NOTRE DAME-TOLEDO HISTORY

- Notre Dame leads the all-time series, 4-2, and has won each of the last three meetings with Toledo. This game completes the third home-and-home series between the foes while Notre Dame and Toledo were also paired in the 1989 WNIT.
- Last year's contest saw a diverse scoring ledger for the Irish in a 74-39 win on Nov. 18 at Purcell Pavilion. Kathryn Westbeld led the way with 13 points followed by Madison Cable (11) and Lindsay Allen (10). Allen also chipped in nine assists to narrowly miss a double-double. No Rockets scored in double-figures.
- In addition to facing the Rockets, the Irish have played another pair of games in the Glass City, competing there in the first and second rounds of the 2014 NCAA Championship. The Irish defeated Robert Morris, 93-42, and Arizona State, 84-67, at Savage Arena en route to the national championship game.

CURRENT ROAD RUN

- Notre Dame has won each of its last 12 road games since a Dec. 5, 2015, loss at UConn.
- The streak is the third-longest active run in the nation. UConn has presently won 28 consecutive road games and Louisville has won 12 in a row away from the KFC Yum! Center.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN AND AGAIN

- Notre Dame is embarking on the second stop of a six-game road trip which is also taking Notre Dame to DePaul (Dec. 10), Michigan State (Dec. 20), Chattanooga (Dec. 27), NC State (Dec. 29) and Georgia Tech (Jan. 2) before the Irish once again play at home at Purcell Pavilion.
- It is the longest true road game string in school history. The previous record was five consecutive road games from Dec. 30, 1983, to Jan. 15, 1984, as the Irish traversed the U.S. going to Boston College, East Carolina, Xavier, Louisiana Tech and SMU.
- Notre Dame has played four straight road games several times in the **Muffet McGraw** era, most recently a run from Dec. 28, 2008, to Jan. 6, 2009, with the Irish sweeping four straight contests at Charlotte, Vanderbilt, Seton Hall and DePaul.
- Oddly, Notre Dame had to wait significantly to pass its first true road test. The Irish were one of the final 27 teams nationally to play a true road game in 2016-17, not breaking out their blue uniforms until a Nov. 30 contest at lowa in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

IRISH USED TO LEADING, EXCEPT FOR UCONN

- On the season to date, Notre Dame has played 400 minutes of basketball, led for 351:17, been tied for 13:08 and trailed for 35:35 all but 32 seconds of that coming against UConn on Dec. 7.
- The Irish trailed Louisiana-Lafayette, 3-2, for seven seconds on Nov. 22, faced a 7-5 deficit against TCU for 11 seconds on Nov. 26 and trailed DePaul, 2-0, for 14 seconds on Dec. 10. In the first two instances, **Marina Mabrey** hit the shot which gave the Irish back the lead mere seconds after falling behind. A pair of **Brianna Turner** free throws knotted the score against the Blue Demons.
- Connecticut was the first team to prove capable of cracking through this Irish advantage. UConn led for 35:03 of the contest at Purcell Pavilion with 2:11 worth of tied game and 2:46 of Notre Dame lead time.

GETTING A LEAD AND KEEPING IT

- The Irish are tough to beat once they gain an advantage in a contest and the Dec. 10 DePaul game saw a milestone in this regards. The contest marked the 150th consecutive win for the Irish when Notre Dame led at halftime.
- The last time the Irish led a game after 20 minutes but did not win the contest came on Feb. 12, 2012, when Notre Dame led West Virginia 33-30 at intermission but would go on to lose to the Mountaineers, 65-63.
- This trend is not a new one for the Irish. Notre Dame is 386-19 (.953) since 2000-01 when leading at the half.

MANY HAPPY HOMECOMINGS FOR IRISH

- Notre Dame has one native Ohioan on its roster in Kettering's **Kathryn Westbeld**.
- The Irish have generally enjoyed Homecoming games of late. The last time a Notre Dame player from outside of Indiana did not win a game played in her home state came on Feb. 28, 2011, when the Irish fell to No. 12 DePaul in Chicago, Illinois, home state of **Devereaux Peters** (Chicago) and **Kaila Turner** (Joliet).
- Twice this season, Notre Dame players have won games, not only in their home states, but their hometown regions. **Brianna Turner** (Pearland, Texas) saw the Irish beat Louisiana-Lafayette in Houston while **Diamond Thompson** (Wheaton, Ill.) saw Notre Dame down DePaul in Chicago.

SOMEBODY'S "O" MUST GO

- As a curious function of opening the season with the 16team bracketed Preseason WNIT, along with winning each contest itself, each of Notre Dame's first six games this year saw a matchup of undefeated teams.
- UConn was the seventh undefeated team the Irish faced in the first nine games this season all of which saw Notre Dame come into the contest undefeated as well.
- Notre Dame opened 2016-17 by facing six similarly undefeated schools in Central Michigan (0-0), Fordham (1-0), Green Bay (2-0), Washington (3-0), Louisiana-Lafayette (1-0) and TCU (4-0), defeating each of them. The Irish fell to 7-0 IIConn
- •The Nov. 30 game at then-5-2 lowa in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge was the first for the Irish this season against a team which had previously lost a game.
- With the addition of 8-1 Toledo, Notre Dame has faced eight teams with one loss or fewer in its first 11 games this year.

CHECKING THE NCAA LEADERS

- The season is young, but several of Notre Dame's top players have ascended to spots among the best in the country already in 2016-17.
- · NCAA leaders below are from the Thursday, Dec. 15 update.
- Some team categories where the Irish collectively excel and rank in the top 15 include rebounding margin (9th at +12.7), field goal percentage (10th at 48.5), scoring margin (12th at +25.7), assists (13th at 187), assists per game (13th at 18.7) and 3-point percentage (13th at 39.6).
- Two-time Nancy Lieberman Award finalist **Lindsay Allen** has made a quick claim to her status as the country's top point guard, not only in how she keeps the Irish under control, but also for her passing ability. Allen is sixth nationally with 71 assists and 10th with 7.1 assists per game. Allen is also fifth with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 4.18. She leads the ACC in the latter two categories as well.

- Allen's 630 career assists rank second among active players behind only Northwestern's Ashley Deary who has 653.
- Allen is also 48th nationally in steals (25) and 68th in steals per game (2.50).
- Arike Ogunbowale has already claimed an espnW National Player of the Week honor and an ACC Player of the Week accolade. Her 3-point shooting, instrumental to each award, ranks as the country's best. Ogunbowale entered the Valparaiso game tied for first nationally with a 60.9% shooting percentage from downtown. Unfortunately, she has no longer taken the minimum number of shots to qualify. She does stand 41st nationally with 66 field goals made and 66th with 166 total points.
- **Brianna Turner** has shot the ball well this year and stands 48th nationally with her field goal percentage of 55.4%. Her four double-doubles tie for 34th in the country.

IVEY JOINS RING OF HONOR

- Prior to the Valparaiso game on Dec. 4, **Niele Ivey** became the third inductee into the Ring of Honor (joining **Ruth Riley** and **Skylar Diggins**) and the first of two this season as **Beth (Morgan) Cunningham** will join the ranks on Jan. 29 when the Irish play host to Virginia.
- Ivey has made immense contributions to the program both as a player and coach. Along with Karen and Kevin Keyes Family Head Women's Basketball Coach **Muffet McGraw** and associate head coach **Carol Owens**, Ivey is one of three connections to all seven Irish Final Four appearances.
- Ivey co-captained the 2001 national championship team along with Riley and earned All-America accolades that season. Ivey was a finalist for the 2001 Nancy Lieberman Award as the country's best point guard and claimed the 2001 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Award for the nation's best player 5-foot-8 or under. Ivey was a three-time All-BIG EAST pick who would go on to play in the WNBA for four years.
- The 2016 WBCA assistant coach of the year, Ivey has helped mentor some of the nation's top backcourts at Notre Dame, led by **Skylar Diggins**, **Jewell Loyd** and **Lindsay Allen**.

ANOTHER NICE NOVEMBER FOR NOTRE DAME

- Notre Dame went a perfect 7-0 in November, continuing a trend of hot starts for the Irish. The Irish have won 32 consecutive games in the month of November, running back to a Nov. 20, 2011, loss at No. 1 Baylor. In the 30 years under **Muffet McGraw**, Notre Dame is 108-20 (.844) in November, including a 64-4 (.941) mark at home.
- Highlights from this season's opening month include winning four games in nine days to claim the Preseason WNIT championship, defeating No. 17 Washington in the title game. **Arike Ogunbowale** earned tournament MVP honors while **Lindsay Allen** joined her on the all-tournament squad. The Irish went out of their way to create a Shamrock Series-style Homecoming game for Houston-area native **Brianna Turner**, defeating Louisiana-Lafayette in a unique contest that was played on two different courts. Notre Dame capped the month with a quality win over lowa at Carver-Hawkeye Arena in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

REMEMBERED FOR CENTURIES

- Notre Dame has not only hit the century mark twice thus far in 2016-17, but the Irish have twice tallied at least 107.
- The Irish beat Central Michigan, 107-57, on Nov. 11 and downed Valparaiso, 114-54, on Dec. 4.
- The last time Notre Dame twice scored at least 107 points in a season came in 2011-12 when the Irish beat Mercer, 128-42, and Pittsburgh, 120-44.
- The 114 points scored against Valparaiso ties for the eighthhighest scoring output in the nation this year. Baylor has the high (as of Dec. 16) from their 140-32 win over Winthrop on Dec. 15. Notre Dame is tied with Northern Illinois' 114-104 20T win over Milwaukee on Nov. 16.

BASKETBALL U?

- Notre Dame was the last school in the nation whose women's and men's basketball programs were both undefeated.
- Curiously, both teams were finally handed their first losses by the top-ranked school and defending national champion from their respective genders.
- The Irish women's team stood at 8-0 before falling to No. 1 UConn on Dec. 7. Notre Dame's men's team was 9-0 before losing to No. 1 Villanova on Dec. 10 in Newark, New Jersey.
- The dual dominance was best displayed on Dec. 4 as the teams combined to sweep a home doubleheader by a 114-point margin. Notre Dame's women's team began the twin-bill with a 114-54 win over Valparaiso while the Irish men provided a 107-53 victory over North Carolina A&T in the nightcap.

MATCHING MILLENNIAL MILESTONES

- Less than two minutes into the lowa game on Nov. 30, **Brianna Turner** became the 36th player in Irish lore to crack the 1,000 career point plateau when **Marina Mabrey** found her and lobbed a pass over the arms of a defender in the paint.
- **Lindsay Allen** had previously hit the 1,000-point marker this season during the game on Nov. 17 against Green Bay.
- Notre Dame last had two players reach the 1,000 career point plateau in the same season in 2013 when **Kayla Mc-Bride** and **Natalie Achonwa** each hit the millennial mark. Seven other Irish teams also saw two players hit the milestone but the school record of three was set back in 1985 (**Trena Keys, Mary Beth Schueth** and **Carrie Bates**).
- Notre Dame has seen at least one player reach 1,000 career points in eight of the last nine years with the exception coming in 2014-15.

IRISH START 8-0

- Notre Dame opened the season on a eight-game winning streak before falling to No. 1 UConn on Dec. 7. It marked the third time in four years in which the Irish had started at least 8-0.
- The 2014-15 Irish stood at 8-0 before losing to UConn on Dec. 6, and the 2013-14 Irish were 37-0 before losing to UConn in the national championship game. The lone exception is the 2015-16 Irish which started the season only 7-0 before losing at UConn.

TURNER NAMED ACC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- For **Brianna Turner**, two double-doubles against two ranked foes added up to one nice award as the junior forward was named the ACC's Player of the Week on Dec. 12.
- Facing No. 1 UConn on Dec. 7, Turner scored 16 points and grabbed 12 rebounds -- eight of them off of the offensive glass. Three nights later, on the road at No. 16 DePaul, Turner scored 14 points and added 11 rebounds. She blocked a pair of shots in each contest. Turner shot an even 50% for the week (11-for-22) from the floor and connected on eight of her nine free throw attempts.
- A preseason All-American, Turner has four double-doubles on the season including one in each of Notre Dame's three games this year against ranked opponents. In addition to her strong showings against both UConn and DePaul, Turner scored 10 points and added 12 rebounds in Notre Dame's win over No. 17 Washington in the championship game of the Preseason WNIT on Nov. 20.

 Her performance against UConn marked the first time the Huskies had allowed a double-double with at least 12 points and rebounds in nearly a year, dating back to when USF's Courtney Williams scored 26 and grabbed 13 boards on Jan. 11.

NAISMITH AND WADE LISTS INCLUDE IRISH

- Three of Notre Dame's finest **Lindsay Allen, Arike Ogunbowale** and **Brianna Turner** were named last week to the watch lists for the Naismith Trophy and/or Wade Trophy, presented annually by the Atlanta Tipoff Club and WBCA, respectively, to the top women's collegiate player in the country.
- Twice a finalist for the Nancy Lieberman Award for the nation's top point guard, Allen has not missed a beat her senior season, ranking fourth nationally with 68 assists and fifth in the country with 7.6 per game. Her 4.53 assist-to-turnover ratio stands sixth in the nation. The 35th member of Notre Dame's 1,000-career point club, joining the ranks during a Nov. 17 win over Green Bay, Allen is also 38th nationally in steals after matching her career high with five on Nov. 30 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge victory on the road at lowa.
- Ogunbowale was named to the ACC's all-freshman team a year ago and has already begun to take steps forward from there through seven games in 2016-17. She has named the Preseason WNIT's tournament MVP, the espnW National Player of the Week (Nov. 21) and the ACC's Player of the Week (Nov. 14) already this young season. Ogunbowale leads the Irish averaging 17.5 points per game, including a career-high 30 on opening night against preseason MAC favorite Central Michigan. Helping her to this lofty scoring total is improved range from long range.
- Turner also joined the 1,000-career point club, hitting the plateau on Nov. 30 at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. She is the lone Notre Dame player to score in double figures for each of the team's nine games in 2016-17 and currently possesses a run of 27 consecutive double-figure games. She has done this while facing some tough interior defenses, making the most of her offensive opportunities to stand 43rd nationally in field goal percentage at 55.9%. Among her highlight games of the young campaign was a double-double performance in Notre Dame's win over No. 17 Washington in the championship game of the Preseason WNIT and another double-double against No. 1 UConn.
- The lone Naismith Trophy recipient in Notre Dame history is Ruth Riley (2001) while the Irish are looking for their first Wade Trophy recipient.

OH GOODNESS, OGUNBOWALE!

- The first round of the Preseason WNIT proved to be a banner night for sophomore **Arike Ogunbowale** who obliterated her previous career high of 21 by scoring 30 points in Notre Dame's Nov. 11 win over Central Michigan.
- Ogunbowale capped her four-game Preseason WNIT run by scoring 17 points while adding five rebounds, four steals and three assists in Notre Dame's win over No. 17 Washington.
- Her efforts over the event earned her both tournament MVP honors and espnW's National Player of the Week accolade
- For her performance against the Chippewas, Ogunbowale was named the ACC's Player of the Week on Nov. 14.

- Ogunbowale hit all five of her 3-point attempts against CMU, a feat that had not been seen for the Irish in 16 years. Ogunbowale provided just the third game in Irish lore where a player took at least five 3-pointers and did not miss one. **Alicia Ratay** sank all seven of her 3-point shots at Rutgers on Feb. 19, 2000, while **Sheila McMillen** went a perfect five-for-five behind the arc against UConn on Dec. 8, 1998.
- Her 12-of-13 from the floor narrowly missed becoming a school record for field goal percentage. **Karen Robinson** set that mark by going 12-for-12 at St. Louis on Jan. 14, 1989. It also marked the first time a Notre Dame player had hit the 30-point mark since **Jewell Loyd** tallied 31 at Georgia Tech on Feb. 19, 2015.
- Ogunbowale also had two steals, two assists and three rebounds on the night.

- Freshman **Jackie Young** collected the first of what could be many honors over the potential Irish career on Dec. 5 when she was named the ACC's Rookie of the Week.
- Young had a break-through game in the Dec. 4, 114-54, win over Valparaiso, scoring 20 points the high-water mark of her young Irish career. Young connected on eight of her nine shots in the contest and went 3-of-4 from 3-point range. She also had a career-high six steals against the Crusaders to go with five rebounds and three assists. Earlier in the week, on Nov. 30, Young tallied five points and grabbed three rebounds as the Irish claimed a 73-58 win at lowa on Nov. 30 during the ACC/Big Ten Challenge.

McGRAW RADIO SHOW DEBUTS JAN. 9

- For the first time, **Muffet McGraw** will have her own local radio show as the Muffet McGraw Show Presented by Tire-Rack.com debuts Jan. 9 at O'Rourke's Public House, conveniently located in Eddy Street Commons, across the street from Notre Dame's campus.
- •The hour-long show, which begins at 6 p.m., will be hosted by **Bob Nagle**, now in his 12th year as the radio voice of the Irish women's basketball team. It will be broadcast live locally on 92.1 Pulse FM and also be available over the internet at WatchND.tv. The shows will also be archived as Notre Dame Athletics Podcasts which are presented by Nissan.
- Five shows, all on Monday nights, are planned for the 2016-17 season with the dates being Jan. 9, Jan. 23, Feb. 13, Feb. 20 and Feb. 27.

DEFEAT OF DePAUL GETS IRISH BACK ON TRACK

- Facing its most historically-competitive rival in its illustrious history, Notre Dame improved to 9-1 on the year by downing No. 16 DePaul, 75-61, on Dec. 10 at a sold out McGrath-Phillips Arena in Chicago.
- Coming to a cozy venue where the Irish and Blue Demons regularly battle to the wire, Notre Dame used a 14-4 run over the third quarter's final 4:32 to pull away with a victory over a DePaul side whose only previous losses had come against teams ranked in the top five (UConn and Baylor).
- Lindsay Allen tied her career high with nine rebounds, falling one short of her first career double-double after adding 14 points. **Brianna Turner** recorded her fourth double-double of the year three of them coming against ranked teams with her 14 points and 11 rebounds.
- Arike Ogunbowale led all Notre Dame scorers with 17 points, 13 of them coming in a first quarter where the Irish unleashed some pent up fury over Wednesday's loss to No. 1 UConn. Mychal Johnson added a season-high 10 points from the bench. Notre Dame held a 48-35 rebounding margin and, in a tightly-officiated game, converted on 17 of its 22 free throws, including 5-of-6 from Marina Mabrey and 6-of-7 from Turner.
- The Irish had lost their last game before DePaul (Dec. 7 vs. No. 1 UConn). In beating DePaul, Notre Dame avoided losing consecutive contests since November 18 and 21, 2010, when the Irish fell to No. 15 UCLA in double overtime and then No. 9 Kentucky.

IRISH PICK UP FIRST LOSS AT HANDS OF HUSKIES

- In a matchup between the No. 1 team in the Associated Press poll and the No. 1 team in the WBCA coaches poll, the writers were the group who picked the winner of Dec. 7's contest as AP No. 1 UConn defeated coaches No. 1 Notre Dame, 72-61, at a sold out Joyce Center.
- Brianna Turner recorded a double-double with 16 points and 12 rebounds while Lindsay Allen scored 11 and added eight assists for the Irish.
- Turner scored the game's opening hoop 17 seconds into play but the Huskies reeled off the game's next 11 points, putting the Irish into a significant deficit for the first time this year. UConn would eventually run its lead to 11 points at 25-11 early in the second quarter. The Irish charged forth from there, putting together a 20-5 run over the next eight minutes dominating the contest's second quarter. The team went to the locker room at halftime tied at 34.
- A fairly-evenly played third quarter saw the score tied at 42-42 with 1:56 to play in the stanza before the Huskies went on an 8-1 run to close out the frame with a sevenpoint edge. The fourth quarter would see UConn extend its lead to 15 before claiming an 11-point win.

IRISH CRUISE PAST VALPARAISO

- On Dec. 4, an emotional pre-game Ring of Honor induction for Niele Ivey ignited the Irish offense in an explosive 114-54 victory over Valparaiso on Sunday.
- Notre Dame used a school-record tying 72-point offensive outburst in the first half to defeat the Crusaders.
- Notre Dame opened the game with a 26-0 run, capped off by **Mychal Johnson**'s three-pointer at the 3:30 mark of the first quarter. The 26 straight points marked the most by an Irish team since a school-record 36-0 run versus Southeast Missouri State on Jan. 2, 2011.

- The Irish never cooled off, scoring a school-record-tying 72 first-half points (also versus Mercer on Dec. 30, 2011) and leading the Crusaders, 72-23, at halftime.
- Six Notre Dame players finished in double-figures for the first time in just eight days, when the Irish defeated TCU. **Jackie Young** (20), **Arike Ogunbowale** (18), **Marina Mabrey** (16), **Erin Boley** (15), **Brianna Turner** (13), and **Kathryn Westbeld** (10) each scored at least 10 points.
- Notre Dame shot 64.0 percent in the game, breaking the 60.0-percent mark for the second time this season. The 114 total points are the most by an Irish scoring 120 against Pittsburgh on January 17, 2012 and the third-most for a game in school history.

IRISH PASS FIRST ROAD TEST AT IOWA

- Notre Dame relied on its veteran leadership to guide it to a 73-58 victory at lowa on Nov. 30 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Fighting Irish remained unbeaten at 7-0, following a competitive affair in their first road game of the season at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- Sophomore **Marina Mabrey** opened the game with the hot hand as she netted seven points within the first three minutes of play. Mabrey, who scored 10 of Notre Dame's first 19 points versus TCU, accounted for nine of the team's first 15 points against the Hawkeyes.
- Just minutes into the contest, senior **Brianna Turner** scored her 1,000th career point and ultimately finished in double-figures for the seventh time this season.
- Turner was not the only player to score 10-plus points for the Irish. Sophomore **Arike Ogunbowale** had a relatively quiet night, adding 16 points and two rebounds. Senior **Lindsay Allen**, who collected seven first-half assists, took control of the basket late in the third quarter to extend Notre Dame's lead and secure the victory on the road. Allen finished with 11 points, eight assists and six rebounds.

IRISH START GAME AND SEASON HOT

- Notre Dame hoped to get a fast start to its season on opening night against Central Michigan. Thanks to a fast start to the game, scoring each of the contest's first 15 points, the Irish got the fast start they hoped for, commencing their year with a 107-47 win over the Chippewas on Nov. 11.
- In scoring 107 points, the Irish tied the most points scored in a season opener since beating Liberty 113-35 on Nov. 24, 1989, on a neutral floor in Orlando, Florida. The Irish also scored 107 points on Nov. 26, 2002, opening that season with a 107-65 win over Cleveland State. The 60-point margin of victory also makes it the most lopsided season-opening game since that 78-point win over the Lady Flames in 1989.
- Notre Dame has enjoyed great historical success in both its home openers and also specifically when opening a season at home.
- The Irish have won now each of their last 22 home openers, dating back to an 87-83 loss to No. 13 Purdue on Nov. 30, 1994.
- The Irish have won each of the last 17 games when its home opener was also its season opener, not losing since an 86-70 defeat to No. 3 Penn State on Nov. 22, 1991.
- Regardless of venue, Notre Dame has not lost a season opener in its last 22 seasons, stretching back to a loss at No. 25 Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1994.

IRISH HELD UNANIMOUS POLE POSITION

- Notre Dame received the No. 1 spot in the preseason Associated Press poll. Notre Dame stood at No. 2 in the preseason coaches poll but leapt up to No. 1 on Nov. 15, surpassing defending national champion Connecticut.
- Despite being undefeated, the Irish slipped back to No. 2 in the AP poll on Dec. 5.
- This year marked Notre Dame's first time holding the AP's top spot entering a season.
- The only other time the Irish sat atop the AP poll came during the 2001 season when Notre Dame earned the No. 1 ranking for a total of five weeks four straight from Jan. 22 to Feb. 12, regaining it on March 5.
- Before this season, Notre Dame's last game as the No. 1-ranked team in the country was a 78-76 loss to No. 2 UConn, in the BIG EAST final on March 6, 2001, at Gampel Pavilion. The Irish, carrying the No. 2 ranking, avenged that defeat to the Huskies by beating them in the NCAA Final Four en route to claiming the national championship two days later with a win over Purdue.
- The Irish have made a habit of standing among the nation's elite in the AP poll. This week, Notre Dame is in the top 10 for the 209th time, surpassing North Carolina's 204 for the 10th-most AP top 10 appearances all-time. No. 3 Baylor is ninth at 214 (and counting).
- Notre Dame has been ranked in the top 10 for each of the last 111 polls since a No. 11 ranking on Jan. 17, 2011.

TURNER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

- No stranger to postseason accolades, **Brianna Turner** began her junior year at Notre Dame with a projection to finish the 2017 season among the country's elite as well. Turner was one of five players named on Nov. 3 to the Associated Press' Preseason All-America team.
- Turner is joined on the preseason All-America squad by Nina Davis of Baylor, Kelsey Mitchell of Ohio State, Kelsey Plum of Washington and A'ja Wilson of South Carolina.
- The 2016 ACC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year, Turner has been named to the postseason All-America teams following each of her first two seasons with the Irish. She averaged 14.6 points per game and 7.3 rebounds per game last season as she helped lead the Irish to a 33-2 record and the program's third consecutive dual ACC regular season and tournament championships. She is the only Division I player to rank in the top 10 in the nation for field goal percentage in each of the last two years. The Pearland, Texas native led the ACC in both field goal percentage (59.3) and blocks per game (3.03) in 2015-16.

ALLEN RETURNS TO LIEBERMAN AWARD WATCH LIST

- Perhaps the top point guard in the nation as she entered her senior year at Notre Dame, **Lindsay Allen** took the first step towards receiving formal recognition as such by the end of the year as she was one of 20 players named on Oct. 24 to the watch list for the Nancy Lieberman Award.
- In both 2015 and 2016, Allen was a finalist for the accolade, presented annually by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame to the country's best point guard. Allen will have ample opportunity to stake a claim to the honor this winter as she goes head-to-head against five other watch list members during the regular season alone (Connecticut's Kia Nurse, DePaul's Jessica January, Duke's Lexie Brown, Miami's Adrienne Motley and Syracuse's Alexis Peterson). The Irish could also face Washington and Kelsey Plum depending on how the Preseason WNIT's 16-team bracket progresses.
- Allen would become the second Irish recipient of the Award, joining **Skylar Diggins** who claimed the honor in both 2012 and 2013.
- Allen claimed honorable mention All-America honors in 2015-16 after dishing out 5.8 assists per game with a 2.52 assist/turnover ratio. Allen led the ACC in assists for the second straight season and, in 2016, was one of four players in Power Five conferences to rank in the top 20 nationally for both assists and assist/turnover ratio. Allen is second among all active players nationally in career assists (559) and fourth in career assists per game (4.99).
- Allen boasts a school-record 122 consecutive starts, having yet to miss one in her Irish career. Notre Dame is 115-7 in those 122 games. She has served as a team captain for each of the past three seasons and has helped guide the Irish three ACC regular season titles, three ACC Tournament championships and a pair of NCAA Final Four appearances.

McGRAW GETS LEGENDS OF COACHING HONOR

- Now in her 30th year at Notre Dame and 35th as a collegiate head coach, **Muffet McGraw**'s legacy of success on the court is visible in the plethora of banners hanging above the Purcell Pavilion court. Her legacy of success off the court is plainly visible in the scores of Irish women's basketball alumni who have been successful in their professions and life.
- This dual-success has been recognized by the John R. Wooden Award Committee which on Oct. 11 announced McGraw as its 2017 Legends of Coaching Award recipient.
- The lifetime achievement award is presented to a singular college basketball coach who exemplifies Wooden's high standards of coaching success and personal achievement. The accolade is just the latest national honor for McGraw the only three-time consensus national coach of the year.
- An enshrine in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and a 2016 finalist for induction in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, McGraw is the third woman to receive the Legends of Coaching Award an accolade first bestowed in 1999 upon Dean Smith of North Carolina. Its 18th recipient, McGraw joins Tennessee's Pat Summitt and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer as the lone female honorees.
- The winningest single-sport coach in Notre Dame history with 740 victories for the Irish, McGraw has guided Notre Dame to 23 NCAA Championship appearances, seven Final Fours (including five in a row from 2011-15) and the 2001 national championship. McGraw is one of just five coaches of any gender with 800 career wins, seven Final Fours and five appearances in the NCAA championship game, joining Smith, Duke's Mike Krzyzewski, Summitt and UConn's Geno Auriemma.

IRISH WELCOME TWO CLASS OF 2021 SIGNEES

- Notre Dame received two National Letters of Intent from the Class of 2021 on Nov. 9 as forward **Danielle Patterson** and center **Mikayla Vaughn** signed on to continue their academic and athletic careers with the Irish.
- Standing at 6-foot-2, Patterson (Brooklyn, New York/The Mary Louis Academy) is the No. 5-ranked small forward in the country, according to espnW/HoopGurlz reporter Dan Olson.
- A five-star recruit, Patterson averaged 22 points, 10 rebounds, two steals and two assists as a junior. She led The Mary Louis Academy to an 18-8 record and an appearance in the Brooklyn/Queens semifinals in 2016. She participated in the U17 Team USA Trials as a junior and was selected to the 2016 New York City Pre-Season Top 10 list prior to this season.
- Throughout high school, Patterson guided two AAU squads to championships, including the Philadelphia Belles to the 15U Boo Williams Championship and the New Jersey Sparks to the 2015 Peach State Championship.
- Vaughn, a four-star recruit, averaged 15 points, 10 rebounds and two blocks per game as a junior at Friends' Central School, before transferring to Paul VI Catholic High School (Fairfax, Virginia) for her senior season. She was named co-captain of the team, guiding it to the league championship in back-to-back seasons.
- Vaughn, 6-foot-3, was named 2016 first-team Class A all-state in Pennsylvania, following the school's run to the PAISSA quarterfinals her junior year. She has thrice received All-Mainline first-team honors.
- Vaughn, like Patterson, was a member of the Philadelphia Belles. She played lacrosse her freshman year and contributed to the team's PAISSA state championship.
