He has a record of 150-63 at Georgetown and a 10-year record of 218-105, including a 68-42 record at Princeton.

SERIES INFORMATION

Tonight's game with Notre Dame is the 27th meeting all-time between the schools ... Georgetown leads the head-to-head series, 14-12 ... The Hoyas have won five of the last seven meetings between the schools.

Georgetown returns home for its BIG EAST Conference home opener on Saturday, Jan. 1, hosting DePaul at Verizon Center ... Tipoff is slated for 1 p.m. and the game will be shown live on MASN and can be heard locally .

ABOUT GEORGETOWN...

Georgetown enters tonight's game with an 11-1 overall record ... Georgetown is ranked No. 9 nationally in the Associated Press Top 25 poll and No. 9 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches' poll ... The Hoyas are ranked No. 2 in the latest RPI Ratings from WarrenNolan.com and are No. 2 according to Strength of Schedule ... The Hoyas have won three-straight games and are coming off an 86-69 win at then-No. 16 Memphis ... Tonight's game is Georgetown's eighth away from home through 12 games ... The Hoyas rank No. 18 in the country, and fifth in the BIG EAST, in scoring offense, averaging 81.0 points per game ... In the last seven games, Georgetown is averaging 86.4 points per game ... Georgetown ranks No. 2 in the country in field goal percentage, connecting on 52.8 percent of its field goals ... The Hoyas are No. 1 in the country in adjusted field percentage (giving credit for three-point field goals) at 60.4 percent ... GU leads the BIG EAST and ranks No. 4 in the country in three-point field goal percentage at 42.6 percent ... The Hoyas also rank No. 8 in the country in assists per game, handing out 18.4 ... Nine different Georgetown players have at least 10 assists this season.

FOR STARTERS

- Georgetown finished the 2009-10 season with a 23-11 overall record, advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game for the third time in six seasons under Head Coach John Thompson III, was selected for the NCAA Tournament for the fourth time in six years and were the only school in the country to post wins over the teams that played for this year's national championship (Duke and Butler).
- The Hoyas were picked to finish in fourth place in the BIG EAST Conference Preseason poll.
- The Hoyas have been ranked in both national polls, appearing at tied for No. 9 in the Associated Press Preseason rankings and No. 9 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches' poll.
- Georgetown's schedule is ranked No. 2 in the country in Strength of Schedule ... Of the Hoyas first 12 games this season, five were against teams picked to win their conference in the preseason and eight, including tonight, are against teams in the top-75 of the RPI Ratings.
- Georgetown's 8-0 start was the second-straight season, and the third in the last four years, the Hoyas have opened with wins under John Thompson III.
- Georgetown leads the BIG EAST and ranks No. 2 in the country in field goal percentage, connecting on 52.8 percent of its field goals The Hoyas also lead the BIG EAST, and rank No.4 in the country, in three-point field goal percentage, hitting 42.8 percent from long distance.
- Only 57 opponents have scored more than 60 points against Georgetown in the last four years, spanning 147 games.
- Georgetown held 24 opponents to below 45 percent shooting from the field last season; 13 opponents have shot below 40 percent ... In the last four seasons – spanning 147 games – only 33 opponents have shot higher than 45 percent against the Hoyas.
- GU has scored at least 69 points eight times this season; under John Thompson III, the Hoyas are 91-13 when scoring at least 69 points.
- Georgetown has connected on at least 50 percent of its field goals eight times this season ... In the last eight games, the Hoyas are shooting 53.8%.
- The Hoyas have hit at least 12 three-pointers four times this season ... Georgetown leads the BIG EAST, shooting 42.8% from behind the arc ... Overall, 28.5 percent of the team's field goals have been from three-point land (101-of-354).
- After getting only two points from the bench in the season opener, the Georgetown bench has averaged 18.8 points, 14.5 rebounds and 5.9 assists in the last 11 games.
- The team received 49 points from the bench in the win over Loyola, the highest output by the bench since Nov. 16, 2001, a win over Marymount.
- Senior guard **Austin Freeman** is the team's most experienced player with 97 career starts in 109 games – he and backcourt mate Chris Wright have combined for 174 starts.
- Senior guard **Chris Wright** had 12 assists in the win over Coastal Carolina, the most for a Georgetown player since Greg Monroe had 12 against Providence last season ... He followed that up with 12 helpers in the win over Appalachian State.

LAST TWO GAMES...

No. 10 Georgetown 86, No. 16 Memphis 69

Senior guard Austin Freeman scored 24 points to lead three players in double figures and No. 10 Georgetown used a big second half to pull away for an 86-69 win over No. 16 Memphis in front of 17,842 fans at the FedEx Forum on Thursday night. It was the third-straight win for the Hoyas, who improve to 11-1 overall, while Memphis falls to 9-2 overall.

Freeman connected on 9-of-12 shots from the field to score a game-high 24 points with five rebounds and four assists, while senior guard Chris Wright scored 17 points and had two assists and senior forward Julian Vaughn recorded his second career double-double with 15 points with 10 rebounds, three blocked shots and two assists.

Georgetown led by four points at the half, but out-scored the Tigers 46-33 in the final 20 minutes, connecting on 63.0 percent of its shots (17-of-27) from the field and tallying 32 points in the paint.

The Hoyas held a 40-36 advantage at the break, but used a 10-4 run over the opening 2:29 of the second half and took a 10-point lead, 50-40, after a steal from Wright led to a Freeman fast-break layup that forced Memphis to call a timeout. Memphis cut the lead to 50-43 on a three-pointer from Chris Crawford, but consecutive layups from Wright gave the Hoyas their biggest lead, 54-43, with 16:03 to play in the game.

The lead grew to 13 points, first at 58-45 on a layup from Freeman and then to 60-47 on free throws from the BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year. After a free throw from junior center Henry Sims made it 63-52, a jumper from Memphis' Joe Jackson cut the lead to nine point. A running jumper from sophomore guard Vee Sanford pushed the lead back to 11 points, 65-54, with 8:02 to play, and a three-pointer from Freeman with 5:55 made it 70-58 and the Tigers got no closer than 11 points the rest of the way. Georgetown's biggest lead was 19 points, first at 78-59 on a layup from sophomore forward Jerrelle Benimon with 3:00 left.

The Hoyas jumped out to a quick 6-0 lead after a three from Wright and a three-point play from Vaughn and the team still maintained a four point lead, 11-7, on a three from Freeman just over three minutes into the game. The Tigers used a 10-3 run over 4:10 to take a 17-14 lead on a layup from Tarik Black.

No. 15 Georgetown 99, Loyola 75

Aided by a first half performance in which the team connected on 78 percent of its field goals, Georgetown opened up a 23-point lead at the half en route to a 99-75 win over Loyola in front of 11,745 fans at Verizon Center.

The 99 points scored marked the eighth time a Georgetown team scored at least 90 points under Head Coach John Thompson III and it was the fifth-highest scoring game since he took over as head coach. The Hoyas finished the game shooting 64.2 percent from the floor (34-of-53), the team's best performance since connecting on 71.7 percent of their field goals in an 89-77 win over Duke on Jan. 30, 2010.

Georgetown jumped out to a 50-27 lead at halftime aided by a terrific shooting performance as the team connected on 78.3 percent of its field goals (18-of-23), the second-best shooting percentage in a half under Thompson (the team hit 80.0 percent during the second half of a 75-60 win over Clemson on Dec. 23, 2004).

The starters played no more than 22 minutes and all 14 players appeared for at least two minutes, while 12 different players scored. Senior guard Austin Freeman and sophomore forward Hollis Thompson scored 14 points apiece to lead the team, while junior center Henry Sims added 12 points and five assists and senior guard Chris Wright scored 11 points.

Leading 14-10 nearing the mid-point of the first half, the Hoyas used an 11-0 run over 2:25 and took a 25-10 lead on free throws from Freeman with 10:27 to play. Freshman guard Markel Starks (Accokeek, Md./Georgetown Prep) started the run with a three-pointer, followed by a free throw from Thompson and then a three-point play and the free throws from Freeman.

Four free throws from Loyola made it 29-14, but a 9-1 spurt over 1:52 pushed the lead 23 points, 38-15, on a three-pointer from Thompson.

Georgetown's defense, meanwhile, held Loyola without a field goal for 8:52. The Greyounds had narrowed the first half lead to 14-10 on a layup from J'hared Hall with 12:52 to play, but did not hit a field goal until Hall connected on a three-pointer with 3:17 to play in the half.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame enters tonight's game with an 11-1 overall record ... The Irish are ranked No. 15 in the Associated Press poll and No. 15 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 Coaches' poll ... Notre Dame's lone loss of the season was a 72-58 decision to Kentucky ... The Irish have won three-straight games, posting wins over Gonzaga, Stony Brook and UMBC Notre Dame is third in the BIG EAST in scoring offense (81.3 ppg), eighth in the league in field goal percentage (45.8%) and second in the league in three-point field goal percentage (37.5%) ... Graduate student forward Tim Abromaitis is one of four players scoring in double figures for the Irish, leading the team with 16.1 points ... He leads the team with 7.5 rebounds per game ... Senior forward Ben Hasborough is second on the team with 15.3 points, leads the team with 4.0 assists and has hit a team-high 32 three-point field goals ... Georgetown's three primary long distance shooters – Austin Freeman (29), Jason Clark (26) and Chris Wright (19) – have combined to hit 44.8 percent of their shots from long distance (74-of-165) ... He earned the honor after guiding the Hoyas to a 111-102 overtime win at No. 9 Missouri on Tuesday and to a 68-51 win over Utah State on Saturday ... Here's what The Hoops Report said in awarding Thompson the National Coach of the Week honor: *"What an impressive week it was for Georgetown. JT3's troops earned a memorable overtime win over Missouri, 111-102, in what might be the game of the year. The Hoyas held a double-digit lead in the first half but Missouri got back into the game gradually and took the lead in the second half. The Hoyas trailed by four in the final minute, but they didn't give up. Chris Wright drained a 3-pointer to send the game into overtime, and the Hoyas easily won the extra five-minute period. The Hoyas could've had a letdown game at home against a quality Utah State team on Saturday, but instead they kept up the hot play and remained undefeated with a convincing 68-51 victory. The Hoyas are quickly moving their way up the rankings."*

WRIGHT NAMED BIG EAST PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Chris Wright was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on Monday, it was announced by league officials ... Wright helped lead the Hoyas to a pair of wins last week, first a thrilling 111-102 overtime win at then-No. 9 Missouri, and then to a 68-51 win over Utah State at home on Saturday ... Wright, a senior guard, averaged 21.0 points, 6.0 assists, 2.5 steals and 2.0 rebounds in the 2-0 week for the Hoyas ... One of the team's tri-captains, he recorded a double-double in the team's win at Missouri, scoring 21 points to go with 10 assists in the win ... Wright sank the game-tying three-point basket with 0.3 seconds left in left in regulation, sending the game into overtime ... In Saturday's 68-51 win over Utah State, Wright was the only player in the game to reach double figures, hitting 6-of-9 shots from the field and 8-of-10 from the free throw line to match his season high with 21 points ... He added four steals, three rebounds and two assists ... Through eight games, Wright is third on the team in scoring with 14.8 points per game and leads the team, and is second in the BIG EAST, with 6.8 assists per game ... FREEMAN NAMED BIG EAST PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior guard Austin Freeman was selected as the BIG EAST Conference's Preseason Player of the Year in a vote of the league's coaches announced at its annual Media Day at Madison Square Garden ... This is the sixth time a Georgetown player has been selected as the BIG EAST Preseason Player of the Year and Freeman is the fourth Hoya to earn the nod, joining Patrick Ewing, Alonzo Mourning and Roy Hibbert ... Freeman is also the third Hoya to be named the BIG EAST Player of the Year under John Thompson III, joining Hibbert and Jeff Green ... Freeman was an All-BIG EAST Second Team selection last year as a junior ... Freeman is coming off a junior season in which he led the team in scoring, and ranked 11th in the BIG EAST, with 16.5 points per game ... He was fourth on the team in rebounds (3.5), third in assists (2.4), second in three-point field goals made (59) and second in minutes played (34.4) ... Freeman connected on 52.5 percent of his field goals (11th in the league) and ranked fourth in the league, connecting on 85.6 percent of his free throws (83-of-97) ... In BIG EAST games, Freeman ranked fifth in the league, averaging 19.5 points per game.

FREEMAN SELECTED TO WOODEN AWARD PRESEASON TOP-50 LIST

Austin Freeman as one of 50 student-athletes across the country selected as a preseason candidate for the 2009-10 John R. Wooden Award All-American Team and Player of the Year trophy ... The list is comprised of 50 student-athletes who, based on last year's individual performance and team records, are the early frontrunners for college basketball's most prestigious honor ... Transfers, freshmen and medical redshirts are not eligible for the preseason list ... These players and others who excel throughout the season will be evaluated and considered for December's Midseason list and the official voting ballot released in March ... In late December, the Wooden Award Committee will release the Midseason Top 30 list, followed in March by the National Ballot, consisting of approximately 20 top players who have proven to their universities that they are also making progress toward graduation and maintaining a cumulative 2.0 GPA ... The Wooden Award All-American Team will be announced the week of the "Elite Eight" round during the NCAA Tournament ... HEAD COACH JOHN THOMPSON III

In six seasons as the head coach of the program he has been around since his youth, John Thompson III has made his mark not only on the Georgetown men's basketball program, but in the elite circles of college basketball. Thompson, who has been a collegiate head coach for 10 seasons, has compiled several coaching milestones:

- He has led the Hoyas to three appearances in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game in six years at the helm of the program.
- Including the team's appearance in 2010, Georgetown has been selected to the NCAA Tournament in four of the last six seasons.
- In three of the team's four NCAA Tournament appearances, the Blue & Gray have been seeded among the top three teams, earning two No. 2 seeds and a No. 3 seed in 2010.
- In 2006-07, Thompson led the program to a 30-7 record as the Hoyas won the BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the NCAA East Regional and advanced to the Final Four for the first time since 1985.
- In 2007-08, the Hoyas won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08), posting a two-year record of 28-6 against conference opponents
- Since his arrival on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have reached the postseason in all six seasons.
- He has twice been named the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

Recognized as an outstanding talent evaluator who has been nationally-recognized for his in-game coaching, tremendous vision and character, outstanding recruiting and his ability to connect with players, John Thompson III was introduced as Georgetown University 17th Head Coach on April 20, 2004.

Thompson arrived on the Hilltop in 2004 with a tremendous pedigree. The second Head Coach at Georgetown named John Thompson, he is the child of one Hall of Fame coach and the student of another, having played for the legendary Pete Carril as an undergraduate at Princeton.

Off the court, Thompson has been an active member of Georgetown University and a presence in the Washington, D.C. community. He speaks at a variety of alumni events throughout the year and has annually joined the members of the Georgetown University Wall Street Alliance in New York City each October. Through his work with his self-named foundation, the JTIII Foundation (which was founded in 2007), Thompson and his wife, Monica, have worked to aid community-based charities that serve at-risk children and families.

Thompson also has international experience, serving as an assistant coach on the USA Basketball Men's Under-18 National team that competed in the 2008 FIBA Americas U18 Championship in Argentina.

In his first six years at Georgetown, Thompson has guided the Hoyas to a 150-63 overall record (.704 win percentage) and to a 63-39 record in conference play.

Overall in 10 years as a head coach, including four at his alma mater, Princeton, Thompson has compiled a 218-105 (.675) overall record, with a 108-50 record in conference play (BIG EAST and Ivy League combined), won five league championships and guided his teams to nine postseason appearances

Since arriving on the Hilltop, the Hoyas have advanced to one Final Four (2006-07), won a BIG EAST Tournament title (2006-07), won back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season titles (2006-07, 2007-08), reached the NCAA Tournament four times (2005-06 – 2007-08, 2009-10), including three-straight appearances from 2005-06 – 2006-07, been invited to the National Invitation Tournament twice (2004-05, 2008-09) and played in the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game three times.

During that time, Georgetown has been ranked among the top-25 teams in the country for 38-straight weeks and is among the winningest programs in the BIG EAST. In addition, in the last four years, more Georgetown players (5) have been selected in the NBA Draft than any other school in the BIG EAST Conference. He has coached a BIG EAST Player of the Year, three All-Americans, five First-Team All-BIG EAST selections and 15 players who have earned All-BIG EAST accolades.

Thompson is also a two-time winner of the Black Coaches Association (BCA) Male Coach of the Year Award and was named the 2007 National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Coach of the Year.

Last year, the Hoyas finished the season with a 23-11 overall record, made a thrilling run to the Championship Game of the BIG EAST Tournament and were selected as a No.3 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Georgetown was the only school in the country to beat last year's NCAA Finalists (Duke and Butler) and was the only school to play three teams that reached the Final Four (Duke, Butler, West Virginia). The team was challenged by a scheduled that ranked No. 1 in the country by strength of schedule for much of the season and responded to that with signature wins, including non-conference wins over Temple during ESPN's "24 Hours of College Basketball," Butler at the Jimmy V Classic, Washington during the John Wooden Classic and Duke, in front of a sold-out crowd wearing gray

and an audience that included the President and Vice-President of the United States. The Hoyas, who finished the season No. 2 in strength of schedule and No. 13 in the RPI Ratings, also had impressive conference wins, including a come-from-behind win at home against Connecticut when Austin Freeman scored 28 of his 33 points in the second half and a stirring rout of Villanova in front of a crowd of nearly 10,000 on the day the District of Columbia was hit with more than two feet of snow. Sophomore center Greg Monroe, who declared for the NBA Draft at the conclusion of the season, was named First Team All-BIG EAST, earned Third Team Associated Press All-American honors and was named the Pete Newell Big Man of the Year by the NABC.

In 2008-09, Georgetown made its fifth-straight postseason appearance under Thompson, advancing to the NIT where the team lost to eventual runner-up Baylor in the first round. The Hoyas finished the season with a 16-15 overall record and were 7-11 in the conference, finishing in 12th place in the BIG EAST Conference, which was arguably the toughest in the country that season. Georgetown finished the season ranked No 12 in the country in strength of schedule, posted four wins over top-25 teams, beat two teams that advanced to the Final Four (UConn and Villanova) and two that advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament (Memphis, Syracuse). Freshman center Greg Monroe was named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year, becoming the sixth Georgetown player in history to earn the award.

The Hoyas made their third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance during the 2007-08 season, tabbed as the No. 2 seed before losing in the second round. His team earned a 28-6 (.823%) mark, going 15-3 in BIG EAST play to garner their second consecutive regular season championship, a feat previously unmatched in Hoya history. His team appeared in the national polls all 20 weeks of the season, never dropping lower than 12th and senior Patrick Ewing Jr. earned the inaugural BIG EAST Sixth Man Award.

During Thompson's third season as Georgetown's head coach, in 2006-07, JTIII saw his Hoyas win the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, the BIG EAST Tournament Championship as well as the NCAA East Regional Championship while compiling a 30-7 record. The Hoyas appeared in the national polls 18 times, defeated seven nationally-ranked opponents and compiled a conference record of 13-3. Thompson saw junior Jeff Green named BIG EAST Player of the Year, MVP of the BIG EAST Tournament and MVP of the NCAA East Regional. Green was the fifth player selected in the 2007 NBA Draft.

In his second season at the helm, Thompson's Hoyas made their presence felt with a thrilling run to the Sweet 16. This was his fifth trip to the postseason in six years as a head coach. A first-round victory over Northern Iowa and a second-round defeat of Ohio State advanced Georgetown to its first Regional Semifinal since 2001. The Hoyas, who fell just three points shy of a victory over the eventual national champion Florida Gators, ended the year with a 23-10 overall record, earning Thompson the Black Coaches Association's Fritz Pollard Male Coach of the Year Award.

In his inaugural season as the Hoya's head coach, Thompson's approach took a giant leap when he became one of only three coaches in BIG EAST history to defeat a nationally ranked team in the conference opener. The Hoyas ended up winning 19 games and advanced to the NIT Quarterfinals.

Coached by the legendary Carril as a student at Princeton and then working under him as an assistant coach at his alma mater for five years, Thompson brought a Princeton touch to Georgetown's rich basketball history, creating a new system he describes as the Georgetown Offense:

"The `system' is more about how you see the game than about plays. It's about adjusting and adapting to your own skills and strengths, and the skills and strengths of your opponent. personality of your team and tweak the system accordingly."

Prior to coaching at Georgetown, Thompson guided Princeton to three Ivy League Championships, two NCAA tournaments and an NIT appearance over his four years as head coach. He amassed a 68-42 record as Princeton's head coach after serving as an assistant coach at Princeton from 1995-2000. As assistant coach, he helped lead the team to a Top 10 national ranking and five consecutive post-season appearances.

Princeton not only made the postseason eight of nine years during Thompson's tenure, but he helped recruit and coach three All Americans, three Ivy League Players of the Year, two Ivy League Rookies of the Year and 12 First-Team All-Ivy League players.

Thompson also played basketball as an undergraduate for the Tigers while majoring in politics. As a forward, he ranks third on Princeton's all time assist leader list with 358. Playing for legendary coach Pete Carril, Thompson produced with amazing proficiency with 103 assists and just 34 turnovers as a senior. He was co-captain of the 1988 team and shared the B.F. Bunn trophy that year as one of the Tigers' Most Valuable Players.

Thompson, 43, grew up in Washington, D.C., where he graduated from Gonzaga College High School. As a high school senior he was named first team All-Metro by the Washington Post.

Thompson's wife, Monica, is also a Princeton grad (Class of '89). They have three children: Morgan, age 12; John Wallace, age 9; and Matthew, age 7.

JOHN THOMPSON III FOUNDATION

The John Thompson III Foundation was established in 2007. The mission of the John Thompson III Foundation is to foster community-based charities that serve at-risk children and families. The primary focus is education and healthcare. The Foundation partners primarily, but not exclusively, with non-profits in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan region which specialize in programs targeted to underserved children and families.

The John Thompson III Foundation intends to aid those organizations working within Washington, D.C. to address the community's more dire conditions, including:

- The 2005 estimated poverty rate was 19.8 percent of all residents, or 98,069 persons, living below the federal poverty level
- 36 percent of all children and 42 percent of all African-American children were living below the federal poverty level in 2005.
- While the District ranks second highest in per capita personal income among the states, it also ranks third highest in overall poverty rates and highest in poverty rates for children.
- More than 40% of youth in the District do NOT complete high school.
- Nearly 49% of the youth that are enrolled in the majority of the District's high schools are truant.
- In 2005-06, only 27 percent of all DCPS and public charter school students tested at a proficient or advanced level in math.
- Cancer is the second leading cause of death among District residents (22% of all deaths are due to cancer alone). Cancer is 27 percent more prevalent among blacks (512.8 cases per 100,000 population) than whites (404.5 cases per 100,000 population). In the District of Columbia, the percentage of women who receive prenatal care varies from 70 percent among blacks to 90 percent among whites.
- District of Columbia has higher rates of heart disease, stroke and all cancers on average than the rest of the United States.
- The Infant Mortality Rate for the District of Columbia has decreased from 11.9 per 1,000 live births in 2000 to 10.6 per 1,000 live births in 2001. The rate has declined by 42 percent over a 10-year period since 1992. But is still almost double the national average.
- The January 2006 homeless count included 3,485 homeless adults and children in families.

The Fourth Annual JTIIF Foundation Community Festival was held on Saturday, Sept. 25 at the Turkey Thicket Recreation Center, located at 1100 Michigan Ave., NE in Washington, D.C. In its second year at Turkey Thicket, the event promoted physical activity, education and health care.

It was a free, fun-filled day for children and adults, with food, games and entertainment. The festival consisted of arts and crafts, interactive games, sport stations, book readings, health screenings for adults and a basketball clinic hosted by Coach Thompson and the Hoyas. The basketball clinic was open to all children under the age of 14.

This year's participating organizations included: Everybody Wins! DC, Dr. Thomas Wong Optometrist, Prevention Works!, Uniting for Life, Boys & Girls Club of Greater Washington, D.C. Fire EMS and others.
