Irish Return Home For Weekend Series Versus Northern Michigan

- Notre Dame clinches first-round bye in CCHA playoffs with split at Ohio State.
- Irish see 12-game road unbeaten streak snapped in 4-1 loss to the Buckeyes on Sunday.
- Notre Dame's 4-3 overtime win at OSU comes in dramatic fashion; Erik Condra gets goal with one second left to tie and Calle Ridderwall scores 49 seconds into overtime for win.

HITTING THE HOME STRETCH: Notre Dame enters the final six games of the regular season with three home games and three road tilts left on the docket. The Irish will play two of those home games this weekend when they play host to the Northern Michigan Wildcats on Feb. 13-14. Friday's game has an 8:05 p.m. start time with the game being televised live by CBS College Sports with **Matt McConnell** and **Dave Starman** providing the play-by-play and commentary. On Saturday night, the two teams will play a 7:05 p.m. game that will be streamed live on Notre Dame's website, und.com. That live broadcast is free of charge. The Irish enter the weekend knowing that they have clinched a first-round bye in the CCHA playoffs and will play a best-of-three, second-round series at the Joyce Center the weekend of March 13-15. Notre Dame is 21-5-3 overall and 15-4-3-3 in the CCHA, good for 36 points. The Irish lead second-place Miami (32) by four points, third-place Michigan (30) by six points and fourth-place Ohio State (28) by eight. Northern Michigan comes into the weekend as one of the hottest teams in the nation. Since Jan. 2, the Wildcats are 8-1-1, including four straight wins and a current unbeaten streak of seven (6-0-1). Overall, Northern Michigan is 11-13-4 on the season and 8-10-4-3 in the conference for a seventh-place tie with Ferris State as each team has 23 points. The Irish are ranked second in the nation in this week's *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll and third in the USCHO.com/CBS College Sports poll.

IRISH VERSUS WILDCATS: Notre Dame and Northern Michigan have met 41 times in the all-time series with the Wildcats holding a 20-16-5 edge in the games played to date. The two teams have met twice this year, in Marquette, on Oct. 31-Nov. 1 with the Irish taking both games by 3-2 and 4-2 scores. Those two games were the start of Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak that ran from Oct. 31 through Jan. 30. In that series, five of Notre Dame's seven goals came on the power play. At the Joyce Center, the Wildcats lead the series, 9-8-3. The last time the two teams played at the Joyce Center was Dec. 31, 2006 and Notre Dame took a 6-2 decision in that game. Since the 2003-04 season, the Irish are 3-1-1 against Northern Michigan at home and also own a win in 2006 at Fort Wayne, Ind.

MAGIC NUMBERS: With six games left for Notre Dame in the 2008-09 season, the Irish have reached one of their goals, getting the first round bye in the CCHA playoffs. Next up is winning the CCHA regular-season title. Going into this weekend, any combination of nine points (Irish wins/ties or Miami losses/ties) will give Notre Dame the regular-season title. Seven points will eliminate Michigan and five points will knock out Ohio State.

ROAD STREAK ENDS: Notre Dame's 4-1 loss at Ohio State on February 8, snapped a 12-game Irish road unbeaten streak (11-0-1), the longest in the program's 41-year history. The Irish had not lost a game since Oct. 11, the season opener at Denver where they fell 5-2. With the loss, Notre Dame is now 11-2-1 on the road this season. The .821 road winning percentage is the best in the program's history with three road games left to play. Only three Irish teams have won 12 road games in a season at Notre Dame - '06-'07 (12-4-1), '97-'98 (12-11-0) and '79-'80 (12-11-1).

OHIO STATE RECAP:

Sunday, February 8

Notre Dame saw its 12-game road unbeaten streak snapped at Value City Arena on Sunday afternoon in a 4-1 loss to the Buckeyes. Ohio State scored three times in a 10-minute span of the second period to take a 3-1 lead. **Christiaan Minella (Sr., Aurora, Colo.)** gave Notre Dame a 1-0 lead with a power-play goal at 7:44 of the second period. The Buckeyes then got goals from John Albert (8:23), Shane Sims (ppg at 17:00) and Tayler Stefishen (18:35) to build a 3-1 advantage. Mathieu Picard closed out the scoring with an empty-net goal at 17:57 of the third period for the 4-1 win. Notre Dame out shot the Buckeyes by a 33-30 margin. **Jordan Pearce (Sr., Anchorage, Alaska)** made 26 saves for the Irish. Dustin Carlson had 32 for the Buckeyes. Notre Dame was 1-for-6 on the power play while Ohio State was 1-for-4.

Friday, February 6

The Irish pulled out a 4-3 overtime win on Friday night in Columbus, Ohio, getting the game-tying goal with one second left and the overtime game winner just 49 seconds into the extra stanza. **Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.)** led the Irish with a pair of power-play goals, including the game-tying goal at 19:59 of the third period. **Ian Cole (So., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** had a goal and two assists for three points on the night and **Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden)** scored the game winner on a power play, just 49 seconds into overtime. Corey Elkins, Sergio Somma and Zac Dalpe scored for Ohio State. Cole put Notre Dame ahead 1-0 at 4:59 of the first period with Elkins tying the game at 8:47 for a 1-1 score after one period. Somma made it 2-1 for Ohio State just 1:15 into the second period and the score stayed that way into the third. Condra got his first goal of the night on the power play at 8:50 of the third period to make it 2-2. Dalpe put the Buckeyes ahead at 17:05 with his 13th of

the season. Just 44 seconds later, the Buckeyes' Ian Boots received a major penalty for spearing, giving Notre Dame the five-minute power play. With **Jordan Pearce** pulled for a sixth attacker, Condra scored the tying goal with 1.3 seconds left on the clock. The power play continued into overtime where Ridderwall ended the game with his 12th of the year at 00:49. Notre Dame was 3-for-5 on the power play while OSU was 0-for-2. The Irish out shot the Buckeyes, 23-20, with Pearce making 17 saves and Dustin Carlson 19 on the night.

ON THE SIDELINES: Two Notre Dame players went down with injuries in the Feb. 6 game with Ohio State and missed Sunday afternoon's contest. Junior left wing **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** suffered a high ankle sprain and is out indefinitely. Senior center **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** suffered a slight concussion and is listed as day-to-day. They join sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, who has been out for the season, on the injured list. Phillips injured his right knee in the preseason and has not played this year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

LATEST AND FASTEST: **Erik Condra's** goal with 1.3 seconds left on Feb. 6 against Ohio State was the latest goal in regulation scored by the Irish to send a game into overtime. That was followed by **Calle Ridderwall's** overtime game winner that was the fastest that a Notre Dame team has ever scored in overtime - 49 seconds. That beat the previous quickest overtime game winner by **Dan Carlson '01** who scored just 52 seconds into overtime on Jan. 21, 2000 to beat Western Michigan, 4-3.

TURNING ON THE POWER: Notre Dame scored three times (3-for-5) on the power play in the 4-3 overtime win against Ohio State on Feb. 6. That marked the 10th time this season that the Irish had two or more power-play goals in a game and the fifth time on the season that they had three or more power-play goals in one contest. On the weekend, Notre Dame was 4-for-11 (36.4%) with the man advantage. For the year, the Irish are 38-for-174 for a 21.8% success rate.

LOOKING FOR A HERO: The 4-3 overtime win against Ohio State was the first overtime win for Notre Dame since April 10, 2008 when the Irish defeated Michigan, 5-4, in the NCAA semifinals. In that game, **Calle Ridderwall** scored the game winner in overtime. On Feb. 6, at Ohio State, Ridderwall was at it again, scoring the game-winning goal in overtime against Ohio State.

HOBEBY BAKER CANDIDATE: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** is listed among the candidates for the 2009 Hobey Baker Award on the award's website - hobeybaker.com. Fans can now vote for their choice for the award at the website. The first phase of the voting will continue until March 8. On March 19, the 10 finalists will be announced. The Hobey Baker Hat Trick of the three finalists will be announced on April 2 with the winner selected on April 10.

MR. RELIABLE: Notre Dame's All-American and Hobey Baker candidate - senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** - has been a regular in the Notre Dame goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008, Pearce has appeared in 51 of the last 52 Irish games. Of those 51 games, 50 have been starts. Pearce has now appeared in 26 straight games for the Irish, making 25 starts in that span. The last game he did not start was on Nov. 29 when **Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.)** made his second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 28 of Notre Dame's first 29 games this season and is 20-5-2 with a 1.70 goals-against average and a .933 save percentage with four shutouts. *Pearce played in all 20 games of Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak, going 17-0-3 with a 1.36 goals-against average with a .944 save percentage and three shutouts.*

HOW GOOD IS PEARCE: Going into this weekend's series with Northern Michigan, Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** leads the nation in wins (20), is fifth in minutes played (1,663:15), is sixth in goals-against average (1.70), sixth in save percentage (.933), fifth in winning percentage (.768) and tied for second in shutouts (4).

COLE ON A ROLL: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** had his second, three-point game (1g, 2a) of the season in the 4-3 overtime win against Ohio State and the third of his career. He also had a goal and two assists earlier this season in a 7-0 win against Sacred Heart on Oct. 18. His first one was a two-goal, one assist game versus Ferris State in the 2007-08 season.

TAKING OVER: Sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** moved into the scoring lead for Notre Dame with a goal and an assist in the 4-3 overtime win at Ohio State. Ridderwall now has career highs in goals (12), assists (15), points (27) and power-play goals (9) during the 2008-09 campaign. As a freshman in 2007-08, Ridderwall had five goals and two assists for seven points in 39 games. His breakout game came in last April's 5-4 overtime win against Michigan in the NCAA semifinals, when he scored twice in the game, including the overtime game winner.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team are among a list of 20 candidates for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Named to the list last week are senior forward **Erik Condra** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, senior **Mark Van Guilder '08** was one of 10 finalists for the award and in 2007, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** and freshman **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** were put on the same line with center **Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** in the second game of the Miami series (Oct. 25), it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers though as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 25 games together this season, the duo has combined for 21 goals and 27 assists with Maday having eight goals and 13 assists for 22 points while Ridderwall has 12 goals and 14 assists for 26 points in those games.

BALANCING ACT: Balance has been a key for Notre Dame in the 2008-09 season. The Irish have 13 players with 10 or more points so far this year with **Christian Hanson** leading the team with 26 points on 14 goals and 12 assists. The Irish have just three players with 10 or more goals (Hanson, Calle Ridderwall - 11 and Billy Maday - 10) but have nine players with five or more goals. Ten players on the Notre Dame roster have scored game-winning goals this year.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame and Michigan have had the winningest hockey programs in the country. Both teams have won 80 games over that period. Notre Dame is 80-28-10 for a .739 winning percentage while Michigan is 80-29-5 for a .724 mark. Miami is third with 73 wins and a .692 winning percentage. Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage (as of Feb. 11).

STREAK RANKINGS: When Notre Dame lost on Jan. 30 to Michigan, it not only snapped an overall 20-game unbeaten streak, but it snapped a 16-game CCHA unbeaten streak (13-0-3). That ties for the seventh-longest conference unbeaten streak in NCAA history and was the third-longest CCHA unbeaten streak in history. The streak trails just Lake Superior State's 28-game conference unbeaten streak (26-0-2) set in 1992-93 and a 17-game conference unbeaten streak (16-0-1) set by Michigan in 1993-94.

STREAK NUMBERS: In Notre Dame's 20-game unbeaten streak, the Irish gave up one goal or less in 12 of the 20 games. The Irish only gave up three goals, four times - a 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (11/14), a 3-3 tie with Western Michigan (11/29), a 4-3 win over Bowling Green (12/13) and the 3-3 tie with Lake Superior (1/17). During the streak, the Irish out scored the opposition by a 72-29 margin (3.60 to 1.45).

POWER-PLAY PRODUCERS: Five Notre Dame players currently rank in the top 10 in the CCHA for power-play point production. Left wing **Calle Ridderwall** is tied for second (9-9-18) while center **Christian Hanson** (6-7-13), right wing **Billy Maday** (5-8-13) and center **Kevin Deeth** (3-10-13) are tied for sixth with 13 points. tied for fifth (6-7-13). Defenseman **Brett Blatchford** (0-12-12) is tied for 13th with 12 power-play points.

RED HOT HANSON: Senior center **Christian Hanson** is off to the best start of his collegiate career. Through the first 28 games of the season, Hanson leads the Irish with 14 goals and is second in points with 26. He also has six power-play goals, one short-handed marker and four game winners. He now has career-bests in goals (14), assists (12), points (26), power-play goals (6) and game winners (4). The 6-4, 228-pound center is sixth in the CCHA in conference scoring and third in goals scored in the league with 12.

PENALTY SHOTS: **Ryan Thang's** successful penalty shot goal in the Jan. 31 game at Michigan was the first penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 27, 2006 when **Kevin Deeth** was stopped in a game against Army in the Lightning College Hockey Classic. His successful score was the first successful penalty shot by a Notre Dame player since Oct. 12, 2001 when **Rob Globke '04** scored on a penalty shot against Union College at the Joyce Center.

HOUSE OF HORRORS: Notre Dame's win at Yost Arena on Jan. 31 was just the fourth for the Irish since returning to the CCHA in 1992-93. The win improved Notre Dame to 4-21-1 at Yost since the start of the '92-'93 campaign. The Irish have won two of their last three games at Yost since the 2006-07 season.

BIG CROWD: The crowd of 3,007 at the Joyce Center on Jan. 30 was the largest crowd to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago, 5-2. The following year, new seating was installed in the Joyce Center and the building was reconfigured to 2,667. A current sellout crowd at the Joyce Center is 2,713. Eight of Notre Dame's 13 home games this season have had crowds of 2,713 or more.

MONTH-BY-MONTH: The Irish were 3-3-0 in the month of October. They followed that with a 7-0-2 record in November and a 4-0-0 mark in December to close out the 2008 portion of the schedule. Notre Dame wrapped up the month of January with a 6-1-1 record.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE MAN

ADVANTAGE: Prior to Notre Dame's series with Bowling Green (11/21-22), Notre Dame's power-play was hitting at a 15.6% success rate and ranked fifth in the CCHA and 31st in the nation. Since then, the power-play is 26-for-97 for a 26.8% success rate. On the season, Notre Dame's power play is now 38-for-174 for a 21.8% success rate. That leads the CCHA and is third nationally.

JOINING THE CENTURY CLUB:

Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded the 100th assist of his Notre Dame career on **Ryan Thang's** third-period goal in the 3-0 win over Alaska on Jan. 10. The assist makes him just the 10th player in the 41-year history of the program to record 100 assists in his career. With two goals against Ohio State on Feb. 6, Condra now has 43 goals and 101 assists for 144 career points. That ties him for 17th on Notre Dame's all-time point list.

CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's** game-winning goal on Jan. 9 against Alaska was his second of the season and his first since Oct. 18 against Sacred Heart. The game winner gives him 13 for his career and moves him into a tie for the top spot on Notre Dame's all-time game-winning goal list. Thang is now tied with **Rob Globke '04**, **Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82** - as all four players now have 13 game winners to their credit.

PRACTICE ON THE POND: Notre Dame took its Friday practice (Jan. 23) outdoors to a local rink - Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind. - as the players got the chance to play a little shinny. Over 250 kids and adults attended the event that was complete with temperatures in the low teens, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter. The kids in attendance got a chance to meet the Notre Dame players while they scrimmaged and afterwards with an autograph session. This is the second time the Irish have done this, doing it prior to their series with Bowling Green last January.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: With the two shutouts versus Alaska, **Jordan Pearce** now has four shutouts this season and eight for his career. The seven career shutouts move Pearce into second on the all-time list. **David Brown '07** holds the Irish record with 12 during his Irish career.

Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

THE PLAYMAKER: Junior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** snapped a six-game pointless drought when he helped set up **Calle Ridderwall's** overtime game winner on Feb. 6 at Ohio State. Blatchford is tied for eighth in the CCHA with 19 assists and his 19 points tie him for fifth among all CCHA defensemen. The smooth-skating defenseman has already exceeded his output of last year when he had 12 assists in 45 games. He currently leads Notre Dame defensemen in scoring.

DYNAMITE DEETH: Junior center **Kevin Deeth** had three assists in the weekend series against Ohio State. That gives him four goals and 20 assists for 24 points on the season. His 20 assists are just two off his career best of 22 that was set in his freshman year (2006-07).

BACK-TO-BACK BLANKINGS: The Irish recorded back-to-back shutouts at the Joyce Center on Jan. 9-10 versus Alaska by 2-0 and 3-0 scores. Senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was between the pipes for both blankings. That marks the second time this season that the Irish have had back-to-back shutouts. In October, Notre Dame shut out Sacred Heart, 3-0 and 7-0, on Oct. 17-18. The last time the Irish had back-to-back shutouts in CCHA play came on March 15-16, 2003, when **Morgan Cey '05** blanked Miami, 1-0 and 5-0, in games two and three of the CCHA playoffs. The Irish have never had back-to-back shutout wins in a CCHA regular-season series before last weekend.

NOTRE DAME AT NO. 1: Notre Dame saw its run at the top of the national polls stopped after seven consecutive weeks (Dec. 1 through Jan. 26) as the Irish are now No. 2 in the nation in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and third in the USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls this week. The seven-week run marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish were No. 1 in the nation and tied for the longest streak of consecutive weeks there with their seven-week run at the end of 2006-07.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the *USA Today* poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 53 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07 season, Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. This season, the Irish were No. 1 from Dec. 1 to Feb. 1, a span covering seven weeks. The third time that Notre Dame was No. 1 came for one week in the 1976-77 season.

THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded his second short-handed goal this season in the 3-3 overtime tie/shootout win for the Irish. The goal was the sixth shortie of Condra's career and moved him into fourth on Notre Dame's all-time short-handed goals list. He is one behind the leaders - **Dave Bankoske ('93)**, **Mike McNeill ('88)** and **Kevin Humphreys ('81)** who had seven in their Irish careers.

STREAK SNAPPED: Josh Sim's first period power-play goal on Jan. 16 for Lake Superior State, snapped **Jordan Pearce's** shutout streak at 171:26, a career high for the senior goaltender. The streak is the second longest for a Notre Dame goaltender as **David Brown '07** had a 193:27 streak from Oct. 17 to Nov. 8, 2003 without giving up a goal.

WELCOME BACK: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup for the Alaska series after missing both games of the Shillelagh Tournament while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5. The duo helped the U.S. to a fifth-place finish. Cole, playing in his second tournament had two goals and two assists in his six games while Ruth had no points with 25 penalty minutes in his first appearance. The duo are among 12 Notre Dame players all-time to play for the U.S. in the World Junior Championships. They join fellow defenseman **Kyle Lawson** as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

TOURNAMENT HONORS: Notre Dame collected its first Shillelagh Tournament title on Jan. 2-3 at the Sears Centre in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Irish defeated Union College, 3-1 in the first game and then knocked off Minnesota-Duluth, 3-1, in the title game. Notre Dame placed four players on the Shillelagh Tournament all-tournament team. Selected to the team were: junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**, forwards **Ben Ryan** and **Garrett Regan** and goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, who also was named the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Lawson anchored an Irish defense that limited Union and Minnesota-Duluth to 41 shots in the tournament while playing over 30 minutes per game. Ryan had a goal and an assist, getting the game winner in the win over Union. Regan scored two goals in the title game, including the game winner versus Minnesota-Duluth. Pearce surrendered just two goals (one even-strength goal) on 41 shots (.951 sv%) and picked up two wins in the tournament. Also selected to the all-tournament team were Minnesota-Duluth defenseman Erik Oberg and forward Justin Fontaine.

THREE IN A ROW: With the win in the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, the Irish have now won one in-season hockey tournament in each of the last three seasons. In 2006-07, the Irish won the Lightning College Hockey Tournament in Tampa, Fla. In 2007-08, Notre Dame was the winner of the Rensselaer Holiday Hockey Tournament in Troy, N.Y. and this season, the Irish got the win in the Shillelagh Tournament.

IRISH TOURNEY HISTORY: For Notre Dame, the Shillelagh Tournament was the 31st in-season tournament that the Irish have participated in. The two wins give Notre Dame an all-time mark of 25-34-3 in those tournaments. The Irish now have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments.

TAKE ME OUT TO THE HOCKEY GAME: As part of the first-ever Shillelagh Tournament, all four tournament teams attended the NHL's Winter Classic at Wrigley Field on Jan. 1. Notre Dame got to see former Irish defenseman **Brett Lebda '04** score a goal for Detroit in the Red Wings' victory.

ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman right wing **Billy Maday** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the month for November. In nine games during the month, Maday had seven goals and four assists for 11 points. Included in his seven goals were five power-play markers. Maday scored points in eight of the nine games and was +4 in the month. He finished the month scoring goals in the last five consecutive games, going 5g, 2a in that span. The freshman is fourth in scoring on the team with 10 goals and 10 assists for 20 points in his first 26 games.

CCHA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** and senior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** were selected as the CCHA's defenseman and goaltender of the week respectively for the week ending, Jan. 11. Lawson helped the Irish limit Alaska to 38 shots on the weekend while recording assists on three of Notre Dame's five goals in the series. He was +3 and blocked two shots versus the Nanooks. Pearce continued his incredible season with two shutouts in goal versus Alaska. The senior stopped all 38 shots he faced - 16 in Friday's 2-0 win and 22 in the 3-0 win on Saturday. The shutouts were the third and fourth of the season for Pearce and extended his current shutout streak to a career best 161:30 over the last three games.

THE NEW KIDS: With **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** playing in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26 to Jan. 5, head coach Jeff Jackson called on a pair of freshmen defensemen to step into the lineup for the Shillelagh Tournament. **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and **Nick Condon (Wausau, Wis.)** stepped into the lineup and played well in place of Cole and Ruth. For Ringel, it was his fourth and fifth games this season. He had no shots but was +1 on the weekend. Condon played in his second and third games and also had no shots but was +1 for the weekend.

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went 6-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

FIRST POINT: Freshman center **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** picked up his first collegiate point in the 1-0 win over Ferris State. Gaul started the game-winning play as he moved the puck through the neutral zone to defenseman **Ian Cole** who set up **Dan Kissel's** game winner. Gaul has played in eight games this season for the Irish.

Calabrese, Fowler and Palmieri all play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Fowler and Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a two-game series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

TWO IN A ROW: The two consecutive losses by Notre Dame to Miami on Oct. 24-25 marked the first time that the Irish have lost two in a row at home since March 3-4, 2006 when they lost both games of their first round, CCHA playoff series to Alaska, 3-1 and 1-0. The last time that Notre Dame was swept at home in a regular-season CCHA series was Nov. 25-26, 2005 when the Irish were swept at the Joyce Center by Ohio State, 4-1 and 5-2.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender **Tom O'Brien** became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by **Jordan Pearce** who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. **David Brown '07** had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

THEY HAVE OUR NUMBER: Notre Dame's loss to the University of Denver drops the Irish to just 10-35-3 all-time against the Pioneers. Playing at DU has been a problem for the Irish as they are now 2-22-2 in the all-time series at the Mile High City. The two teams were members of the WCHA from 1971-1981. Since leaving the WCHA following the 1980-81 season, the Irish are just 1-4-1 against Denver and 1-3-0 since **Jeff Jackson** took over as head coach in 2005-06.

FOUR FOR US: After giving up four goals in the third period of the season opener at Denver (10/11), the Irish blitzed Sacred Heart for four goals in the second period of the 7-0 shutout on Oct. 18. The four-goal outburst was the first for Notre Dame since doing it on Dec. 8, 2007, getting four goals in the second period of a 7-0 shutout at Princeton. Notre Dame also scored four goals in a period on November 1, 2007 with four in the second versus Lake Superior State in a 7-3 victory.

DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors **Erik Condra** and **Jordan Pearce** don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med while Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Erik Condra** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2008-09 season. Joining Condra as alternate captains in '08-'09, are senior center **Christian Hanson** along with junior left wing **Ryan Thang** and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson**. Condra served as an alternate captain in 2007-08 while this is the first season as captains for Hanson, Thang and Lawson.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – senior forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan** (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork '83** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips' uncle, is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** was selected as an *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since **Dan Carlson '01** and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), **Andy Jurkowski '00** (third team), **Forrest Karr '99** (second team) and **Steve Noble '97** and '98 (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-'08 – **Mark Van Guilder '08** and **Erik Condra** (Livonia, Mich.)

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the fourth year of Graduation Success Rate measurements developed by the NCAA and released on Oct. 11. None of the 119 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 figure (19 of 22). This marked the third time in the four years of the survey that Notre Dame has ranked number one in percentage of teams with 100 scores. Here are the top 10 in that category (only 10 institutions had 50% or more of their sports registering 100 marks):

NCAA figures showed that all 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent -- basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, basketball, cross country/track, fencing, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Ice hockey scored 96 percent, football scored 94 percent, and golf was

at 90. Overall, that's one more perfect score than a year ago for the Irish programs, after Notre Dame recorded 18 100 percent GSR scores (of 22 sports) in 2007. In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranked number one.

BACK-TO-BACK: Following the 2007-08 CCHA regular season, goaltender **Jordan Pearce** won the league's top goaltender award based on his 1.80 goals-against average in CCHA games. Pearce followed **David Brown '07**, who had a 1.77 goals-against average to win the 2006-07 award. This marks the fourth time since the 1982-83 season that the same school has won back-to-back goaltending titles with different goaltenders between the pipes. Pearce and Brown are joined on that list by:

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team – senior center **Christian Hanson** and sophomore goaltender **Brian Brooke (Eden Prairie, Minn.)** – have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, **Bob Brooke**, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

MINUTES MAN: Goaltender **Jordan Pearce** entered the 2007-08 season having played in just 12 games and 622 minutes in the first two years of his Irish hockey career. During the '07-'08 campaign, Pearce showed everyone that he could play as he set Notre Dame goaltending marks for games played (43), games started (42) and minutes played (2,557:46). He finished the season ranked second in the nation in minutes played behind Boston College's John Muse who saw action in 2,725:06 minutes for the Eagles.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman **Teddy Ruth** was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though.

At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 56 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

HOMETOWNS: The 2008-09 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 14 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Sophomore **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden during the 2007-08 season.

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** begins his fourth season behind the Irish bench in 2008-09. In his first three years he has compiled a 72-42-11 (.620) record, highlighted by a 32-7-3 mark in 2006-07 and last season's 27-16-4 record on the way to the first-ever appearance for the Irish in the Frozen Four. The '06-'07 CCHA coach-of-the-year and Spencer Penrose Award winner as the national coach-of-the-year, Jackson enters the '08-'09 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with five or more years. His current overall record stands at 254-94-36 for a .708 success rate. His 254 wins tie him for 17th on the list of active coaches. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop – Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. Included in his 254 career wins are 46 postseason victories (46-14 in postseason) and a .767 winning percentage. In nine trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 30-7 (.811). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 6-5 record at Notre Dame. In those nine seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals eight times, winning five tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** (Ann Arbor, Mich.) was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore **Teddy Ruth** (Naperville, Ill.) who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with **Sean Lorenz** (Fr., Littleton, Colo.) were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play

Cole and Ruth join **Jack Brownschidle** ('76-'77, '78-'79), **Ben Simon** ('96-'97, '97-'98), **Joe Dusbabek** ('97-'98), **Dan Carlson** ('98-'99), **Connor Dunlop** ('99-'00, '00-'01), **Brett Henning** ('99-'00), **David Inman** ('99-'00), **Rob Globke** ('00-'01, '01-'02), **Brett Lebda** ('01-'02) and **Kyle Lawson** ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have eight players on the 2008-09 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Just one incoming freshman – defenseman **Sean Lorenz** – was selected in the 2008 draft as he was picked by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. In the previous draft in June of 2007, Notre Dame saw five of its players selected. Leading the way was current sophomore defenseman **Ian Cole** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan** (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. They join senior right wing **Erik Condra** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

USA...USA...USA: Notre Dame will have seven players on the 2008-09 roster who have cut their teeth with the U.S. National Team Developmental Program. The list includes: senior **Jordan Pearce**, junior **Kyle Lawson**, sophomores **Ian Cole**, **Teddy Ruth** and **Brad Phillips** and newcomers **Patrick Gaul** (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and **Sean Lorenz**. Since the program started, the Irish have 21 former USNTDP alumni play at Notre Dame since the program began in 1997-98.
