ARMY (9-2) vs. NOTRE DAME (9-1) Joyce Center, Dec. 21, 2006

TONIGHT'S STORYLINE

Two of the hottest teams in college basketball meet up tonight as the Army Black Knights invade the Joyce Center to battle the Notre Dame Fighting Irish. The Black Knights (9-2) have won six straight contests, their longest run of consecutive victories since the 1984-85 campaign, while the Fighting Irish (9-1) have won eight games in a row and are ranked 20th in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll. Army's hot start has been spurred on by Jarell Brown (17.6 ppg.) and Matt Bell (15.7 ppg.), who both rank among the top-five scorers in the Patriot League. The Black Knights have been playing outstanding defense all season long, limiting their opponents to just 55.0 ppg. Army is hitting 51.2 percent of their shots from the floor, including 44.2 percent of their three-pointers.

NOTRE DAME (9-1)

Notre Dame is off to a hot start, having won nine of its first 10 games. The Fighting Irish are 9-1 for the first time since opening the 2004-05 season 12-1. Notre Dame has been led in the early going by Russell Carter (18.8 ppg., 4.8 rpg.), Rob Kurz (15.9 ppg., 9.1 rpg.), Colin Falls (13.8 ppg., 3.5 rpg.) and Luke Harangody (12.1 ppg., 5.0 rpg.). The Fighting Irish, who have won all seven previous meetings with Army, are under seventhyear head coach Mike Brey. Notre Dame enters tonight's game ranked 20th in this week's Associated Press Top 25 poll. The Fighting Irish have knocked off two of college basketball's perennial powers, having defeated Maryland (81-74) and Alabama (99-85) earlier this month. Those victories propelled Notre Dame into the national rankings. The Irish have already defeated a pair of Patriot League teams, having downed Lafayette (92-60) and Lehigh (93-87) in November. Notre Dame suffered its lone loss of the campaign to Butler in the first round of the preseason NIT. The upstart Bulldogs went on to win the preseason tourney.

ALL-TIME RECORD

As Army travels to South Bend, Ind., to take on Notre Dame this evening, the Black Knights show an all-time record of 1064-1034 (.507).

ARMY OFF TO BEST START IN 30 YEARS

At 9-2, Army is off to its best start since opening the 1976-77 campaign with an identical mark. With the hot start, the Black Knights have already surpassed last season's win total. The nine wins mark Army's high water mark under head coach Jim Crews. They are the most since the Black Knights won 12 games during the 2001-02 season.

ARMY RECEIVES VOTE IN AP POLL

Army's hot start has garnered the attention of the national college basketball writers as the Black Knights have received one vote in the Associated Press Top 25 poll each of the last two weeks. Army is the only Patriot League school to be listed in this week's AP poll.

BLACK KNIGHTS WIN ON THE ROAD

The Black Knights have been "road warriors" in the early portion of the schedule, already claiming four wins away from West Point. Army won neutral site games against Stetson and North Carolina A&T at the John Thompson Foundation Classic during the opening weekend. More recently, the Black Knights have won road tilts at Brown and at The Citadel.

BACK WITH A VENGEANCE

The Black Knights have already avenged three losses from last season with wins this year. Army lost to Brown, VMI and The Citadel in 2005-06, but have reversed fortunes versus the Bears, Keydets and Bulldogs this year. In fact, after losing home games to Brown and The Citadel last year, Army went on the road to defeat both the Bears and Bulldogs this season.

THOMPSON EARNS LEAGUE HONOR

Army freshman guard Tyrell Thompson was honored on Monday (Dec. 18) as the Patriot League "Rookie of the Week" following the best game of his young career. The Mohegan Lake, N.Y., native came off of the bench in the second half against N.Y. Purchase and registered 13 points, four rebounds and three steals. Thompson was a perfect 6-of-6 from the field versus the Panthers.

STINGY SCORING DEFENSE

For the first time since 1945, Army has held three straight opponents to 42 points or less. The Black Knights yielded 40 points to NJIT and N.Y. Purchase in consecutive games and followed those performances by limiting N.Y. Maritime to 42 points.

WILLIAMS HAS BIG NIGHT

In Army's 92-42 victory over N.Y. Maritime, sophomore forward Doug Williams notched career highs with nine points and eight rebounds.

SEWELL SETS BLOCK RECORD

Army senior center Jimmy Sewell established the Academy record for career blocked shots against N.Y. Maritime. Sewell's first half rejection gave him 65 career blocks and moved him in front of Charles Woodruff on the school's career ledger.

MORE ON SEWELL

Jimmy Sewell put together his finest performance of the season versus N.Y. Maritime, scoring 10 points and hauling in eight rebounds. Both statistics marked season bests. Versus N.Y. Purchase, Sewell tied the Academy single-game record for blocks, rejecting four shots in the contest.

ARMY HITS CENTURY MARK

For the first time since the 2000-01 season, Army reached 100 points, defeating N.Y. Purchase, 101-40. It marked the first time since the Black Knights outlasted Lafayette, 104-103 in overtime, a span of 156 games.

BLACK KNIGHTS WIN BIG

In Army's 101-40 victory over N.Y. Purchase, the Black Knights established their largest margin of victory (61 points) since defeating Maryland by 63 points (85-22) during the 1944 campaign.

ARMY TAKES DOWN SUNY SCHOOLS

Army defeated N.Y. Purchase, 101-40, and N.Y. Maritime, 92-42. It marked the largest backto-back wins (based on single-game point spreads) in school history. Army had never won consecutive games by more than 50 points (each game).

PILING UP THE POINTS

In Army's 92-42 defeat of N.Y. Maritime, the Black Knights set the Christl Arena record for most points in a first half by an Army team, racking up 58 points in the opening 20 minutes.

LIMITING THE PRIVATEERS

While Army's offense was setting the Christl Arena record for most points in a first half (by an Army team), the Black Knights' defense was busy holding N.Y. Maritime to the lowest first half point total by an opponent at Christl Arena. The Privateers were able to muster just 14 first half points, tying the record for fewest first half points scored by an opponent at Christl Arena.

BLACK KNIGHT TIDBITS

Stifling the Opposition: Army lists 15th nationally in scoring defense, holding its opponents to 55.0 points per game.

Dialing Long Distance: Army ranks 16th in the country in three-point field goal percentage (.442).

Seeing Double: Against VMI, Corban Bates registered the first double-double recorded by an Army player this season, scoring 10 points and hauling in 10 rebounds. Versus NJIT, freshman forward Chris Walker notched his first career double-double, scoring 10 points and ripping down 11 rebounds.

Piling Up The Points: Matt Bell and Jarell Brown have combined to score 47.3 percent of Army's points this season as the tandem has produced 367 of Army's 776 points. The duo is on pace to score over 1000 points this year, an accumulation that would rank among the Black Knights' all-time list of top-scoring tandems.

MOONSHOWER DISHES OUT ASSISTS

In Army's 101-40 victory over N.Y. Purchase, John Moonshower set a career high with five assists, helping the Black Knights set a new Academy single-game assists record.

ARMY SETS ASSIST RECORD

Army established the Academy record for assists in a game against N.Y. Purchase, handing out 27 helpers in the team's 101-40 victory over the Panthers.

WALKER RECORDS DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Against NJIT, Army freshman forward Chris Walker recorded his first career double-double, scoring 10 points and ripping down 11 rebounds. Walker became just the second Black Knight player to notch a double-double this season (Corban Bates).

HOLDING DOWN NJIT

Versus NJIT, Army held the Highlanders to 40 points, the lowest total allowed by Army since defeating New York Maritime, 53-36, last season. The 40 points permitted to NJIT marked the lowest point total allowed by an Army team to a Division I opponent since the Mike Krzyewski-coached Black Knights opened the 1975-76 campaign with a 56-29 defeat of Lehigh.

ARMY ATHLETE OF...THE MONTH

For the third time in four weeks, Army guard Jarell Brown was named Army Athletic Association "Athlete of the Week" after the junior averaged 23.5 ppg., 3.0 rpg. and 3.0 apg. during the Black Knights' 2-0 showing against VMI and The Citadel. He also copped the honor following Army's I-1 week versus Cornell and Brown, and after the season-opening John Thompson Foundation Classic in Missouri, where the Cleveland, Ohio, native averaged 19.3 ppg. in three games. By earning the weekly plaudits three times in four weeks, Brown was almost certainly the unofficial Army "Athlete of November".

WALKER EARNS CONFERENCE HONOR

Army freshman forward Chris Walker was named the Patriot League's "Rookie of the Week" on Dec. 4, following his best week of the season. The Suwanee, Ga., product averaged 17.0 ppg. and 7.5 rpg. over the course of the week to best all other league rookies. Walker was instrumental in the Black Knights' 79-72 victory over VMI, tallying a career-high 23 points to go along with eight rebounds. In Army's 63-55 road win at The Citadel, Walker tallied 11 points and ripped down a team-high seven rebounds. Walker currently ranks third on the team in scoring (9.1 ppg.) and leads the club in rebounding (6.0 rpg.).

BATES RECORDS DOUBLE-DOUBLE

Versus VMI, junior forward Corban Bates registered the first double-double for an Army player this season, scoring 10 points and ripping down 10 rebounds. It marks the first doubledouble by an Army player since Bates recorded 11 points and 14 rebounds versus Navy last season (Feb. 5, 2006). Bates also handed out six assists against the Keydets, falling just four help-

WALKER HAS BIG NIGHT VERSUS VMI

Versus VMI, freshman forward Chris Walker scored a career-high 23 points, hitting 8 of 11 field goals and 7 of 10 free throws. Walker also tied his career high with eight rebounds, falling just two caroms shy of producing his first double-double. The big man finally notched his first career double-double two games later versus NJIT.

ARMY SLOWS DOWN "RUNNIN' RODS"

The Black Knights put the clamps on the high octane run-and-gun offense of VMI, holding the Keydets nearly 34 points below their season average. VMI was leading the nation with 105.9 ppg. going into the Nov. 28 showdown versus Army. The "Runnin' Roos" were only able to muster 72 points against the Black Knights. VMI struggled from the field, shooting just 32.9 percent.

20-Something

Junior guard Jarell Brown, who tops Army in scoring with 17.6 ppg., has scored 20 or more points in five of Army's first 11 contests. Brown hit for 20 versus Missouri, 22 versus North Carolina A&T, 21 at Brown, a season-high 24 against VMI and 23 against The Citadel. In fact, Brown has scored 16 or more points in eight of Army's nine games. If Brown keeps up his current scoring pace, he would become the first Black Knight to score better than 18 ppg. in a season since Chris Spatola averaged 18.5 ppg. during the 2000-01 campaign.

ARMY NEARLY PERFECT AT FOUL LINE

Against Brown, Army was nearly perfect from the free throw line as the Black Knights hit 15 of 16 (.938). Cory Sinning led Army, connecting on all eight of his attempts.

MILLER STEPS UP AGAINST CORNELL

Freshman guard Josh Miller made the most of his opportunity in Army's 65-56 loss to Cornell. The first-year player netted nine points in 15 minutes off the bench, knocking down all three of his field goal attempts. He played the majority of the second half providing a spark for the Black Knights.

BELL HITS 1,000 POINTS

Against Cornell, Matt Bell scored his 1,000th career point on a three-pointer late in the game. Bell is just the 25th Army men's basketball player to reach the coveted milestone. Bell was honored by the Army Athletic Association for his accomplishment prior to Army's 79-72 victory over VMI.

NELSON SHINES VERSUS HARTFORD

In Army's 62-53 victory over Hartford, Marcus Nelson stuffed the stat sheet, recording career highs with 12 points, six rebounds, six assists, two steals and one blocked shot. The freshman guard played intense pressure defense and helped Army put the clamps on Hartford's offense. Nelson was instrumental in the Black Knights' 13-0 run near the end of the first half. The spurt was part of a larger 34-11 scoring stretch that turned a 20-13 deficit into a 47-31 advantage.

ARMY SHOOTS "LIGHTS OUT"

In Army's 80-68 victory over Stetson in the season opener, the Black Knights shot a blistering 56.8 percent (25 of 44) from the field. The figure is the highest since Army shot 57.8 percent against Navy on Jan. 22, 2006.

BLACK KNIGHTS SET THREE-POINT RECORD

Army's hot shooting against Stetson was spurred on by its accuracy from behind the three-point line. In fact, the Black Knights set an Academy record for three-point percentage in a game, connecting on 9 of 12 (.750) attempts from behind the arc. The percentage shattered the previous school standard of .647 (11 of 17), which was established against Bucknell on Feb. 23, 2003.

ARMY SHUTS DOWN HARTFORD

Army stepped up its defensive pressure against Hartford, holding the Hawks without a point for a span of 9 minutes, 24 seconds in the first half. During that time, Army was able to turn an early 20-13 deficit into a 26-20 lead, outscoring Hartford, 13-0. The Black Knights held the Hawks to 34.0 percent shooting from the floor, including 19.4 percent from three-point range (6 of 31).

BROWN GETS OFF TO STRONG START

Junior guard Jarell Brown picked up a pair of weekly awards following three strong performances at the season-opening John Thompson Foundation Classic in Columbia, Mo. The Cleveland, Ohio, native was named Patriot League "Player of the Week" as well as being honored with Army Athletic Association "Athlete of the Week" laurels. Brown was on fire from behind the three-point line in all three games, nailing 14 of 25 shots from "downtown". Brown, who knocked down a career-high six treys in Army's 63-49 win over North Carolina A&T, averaged 19.3 ppg. over the course of the first weekend of competition.

FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTE IN MISSOURI

Freshmen Chris Walker and Cleveland Richard each started all three of Army's games at the John Thompson Foundation Classic. Walker made the biggest impact statistically, as the strong forward listed third on the team in scoring (7.3

Walker's numbers over the course of the threeday event were solid as the plebe ranked third in scoring (7.7 ppg.) and tied for second in rebounding (4.3 rpg.).

BELL CLIMBS SCORING CHART

Matt Bell continues to climb Army's all-time scoring chart. The senior enters this evening's game at Notre Dame ranked 20th on Army's all-time scoring ledger with 1,087 points. He needs just 36 points to pass Todd Mattson for 19th place on the career chart. He is only 40 points shy of moving past Marty Coyne and John Roosma for 17th place. The Kokomo, Ind., native became just the Academy's 25th member of the 1,000-point club against Cornell.

In Army's 62-53 victory over Hartford, the Black Knights outrebounded the Hawks, 38-28. It marked the first time since Jan. 22, 2006 that Army outrebounded its opponent, a span of 13 games.

CRASHING THE BOARDS...PART TWO

In Army's 62-54 win over Brown, the Black Knights outrebounded the Bears, 33-18. The 15rebound advantage is its largest since outrebounding Polytechnic, 42-21, last year.

CRASHING THE BOARDS...VMI EDITION

Against VMI, Army outrebounded the Keydets, 45-31. The 45 rebounds marked the most since the Black Knights coralled 49 caroms against Coast Guard on Nov. 23, 2003 (a span of 84 games).

ANSWERING THE BELL

Matt Bell has started each of Army's 90 games since the beginning of the 2003-04 season. The senior guard is on pace to crack into

the Top 10 in career games played this season. His streak of 90 games started in a row marks the longest by a Black Knight since Chris Spatola (USMA '02) closed out his career with 100 straight starting berths.

ARMY SCORES IN BUNCHES

At the John Thompson Foundation Classic, Army showed its ability to score points in bunches as the Black Knights reeled off impressive scoring runs in all three games. In Army's game against Stetson, the Black Knights went on a 24-6 burst to turn a 10-4 deficit into a 28-16 advantage en route to an 80-68 win. Against Missouri, Army trailed the home-standing Tigers 34-14 before reeling off a 28-8 run that knotted the contest at 42-42 before falling short, 67-58. In their game opposite North Carolina A&T, the Black Knights used a 21-8 spurt to break away from the Aggies in the first half and cruise to a 63-49 triumph.

SCORING RUNS...PART TWO

Army's penchant for going on big runs carried over to its home opener against Hartford. With the Black Knights trailing the Hawks 20-13 midway through the first half, Army reeled off a 13-0 run to take a 26-20 lead. That spurt was part of a larger 34-11 outburst that spanned both the first and second halves and deliverd the Black Knights a 47-31 lead midway through the second stanza. Army used a 15-7 spurt against Brown to forge an 11-point first half lead. Then, after the Bears tied the game at 41-41, the Black Knights went on a 7-0 run to take control of the game. Army trailed 63-59 midway through the second half versus VMI, but an 8-0 spurt turned a four-point deficit into a four-point lead and the Black Knights did not trail the rest of the way. Army found itself trailing 46-38 midway through the second half against The Citadel. From there, the Black Knights ended the contest on a 25-9 run to turn the eight-point deficit into an eightpoint victory.

BROWN LIGHTS IT UP FROM DEEP

Jarell Brown led Army in scoring in two of the three games at the John Thompson Foundation Classic, and a big reason why was his accuracy from behind the three-point line. The junior hit 14 of 25 (.560) from three-point range en route to scoring at a clip of 19.3 ppg. Brown went off against North Carolina A&T, setting a career-high with six triples. He connected on five of those treys before halftime en route to 19 first half points.

VETERAN ROSTER IN 2006-07

For the first time since taking over the reins of the Army program prior to the 2002-03 season, head coach Jim Crews has a veteran roster to draw upon. After featuring just one senior each of the past two seasons, this year's edition of the Black Knights includes four seniors and four juniors, who began the season with 423 game appearances and 221 starts.

HOLDING SPOT IN LEAD CAST

Freshman guard Cleveland Richard has stepped right into Army's starting lineup, as the Houston, Texas, native has started all 11 of Army's games so far this season. Richard is averaging 2.2 ppg. and 1.4 rpg. on the year. He lists second among freshmen in assists, averaging 1.10 apg.

SINNING DROPS DIMES

Cory Sinning leads Army in assists, averaging 2.55 apg. Sinning recorded a season-high six assists against Brown in November.

BROWN LEADS ARMY IN SCORING

Jarell Brown leads the team in scoring, averaging 17.6 ppg. The Cleveland, Ohio, native has already registered five 20-point outings, scoring 20 against Missouri, 22 versus North Carolina A&T, 21 opposite Brown, a season-high 24 against VMI and 23 versus The Citadel. The thirdyear guard has steadily blossomed into one of the Patriot League's most prolific scorers.

SUPER SIXTH MAN

It may not surprise people that Jarell Brown is leading Army in scoring through the first nine games of the year (17.6 ppg). After all, the guard did lead the Black Knights in scoring last season (14.3 ppg.). Folks probably would be surprised to realize that Brown is scoring at such a high rate coming off of the bench as one of Army's reserves.

PENCHANT FOR PRODUCING SCORERS

Jarell Brown finished last season ranked second in the Patriot League in scoring at 14.3 ppg. It marked the fifth time in the past six years that an Army player has ended a campaign among the PL's top five scorers. Chris Spatola led the league in scoring in both 2000-01 (18.5 ppg.) and 2001-02 (16.5 ppg.), while his classmate Charles Woodruff finished second in 2001-02 (16.2 ppg.). In 2004-05, Matt Bell was third in the league in scoring at 14.3 ppg. Brown enters tonight's game among the league leaders in scoring (17.6 ppg.).

BELL IN MIDDLE OF ACTION

In addition to ranking second on the team in scoring (15.7 ppg.), Matt Bell lists second on the squad in assists (2.36 apg.), third in rebounding (4.4 rpg.) and second in steals (1.18 spg.).

LOGGING MINUTES

For the fourth straight season, Matt Bell is on pace to play in excess of 27 minutes per game. Through the first eight contests of this season, Bell has played a team-high 30.5 mpg. In 2005-06, Bell averaged 32.2 mpg., six minutes more per game than Jarell Brown, who listed second on the team in minutes played (26.2 mpg.). In 2004-05, Bell averaged 32.7 mpg., after averagng 27.0 mpg. as a freshman.

BELL MOVES UP THREE-POINT CHARTS

In addition to elevating his name higher on Army's career scoring chart, Matt Bell has moved into the program's all-time Top 10 list for threepoint field goals as well. Bell currently ranks fifth all-time with 112 career treys, placing him just 19 three-pointers away from passing Jamie Upgraft for fourth place. Bell also stands seventh on the career three-point field goal attempts chart, having hoisted 289 threes.

BATES BATTLES ON THE BOARDS

Despite his 6-4 frame, Corban Bates ranks second on the team in rebounding, averaging 5.5 rpg. The scrappy forward hauled in a seasonhigh 10 caroms against VMI. Last winter, Bates averaged 5.1 rpg., a statistic that led the Black Knights and ranked seventh among Patriot League performers.

BLOCKS PILING UP

Jimmy Sewell boasts 65 career blocked shots and stands first on Army's all-time rejections list, having surpassed Charles Woodruff (64). Sewell, who blocked 17 shots last season (the seventh-best single-season total at Army), established a new single-season record with 29 blocks in 2004-05, becoming the first Army player (since block stats were first kept at Army in 1984-85) to average more than one block per contest. Sewell eclipsed the previous mark of 22 held jointly by Chris Glowe (1996-97) and Woodruff (2001-02).

BELL DOES WORK ON THE BOARDS

Matt Bell tied his career high with seven rebounds in Army's 63-49 victory over North Carolina A&T. The senior guard, who is known more for his scoring prowess, currently ranks third on the team in rebounding, averaging 4.4 rpg.

VALIANT EFFORT VERSUS TIGERS

Early this year, Army showed what kind of heart and determination it has against Missouri. Trailing 34-14 to the mighty Missouri Tigers on their home floor, Army could have just packed it in. Instead, the Black Knights responded with a furious 28-8 scoring spurt that spanned the first and second halves, eventually tying the score at 42-42. Although Army eventually fell to Mizzou, 67-58, the Black Knights gained the respect of everyone in the gym. It served as a sign that this Army team will not quit, regardless of the opponent or the score.

BOMBS AWAY!

Junior guard Grant Carter has developed into a three-point specialist for the Black Knights. Carter's skills were on display against N.Y. Purchase when he knocked in 3-of-4 attempts from behind the three-point line. During the 2004-05 season, Carter set the Army-Navy series record with seven three-pointers against the Midshipmen.

THE GEORGIA CONNECTION

Army freshmen Chris Walker and Jon Sizemore have been playing together for a very long time. Walker and Sizemore were teammates at North Gwinett High School in Suwanee, Ga., before making the trek north to the U.S. Military Academy Prep School last year. This will mark the sixth straight season that the players have suited up in the same uniform.

FOLLOWING SINNING TO THE POINT

Sophomore John Moonshower joined the Army men's basketball program last year, following in the footsteps of fellow Ohioan Cory Sinning, currently an Army senior. Both Sinning and Moonshower toiled on the hardwood for Van Wert High School in Van Wert, Ohio. Sinning was a senior at Van Wert when Moonshower was a freshman. Sinning spent a year at the U.S. Military Academy Prep School before arriving at West Point.

STICKING WITH ONE LINEUP

After implementing a dozen different starting lineups during the 2005-06 regular season, head coach Jim Crews has stuck with the same starters in eight of of Army's first 11 games. The quintet of Matt Bell, Cory Sinning, Kenny Brewer, Cleveland Richard and Chris Walker has remained constant in seven of the nine games. Bell, Walker and Richard have each started all nine games.

UP NEXT

Following the Black Knights' game versus Notre Dame, Army travels to Ann Arbor, Mich., to face the Michigan Wolverines. Tip off is set for 8 p.m.

Army Head Coach Jim Crews

As he conducts his fifth season along the banks of the Hudson, and the 22nd season of his head coaching career, Jim Crews continues with the rebuilding project that became his mission when he was hired as Army's 29th head men's basketball coach in March 2002.

Having reached the coveted 300-win plateau in 2003-04, Crews further established himself as one of college basketball's finest mentors, building upon a sparkling resumé that also includes six postseason appearances and five regular season conference championships.

He entered the 2006-07 campaign with 314 career victories, listing 43rd among active mentors in all-time victories.

Over the past two years, Crews has presided over a program in transition, infusing a large group of young players into the mix. After having tutored just one senior during each of the past two campaigns, the veteran mentor has slowly watched his squad evolve from a crop of youngster into a collection of seasoned and talented veterans.

This winter, Crews welcomed back four seniors who had recorded 186 starting assignments among their 300 combined game appearances over the past four years. In addition, four juniors returned, creating a formidable nucleus of upperclassmen to which Crews will look to for leadership and production.

Crews is certainly adept at helping build outstanding programs, having played at and coached for perennial Big Ten and national power Indiana University prior to a successful 17-year run as head coach at the University of Evansville that preceded his arrival at the Academy. During his tenure in Evansville, Crews led the Purple Aces to six postseason appearances, including four trips to the NCAA Tournament. All six of those teams registered at least 21 victories. Evansville recorded 15 consecutive seasons of at least .500 finishes in conference play. under Crews. Only eight other schools among the nation's 321 Division I members could make that claim during the same span.

Named the 1999 Rawlings Missouri Valley Conference "Coach of the Year," Crews guided the Purple Aces to a 23-10 record, a regular season league championship and their fourth NCAA tourney appearance in 14 years. It marked the fourth time that the native of Normal, Ill., garnered league coach of the year plaudits after having been similarly cited by the Midwestern Collegiate Conference in 1987, 1989 and 1992.

Crews is the only coach in the traditionrich history of Evansville to register nine consecutive non-losing seasons. Before Crews, no coach at UE had ever produced more than seven straight seasons with a record of at least .500. That includes legendary Arad McCutchan, the first college division coach ever inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame.

While he has built an impressive resume' on the basketball court, Crews is viewed just as highly off it. Fifty-two of the 53 players, who spent four years with the Purple Aces' program during Crews' tenure, earned undergraduate de-

grees. Every senior in his final dozen years departed Evansville with a degree.

A member of Indiana University's 1976 National Championship team, Crews lettered four years for the Hoosiers from 1972 to 1976 under legendary head coach Bob Knight. During his time in the "Crimson and Cream," Indiana forged a remarkable 108-12 (.900) overall record, including a stellar 59-5 (.922) mark in Big 10 Conference games. Indiana claimed conference titles in each of those seasons. As a senior, Crews helped the Hoosiers to a 32-0 record en route to becoming the NCAA's most recent undefeated National Champions.

After graduating from IU, Crews spent one year in the private sector before returning to his alma mater for eight



years as an assistant on Knight's coaching staff. During that highly successful period, the Hoosiers captured the National Championship in 1981 and claimed three Big 10 championships (1980, 1981 and 1983). Indiana posted a 174-76 (.696) overall record and a 94-50 (.653) Big 10 Conference slate during Crews' stint as an assistant in Bloomington.

Crews departed Indiana in 1985 to join the Evansville program.

Jim and his wife, Kim, reside at West Point. They have a daughter, Abby, and a son, Todd.
