### NOTRE DAME-OHIO STATE HISTORY

- Notre Dame leads the all-time series, 3-1, although all four meetings have been settled by seven points or less.
- One of the more unique games in the history of both programs occurred on Nov. 9, 2012, as the teams played on the flight deck of the USS Yorktown, docked in Mount Pleasant, South Carolina. The first women's Carrier Classic saw the Irish claim a 66-62 win behind a double-double from Natalie Achonwa with 17 points and 10 rebounds.
- The sides last met on Dec. 2, 2015, at Purcell Pavilion with the Irish claiming a 75-72 win during the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. **Madison Cable** had a double-double for the Irish with 25 points and 11 rebounds while **Lindsay Allen** scored 20. Kelsey Mitchell scored a game-high 27 for the Buckeyes while Shayla Cooper had a double-double with 18 points and 15 rebounds.

### NOTRE DAME-BIG TEN HISTORY

- Notre Dame is 3-0 this year against Big Ten teams, beating Iowa, 73-58, on Nov. 30 in Iowa City, Michigan State, 79-61, on Dec. 20 in East Lansing, and Purdue, 88-82 in overtime, on Sunday night at Purcell Pavilion.
- Notre Dame is on a 18-game winning streak against Big Ten teams (at game time), dating back to a loss to Minnesota in the 2009 NCAA Championship. That run extends to 26 games if counting wins against Maryland and Rutgers when they competed in the ACC and BIG EAST, respectively.
- This marks just the second time Notre Dame has played members of the same conference in consecutive NCAA tournament games, the other coming in 2014 when the Irish defeated Big 12 members Oklahoma State and Baylor in the Sweet 16 and Elite Eight, respectively.
- The Irish are 6-5 against the Big Ten (at game time) in NCAA play and 8-5 counting two wins over Maryland when the Terapins competed in the ACC.
- The only other time Notre Dame played two Big Ten teams in the same tournament was 2001 when the Irish beat Michigan in the second round and Purdue in the national championship game.

### NOTRE DAME IN THE NCAAs

- Notre Dame is making its 24th appearance in the NCAA Championship and its 22nd in a row.
- The Irish stand at 55-22 all-time in NCAA play, highlighted by the 2001 national championship.
- Notre Dame has advanced to seven Final Fours (including a run of five straight from 2011-15) and five national championship games. The Irish have advanced to seven Eight Eights and 15 Sweet 16s, including each of the last eight.
- The Irish have won at least one game in 20 of their 24 trips to the NCAAs, including each of the last eight since a first round loss to Minnesota in 2009.

### NOTRE DAME IN THE NCAA HISTORY BOOK

- Notre Dame's 22 consecutive NCAA Championship appearances are the fourth-longest active streak in the nation and the fifth-longest of all-time.

• Notre Dame has had success once reaching the tournament field. Its seven Final Four appearances are the fifth-most of any school. Only Tennessee (18), UConn (17), Stanford (12) and Louisiana Tech (10) have been to more.

**NOTRE DAME AS A #1-SEED**

- This is the seventh time that Notre Dame has claimed a No. 1-seed and the sixth year in a row.
- The Irish are 29-5 all-time when playing as a top seed with four of the losses coming to fellow No. 1 seeds.
- Notre Dame first found itself on the top line in 2001 and went on to claim the national championship.
- The current run of six-straight years as a No. 1-seed began in 2012. Over that time, the Irish have advanced to four Final Fours and made three appearances in the national championship game.

**HOME SWEET HOME FOR FIRST WEEKEND**

- This year marked the 12th time that Notre Dame played host to NCAA Championship action and the fourth in a row.
- The Irish are 18-2 in NCAA play at Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center, including wins in each of their last 12 contests.
- Curiously, both of the losses have come against Minnesota with the Golden Gophers upsetting the Irish in both 1994 and 2009 during games that matched seventh-seeded Notre Dame and 10th-seeded Minnesota.
- Ten of the 12 years where Notre Dame has hosted, the games were first and second round matchups. The lone exceptions came in 1983 and 2014 when the Irish played host to a regional. In 2014, Notre Dame downed Oklahoma State and Baylor to advance to the Final Four in Nashville, Tennessee. Serving a neutral site in 1983, Georgia beat Tennessee to advance to the Final Four in Norfolk, Virginia, after beating Indiana and Ole Miss, respectively.

**CONFERENCE TOURNAMENT SUCCESS**

- The Irish now claim a 15-game conference tournament winning streak after sweeping its three games this year, including a perfect 12-0 mark in ACC play.
- Overall, Notre Dame is 48-19 in conference tournament play, including its time in the MCC (now Horizon League), BIG EAST and ACC.
- The Irish won their 10th conference tournament championship and fifth in a row. Nationally, only Notre Dame and Albany (America East) have won their conference tournament each of the past five years.
- This year marked the eighth consecutive year the Irish have played for a conference tournament championship, going 5-3. The Irish fell to UConn in 2010-12 (all played in Hartford), downed the Huskies in the 2013 BIG EAST final at the XL Center, and then won ACC crowns against Duke (2014), Florida State (2015), Syracuse (2016) and Duke (2017).

**IRISH AMONG HOTTEST TEAMS IN THE COUNTRY**

- Notre Dame rides a 16-game winning streak into the NCAA's Sweet 16. This streak stands as the second-longest active winning streak nationally behind only UConn (109). The Irish have not lost since a Jan. 16 setback at Tennessee.
- The Irish also won each of their last 18 ACC games of the year (regular season and tournament). The run ties New Mexico State (WAC) for the fourth-longest active conference winning streak in the country.
- Helping the Irish to these runs has been its success away from Purcell Pavilion. The Irish went 12-2 on the road this year. As of Monday, only UConn (14) and Belmont (13) had more road wins in 2016-17.

**FIFTH TEACHER VS. PUPIL MATCHUP FOR MCGRAW**

- While **Muffet McGraw's** coaching tree features several collegiate head coaches, the Sweet 16 matchup with Ohio State is just the fifth time she has faced a pupil head-to-head. She is 4-0 to date in these games.
- McGraw faced Kevin McGuff's Buckeyes in the 2015 ACC/Big Ten Challenge and came away with a 75-72 win at the Joyce Center. McGuff was an assistant at Notre Dame from 1996-2002.
- McGraw faced Coquese Washington, her former player and assistant - now head coach at Penn State, on Dec. 4, 2013, also in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. The Irish won that game, 77-67, in State College.
- One of McGraw's original Irish assistants, Bill Fennelly, later became head coach at Toledo. The Irish downed Fennelly's Rockets in both the 1989 WNIT and 1990 regular season.
- McGraw got a taste of this phenomenon from the other side of the fence earlier this year as her team took on her college coach and mentor Jim Foster's Chattanooga Mocs on Dec. 27. The Irish claimed that matchup, 79-58, in Chattanooga as McGraw improved to 6-3 in her career against Foster. Their meetings on the court have swayed significantly based on McGraw's employer at the time. As head coach at Lehigh, she went 0-3 against Foster's St. Joseph's teams. Since coming to Notre Dame, she is 6-0 against Foster-coached teams: 1-0 vs. St. Joseph's, 1-0 vs. Vanderbilt, 2-0 vs. Ohio State and 2-0 vs. Chattanooga.

**THE TIES THAT BIND**

- The links between the Notre Dame and Ohio State coaching staffs are deeper than merely basketball.
- McGuff's wife, Letitia Bowen, was a four-year monogram winner for the Irish and still ranks second in school history with 999 career rebounds. Bowen later served as an assistant coach under **Muffet McGraw** when the couple began dating.
- McGraw is Godmother to McGuff's eldest daughter, Kilyn, while associate head coach **Niele Ivey** is Godmother to McGuff's daughter, Lily.
- After playing for McGuff at Notre Dame, Ivey got her break into the coaching profession as an administrative assistant under McGuff at Xavier from 2005-07.

**MY OLD KENTUCKY HOME**

- **Erin Boley** is making a return trip to her home state where she was Kentucky's Miss Basketball in 2016.
- The Irish have generally enjoyed Homecoming games of late. The last time a Notre Dame player from outside of Indiana did not win a game played in her home state came on Feb. 28, 2011, when the Irish fell to No. 12 DePaul in Chicago, Illinois, home state of Devereaux Peters (Chicago) and Kaila Turner (Joliet).

**IRISH NET 30 WINS**

• Notre Dame claimed its 30th win of the season when the Irish beat Duke to win the ACC championship on March 5. It marked the seventh consecutive 30-win season for Notre Dame and the ninth in school history, joining the 1996-97 and 2000-01 squads.

• Nationally, only UConn has a longer active streak of 30-win seasons at 12. Baylor matches the Irish with a streak that began in 2010-11.

• This is the sixth consecutive year where Notre Dame has started a season 30-3 or better.

• The 2010-11 team was the last one to win less than 30 of its first 33 games and that squad still stood at a solid 26-7 at that late-season juncture.

• This season marks the 11th year in a row and the 23rd time in the past 24 years in which Notre Dame has won at least 20 games. It marks the 12th Irish team to win at least 25 games in a season, all coming under **Muffet McGraw's** tutelage.

• The Irish also won at least 10 league games this season. Notre Dame has claimed double-digit league wins in 20 of its 21 years in the BIG EAST and ACC combined, going 8-8 in 2005-06 league play for the lone exception.

**ALLEN, TURNER, YOUNG AND BOLEY HONORED BY ACC**

• **Brianna Turner** stopped plenty of opponents this winter and the ACC's coaches couldn't be stopped from recognizing her as the league's defensive player of the year. She also won the accolade in 2015-16 and was the ACC's rookie of the year in 2014-15.

• The junior center leads the ACC, and ranks 16th nationally in blocked shots with 86 on the year. Her 263 career blocked shots already rank ninth in ACC history and second in Irish lore behind only Ruth Riley's 370. Turner is eighth among all

active players in blocked shots and second among her peers in the junior class. The centerpiece in a defense which held its foes to 61.5 points per game and a .390 shooting percentage while facing the nation's second-toughest schedule, Turner also has 28 steals and 7.1 rebounds per game.

• Turner and **Lindsay Allen** were named to the all-ACC first team while **Jackie Young** was named all-freshman by both the league's coaches and media.

• Allen has yet to miss a start in her 147 games at Notre Dame and, on March 3, the school's 30-year-old career assist record - now boasting 825. On the season, she has helped 266 buckets, ranking first on the school's single-season chart. The two-year team captain also broke the ACC career assist record of 785 set from 2004-08 by Virginia's Sharnee Zoll. Allen both leads the ACC and ranks among the top four nationally in assists, assists per game and assist to turnover ratio. She chips in 9.4 points per game and has 79 steals to place among the league leaders there as well.

• Young has averaged 7.2 points per game in her debut campaign for the Irish, appearing in 31 of the team's 35 games. She averages 4.7 rebounds per game, fourth on the squad. Her career-high 12 rebounds proved to be crucial in the narrow Feb. 19 win at No. 21 Syracuse. An athletic presence whose defense has continued to improve along with her renowned scoring touch, Young also contributed 38 assists and 26 steals while blocking eight shots. She was named the ACC Rookie of the Week twice this year, claiming the prize on both Dec. 5 and Feb. 13.

• Also, **Erin Boley** earned a spot on the ACC's All-Academic team for her combination of good grades and good play.

**ABOUT TO BE NUMBER ONE FOR THREE**

• Notre Dame has made 199 3-pointers this season, 14 shy of the most in school history. The 2015-16 set Notre Dame's best outside-shooting mark by making 207.

• This year's Irish team has shot .395 from downtown, sixth-best in school history.

**CONSISTENT WINNERS**

• Notre Dame has been one of the best teams in the nation on an annual basis in recent vintage. Over the past six seasons (2011-12 through Friday night), only UConn (218) has won more games than Notre Dame's 208. Baylor has claimed 207. Stanford (184) and Maryland (183) round out the top five.

**IRISH AMONG TOP SHOOTING TEAMS**

• Notre Dame has proved to be one of the best shooting teams in the nation this season. The Irish stand fourth in field goal percentage at 49.5 and third in 3-point field goal percentage at 39.5. It has added up to a team ranked 13th in scoring offense at 79.7 points per game.

• The Irish are vying to be the second team to ever lead the ACC in field goal percentage four years in a row, joining Duke's eight-year run from 1999-2006.

• Other team categories where the Irish collectively excel and rank in the top 25 include assist to turnover ratio (5th at 1.45), assists (6th with 662), assists per game (6th at 18.9), scoring margin (9th at +18.2), rebounding margin (19th at +7.5) and rebounds (22nd at 1,381). The Irish are on the cusp of the top 25 in fewest turnovers per game (27th at 13.0), blocked shots (37th with 157), steals (38th at 318) and turnover margin (40th with +3.31).

• Three-time Nancy Lieberman Award finalist **Lindsay Allen** has made a claim to her status as the country's top point guard, not only in how she keeps the Irish under control, but also for her passing ability. Allen is second nationally with 266 assists and fourth with 7.6 assists per game. Allen is currently fourth with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 3.59 and led the nation in this field entering the Dec. 20 game at Michigan State. She leads the ACC in all three categories as well.

• Allen's 825 career assists lead all active players, well ahead of Northwestern's Ashley Deary's 788.

• Allen is also 42nd nationally in steals (79) and 19th in minutes played (1,201).

• **Brianna Turner** has shot the ball well this year and stands eighth nationally with her field goal percentage of 61.9%. Her recent surge has also left her 16th nationally in blocked shots with 86. Turner and West Virginia's Lanay Montgomery are the only players in the nation to rank in the top 20 for both field goal percentage and blocked shots. Turner also stands 31st nationally with 226 field goals made.

• The Irish top the ACC as a team in assists, assists per game, assist-to-turnover ratio, field goal percentage, fewest fouls per game and 3-point field goal percentage.

• Individually, Allen leads the elite league in assists, assists per game and assist-to-turnover ratio. Turner is the ACC leader in blocked shots, blocked shots per game and field goal percentage.

**BIG SCORING NIGHTS ON THE RISE**

• **Marina Mabrey** poured in 21 points during the NCAA second round win over Purdue. The offensive output reflects a growing trend for the Irish in 2016-17. Last season, Notre Dame recorded a 20-point individual game 16 times. This year, with basketball left to be played, Notre Dame has already produced 22 games with 20 points.

• This season, Mabrey has nine and **Brianna Turner** has seven 20-point efforts while **Arike Ogunbowale** has five 20-point games to her credit. **Jackie Young** hit that plateau once, Dec. 4 vs. Valparaiso.

• A year ago, **Madison Cable** produced six 20-point games while Turner added four and **Lindsay Allen** had three. Mabrey, her sister **Michaela Mabrey**, and Ogunbowale had one apiece.

• Ogunbowale and Turner have hit the 30-point mark once apiece with Turner recording 31 at Syracuse (Feb. 19) and Ogunbowale scoring 30 against Central Michigan (Nov. 11). Notre Dame did not have any 30-point games a season ago.

• Seven of Mabrey's nine 20-point games came against ACC competition.

**HOME COURT ADVANTAGE**

• When playing at home, Notre Dame has enjoyed its typical home court advantage as provided by its incredibly loyal lime green-glad fans. Entering the NCAA Championship's first weekend, the Irish ranked sixth nationally in average attendance (8,444) and also sixth in total (126,657) home attendance. Notre Dame was second nationally for operating at 92.29% of capacity at 9,149 seat Purcell Pavilion at the Joyce Center, narrowly behind Gonzaga's 93.63%.

• This advantage has played itself out particularly notably in conference play. Notre Dame has won a school-record 42 consecutive home conference games, beginning with a 66-47 win over Providence on Feb. 14, 2012, in BIG EAST play.

• Notre Dame is 32-0 at Purcell Pavilion in ACC play, going 8-0 in 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. In fact, the Irish have never lost at home to an (active at game time) ACC team in **Muffet McGraw's** 30 years at the helm. The last time Notre Dame lost at the Joyce Center to an team representing the ACC was a 69-48 setback against No. 20 Maryland on Jan. 10, 1987.

• The Irish offense has been notably more potent at home, averaging 79.7 points per game as opposed to 74.7 on the road. However, Notre Dame's defense has not missed a beat regardless of venue posting remarkably similar numbers. The Irish have held foes to 61.5 points per game and .390 shooting at home while permitting 63.1 points per game and .402 shooting on the road.

• Notre Dame's Feb. 26 matinee vs. Florida State drew a sellout crowd of 9,149. It marked the 52nd sellout in Irish history and the fourth this year, joining the Dec. 7 game against UConn, the Jan. 29 contest vs. Virginia and the Feb. 12 game against Georgia Tech.

### NOT FOULING FAIRLY WELL

• While playing solid defense this year, Notre Dame has done it in a smart manner. The Irish are leading the ACC with just 15.6 fouls per game called against them.

• Notre Dame has only had four players foul out this season, **Kristina Nelson** at Chattanooga and vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, **Brianna Turner** at NC State and **Kathryn Westbeld** vs. Purdue.

• Only Duke (1) has fewer foul-outs in the ACC this year while the four disqualifications by the Irish tie for the 19th-fewest nationally.

### FRIDAY, I'M IN LOVE

• Heading into Friday's game, Notre Dame has only played three other Friday games this year and won them all.

• The first was the season opener back on Nov. 11 against Central Michigan and it proved to be one of Notre Dame's most lopsided wins. Behind 30 points from **Arike Ogunbowale**, the Irish beat the Chippewas, 107-47, in the opening round of the Preseason WNIT. The Irish shot 61.5% from the floor and 54.5% from 3-point range.

• The second was Notre Dame's 76-59 win over Virginia in the ACC quarterfinals on March 3. **Lindsay Allen** had a double-double with 12 points and 10 assists while Ogunbowale led all scorers with 19.

• Most recently, the Irish rolled to a 79-49 win over Robert Morris on March 17 in the first round of the NCAA Championship. Ogunbowale and **Brianna Turner** each had double-doubles in the victory.

### TURNOVERS NOT IN THE CARDS

• In Notre Dame history, the Irish have played four games in which the team committed five turnovers or less. Curiously, two of them have come this year and against Louisville.

• On Feb. 6, Notre Dame tied a school record by committing just three turnovers against the Cardinals. In the "Big Monday" win, the Irish did not commit a single turnover until there was 1:24 left in the third quarter.

• On March 4 in the ACC semifinals, the Irish turned the ball over just five times in a win over the Cardinals. Notre Dame had just two first half turnovers and both of them came on offensive fouls as opposed to ball-handling miscues.

• The lopsided turnover margins added up to a combined 44-8 edge for the Irish in points off turnovers during the

two victories over Louisville.

• Prior to this year, the only times the Irish had ever committed fewer than six turnovers in a game came on Nov. 16, 2007, when the Irish turned the ball over just three times in a loss at Maryland, and Feb. 1, 2016, when Notre Dame had five turnovers in a win at Duke.

### FAST STARTS KEY

• Notre Dame has been at its best this year when getting off to a fast start to games. Out of the four quarters of a game, Notre Dame has scored the most points (753) and has by far the widest scoring margin (+222) in the first quarter of any single stanza.

• In 35 games this year, Notre Dame has only trailed five times after 10 minutes of play. Not completely by coincidence, those five games (UConn, NC State, Duke, Syracuse and Purdue) include two of the team's three losses.

• The Irish have held a lead after the first quarter in 29 of their 35 games while standing tied with TCU, 22-22, after the first quarter of an eventual Notre Dame win on Nov. 26.

• This trend extends back to last season when the NCAA switched from halves to quarters. The 2015-16 Irish scored 719 first quarter points - the most of any 10-minute segment. Last year's team saw its lowest quarterly defensive output and scoring margin totals still come in the first half of games, but in the second quarter.

### GETTING A LEAD AND KEEPING IT

• Tennessee accomplished a rare feat in rallying back from a 44-31 halftime deficit to upset Notre Dame on Jan. 16 at Thompson-Boling Arena. The game snapped a streak of 157 consecutive wins for the Irish when leading at halftime.

• The last time the Irish had previously led a game after 20 minutes but did not win the contest came on Feb. 12, 2012, when Notre Dame led West Virginia 33-30 at intermission but would go on to lose to the Mountaineers, 65-63.

• This trend is not new. Notre Dame is 406-20 (.953) since 2000-01 when leading at the half, including a 29-1 mark this season.

### McGRAW WINS 850TH GAME & 750TH AT NOTRE DAME

• The Women's Basketball Hall of Fame career of **Muffet McGraw** reached yet another pair of milestone this season. She claimed her 750th win at Notre Dame on Jan. 22 at North Carolina and her 850th win overall in the ACC championship game win over Duke on March 5.

• She is one of just four women (and seven overall) to win at least 750 women's basketball games at a single Division I school, joining Pat Summitt (Tennessee), Tara VanDerveer (Stanford) and Jody Conradt (Texas).

• McGraw's 852 career wins overall including her five years at Lehigh are the sixth-most all-time by a female Division I women's basketball coach (10th overall).

• All of the other women on these two charts are also enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, an honor for which McGraw is a finalist in 2017.

### McGraw Named Hall of Fame Finalist

- Already enshrined in the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, **Muffet McGraw** took the penultimate step towards the sport's ultimate lifetime honor as she was included on the list of 14 finalists for the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame's Class of 2017, announced on Feb. 18.
- Also a finalist for enshrinement in 2016, McGraw will learn if she is one of the latest enshrines on April 3 at the men's basketball Final Four in Glendale, Arizona. Joining McGraw as women's committee finalists are Rebecca Lobo, Kim Mulkey and the pioneering teams from Wayland Baptist University as a collective unit.
- McGraw, who guided the Irish to the 2001 national championship and seven Final Four appearances, is the winningest single-sport coach in Irish lore with 764 wins. Over her 35-year coaching career, McGraw is 852-267 (.761), making her the sixth-winningest active coach nationally and the 10th-winningest all-time at the Division I level.
- She is the 2017 recipient of the Wooden Awards' Legends of Coaching Award, becoming just the third female to receive this honor, joining Tennessee's Pat Summitt and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer. She is the fourth women's coach to be recognized with this honor, joining Summitt, VanDerveer and UConn's Geno Auriemma.
- Among many accomplishments, McGraw is one of five Division I coaches with 800 wins, seven Final Fours and five NCAA title game appearances, joining Summitt, Auriemma, Duke men's coach Mike Krzyzewski and North Carolina men's coach Dean Smith, all of whom are enshrined in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.
- She is also the only coach to be named the consensus national coach of the year three times, sweeping the Associated Press, Women's Basketball Coaches Association, Naismith Award and United States Basketball Writers Association honors in 2001, 2013 and 2014.

### Consistent ACC Success for Irish

- Since joining the ACC for the 2013-14 season, Notre Dame has been the league's top program, compiling a 62-2 regular season record and winning three consecutive regular season and tournament championship doubles. The Irish are 74-2 in ACC competition, including league tournaments.
- Notre Dame's current 12-game ACC Tournament winning streak is the longest since North Carolina won 13 in a row from 2005-09.
- The Irish have lost no more than one ACC league game each of the past four years - the longest such streak in conference history. Duke went three consecutive years from 2002-04 with no more than one ACC loss per season.
- The first loss came at Miami on Jan. 8, 2015, and the Irish won all 29 regular season games and 35 games in a row vs. ACC teams including conference tournament play until the Dec. 29 loss at NC State.
- The 35-game ACC streak including tournament games is the 15th-longest in NCAA history and the second-longest in ACC history behind a 51-game run by Duke from 2001-04.

- The 29-game ACC regular season winning streak is the 24th-longest such streak in NCAA history and the second-longest in ACC history behind just a 42-game run by Duke from 2001-04.
- The Irish maintain an active streak of 32 consecutive home wins in ACC play, part of an overall streak of 42 consecutive home league wins including the final years of Notre Dame's BIG EAST membership.

### Irish Routinely Play the Best

- Notre Dame ranks second in nation in the NCAA's strength of schedule measure as its opposition has combined for a .666 winning percentage. That mark is outdistanced only by UConn's .689.
- Prior to the Dec. 27 game at four-time defending Southern Conference champion Chattanooga, every team Notre Dame had faced this year entered the game with both a winning record and no more than three losses, including seven undefeated teams.
- As a curious function of opening the season with the 16-team bracketed Preseason WNIT, along with winning each contest itself, each of Notre Dame's first six games this year saw a matchup of undefeated teams.
- UConn was the seventh undefeated team the Irish faced in the first nine games this season - all of which saw Notre Dame come into the contest undefeated as well.
- Notre Dame opened 2016-17 by facing six similarly undefeated schools in Central Michigan (0-0), Fordham (1-0), Green Bay (2-0), Washington (3-0), Louisiana-Lafayette (1-0) and TCU (4-0), defeating each of them.
- The Nov. 30 game at then-5-2 Iowa in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge was the first for the Irish this season against a team which had previously lost a game.

### Notre Dame Faced Challenging Foes All Year

- While Notre Dame's strength of schedule benefits immensely from playing in the ACC, which received seven NCAA bids including five top-four seeds, the Irish did not limit their tournament-testing to just conference play.
- Notre Dame played seven non-conference teams which earned NCAA Championship berths (Chattanooga, DePaul, Green Bay, Michigan State, Tennessee, Toledo and Washington).
- Adding to the non-conference challenges, Notre Dame played five of these seven games on the road, travelling to face NCAA selections Chattanooga, DePaul, Michigan State, Tennessee and Toledo on their home floors.

### 11 Would Be Heaven

- The Dec. 20 game at Michigan State, the Dec. 27 game at Chattanooga and Feb. 19 game at Syracuse have been the only three this season in which Notre Dame's entire roster was available to play with the Michigan State and Chattanooga contests being the only ones in which they did play.
- The most recent player to miss time for injury and/or illness is **Mychal Johnson** who hurt her shoulder in practice on Jan. 25 and sat out until that Syracuse game where she injured her ankle in the penultimate second of the second quarter. She remained out of the lineup with that ankle injury until the NCAA first round game against Robert Morris.

- Johnson's loss overlapped with the return of **Kathryn Westbeld** who hurt her ankle in practice on Jan. 18 and missed the Boston College (Jan. 19) and North Carolina (Jan. 22) before returning to the lineup against Duke (Jan. 26). She has played mostly off the bench since based on need and sat out a few games entirely to help recover.
- Additionally, **Jackie Young** has missed five games due to knee and ankle injuries while being limited in several other midseason contests as she recovered from the ankle injury. Fellow former Indiana Miss Basketball **Ali Patberg** missed 10 games with a virus and also saw limited action in a few midseason games as she continued to regain her strength. She also missed the Georgia Tech game with the flu.
- Senior **Diamond Thompson** has missed multiple games this year due to a combination of injury and illness.
- Junior **Brianna Turner** joins this list for the Sweet 16 after suffering a season-ending knee injury against Purdue on March 19.

### Allen Assist Chart Watch

- **Lindsay Allen's** name appears countless places in Notre Dame's record book and she moved up the final rung on a major career-leaders chart on March 3 when she surpassed **Mary Gavin's** 30-year old school record of 778 career assists.
- Allen has reached this total at a clip of 5.6 assists per game - second in Irish lore behind **Mary Gavin** (7.0).
- Allen not only is leaving an impact on the Notre Dame records, but, as a part of the first class of four-year ACC Irish players, she is also historically doing it in conference history. Allen also stands first in ACC history for the most career assists, breaking that record on March 3 in the ACC quarterfinal win over Virginia. That game was the first of three consecutive double-digit assist games for Allen, tying the school record. She would be named the tournament MVP after setting a record with 33 assists during the event.

**ALLEN COLLECTS HISTORIC DOUBLE-DOUBLE**

• The Notre Dame career of **Lindsay Allen** has been unconventional in that she started the opening game of her freshman year and has yet to miss one, starting all 146 contests of her time at Notre Dame to date.  
 • In the first 134 starts, Allen had recorded a triple-double (Dec. 27 at Chattanooga) but she had yet to record a true double-double until Jan. 29 when she had a career-high-tying 11 rebounds plus 10 assists against Virginia.  
 • Naturally, Allen's first double-double would prove unconventional. It is believed to be the first in Notre Dame history that has not included points as one of the double digit categories.

**ALLEN'S QUITE A THIEF TOO**

• In addition to her success guiding the Irish offense, **Lindsay Allen** has also proven to be a solid defender during her time at Notre Dame.  
 • With her five-steal effort against Duke in the ACC championship game on March 5, she moved into ninth place on the school's career chart. She currently has 225.

• Notre Dame got an up close look at the leading scorer in NCAA history, Kelsey Plum, when the Irish downed Washington, 71-60, on Nov. 20 in the championship game of the Preseason WNIT.  
 • Plum averages 31.8 points per game this year, leading the nation by 5.8 points per game. However, against a combination of Irish defenders, the senior was held to "just" 22 points while playing a full 40 minutes. That sum from November still holds up as her lowest scoring outing of the season except for a 21-point game against Washington State on Dec. 27 where she also played seven fewer minutes.

**MATCHING MILLENNIAL MILESTONES**

• Less than two minutes into the Iowa game on Nov. 30, **Brianna Turner** became the 36th player in Irish lore to crack the 1,000 career point plateau when **Marina Mabrey** lobbed a pass over the arms of a defender in the paint.  
 • **Lindsay Allen** had previously hit the 1,000-point marker this season during the game on Nov. 17 against Green Bay.  
 • Notre Dame last had two players reach the 1,000 career point plateau in the same season in 2013 when **Kayla McBride** and **Natalie Achonwa** each hit the millennial mark. Seven other Irish teams also saw two players hit the milestone but the school record of three was set back in 1985 (**Trena Keys**, **Mary Beth Schueth** and **Carrie Bates**).  
 • Notre Dame has seen at least one player reach 1,000 career points in eight of the last nine years with the exception coming in 2014-15.

• As a part of a six-block night at Chattanooga on Dec. 27, junior **Brianna Turner** recorded her 200th career blocked shot when she rejected Jasmine Joyner's shot with 8:19 left in the third quarter for her fourth block of the game.  
 • Turner is the third Irish player with 200 career blocks, joining **Ruth Riley** (370) and **Devereaux Peters** (227).  
 • Turner ranks tied for eighth among all active players nationally with her 263 career blocks and second among juniors.  
 • Additionally, Turner's 263 blocks rank ninth in ACC history.  
 • Turner found her shot-blocking form after a slow start. After swatting away just 14 shots over Notre Dame's first 11 games, she recorded 72 blocks in her last 24 games, an average of 3.0 per game that exceeds her career average of 2.7 blocked shots per game.

• Junior **Brianna Turner** is seldom shy about shooting the ball, taking 960 shots to date in her 100-game Irish career (9.6 shots per game). Where she has been historically great though is her conversion rate on her shots.  
 • Turner has connected on 597 of her 960 career field goals for a .622 percentage. This success rate stands second in Irish lore (trailing just **Ruth Riley's** .632) and fourth in ACC history.  
 • Turner is the only player to rank among top 10 in the nation in field goal percentage each of the past two seasons and is likely to make it three in a row currently standing eighth at .619. She led the nation as a freshman at .652 and ranked fifth her sophomore year at .593.

**ALLEN ALWAYS THERE FOR IRISH**

• Senior **Lindsay Allen** has proved to be both dependable and durable throughout her Irish career and those numbers are reflected in her standing on several Notre Dame career record charts. The point guard has never missed a start in her Notre Dame career and seldom even leaves the court. Nine times this season (and 13 times in her career), Allen has played all 40 minutes of a game - including a full 45-minute effort in the overtime win over Purdue on March 19.  
 • Allen's streak of 147 consecutive starts has long since set a school record. She eclipsed the previous school record of 144 total games started by **Skylar Diggins** from 2009-13 with her start against Duke on March 5 in the championship game of the ACC Tournament.  
 • Allen's 147 consecutive games started streak is believed to be an NCAA record.  
 • Notre Dame boasts a 138-9 (.939) record in games started by Allen.  
 • Allen ranks second in school history with 4,476 career minutes played. Fittingly, Allen had two assists in the milestone 4,000th minute of her career, coming Jan. 26 vs. Duke.

**PATTERSON NAMED McDONALD'S ALL-AMERICAN**

- For the sixth consecutive year, the Irish are congratulating one of its signees for their selection to the prestigious McDonald's All-American teams as **Danielle Patterson** (Brooklyn, New York / The Mary Louis Academy) is the latest future Irish student-athlete to earn this distinction.
- Patterson will be one of eight McDonald's All-Americans on next year's roster, matching a school record set this season as Patterson would replace the graduating **Lindsay Allen** (2013) on this honored roll. Patterson will join McDoanld's All-America Game alumni **Erin Boley** (2016), **Marina Mabrey** (2015), **Arike Ogunbowale** (2015), **Ali Patberg** (2015), **Brianna Turner** (2014), **Kathryn Westbeld** (2014) and **Jackie Young** (2016) on the 2017-18 Notre Dame team.
- Notre Dame's other signee for next year, **Mikayla Vaughn**, is playing for one of the top team in the nation as her Paul VI High School in Fairfax, Virginia sat as the No. 1 team in the nation in the espnW, USA Today and MaxPreps polls until late February. Vaughn was a nominee for the McDonald's All-American team for her leading role in helping the Panthers to a current run of 34 consecutive wins.
- Patterson, who averages 22 points, eight rebounds and four assists per game this season, becomes the 18th McDonald's All-American to join the Irish since the boys program was extended to include girls in 2002.

**IRISH HELD UNANIMOUS POLE POSITION**

- Notre Dame received the No. 1 spot in the preseason Associated Press poll. Notre Dame stood at No. 2 in the preseason coaches poll but leapt up to No. 1 on Nov. 15, surpassing defending national champion Connecticut.
- This year marked Notre Dame's first time holding the AP's top spot entering a season.
- The only other time the Irish sat atop the AP poll came during the 2001 season when Notre Dame earned the No. 1 ranking for a total of five weeks - four straight from Jan. 22 to Feb. 12, regaining it on March 5.
- The Irish have made a habit of standing among the nation's elite in the AP poll. This week, Notre Dame is in the top 10 for the 222nd time, surpassing North Carolina's 204 earlier this year for the 10th-most AP top 10 appearances all-time. No. 3 Baylor is ninth at 227 (and counting).
- Notre Dame has now spent 146 weeks in the AP top five all-time, this week surpassing Georgia (145) for the seventh-most all-time.
- Notre Dame has been ranked in the top 10 for each of the last 124 polls since a No. 11 ranking on Jan. 17, 2011.

**IRISH DRAW A CROWD**

- Featuring perhaps the nation's most geographically-diverse fan base, it should come as no surprise that the Irish attract large crowds wherever they may go.
- Of Notre Dame's 14 road games this year, 13 of them drew above their host school's season average with the lone exception coming on Wednesday, Nov. 30, at Iowa.
- Overall, Notre Dame attracted 59,816 fans on the road this year when opposing averages imply that the number should have been 41,734, meaning that teams drew an average of 43.3% more fans for their home games against the Irish than they would have against the average foe.
- The Notre Dame game was among the top three home crowds at nine road venues this year, including a sellout crowd at DePaul and a women's Carrier Dome record of 11,021 at Syracuse.

- Twice in 2016-17, Notre Dame helped attract a crowd of over 10,500 fans to an opponent's home court (at Syracuse and at Tennessee). That tied for the most in the nation alongside Kentucky, Mississippi State, Tennessee and UConn.

**UP NEXT**

- Should the Irish beat Ohio State, they would advance to their sixth Elite Eight in seven years to face either Texas or Stanford at noon on Sunday at Rupp Arena. Notre Dame is a perfect 7-0 all-time in regional finals.
