Notre Dame vs. Stonehill

- Notre Dame plays its second and final exhibition tuneup before the start of the 2008-09 campaign when the Irish entertain Stonehill on Sunday, Nov. 9. The Skyhawks finished 18-14 and were 12-10 in the Northeast-10 Conference. The Irish were 25-8 campaign (the third most wins in school history) and registered a 14-4 mark in BIG EAST play as they tied for second in the final regular-season standings. Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament and made its second straight appearance and fifth in the last eight years.

- Notre opens up the program's 104th season one week from today when the Irish play host to USC Upstate in the first-ever meeting between the two schools.

Notre Dame vs. Briar Cliff Recap

- After a somewhat slow start, the Irish exploded for 57 second-half points en route to a 103-64 victory in its first exhibition test of the season. **Ryan Ayers** led Notre Dame with 21 points as he connected on 8-15 shots from the field. **Luke Harangody** finished with

16 points and 11 rebounds, while **Tory Jackson** scored 18 points, grabbed seven rebounds, dished off seven assists and made five steals. All five starters scored in double figures with **Luke Zeller** netting 12 points and grabbing six rebounds and **Kyle McAlarney** chipping in 11 points.

- All 11 players who played in the game scored. **Tim Abromaitis** came off the bench to his three-of-five shots as he finished with eight points and four rebounds in nine minutes of action, Carleton Scott played 12 minutes and added six points and six rebounds.

- Notre Dame shot 51.4 percent from the field (38-74) for the game and dished off 20 assists. The Irish also outrebounded Briar Cliff 51-27 in the contest and turned the ball over just nine times, made 10 steals and blocked four shots. Notre Dame also converted 18-21 free throws from the charity stripe.

2007-08 Rewind

- Notre Dame returned to the NCAA tournament for the second consecutive year and fifth time in eight seasons under head coach Mike Brey. The Irish enjoyed its first 25-win campaign under Brey while putting together a banner year in the BIG EAST by finishing with a school record 14 wins en route to a final 14-4 mark. Notre Dame has put together five campaigns of 10 or more wins in BIG EAST regular-season play. The Irish earned a No. 5 in the East Region and defeated No. 12 seed George Washington (68-50) and then lost to No. 4 seed Washington (61-41). Notre Dame closed out the regular season by winning 11 of its final 13 regular-season games. During Brey's tenure, the Irish have posted five 20-win seasons.

Who's Back

- Notre Dame loses just one starter off of last year's team, forward **Rob Kurz**. **Kurz**, a two-time captain, was the third-leading as he averaged 12.5 ppg. and finished as the second-leading rebounder at 7.1 rpg.

- 2008 BIG EAST Player of the Year **Luke Harangody** returns after putting together becoming the surprise player nationally during the 2007-08 campaign. The junior forward was a consensus second team All-American and averaged 20.4 points and 10.6 rebounds in 33 rebounds. He became just the second player in BIG EAST Conference history to lead the conference in both scoring and rebounding as he netted 23.3 points and grabbed 11.3 boards. Selected as the Preseason BIG EAST Player of the Year, he was named a preseason first-team All-American by nearly every publication.

- Senior guard **Kyle McAlarney**, who joined Harangody on the all-BIG EAST first team last season, is one of four returning seniors on the Irish squad. McAlarney was the second-leading scorer as he averaged 15.1 points and set the Notre Dame single-season three-point record with 108. He will return as one of the nation's top three-point threats after shooting 44.1 percent from behind the three-point stripe.

- **Zach Hillesland** became a starter in the Irish lineup 17 games into last season and averaged career bests of 6.1 points and 5.2 rebounds. Classmate **Ryan Ayers** started the first 16 games of the '07-'08 campaign and also averaged personal highs of 7.8 points and 3.2 rebounds. Along with McAlarney, he will one of the team's top three-point shooters after hitting on a career-best 45.1 percent of his shots a year ago. **Luke Zeller** round out the senior class and can play both inside and along the perimeter. He averaged 4.5 points 2.2 rebounds.

- **Tory Jackson** will team with McAlarney to form one of the nation's top backcourt tandems. Jackson averaged 8.0 points and 5.1 rebounds and led the BIG EAST Conference in assists with 5.8 per game. He also led the Irish in steals with 58 for an average of 1.8 per game. Classmate **Jonathan Peoples** is likely to see improve on his 11.5 minutes of playing time a year ago. Peoples played in all 33 games and averaged 3.3 points.

- Sophomores **Tim Abromaitis**, **Tyrone Nash** and **Carleton Scott** will look for playing time off the bench. Abromaitis played in 12 games and averaged 1.7, while Nash saw action in 15 contests and averaged 1.0 points and 1.3 rebounds. Scott did not play last season, but will contribute at both ends of the floor as a scorer and rebounder.

- Notre Dame led the nation in assists (18.4 per game) and led the BIG EAST in scoring at 79.0 points per game.

Irish Debut At No. 9 In ESPN/USA Today Coaches' Poll

- Notre Dame is ranked ninth in ESPN/USA Today Preseason Coaches' Poll that was released on October 30. It was the highest preseason ranking ever for the Irish in the preseason coaches' poll. Prior to this season, it's highest ranking ever was 17th in 2000-01 in the poll which began in 1991-92. The last time the Irish started the season ranked was in preseason coaches poll was in 2004-05 (21st). The BIG EAST led all conference with seven teams ranked in the top 25 — Connecticut (2nd), Louisville (3rd), Pittsburgh (6th), Marquette (17th), Georgetown (18th) and Villanova (25th).

Ditto For The Associated Press Poll

- The Irish also are ranked ninth in the Preseason Associated Press Poll. It marked the fifth time in program history that Notre Dame has debuted in the top-10 of the AP poll.

- The Irish have not begun a season ranked in the top 10 of the AP rankings since 1980-81 when they were 10th. Notre Dame's highest-ever AP preseason mark was third in 1978-79. The Irish were ranked fourth in 1977-78 and fifth in 1979-80. The last time Notre Dame was ranked in the preseason AP poll was in 2004-05 when the Irish were 20th.

- A total of seven BIG EAST teams appear in the top 25, including four in the top 10.

Nine Straight Postseason Appearances

- Notre Dame's appearance in last year's NCAA tournament field marked the fifth NCAA berth for the Irish in seven years. Since 2000, Notre Dame has appeared in either the NCAA or NIT tournaments each of the last nine years — the longest postseason stretch in school history.

Five 20-Win Seasons Under His Belt

- With its 25-8 record last season, Notre Dame reached the 20-win mark for the fifth time in eight seasons and second consecutive year under head coach Mike Brey. Notre Dame's 20-win campaigns under Brey have been in 2000-01 (20-10), 2001-02 (22-11), 2002-03 (24-10) and 24-8 (2006-07). In the 103-year history of the program, Notre Dame teams have won 20 or more games on 32 occasions.

Tough Schedule

- Notre Dame's 2008-09 schedule may rank as the toughest in school history. The Irish are slated to play No. 2 Connecticut and No. 3 Louisville twice during the BIG EAST regular season and will face No. 6 Pittsburgh on the road and No. 17 Marquette, No. 18 Georgetown and No. 25 Villanova at home. The Irish are also slated to take on No. 4 UCLA in Los Angeles in early February. Two other potential top-10 foes Notre Dame could face at the Maui Invitational at No. 1 North Carolina and No. 8 Texas.

BIG EAST Turnaround

- Under head coach Mike Brey's tenure, Notre Dame has had only one losing season. That season was in 2005-06 when the Irish finished 6-10 after beginning the BIG EAST campaign with a 1-8 record. Since that 1-8 start, Notre Dame has gone 30-11 (.732) over the last 41 regular-season games.

One Shy Of The All-Time Record

• Notre Dame's 37-game streak at the Joyce Center is one shy of tying the school's all-time home court win streak of 38 games set from Dec. 11, 1943 until Feb. 9, 1948 in the Fieldhouse. The Irish have not lost at home since suffering an 80-72 setback to Marquette on February 25, 2006.

Home Cookin'

• Notre Dame's 17-0 record at home in 2007-08 marked just the fourth time since the opening of the Joyce Center in 1968-69 that an Irish team finished undefeated at home during the regular season. In 2006-07, the Irish were 18-0 which marked the most wins ever for a Notre Dame team in a single season. In addition to this year's team and the 2006-07 squad, only two other Notre Dame squads ever completed a season undefeated at home — the 1973-74 and 1985-86 squads both finished their campaigns with identical 15-0 records. The Irish have been the only BIG EAST team to finish undefeated at home each of the last two seasons. Dating back to the 2005-06 campaign, Notre Dame has won 37 consecutive games at the Joyce Center — an active streak that is second among all Division I teams and is the longest during Mike Brey's tenure.

• Notre Dame's current streak dates back to the final two games of the 2005-06 campaign as Irish defeated DePaul (66-61) in the regular-season finale and Vanderbilt (79-69) in the first round of the NIT. Notre Dame's last loss at home was an 80-72 setback to Marquette on February 25, 2006.

• Notre Dame broke the Joyce Center home win streak mark on December 8 with its 108-62 win over Northern Illinois. Here's a look at the Joyce Center streaks:

Three New Faces On The Irish Bench

• **Anthony Solomon** is back on the Irish sidelines this season as an assistant coach. He first was a member of Mike Brey's staff in 2000-03 before leaving to become the head coach at St. Bonaventure University (2003-07) and then serving as an assistant at Dayton during the past 2007-08 season.

• **Ben Hansbrough** and **Scott Martin** transferred to Notre Dame in June 2008 and will not be eligible to play during the 2008-09 campaign due to NCAA transfer rules. Hansbrough played two seasons at Mississippi State where he saw action in 65 contests and made 28 starts from 2006-08. He averaged 8.8 points, 3.3 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 28.2 minutes per game during his two-year stint. Martin played just one year (2007-08) at Purdue and was the fourth-leading scorer for the Boilermakers as he averaged 8.5 points and 3.8 rebounds.

Success In The Classroom

• The basketball team was one of six Notre Dame teams to earn the 2007-08 BIG EAST Team Academic Excellence award which recognized the highest collective grade averages in each conference sport. The Irish have earned a 3.097 cumulative grade point average and has produced a GPA of 3.0 or better in seven of the last nine semesters and the team cumulative GPA has been above 3.0 for the last eight semesters.
