BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH IN THE NIT

1	Notre Dame leads the country in personal fouls committed per game (12.5) and is third in fewest fouls committed (450).
2	Only two players in Notre Dame history posted 1,600 points, 850 rebounds and 150 blocked shots in their collegiate careers - senior forward Bonzie Colson and current Irish assistant coach Ryan Humphrey .
4	Entering post season play, sophomore guard T.J. Gibbs has logged 1,280 minutes in 2017-18, the fourth-most in the country.
5	Notre Dame and Penn State will be meeting for the fifth time on Tuesday evening and for the third consecutive time in the NIT. Saturday will mark PSU's first visit to Notre Dame for a men's basketball game.
6	With 26 assists in the last four games, senior Matt Farrell has moved up to 413 assists with 190 three-point field goals. He is the sixth Notre Dame player to reach 150 3FGM with 400 assists. Should he reach 200 3FGM in the postseason, only two other Notre Dame players have achieved 200 3FGM with 400 assists.
11	Dishing out a career-best 12 assists against Duke on March 8, Matt Farrell became the 11th Irish player to post 12 assists in a single game (tied for the fourth-best in Notre Dame history). Farrell also scored 11 points in the game, earning his second career double-double.
12	Notre Dame is making its 12th appearance in the NIT. The Irish advanced to the NIT championship game in 1973, 1984, 1992 and 2000 - while also making the semifinals in 2009.
21	Trailing by 21 points in the ACC tournament second round against Virginia Tech, Notre Dame rallied for a 71-65 victory and posted the program's greatest come-from-behind victory. It surpassed the 20-point rally at Villanova on Feb. 18, 2012.
27	Notre Dame is 27-11 all-time in the NIT and 15-3 at Purcell Pavilion.
35	Combined games missed due to injury this season by Bonzie Colson (15), Matt Farrell (5) freshman forward D.J. Harvey (14) and junior Rex Pflueger (1).
86	Senior Martinas Geben is shooting 86 percent (.856) at the free throw line this season (83-97), a mark that would rank 13th on the Notre Dame single-season list. He is 43-for-his-last 45 from the charity stripe (.911) in his last 15 games played.
103	The 2017-18 senior class has set the mark as the all-time winningest four-year class in Notre Dame basketball history and became the first group to win 100 games in four seasons against Pittsburgh on Feb. 28.
502	With 502 career wins, Mike Brey is the 11th active coach to reach that career milestone coaching at just one or two institutions. See page 3 of the notes package for more details.
891	Career rebounds by Bonzie Colson , the 11th Notre Dame player to collect 850 rebounds in a career. He also is just the fifth Irish player to reach the 1,600-point / 850-rebound statistical plateaus.

IRISH AND PENN STATE MEET AGAIN IN THE NIT

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (21-14) returns to the court in the second round of the 2018 National Invitation Tournament against Penn State (22-13) at noon ET in Purcell Pavilion. The game will mark the third consecutive NIT meeting between the two programs, as the Irish and Nittany Lions met in the semifinals of the post season tournament in 2000 and 2009.

QUICK FACTS

- Senior **Martinas Geben** led all ACC players in offensive rebounds per game during the ACC tournament, pulling down 13 in three games (4.33 pg).
- Senior **Bonzie Colson** was named to the 2018 ACC All-Tournament Second Team after averaging 16.3 points, 7.3 rebounds, 2.0 blocks and 2.0 steals per game. It is the second career ACC all-tournament selection for Colson, who was a first-team honoree in 2017.
- **Martinas Geben** and **Bonzie Colson** combined to average 14.3 rebounds per game in the ACC tournament, the top two-player combination of any team in the tournament. Geben and Colson both pulled down 44 rebounds in three games.

NOTRE DAME - PENN STATE SERIES HISTORY

Notre Dame and Penn State will be meeting for the fifth time on Saturday afternoon - and the fourth time in post season play. The Nittany Lions lead the series 3-1, including victories in the 1954 NCAA Tournament and the 2009 NIT semifinals.

The series began in 1925 with a PSU win at home in The Armory 33-22 on Feb. 21, 1925. The Nittany Lions also ended an NCAA run for the Irish in 1954, taking out No. 6/5 Notre Dame 71-63 in the regional finals at Iowa City, Iowa - earning Penn State's only trip to the Final Four.

The two teams also have met twice in the semifinals of the NIT at Madison Square Garden. In 2000, the Irish defeated Penn State 73-52 behind 18 points and eight rebounds from All-American Troy Murphy. A semifinal rematch in 2009 saw Penn State hold off a furious Notre Dame rally (cutting a PSU 19-point lead to four points with just four minutes to go) to escape 67-59.

MATT FARRELL EARNS ALL-ACC HONORS

Senior guard Matt Farrell was named to the All-ACC Third Team on Sunday, March 4, 2018. He was an honorable mention selection as a junior.

Despite missing five conference games this season with a severely sprained ankle, Farrell averaged 16.7 points per game, 5.5 apg and shot .408 from three-point range. He connected on an ACC-best 10 three-point field goals in a victory at Boston College on Feb. 17, 2018, and leads the conference in three-point field goals per game in conference play (3.92).

A SEASON OF MILESTONES FOR MIKE BREY

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey has reached three key milestones in his coaching career this season.

Brey became the all-time men's basketball coaching wins leader at Notre Dame (402 current - 394 was the record-breaking total) with an 88-58 victory over NC State on January 3, 2018.

Brey won his 400th game at Notre Dame against Pittsburgh on February 28, 2018, making him the 11th active coach to have 400 wins at his current school.

Brey then won his 500th career game in the first of two wins for the Irish at the ACC tournament, downing Pittsburgh 67-64.

Brey joins Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Roy Williams, Greg Kampe, Tony Shaver, Tom Izzo, Fran Dunphy, Bob McKillop, Jay Wright and Mark Few as the only current coaches to win 500 or more games while coaching at just one or two schools.

20-WINS TRADITION CONTINUES FOR NOTRE DAME

For the 14th time in 18 seasons and 11th time in the past 12 seasons, Notre Dame reached 20-win mark in 2017-18.

The 14th season of 20-win victories for Mike Brey in 18 seasons at Notre Dame breaks the previous record of 13 held by Digger Phelps in his 20 years on the Irish bench.

GEBEN'S BIG MOMENT

Senior forward Martin Geben has been playing his best basketball of his Notre Dame career this season and stepped up in a clutch situation at the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational.

With the Irish trailing by a point and three seconds remaining, Geben was fouled on an in-bounds play and sent to the foul line. A consistent free throw shooter in practice, Geben has not seen many opportunities in his career (he was 53-70, .750 percentage, before the two attempts against Wichita State) but stepped up to convert both free throw attempts and provide the game-winning points.

Geben's final two games in Maui, 10 pts vs. LSU and a career-high matching 12 against Wichita State, marked the first time in his career he had posted back-to-back double-digit scoring games.

INTERNATIONAL DUO

Senior Martin Geben (Vilnius, Lithuania) and sophomore Nikola Djogo (Hamilton, Ontario, Canada) became first pair of foreign-born players to start a game during the Mike Brey era when they were both in the starting five against Virginia Tech on Jan. 27, 2018.

The last pair of foreign-born players to start a game for Notre Dame occurred in the 1999-2000 season under head coach Matt Doherty. On Jan. 25, 2000, freshmen Jere Macura and Ivan Kartelo - both from Split, Croatia - started against Miami (Florida).

Djogo is the first Canadian-born player to start a game for Notre Dame. He and Geben join Macura, Kartelo, Tom Timmermans (Driehu- is, Netherlands) and Eric Katenda (Paris, France) as the six foreign-born players to compete for Notre Dame under head coach Mike Brey.

FARRELL REACHES 1,000 POINTS

Senior guard Matt Farrell, who saw limited minutes in his first two seasons with the Irish, surpassed the 1,000-point career milestone with a top-of-the-key three pointer at Wake Forest on Saturday, February 24. He is the 62nd (and 23rd Mike Brey era) player in school history to reach that notable milestone.

FARRELL CLUTCH PLAYS

Matt Farrell's game-winning three pointer at Wake Forest with 5.8 seconds remaining was one of the top clutch plays of the 2017-18 season for the Irish, but was just another big late-game play in a series of moments in the Bridgewater, N.J. native's career.

With just seconds remaining in overtime and the Irish trailing by two points, Farrell drives and finds Steve Vasturia open on the wing for the game-winning three point shot.

Ahead by two points, Farrell helps Notre Dame secure a key victory over Clemson with a deep three point shot with nine seconds remaining, pushing the Irish to a 75-70 victory.

Up by one point with 47.2 seconds left, Farrell dives on the ball at midcourt as the Hokies try to roll the ball toward their offensive end to save time. Farrell makes the steal, jumps up without traveling, then drives to the basket to find a wide open T.J. Gibbs for the game-sealing points in a 76-71 victory.

Trailing by three points, Farrell steals and in bounds pass in the back court and immediately finds Bonzie Colson for a lay up to cut the Shockers lead to one point. Notre Dame would eventually win the game with two free throws from Martinas Geben with two seconds remaining.

After hitting a top-of-the-key three pointer to give Notre Dame its first lead of the game at 71-69 with 3:19 remaining (which also was his 999th, 1000th and 1001st career points), Farrell drills a deep three pointer in front of the Irish bench to break a 71-71 tie with 5.8 seconds remaining in the eventual 76-71 victory and keep Notre Dame's post season hopes alive.

FARRELL POSTS HISTORICAL SHOOTING PERFORMANCE

For a career 40-percent three-point field goal shooter, it was only a matter of time before Matt Farrell rebounded from a subpar shooting effort at North Carolina on Feb. 12 (1-12 3FG). The recovery came fast and furious in his next game at Boston College on Feb. 17.

Farrell would eventually score 37 points against the Eagles (the team he originally committed to before a coaching change prompted him to reopen his recruiting and eventually signing with Notre Dame) and finished 10-of-12 from three point range.

BACK-TO-BACK IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT MVPs FOR FARRELL

Safe to say that senior guard Matt Farrell embraces the competition of in-season tournaments. The Bridgewater, N.J., native enjoyed his break out performances at the 2016 Legends Classic in the Barclays Center, earning tournament MVP honors.

He stepped up another level at the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational, leading the Irish through three victories - including a career-high 27 points against Chaminade and the play of the game in the rally over No. 6/6 Wichita State, stealing an in-bounds pass with less than a minute remaining and finding Bonzie Colson to cut the Shocker lead to one point.

In the past two in-season tournaments, Farrell is averaging 19.4 ppg, shooting .482 from 3FG and averaging 5.4 apg.

INJURY TIMELINE

Notre Dame has been hit by the injury bug this season, playing a significant amount of the season without three of its top six players. A timeline of the injury losses:

Friday, Dec. 29, 2013 (loss of Colson) - Senior All-American and National Player of the Year candidate Bonzie Colson injures his foot in practice. He starts and plays the full game against Georgia Tech on Saturday, Dec. 30 (scoring 22 points and collecting 17 rebounds), but the discomfort in his left foot leads to an x-ray performed on Monday, Jan. 1. On Tuesday, Jan. 2, it is announced that Colson will miss eight weeks with a fracture in his left foot. He undergoes successful surgery on Thursday, Jan. 4 and is expected to miss eight weeks of action.

Wednesday, Jan. 3 (loss of Farrell) - In the first game without Bonzie Colson in the lineup, senior guard and Wooden Award watch list selection Matt Farrell severely sprains his left ankle with 5:09 remaining in the first half. Farrell would miss the next three games (at Syracuse - W, at Georgia Tech - L, vs. North Carolina - L). He returned to the starting line up on Tuesday, Jan.16, against Louisville.

Tuesday, Jan. 16 (loss of Harvey) - With Farrell back in the starting lineup, freshman D.J. Harvey (who had started the previous four games in place of Colson) suffers a bone bruise in his left knee with 8:25 remaining in the first half against Louisville. Harvey would be sidelined for the rest of the season, though at the time was expected to miss two to four weeks.

Thursday, Jan. 24 (loss of Farrell again)- After competing in two games, Farrell suffers a setback in the rehabilitation from his ankle injury. An MRI is performed and a bone bruise is identified in his left ankle (suffered during the original injury on Jan. 3). Farrell is sidelined indefinitely and does not play against Virginia Tech (L) or Duke (L). He will be a game time decision for the contest at NC State.

Since losing Colson, the Irish were able to field a lineup with Farrell and Harvey for just 11:35 of game time (the first half of the double overtime loss to Louisville before Harvey's injury) before Farrell returned full time at NC State on Feb. 3.

Thursday, Feb. 1 (loss of Mooney) - With Farrell back to practice, John Mooney sprains his right ankle in the final segment of practice on Thursday, Feb. 1. Mooney attempts to 'give it a go' at NC State and remains in the starting lineup, but is eventually limited to just eight minutes of playing time.

Mooney returned to the lineup full time on Tuesday, Feb. 6, against Boston College and scored a then-career-best 16 points.

Friday, Feb. 16. (Harvey aggravates knee injury) - Poised to return to the lineup on Saturday, Feb. 17, at Boston College, D.J. Harvey tweaks his knee at practice and will undergo surgery on February 28, 2018. He is expected to miss the next six-to-eight months.

February 17 (Pflueger injures lower back) - Rex Pflueger takes a hard fall after a drive to the basket in the second half at Boston College, limiting him to 20 minutes played in the contest. He would miss the Notre Dame - Miami (FL) game, ending a 31-game consecutive start streak. He returned to the starting lineup at Wake Forest but was limited to 25 minutes played (10 minutes below his average).

NINE DIFFERENT STARTING LINE UPS

Due to injuries suffered by Bonzie Colson, Matt Farrell, D.J. Harvey and Rex Pflueger this year, the Irish have utilized nine different starting line ups in 2017-18 - which matches the 2011-12 season for the second-most of the Mike Brey era (2000-01 - present).

Senior Matt Farrell and sophomore T.J. Gibbs not only share the ball handling duties in the Notre Dame backcourt, they also are linked by their noteworthy development as part of the Irish roster.

Moving from a reserve role to the starting point guard for the 2016-17 season, Farrell improved his scoring output by 11.5 points for the season - 2.6 to 14.1 - to rank second in the ACC.

In 2017-18, Gibbs is following Farrell's path while moving from a reserve to the starting line up. Currently, Gibbs has improved his scoring output 10.6 points per game (4.7 to 15.3) - finished second in the ACC behind UNC's Luke Maye.

COLSON LOST FOR EIGHT WEEKS WITH LEFT FOOT FRACTURE

Senior All-American Bonzie Colson, the 2017-18 ACC Player of the Year and consensus preseason first-team All-American, was lost for eight weeks of game action after suffering a fracture in his left foot on Friday, December 29, 2017. After scoring 22 points with a career-best 17 rebounds on December 30, 2017, Colson's fractured foot was revealed in an x-ray.

He underwent successful surgery in South Bend, Indiana, on Thursday, January 4, 2018, was cleared for limited physical activities on Monday, February 19. Colson began full basketball activities on Monday, Feb. 26 and returned to the line up against Pittsburgh on Feb. 28, scoring 12 points with nine rebounds and three blocks in 21 minutes of action.

COLSON A CONSENSUS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Bonzie Colson, the top returning rebounder and second-leading returning scorer in the ACC, has been named a 2016-17 Preseason All-American by a majority of the publications and websites that cover college basketball. The Associated Press, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News, The Athletic and Blue Ribbon Yearbook all placed Colson on their preseason first team.

In addition, Colson was named the preseason national player of the year by the Blue Ribbon Yearbook and the ACC Preseason Player of the Year.

COLSON NAMED TO ASSOCIATED PRESS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM

The Associated Press has announced its 2017-18 Preseason All-America Team and senior forward Bonzie Colson was the second-leading vote getter on the five-person team. BONZIE COLSON NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior forward Bonzie Colson was overwhelmingly voted as the Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Player of the Year as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25. Colson, who led the league in rebounding (10.1) during the 2016-17 season and finished ninth in scoring (17.8), received 49 of the 69 possible votes for the preseason player of the year nod. He was the lone ACC player to average a double-double per game last season.

Colson is the first Notre Dame player to earn a preseason conference player of the year award since Luke Harangody repeated as the BIG EAST preseason player of the year in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Colson also joins Jerian Grant (2013-14, 2014-15) and Demetrius Jackson (2015-16) as Irish players selected to the preseason all-ACC team.

Other previous Notre Dame preseason conference player of the year selections include Pat Garrity (BIG EAST, 1997-98) and Troy Murphy (BIG EAST, 2000-01). Murphy ended up earning the BIG EAST Player of the Year award at the end of the 2000-01 campaign.

Colson was also named to the Preseason All-ACC First Team.

NOTRE DAME EARNS ANOTHER ARENA DEDICATION GAME IN STATE OF ILLINOIS

Notre Dame's season-opening 72-58 victory at DePaul on Saturday, November 11, marked the dedication game of Wintrust Arena in downtown Chicago. The win marked Notre Dame's second consecutive victory in an arena dedication game in the state of Illinois, as the Irish defeated Illinois 84-79 in the State Farm Center dedication on Dec. 2, 2015 (also a part of the ACC-Big Ten Challenge that season).

The Irish have now participated in the opening of five arenas on the road in program history. Here is a list of those contests, which also includes the Joyce Center/Purcell Pavilion dedication game with UCLA in 1968.

November 11, 2017, was not the first dedication that has taken place during a Notre Dame - DePaul game. On December 14, 2003, the Irish and Blue Demons met at Allstate Arena for the dedication of Ray and Marge Meyer Court - honoring the Hall of Fame DePaul coach and former Irish basketball team captain. Notre Dame won that meeting 82-69.

Also on January 29, 1934, Notre Dame was part of the first college basketball doubleheader ever played in Madison Square Garden. The Irish lost to NYU 18-26, while St. John's lost to Westminster 37-33 in front of 16,138 fans.

MIKE BREY, HEAD COACH

In 17 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to 395 victories and is the all-time winningest men's basketball coach in school history.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 112-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over two million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance. He has been inducted into the University of Delaware and George Washington University Halls of Fame.

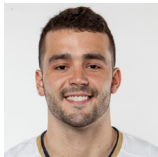

- Named to the 2018 ACC All-Tournament second team, averaging 16.3 ppg, 7.3 rpg, 2.0 spg and 2.0 bpg.
- Nine-of-17 from the field with 18 points and three steals in the ACC quarterfinal loss to Duke.
- Led the Irish with 19 points and three blocks in the first round ACC tournament victory over Pittsburgh - including 9-of-10 from the free throw line.
- Had a tough shooting night against Virginia Tech (4-of-14) but hit the biggest shot of the game, a three-pointer at the shot clock buzzer to give Notre Dame a 60-59 lead after trailing by 21 points earlier in the second half.

- Turned in a great tournament performance at the Maui Invitational, with 23 points, 8 rebounds vs. Chaminade, 12 points and 11 rebounds vs. LSU and a game-high 25 points with 11 rebounds in the come-from-behind victory over No. 6/6 Wichita State.
- His lay up with under a minute remaining in regulation cut Wichita State's lead to one point at 65-66, after hitting a key three pointer just minutes earlier.
