The Irish have visited Las Vegas, Palm Springs, Calif., Columbus, Ga., Boca Raton, Fla., and Tallahassee, Fla., so far this season and have played the most games in school history (26) before appearing in the midwest.

The Irish also battled #4/5 Florida State on Thursday, March 11, taking the Seminoles to 10 innings before falling 4-3.

Time change: Notre Dame's game vs. Loyola (Chicago) on Thursday, March 25 has been moved back one hour. The game will start at 5 p.m. EST.

Weekend oppenents: Here is a look at Notre Dame's opponents this weekend: Eastern Michigan: The Eagles are 8-8 this season and coming off a double-header split with IUPUI. Nikki Denman has led the offense so far in 2004 with a .388 batting average (19-49) with six doubles, two home runs and 10 RBI. Michelle Lloyd (3-1, 1.99 ERA) and Aimee Woodrum (1-3, 3.07 ERA) have seen the most action in the pitching circle. The Irish and Eagles will be meeting for the third time, and the first since 2000. Valpo is 3-5 so far in 2004, led by Karen Constien on offense (.407, 2 HR, 6 RBI) and Ashlee Blankenbaker in the pitching circle (0.61 ERA, 1-1, 14.2 IP).

Booth takes her game to another level: Sophomore Heather Booth is following up her BIG EAST rookie of the year performance in 2003 with an even more impressive campaign in 2004. The staff ace for the Irish, Booth currently boasts a 1.38 ERA, 9-3 record and 102 strikeouts in 9.1 innings pitched. The Riverside, Calif., native is already threatening her 158 strikeout season-best total from last season.

Booth won 21 games in 2003 and has earned nine wins so far in '04. She has been at her best against top competition, earning wins over Nebraska (twice), CS Fullerton (eight-innings, 11 strikeouts), Florida State (four runs allowed over 9.2 innings) and has put up at least four strikeouts in every appearance this season. Her 14 complete games already surpasses the 13 she had during her rookie season and her next shutout will be her fourth - once again surpassing the three from 2003.

In the month of March, Booth has posted a 4-2 record, five complete games, two shutouts, 49 Ks in 44.1 IP and a 1.11 ERA.

Irish offense is both hot and cold: While the Irish have put up an impressive 17 wins in its first 26 games (six of the losses coming to teams ranked at game time or currently ranked) the Notre Dame offense is still searching for its true identity.

Junior Megan Ciolli has delivered consistently (.395 average, 11 steals) and sophomore Meagan Ruthrauff has found her stride as the Irish RBI producer (.348, four HR, 21 RBI) – but that might be where the consistency ends in the Irish line up.

Each of Notre Dame's hitters have posted an impressive string of performances lately, but a close look at the last 12 games portrays a team going in two directions. Ciolli and Ruthrauff lead the way with .368 and .355 averages over the last 12 games, respectively. Freshman Stephanie Brown has been hot lately as well, hitting at a .341 clip over the last 12 games. Her classmate, Carissa Jaquish, struggled over the first month of the year but found her groove during the FSU Invitational and has hit .310 over the last 12 games.

The production then begins to fall off at that point. Sophomore catcher Mallorie

Lenn is hitting .181 this season and .265 in March (last 12 games). Junior Liz Hartmann, who still can provide a timely RBI when needed, is at .229 on the season and .222 in March.

Lenn and Hartmann have flashed the ability to be consistent threats at the plate and are looking forward to Notre Dame's schedule settling down a bit (the Irish have been on the road for five consecutive weekends) to provide an opportunity to work on their swings.

Wisen lost in the boxscore?: One of Notre Dame's signature pitching performances was delivered during the FSU Invitational last weekend, but the stat line might have been lost in the game's boxscore. Notre Dame defeated Georgia State 3-2 on March 13, getting a sacrifice fly from Liz Hartmann in the eighth inning to secure the victory. The hero of the game, however, was junior pitcher Carrie Wisen.

With starting pitcher Steffany Stenglein struggling with the strike zone (six walks in 2.1 IP), Wisen entered the game and completely shut down Georgia State's offense. Picking up her third win of the season, Wisen threw 5.2 innings of relief, striking out nine of 18 batters she faced an not allowing a single hit. Georgia State was able to just get three balls out of the infield against Wisen that afternoon.

Notre Dame matchup with #19/19 Nebraska on April 12 to be shown nationally on CSTV: The University of Notre Dame will travel to Lincoln, Neb., to face the Cornhuskers for the third time this season - and College Sports Television (CSTV) will televise the game live across the country. Over the past three seasons, Notre Dame has claimed an upset victory on the road (vs. #4 Nebraska, 2002), an amazing comeback victory on the road (vs. La.-Lafayette, 2003), a BIG EAST Championship (vs. Villanova, 2003) and two first-weekend come-from-behind victories (at the UNLY Classic this season) via dramatic home runs.

Liz Hartmann has played a role in three of the memorable moments. In 2002, her three-run blast in the top of the seventh pushed Notre Dame to a 3-2 victory over #4 Nebraska at the Cornhuskers' dedication of their new field in Lincoln. Last season, Hartmann tied the school record for home runs in a single game with two shots vs. La.-Lafayette. Her first against the Lady Cajuns tied up the game in the seventh inning (after Notre Dame had rallied from a 5-1 deficit) and then ended the game in the ninth inning on a three-run round tripper.

The 2003 BIG EAST Championship was claimed on a walk off home run by '03 graduate Andrea Loman, who smashed a solo shot in the bottom of the ninth.

During the UNLY Classic four weeks ago, Notre Dame utilized four clutch home runs to secure two victories. Sophomore Kellie Middleton launched a two-run shot to complete Notre Dame's rally from a 7-4 deficit to defeat Hawaii 8-7. The next day, freshman Stephanie **Brown completed another Irish rally** with a two-run shot in the top of the seventh vs. #8/8 Nebraska - followed by another two-run shot by Hartmann to claim the winning margin. Hartmann had previously cut the Cornhusker lead down to 4-2 with a two-run homer in the fifth.

Notre Dame will face a loaded early **season schedule:** In what has developed into a yearly tradition for the Fighting Irish softball team. Notre Dame hit the road for the first five weekends of the season to face several of the top teams in the nation. According to the latest national polls, over the first five weekends of the season Notre Dame faced nine ranked teams (ESPN.com/USA Softball ranking first. followed by USA Today/ NFCA1:

ceived votes for the national polls this season.

While a tough schedule might affect Notre Dame's early season record, it has paid huge dividends over the last two vears when the Irish return to the Midwest for conference and regional play. The 2002 season saw Notre Dame open up 8-12 while facing eight ranked teams in the first two months of the season. Notre Dame responded by winning 34 of its next 37 games and the BIG EAST Championship entering the NCAA regional. The 2003 season followed a similar pattern, as Notre Dame found itself facing six ranked teams and holding a 10-10 record on March 14. The Irish bounced back with a 20-game win streak and 26 win in its last 30 games entering the **NCAA** regional.

Head coach Deanna Gumpf: The 2004 season marks Notre Dame head coach Deanna Gumpf's third at the helm of the Irish softball program. Her 82 wins over

the first two seasons are the most in school history (Liz Miller had 77 while Brian Boulac posted 61) and she has guided the team to set school records for home runs, RBI and fielding percentage over the last two seasons.

Gumpf's record at Notre Dame stands at 99-43 (.697) entering this weekend's action and her teams have captured back-to-back BIG EAST titles and NCAA regional appearances.

The 2004 season will feature Gumpf's distinctive stamp on the program. The graduation of four starters in the infield gives the opportunity for the Irish starting lineup to feature five players from Gumpf's first two recruiting classes at Notre Dame.

Megan Cielli named to USA Softball Player of the Year watch list: The Amateur Softball Association (ASA) and USA Softball have announced their initial watch list for the third-annual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Award

and Notre Dame junior Megan Ciolli (Terre Haute, Ind.) was one of the 40 players to make the list.

Ciolli will embrace a new role as team leader for the Irish this season, which begins next weekend (Feb. 13) at the UNLV Classic in Las Vegas, Nev. The Irish have radically shifted from a senior laden team to one of the youngest squads in the Midwest.

A starter since she arrived on campus three years ago, Ciolli boasts a .350 career average – hitting either first or second in the Irish line up. A three-tool player able to bunt, slap and hit for power, the junior boasts 131 hits in her career, eight home runs and 48 RBI. She also has stolen 23 bases in her career and her .350 career average puts her in the top five all-time at Notre Dame.

So far in 2004, Ciolli has paced the Irish offense with a team-high 32 hits (.395 average), 11 stolen bases (in 12 attempts) and has contributed three out-

Notre Dame picked to win its thirdstraight BiG EAST title: Notre Dame has been picked to finish first in the BiG EAST Conference for the 2004 season, as voted on by the league coaches and released by the conference office. The Irish garnered seven of 11 first place votes and 95 total points in the poll, followed by Villanova (83 points) and Boston College (74).

Notre Dame won a share of the BIG EAST regular-season crown for the seventh-straight season last year, finishing the conference schedule with a 14-3 record. Led by conference player of the year Andrea Loman, Notre Dame swept through the BIG EAST Championship, scoring 21 runs in three games and earning the title on a walk off home run by Loman in the ninth inning against Villanova.
