5	Notre Dame and Saint Peter's will be meeting for the fifth time Wednesday evening and the first time since 1999. The Irish lead the all-time series 4-0.
7	Double-doubles this season (points and rebounds) for junior Bonzie Colson , which leads the ACC and is 10th in the nation.
6	Career-best three-point field goals made against Colgate by senior V.J. Beachem on his way to scoring a gamehigh 20 points.

93	Consecutive games started by senior captain Steve Vasturia , dating back to the final seven games of the 2013–14 season. Vasturia is on pace to become just the fourth Notre Dame player to start 100 consecutive games in a career this season.
117.9	Adjusted offensive efficiency index as rated by kenpom.com, the seventh-best in the nation and third-best (Duke, North Carolina) of any team in the ACC.
210	Minutes played this season for sophomore Rex Pflueger without committing a turnover - the longest stretch of minutes without a mistake to start a season in the Mike Brey era. Pflueger also has 20 assists, 10 steals and seven blocks this season while shooting .488 from three-point range.
366	Victories at Notre Dame for head coach Mike Brey , the second-most in Notre Dame history and 27 away from the all-time record (393).
696	Career Divison I games coached by Mike Brey , closing in on the 700-game milestone. Brey will become the 35th active Division I coach to reach the 700-win milestone against Clemson on Jan. 7.
1,829	Wins in Notre Dame basketball history, ranked seventh all-time entering the 2016-17 season. Since Mike Brey took over the Irish program in 2000-01, the Irish have moved from 12th to seventh on the all-time wins list.

IRISH FACE PEACOCKS IN FINAL NON-CONFERENCE GAME OF THE SEASON:

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (10-2) will face Saint Peter's (5-6) in the final non-conference matchup of the season on Wednesday, Dec. 28, at 7:00 p.m. ET in Purcell Pavilion.

NOTRE DAME vs. SAINT PETER'S SERIES HISTORY:

Saint Peter's is located in Jersey City, New Jersey and is a member of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference. The Peacocks are 5-6 in 2016-17, with victories over Lipscomb, Fairleigh Dickinson, Boston University, Manhattan and at St. Francis Brooklyn on Dec. 23.

The Irish are 4-0 all-time against Saint Peter's, with the initial meeting coming in the 1968 National Invitational Tournament at Madison Square Garden on March 23 (a 81-78 Notre Dame victory). The Peacocks have made three trips to Purcell Pavilion, the most recent in 1999, an 85-67 Notre Dame victory.

PFLUEGER ALLERGIC TO TURNOVERS:

Rex Pflugger enters the game with Saint Peter's having not turned the ball over once for the Irish this season. In 210 minutes of action, which includes aggressive drives to the basket and stints at running the point for the team, Pflueger has yet to give the ball away to the

In that same time frame, he has 20 assists, 10 steals, seven blocks and has already connected on more three-point field goals (nine) than his entire freshman season (eight) in 2015-16 at a much higher percentage rate (.320 last season, .488 in 2016-17).

Dating back to last season, Pflueger's last turnover came in the second half against Stephen F. Austin in the NCAA Championship second-round victory (which he sealed with a last-second tip-in). He played another 12 minutes last season without a turnover, pushing his total amount of minutes played, without committing a turnover, over the past two seasons to 222.

FARRELL EMBRACES THE CHALLENGE OF TOP COMPETITION:

Junior guard Matt Farrell, who entered the starting lineup in the NCAA Championship run last season, has saved some of his best performances for Notre Dame's top competition. Eight of Farrell's 16 career starts have come against college basketball power conference teams (ACC, Big Ten, Big East, or Pac-12) and Farrell has responded with 14.0 ppg (18.8 this season), 5.6 apg and is shooting .526 from the floor and .484 from three-point field goal range. Here is a breakdown of Farrell's performances in the past eight games against power college basketball conference opponents:

COLSON FILLING UP THE BOXSCORE:

Junior forward Bonzie Colson recorded his seventh double-double of the season against No. 15/16 Purdue with 23 points and 10 rebounds.

Colson has scored double-figure points in all 12 games of the 2016–17 season, becoming the first Irish player since Jerian Grant (2014–15) to score 10 or more points in the team's first 12 games of the season.

Colson is the first non-guard to accomplish that feat since Luke Harangody in 2009–10, who scored double-figures in the season's first 25 games before an injury vs. Seton Hall ended his scoring streak.

THE ULTIMATE WEAPON - GETTING TO THE FREE THROW LINE:

Notre Dame is first in the country (as of Dec. 26) in free throw percentage, shooting 85.6 percent (179–209) from the charity stripe this season. Here are some of the superlatives for the team from its free throw shooting –

- Junior Matt Farell was tied with two other players in the country with a perfect 1.000 shooting percentage from the free throw line as of Dec. 10. Farrell is currently just behind the average attempt per game needed to qualify as the national leader (2.5) but remains perfect from the line this season (27-27).
- Dating back to the 2015–16 season, Farrell has connected on 31 consecutive free throws.
- Farrell is the first Notre Dame player in the Brey era to begin the season connecting on his first 27 free throw attempts.
- Steve Vasturia is currently seventh in the nation for free throw shooting percentage at .943 (33-35).
- Vasturia combines with Bonzie Colson (25th, 49–54, .907) to give Notre Dame the only team in the country with two players in the top
- Colson's 12-for-12 effort at the free throw line against lowa tied four other ND players with the fourth-best in school history.
- Notre Dame has missed three or less free throws in 11 of 12 games this season and connected on all 14 attempts in the victory over North Carolina A&T and all six attempts against Villanova.
- Over the course of the three games with lowa, North Carolina A&T and Fort Wayne, Notre Dame combined to hit 31 consecutive free throws as a team.

VASTURIA REACHES CAREER MILESTONE:

Senior captain Steve Vasturia entered the Legends Classic final against Northwestern needing 18 points to reach 1,000 points in his career. Not only did Vasturia reach that milestone, he might have played the best all-around game of his career against the Wildcats. The Medford, New Jersey, native grabbed eight rebounds to go along with 18 points, three assists and three steals.

Vasturia is the 59th Notre Dame player to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

USE INK TO PUT VASTURIA IN THE STARTING LINEUP:

Senior guard and team tri-captain Steve Vasturia, who head coach Mike Brey has said keeps him calm on the sidelines while in the lineup, has started 93 consecutive games for the Irish. As a freshman guard, Vasturia's first start came at Maryland on Jan. 15, 2014, but he entered the starting line up permanently on February 16, 2014, playing 30 minutes and scoring seven points in a victory at Boston College. The Philadelphia, Pa., native has not left the Irish starting five since that game.

Vasturia is on pace to become just the fourth Notre Dame player to start 100 consecutive games in a career at Florida State on Jan. 18, 2017.

Pat Connaughton, a former teammate of Vasturia's in 2013–14 and 2014–15, holds the school record for consecutive games started at 139. Chris Thomas (2002–05) started all 128 games of his career at Notre Dame and Pat Garrity (1995–98) was in the starting lineup for all 111 games of his career with the Irish.

The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. NOTRE DAME REACHES 1800-WIN MILESTONE:

Notre Dame's 84-79 victory at Illinois on Dec. 2, 2015 marked the 1800th win in program history. The Fighting Irish are 1829-986 (.649) all-time in 112 seasons.

Notre Dame entered the season ranked seventh in Division I in all-time program wins behind Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple and Syracuse. The Irish have improved five spots in the all-time wins list since Mike Brey took over the program for the 2000-01 season, surpassing Indiana. Oregon State, Pennsylvania and St. John's.

Notre Dame is the only NCAA program to rank in the top 10 for men's basketball and football victories.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS:

Not only did Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1978–79, but the Irish combined for six NCAA tournament wins over the past two seasons – the most in program history over a two-year stretch. The previous high was Notre Dame's three wins in 1978 (the team's lone appearance in the Final Four) and two victories the next season.

The Irish were the only team in the nation to advance to the Elite Eight in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons and the back-to-back regional final games are a first for the program since the NCAA touranment expanded to 64 or more teams in 1985.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

For the first time in the Mike Brey era, the Irish head coach was tasked with replacing two assistant coaches in the same season. Long time aides Martin Ingelsby accepted the Delaware head coaching job (the same first-time Division I job Brey assumed in 1995–96) while Anthony Solomon joined the Georgetown coaching staff in the offeseason.

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 stand out shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

SUCCESS IN THE TAR HEEL STATE:

Notre Dame joined the ACC at the start of the 2013-14 basketball season. The Irish ended up 0-3 in the state of North Carolina that year (65-58 loss at Wake Forest, 63-61 loss at North Carolina, 81-69 loss to Wake Forest in the ACC Tournament in Greensboro).

Since breaking through for the program's first win in Chapel Hill, 71-70, at North Carolina on Jan. 5, 2015, the Irish have won seven of the last eight games they have played in the Tar Heel State:

LEGENDS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS:

Notre Dame claimed its first in-season tournament title since 2010 with a 70-66 victory over Northwestern on Tuesday, Nov. 22, in the championship game of the 2016 Legends Classic at the Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The four victories for the Irish in the tournament (over Bryant, Seattle, Colorado and Northwestern) mark the most the Irish have ever won in an in-season tournament. The trophy was the first in-season award claimed by the Irish since they won three games in 2010 to claim the Old Spice Classic at Disney's Wide World of Sports. Previous to the 2010 Old Spice victory, Notre Dame's most recent in-season tournament title came at the Hawaii-Pacific Thanksgiving Classic in 2001.

LEGENDS CLASSIC MVP:

Bridgewater, New Jersey, native Matt Farrell enjoyed his return to the Barclays Center, not far from the area where he played during his prep career, for the Legends Classic semifinal and final victories over Colorado and Northwestern, respectively.

Farrell, whose first two career starts came in Notre Dame's two NCAA tournament victories over Michigan and Stephen F. Austin in the Barclays Center during March of 2016, played a career-best game in the semifinal over Colorado, scoring 20 points with six assists and three steals.

He followed up that performance with 18 points and six assists against Northwestern in the championship game, including scoring Notre Dame's final five points in the come-from-behind victory.

With a 19 point-per-game average in the two games at Barclays Center, along with 6.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game, Farrell was the easy choice as the tournament's most valuable player.

FARRELL LOVES NEW YORK/NEW JERSEY:

Junior guard Matt Farrell has made a claim as one of the most improved players in the nation this season, leading the team in assists (65, 5.9 per game) while scoring 13.8 points-per-game and converting on all 27 of his free throw attempts.

Farrell's stellar play in the 2016 Legend Classic tournament games at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, earned him the tournament MVP award and his impressive perfromance against No. 1/1 Villanova on Dec. 10 in the Never Forget Tribute Classic in Newark, New Jersey, proved that the Bridgewater, New Jersey, native loves to compete in front of his hometown fans.


