Gold intrasquad scrimmage. Yzerman joins

Chicago Blackhawk TV analyst **Ed Olczyk** and **Scotty Bowman** who were guest speakers in 2006 and 2005 respectively. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weis to address his team at practice, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan in 2005.

THE KIDS WERE ALRIGHT: Notre Dame placed three players on the CCHA all-rookie team in 2007. Forwards **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** and **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** were joined by defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**. Notre Dame became the third school in CCHA history to have three players on the all-rookie team, joining Michigan (five times) and Michigan State (once). The 1993-94 Michigan team set the record with four freshmen named to that team. Thang became the first Irish freshman to score 20 or more goals in a season since **Dave Poulin '82** had 28 in his rookie year of 1978-79. His 20 goals were the sixth most by a Notre Dame freshman while his 41 points tied for eighth best. Deeth's 17 goals tied him for the eighth-best total and his 39 points tied him for 10th among Irish freshmen.

WELCOME BACK: Junior defenseman **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** returns to the Notre Dame lineup this season after spending the 2006-07 season with the Tri-City Storm of the USHL. Lucyk played in 44 games for the Irish between 2004-06 with one goal and one assist for two points. He returned to Tri-City last season to get more playing time and had nine goals and 13 assists for 22 points in 59 games.

NHL DRAFTS: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

WORST TO FIRST: Just two seasons ago (2004-05), Notre Dame was 5-27-6 overall and finished last in the CCHA with a 3-20-5 record. In the CCHA's 35-year history, no team has ever gone from worst-to-first in one season. There have been three teams go from worst to first in a two-season span. They are:

1975-76 Bowling Green – Falcons finished last in 1973-74 in a three team conference and finished first in '75-'76 in a five-team league.

1992-93 Miami – RedHawks were last in 1990-91 with nine points in a nine-team conference. They finished first in 1992-93 with 49 points in a 12-team conference for a 40-point improvement over two seasons.

2006-07 Notre Dame – Irish were last in 2004-05 with 11 points in a 12-team conference. In '06-'07, the Irish took first place with 45 points for a 34-point improvement over two seasons.

JUNIOR EVALUATIONS: Three members of the Notre Dame freshman class participated in the U.S. Junior Evaluation Camp this past August in hopes of making the United States' roster for the 2007 World Junior Championships. Freshmen defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** were joined by center **Ben Ryan**. Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** served as one of the assistant coaches at the camp.

HOMETOWNS: The 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 13 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ontario, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, freshmen Robin Bergman (Stockholm) and Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: – The CCHA begins its sixth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2007-08, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Ferris State and Western Michigan four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Lake Superior, Nebraska-Omaha and Ohio State while playing two-game road series at Alaska, Miami and Northern Michigan. Last year, the Irish were 10-1-1 against Bowling Green, Alaska and Nebraska-Omaha, the three teams in their cluster.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshmen defensemen Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth plus goaltender Brad Phillips.
