FIRST-AND-10 -

- Fresh off a bye week, Michigan State (2-0) will play host to Notre Dame (2-1) in Spartan Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 23 at 8 p.m. in the battle for the Megaphone Trophy. The game will be televised nationally on FOX. The Spartans are 2-0 for the third consecutive year after opening the season with home wins over Bowling Green (35-10) and Western Michigan (28-14). The Fighting Irish improved to 2-1 with a 49-20 victory at Boston College last Saturday.
- Saturday's game marks the 79th meeting between Michigan State and Notre Dame. The Irish lead the all-time series 48-29-1, including a 19-15-1 record in games played in East Lansing. The Spartans have won 11 of the last 18 meetings in the series. Eleven of the last 15 games in the series have been decided by one score or less. MSU head coach Mark Dantonio is 4-4 against Notre Dame, including a 2-1 mark in Spartan Stadium. The Spartans won at Notre Dame last season, 36-28.
- · Former Michigan State All-American wide receiver Kirk Gibson has been named honorary captain for the Notre Dame game. Gibson will have his name and number (No. 23) added to the Spartan Stadium "Ring of Fame" during a ceremony on Saturday night. Gibson is MSU's latest inductee into the College Football Hall of Fame and will be officially enshrined into the hall on Dec. 5 in New York City. The National Football Foundation will also be on hand for its on-campus salute.
- Michigan State ranks second among opponents in all-time victories (29) over Notre Dame. Only USC (37) has posted more wins over the Irish than the Spartans.
- · Michigan State's defense has not allowed an offensive touchdown through the first two games of the season. MSU ranks among the Big Ten leaders in several defensive categories, including total defense (first at 203.5 ypg.), third-down percentage defense (first at .107), passing defense (first at 112.0 ypg.), pass efficiency defense (first with 63.48 rating), first downs defense (first with 20), red-zone defense (second at .500), scoring defense (fourth at 12.0 ppg.) and rushing defense (fourth at 91.5 ypg.). The Spartans also lead the FBS in third-down defense (.107) and rank second in the nation in pass efficiency defense (63.48) and third in total defense (203.5 ypg.).

- Last fall marked the 50th anniversary of the famous "Game of the Century" 10-10 tie between No. 1 Notre Dame and No. 2 Michigan State on Nov. 19, 1966, in Spartan Stadium. Thirty-one players from that game went on to play in the NFL, including 10 first-round draft picks. Several members from both of those teams will have a reunion this weekend in East Lansing.
- The Michigan State-Notre Dame series began 120 years ago in 1897, making it one of the 27 oldest rivalries in college football. It also ranks as one of only three rivalries among those 27 - joining Army-Navy and Auburn-Georgia Tech – that does not involve either intrastate or current conference rivals.
- Michigan State is in the midst of its second-winningest decade in school history. The Spartans are 70-25 (.737) since 2010 and during that span, MSU has claimed three Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015) and three Big Ten Division titles (2011, 2013, 2015). In addition, the Spartans recorded a school-record four consecutive bowl victories (2012 Outback against No. 18 Georgia, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings against TCU, 2014 Rose Bowl Game against No. 5 Stanford, 2015 Cotton Bowl Classic against No. 4 Baylor), which also tied a Big Ten record. MSU was the only school to finish in the top-six of the national polls from 2013-15 (No. 3 in 2013, No. 5 in 2014, No. 6 in 2015).
- The 70 wins this decade are second most in the Big Ten and 12th most in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision, while the 41 wins since 2013 are tied for third in the Big Ten and tied for eighth most in the FBS. The 36 wins from 2013-15 marked the winningest three-year stretch in the history of the program. MSU's highest winning percentage by decade is currently the 1950s (.766, 70-21-1 record).
- Now in his 11th season as head coach of the Spartans, Dantonio owns a 92-42 (.687) record. Dantonio has won the most Big Ten Championships (three) and bowl games (four) of any Spartan head coach and also ranks first with nine bowl appearances. He is the only active Big Ten coach to win multiple Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015), claim a victory in the Rose Bowl (2014), and coach in the College Football Playoff (2015). The second-winningest coach in school history with 92 victories, trailing only Hall of Famer Duffy Daugherty (109), Dantonio also ranks first in program history in conference winning percentage (.654, 53-28 record, minimum 10 games), second in home wins (55) and AP Top 25 victories (17), tied for second in Big Ten wins (53) and AP Top 25 finishes (six), and fifth in overall winning percentage (.687).

A QUICK GLANCE AT NOTRE DAME (2-1) -

- The Fighting Irish bring a 2-1 record into Saturday's clash with the Spartans. Notre Dame is currently on a win-loss pattern through its first three games, beating Temple, 49-16, in the season-opener on Sept. 2, before losing to No. 15 Georgia, 20-19, on Sept. 9. In their first road game of the season, the Fighting Irish won at Boston College, 49-20, last Saturday.
- Notre Dame head coach **Brian Kelly** is in his eighth season at the helm of the Fighting Irish, posting a 61-32 record. Overall, Kelly has a 232-89-2 record in his 27th year as a collegiate head coach. Kelly has strong ties to Michigan, as he was head coach at Grand Valley State for 13 seasons from 1991-2003, posting a 118-35-2 mark there before spending three seasons at Central Michigan from 2004-06, logging a 19-16 ledger with the Chippewas. Kelly then spent three seasons at Cincinnati from 2007-09 and recorded a 34-6 mark before becoming the Fighting Irish head coach in 2010.
- Last week at Boston College, Notre Dame pulled away from a 14-10 halftime lead with 35 second-half points for a 49-20 victory. After the Eagles kicked a field goal early in the third quarter to close to 14-13, the Fighting Irish reeled off 21 unanswered points spanning the rest of the third quarter and early fourth frame to open a 35-13 advantage. Junior quarterback **Brandon Wimbush** scored four rushing TDs on the day as part of his 207 yards on 21 carries, setting a new Notre Dame record for single-game rushing yards by an ND quarterback. Fellow junior running back **Josh Adams** rushed for 229 yards on 18 carries to combine with Wimbush for the first time in the storied history of Notre Dame that two players rushed for 200 yards in a game.
- The Fighting Irish amassed 515 rushing yards on 51 carries to go with 96 passing yards for 611 yards of total offense. The Notre Dame defense yielded 400 yards of total offense by BC, with 215 yards passing and 185 rushing yards.

- For the season, Notre Dame is averaging 494.0 yards per game, while holding the opposition to 352.0 yards per game. The Fighting Irish offense averaged 330.7 ypg rushing and 163.3 ypg passing.
- Adams leads the Notre Dame rushing attack with 443 yards on 56 carries (147.7 ypg/7.9 ypc) with two TDs. Wimbush has 314 rushing yards on 49 carries (104.7 ypg/6.4 ypc) with six scores.
- Wimbush is 48-of-94 passing for 490 yards (163.3 ypg) with two TDs and two INTs.
- Junior tight end **Alize Mack** has been Wimbush's top target with nine catches for 101 yards (11.2 ypc), while Adams is second on the team in receptions with eight for 69 yards (8.6 ypc). Junior wide receiver **Equanimeous St. Brown** has seven catches for 99 yards (14.1 ypc) with one of ND's two TDs, while junior tight end Nic Weishar has the other.
- Junior linebacker **Te'von Coney** leads the Fighting Irish defense with 25 tackles, including 1.5 tackle for loss and one sack. The senior linebacker duo of **Nyles Morgan** and **Greer Martini** are close behind, as Morgan has 24 stops with three TFLs and one sack, while Martini has 22 tackles with two TFLs. Both Morgan and Martini add one forced fumble apiece. Senior linebacker **Drue Tranquill** had a team-best 3.5 TFLs and has one INT.
- Sophomore cornerback **Shaun Crawford** has two interceptions and two pass break-ups.
- Junior placekicker Justin Yoon is 15-of-15 on PATs and is 4-of-6 on field goals with a long of 42-yards.
- Junior punter **Tyler Newsome** has a 47.3 yards per punt average on 18 punts with a long of 59 yards, including five inside the 20.

MSU/NOTRE DAME CONNECTIONS -

- Notre Dame's **Brian Kelly** succeeded Michigan State's **Mark Dantonio** as head coach at Cincinnati. Dantonio (2004-06) and Kelly (2007-09) each enjoyed three-year stints with the Bearcats.
- Michigan State associate strength and conditioning coach Lorenzo Guess spent two seasons (2010-11) as an assistant director of strength and conditioning at Notre Dame while working with head coach Brian Kelly. - Notre Dame special teams coordinator Brian Polian spent the 1997 season as an offensive graduate assistant at Michigan State under former head coach Nick Saban.
- Michigan State recruiting operations coordinator Butler Benton spent 15 months as the assistant director
 of player development, engagement and academic enhancement at Notre Dame under Brian Kelly.
- Michigan State's veteran play-by-play radio announcer **George Blaha** graduated from Notre Dame in 1966 with a degree in economics. Blaha is in his 40th season as the Spartans' radio voice.

MSU/NOTRE DAME SERIES NOTES -

- Saturday's game marks the 79th meeting between Michigan State and Notre Dame. The Irish lead the all-time series 48-29-1, including a 19-15-1 record in games played in East Lansing. The Spartans have won 11 of the last 18 meetings in the series. Eleven of the last 15 games in the series have been decided by one score or less. MSU head coach **Mark Dantonio** is 4-4 against Notre Dame, including a 2-1 mark in Spartan Stadium.
- Michigan State ranks second among opponents in all-time victories (29) over Notre Dame. Only USC (37) has posted more wins over the Irish than the Spartans.
- The Spartans recorded six straight victories in Notre Dame Stadium from 1997-2007. The six-game winning streak was the longest run by an Irish opponent in the history of Notre Dame Stadium.

THE LAST MEETING -

Sept. 17, 2016, in Notre Dame, Ind. (AP): Twelfth-ranked Michigan State didn't panic when No. 18 Notre Dame scored three straight touchdowns to cut a 29-point lead to 36-28 with just over six minutes left. The Irish didn't get any closer after **DeShone Kizer** was sacked for a 5-yard loss by **Raequan Williams** on third-and-2 and Notre Dame punted with 3:37 left in the game and the Spartans (2-0) ran out the clock.

Tyler O'Connor, a fifth-year senior making his third career start, was 19 of 26 passing for 241 yards, two touchdowns and one interception on a deflected pass. **Gerald Holmes** ran for 100 yards and two touchdowns, including a 73-yard score, while **LJ Scott** had 98 yards on 22 carries. The Spartans racked up 501 yards of total offense in winning at Notre Dame for the first time since 2007.

GAME OF THE CENTURY: 50TH ANNIVERSARY -

• Last fall marked the 50th anniversary of the famous "Game of the Century" 10-10 tie between No. 1 Notre Dame and No. 2 Michigan State on Nov. 19, 1966, in Spartan Stadium. Thirty-one players from that game went on to play in the NFL, including 10 first-round draft picks. Four Michigan State players from the game were selected in the first eight picks on the 1967 NFL Draft (No. 1, Colts, DE **Bubba Smith**; No. 2, Vikings, RB **Clinton Jones**; No. 5, Oilers, LB **George Webster**; No. 8, Vikings, WR **Gene Washington**). Several members from both of those teams will have a reunion this weekend in East Lansing.

A FAMILY AFFAIR -

• Junior linebacker **Byron Bullough** has plenty of bloodlines involved in the Michigan State-Notre Dame rivalry. Byron is a third-generation Spartan, following in the footsteps of his grandfather **Hank** (guard, 1952-54) and father **Shane** (linebacker, 1983-86) who played football at Michigan State. Byron's grandfather **Jim Morse** (halfback, 1954-56) played for Coach **Terry Brennan** at Notre Dame, and his uncles **Chuck Bullough** (Michigan State, linebacker, 1988-91), **Bobby Morse** (Michigan State, running back, 1983-86) and **Jim Morse** (Notre Dame, cornerback, 1976-77) played college football. Byron's two older brothers, Max (2010-13) and Riley (203-16), were both four-year letterwinners and middle linebackers for the Spartans. In addition, Byron's mother, LeeAnn, is a Notre Dame graduate.

SPARTANS FOLLOWING BYE WEEKS UNDER DANTONIO -

• Michigan State is coming off its only bye week of the season following its Week 2 win over Western Michigan on Sept. 9. MSU is 6-4 after bye weeks under Dantonio.

POST-GAME NOTES FROM THE WESTERN MICHIGAN GAME -

- With the 28-14 victory over Western Michigan on Sept. 9, Michigan State won its 11th straight game over the Broncos . . . MSU leads the all-time series, 13-2, including a 9-0 record in Spartan Stadium.
- MSU head coach **Mark Dantonio** is 5-0 in his MSU career against WMU, and his teams have outscored the Broncos, 178-79 (average score: 36-16).

OFFENSE

- Brian Lewerke ran for a career-high 81 yards, the most by a Spartan quarterback since Drew Stanton had 83 against Purdue in Nov. 4, 2006 . . . Lewerke scored his first career rushing touchdown on a 61-yard run in the first quarter, the longest TD run by a Spartan quarterback since Charlie Baggett on Oct. 27, 1973 vs. Purdue (69 yards) . . . it tied the longest rush by a Spartan QB since Damon Dowdell also had a 61-yard run against Wisconsin on Nov. 13, 2004 . . . the last time a Spartan QB had a longer run was Bobby McAllister at Purdue (70 yards) on Nov. 5, 1988 . . . Lewerke also had a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter . . . Lewerke became the first Spartan QB to record two rushing TDs in a single game since Drew Stanton in 2006 against Eastern Michigan (Sept. 9) . . . Lewerke finished with 242 yards of total offense, as he was 13-of-21 passing for 161 yards and one touchdown.
- Michigan State rushed for 296 yards, the most by the Spartans in a single game since they ran for 330 yards at Indiana on Oct. 18, 2014.
- Felton Davis III recorded a career-high 69 receiving yards on a team-high four receptions.
- For the second consecutive game, **Darrell Stewart Jr.** led the Spartans with 159 all-purpose yards (career-high 70 rushing, 33 receiving, 51 kick return, 5 punt return).
- LJ Scott collected 111 all-purpose yards, including a team-high 86 yards on the ground . . . on fourth-and-1 on the MSU 45-yard line with 12:49 in the fourth quarter, Scott busted loose for a 44-yard run that set up the Spartans' fourth and final touchdown of the game, a 2-yard run by Scott with 10:48 left . . . Scott also caught a 15-yard TD from Lewerke in the second quarter.

DEFENSE

- Michigan State limited Western Michigan to 195 yards of total offense (116 rushing; 79 passing) . . . last week at No. 4 USC, the Broncos had 357 yards of total offense (263 rushing, 94 passing).
- MSU's defense hasn't allowed a touchdown this season . . . WMU scored touchdowns on a 67-yard fumble return by Darius Phillips and also a 100-yard kickoff return by Phillips.
- The Spartans held Western Michigan to 1-of-15 on third down and also stopped the Broncos twice on fourth down (3-of-5).



- MSU had four sacks, the most in a single game for the Spartans since Sept. 26, 2015, against Central Michigan.
- For the second consecutive game, **Joe Bachie** led the Spartans with a career-high 11 tackles.
- Josiah Scott recorded his first career interception in the first quarter.

TYSON SMITH NOMINATED FOR ORANGE BOWL COURAGE AWARD & DISNEY SPORTS SPIRIT AWARD -

- Junior cornerback **Tyson Smith**, who suffered a stroke last November and wasn't medically cleared to play football until late June, has been nominated for the Orange Bowl Courage Award and the Disney Sports Spirit Award. In his first game back, Smith returned an interception 38 yards for a touchdown in the season-opening win against Bowling Green on Sept. 2.
- Smith missed all of winter conditioning and spring practice while recovering from his stroke. He was cleared to play June 29 and reported for Michigan State's preseason camp on July 30.
- After the game, Smith told reporters: "The feeling when I stepped on the field, it was more than football, it was a blessing. I'm still me and I felt normal, but I didn't know for sure if I was normal...Everybody was behind me, but I thought it was a low chance of me coming back...It meant everything in the world (to have my teammates celebrate with me after the touchdown). Those guys were behind me when I was out. To see that they were behind me, that meant a lot."
- The Orange Bowl Courage Award honors players in college football who show great courage in the face of adversity. Michigan State's **Arthur Ray Jr.**, who battled back from cancer to see the field in 2011, won the Orange Bowl Courage Award in 2011.
- Since 1996, the Disney Sports Spirit Award has been presented annually to college football's most inspirational student-athlete, team, coach, fan or figure who has overcome extraordinary physical or emotional hardships or other challenges, while exhibiting a selfless nature and good sportsmanship. The award will be presented for the 22nd consecutive year on Dec. 7 during the ESPN live telecast of The Home Depot College Football Awards.

QUICK LOOK AT THE 2017 SCHEDULE -

- Michigan State will face nine teams on its 2017 schedule that appeared in postseason bowl games last season, including eight Big Ten opponents.
- The Spartans open the 2017 season with four consecutive home games for the first time since 2002 and for only the fifth time in school history (1918: 5 straight, 1924: 4, 1928: 5, 2002: 5; 2017: 4).
- Michigan State will play a total of seven home games in 2017, including three nonconference contests (Bowling Green, Western Michigan, Notre Dame) and four Big Ten games (Iowa, Indiana, Penn State, Maryland).
- Michigan State will host Notre Dame for the first time since 2012 on Sept. 17 in Spartan Stadium. The Spartans defeated the Fighting Irish at Notre Dame Stadium last season, 36-28. Dantonio is 4-4 in his tenure against Notre Dame, including a 2-1 record in East Lansing.
- The Spartans open Big Ten play against lowa on Sept. 30 in Spartan Stadium. MSU also hosts Indiana (Oct. 21), Penn State (Nov. 4) and Maryland (Nov. 18) in Big Ten action, while traveling to Michigan (Oct. 7), Minnesota (Oct. 14), Northwestern (Oct. 27), Ohio State (Nov. 11) and Rutgers (Nov. 25).

 freshmen in their collegiate debut under Dantonio include punter Aaron Bates in 2007 and long snapper
 Taybor Pepper in 2012.

MSU IN SEPTEMBER UNDER DANTONIO -

 Michigan State has won 13 of its last 16 as part of a 30-10 (.750) record in the ninth month of the calendar year under head coach Mark Dantonio.

ALL IN THE FAMILY -

Michigan State features three sets of brothers on its 2017 roster: Brian and Matt Allen, Andrew and David Dowell (fraternal twins), and Mike and Jacub Panasiuk.

BRIAN LEWERKE PROVING TO BE A DUAL-THREAT QUARTERBACK -

- Sophomore **Brian Lewerke** leads the Spartans not only in total offense (561 yards; 280.5 ypg.) and passing (411 yards; 205.5 ypg.), but also in rushing (150 yards; 75.0 ypg.) and rushing touchdowns (2). Lewerke has led the Spartans in rushing the first two games (69 yards vs. Bowling Green; career-high 81 vs. Western Michigan). **Lewerke ranks fourth in the Big Ten in total offense (280.5 ypg.)**.
- Lewerke ran for a career-high 81 yards against Western Michigan, the most by a Spartan quarterback since Drew Stanton had 83 against Purdue in Nov. 4, 2006.
- Lewerke scored his first career rushing touchdown on a 61-yard run in the first quarter vs. WMU, the longest TD run by a Spartan quarterback since **Charlie Baggett** ran for a 69-yard score on Oct. 27, 1973 vs. Purdue. It tied the longest rush by a Spartan QB since **Damon Dowdell** also had a 61-yard run against Wisconsin on Nov. 13, 2004; the last time a Spartan QB had a longer run was **Bobby McAllister** at Purdue (70 yards) on Nov. 5, 1988.
- Lewerke also had a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter to become the first Spartan QB to record two rushing TDs in a single game since **Drew Stanton** in 2006 against Eastern Michigan (Sept. 9) . . . Lewerke finished with 242 yards of total offense agains the Broncos, as he was 13-of-21 passing for 161 yards and one touchdown.
- The native of Phoenix, Arizona, recorded his first career win as a starting quarterback in the season-opening victory over Bowling Green while recording career highs in passing yards (250), completions (22), attempts (33), passing touchdowns (3) and total offense (319 yards) against the Falcons. Lewerke also rushed eight times for 69 yards.
- The 6-3, 212-pound Lewerke is 35-of-54 passing (.648) for 411 yards, four touchdowns and one interception in two games this season.
- Lewerke played in four games and started twice (Northwestern, Maryland) as a redshirt freshman in 2016 before suffering a season-ending injury (broken tibia) in the fourth quarter of the Michigan game on Oct. 28.
 He bounced back quickly from the injury and fully participated in all of spring practice.
- Last season, Lewerke became the first Spartan freshman quarterback to start a game (Northwestern) since 2004 (**Stephen Reaves** vs. Central Michigan).
- In six career games, Lewerke has completed 60 percent of his passes (66-for-111) for six touchdowns and two interceptions.

LJ SCOTT RETURNS TO LEAD POTENT RUSHING ATTACK -

- Junior LJ Scott, who has been named to the Maxwell Player of the Year and Doak Walker Running Back of the Year Watch Lists, led the Spartans in nearly every rushing category last season, compiling career highs in rushing yards (994), carries (184) and rushing touchdowns (6). His 82.8 rushing yards per game average ranked eighth in the Big Ten during the regular season and his 86.9 ypg in conference play was sixth best. Scott's 994 rushing yards were seventh most by a Spartan sophomore in a single season. He also had a team-best 10 runs of 20 yards or longer.
- The 6-1, 230-pound Scott had five 100-yard games, tied for third most in the Big Ten in the regular season, including four of the last six games (109.7 ypg last six games).
- A third-team All-Big Ten selection by the media last season, Scott collected career highs in rushing yards (160), all-purpose yards (236) and receiving yards (76) vs. No. 2 Ohio State on Nov. 19. Scott scored on the second play from scrimmage against the Buckeyes on a career-long 64-yard TD reception and also recorded a career-long rush with a 61-yard scamper in the first quarter. He finished with 19 carries for 160 yards (8.4 avg.) and two catches for 76 yards.
- In 28 career games, including 12 starts, the Hubbard, Ohio, product has rushed for 1,818 yards (64.9 ypg; 5.0 avg.) and 18 touchdowns. Scott already ranks 20th in MSU history in carries (363) and 21st in rushing yards (1,818). His 1,693 rushing yards ranked No. 5 in school history for a player through their sophomore season (Lorenzo White: 2,682 yards in 1984 and 1985). Scott currently ranks second on the Spartans in rushing with 125 yards on 33 carries (62.5 ypg.).

GERALD HOLMES, MADRE LONDON ALSO BRING EXPERIENCE TO THE BACKFIELD -

• In addition to **LJ Scott**, senior **Gerald Holmes** and junior **Madre London** bring significant experience and will see their share of carries in the backfield. Holmes has rushed for 1,090 yards on 233 carries in 30 career games, including 10 starts, while London has 165 carries for 702 career yards in 23 games with six starts. The trio of Holmes, London and Scott own a combined total of 3,610 rushing yards on 761 carries with 37 rushing touchdowns.

BRIAN ALLEN NOMINATED FOR NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION SCHOLAR-ATHLETE CLASS -

• Senior offensive lineman **Brian Allen** is Michigan State's 2017 nominee for the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Class. A two-time Academic All-Big Ten selection, Allen is an economics major with a 3.24 GPA. All nominees must be seniors who have displayed superior performance on the playing field, in the classroom and in the community. Michigan State has had three NFF Scholar-Athletes in Mark Dantonio's tenure (**Kirk Cousins** in 2011, **Max Bullough** in 2013, **Mike Sadler** in 2014).

DARRELL STEWART JR. EMERGING AS PLAYMAKER FOR SPARTANS -

- Sophomore wide receiver **Darrell Stewart Jr.** leads the Spartans in all-purpose yards (309; 154.5 ypg.), which ranks fifth in the Big Ten. Stewart also ranks first on the team in receptions (9), receiving yards (118), kick return yards (73) and punt return yards (20), and is third in rushing (98).
- Stewart has proven to be a playmaker the first two games, leading the Spartans with six explosive plays (20 yards or more). He has three kick returns, two rushes and one reception for more than 20 yards this season.
- Stewart had a career-high six catches for 85 yards in the season opener vs. Bowling Green, then rushed for a career-high 70 yards on three carries against Western Michigan.
- The Houston, Texas, native was one of 10 Spartans to help volunteer with the Hurricane Harvey relief efforts last weekend in Houston.

RUNNING GAME KEY FOR SPARTANS UNDER DANTONIO -

• Under **Mark Dantonio**, Michigan State is 75-16 (.824) when outrushing its opponent, including a 59-9 record (.868) since 2010. Conversely, MSU is 17-26 (.395) under Dantonio when being outgained on the ground by its opponent. The Spartans are 35-6 (.854) in games when gaining 200 or more rushing yards under Dantonio.



STOPPING THE RUN -

- Michigan State ranks fourth in the Big Ten and 17th in the FBS in rushing defense (91.5 ypg.).
- A week after Western Michigan collected 263 yards on the ground at No. 4 USC, the Spartans held the Broncos to 116 yards rushing in Week 2.
- MSU held Bowling Green to just 67 rushing yards in the season opener.
- MSU has held 43 opponents under 100 yards rushing since 2011, most in the Big Ten.
- Stopping the run has been the main theme for MSU on defense in the Dantonio era, and it led to ranking No. 1 in the NCAA FBS in rushing defense in 2014 (88.5 ypg.). Since the Big Ten began awarding stat champions in all games in 1985, Michigan State (2011-14) became only the second team in conference history to lead the league in rushing defense four years in a row (Michigan, 1990-93). MSU's 88.5 rushing yards allowed in 2014 was the eighth-lowest total in school history. The Spartans have ranked in the Top 25 in rushing defense six times in the last eight seasons, including a run of five straight years in the top 11 (2011-15).

THIRD DOWNS AND RED ZONE EFFICIENCY KEY TO EARLY 2-0 START -

- Michigan State's success on third downs and inside the red zone both on offense and defense has been a key reason to the team's 2-0 start.
- On third downs, the Spartan defense ranks No. 1 in the FBS in third-down conversion percentage, as opponents have only converted three first downs on 28 chances (.107). On the flip side, MSU's offense ranks second in the Big Ten and 13th in the FBS in converting third-down opportunities on offense (15-of-30, .500).
- Michigan State has been efficient both on offense and defense in the red zone this season. On offense, the Spartans have scored seven touchdowns in eight trips to the red zone. Defensively, the Spartans have only allowed two trips into the red zone all season (allowed one field goal; stopped the other trip on downs).

🐔 SPARTAN FOOTBALL PROGRAM NOTES

- Michigan State is in the midst of its second-winningest decade in school history. The Spartans are 70-25 (.737) since 2010 and during that span, MSU has claimed three Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015) and three Big Ten Division titles (2011, 2013, 2015). In addition, the Spartans recorded a school-record four consecutive bowl victories (2012 Outback against No. 18 Georgia, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings against TCU, 2014 Rose Bowl Game against No. 5 Stanford, 2015 Cotton Bowl Classic against No. 4 Baylor), which also tied a Big Ten record. MSU was the only school to finish in the top-six of the national polls from 2013-15 (No. 3 in 2013, No. 5 in 2014, No. 6 in 2015).
- The 70 wins this decade are second most in the Big Ten and 12th most in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision, while the 41 wins since 2013 are tied for third in the Big Ten and tied for eighth most in the FBS. The 36 wins from 2013-15 marked the winningest three-year stretch in the history of the program. MSU's highest winning percentage by decade is currently the 1950s (.766, 70-21-1 record).
- The Spartans have had sustained success in the Big Ten Conference under Dantonio. MSU has won two of the past four Big Ten Championships (2013, 2015) and three overall this decade, also claiming a championship in 2010. The Spartans own victories in 26 of their last 36 games against Big Ten opponents (including the Big Ten Championship Game), dating back to the 2012 regular-season finale, including 19 wins by double-figures.

- Michigan State and Florida are the only schools in the country to win multiple National Championships in football and men's basketball. MSU has won six national titles in football (1951, 1952, 1955, 1957, 1965, 1966) and two in men's basketball (1979, 2000). Michigan State is also the only school in the nation to win multiple National Championships in football, men's basketball and hockey.
- Entering the 2017 season, Michigan State ranked tied for 27th in the FBS in all-time victories with 684 wins in school history. The Spartans also entered 2017 ranked 25th in all-time winning percentage at .599 (684-450-44).
- Michigan State is one of only five schools to have had at least one player chosen every year since the inception of the common NFL Draft in 1967. MSU joins Florida, Michigan, Nebraska and USC as the only programs with at least one draft choice for 51 consecutive years.
- Since 2008, MSU has recorded 50 Big Ten regular-season victories, third most of any team in the conference. The Spartans produced back-to-back 11-win seasons in 2010-11 for the first time in program history, claimed a share of the Big Ten Championship in 2010, won the inaugural Big Ten Legends Divisions title in 2011, won the 2013 Big Ten Championship and 2014 Rose Bowl Game, won the 2015 Cotton Bowl Classic and captured the 2015 East Division and Big Ten Championships.

HEAD COACH MARK DANTONIO NOTES

DANTONIO RANKS SECOND IN WINS AT MICHIGAN STATE -

- Eleventh-year Michigan State head coach **Mark Dantonio**, who was a finalist for three national coach of the year awards (Bobby Dodd, George Munger, Eddie Robinson) in 2015, owns a 92-42 (.687) record. His .687 winning percentage currently ranks fifth best at MSU. He won his 71st game at MSU on Oct. 25, 2014, against Michigan to move into second place all-time in victories in school history (record: Duffy Daugherty, 109). Dantonio won his 100th career game as a head coach on Oct. 17, 2015, at Michigan Stadium as the Spartans rallied to defeat the Wolverines, 27-23, on a 38-yard fumble return as time expired. His career record stands at 110-59 (.651) in his 14th season.
- Dantonio's .654 winning percentage (53-28) in Big Ten games ranks first in MSU history (minimum 10 Big Ten games).
- Dantonio led the Spartans to the 2015 Big Ten Championship with a 16-13 victory over previously undefeated and fourth-ranked Iowa. It marked Dantonio's third Big Ten Championship (2010, 2013, 2015), establishing a school record (previous: Daugherty and Perles with two each).
- Dantonio became the first coach in Big Ten history to record five 11-win seasons in a six-year span (11 in 2010; 11 in 2011; 13 in 2013, 11 in 2014; 12 in 2015), and his five 11-win seasons are tied with Joe Paterno of Penn State and Urban Meyer of Ohio State for the second most in Big Ten history (Jim Tressel with six; Paterno with five at Penn State as Big Ten member). Prior to Dantonio's arrival, MSU had not recorded an 11-win season in its history, and had just two 10-win seasons (1965, 1999).

- A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2010, 2013), Dantonio has led Michigan State to Top 25 finishes in six of his 10 seasons (2008: No. 24 in both polls; 2010: No. 14 in both polls; 2011: No. 10 USA TODAY/ No. 11 AP; 2013: No. 3 in both polls; 2014: No. 5 in both polls; and 2015: No. 6 in both polls). His six AP Top-25 finishes are tied for second most in school history ("Biggie" Munn, who coached from 1947-53, had six consecutive from 1948-53). Daugherty's teams posted seven Top-25 finishes during his 19-year tenure from 1954-72.
- Michigan State extended its school record by playing in a bowl game for the ninth consecutive season in 2015 (2007 Champs Sports Bowl, 2009 Capital One Bowl, 2010 Alamo Bowl, 2011 Capital One Bowl, 2012 Outback Bowl, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl, 2014 Rose Bowl, 2015 Cotton Bowl, 2015 College Football Playoff Semifinal at Cotton Bowl).
- Dantonio also extended his school record for most bowl appearances (nine) by a head coach with a trip to the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Cotton Bowl Classic in 2015 (previous record: Perles with seven from 1983-94). Dantonio is 4-5 in bowl games at Michigan State, including a school-record four-game winning streak (2012 Outback, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings, 2014 Rose, 2015 Cotton). Dantonio has led his teams to 11 bowl berths in 13 seasons as a head coach (nine at MSU, two at Cincinnati).
- From his first day on the job, Dantonio has pledged to support student-athletes as they pursue excellence, both in the classroom and on the playing field. In his first 10 seasons, a total of 189 players have earned their undergraduate degrees. In addition, 136 Spartans have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, including seven Academic All-America selections. Michigan State has placed three student-athletes in the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Class in the past five years.
- Dantonio is one of just four Spartan head coaches to coach in at least 100 games at MSU and ranks third in Spartan history with 134 games coached at Michigan State (**Duffy Daugherty**: 183; **George Perles**: 139; Dantonio: 134; **Charlie Bachman**: 114).
- Dantonio is the third-longest tenured coach in the Big Ten (Kirk Ferentz, Iowa: 18th season; Pat Fitzgerald, Northwestern: 11th season) and eighth-longest in the FBS at the same school.

- Twenty-eight Spartans have been chosen in the NFL Draft under Dantonio's watch, including three consecutive first-round selections. Darqueze Dennard was a 2013 unanimous All-America selection and also won the Jim Thorpe Award, which is given annually to the nation's best defensive back. He was selected in the first round of the 2014 NFL Draft (No. 24 overall) by the Cincinnati Bengals to become the first Spartan under Dantonio to be chosen in the first round. Cornerback Trae Waynes was selected in the first round by the Minnesota Vikings at No. 11 overall in 2015. Michigan State became just the sixth school to have cornerbacks selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in consecutive years, joining Alabama (2012-13), LSU (2011-12), Miami-Florida (2005-06), Ohio State (1999-2001) and Notre Dame (1993-94). In 2016, offensive tackle Jack Conklin became the highest Spartan drafted under Dantonio as he was chosen No. 8 overall by the Tennessee Titans. The Spartans had six players drafted in 2012, the most in the Dantonio era, and five in 2016.
- Since 2007, Dantonio has helped develop nine different first-team All-Americans and 11 selections overall: RB Javon Ringer (2008); LB Greg Jones (2009-10); DT Jerel Worthy (2011); RB Le'Veon Bell (2012); CB Darqueze Dennard and P Mike Sadler (2013); S Kurtis Drummond (2014); C Jack Allen (2014-15) and OT Jack Conklin (2015). In addition, Dantonio has helped produce 36 first-team All-Big Ten selections.
- · Under Dantonio, Spartan teams have produced some of the longest winning streaks in school history. MSU's 13-game Big Ten winning streak from 2012-14 was its second-longest conference run, while MSU's 12-game winning streak that began on Nov. 15, 2014, and ended on Nov. 7, 2015, was tied for the third longest overall in school history. Dantonio also had an 11-game winning streak during the 2013-14 seasons. In addition, Michigan State has produced a 55-17 record (.764) in home games since 2007, including four undefeated home seasons (2010, 2011, 2013, 2015).

STAFF CONTINUITY SPARKS DANTONIO'S SUCCESS AT MSU -

- MSU head coach Mark Dantonio has repeatedly stressed the importance of continuity on his coaching staff as one of the main reasons for Michigan State's success during his tenure. Four of MSU's nine assistant coaches have been at MSU since Dantonio's arrival in 2007 (associate head coach/co-defensive coordinator/secondary coach Harlon Barnett, assistant head coach/offensive line coach Mark Staten, co-defensive coordinator/linebackers coach Mike Tressel, co-offensive coordinator/running backs coach Dave Warner). Those four also coached under Dantonio at Cincinnati. Dantonio, Barnett, Staten and Tressel have been on the same staff since 2004. MSU is one of only three schools (Navy, Northwestern) in the FBS to have at least five coaches on the same staff for the past 10 years.
- In addition, quarterbacks coach **Brad Salem** is in his eighth year on the staff, wide receivers coach **Terrence Samuel** is in his seventh year, and defensive tackles coach **Ron Burton** is in his fifth year. Co-offensive coordinator/tight ends coach **Jim Bollman**, who is also in his fifth season, has coached with Dantonio on three previous occasions: Youngstown State (1986-90), Michigan State (1995-97) and Ohio State (2001-03). Defensive ends coach/special teams coordinator **Mark Snyder** is in his third year on the staff at MSU.
- Dantonio announced in June 2017 the promotion of **Mark Staten** to assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator and **Sheldon White** as the executive director of player personnel and recruiting. Staten, who is entering his 11th season at Michigan State and his 14th as a full-time assistant under Dantonio, has been the program's offensive line coach since 2011. He previously served as the program's recruiting coordinator and tight ends/tackles coach from 2007-10. In addition to his new duties, Staten will remain the offensive line coach.
- White, who worked for 19 years in the front office with the Detroit Lions, including Vice President of Pro Personnel for six years and the role of interim general manager in 2015, was hired in 2016 as a program consultant. As executive director of player personnel, White's primary responsibilities will include coordinating the evaluation of all current players on the active roster, providing detailed evaluations to the coaching staff. He will also play a lead role in organizing the recruiting efforts of the program.
- In addition, **Harlon Barnett**, previously the program's assistant head coach, was appointed associate head coach.
- Three of Dantonio's former assistants left Michigan State to become head coaches at FBS schools: Don Treadwell (Miami-Ohio, 2011-13), Dan Enos (Central Michigan, 2010-14) and Pat Narduzzi (Pittsburgh, second season).

SPARTANS MAINTAIN SUCCESS IN BIG TEN PLAY -

- MSU has won nine Big Ten Championships in school history (1953, 1965, 1966, 1979, 1987, 1990, 2010, 2013, 2015), including a school-record three by **Mark Dantonio**.
- Michigan State has won 26 of its last 36 games (.722) against Big Ten opponents (including the Big Ten Championship Game), dating back to the 2012 regular-season finale, including 19 wins by double-figures. MSU has won 24 of its last 34 regular-season Big Ten Conference games. Michigan State is 40-17 (.702) in Big Ten regular-season games since 2010.
- Michigan State's 13-game Big Ten winning streak from Nov. 24, 2012 to Oct. 25, 2014, was the secondlongest Big Ten winning streak in school history (16 straight from Oct. 2, 1965 to Oct. 21, 1967). In addition, MSU had won 14 consecutive games against Big Ten opponents (2013 Big Ten Championship Game vs. No. 2 Ohio State).
- Mark Dantonio's .654 winning percentage (53-28) in Big Ten regular-season games ranks first in MSU history (minimum 10 Big Ten games).
- MSU is 26-14 (.650) in Big Ten road games under Dantonio, including a 20-8 record (.714) since 2010.
 Dantonio has won at least one road game at every Big Ten stadium.
- Since 2008, MSU has recorded 50 Big Ten regular-season victories, third most of any team in the conference.



TURNOVER MARGIN THE KEY INGREDIENT FOR SPARTAN SUCCESS -

- Michigan State, which had ranked in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision Top 10 and led the Big Ten in turnover margin for three consecutive seasons from 2013-15, ranked No. 101 in the FBS and No. 10 in the Big Ten in turnover margin (-0.42) in 2016 (13 turnovers gained; 18 turnovers lost). MSU turned the ball over a season-high four times in the loss to No. 11 Wisconsin on Sept. 24, the most by the Spartans since Nov. 17, 2012, against Northwestern.
- MSU was No. 4 in the FBS in 2015 with a +1.00 turnover margin. The Spartans forced 28 turnovers (15 interceptions, 13 fumbles) and turned the ball over just 14 times all season (eight interceptions, six fumbles). In addition, MSU scored 108 points off of its opponents' turnovers, while the opposition only scored 20 points on Spartan miscues (+88).
- The Spartans ranked No. 2 in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision in turnover margin (+1.46 per game) in 2014. MSU was +19 in the turnover department and forced 34 turnovers (16 fumbles, 18 interceptions), which ranked No. 1 in the Big Ten and third most in the FBS. Conversely, the Spartans turned the ball over just 15 times (six fumbles, nine interceptions), fewest in the Big Ten.
- Michigan State ranked first in the Big Ten and tied for 10th in the FBS in turnover margin (+13, 0.93 per game) in 2013. The Spartans forced the most turnovers in the Big Ten (28) and also turned the ball over the least amount of times (15) in the conference.
- Michigan State has forced at least one turnover in 107 of 134 games under head coach **Mark Dantonio** (80 percent of the games since 2007).
- Michigan State is 57-12 (.826) when forcing at least two turnovers in a game under head coach Mark Dantonio.

SPARTANS TOUGH ON HOME TURF -

- Under **Mark Dantonio**, Michigan State has produced a 55-17 record (.764) in home games since 2007, including a 15-game winning streak (7-0 in 2010, 7-0 in 2011, won first game in 2012) and a 12-game winning streak (7-0 in 2013; won first five in 2014), which rank second and tied for third, respectively, in Spartan Stadium history.
- MSU is 40-11 (.784) at home since 2010 and 24-6 (.800) since 2013.
- Mark Dantonio is 28-3 (.903) against nonconference opponents in Spartan Stadium (only losses: 2009 to Central Michigan; 2012 to No. 20 Notre Dame; 2016 to BYU).
- Dantonio is 11-0 in home openers at MSU and the Spartans' 19-game winning streak in home openers is tied for the fifth-long longest in the nation.

SPARTANS SUCCESSFUL IN NONCONFERENCE GAMES -

• Mark Dantonio is 37-13 (.740) against nonconference opponents, including a 28-3 (.900) mark in Spartan Stadium. Dantonio is 27-2 in games against teams outside of the Power Five conferences.

SPARTAN STADIUM NAMED COLLEGIATE FIELD OF THE YEAR BY STMA -

- Spartan Stadium was named the top collegiate football field for 2016 by the Sports Turf Managers Association (STMA). Spartan Stadium became just the fourth collegiate football field to earn the distinction of STMA Field of the Year twice since the award was created in 1992; the field was also recognized in 2005.
- MSU Sports Turf Manager **Amy Fouty** and athletic groundskeeper **Andy Flynn** accepted the award at the annual STMA Conference and Exhibition in January 2017. Fouty became the first woman to receive the award in the collegiate football category in 2005. Fouty and her staff also won the STMA Field of the Year Award in baseball in 2013 (Kobs Field at McLane Baseball Stadium).

KIRK GIBSON TO BE ADDED TO SPARTAN STADIUM RING OF FAME ON SEPT. 23 -

- As the latest Spartan to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame, former All-American wide receiver **Kirk Gibson** will have his name and number (23) added to the Spartan Stadium Ring of Fame prior to the Notre Dame game on Sept. 23.
- A four-year letterman who played for both **Denny Stolz** (1975) and **Darryl Rogers** (1976-78), Gibson earned first-team All-Big Ten and first-team All-America honors as a senior while helping lead the Spartans to a share of the 1978 Big Ten Championship and a No. 12 national ranking by The Associated Press. He set career highs in receptions (42), receiving yards (806) and touchdown receptions (7) in 1978. The 806 receiving yards in a single season established a school record at the time, breaking his own record of 748 he set as a sophomore.
- A native of Waterford, Michigan, Gibson led the Spartans in receiving yards for three straight seasons (1976-78) and is still the only Spartan to lead the Big Ten in receptions in conference games twice (30 for 486 yards and 4 TDs in 1976; 31 for 613 yards and 5 TDs in 1978).
- Gibson closed out his career as MSU's all-time leader in receptions (112), receiving yards (2,347) and TD receptions (24). He had seven 100-yard receiving games, tied for sixth most in the MSU record book, including a career-best 173-yard performance against North Carolina State as a sophomore in 1976 that set a single-game record at the time. He still ranks No. 1 in school history in yards per catch (21.0) and third in touchdown catches (24) and fourth in receiving yards (2,347).

BOB APISA SELECTED TO MSU ATHLETICS HALL OF FAME -

- Former two-time All-American fullback **Bob Apisa** will be inducted into the Michigan State Athletics Hall of Fame on Sept. 28 as part of MSU's "Celebrate 2017" Weekend.
- Apisa joins Joe Baum (soccer), Bob Cassleman (track & field), Kristin Haynie (basketball) and Dr. Clarence Underwood (administration) in the 2017 MSU Athletics Hall of Fame Class.
- One of just 15 players in program history to earn first-team All-America honors twice, Apisa played an
 instrumental role in helping the Spartans to a combined record of 19-1-1 during the 1965 and 1966 seasons,
 including back-to-back Big Ten and National Championships. A three-year letterwinner from 1965-67, Apisa
 garnered first-team All-America accolades as a sophomore in 1965 by Football News, and repeated as a
 first-team All-American in 1966 by both the Football News and New York News.

MORTEN ANDERSEN: ENSHRINED IN CANTON -

- Former Michigan State All-American kicker **Morten Andersen** was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame on Aug. 5 in Canton, Ohio. Michigan State head coach **Mark Dantonio** attended the induction ceremony, along with a number of other former Spartans.
- Andersen is just the third specialst who did not play another position to be enshrined in the Pro Football Hall of Fame, joining fellow placekicker **Jan Stenerud** and punter **Ray Guy**.
- Andersen is the third former Spartan to be inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame, joining Herb Adderley (Class of 1980) and Joe DeLamielleure (Class of 2003).



- Andersen is the NFL's all-time leader in points (2,544), field goals (565) and games played (382). In addition, his 40 field goals of 50 yards or longer were the most in NFL history at his retirement. Andersen was named to the NFL All-Decade Teams in both the 1980s and 1990s.
- A four-year letterman from 1978-81, Andersen closed out his career as Michigan State's all-time leader in field goals (45), extra points (126) and scoring (261 points). He connected on nine field goals from 50-plus yards during his career, including a Big Ten-record 63-yarder at Ohio State in 1981. He also converted 62-straight extra-point attempts during one stretch. In 1999, Andersen was named to the Walter Camp Football Foundation All-Century Team (1900-2000).

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES -

• Since the beginning of the 2010 season, Michigan State is 20-11 (.645) in games decided by one score or less, including all four bowl victories. The losses have come against Wisconsin in the 2011 Big Ten Championship Game (42-39), Ohio State (17-16), Iowa (19-16 in 2OT), Michigan (12-10), Nebraska (28-24) and Northwestern (23-20) in 2012, Notre Dame (17-13) in 2013, Nebraska (39-38) in 2015, and Indiana (24-21 in OT), Illinois (31-27) and Ohio State (17-16) in 2016.





HEAD COACH MARK DANTONIO



Now in his 11th season at Michigan State, Mark Dantonio is one of the most accomplished head coaches in the school's storied history, leading a program that has transformed itself into one of the nation's perennial powers.

Dantonio has won the most Big Ten Championships (three) and bowl games (four) of any Spartan head coach and also ranks first with nine bowl appearances. He is the only active Big Ten coach to win multiple Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015), claim a victory in the Rose Bowl (2014), and coach in the College Football Playoff (2015). The second-winningest coach in school history, trailing only Hall of Famer Duffy Daugherty, Dantonio owns a 92-42 (.687) record at MSU since his arrival in 2007. He also ranks first in program history in conference winning percentage (.654, 53-28 record, minimum 10 games), second in home wins (55) and AP Top 25 victories (17), tied for second in Big Ten wins (53) and AP Top 25 finishes (six), and fifth in overall winning percentage (.687).

A Zanesville, Ohio, native with Midwest ties, Dantonio is in his 38th year of collegiate coaching, including his 14th as a head coach and 16th in East Lansing (served as the Spartan secondary coach from 1995-2000). The 61-year-old Dantonio won his school-record third Big Ten Championship in 2015 with a 16-13 victory over previously undefeated and fourth-ranked lowa that sent Michigan State to the College Football Playoff. He became MSU's second all-time winningest coach with his 71st victory on Oct. 25, 2014, against Michigan (record: Duffy Daugherty, 109). He won his 100th career game as a head coach in dramatic fahsion on Oct. 17, 2015, at Michigan Stadium as the Spartans rallied to defeat the Wolverines, 27-23, on a 38-yard fumble return as time expired. Dantonio owns a career record of 110-59 (.651) in his 14th season as a head coach.

A two-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2010, 2013), Dantonio has led Michigan State to Top 25 finishes in six of his 10 seasons (2008: No. 24 in both polls; 2010: No. 14 in both polls; 2011: No. 10 USA TODAY/No. 11 AP; 2013: No. 3 in both polls; 2014: No. 5 in both

polls; and 2015: No. 6 in both polls). Dantonio's six AP Top-25 finishes are tied for second most in school history (Biggie Munn, who coached from 1947-53, had six consecutive from 1948-53; Daugherty's teams posted seven Top-25 finishes during his 19-year tenure from 1954-72). MSU (No. 3 in 2013, No. 5 in 2014, No. 6 in 2015) was the only school to finish in the top six of the final AP Poll from 2013-15.

Michigan State is in the midst of its second winningest decade in school history with a 70-25 record since 2010 (.737). MSU's highest winning percentage by decade is currently the 1950s (.766, 70-21-1 record). The 70 wins since 2010 are 12th most among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams and second most in the Big Ten during that same period. During that span, MSU has claimed three Big Ten Championships (2010, 2013, 2015) and three Big Ten Division titles (2011, 2013, 2015). In addition, the Spartans recorded a school-record four consecutive bowl victories (2012 Outback against No. 18 Georgia, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings against TCU, 2014 Rose Bowl Game against No. 5 Stanford, 2015 Cotton Bowl Classic against No. 4 Baylor), which also tied a Big Ten record. MSU's 41 wins since 2013 are tied for eighth most in the NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision.

Dantonio made history by becoming the first Big Ten coach to record five 11-win seasons in a six-year span following MSU's 12-win campaign in 2015 (11 in 2010; 11 in 2011; school-record 13 in 2013, 11 in 2014; 12 in 2015). His five 11-win seasons are tied with Joe Paterno of Penn State and Urban Meyer of Ohio State for the second most in Big Ten history (Jim Tressel with six, although the 2010 season was officially vacated; Paterno with five at PSU as Big Ten member). Prior to Dantonio's arrival, MSU had not recorded an 11-win season in its history, and had just two 10-win seasons (1965, 1999).

During conference play, Michigan State has won 26 of its last 36 games against Big Ten opponents, dating back to the 2012 regular-season finale, including 19 wins by double-figures. In addition, Michigan State has recorded 50 Big Ten regular-season victories since 2008, the third most of any team in the conference. Since the inception of the College Football Playoff and New Year's Six in 2014, Michigan State is one of only six schools (Alabama, Clemson, Florida State, Ohio State, Oklahoma) schools to play in both the CFP (2015 vs. Alabama) and a New Year's Six game (2015 Cotton Bowl vs. Baylor).

Michigan State extended its school record by playing in a bowl game for the ninth consecutive season in 2015 (2007 Champs Sports Bowl, 2009 Capital One Bowl, 2010 Alamo Bowl, 2011 Capital One Bowl, 2012 Outback Bowl, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings Bowl, 2014 Rose Bowl, 2015 Cotton Bowl, 2015 College Football Playoff Semifinal at Cotton Bowl). Dantonio also extended his school record for most bowl appearances (nine) by a head coach with a trip to the College Football Playoff Semifinal at the Cotton Bowl Classic in 2015 (previous record: George Perles with seven from 1983-94). Dantonio is 4-5 in bowl games at Michigan State, including a school-record four-game winning streak (2012 Outback, 2012 Buffalo Wild Wings, 2014 Rose, 2015 Cotton). Dantonio has led his teams to 11 bowl berths in 13 full seasons as a head coach (nine at MSU, two at Cincinnati).

Dantonio has coached the third-most games of any Spartan head coach in school history (Daugherty: 183; Perles: 139; Dantonio: 134). In addition, Dantonio is the third-longest tenured coach in the Big Ten (Kirk Ferentz, Iowa: 19th season; Pat Fitzgerald, Northwestern: 12th season) and eighth longest in the FBS (same school).

Since 2007, Dantonio has helped develop nine different first-team All-Americans and 11 selections overall: RB Javon Ringer (2008); LB Greg Jones (2009-10); DT Jerel Worthy (2011); RB Le'Veon Bell (2012); CB Darqueze Dennard and P Mike Sadler (2013); S Kurtis Drummond (2014); C Jack Allen (2014-15) and OT Jack Conklin (2015). In addition, Dantonio has helped produce 36 first-team All-Big Ten selections.

Twenty-eight Spartans have been chosen in the NFL Draft under Dantonio's watch, including three consecutive first-round selections from 2014-16. Dennard was a 2013 unanimous All-America selection and also won the Jim Thorpe Award, which is given annually to the nation's best defensive back. He was selected in the first round of the 2014 NFL Draft (No. 24 overall) by the Cincinnati Bengals to become the first Spartan under Dantonio to be chosen in the first round. Cornerback Trae Waynes was selected in the first round by the Minnesota Vikings at No. 11 overall in 2015. Michigan State became just the sixth school to have cornerbacks selected in the first round of the NFL Draft in consecutive years, joining Alabama (2012-13), LSU (2011-12), Miami-Florida (2005-06), Ohio State (1999-2001) and Notre Dame (1993-94). In 2016, offensive tackle Jack Conklin became the highest Spartan drafted under Dantonio as he was chosen No. 8 overall by the Tennessee Titans, and went on earn AP All-Pro honors as a rookie. The Spartans had six players drafted in 2012, the most in the Dantonio era, and five in 2016.

From his first day on the job, Dantonio has pledged to support student-athletes as they pursue excellence, both in the classroom and on the playing field. In his first 10 seasons, a total of 189 players have earned their undergraduate degrees. In addition, 136 Spartans have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, including seven Academic All-America selections (Blair White, 2009 second team; Sadler, 2014 first team, 2013 first team, 2012 second team, 2011 second team; Max Bullough, 2013 first team, 2012 second team). MSU set a program record with 22 Academic All-Big Ten honorees in 2016. In the past six years, Michigan State has placed three student-athletes in the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Class (Kirk Cousins in 2011; Bullough in 2013; Sadler in 2014). Sadler became MSU's first four-time Academic All-American and was a finalist for the 2014 William V. Campbell Trophy (nation's top scholar-athlete).

For his work in the community, Dantonio received the 2016 Gene Stallings Award, which is given annually to college football head coaches who are also humanitarians and strive to promote healthy, vibrant communities through charitable and community service efforts. In addition to Dantonio's numerous accomplishments as head football coach at Michigan State, he has been an active member of the Mid-Michigan community. Dantonio and his wife, Becky, have hosted a women's football clinic nearly every year of his tenure, with proceeds going to local charities. The most recent clinic in April 2016 benefited the Boys and Girls Club of Lansing. Dantonio was named honorary chairman of the Children's Miracle Network at the Sparrow Children Center's in Lansing in 2009 and has played an integral role in helping children throughout the Mid-Michigan region get the medical care they need. Dantonio and his staff have also hosted CMN telethons that have raised hundreds of thousands of dollars. He has also played a role in getting the Spartans visiting elementary and middle schools throughout Lansing as part of the city's "Lansing Promise" campaign.

Dantonio was also named a 2015 finalist for the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award, which annually honors the coach of a team with a successful season on the field and equally as important, stresses the importance of academic excellence and desire to give back to the community.

Under Dantonio, Spartan teams have produced some of the longest winning streaks in school history. MSU's 13-game Big Ten winning streak from 2012-14 was its second-longest conference run, while MSU's 12-game winning streak that began on Nov. 15, 2014, and ended on Nov. 7, 2015, was tied for the third longest in school history. Dantonio also had an 11-game winning streak during the 2013-14 seasons. In addition, Michigan State has produced a 55-17 record (764) in home games since 2007, including four undefeated home seasons (2010, 2011, 2013, 2015).

The Spartans have consistently produced victories against highly ranked teams under Dantonio. MSU has defeated 17 AP Top-25 teams in his tenure, including seven in the Top 10. The Spartans have twice stopped the two longest winning streaks in Ohio State history (snapped school-record 24-game winning streak over the No. 2 Buckeyes in the 2013 Big Ten Championship Game; snapped 23-game winning streak over the defending National Champion and second-ranked Buckeyes on Nov. 21, 2015, in Ohio Stadium). MSU also has AP Top 10 wins over No. 4 Iowa (2015 season), No. 4 Baylor (2014), No. 4 Wisconsin (2011), No. 5 Stanford (2013) and No. 7 Oregon (2015) under Dantonio. The Spartans have also defeated Michigan seven times in the last nine years, including a last-second victory

against the No. 12 Wolverines on Oct. 17, 2015, in Michigan Stadium.

Known as one of the top defensive minds in the country, Dantonio and his staff have assembled one of the most consistently productive defenses in the FBS, year in and year out. The Spartans were the only team to rank in the NCAA FBS Top 10 in total defense from 2011-14 (No. 6 in 2011, No. 4 in 2012, No. 2 in 2013, No. 8 in 2014). A key reason for MSU's success has been creating turnovers, as the Spartans led the Big Ten for three consecutive years from 2013-15 in turnover margin, figures which also ranked in the FBS Top 10 (No. 10 in 2013 at +0.93; No. 2 in 2014 at +1.46; No. 4 in 2015 at +1.0).

Stopping the run has been the main theme for MSU, and it led to ranking No. 1 in the NCAA FBS in rushing defense in 2014 (88.5 ypg.). Since the Big Ten began awarding stat champions in all games in 1985, Michigan State (2011-14) became only the second team in conference history to lead the league in rushing defense four years in a row (Michigan, 1990-93). MSU's 88.5 rushing yards allowed in 2014 was the eighth-lowest total in school history. The Spartans have ranked in the Top 25 in rushing defense six times in the last eight seasons, including a run of five straight years in the top 11 (2011-15).

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Brian Lewerke threw three touchdown passes, and Tyson Smith capped his heartwarming comeback with an interception return for a touchdown in Michigan State's 35-10 win over Bowling Green on Sept. 2.

Lewerke, who has taken over as the starting quarterback as a sophomore, went 22 of 33 for 250 yards and also made some crucial plays with his legs, running for a team-high 69 yards

The play of the day went to Smith, however. He talked last month with reporters about an offseason health scare that involved a severe headache and turned out to be a stroke. By Saturday, he was able to play, and his 38-yard interception return in the third quarter made it 35-3.

Michigan State marched down the field on the first drive of the game, only for LJ Scott to fumble the ball away near the goal line. The Spartans lost another fumble near midfield later in the quarter, but they finally took a 7-3 lead early in the second on a 7-yard touchdown run by Madre London.

From there, it was smoother sailing. Lewerke threw two TD passes to Felton Davis - a 4-yarder in the final seconds of the half and an 8-yarder in the third quarter. His 13-yard touchdown pass to Matt Sokol made it 28-3.

Cameron Jefferies returned a fumble 46 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter for Bowling Green.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- Michigan State has won 19 straight home openers, tied for the fifth-longest active streak in the nation. MSU's streak began in 1999 with a win over Oregon . . . Mark Dantonio improved to 11-0 in home openers at MSU and 10-1 in season openers.

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Brian Lewerke scored on a 61-yard run in the first quarter, and Michigan State's defense was impressive for a second straight week in a 28-14 victory over Western Michigan on Sept. 9.

Lewerke added another touchdown on a quarterback sneak and also threw for a TD on a day when the Spartans (2-0) didn't need to do much offensively. Michigan State has allowed only three touchdowns in two games this year. Two of them came on fumble returns and the other on a kickoff return.

The Broncos (0-2) looked like a dangerous opponent after rushing for 263 yards in a season-opening loss to Southern California, but the Spartans contained WMU's running backs. The only touchdowns for the Broncos came courtesy of Darius Phillips, on a 67-yard fumble return in the third and a 100-yard kick return in the fourth.

Lewerke opened the scoring with the longest touchdown run by a Michigan State quarterback since 1973. A fake handoff helped open up the middle of the field, and the sophomore was able to outrun the secondary for a 7-0 lead. Lewerke threw a 15-yard scoring pass to LJ Scott in the second quarter.

Phillips ripped the ball away from Hunter Rison and ran it all the way back to the end zone to make it 14-7, but Michigan State responded with a 75-yard scoring drive that included a 46-yard run by Darrell Stewart and Lewerke's 1-yard touchdown.

Scott scored on a 2-yard run in the fourth, but Phillips took the ensuing kickoff all the way back to make it 28-14.

The last time a Michigan State quarterback had a longer scoring run than Lewerke's was in 1973, when Charlie Baggett had a 69-yarder against Purdue.

POST-GAME NOTES:

- Michigan State limited Western Michigan to 195 yards of total offense (116 rushing; 79 passing) . . . in the season opener at No. 4 USC, the Broncos had 357 yards of total offense (263 rushing, 94 passing).
- Michigan State rushed for 296 yards, the most by the Spartans in a single game since they ran for 330 yards at Indiana on Oct. 18, 2014.



Brian Lewerke ran for a career-high 81 yards, the most by a Spartan quarterback since Drew Stanton had 83 against Purdue in Nov. 4, 2006... Lewerke scored his first career rushing touchdown on a 61-yard run in the first quarter, the longest TD run by a Spartan quarterback since Charlie Baggett on Oct. 27, 1973 vs. Purdue (69 yards)... Lewerke also had a 1-yard TD run in the third quarter to became the first Spartan QB to record two rushing TDs in a single game since Drew Stanton in 2006.




