- Clemson takes on its second straight ranked opponent, as the Tigers travel to No. 21 Notre Dame on Saturday; the Fighting Irish have come out on top in all four meetings since joining the ACC in 2013-14.
- The Tigers are in search of a 2-0 start to road play in the ACC; the last time that happened was in 2013-14, when Clemson won at Boston College and Virginia Tech to open its slate away from home.
- Clemson was tied for the national lead with five top-50 RPI wins through games of Thursday.

TIGER TRACKS

- Clemson averages 8.4 steals per game, the program's highest pace since the 2009-10 season. The Tigers rank second among ACC teams in the statistic.
- Jaron Blossomgame has been at his best against Notre Dame, averaging 17.8 points per game, highest versus any opponent in his career. Last season, he poured in 30 points and made 13 field goals against the Irish. Blossomgame has shot 30-48 (.625) in his career against the Fighting Irish.
- Blossomgame needs just two points to become only the seventh player in Clemson history with at least 1,400 points and 700 rebounds in a career.
- In two appearances against North Carolina, including as a freshman at Robert Morris, sophomore Marcquise Reed is averaging 20.5 points per game. He posted 17 for the Tigers on Tuesday, including the game-tying three with 22 seconds left in regulation.
- Avry Holmes has improved his three-point shooting over a year ago, shooting nearly five percentage points higher (.380). He also is just three steals shy of reaching 100 for his career.

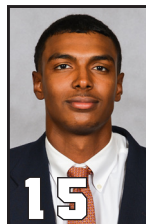

HEAD COACH BRAD BROWNELL

- Named the 21st men's basketball head coach in Clemson history on April 13, 2010.
- Is coaching his 15th season in Division I, having previously coached four years each at UNC Wilmington and Wright State before coming to Clemson.
- Set Clemson records for total wins (22) and ACC wins (9) by a first-year head coach in 2010-11.
- Led Clemson to first NCAA Tournament win in 14 years when the Tigers topped UAB in the first round in 2011.
- Has taken three different schools to the NCAA Tournament.
- Took the Tigers to the 2014 NIT semifinals.
- Winningest coach in history on a percentage basis against ACC competition, and needs just eight wins to pass Cliff Ellis for the career record (59) at Clemson.
- Coached K.J. McDaniels (2014) and Jaron Blossomgame (2016) to first-team All-ACC honors. McDaniels was ACC Defensive Player of the Year, while Blossomgame won the ACC's Most Improved Award.
- Named Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006. He coached CAA Player of the Year Brett Blizzard in 2002-03, his first season.
- Took over Wright State in 2006-07 and guided the school to a record 23 wins in his first season and an NCAA Tournament bid.
- Played Division III ball at DePauw University in Greencastle, Ind.
- He and his wife, Paula, have two daughters, Abby (18), a freshman at Clemson, and Kate (16).

LITTLEJOHN COLISEUM BACK IN BUSINESS

- Clemson held a ribbon-cutting for the newly renovated Littlejohn Coliseum on Friday, October 14.
- The opener against Georgia on Nov. 11 served as the 'grand reopening' of the facility, complete with all the bells and whistles.
- The \$63.5 million project was completed after 16 months of renovation, which began almost immediately after the 2014-15 season.
- Renovation features include:
 - Newly configured seating bowl, with court rotating 90 degrees from its prior layout
 - Swann Pavilion, a newly designed operations complex and practice facility connected to the arena
 - Burton Gallery, a new 10,000 square foot main entrance space
 - Expanded portals, allowing for a more accessible in-game atmosphere from the concourse level
 - Nation's largest centerhung curved videoboard, as well as ribbon boards atop each portal in the seating bowl
 - Coliseum club & courtside club premium seating areas
 - Coaches offices overlooking the practice gym
 - Expansive space for staff conferences
 - Locker room for players, coaches and staff
 - Team film and meeting room
 - Players lounge
 - Recruiting lounge
 - Weight room connecting the players lounge to the practice gym
 - Athletic training room

TIGERS COMPLETE 'EARN YOUR ORANGE' CHALLENGE

- Brad Brownell took his team through a five-week series in the preseason entitled 'Earn Your Orange,' where players were given a weekly challenge that included mile runs, campus runs, hill runs, football field lengths, learning the alma mater, and a community service project with ClemsonLIFE.
- Clemson also practiced five sessions with the women's rowing staff, learning how to compete together as a team on Lake Hartwell.

GAME NOTES & MISCELLANEOUS STATS

TIGERS SEEK FIRST VICTORY OVER NOTRE DAME

- In what has been a competitive series since Notre Dame joined the ACC in 2013-14, the Fighting Irish have come out victorious in all four meetings against Clemson. Three of the four have been decided by six points or less.
- Notre Dame is the only ACC team Clemson has not defeated. The Tigers already own wins over Louisville, Pittsburgh and Syracuse.
- The first game in the series was a memorable double overtime contest in South Bend. The Irish hung on for a 68-64 victory despite a monumental effort from All-ACC wing K.J. McDaniels (30 points, 14 rebounds).

NOTRE DAME SCOUTING REPORT

- The Fighting Irish enter Saturday's tilt with a 13-2 overall record, 2-0 in ACC play. Mike Brey has a 369-179 record in his 17th season as Notre Dame's head coach. He took the Irish to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament last season.
- Four players average double figures, led by power forward Bonzie Colson who sports a double-double at 16.7 points and 10.7 rebounds per game.
- The Irish are the nation's top free throw shooting team at 84 percent, and are also one of the ACC's top three-point offenses (.396).

CLEMSON TIED FOR NATIONAL LEAD IN TOP-50 RPI WINS

- Through the completion of games on Jan. 5, the Tigers were tied for the national lead in wins over top-50 RPI teams with five. Baylor, Creighton, Florida State and Villanova also had five top-50 RPI wins.
- Clemson is 7-2 against teams in the current top 100 of the RPI.

TIGERS HAD LONGEST WINNING STREAK SINCE 2008-09

- With the win over Wake Forest to start ACC play, Clemson won its ninth straight game, the longest streak under coach Brad Brownell. Clemson's longest winning streak since 2008-09 (16) was snapped in the overtime loss to North Carolina on Jan. 3. During the winning streak, the Tigers were 3-0 in games decided by five points or less.

CLEMSON CLOSED OUT NON-CONFERENCE PLAY 10-2

- The Tigers, 10-2 on the season, compiled the program's best winning percentage in non-conference play (.833) since 2009-10, when Oliver Purnell's last team went 12-2 prior to ACC play.
- Clemson's win over UNC Wilmington boosted the Tigers to an RPI of No. 24, by far the top non-conference performance in a number of years.

TIGERS EARN CONSECUTIVE WINS AT WAKE FOREST

- Clemson has won just four times in Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum since the facility opened in 1989, but three of the four wins have come under Brad Brownell's watch.
- The Tigers earned an 89-75 win that first season, but did not experience the taste of victory again until 2011-12.
- Brownell guided Clemson to a 76-62 win at Wake last season, and 73-68 last weekend to earn the Tigers' first consecutive wins in Lawrence Joel.

COMEBACK FOR THE AGES

- In the 73-68 victory over Wake Forest, the Tigers ended the game with a 15-0 run to stun the Lawrence Joel Coliseum crowd.
- Clemson overcame a 13-point deficit in the final seven minutes, the largest second half deficit overcome since the Tigers of 2010-11 erased a 19-point lead by NC State at home.
- The Tigers held the Demon Deacons scoreless over the final 4:50.
- It was the 10th time a Tiger team has rallied from a double-digit deficit since Brad Brownell became head coach in 2010.

DECEMBER WAS PERFECT FOR THE TIGERS

- Clemson closed out the year 2016 on the highest note possible, winning all seven of its games in the month of December.
- It marked the first time since December 2008 that the Tigers finished a month with a perfect record.
- During the month, Clemson posted three road wins (Alabama, South Carolina, Wake Forest) and defeated three teams in the top 100 of the RPI.

GAME NOTES

THE BENCHMARK

- A big reason for the Tigers' success so far in 2016-17 has been the play of their bench. Clemson is 10-1 when its reserves outscore the opposition, with the only loss coming to No. 14 North Carolina.
- Marquise Reed (10.9 points per game), Gabe DeVoe (9.0 ppg) and Elijah Thomas (8.4 ppg) comprise one of the ACC's top bench rotations.
- In the ACC opener against Wake Forest, Clemson's bench outscored the Demon Deacons by a 34-13 margin.

TURNOVER MARGIN AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

- Clemson has protected the basketball well during the first 14 games of the season, committing the nation's 17th fewest turnovers per game (10.9).
- Equally as important, the Tigers have been turning their opponents over. Clemson is 11th nationally in turnover margin (+5.1), due in large part to one of the ACC's best steals per game (8.4) figures.
- Clemson has won the turnover margin in all but three games this season, and is 8-2 when gaining the upper hand in the statistic.

TIGERS MAKE HISTORY IN COLUMBIA

- Clemson entered its Dec. 21 contest with No. 20 South Carolina with an 0-12 record all-time on the road against ranked non-conference opponents, but changed that with a thrilling 62-60 victory over the Gamecocks.
- It was only Clemson's seventh regular season win over a ranked non-conference team in history, regardless of site, and first since 2014-15 against Arkansas.
- The win was Clemson's second over a top-25 Gamecock team (1997-98).
- Clemson has now won 28 times in history over South Carolina in Columbia, second-most wins in program history on the road over another opponent, trailing only 41 all-time road wins over Furman.
- The win was the Tiger program's fifth in the last seven games against South Carolina in Colonial Life Arena.

CLEMSON FLIPS SCRIPT, GOES 3-0 VS. THE SEC

- The Tigers have rewritten the script from the 2015-16 season, when Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina all defeated Clemson. This year's group went 3-0 against the same three teams, beating Alabama and South Carolina in consecutive road games.
- Clemson last won three games against teams in the SEC in the same season in 2014-15, when the Tigers knocked off LSU, Arkansas and Auburn.
- The Tigers are now 8-8 all-time under Brad Brownell against teams from the SEC.

CLEMSON OPENS LITTLEJOHN COLISEUM WITH WIN OVER GEORGIA

- The Tigers long anticipated a return to their home arena, which finished a 16-month renovation in October 2016.
- Clemson did not disappoint in its return before a capacity crowd. The Tigers beat nearby rival Georgia, avenging a 23-point loss the year before with a 74-64 win to open the season November 11.
- The win was the program's first over a team currently in a "Power 5" conference to open a season since 1996-97, when the Tigers shocked the world by beating defending NCAA champion Kentucky in Indianapolis, Ind.

BROWNELL CLEMSON'S WINNINGEST COACH VS. ACC COMPETITION

- Head coach Brad Brownell carries a career record of 285-175 overall, 118-90 at Clemson.
- Brownell is Clemson's career winning percentage leader against ACC competition, and has led the Tigers to 10 regular-season wins in two of the past three seasons.
- Brownell owns 53 career wins over ACC teams, third-most in school history behind Cliff Ellis (59) and Oliver Purnell (54). He needs seven to move atop the recordbooks following his team's 73-68 victory at Wake Forest.

BROWNELL GETS A WIN OVER FIRST HEAD COACHING STOP

- Clemson head coach Brad Brownell earned his start as a head coach at UNC Wilmington from 2002-06. In four seasons, his teams compiled a combined record of 83-40 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament twice.
- Brownell was the Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2003 and 2006, both seasons his teams won conference tournament titles.
- He put all the emotions aside on Dec. 28, when he led his Tigers to an 87-73 win over Wilmington, the school that first gave him a shot as head coach.

THREE TIGERS PLAYING WITH DEGREES

- Two members of the Tiger team began play in their final seasons with an undergraduate Clemson degree already in hand, Jaron Blossomgame and Riley McGillan.
- The two roommates both graduated this year, McGillan with a marketing degree in May and Blossomgame with a sociology degree in August.
- A third, Avry Holmes, joined them on Dec. 15 by graduating with a communication degree.

BLOSSOMGAME POSTS ANOTHER 20-POINT ACC GAME

- Jaron Blossomgame made a habit out of scoring 20 or more points in ACC play last season, a trend that continued Jan. 3 in Clemson's home league opener against North Carolina.
- The Clemson graduate now has scored 20 or more points in 12 of his last 18 ACC regular season games, dating to last season.
- His 24 points were the most scored by a Tiger player against the Tar Heels since Devin Booker posted 25 in a Feb. 28, 2013 meeting.

BLOSSOMGAME HAS BEEN AT HIS BEST AGAINST NOTRE DAME

- Jaron Blossomgame has put up gaudy numbers in four appearances against the Fighting Irish.
- His average of 17.8 points per game is the highest against any ACC opponent over his decorated career. It includes a 30-point outing at home in an 89-83 loss last season.
- Blossomgame posted double-doubles in both meetings with Notre Dame as a sophomore in 2014-15. He posted 17 points and 14 rebounds in a narrow loss at home, before responding with what was then an ACC-high 22 points in South Bend to end the regular season.
- He has hit 30 of 48 shots in his career against Notre Dame, 62.5 percent.

BLOSSOMGAME TWO POINTS SHY OF 1400/700 CLUB

- Jaron Blossomgame needs just two points Saturday to reach 1,400 for his career. When he achieves it, he will be just the seventh player in Clemson history with 1,400 points and 700 rebounds over a career.
- The most recent player to achieve the benchmark in both statistics was Trevor Booker, who played for the Tigers from 2006-10.

BLOSSOMGAME MOVIN' ON UP

- Jaron Blossomgame passed a decorated former player on Clemson's career scoring chart in the Dec. 28 win over UNC Wilmington. With 20 points, he moved ahead of longtime NBA great Larry Nance for 17th on the all-time scoring list. He later passed Vince Yockel for 16th place after his fourth 20-point outing of the season.
- Blossomgame passed both Stan Rome and Demontez Stitt for 14th place on Clemson's all-time scoring list after his 14-point showing at Wake Forest.
- He also moved into the top 10 in Clemson history against Wake Forest when he made his 105th start as a Tiger. He tied former teammate Rod Hall for ninth in the North Carolina game.

DJITTE AVERAGING CAREER-HIGH ON THE BOARDS

- Senior center Sidy Djitte put together arguably the top effort of his career on Nov. 20 when he amassed 14 points and 14 rebounds, playing all 40 minutes against Oklahoma in the Tire Pros Invitational.
- Djitte's minute and rebound totals both set career highs, while his point total tied his previous best of 14 set last season against Florida State.
- Djitte ranks seventh among all NCAA players with 4.1 offensive rebounds per game, snatching 58 on the season.

HOLMES ACHIEVES 1,000 CAREER POINTS

- Senior guard Avry Holmes went past the 1,000 career point plateau in Clemson's game against Coppin State on Dec. 4, becoming the second active Tiger to reach 1,000, along with Jaron Blossomgame.
- Holmes scored 607 points his first two seasons for the University of San Francisco, and added 311 in his first year of eligibility at Clemson.

HOLMES IMPROVED FROM THREE-POINT RANGE

- Avry Holmes shot over 40 percent from long distance each of his two seasons at San Francisco, but saw his accuracy dip to 33 percent in his first season with the Tigers in 2015-16.
- But the steady Tiger senior has seen his percentages increase slowly but surely in 2016-17. He leads the Tigers with 30 three-pointers, eight more than the next closest player.
- Holmes has connected on 38 percent this season, and has made three or more in a game five times this year (after only doing so seven times in 31 games last season).

MITCHELL 9-1 WITH THE TIGERS

- Sophomore point guard Shelton Mitchell, one of Clemson's most anticipated newcomers, sustained a knee injury in practice on Nov. 7. He underwent a minor procedure the following day to clean up the affected area, and missed Clemson's first four games.
- Since returning to action Nov. 25 against High Point, he has been one of Clemson's top players. Mitchell is averaging 9.4 points per game. The Tigers are 9-1 with him in the lineup.
- Mitchell scored a career-high 18 points in the win over Alabama on Dec. 18, hitting 6-10 field goals (2-2 from three) and all four of his free throws.

REED IMPRESSIVE IN PAIR OF DEBUTS AS A TIGER

- Marquise Reed, former Robert Morris standout and 2015 Northeast Conference Rookie of the Year after scoring 15.1 points per game for the

Colonials, did not disappoint in his first game as a Tiger.

- Reed scored a team-high 19 points, hitting five of 11 field goal attempts and all six of his free throws. He was 3-6 behind the three-point arc in the win over Georgia on Nov. 11.
- Reed's point total was the highest by any Clemson player in a debut since Elden Campbell also scored 19, as a freshman in 1986-87.
- He then made his ACC debut with the Tigers in similar fashion, scoring 21 points. His point total was the highest in a first ACC game as a Tiger since 2001-02, when Chey Christie scored 21 against Duke.

REED CONFIDENT VS. POWER 5 TEAMS

- Marquise Reed has stepped his game up a notch when taking on the top competition. In seven games against teams from "Power 5" conferences, Reed is averaging 13.7 points per game.
- Reed is 29-33 at the free throw line in games against Power 5 teams, converting a perfect 6-6 versus both Georgia and South Carolina.
- His play has been critical in Clemson's two most recent road wins at South Carolina and Wake Forest. In the win over the Gamecocks, he scored 12 of his 14 points in the second half to help the Tigers erase a four-point deficit.
- Against Wake, he posted 17 of his 21 points in the second half to propel the Tigers to an improbable win after trailing by 13 points.

THOMAS ADDS DEPTH IN THE FRONT COURT

- Elijah Thomas, a former top-50 recruit who played eight games last season at Texas A&M, made his debut for the Tigers on Dec. 18 at Alabama. He produced five points and three rebounds in 11 minutes.
- Thomas transferred to Clemson in the middle of the academic year, and has been practicing with the Tigers since January 2016.
- The Dallas, Texas product had a solid showing in his second appearance as a Tiger, compiling career highs in points (12), rebounds (7) and minutes (26) against South Carolina on Dec. 21.
- In five appearances, Thomas is averaging 8.4 points per game and has made 17 of 25 field goal attempts (.680).
