Irish Ranked No. 1 In The Nation For First Time In Program's History; Notre Dame To Host Nebraska-Omaha In Weekend Series At The Joyce Center.

Irish clinch first round bye in CCHA playoffs with sweep at Bowling Green; 17 league wins are most ever for Notre Dame.

THE TOP OF THE HEAP: For the first time in the 39-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program the Fighting Irish find themselves looking down at the rest of the college hockey world as they are ranked first in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV college hockey polls. Notre Dame brings a 23-5-2 overall record into its weekend series with Nebraska-Omaha and sits atop the CCHA standings with a 17-3-2 league record. The Irish hold a four-point lead on second-place Michigan, a six-point lead on third-place Miami and an eight-point lead on fourth-place Michigan State while the Spartans have one game in hand. The Irish are the first team in the conference to clinch a first-round bye in the CCHA playoffs and the magic number to clinch first-place is any combination of Notre Dame wins or ties or Michigan losses and ties that totals nine points. Nebraska-Omaha is 13-12-7 overall and 10-9-3 in the CCHA, good for 23 points and fifth-place in the league. The Mavericks are five points behind fourth-place Michigan State and the final spot that receives a first-round bye. UNO leads sixth-place Lake Superior by two points and seventh-place Ohio State by three points in the race for home ice in the first round of the CCHA playoffs.

NOTRE DAME VS. NEBRASKA-OMAHA:

The Irish and Mavericks have met twice this season, splitting a pair of games in Omaha in November. Notre Dame won the series opener on Nov. 24, 4-2 and then lost a 3-2 decision on Nov. 25. The all-time series is even at 9-9-3 and Nebraska-Omaha has a 4-3-1 edge in the games played at the Joyce Center. UNO's last win at the Joyce Center came on Feb. 5, 2005, a 6-3 win.

CCHA WINS: Notre Dame's 17 CCHA wins to date are the most in the team's 17-years in the conference. The Irish had 15 wins in 1981-82 and again in 1998-99.

HOBEY HOPEFULS: Two Notre Dame players – goaltender **David Brown (Sr., Stoney Creek, Ont.)** and right wing **Mark Van Guilder (Jr., Roseville, Minn.)** – are among 40 players listed by the Hobey Baker Award website as candidate's for the prestigious honor. Phase one of – Vote For Hobey – is now underway. Fans now have the opportunity to select their favorite candidate for the list of top ten finalists on the new Hobey Baker Award website (www.hobeybaker.com). Fans may vote for one candidate at a time, but can vote multiple times per day. The standings will run concurrently on the Hobey Baker website. Voting in phase one will end on March 4. Phase two will begin on March 15 after the top ten finalists have been announced. To vote, visit the Vote For Hobey link on the Hobey Baker website, or just click on the Vote For Hobey button on the site's homepage.

David Brown: Brown comes into the Nebraska-Omaha series with a 22-4-2 record to go with a 1.70 goals-against average and a .928 save percentage. His 22 wins lead the nation while his goals against leads the CCHA and is second in the country. Brown's save percentage is second in the conference and ninth nationally. He has led the Irish to the second-best defense in the nation, giving up just 1.73 goals-per game. He is tied for the CCHA lead with three shutouts and is tied for fifth in the nation in that category. In his last five games, Brown is 4-0-1 with a 1.18 goals-against average and a .947 save percentage and one shutout. Brown is currently ranked first by Inside College Hockey.com's Hobey Tracker and second by CSTV.com's Hobey Watch.

Mark Van Guilder: Van Guilder had one assist in the series at Bowling Green and is tied for second on the team in scoring with 29 points on 15 goals and 14 assists. His 15 goals are second on the team and are a career high for the junior forward. His 29 points are also a career best.

BOWLING GREEN RECAP: The Irish took two one-goal wins on the road at Bowling Green, winning 3-2 and 2-1 versus the Falcons. The two wins helped the Irish clinch a first-round bye in the upcoming CCHA playoffs. On Friday night, senior **Michael Bartlett (Morton Grove, Ill.)** scored off a scramble in front of Bowling Green goaltender Jimmy Spratt at the 19:01 mark of the second period to give the Irish a 3-2 win. Notre Dame scored a pair of power-play goals 59 seconds apart in the first period to take a 2-0 lead. **Dan Kissel (Fr., Crestwood, Ill.)** scored at 4:55 on a five-on-three chance off a **Mark Van Guilder (Jr., Roseville, Minn.)** set up. Freshman **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** scored at 5:54 as he redirected a **Brett Blatchford (Fr., Temperance, Mich.)** pass behind Spratt for his 16th goal of the season. The Falcons cut the lead to 2-1 at 14:03 on a Brandon Svendsen goal. They tied the game in the second period at 4:22 when James Unger flipped a rebound over Irish goaltender **David Brown (Sr., Stoney Creek, Ont.)** for a 2-2 score. That set up Bartlett's game winner as he tucked a rebound of **Noah Babin's (Sr., Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.)** shot under Spratt for his second goal of the season. Notre Dame out shot Bowling Green by a 32-20 margin. Brown made 18 saves

while Spratt had 29. The Irish were 2-for-4 on the power play while the Falcons were 0-for-1. On Saturday night, the Irish trailed after the first period for just the fifth time this season as Kai Kantola scored on a power play at 7:19 of the opening period. The Irish would tie the score and go ahead in the second with two goals. Bartlett scored his third of the season and second of the weekend when he tucked the rebound of a **Brook Sheahan (Jr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** under Spratt at 7:31. Notre Dame got the game winner at 14:27 when **Kevin Deeth (Fr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** redirected a **Kyle Lawson (Fr., New Hudson, Mich.)** pass between Spratt's pads on a power play for his 13th goal of the season. The Irish out shot Bowling Green by a 21-15 margin. Brown finished with 14 saves while Spratt had 19 stops on the night. Notre Dame was 1-for-8 on the power play while the Falcons were 1-for-5.

JOYCE CENTER SELLOUTS: Both games of the Nebraska-Omaha series are sold out. That gives the Irish sellout crowds in six of their last seven games going back to Dec. 10. For the year, the Irish have already had seven sellouts at the Joyce Center and are averaging 2,322 fans per game for the year.

SICK BAY: Sophomore center **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** has been sidelined since the Lake Superior Series (Jan. 12-13) with mononucleosis. He is expected to miss 3-4 weeks of action.

23 WINS AND COUNTING: The Irish now have a 23-5-2 record for the season. The 23 wins equals the second-most wins in the program's 39-year history. The 1972-73 team was 23-14-1 and finished second in the WCHA. In 1981-82, the Irish were 23-15-2 and finished fourth in the CCHA. The school record for wins is 27-4-2 and came in 1987-88 when the Irish played as a Division I Independent.

BARTLETT SCORES: Senior **Michael Bartlett** scored a goal in each of the games at Bowling Green. His goal in the 3-2 win was the game winner and snapped a 24-game goal-less drought that started after his Oct. 30 goal at Providence. The game winner was his first since Oct. 30, 2003 when he had the game winner against Nebraska-Omaha. He added his third goal in the 2-1 win on Saturday, tying the game in the second period. Bartlett's three goals this season are the most he's scored since getting six goals as a freshman in 2003-04.

FIRST-PERIOD GOALS: Bowling Green became the eighth team this season to score first versus the Irish (ND is 5-2-1 in those games). On the year, the Irish have given up just 12 first-period goals while scoring 31 of their own. Notre Dame has scored the first goal of the game 22 times this year and is 18-3-1 in those games.

IRISH VERSUS TOP 15-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame's win and tie versus #9/#8 Miami gives the Irish a 9-1-1 record this season in games against Top 15 teams. The Irish are now 7-0-1 in their last eight games against ranked teams. Notre Dame is 4-1 on the road against ranked teams and 5-0- at home against the top teams in the nation. Beside the Miami series, the wins include two over #15/#15 Lake Superior (4-3 in ot and 4-1), #7/#7 Michigan (7-3 and 4-3), two against #14/#14 Alaska (3-1 and 6-2) and one each against #4/#4 Michigan State (4-1) and #1/#1 Boston College (7-1). The lone loss came at #4/#4 Michigan State (2-0). Last season, the Irish were 0-8-2 in games versus ranked teams.

Versus Michigan on Dec. 10, Notre Dame surrendered two goals in the first period for the only time this season and trailed the Wolverines 2-1 after one period. Notre Dame is 15-2-0 when they lead after one period and 5-2-1 when tied after one period. The Irish are now 3-1-1 when they trail after one period of play.

RANKINGS UPDATE: For the 15th consecutive week, the Irish are ranked by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls and for the first time ever, they are ranked No. 1 in the nation. Prior to this season, the last time the Notre Dame was ranked was the 2003-04 campaign when the Irish finished the year ranked 12th. The 15 consecutive weeks are the most the Irish have been ranked in one season. Week-by-week with the Irish this season:

Prior to this week, the Irish were ranked as high as second several times, including Jan. 2 and Jan. 31 of this season.

IRISH RANKING HISTORY: Notre Dame hasn't been ranked often in its 39-year hockey history. During the 1972-73 season, the Irish finished ranked fourth overall in the WMPL radio poll and were ranked for eight weeks during the year. That season, Notre Dame lost to Wisconsin in the WCHA finals. The following year (1973-74), the Irish opened the season ranked second (WMPL) and stayed as high as No. 2 through the first four weeks of the year before dropping out. In 1976-77, the Irish were ranked in the final seven weeks of the season, reaching as high as No. 2 on Jan. 31, finishing the year ranked third in the WMPL radio poll. They lost to Minnesota in the WCHA playoffs in a total-goal series. Notre Dame would not be ranked again until October 26 of the 1981-82 season when they reached 10th but weren't ranked again. In 1998-99, the Irish spent 16 consecutive weeks (Oct. 19-Feb. 16) in both the *USA Today* and *USHCHO.com* polls, before falling out at the end of the year. In 2002-03, the Irish were ranked for one week and in 2003-04, they were ranked six weeks in total, including the final four weeks in a row to finish 12th in the *USA Today* Poll and 13th in the *USCHO.com* final polls.

PENALTY-KILLING PROWESS: Over the last seven games, Notre Dame has given up just two power-play goals (Miami 1/26 and Bowling Green 2/3) in 35 opponent chances (94.3%). On the year, Notre Dame has given up just two power-play goals in a game twice (to Minnesota State and Robert Morris, both losses). Overall, the Irish have killed 135-of-150 power plays for a 90.0% success rate that is tied for the lead in the CCHA and tied for second in the nation.

ALASKA TV: Notre Dame's game at Alaska on Friday, Feb. 16 will be televised on tape delay on WHME-TV 46 in South Bend. The game can be seen on Saturday, Feb. 17 at 9:30 a.m.

THE KID LINE: Notre Dame's line of **Ryan Thang, Kevin Deeth** and **Erik Condra** (two freshmen and a sophomore) has been the team's top scoring trio this season. The threesome picked up two goals and an assist in the weekend sweep of Bowling Green, with Deeth getting the game winner in the Feb. 3, 2-1 win. For the season the trio now has 40 goals and 53 assists for 93 points. Included in the 40 goals are 17 power-play goals, three short-handed goals and 10 game winners. The three players are a combined +51. Condra is second in the CCHA with a +19, Deeth is third with a +18 and Thang is tied for 11th with a +14.

CONDRA BESTS: Sophomore right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** was held to one assist in the weekend series at Bowling Green, but continues to lead the team with 11 goals and 25 assists for 36 points. His 11 goals are a career high and rank fourth on the team. His 25 assists are just three off his career high set last season and lead the team. A year ago, Condra had 34 points for the year on six goals and 28 assists.

THE REAL THANG: Freshman right wing **Ryan Thang** took over the team lead in goals (16) and power-play goals (8) with his goal in the 3-2 win over Bowling Green on Feb. 2. Thang's 16 goals are most by an Irish freshman since **Rob Globke '04** had 17 in 2000-01. He is tied for tied for ninth on the Irish list for goals by a freshman with current Irish volunteer assistant **Mike McNeill '88** who had 16 in the 1984-85 season. He is second in the CCHA among freshmen goal scorers, trailing Western Michigan's Mark Letestu who has 18.

DYNAMIC DEETH: Freshman center **Kevin Deeth** is second on the Irish in scoring with 13 goals and 16 assists for 29 points. Included in his 13 goals are six power-play goals and two game winners. His power-play goal in the second period on Feb. 3 gave the Irish the 2-1 win. Deeth is also second on the team with a +18.

MR. STEADY: Junior **Mark Van Guilder** continues to be Notre Dame's steadiest player as he is tied for second on the team in goals (15) and points (29) and is sixth with a +12. The Hobey Baker Award candidate has been held off the scoresheet just 10 times this season and he leads the Irish with eight multiple-point games on the year. eight goals of a year ago. The Roseville, Minn., native now has his eyes set on Notre Dame's "Iron Man" record of 153 consecutive games, set by **Tim Wallace (2002-06)** as he has now played in 104 consecutive games in his career.

COMING FROM BEHIND: Four times this season, Notre Dame has rallied from a third-period deficit to win or tie a game. On Dec. 2 versus Alaska, the Irish trailed 1-0 going into the third period and scored three times for a 3-1 win. On Dec. 10, ND trailed Michigan, 3-2, entering the third period and scored twice for a 4-3 win. On Dec. 30, the Irish trailed Northern Michigan, 2-1 entering the third and scored three times in a 4-3 win. Last weekend, Notre Dame trailed Miami, 2-0 entering the third and scored twice for a 2-2 tie. On the year, when trailing going into the third period, the Irish are 3-3-1.

GOALTENDER OF THE WEEK: For the third time this season, Notre Dame goaltender and Hobey Baker candidate **David Brown** has been selected as the CCHA goaltender of the week. Brown stopped 50-of-53 shots (.943) in the weekend series with Miami, giving up just three goals in the win and tie. He was selected goaltender of the week previously on Oct. 23 and Nov. 6.

SCORING IN BUNCHES: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame has scored two or more goals in a period a total of 32 times, including two goals in the first period at Bowling Green on Feb. 2 and two goals in the second period on Feb. 3. The totals include 21 periods with two goals, nine periods with three goals, one period with four and one with five lamplighters.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Senior goaltender **David Brown** continues to be one of the leading contenders for the Hobey Baker Memorial Award for college hockey's top player. Brown bounced back from his first loss in 10 games (3-2 on Jan. 19 at Western Michigan) to record his third shutout of the season, winning at Western, 3-0 on Jan. 20. Over his last five games since the loss, Brown is 4-0-1 with a 1.18 goals-against average and a .949 save percentage. Prior to the Jan. 19 loss, Brown had not lost a game since Nov. 25 at Nebraska-Omaha. In his nine-game winning streak, Brown has a 2.21 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage. Overall, he has now appeared in 28 of Notre Dame's 30 games and has a 1.70 goals-against average and a .928 save percentage to go with an 22-4-2 record. The Hobey Baker candidate is first among CCHA goaltenders in wins (22) and goals-against average (1.70), second in save percentage (.928) and third in minutes played (1,694:04). He ranks first nationally in wins, second in goals-against average, third in minutes played and eighth in save percentage. His .821 winning percentage is first in the CCHA and second nationally. Brown and the Irish defense are second in the nation, giving up just 1.73 goals-per-game (52 in 30 contests). The senior goaltender now has 47 career wins at Notre Dame to rank third on the all-time wins list. A three-time CCHA goaltender of the week (Oct. 23, Nov. 6 and Jan. 29), Brown was also the all-tournament goaltender at the Lightning College Hockey Classic. This season, Brown has taken over Notre Dame's all-time top spot for career goals-against average (2.45), save percentage (.914) and shutouts (9).

FRIDAY NIGHT FUN: The Irish ran their record to 10-1-0 in the opening game of a week-end CCHA series with the 3-2 win at Bowling Green. The lone loss came on Jan. 19 at Western Michigan (3-2). Notre Dame also is 7-2-2 in the second game of the series.

CLUTCH SCORER: Freshman **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** picked up his sixth goal of the season with a power-play goal in the 3-2 win at Bowling Green on Feb. 2. Kissel now has six goals in 16 games this season with three of them being game winners.

KID STUFF: Notre Dame's freshman class continues to excel on the ice and played a key role in the sweep at Bowling Green. Of the five goals the Irish scored, three came off the sticks of freshmen and they added three assists on the weekend. In the 30 games, the freshmen have combined for 41 goals and 59 assists for 100 points, 15 power-play goals, three short-handed tallies, 10 game-winning goals and are a combined +68. Leading the way are **Kevin Deeth (13g, 16a)** and **Ryan Thang (16g, 12a)** with 29 and 28 points respectively. Thang leads the team with eight power-play goals and is followed by Deeth with six. Thang's four game-winning goals ties him for the team lead and is third in the CCHA and eighth in the nation. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has become a force on the Irish blue line with three goals and 13 assists on the year and is second on the team with a +18. Fellow blueliner **Brett Blatchford** has 14 points on two goals and 12 assists and is +10. Left wing **Dan Kissel** has six goals and three assists for nine points in 16 games. **Christian Minella** has scored one goal and added three assists in 15 games. The freshman class has accounted for 10 of Notre Dame's 23 game-winning goals (Thang - 4, Kissel - 3, Deeth - 2 and Blatchford one).

CCHA WINNING STREAK: Notre Dame saw its eight-game CCHA winning streak come to an end with the 3-2 loss at Western Michigan on Jan. 19. The streak started on Dec. 2 versus Alaska and included two wins versus the Nanooks, two versus Michigan, two against Northern Michigan and a pair versus Lake Superior State. The streak was the longest conference win streak for the Irish in their 17 years (1981-83, 1992-07) in the league. The previous best win streaks were five games (Oct. 9-Oct. 23, 1998 and Feb. 9-Mar. 2, 2002).

BETTER THAN LAST YEAR: With 110 goals in the first 30 games this season (3.67 goals-per-game), Notre Dame has already surpassed its goal total from a year ago when the Irish had 89 goals in 36 games for a 2.47 goals-per-game average. The last time the Irish averaged more than 3.67 goals-per-game was 1990-91 (4.06). This year's Irish offense is tied for sixth in the nation and the +1.93 goals margin is second best in the country.

TOP 10 MEETINGS: The weekend series with Miami (1/26-27) marked the third series for the Irish this season where both teams were ranked in the Top 10. Earlier this season, the Irish faced Michigan State and Michigan when they were in the top 10. Over the program's history, Notre Dame has played in 34 games when both teams were top-10 teams. CLUTCH SCORER: Sophomore **Erik Condra** made the most of his two goals at Lake Superior (1/12 and 1/13). Both of Condra's goals proved to be the game winner. His goal on Jan. 12 came in overtime and was his third game winner. On Saturday, Jan. 13, a second-period power-play goal proved to be the game winner. Condra now has a career-high 11 goals with four of them winning games. His four game winners tie him with teammate **Ryan Thang** for the team lead. Condra now has 17 career goals with five of them the game-deciding goal.

CONDRA CAPERS: Sophomore right wing **Erik Condra** has picked up where he left off as a freshman when he led the Irish in scoring (6g, 28a) as he again leads the team with 11 goals and 24 assists for 35 points. Condra scored two goals and added an assist in the sweep at Lake Superior with both his goals being game winners and now has four on the season. He recorded a career-high five-point game at Robert Morris on Jan. 5, the first five-point game by an Irish player since Dec. 20, 2000 when **Brett Lebda '04** had five points (1g, 4a) in a 7-4 win at Nebraska-Omaha. Condra has four games this season with three or more points.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 2-2 tie with Miami on Jan. 27 was the fourth game this season that saw the Irish go to extra playing time. They are now 1-1-2 in the extra session. On Jan. 12, at Lake Superior, the Irish took a 4-3 overtime win that was the first for the Irish since Dec. 10, 2004 when the Irish defeated Michigan State, 3-2, at the Joyce Center. The last time that the Irish won an overtime game on the road was March 9, 2002, a 2-1 win at Nebraska-Omaha in the CCHA playoffs. In 57 overtime games since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Irish are 8-7-42 in overtime.

ROAD SWEEPS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Bowling Green on Feb. 2-3 was the second road sweep for the Irish this season. They also took two from Lake Superior on Jan. 12-13. That sweep was the first road sweep for Notre Dame since Feb. 14-15, 2003 when they won a pair of games at Bowling Green.

MAD HATTER: Freshman **Kevin Deeth** recorded his first career hat trick in the Jan. 5, 6-2 win over the Robert Morris. The hat trick was the third of the year for the Irish as Deeth joins **Mark Van Guilder** and **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** with three goal games. The last time the Irish had three hat tricks in a season was the 1991-92 campaign when they had four. Deeth is second on the team in scoring with 11 goals and 15 assists for 26 points. He is tied for the team lead with five power-play goals.

PLAYING WITH THE LEAD: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame has played a total of 1818:09 minutes. In those 30 games, the Irish have trailed for just 254:19 minutes (or 14.0% of the time). On the year, the Irish have been in the lead or tied for 86.0% of the time or 1563:50 minutes. That breaks down to being tied for 584:32 minutes (32.1%) and leading 979:18 (53.9%).

BACK WITH A BRONZE: Notre Dame freshman defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** returned to the Irish lineup at Lake Superior State after missing four games while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team at the 2006-07 World Junior Championships in Sweden. Lawson, an alternate captain for the U.S. team, and his teammates collected a bronze medal in the tournament. Lawson has continued his strong rookie season play since returning with a goal and five assists for six points in his eight games back in the lineup. He now leads Irish defensemen in scoring with three goals and 13 assists for 16 points. His +18 is tied for second on the team and is the best among Irish defensemen. Lawson is the 10th Notre Dame player to be selected to the U.S. Junior National Team and the first since **Rob Globke '04** and **Brett Lebda '04** played for the 2001-02 team. Besides Globke and Lebda, the seven other Irish players to play in the world juniors are: **Jack Brownschidle** ('76-'77 and '78-'79), **Ben Simon** ('96-'97 and '97-'98), **Joe Dusbabek** ('97-'98), **Dan Carlson** ('98-'99), **Connor Dunlop** ('99-'00 and '00-'01), **Brett Henning** ('99-'00), **David Inman** ('99-'00). Globke was a member of the 2000-01 and '01-'02 teams while Lebda was on the '01-'02 teams.

HOME SWEET HOME: Notre Dame's loss to Robert Morris on Jan. 7 snapped an 8-0-0 start for the Irish at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 7-11-3 on home ice. Through the first 30 games, the Irish have played just 11 games at home (9-1-1) and 19 on the road (four neutral site games). The Irish are 10-4-1 in away games and 4-0-0 in neutral site games. The last time the Irish won more than 10 games on the road was in 1997-98 when they were 12-11-0 away from the Joyce Center.

SPORTS ILLUSTRATED: The Notre Dame hockey program was featured – "Puck of the Irish," – in the Dec. 11 issue of *Sports Illustrated*. The story was written by Rick Lipsey and covers the fast start in the 2006-07 season by the Irish hockey program.

TURN THE PAIGE: Senior center **Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.)** has picked up points in each of his last three games, recording assists versus Miami (1/27) and in each game of the Bowling Green series. Through 30 games, Paige has eight goals and eight assists for 16 points. His eight assists is a career best while the 16 points ties his career high. His previous best season came in 2003-04 when he had 10 goals and six assists for 16 points, all career highs. He recorded the second two-goal game of his career in the win over Michigan State on Nov. 17. His previous two-goal game came on Feb. 27, 2004, in his freshman year against Michigan. He has already surpassed his totals from last season (4g, 1a, 5pts). One of the top defensive forwards in the CCHA, Paige continues as Notre Dame's top face-off man winning 357-of-602 for a 59.3% success rate.

BLATCHFORD BITS: Freshman defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** set up a pair of goals in the weekend series at Bowling Green to raise his point totals to two goals and 12 assists for 14 points in 21 games this season. Versus Michigan, on Dec. 8, Blatchford had a career-high three assists, including an assist on **Josh Sciba's** second-period game-winning goal. He is tied for third among Notre Dame defensemen in scoring and is fourth among freshmen on the scoresheet.

TWO-GOAL GAMES OR MORE: Scoring is definitely contagious. Through 30 games this season, the Irish have seen players score two or more goals in a game 13 times. Last season, Notre Dame had a total of seven multiple-goal games, including two hat tricks.

SHARE THE WEALTH: Through the first 28 games of the season, all but two Notre Dame players - defensemen **Wes O'Neill (Sr., Essex, Ont.)** and **Dan VeNard (Jr., Vernon Hills, Ill.)** - have scored goals. Notre Dame now has five

players with double-figure totals in goals and nine players have five or more goals. **Ryan Thang** leads the team with 16 goals. Last season, in 36 games, the Irish had just eight players with four or more goals.

A POOLEY HOMECOMING: Notre Dame associate head coach **Paul Pooley** made his fourth homecoming of sorts when the Irish visited Lake Superior (Jan. 12-13). He spent three seasons with the Lakers as an associate head coach to Jeff Jackson from 1991-94. During his tenure, the Lakers advanced to the NCAA finals three times, winning the national title in 1992 and 1994. Earlier this season, Pooley returned home to Ft. Wayne, Ind. on Dec. 30 when played Northern Michigan at Ft. Wayne. As a player, Pooley spent the 1986-87 season with the Ft. Wayne Komets, serving as a co-captain of the Western Division championship team that was 48-28-6. He was fourth in scoring with 28 goals and 44 assists for 72 points. In the fall (No0v. 3-4), he had his number as a player at Ohio State retired in a ceremony held on Sat., Nov. 4 when Notre Dame played at Ohio State. The Irish also played in October at Providence College, where Pooley was the head coach for 11 seasons. A 1984 graduate of Ohio State, Pooley is still the Buckeyes' all-time leading scorer with 114 goals and 156 assists for 270 points. A member of the CCHA's all-Decade Team for the 1980s, Pooley was the CCHA player of the year in 1984 and a first team All-American as he led the nation in scoring with 32 goals and 64 assists for 96 points in 41 games. A three-time CCHA all-academic selection, Pooley was an Academic All-American in his senior year. He began his coaching career at Ohio State as an assistant before joining Jeff Jackson's staff at Lake Superior in 1992. Pooley became the head coach at Providence College in 1994 and was there for 11 seasons where his teams compiled a 185-187-40 record, won one Hockey East title (1995-96) and advanced to the NCAA tournament twice (1996 and 2001). He was selected to the OSU Hall of Fame in 1994. He is the first Ohio State hockey player to have his number retired.

STREAKING IRISH: Notre Dame's 4-2 loss to Robert Morris on Jan. 7 snapped a seven-game winning streak, the longest for the Irish since Nov. 13 to Dec. 4, 1987. The Irish have now won 10 of their last 12 games and 14 of their last 17 since Nov. 10. The Robert Morris loss also ended Notre Dame's eight-game home winning streak to start the season. That was the longest home win streak since Nov. 23, 1990 to Jan. 26, 1991 when that team was in the midst of a 12-game win streak. The Irish are now 8-1-0 at home this season.

IRISH IN NHL BUILDINGS: Notre Dame's win at Mellon Arena on Jan. 5 improved the Irish to 3-0-0 this season in games played in buildings that host teams from the National Hockey League. In October, the Irish won a pair of games at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla., the home of the Tampa Bay Lightning, winning the Lightning College Hockey Classic with a 3-0 win over Army and a 2-0 win over Air Force on Oct. 27-28. Should Notre Dame advance to the CCHA Championship weekend, the Irish would play in a fourth NHL building - Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

JUST JOSHING: Josh Sciba scored his seventh goal of the season at Lake Superior on Jan. 13 in the 4-1 Irish win. He now has seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points to rank sixth on the team. Sciba had a career-best six-game point streak (2g, 5a) snapped in the 2-0 loss at Michigan State (Nov. 18). Nine of his points (4g, 5a) have come on the power play. For his career, Sciba now has 37 career goals with 19 of them coming with the man advantage.

SAWATSKES FOR TWO: Senior defenseman Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.) recorded the first two-point game (1g, 1a) of his collegiate career in the 7-3 win over Michigan on Dec. 8. Prior to that game, Sawatske, who played the first two years of his career at Wisconsin, had one point in a game 19 times in 100 career games. He followed that goal with a goal on Dec. 30 in Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Northern Michigan and his third goal of the year on Jan. 20 at Western Michigan proved to be a game-winning goal.

YOST BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 7-3 win on Dec. 8 at Yost Arena snapped an eight-game Michigan winning streak versus the Irish that covered the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. The win was just the first for the Irish at Yost since Nov. 23, 2002 and snapped a five-game Michigan home winning streak. Since a 9-5 Notre Dame win at Yost on Oct. 22, 1982, the Irish have won just three times at Yost (3-23-1).

LUCKY SEVEN: The seven goals scored by the Irish on Dec. 8 in the 7-3 win versus Michigan were the most scored by the Irish against the Wolverines since Oct. 22, 1982 in a 9-5 Notre Dame win at Yost Arena. In that 54-game span, the Irish scored six goals once and five three times, with Michigan winning 42 times, Notre Dame eight, with four ties.

SCORING DEFENSE: The Irish defense led the way in the win at Western Michigan on Jan. 20, scoring a pair of goals by Tom Sawatske and Brett Blatchford. Add in a power-play goal by Kyle Lawson in the 3-2 loss and the Irish defense had three of ND's five goals on the weekend against the Broncos. The Irish defense now has 10 goals and 65 assists on the season. Freshman Kyle Lawson (3g, 13a) leads the defensemen with 16 points. Noah Babin (Sr., Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.) is second with a goal and 15 assists for 15 points. He is followed by Wes O'Neill (Sr., Essex, Ont.) who has 14 assists on the season and freshman Brett Blatchford who

has two goals and 12 assists for 14 points. Tom Sawatske has three goals and three assists while Dan VeNard (Jr., Vernon Hills, Ill.) has four assists and Brock Sheahan (Jr., Lethbridge, Alb.) has a goal and four assists for the year.

IRISH ADD SEVEN: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that seven players have signed national letters-of-intent to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2007. The group of seven is made up of one goaltender, two defensemen and four forwards. The goaltender is Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.), who is currently a member of the USA Under-18 team as are the two defensemen, Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). All four forwards are currently playing in the USHL. Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) is a member of the Cedar Rapids RoughRiders while Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.) plays for the Waterloo Black Hawks. Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) is with the Tri-City Storm and Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) is in his second year with the Des Moines Buccaneers. Bergman and Ridderwall are the first two Swedish players to play at Notre Dame. Ridderwall and Maday were midget teammates last season with the Chicago Chill. All seven of Notre Dame's recruits for the 2007-08 season are ranked in the National Hockey League's Central Scouting Mid-term Rankings. Phillips is ranked fourth among 30 North American goaltenders and is the highest rated goaltender who will attend college. Leading the skaters is Ruth who is ranked 34th among 210 North American skaters. He is followed by Ryan (50th), Bergman (97th), Ridderwall (109th), Cole (113rd) and Maday (177th).

POWER-PLAY PRODUCER: Wes O'Neill has recorded 14 assists this season. He has led Irish defensemen in scoring in each of the last three seasons. So far this season, nine of his 14 assists have come on the power play. For his career, O'Neill has scored 10 goals and 33 assists on the power play. In 142 all-time games, the veteran defenseman has 14 goals and 57 assists for 71 career points.

FIRST TIMER: Freshman right wing Christian Minella (Aurora, Colo.) had to wait until the 10th game of the season to see his first collegiate hockey action but wasted little time making the most of it. Minella scored his first collegiate goal on his first shot at 9:04 of the first period to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. The last Notre Dame player to score on his first career shot was Tim Wallace '06 who did it on Oct. 11, 2002 at Minnesota-Duluth. The hard-hitting right wing added his first career assist in the 4-1 win over

Michigan State and then had a pair of assists on Dec. 3 in the 6-2 win over Alaska.

TOURNEY HONORS: Three members of the Irish hockey team were selected to the Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team: goaltender David Brown, defenseman Brock Sheahan (Jr., Lethbridge, Alb.) and center Christian Hanson. Hanson was named the tournament's most valuable player as he scored a goal in each game, including the game winner in the championship game versus Air Force.

BEATING THE BEST: Notre Dame has defeated the No. 1 ranked team nine times in the program's 39-year history. Each of the last three times have come at the expense of the Boston College Eagles ('03-'04, '04-'05 and '06-'07). Here's the list of Irish wins versus top-ranked teams in the 39-year history of the program.

FOR OPENERS: With the 6-1 win on Oct. 12 versus Minnesota State, the Irish improved to 20-17-2 in the opening game of the season. The home win gave Notre Dame a 21-17-1 record in home openers. The 3-2 overtime loss on Oct. 14 dropped the Irish to 14-22-3 in road openers. Last season, the Irish dropped both the road opener (3-1 at Colorado College) and the home opener (5-3 to Princeton).

BACK-TO-BACK: The Irish recorded back-to-back hat tricks in the games at Boston College and Providence. In the 7-1 win on Friday night, Mark Van Guilder picked up the second, three-goal game of his career. The following night, Dan Kissel scored three times in the 6-1 win over the Friars. That marked the first time since Feb. 7-8, 1992 that Irish players recorded hat tricks in back-to-back games. On Feb. 7, 1992, Lou Zadra had three versus Western Michigan in a 10-4 loss. The following night, Sterling Black scored three times in a 7-5 loss at Western Michigan.

MINNESOTA MAGIC: Notre Dame's five Minnesota natives had strong weekends in the home-and-home weekend with Minnesota State. Junior Mark Van Guilder had two goals and one assist in the 6-1 win on Thursday. Sophomore Garrett Regan had two goals in the 6-1 win against the Mavericks. Freshman Ryan Thang had a goal and an assist in the season opener. Seniors Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.) was +1 on the weekend and T.J. Jindra (Faribault, Minn.) was even. An adopted son, Kevin Deeth who played two years of prep hockey at Shattuck St. Mary's (Faribault, Minn.), also had two goals and an assist in two games versus MSU.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **T.J. Jindra (Faribault, Minn.)** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the second consecutive season. Jindra becomes the first Irish player to serve as captain twice since Evan Nielsen '03 held the responsibility from 2001-03. There have been 14 players to serve as two-time captains with the Irish. Joining Jindra as alternate captains in '06-'07, are senior center **Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.)** and senior defensemen **Wes O'Neill (Essex, Ont.)** and **Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.)**. Paige has served as an alternate captain since his sophomore year. O'Neill and Sawatske will be alternate captains for the first time at Notre Dame.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

ROOKIE SUCCESS: Sophomore right wing **Erik Condra** led Notre Dame in scoring last season with six goals and 28 assists for 34 points. He became the first Notre Dame freshman to lead the team in scoring since **Jamie Ling '96** led the 1992-93 team with 40 points in his first season. He would go on to lead the Irish in scoring four straight seasons. Condra was selected as Notre Dame's rookie of the year and was selected to the CCHA's all-rookie team. He led all CCHA freshmen in scoring and was seventh in the nation among rookie point scorers.

CCHA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE: Senior **Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.)** was Notre Dame's representative on the CCHA Scholar-Athlete team for the 2005-06 season. Paige was one of 12 players (one from each school) selected to the team by the league's faculty representatives. Paige has a 3.71 grade-point average in finance. He follows former Irish captain, **Cory McLean ('05)**, who was selected as the CCHA's first-ever Scholar-Athlete of the Year award winner following the 2004-05 season. McLean was a five-time Dean's List selection and graduated with a degree in Finance from the Mendoza College of Business with a 3.592 grade-point average. To be considered for the CCHA Scholar-Athlete Award, a player had to have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 through the fall term of the selection year to receive the school's Scholar-Athlete award. The award is selected by the 12 faculty representatives, voting based on a system awarding five points for a first-place vote, three points for a second-place vote and one point for a third-place vote. Previously, the CCHA honored an all-Academic team that saw the Irish have at least one honoree in all but one season (2002-03) since their return to the CCHA in '92-'93. The nine first-team selections were: **Curtis Janicke** and **Carl Picconatto ('92-'93)**, **Garry Gruber ('95-'96)**, **Steve Noble ('96-'97,**

'97-'98), **Forrest Karr** and **Aniket Dhadphale ('98-'99)**, **Andy Jurkowski (99-'00)**, **Dan Carlson (2000-01)**, **David Inman (2001-02)** and **Rob Globke (2003-04)**. During that 12-year span, only Western Michigan (14) produced more CCHA All-Academic selections than Notre Dame's 11.

TURNAROUND YEAR: A year ago, the Notre Dame hockey team turned in a 13-19-4 record in **Jeff Jackson's** first season behind the bench. A closer look at the mark shows vast improvement for the Irish. Through the first 13 games of the season, Notre Dame was 3-9-1. Over the remaining 23 contests, the Irish were 10-10-3. In CCHA play, Notre Dame went from 3-20-5 in '04-'05 to 11-13-4 in '05-'06, a 15-point improvement from one season to the next. Only Miami's 16-point improvement in the standings was better than Notre Dame's 15-point turnaround.

IRON MAN: Graduated right wing **Tim Wallace (Anchorage, Alaska)** finished his Notre Dame career in 2005-06 as the Notre Dame's all-time "Iron Man." Wallace played in every game of his career, 153 in all. He finished third on the all-time games played list for his four seasons with the Irish. Junior center **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** is next in line as he now has played in every game in his first two-plus seasons for a total of 103 consecutive games.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame sophomore **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth Irish player whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have four players on the 2006-07 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, sophomore right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators. He is joined by freshman defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall. Condra and Lawson are joined by senior defenseman **Wes O'Neill (Essex, Ont.)** who was chosen in the fourth round of the 2004 Entry Draft, 115th overall by the New York Islanders. Also selected in 2004 was senior goaltender **David Brown (Stony Creek, Ont.)** who went in the eighth round, 228th overall to the Pittsburgh Penguins.

PLAYING IN THE NHL: At times during the 2005-06 season, Notre Dame had five former players in the NHL at the same time. The five

were: **Ben Simon '00** (Columbus), **Rob Globke '04** (Florida), **Brett Lebda '04** (Detroit), **Mark Eaton** (Nashville) and **Yan Stastny** (Edmonton-Boston). Only one other time, have the Irish had five players in the NHL in one season. That came during the 1982-83 campaign when the Irish had five players see time, in the NHL. That group included: **Jim Brown '82** (three games with Los Angeles), **Jack Brownschidle '77** (72 games with St. Louis), **Jeff Brownschidle '81** (four games with Hartford), **Don Jackson '78** (71 games with Edmonton) and **Dave Poulin '82** (two games with Philadelphia). As of Jan. 30, Eaton (Pittsburgh) and Lebda (Detroit) are skating with their NHL teams. Stastny was playing for Boston before he was traded to St. Louis and assigned to the Blues' AHL team in Peoria and Globke has spent time with Florida this season.

HOMETOWNS: The 2006-07 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states and two Canadian provinces - Alberta and Ontario. Over the past 12 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Wisconsin, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, the Irish have their first-ever player from the state of Washington – freshman **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor)**.
