Top-Ranked Notre Dame Returns From Bye Week To Face #7/#8 Michigan In Home-And-Home Series

- Weekend series is first meeting between the two teams since last April's NCAA semifinals.
- Irish return to action with 20-game unbeaten streak (17-0-3) on the line.
- Notre Dame coming off a win and tie (shootout win) at Lake Superior (Jan. 16-17).

THE STRETCH RUN: Notre Dame returns to action this weekend after a bye week as the Irish face the Michigan Wolverines in a home-and-home series. On Friday night, Jan. 30, the two teams meet at Notre Dame's Joyce Center in an 8:05 p.m. game. That contest will be televised by CBS College Sports with **Matt McConnell** and **Dave Starman** providing the play-by-play and analysis.

Saturday night, Jan. 31, the series moves to Ann Arbor, Mich., for a 7:35 p.m. game that will be televised on FSN Detroit. **Dan Dickerson** and **Fred Pletsch** will call the action from Yost Arena. The Fighting Irish enter the series ranked No. 1 in the nation with a 19-3-3 overall record and a 13-2-3-3 mark in the CCHA, good for 32 points and first place in the conference. Notre Dame is four points ahead of second-place Miami with two games in hand. The Irish are six ahead of third-place Alaska and have four games in hand on the Nanooks. The lead is eight points over Ohio State, Nebraska-Omaha (2 games in hand) and Michigan as all three of those teams are tied for fourth with 24 points. Michigan enters the series ranked seventh in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and eighth by USCHO.com/CBS College Sports poll. The Wolverines are 18-8-0 overall and 12-6-0-0 in the CCHA with 24 points. Michigan is coming off a series sweep of Michigan State last weekend, winning 6-2, at Joe Louis Arena on Friday and 5-3 versus the Spartans on Saturday at home.

IRISH VERSUS WOLVERINES: The Notre Dame-Michigan series is the oldest series on the books for the Irish as the two teams have met 115 times in the series and the Wolverines own a 65-45-5 edge in those games. The series started in 1921-22 with a home-and-home series between the two schools. At the Joyce Center, the series is tied at 21-21-2. At Yost Arena, Michigan has a 36-21-3 advantage. On neutral ice, Michigan has an 8-3-0 edge. The two teams met three times in 2007-08 with Michigan winning the regular season series via a 3-2 win at Yost Arena and then a 5-1 victory in a game played at the Palace of Auburn Hills as a Notre Dame home game. In the postseason, the Irish won one of the biggest games in the program's history, knocking off the Wolverines, 5-4, in overtime in the Frozen Four semifinal game on April 10. That win sent Notre Dame to its first-ever NCAA championship game.

Notre Dame 5 • Michigan 4 (ot)
Semifinals - Frozen Four**

Freshman left wing **Calle Ridderwall** scored his second goal of the game at 5:44 of overtime, lifting fifth-ranked Notre Dame to a 5-4 victory over top-ranked Michigan in the NCAA Frozen Four semifinals at Denver's Pepsi Center ... with the win, the Irish moved on to face Boston College in their first-ever national championship game ... Ridderwall, who came into the game with just three goals on the season, drilled the rebound of a **Dan VeNard** shot over goaltender Brian Hogan's right shoulder to set off a wild on-ice celebration ... Ridderwall led the Irish attack with two goals while **Mark Van Guilder**, **Ryan Thang** and **Kevin Deeth** added solo goals ... Chad Kolarik scored twice for the Wolverines while Matt Rust and Carl Hagelin added single goals ... Notre Dame scored three times in the opening period to take a 3-0 lead at the intermission on goals by Ridderwall, Van Guilder and Thang (shg) ... Brian Hogan replaced starting goaltender Billy Sauer at the start of the second period and it seemed to lift Michigan ... the Wolverines scored twice in a 15-second span midway through the period on goals by Kolarik and Rust ... they tied the game just 2:16 into the third period when Kolarik got his second of the game to make it 3-3 ... the Irish retook the lead at 11:30 when Deeth scored off a two-on-one with Dan Kissel, chipping a shot over Hogan for his 10th goal of the year ... Michigan would get the equalizer at 14:39 when Hagelin beat Pearce from a bad angle along the goal line to tie the game at 4-4 and send the game to overtime ... Michigan finished the game with a 33-29 shot advantage ... **Jordan Pearce** had 29 saves in the win while Hogan finished with 18 saves and Sauer six in the game.

LAKE SUPERIOR RECAP:

Saturday, Jan. 17 - Notre Dame battled back from 2-0, 2-1 and 3-2 deficits in game two of the weekend series to get a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior State in 65 minutes of action. In the shootout, **Billy Maday (Fr., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden)** each scored while goaltender **Jordan Pearce (Sr., Anchorage, Alaska)** stopped two-of-three Laker

shots for a 2-1 shootout win. Notre Dame got goals from **Ben Ryan (So., Brighton, Mich.)**, **Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.)** and **Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** in the game. That offset Laker goals from Steven Kaunisto (shg), Chad Nehring and Fred Cassiani (ppg). The Irish out shot Lake Superior by a 35-14 margin. Pearce had 11 saves on the night while Pat Inglis (11) and Brian Mahoney-Wilson (21) combined for 32 for the Lakers. Condra's goal was short-handed and Deeth's game-tying goal came on the power play at 13:15 of the second period.

Friday, Jan. 16 - Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** held off a strong third-period attack by Lake Superior State, stopping all 14 shots he faced for a 3-2 Notre Dame win. In the game, Pearce finished with 31 saves. The Lakers took a 1-0 lead at 9:56 of the first period on a Josh Sim power-play goal. The Irish would answer with goals from **Justin White (Traverse City, Mich.)** at 15:12 and a power-play goal from **Calle Ridderwall** at 18:32 for a 2-1 lead after one period. In the second stanza, **Christiaan Minella (Aurora, Colo.)** scored what proved to be the game winner at 12:34. Will Acton made it a one-goal game as he beat Pearce at 16:01 to make it 3-2, but that would end the scoring. Lake Superior out shot the Irish, 33-27, on the night. Brian Mahoney-Wilson made 24 saves for the Lakers.

THE STREAK: The win and the tie at Lake Superior State (Jan. 16-17) extended Notre Dame's current unbeaten streak to a school-record 20 games (17-0-3). The previous longest unbeaten streak for the Irish was 15 games. The last time the Irish lost a game was on Oct. 25 at home against Miami. The Irish also have a 16-game unbeaten streak (13-0-3) in the CCHA play since dropping their first two games to Miami in October. With three shootout wins, the Irish have picked up all 32 points available to them in those 16 league contests.

ROAD WARRIORS: Notre Dame's 3-3 tie at Lake Superior on Jan. 17 snapped an Irish nine-game road winning streak, but continued what is now a 10-game road unbeaten streak (9-0-1). Notre Dame dropped its season opener on the road at Denver (Oct. 11). Notre Dame is now 9-1-1 on the road this season.

HOBEBY BAKER CANDIDATE: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** is listed among the candidates for the 2009 Hobey Baker Award on the award's website - hobeybaker.com. Fans can now vote for their choice for the award at the website. The first phase of the voting will continue until March 8. On March 19, the 10 finalists will be announced. The Hobey Baker Hat Trick of the three finalists will be announced on April 2 with the winner selected on April 10.

MR. RELIABLE: Notre Dame's All-American and Hobey Baker candidate - senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** - has been a regular in the Notre Dame goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008, Pearce has appeared in 47 of the last 48 Irish games. Of those 47 games, 46 have been starts. Pearce has now appeared in 22 straight games for the Irish, making 21 starts in that span. The last game he did not start was on Nov. 29 when **Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.)** made his second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 24 of Notre Dame's first 25 games this season and is 19-3-2 with a 1.56 goals-against average and a .936 save percentage with four shutouts.

In his current 20-game unbeaten streak (17-0-3), Pearce has a 1.36 goals-against average, a .944 save percentage and three shutouts.

Pearce's 40-save performance against Lake Superior State on Nov. 14, were the most saves in his career, surpassing the previous high of 34 set on Feb. 17, 2006 versus Bowling Green in a 7-4 win.

MORE ON PEARCE: With his last win over Lake Superior State (Jan. 16), **Jordan Pearce** picked up his 47th career win and is now in fourth place on Notre Dame's all-time wins list. The win puts him two behind **Dick Tomasoni '72**, who had 49 in his career.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded his second short-handed goal this season in the 3-3 overtime tie/shootout win for the Irish. The goal was the sixth shortie of Condra's career and moved him into fourth on Notre Dame's all-time short-handed goals list. He is one behind the leaders - **Dave Bankoske ('93)**, **Mike McNeill ('88)** and **Kevin Humphreys ('81)** who had seven in their Irish careers.

CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's** game-winning goal on Jan. 9 against Alaska was his second of the season and his first since Oct. 18 against Sacred Heart. The game winner gives him 13 for his career and moves him into a tie for the top spot on Notre Dame's all-time game-winning goal list. Thang is now tied with **Rob Globke '04**, **Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82** - as all four players now have 13 game win-

ners to their credit.

PRACTICE ON THE POND: Notre Dame took its Friday practice (Jan. 23) outdoors to a local rink - Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind. - as the players got the chance to play a little shinny. Over 250 kids and adults attended the event that was complete with temperatures in the low teens, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter. The kids in attendance got a chance to meet the Notre Dame players while they scrimmaged and afterwards with an autograph session. This is the second time the Irish have done this, doing it prior to their series with Bowling Green last January.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When **Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden)** and freshman **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** were put on the same line with center **Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** in the second game of the Miami series, it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 21 games together this season, the duo has combined for 18 goals and 22 assists with Maday having seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points while Ridderwall has 11 goals and 12 assists for 23 points in those games.

STARTING POINT: In last April's 5-4 overtime win against Michigan in the NCAA semifinals, then freshman **Calle Ridderwall** scored twice in the game, including the overtime game winner. That game proved to be the breakout game for Ridderwall. After finishing last season with five goals and two assists in 39 games, the sophomore from Stockholm, Sweden is second in scoring for the Irish with 10 goals and 13 assists for 23 points in the first 25 games this year.

BALANCING ACT: Balance has been a key for Notre Dame in the 2008-09 season. The Irish have 13 players with 10 or more points so far this year with **Christian Hanson (Sr., Venetia, Pa.)** leading the team with 26 points on 14 goals and 12 assists. The Irish have just two players with 10 or more goals (Hanson and Ridderwall - 10) but have nine players with five or more goals. Ten players on the Notre Dame roster have scored game-winning goals this year.

RED HOT HANSON: Senior center **Christian Hanson** is off to the best start of his collegiate career. Through the first 25 games of the season, Hanson leads the Irish in scoring with 14 goals and 12 assists for 26 points. He also has six power-play goals, one short-handed marker and four game winners. He now has career-bests in goals (14), assists (12), points (25), power-play goals (6) and game winners (4). The 6-4, 228-pound center has points in 11 of his last 16 games (10-10-20). In 18 CCHA games this season, Hanson is tied for the league lead in scoring with 24 points and is second in goals scored with 12.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has the winningest hockey program in the nation. Heading into this weekend against Michigan, Notre Dame ranks first in wins (78) and first in winning percentage (.728). Michigan is second with 77 wins and a .723 winning percentage. STREAK SNAPPED: Josh Sim's first period power-play goal on Jan. 16 for Lake Superior State, snapped **Jordan Pearce's** shutout streak at 171:26, a career high for the senior goaltender. The streak is the second longest for a Notre Dame goaltender as **David Brown '07** had a 193:27 streak from Oct. 17 to Nov. 8, 2003 without giving up a goal.

BACK-TO-BACK BLANKINGS: The Irish are recorded back-to-back shutouts at the Joyce Center on Jan. 9-10 versus Alaska by 2-0 and 3-0 scores. Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was between the pipes for both blankings. That marks the second time this season that the Irish have had back-to-back shutouts. In October, Notre Dame shut out Sacred Heart, 3-0 and 7-0, on Oct. 17-18. The last time the Irish had back-to-back shutouts in CCHA play came on March 15-16, 2003, when **Morgan Cey '05** blanked Miami, 1-0 and 5-0, in games two and three of the CCHA playoffs. The Irish have never had back-to-back shutout wins in a CCHA regular-season series before last weekend.

LAKER LOVER: Junior **Christiaan Minella (Jr., Aurora, Colo.)** scored the sixth goal of his Notre Dame career, the game winner in the Jan. 16, 3-2 win over the Lakers. Minella has now scored three of his six career goals against Lake Superior State. He has career highs in goals (5), assists (6), points (11) and game-winning goals (2) this season.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: With the two shutouts versus Alaska, **Jordan Pearce** now has four shutouts this season and eight for his career. The seven career shutouts move Pearce into second on the all-time list. **David Brown '07** holds the Irish record with 12 during his Irish career.

JOINING THE CENTURY CLUB: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded the 100th assist of his Notre Dame career on **Ryan Thang's** third-period goal in the 3-0 win over Alaska on Jan. 10. The assist makes him just the 10th player in the 41-year history of the program to record 100 assists in his career. In Friday's game with Alaska, Condra recorded the 40th goal of his Irish career. He is currently 19th on Notre Dame's all-time points list with 142 career points.

STREAK NUMBERS: In Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak, the Irish have given up one goal or less in 12 of the 20 games. The Irish have only given up three goals, four times - a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (11/14), a 3-3 tie with Western Michigan (11/29), a 4-3 win over Bowling Green (12/13) and the 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (1/17). During the streak, the Irish have out scored the opposition by a 72-29 margin (3.60 to 1.45).

ON THE SIDELINES: The Irish will be without the services of sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** for the entire season. Phillips injured his right knee in the pre-season and will be out of action for the year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team are among a list of 20 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Named to the list last week are senior forward **Erik Condra** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, senior **Mark Van Guilder '08** was one of 10 finalists for the award and in 2007, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award.

POWER-PLAY PRODUCERS: Five Notre Dame players currently rank in the top 10 in the CCHA for power-play point production. Left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is tied for second (8-9-17) with center **Christian Hanson** tied for fourth (6-7-13). Defenseman **Brett Blatchford** (0-11-11), right wing **Billy Maday** (5-6-11) and center **Kevin Deeth** (3-8-11) who are tied for 10th.

THE PLAYMAKER: With assists in each game of the Shillelagh Tournament, junior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** is tied for third in the CCHA in assists with 18 and is tied for second among all CCHA defensemen with 18 points this season. The smooth-skating defenseman has already exceeded his output of last year when he had 12 assists in 45 games. He leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring and is tied for 22nd nationally among defensemen in scoring.

WELCOME BACK: Sophomore defensemen **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup for the Alaska series after missing both games of the Shillelagh Tournament while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. The duo helped the U.S. to a fifth-place finish. Cole, playing in his second tournament had two goals and two assists in his six games while Ruth had no points with 25 penalty minutes in his first appearance. The duo are among 12 Notre Dame players all-time to play for the U.S. in the World Junior Championships. They join fellow defenseman **Kyle Lawson** as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

They knocked off No. 2 Boston College, 4-1, on Nov. 7. Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

WE'RE NO. 1: For just the third time in the 41-year history of the Notre Dame hockey team, the Irish are ranked No. 1 in the nation. Both polls, the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls, have Notre Dame at the top of their lists for the seventh consecutive week of voting. This ties for the longest stretch the Irish have ever been ranked No. 1 with the 2006-07 season when they were No. 1 for seven straight weeks. The first time that Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 was during February of 1977 when the Irish were on top for just one week.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the *USA Today* poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 51 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07 season, Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. Prior to that, the Irish had been No. 1 just one other time, for a week during the 1976-77 season.

NICE NOVEMBER: Notre Dame closed out the month of November with a 7-0-2 mark in the nine games played. During the month, the Irish out scored the opposition by a 41-15 margin (4.56 to 1.67). In the two ties, Notre Dame won the CCHA contests with a pair of 2-1 shootout victories. Last season, the Irish were 9-1-0 in the month of November.

BETTER DECEMBER: The Irish finished up the month of December with a 4-0-0 record, out scoring the opposition by an 11-5 margin (2.75 to 1.25). Notre Dame takes an 11-0-2 mark over the last two months into January.

HAVING FUN IN JANUARY: The Irish continued their winning ways in January as they are now 5-0-1 during the month. During January, Notre Dame has out scored the opposition by a 17-7 margin (2.83 to 1.17).

GETTING HOT AT THE RIGHT TIME: Center **Ben Ryan** has recorded points in six of his last eight games since Dec. 12. In that span, the sophomore center has four goals and four assists for eight points. On the year, Ryan has seven goals and seven assists for 14 points. Three of his seven goals have been game winners.

TOURNAMENT HONORS: Notre Dame collected its first Shillelagh Tournament title on Jan. 2-3 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Irish defeated Union College, 3-1 in the first game and then knocked off Minnesota-Duluth, 3-1, in the title game. Notre Dame placed four players on the Shillelagh Tournament all-tournament team. Selected to the team were: junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**, forwards **Ben Ryan** and **Garrett Regan** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, who also was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Lawson anchored an Irish defense that limited Union and Minnesota-Duluth to 41 shots in the tournament while playing over 30 minutes per game. Ryan had a goal and an assist, getting the game winner in the win over Union. Regan scored two goals in the title game, including the game winner versus Minnesota-Duluth. Pearce surrendered just two goals (one even-strength goal) on 41 shots (.951 sv%) and picked up two wins in the tournament. Also selected to the all-tournament team were Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Erik Oberg and forward Justin Fontaine.

THREE IN A ROW: With the win in the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, the Irish have now won one in-season hockey tournament in each of the last three seasons. In 2006-07, the Irish won the Lightning College Hockey Tournament in Tampa, Fla. In 2007-08, Notre Dame was the winner of the Rensselaer Holiday Hockey Tournament in Troy, N.Y. and this season, the Irish got the win in the Shillelagh Tournament.

IRISH TOURNEY HISTORY: For Notre Dame, the Shillelagh Tournament was the 31st in-season tournament that the Irish have participated in. The two wins give Notre Dame an all-time mark of 25-34-3 in those tournaments. The Irish now have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE HOCKEY GAME: As part of the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament, all four tournament teams attended the NHL's Winter Classic at Wrigley Field on Jan. 1. Notre Dame got to see former Irish defenseman **Brett Lebeda '04** score a goal for Detroit in the Red Wings' victory.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman right wing **Billy Maday** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the month for November. In nine games during the month, Maday had seven goals and four assists for 11 points. Included in his seven goals were five power-play markers. Maday scored points in eight of the nine games and was +4 in the month. He finished the month scoring goals in the last five consecutive games, going 5g, 2a in that span. The freshman is fourth in scoring on the team with nine goals and seven assists for 16 points in his first 18 games.

CCHA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** and senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** were selected as the CCHA's defenseman and goaltender of the week respectively for the week ending, Jan. 11. Lawson helped the Irish limit Alaska to 38 shots on the weekend while recording assists on three of Notre Dame's five goals in the series. He was +3 and blocked two shots versus the Nanooks. Pearce continued his incredible season with two shutouts in goal versus Alaska. The senior stopped all 38 shots he faced - 16 in Friday's 2-0 win and 22 in the 3-0 win on Saturday. The shutouts were the third and fourth of the season for Pearce and extended his current shutout streak to a career best 161:30 over the last three games.

THE NEW KIDS: With **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** playing in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5, head coach Jeff Jackson called on a pair of freshmen defensemen to step into the lineup for the Shillelagh Tournament. **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and **Nick Condon (Wausau, Wis.)** stepped into the lineup and played well in place of Cole and Ruth. For Ringel, it was his fourth and fifth games this season. He had no shots but was +1 on the weekend. Condon played in his second and third games and also had no shots but was +1 for the weekend.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that five players have signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2009. The list includes two defensemen and three forwards. Joining the Irish for next season are: **Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.)**, **Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)**, **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)**. Calabrese, Fowler and Palmieri all play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Fowler and Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE MAN ADVANTAGE: Prior to Notre Dame's series with Bowling Green (11/21-22), Notre Dame's power-play was hitting at a 15.6% success rate and ranked fifth in the CCHA and 31st in the nation. Since then, the power-play is 22-for-79 for a 27.8% success rate. On the season, Notre Dame's power play is now 34-for-156 for a 21.8% success rate. That leads the CCHA and is fourth nationally.

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went 6-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

FIRST POINT: Freshman center **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** picked up his first collegiate point in the 1-0 win over Ferris State. Gaul started the game-winning play as he moved the puck through the neutral zone to defenseman **Ian Cole** who set up **Dan Kissel's** game winner. Gaul has played in eight games this season for the Irish.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

POWER PLAYS AGAINST: Notre Dame has given up just 14 power-play goals in the first 25 games this season. The 14 goals have actually come in just 10 games and the Irish are 5-2-3 in those contests. So far this season, the Irish have given up 14 power-play goals in 136 chances for a 89.7% success rate.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a two-game series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

TWO IN A ROW: The two consecutive losses by Notre Dame to Miami on Oct. 24-25 marked the first time that the Irish have lost two in a row at home since March 3-4, 2006 when they lost both games of their first round, CCHA playoff series to Alaska, 3-1 and 1-0. The last time that Notre Dame was swept at home in a regular-season CCHA series was Nov. 25-26, 2005 when the Irish were swept at the Joyce Center by Ohio State, 4-1 and 5-2.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender **Tom O'Brien** became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by **Jordan Pearce** who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. **David Brown '07** had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

THEY HAVE OUR NUMBER: Notre Dame's loss to the University of Denver drops the Irish to just 10-35-3 all-time against the Pioneers. Playing at DU has been a problem for the Irish as they are now 2-22-2 in the all-time series at the Mile High City. The two teams were members of the WCHA from 1971-1981. Since leaving the WCHA following the 1980-81 season, the Irish are just 1-4-1 against Denver and 1-3-0 since **Jeff Jackson** took over as head coach in 2005-06.

FOUR FOR US: After giving up four goals in the third period of the season opener at Denver (10/11), the Irish blitzed Sacred Heart for four goals in the second period of the 7-0 shutout on Oct. 18. The four-goal outburst was the first for Notre Dame since doing it on Dec. 8, 2007, getting four goals in the second period of a 7-0 shutout at Princeton. Notre Dame also scored four goals in a period on November 1, 2007 with four in the second versus Lake Superior State in a 7-3 victory.

KNOCKING OFF NO. 1: Notre Dame played five games during the 2008-09 season versus teams ranked No. 1 in the nation. On Nov. 9-10, the Irish faced top-ranked Miami in Oxford, Ohio, splitting a weekend series with the RedHawks. In January (18-19), the Irish dropped two games to No. 1 Michigan, losing at Yost Arena and also at the Palace of Auburn Hills. Notre Dame met the top-ranked Wolverines a third time on Apr. 10 at the Frozen Four in Denver, Colo., and knocked off Michigan, 5-4 in overtime to advance to the national championship game. DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors **Erik Condra** and **Jordan Pearce** don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med while Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2008-09 season. Joining Condra as alternate captains in '08-'09, are senior center **Christian Hanson** along with junior left wing **Ryan Thang** and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**. Condra served as an alternate captain in 2007-08 while this is the first season as captains for Hanson, Thang and Lawson.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - senior forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan** (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) - have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork '83** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips'

uncle, is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the fourth year of Graduation Success Rate measurements developed by the NCAA and released on Oct. 11. None of the 119 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 figure (19 of 22). This marked the third time in the four years of the survey that Notre Dame has ranked number one in percentage of teams with 100 scores. Here are the top 10 in that category (only 10 institutions had 50% or more of their sports registering 100 marks):

NCAA figures showed that all 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent -- basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, basketball, cross country/track, fencing, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Ice hockey scored 96 percent, football scored 94 percent, and golf was at 90. Overall, that's one more perfect score than a year ago for the Irish programs, after Notre Dame recorded 18 100 percent GSR scores (of 22 sports) in 2007. In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranked number one.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was selected as an *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since **Dan Carlson '01** and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), **Andy Jurkowski '00** (third team), **Forrest Karr '99** (second team) and **Steve Noble '97** and **'98** (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-'08 -- **Mark Van Guilder '08** and **Erik Condra** (Livonia, Mich.)

BACK-TO-BACK: Following the 2007-08 CCHA regular season, goaltender **Jordan Pearce** won the league's top goaltender award based on his 1.80 goals-against average in CCHA games. Pearce followed **David Brown '07**, who had a 1.77 goals-against average to win the 2006-07 award. This marks the fourth time since the 1982-83 season that the same school has won back-to-back goaltending titles with different goaltenders between the pipes. Pearce and Brown are joined on that list by:

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team -- senior center **Christian Hanson** and sophomore goaltender **Brian Brooke (Eden Prairie, Minn.)** -- have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, **Bob Brooke**, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

MINUTES MAN: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** entered the 2007-08 season having played in just 12 games and 622 minutes in the first two years of his Irish hockey career. During the '07-'08 campaign, Pearce showed everyone that he could play as he set Notre Dame goaltending marks for games played (43), games started (42) and minutes played (2,557:46). He finished the season ranked second in the nation in minutes played behind Boston College's John Muse who saw action in 2,725:06 minutes for the Eagles.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman **Teddy Ruth** was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though. At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in

honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral role in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 56 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

HOMETOWNS: The 2008-09 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 14 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces -- those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** begins his fourth season behind the Irish bench in 2008-09. In his first three years he has compiled a 72-42-11 (.620) record, highlighted by a 32-7-3 mark in 2006-07 and last season's 27-16-4 record on the way to the first-ever appearance for the Irish in the Frozen Four. The '06-'07 CCHA coach-of-the-year and Spencer Penrose Award winner as the national coach-of-the-year, Jackson enters the '08-'09 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with five or more years. His current overall record stands at 254-94-36 for a .708 success rate. His 254 wins tie him for 17th on the list of active coaches. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop – Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. Included in his 254 career wins are 46 postseason victories (46-14 in postseason) and a .767 winning percentage. In nine trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 30-7 (.811). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 6-5 record at Notre Dame. In those nine seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals eight times, winning five tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with **Sean Lorenz (Fr., Littleton, Colo.)** were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play in Ottawa, Ontario. Cole and Ruth join **Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79)**, **Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98)**, **Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98)**, **Dan Carlson ('98-'99)**, **Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01)**, **Brett Henning ('99-'00)**, **David Inman ('99-'00)**, **Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02)**, **Brett Lebda ('01-'02)** and **Kyle Lawson ('06-'07)** as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have eight players on the 2008-09 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Just one incoming freshman – defenseman **Sean Lorenz** – was selected in the 2008 draft as he was picked by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. In the previous draft in June of 2007, Notre Dame saw five of its players selected. Leading the way was current sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan** (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. They join senior right wing **Erik Condra** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

USA...USA...USA: Notre Dame will have seven players on the 2008-09 roster who have cut their teeth with the U.S. National Team Developmental Program. The list includes: senior **Jordan Pearce**, junior **Kyle Lawson**, sophomores **Ian Cole**, **Teddy Ruth** and **Brad Phillips** and newcomers **Patrick Gaul** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Sean Lorenz**. Since the program started, the Irish have 21 former USNTDP alums play at Notre Dame since the program began in 1997-98.
