#### COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

<b>515</b>	With 515 rushing yards at Boston College, it marked the third-most by any Irish team in a game since 1969 when they ran for a modern school-record 597 yards against Navy. It was good for a 10.1 yards per rush average, breaking the modern Notre Dame record (10.0) set against Great Lakes in 1942.
<b>100</b>	Brian Kelly will coach his 100th game at Notre Dame on Saturday, becoming just the fifth head coach in school history to reach the milestone. He joins Knute Rockne, Frank Leahy, Ara Parseghian and Lou Holtz.
<b>10</b>	Notre Dame had six players (Heisman trophy candidate Josh Adams, RB Tony Jones Jr., RB Dexter Williams, RB Deon McIntosh, WR Kevin Stepherson and QB Brandon Wimbush) record runs of at least 10 yards vs. Wake Forest.
<b>9</b>	OG Quenton Nelson is the highest-rated offensive guard in the country by Pro Football Focus (38.8), grading out more than nine points higher than the next highest rated guard (29.0). Nelson has not allowed a sack in 635 snaps.
<b>8</b>	CB Julian Love became the eighth Irish player to return two interceptions for touchdowns in a season when he recorded a pick-six against NC State to join his earlier INT return for a TD against Michigan State. Love recorded his third pick against Wake Forest and owns a single-season school-record 14 pass break-ups.
<b>7</b>	With seven TD runs of at least 60 yards this season, Heisman candidate Josh Adams leads the nation in that category.
<b>6</b>	NC State's rushing defense entered the Oct. 28 contest ranked sixth nationally in rushing defense and had not allowed a 100-yard rusher all season. In Notre Dame's 35-14 win, the Irish ran for 318 yards, including 136 by halftime, eclipsing the Wolfpack's previous high for rushing yards allowed in a game of 133.
<b>5</b>	Notre Dame has not committed a turnover in five games this season. The Irish are tied for fifth nationally in turnover margin with 19 forced turnovers and seven giveaways. More importantly, Notre Dame is outscoring opponents off those turnovers, 108-10.
<b>4</b>	RB Josh Adams owns four rushing TDs this season versus AP ranked opponents. Only one running back in the nation has more against ranked foes.
<b>3</b>	Brandon Wimbush is the third QB in school history to eclipse both 500 rushing yards and 1,000 passing yards in the same season. He joins Tony Rice (1988 and '89) and DeShone Kizer (2015).
<b>2</b>	Heisman trophy candidate Josh Adams is one of just two players in Notre Dame history to reach 1,000 rushing yards for the season in eight games. He passed the mark against NC State, matching Vagas Ferguson who hit 1,000 in eight games in 1979. Adams was the fastest to 1,000 in terms of carries in school history.
<b>1</b>	Heisman trophy candidate Josh Adams is the only player in the FBS since at least 1996 to break a TD run of at least 70 yards in four consecutive games. Per STATS, he passed four players since '96 who had TD runs of 70-plus in three straight games, including Heisman trophy winner Ricky Williams.
<b>0</b>	Not a single ticket has remained for a Notre Dame home game since 1973. The Wake Forest game was the 261st consecutive sellout at Notre Dame Stadium. Tickets remain for the Navy contest and can be purchased at <a href="http://UND.com/BuyTickets">UND.com/BuyTickets</a> .

**HITTING THE BIG ONE**

- Heisman candidate Josh Adams had a TD rush of over 70 yards in each of the last four games, before seeing that streak snapped against Wake Forest
- Per STATS, he is the only player in college football since at least 1996 to have such a run in four consecutive games.
- The STATS database going back to 1996 found four players who have hit a 70-yard TD run in three straight games. The list includes Texas Heisman Trophy winner Ricky Williams, Northern Illinois' Garrett Wolfe, Matt Breida from Georgia Southern and Arizona's Khalil Tate.
- Against NC State, the nation's sixth-ranked rushing defense entering the Oct. 28 game, Adams had a 77-yard TD scamper in the third quarter to put the game away. He totaled 202 rushing yards against a Wolfpack defense which was allowing 91.3 rushing yards per game going in and had not conceded a 100-yard rusher all season.
- Adams' longest rush of the season came against rival Southern Cal, an 84-yard TD run in the third quarter which also put the game out of reach. He gashed the Trojans for 191 yards and three TDs.
- At North Carolina, Adams hit paydirt on a 73-yard run in the second quarter to put the Irish up 14-0. He finished with 118 yards on just 13 carries.
- The streak began against Miami (Ohio), when Adams 73-yard TD rush on the second play from scrimmage opened the scoring in a 52-17 Notre Dame win. He finished with 159 yards and 2 TDs against the RedHawks.

**FIGHTING AFTER CONTACT**

- Heisman candidate Josh Adams leads the nation with 6.2 yards per rush after contact.
- He's totaled 852 rushing yards after contact this season. Only 29 players in FBS have more total rushing yards this season than Adams has after contact.
- His per game average of 94.7 yards after contact would rank 32nd nationally in rushing yards per game.

**NATIONAL STATEMENT**

- Heisman candidate Josh Adams has established himself as a Heisman Trophy candidate and one of the best running backs in Notre Dame history.
- Adams is third nationally in yards per carry, with his 8.69 mark trailing only Arizona QB Khalil Tate (13.42) and Stanford RB Bryce Love (10.27). Adams averaged 10.1 yards per carry in the win over USC, topping Love's mark of 9.4 against the Trojans this year.
- He is slotted ninth nationally in yards per game, coming in at 132.3 per contest, a mark which ranks seventh among running backs
- In total rushing yards, Adams checks-in at seventh in the country with 1,191 yards on the year. He was one of 10 players in the nation over 1,000 yards by the end of October, one of just six players from a major program (Power 5+ND) to hit that milestone before November and one of eight running backs in FBS to reach the mark.
- Adams owns eight runs of 59 yards or longer, while four of his rushing TDs this season have come on rushes of at least 70 yards.
- He has eclipsed the century mark in all but three games this year, reaching 100 yards in the first half of five contests.
- This has all been while not seeing action in 12 quarters.
- Adams paces an Irish rushing attack which ranks fifth in the country at 324.8 rushing yards per game. Notre Dame is second in the nation among non-option teams, trailing only Arizona's 327.0 per game.
- Georgia Tech, Arizona and Notre Dame are the only major programs (Power 5+ND) averaging better than 300 yards per game rushing.
- His career 2,959 yards rank 22nd among active FBS players and fifth among active juniors.

**TAKING HIS PLACE IN IRISH LORE**

- In addition to rushing for over 200 yards for the first time in his career at Boston College, Heisman candidate Josh Adams became the 17th player in school history to eclipse the 2,000 career rushing yards mark. Doing so in 316 carries, Adams hit the mark quicker than any player in school history.
- Through the Wake Forest game, Adams now totals 2,959 career yards. That total slots him sixth in school history. Next in his sights is Julius Jones (3,018).
- At his current pace of 132.3 yards per game, Adams would finish the regular season at 3,356 career yards, a mark which would slot him fourth all-time.

- If the season ended after the Wake game, Adams would own single-season records in yards per game (130.6 by Vagas Ferguson in 1979) and yards per rush (8.11 by George Gipp in 1920).
- Adams owns the Notre Dame record for rushing yards as a freshman (835) and is the first back in school history to eclipse 800 yards in each of his first two seasons.
- In terms of quickest to the 2,000-yard club, Adams edged out George Gipp, who hit the mark in 323 carries. In terms of games, Adams was seventh-quickest. Allen Pinkett made it to 2,000 in 22 games, but on 384 carries.

**GAMEDAY SPOTLIGHT**

- ESPN's College GameDay will be at a Notre Dame football game for the 28th time on Saturday as the third-ranked Irish visit No. 7 Miami (Fla.).
- The most recent Irish-involved episode came on Oct. 31, 2015, when the roadshow was in Philadelphia as No. 9 Notre Dame knocked-off No. 21 Temple, 24-20.
- All-time, Notre Dame is 12-15 when GameDay is at the site. The Irish are 8-10 when appearing as the road team in a GameDay match-up.
- The last six College GameDay appearances have been away from home, with the show's last visit to the Notre Dame campus on Oct. 13, 2012, when the seventh-ranked Irish knocked-off No. 17 Stanford, 20-13 in overtime, en route to an undefeated season.
- Notre Dame hosted the first on-campus edition of College GameDay on Nov. 13, 1993, when No. 1 Florida State visited to take on the second-ranked Irish. Lou Holtz's squad handed the Seminoles a 31-24 defeat after the show aired from the Joyce Center.
- The Irish are 3-5 when Lee Corso picks Notre Dame to win, with a 5-9 mark when Corso picks against the Irish.
- Notre Dame enters GameDay with its highest ranking since the 2012 BCS National Championship game, also in Miami Gardens, Florida, when the Irish carried a No. 1 ranking into the contest.

**BIG TIME NOVEMBER TRIPS**

- Saturday night's contest will be the 15th time since the advent of the Associated Press poll in 1936 that the Irish will visit an undefeated opponent in the month of November.
- Notre Dame has gone on the road in November and handed its opponent their first defeat of the year three times: 1988 at USC, 1982 at Pitt and 1957 at Oklahoma. In addition, the Irish have played to a tie three times: 1946 vs. Army, 1966 vs. Michigan State and 1968 vs. USC.
- This will be the first November visit to an undefeated foe since 2004, when the Irish lost at top-ranked USC to cap the season.
- That was the only November road game at an undefeated opponent since 1988. In '88, the undefeated Irish visited undefeated USC and won, 27-10.
- The Irish have once played Miami (Florida) in such a scenario, with the No. 2 Hurricanes winning, 24-0, to cap the 1987 regular season. Lou Holtz's Irish won the next 22 regular season contests.
- Notre Dame's first win in November at an undefeated opponent came in 1957, when the Irish won 7-0 in Norman, Oklahoma, to snap the Sooners' 47-game winning streak.

**BEATING THE BEST, SOUNDLY**

- With the victory over NC State, Notre Dame beat opponents in the AP Top 15 in consecutive weeks for the first time since 1989.
- The Irish took down No. 14 NC State, 35-14, a week after defeating No. 11 Southern Cal, 49-14.
- In 1989, Lou Holtz's team beat No. 9 Southern Cal, 28-24, on Oct. 21, before downing No. 7 Pittsburgh, 45-7, on Oct. 28.
- With the two victories coming by at least 20 points, it marked the first time since 1944 the Irish won by 20 points over top-15 foes in consecutive weeks. That season, Notre Dame beat No. 10 Georgia Tech, 21-0, on Nov. 25, before beating No. 12 Great Lakes Naval Station, 28-7, on Dec. 2. Great Lakes was coached by the legendary Paul Brown.

**SOMETHING GAVE**

- No. 14 NC State entered the Oct. 28 contest ranked sixth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 91.3 rushing yards per game. The Wolfpack had not allowed an individual rusher to go over 100 yards and had not allowed a team to go beyond 133 yards in a game.
- The Irish flipped the script, rushing for 136 yards in the first half. Notre Dame finished with 318 yards on the ground, its sixth game with at least 300 rushing yards this season.
- Heisman candidate Josh Adams didn't just become the first 100-yard rusher against the Wolfpack this season, he broke the 200-yard mark, finishing with 202 yards and a TD.

**PUTTING IT AWAY**

- While the Irish rushing attack helped Notre Dame salt away its 35-14 victory over No. 14 NC State with a 15-play, 76-yard drive over the final 8:40 of the contest, the Irish defense did its part, as well.
- Mike Elko's defense force four straight three-and-outs to end the game. The other two second-half possessions by the Wolfpack ended in a 69-yard interception return for a TD by Notre Dame's Julian Love and a turnover on downs.
- It was one of two fourth down stops by the defense, making Irish opponents 3-for-13 on fourth down this season.
- The Irish defense held the Wolfpack to 50 rushing yards, while QB Ryan Finley was intercepted for the first time this season when Love delivered his pick-six.

## STEPPING UP WHEN IT MATTERS MOST

- Notre Dame has scored points on 36-of-39 trips to the red zone this season, good for a percentage of 92.3 which ranks 16th in the nation.
- The Irish were perfect in their first 22 red zone trips this season before failing to score for the first time against North Carolina. They have been perfect in seven of nine games this year, with the only red zone failure in the NC State game coming as the Irish took a knee to end to run out the clock from the Wolfpack five-yard line.
- The area was a point of emphasis for the Irish after scoring at an 83.3 clip last season to rank 72nd in FBS.
- On the flip side, the Notre Dame defense has halted opponents on seven trips inside the 20 to rank 27th nationally in red zone defense. In addition, Notre Dame has allowed a TD on just 13 of the 29 red zone trips.
- No team in the nation has allowed fewer than Notre Dame's three red zone rushing TDs.
- Notre Dame is one of three major programs (Power 5+ND) to rank in the top 30 nationally in both red zone offense and red zone defense, joining top-ranked Georgia and Northwestern.

## HERE COME THE IRISH

- The Irish defense has made fast starts a trend, forcing either a punt or a turnover on the opponents' first drive in all but one game.
- Notre Dame forced a punt on the first defensive series against Temple, Georgia and Boston College.
- Against Michigan State and Miami (Ohio), the defense has gotten interceptions from Julian Love and Greer Martini, respectively.
- The defense extended their dominance even further at North Carolina, forcing the Tar Heels to go three-and-out on their first five drives of the game.
- Notre Dame forced USC QB Sam Darnold to fumble on the Trojans' first offensive play.
- The defense forced NC State to go three-and-out, one of six three-and-outs the Irish forced in the contest.
- The streak ended against Wake Forest when the Demon Deacons kicked a field goal on their first offense drive. The Deacs needed to convert two third downs and took 14 plays to go 82 yards over 4:11.

## FRESH TURNOVERS

- Notre Dame ranks fifth nationally in turnover margin, having created 19 opponent turnovers while giving the ball away seven times.
- Just as importantly, the Irish have taken advantage of opponent's miscues, scoring 108 points off those 19 turnovers. Three games this season (Boston College, Michigan State and USC) have seen the Irish score 21 points off turnovers.
- Notre Dame's 19 turnovers break into 10 fumble recoveries and nine interceptions. The fumble recovery total ranks eighth nationally and trails just one major program (Power 5+ND).
- With just seven turnovers of their own, the Irish are fifth in the nation. In five games (Michigan State, Miami Ohio, USC, NC State and Wake Forest), the Irish have not turned the ball over at all, including three straight games since the bye week.
- Perhaps most impressively, the Irish defense has allowed just 10 points all season after the turnovers, a field goal by Boston College and a TD by North Carolina.

## LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

- Notre Dame's 35-14 victory over NC State on Oct. 28 gave the Irish six consecutive victories of 20 points or more for the first time since 1966. That year the Irish scored consecutive wins over Northwestern, Army, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Navy, Pitt and Duke (the streak was snapped by the famous 10-10 tie at Michigan State).
- The previous weeks saw Notre Dame defeat Boston College (49-20), Michigan State (38-18), Miami (Ohio) (52-17), North Carolina (33-10) and USC (49-14).
- With over 38 points those first three games of the streak, Notre Dame eclipsed that number in three straight games for the first time since 2006. That season, Notre Dame beat North Carolina (45-26), Air Force (39-17) and Army (41-9).
- The Irish scored 45 of their 52 points against Miami (Ohio) in the first half, marking the highest scoring opening half under Brian Kelly. It was the most first-half points since the Irish hung 49 on Pitt in the first two periods on Nov. 9, 1968.
- The 28-point first quarter against the RedHawks was the highest scoring quarter for the Irish since Sept. 3, 2005, when they scored 28 points in the second quarter of a 42-21 victory at Pitt.
- With wins by over 20 points in seven of eight games, Notre Dame has six wins by at least 20 points in the same season for the first time since 2005.

## LOVE THE END ZONE

- When Irish CB Julian Love returned an interception 59-yards for a touchdown on Michigan State's first drive, he became the first Irish player with a pick six since 2015 when Andrew Trumbetti returned an interception for a score against Wake Forest.
- Love was the first player to accomplish the feat in a true road game since 2013 when Bennett Jackson had a pick six against Purdue. Jackson's return was also the last time an Irish CB had an interception return for a TD.
- He had his second pick-six of the year against NC State, when he recorded the first interception of Wolfpack QB Ryan Finley on Oct. 28, then returned it 69 yards for a TD.
- Love became the eighth player in school history to return two interceptions for a TD in the same season, the first since Tom Zbikowski in 2005.
- On the season, Love has three interceptions and a school-record 14 pass break-ups on the season. His 153 interception return yards are the second-most in program history, trailing only Nick Rassa's 197 in 1965.

## WIMBUSH ON THE RUN

- With 207 rushing yards and four TDs in the win at Boston College, QB Brandon Wimbush had a recording setting day for Irish signal callers.
- He is the first quarterback in school history to put together a 200-yard rushing performance, as he topped the school record of 146 set by Bill Etter against Navy on Nov. 1, 1969.
- With four rushing TDs, it was the first time any Irish player went for four scores on the ground since Emmett Mosley scored four rushing TDs against Navy on Oct. 22, 1994. He was the first QB in school history to score four times on the ground.
- Wimbush now totals 13 rushing TDs on the season, a school record for rushing TDs in a season by a QB. That total ranks eighth in the nation, fifth among FBS QBs and third among non-option QBs.



**ROAD WARRIORS**

- Notre Dame secured its third road victory over a Power 5 opponent on Oct. 7 at North Carolina. The Irish had earlier victories at Boston College and Michigan State.
- Notre Dame was the third FBS team to reach three road wins over Power 5 foes this season, joining Washington and Georgia as the only programs to accomplish the feat over the first six weeks of the season.
- It marks the first time Notre Dame had three consecutive road wins over Power 5 teams since 2012 when a four-game winning streak included Michigan State, Oklahoma, Boston College and USC.
- Additionally, it is the first time since 1967 Notre Dame has scored three Power 5 road wins by at least 20 points each. That year, the Irish won at Illinois (47-7), Pitt (38-0) and Georgia Tech (36-3).
- It marks the first streak of three straight games at any point since 1973-74 when Notre Dame won at Miami (Fla.), 44-0, in the '73 season finale before winning 31-7 at Georgia Tech and 49-3 at Northwestern in the first two road games of '74.

**COMPLETE PERFORMANCE CAPTURES  
JEWEL SHILLELAGH**

- Notre Dame secured a 49-19 victory in the latest installment of the USC rivalry, scoring the most points against the Trojans since 1977.
- The Irish held a 28-0 halftime lead, the largest since holding a 31-0 advantage at intermission of a 51-0 win in 1966.
- RB Josh Adams and QB Brandon Wimbush led an Irish rushing attack which went for 377 yards, the most against USC in the modern era. The previous high was 373 yards in a 23-17 win over the Trojans in 1954.
- The victory gives the Irish four of their five competitive trophies, following earlier wins this season over Boston College (Leahy Bowl) and Michigan State (Megaphone), as well as a win over Purdue (Shillelagh) in the last meeting in 2014. Notre Dame will have a chance to possess all five in the regular season finale at Stanford on Nov. 25 when the Legends Trophy is on the line versus the Cardinal.

**WIMBUSH & BOOK WIN DEBUTS**

- This season, Brandon Wimbush and Ian Book have become the sixth and seventh consecutive Notre Dame signal callers to win their first career starts.
- Wimbush scored a win in the season opener against Temple, while Book started for an injured Wimbush at North Carolina.
- The duo joins Dayne Crist (2010 vs. Purdue), Tommy Rees (2010 vs. No. 15 Utah), Everett Golson (2012 vs. Navy), Malik Zaire (2014 vs. No. 22 LSU) and DeShone Kizer (2015 vs. No. 14 Georgia Tech).
- Including his tenure at Cincinnati, head coach Brian Kelly has now seen each of the last 10 quarterbacks he has started emerge victorious from their debut starts.
- Wimbush not only completed 17 of 30 passes for 184 yards and two TDs, but the signal caller rushed for 106 yards on 12 carries and one TD. Wimbush became the first Irish quarterback responsible for three or more touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) in his first career start since Rees (three passing) against No. 15 Utah in 2010. Since 1985, only Wimbush, Rees, Matt LoVecchio (two passing, one rushing against Stanford in 2000) and Ron Powlus (four passing against Northwestern in 1994) can claim that distinction in their first career start.
- Book was the first Irish QB to make his first start on the road since Jimmy Clausen at Penn State in 2007 (Malik Zaire and Everett Golson made their first starts in neutral site games at the Music City Bowl and in Dublin, Ireland, respectively). Book is the first Notre Dame signal caller to win when his first career start came in a road game since Tom Krug won at Air Force, 44-14, in 1995.

- He was 17-for-31 passing for 146 yards and a TD, while rushing for 45 yards at UNC.
- Book was Notre Dame's 26th different starting quarterback since 1985. The Irish are 20-6 (.769) in those games featuring a first-time starter under center. Notre Dame is 10-2 (.833) in such games at Notre Dame Stadium.
- From 1985-98, Notre Dame was victorious in nine straight games in which an Irish quarterback was making his first career start, including four coming in a season opener. Those openers were won by Rick Mirer (No. 1 Notre Dame def. No. 4 Michigan 28-24 in '90), Kevin McDougal (No. 7 Notre Dame def. Northwestern 27-12 in '93), Powlus (No. 3 Notre Dame def. Northwestern 42-12 in '95) and Jarious Jackson (No. 22 Notre Dame def. No. 5 Michigan 36-20 in '98).
- Notre Dame's nine-game, first-start streak ended in the 10-0 loss at USC on Nov. 28, 1998, when Eric Chappell started in place of the injured starter Jackson (then-freshman Arnaz Battle also played a large chunk of that game).
- Following the 1998 meeting with USC, the Irish won three consecutive games under first-time signal callers. In fact, all three came during the same season, 2000, and occurred over the year's first five contests. Battle (Notre Dame def. No. 24 Texas A&M, 24-10), Gary Godsey (Notre Dame def. Purdue, 23-21) and Matt LoVecchio (No. 25 Notre Dame def. Stanford, 20-14).
- The Irish then dropped four straight contests with a first-time starting quarterback under center.
- Notre Dame used a trio of first-time signal callers in 2007, including one in each of the first two games of the season. Demetrius Jones (Georgia Tech def. Notre Dame, 33-3), Jimmy Clausen (No. 14 Penn State def. Notre Dame, 31-10) and Evan Sharpley (No. 13 USC def. Notre Dame, 38-0) all failed to walk away with a victory.
- Dayne Crist snapped that five-game skid with a victorious debut against Purdue on Sept. 4, 2010.

**SPARTAN SHUTDOWN**

- In Notre Dame’s 38-18 victory to claim the Megaphone Trophy versus Michigan State last week, the Irish stepped-up in a rivalry game.
- Notre Dame put up 28 points in the first half, marking the most first-half by the Irish in the series with the Spartans since 1992.
- With a 21-point halftime lead, it was the largest deficit at intermission for Michigan State since the Capital One Bowl on Jan. 1, 2011, when the Spartans trailed Alabama 28-0 at the break.
- Notre Dame scored on the opening drive and followed with a pick six on Michigan State’s first drive, en route to never trailing. It marked the first time Michigan State never had a lead in a game since Sept. 15, 2012, when Notre Dame took a 20-3 decision at Spartan Stadium.
- Coupled with Notre Dame’s 49-20 win at Boston College the previous week, it marked the first time since 1983 the Irish scored wins by at least 20 points on the road in consecutive weeks. That year, Gerry Faust’s teams won 27-3 at Colorado and 30-6 at South Carolina.
- In the game, the Irish ran for 182 yards, the most allowed on the ground by a Spartan defense which ranks eighth nationally in rushing defense.
- Notre Dame has now won five of its last seven games in East Lansing, Michigan.

**CRAWFORD MAKING THE MOST**

Notre Dame junior CB Shaun Crawford returned with a vengeance in his first six games of the season. He missed his entire freshman season (2015) with a torn ACL and then suffered a torn Achilles in the first quarter of the second game of his sophomore season (2016). In that limited time he:

- Returned a blocked PAT for a two-point conversion to tie Texas, 37-37, with just over three minutes remaining
- Three interceptions
- Two fumble recoveries
- A forced fumble at the goal line to negate a certain touchdown
- Four passes defended
- 1.5 sacks and 20 total tackles

**RUNNING DOWN RECORDS**

- Notre Dame ran for over 400 yards in two of the season’s first three games. Prior to this year, that number had been reach once previously in the Brian Kelly era.
- At Boston College, the Irish went for 515 on the ground. It was the third-most since Notre Dame ran for 597 against Navy on Nov. 1, 1969, while also trailing a 545-yard day against Army in 1974 and a 526-yard performance against Navy in 1972.
- The 515 on 51 carries was good for an average of 10.1 yards per rush, setting a modern-day record. The previous top mark was 10.0 yards per rush against Great Lakes Naval Station on Dec. 5, 1942.
- The BC game was the first time in school history the Irish had a pair of runners eclipse 200 yards on the ground in the same game. RB Josh Adams went for 229 yards on 18 carries, while QB Brandon Wimbush picked-up 207 yards and ran for four scores.
- They were the first players to eclipse 200 yards since Julius Jones ran for 218 at Stanford in 2003.
- Adams led the charge against Temple in the opener, as three Notre Dame players eclipsed 100 yards on the ground for what is believed to be the first time in school history (confirmed since at least 1954). Adams led the charge with 161 yards, followed by Dexter Williams at 124 and Wimbush at 106. As a team, the Irish totaled 422 yards
- Against Miami (Ohio), Adams set a personal best by eclipsing 100 yards on just his fifth carry of the day. He finished with 162 yards on eight carries with two TDs against the RedHawks.

**DOUBLE DOMERS**

- The duo of RB Josh Adams and QB Brandon Wimbush each breaking 200 yards rushing at Boston College was not only the first time the feat had been accomplished in school history, it was just the seventh time in FBS history and only the fourth time the feat had been accomplished against a major program (ND+Power Five).
- It marked the first time the feat had been accomplished against a major program since the 2012 Big Ten Championship Game, when Melvin Gordon and Montee Ball both eclipsed 200 against Nebraska.
- It last happened in college football last season, when Middle Tennessee had I’Tavius Mathers and Richie James break the mark against Florida Atlantic.

**YOON HITS FOR FOUR**

- K Justin Yoon made all four of his field goal attempts against No. 15 Georgia, connecting from 39, 42, 37 and 28 yards.
- It was the career-best performance by Yoon, who is a career 35-for-44 on field goals and 137-for-141 on PATs.
- It was the first time an Irish kicker connected for four field goals in a game since 2008 when Brandon Walker hit four in a four-overtime loss to Pittsburgh. Walker was 4-for-5, making his first four kicks before missing a 38-yarder in the fourth extra frame.

**IRISH OPEN 2017 WITH QUICK STRIKE**

- The Irish recorded their quickest offensive touchdown to open the season since at least 1963 (when records consistently show times of scores).
- Josh Adams broke a 37-yard run to the end zone just 33 seconds into the opener against Temple.
- It marked the quickest points of any kind by Notre Dame to open a season since 1993 when Pete Bercich returned an interception for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage against Northwestern. That score occurred in just eight seconds.

**WIMBUSH WINS BY LAND AND AIR**

- In passing for 184 yards and rushing for 114 in the season opener, Irish QB Brandon Wimbush proved his potential as a dual threat quarterback.
- Wimbush is believed to be the first Irish QB since at least 1942 to break 100 yards in both passing and rushing in his first career start.
- He is just the sixth different Notre Dame quarterback to hit the century mark in both categories.

- Paul Hornung, Joe Theismann and Tony Rice were the first three to accomplish the feat, while Jarious Jackson and DeShone Kizer each hit the mark twice.
- Kizer’s first such performance also came against Temple in 2015.
- Wimbush scored Notre Dame’s only TD in the one-point loss to No. 15 Georgia on a one-yard run.

**COIN TOSS CAPTAINS**

Head coach Brian Kelly has named seven team captains for the 2017 campaign, but NCAA rules limit teams to sending four student-athletes to the middle of the field for the coin toss. The captains include:

- LB Greer Martini
- OL Mike McGlinchey
- LB Nyles Morgan
- OL Quenton Nelson
- LB Drue Tranquill
- WR Austin Webster

The Irish are 6-2 on the toss this season. Martini and Morgan are both 2-0 when taking part in the coin toss. Regardless of the result of the toss, Notre Dame has received the opening kickoff in every game except Boston College.

**POSITIONAL BREAKDOWN**

**QUARTERBACKS**

- Brandon Wimbush has emerged as one of the most successful rushing quarterbacks in the nation. He is fifth among non-option QBs at 79.9 rushing yards per game. His 13 rushing TDs this season rank eighth in the country as well as being a school record for rushing TDs in a season by a QB. Against BC he became the first Irish QB in modern history to rush for over 200 yards and score four rushing TDs.
- Ian Book is the backup for Wimbush. The sophomore saw limited action before making his first career start at North Carolina in place of an injured Wimbush. Book became the sixth straight Notre Dame QB to win his starting debut by going 17-for-31 for 146 yards and a TD while also rushing for 45 yards. He briefly spelled an injured Wimbush against Wake Forest, going 8-for-8 for 50 yards and a TD.

**RUNNING BACKS**

- Heisman candidate Josh Adams leads a dominant Irish rushing game with 1,191 yards on the year. He’s third nationally at 8.69 yards per carry. Against BC, he became the 17th back in school history to reach 2,000 career yards now stands sixth on the Notre Dame career rushing list at 2,959 yards.
- Dexter Williams, Tony Jones Jr. and Deon McIntosh provide depth at the position. The trio has combined for 845 yards and 12 TDs on the year.

- The Irish rushing attack ranks fifth nationally at 324.8 yards per game. The only non-option team with more rushing yards per game this season is Arizona at 327.0.

**WIDE RECEIVERS**

- After a breakout game against Wake Forest, Chase Claypool leads the Irish receivers with 24 catches 354 yards and two TDs. Equanimeous St. Brown leads the corps in TDs with three TD grabs as part of 22 receptions and 289 yards.
- Cam Smith, Chris Finke, Miles Boykin and Kevin Stepherson have emerged as the next threats. Claypool and Boykin both had TD receptions against Miami (Ohio), while Smith had a TD catch at North Carolina.
- Stepherson and St. Brown both had TD receptions in the win over Southern Cal., while Stepherson added another against NC State. Stepherson then showcased his versatility with a career-long 35-yard rush against Wake Forest.
- The group took a hit entering the BC game when transfer Freddy Canteen was lost for the year (labrum).

**TIGHT ENDS**

- Notre Dame maintains its legacy as Tight End U with five tight ends who have seen action this season.
- Durham Smythe has started every game this season. He’s made 12 catches for 218 yards and a TD. Alizé Mack has returned after missing the 2016 season and has 17 catches for 154 yards as the team’s leading receiver. Senior Nic Weishar has two TDs among six catches for 37 yards.
- The Irish welcomed in arguably the best tight end class in the country and both true freshmen have seen action. Brock Wright entered as the No. 1 tight end according to ESPN and Rivals, while Cole Kmet was ranked No. 3 by both groups. Both have played in all three games, with Wright occasionally lining up at fullback and Kmet seeing heavy action on special teams.

**OFFENSIVE LINE**

- With four returning starters, Notre Dame’s offensive line has paved the way for the Irish to go for over 300 rushing yards in seven games and rank second in the nation in rushing yards per game among non-option attacks.
- Led by preseason All-Americans Mike McGlinchey (tackle) and Quenton Nelson (guard) on the left side, the group also returns center Sam Mustipher and Alex Bars, who has moved from right tackle to right guard. Tommy Kraemer and Robert Hainsey have split time at right tackle.
- Led by offensive line coach Harry Hiestand, the offensive line has helped the Irish to a rank of fifth nationally in rushing offense (324.8 per game), while they have been especially adept at helping the offense convert on red zone opportunities. While the Irish are 36-for-39 in the red zone this season, 23 of the 33 trips have ended with rushing TDs.
- Part of the offensive line that paves the way for the fifth-ranked rushing offense in the FBS (324.8 rush yards/game)
- Irish lead the FBS in rush yards/carry (7.04)
- Notre Dame ranks tied for second in the FBS in rushing TDs (34)
- Irish rank third in the FBS in total rushing yards (2,923)
- Notre Dame has rushed for at least 300 yards in seven of nine games
- Irish have rushed for at least 400 yards in two games
- Helped Notre Dame rush for 515 yards at Boston College -- third-most by any Irish team in a game since 1969 when they ran for a modern school-record 597 yards against Navy
- Irish rushed for 10.1 yards per carry against the Eagles -- breaking the modern Notre Dame record (10.0) set against Great Lakes in 1942
- Irish rank first or second in the nation in runs of at least 20 yards (1st, 36), 30 yards (t-1st, 25), 40 yards (2nd, 15), 50 yards (t-1st, 11), 60 yards (1st, nine) and 70 yards (2nd, four)
- Notre Dame leads the nation in rush yards (932) and rushing TDs (11) against current AP-ranked foes

- Irish offensive line is the only such unit in the country to average over 230.0 rush yards/game with at least four games against ranked opponents
- Notre Dame averages 233.0 rush yards/game and 5.24 yards/rush in its four games against current AP-ranked foes
- Irish ran for 318 yards, including 182 in the second half, against NC State, which entered the contest as the No. 6-ranked rushing defense in the country allowing just 91.3 yards/game
- Notre Dame's total almost tripled the previous high by a Wolfpack opponent (133)
- Blocked for six different Irish players to have a run that gained at least 35 yards
- Irish have registered 20 carries that have netted a minimum of 35 yards
- Four different Notre Dame players have rushed for at least 100 yards
- Irish have recorded 12 separate 100-yard rushing games

**DEFENSIVE LINE**

- Under the tutelage of assistant head coach Mike Elston, the defensive line has thrived in defensive coordinator Mike Elko's system. Jerry Tillery, Jay Hayes, Jonathan Bonner and Daelin Hayes have been the starters, while Andrew Trumbetti, Julian Okwara, Khalid Kareem, Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa and Kurt Hinich see heavy action, as well.
- Against now-No. 1 Georgia, the group totaled three TFLs and a sack while holding the Bulldogs to two or fewer yards rushing on 21 of their 43 rushing attempts.
- The group stepped-up against then-No. 11 Southern Cal, as well, with Khalid Kareem recording two sacks and Jay and Daelin Hayes each getting one sack, while holding USC to its second-lowest rushing total of the season (78 yards).
- On the year, the line has 13.0 sacks, a forced fumble, two fumble recoveries and an interception.

**LINEBACKERS**

- The Irish linebackers also have seen a new level of play under position coach Clark Lea and defensive coordinator Mike Elko.
- Greer Martini (buck), Nyles Morgan (mike) and Drew Tranquill (rover) have been the primary starters, while Te'Von Coney has seen a large share of playing time, as well.
- Those four are the team leaders in tackles, as Coney leads the way with 74, followed by Morgan at 64, Tranquill at 54 and Martini at 46.
- In addition, Coney has three sacks, 9.0 TFLs, a forced fumble and fumble recovery, while Tranquill has 6.5 TFLs and three forced fumbles.

**SECONDARY**

- Julian Love and Nick Watkins have started all nine games at cornerback. Love, a 247 Freshman All-American in 2016, has three interceptions (two returned for a TD), 37 tackles and a school-record 13 pass break-ups, while Watkins has 26 tackles to go along with seven break-ups.
- Shaun Crawford has provided depth at corner and had a breakout performance at BC. He had two interceptions and a fumble recovery in the win over the Eagles, while also registering two tackles and a pass break-up. Crawford followed with a forced fumble and fumble recovery at Michigan State.
- At safety, it's been Nick Coleman and Jalen Elliot as starters for all eight games. Coleman has made 33 tackles with three PBUs, while Elliott has contributed 27 tackles and a PBU.

**SPECIAL TEAMS**

- On special teams, the Irish return veterans at kicker, punter and holder, while breaking in a new long snapper.
- Justin Yoon has been the kicker since stepping on campus. He had his first four-for-four FG performance against Georgia this season and owns a career long of 52 yards.
- Tyler Newsome is in his third year as the Irish punter. He ranks 20th in the nation in punting with an average kick of 44.3 yards.
- Senior QB Montgomery VanGorder continues as the team's holder.
- The Irish welcome a new long snapper to the mix this season, as John Shannon has made his debut at the position after not playing as a freshman.

**FRESH LOOK FOR STAFF**

- The Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly welcomes six new staff members to the fold in 2017.
- The group includes new coordinators for all three phases (OC Chip Long, DC Mike Elko and ST Brian Polian), with new position group coaches for the wide receivers (Del Alexander), quarterbacks (Tom Rees) and linebackers (Clark Lea).
- As part of the staff changes, Mike Elston has shifted to coaching the defensive line while also being promoted to assistant head coach.
- Polian has taken over the role of recruiting coordinator in addition to his special teams responsibilities.
- Holdovers on Kelly's staff include Elston, running backs coach Autry Denson, offensive line coach Harry Hiestand and the Pat and Jana Eilers Family Defensive Backs Coach, Todd Lyght.
- With the addition of Rees, Kelly's staff now includes three former Notre Dame football players, as he joins Denson and Lyght.

**ON THIS DATE**

- Notre Dame has posted an all-time record of 11-4-1 on Nov. 11, with a 4-2-1 mark on the road.
- The Irish have won eight straight on this date, going back to a 1950 victory over Pittsburgh. The winning streak on Nov. 11 also includes wins over the Panthers in '61 and '71, before wins over Air Force (1972), Tennessee (1978), SMU (1989), Boston College (2000) and Air Force again in 2006, the most recent Nov. 11 outing. The Irish have been ranked in the last six games of the winning streak.
- The 2006 season saw the ninth-ranked Irish leave Colorado Springs with a 39-17 victory. The Irish scored less than a minute in to the game when Brady Quinn hit Jeff Samardzija for a 51-yard TD. Quinn added TD passes to John Carlson and Rhema McKnight in the first quarter as the Irish jumped out to a 20-3 lead at the end of one. Quinn finished 14-19 for 207 yards and four TDs, while Darius Walker ran for 153 yards on 15 carries and a TD.
- In 2000, the Irish hosted Boston College in the home finale. Tony Fisher ran for 196 yards and two TDs as the No. 11 Irish downed the Eagles, 28-16, en route to a Fiesta Bowl berth. As a team, Bob Davie's squad ran for 380 yards. The scoring included a five-yard TD run by kicker Nick Setta on fake field goal.
- Saturday's contest at Miami will mark the highest ranking for the Irish on a Nov. 11 game since 1989 when Lou Holtz's top-ranked team sprinted past SMU, 59-6.
- As has been the case for several contests this season, Notre Dame has gone on to a major bowl game in every season that has seen the Irish play on Nov. 11 (since resuming postseason play in 1969).

**THE MIAMI SERIES**

- Saturday will be the 27th meeting between Notre Dame and Miami, with the Irish holding an 18-7-1 edge in the series. The teams have split 13 games at Miami, with one tie and six wins apiece.
- The first five meetings all came in South Florida, with the Irish winning three to one for Miami and one tie.
- The Irish and Hurricanes met almost annually from 1971-1990 (1986 was the only exception). Notre Dame won 10 straight from 1971-80, including a 40-15 victory in Tokyo, Japan, in 1979.
- Miami scored its first win since 1960 via a 37-15 win to cap the 1981 season and the Hurricanes won six of the next eight. The lone exception was a 31-30 Irish win at Notre Dame Stadium on Oct. 15, 1988, en route to a national title for Lou Holtz's squad.
- The Hurricanes won, 27-10, at the Orange Bowl in 1989, ending Notre Dame's 23-game winning streak. That marks Miami's last win in the series.
- The teams did not meet again until Dec. 31, 2010, when the Irish took a 33-17 victory at the Sun Bowl. The Irish jumped out to a 30-3 lead by the end of the third quarter, keyed by two first-quarter TD passes from Tommy Rees to Michael Floyd. Notre Dame's defense forced Miami into four interceptions, three by Harrison Smith, in the dominating win.
- It was all Irish in the next meeting, as well, when RBs Cierre Wood and George Atkinson III both eclipsed 100 yards in a 41-3 Shamrock Series victory at Chicago's Soldier Field. The win moved the Irish to 5-0 en route to a berth in the national title game.
- Last season at Notre Dame Stadium is still the most recent loss for Miami, as the Irish won 30-27. Justin Yoon's 23-yard field goal with 30 seconds left provided the deciding score after Josh Adams broke a 41-yard TD run to tie the game with less than six minutes to play. Adams finished with 94 rushing yards, while Equanimeous St. Brown was the top target for QB DeShone Kizer with six catches for 72 yards.
- Irish RB coach Autry Denson played in what is now Hard Rock Stadium for the Miami Dolphins from 1999-2000.
