Series History: First meeting

OVERVIEW

▶ The Notre Dame Fighting Irish hockey team opens the 2016-17 season with a weekend series versus Arizona State, marking the first ever meetings between the two teams.

▶ This season marks Notre Dame's 49th year of varsity hockey, and the 12th under the guidance of Head Coach Jeff Jackson.

▶ This weekend's series will be the first of three straight non-conference series the Irish play to open the 2016-17 season.

NOTRE DAME IN SEASON OPENERS

▶ The Irish are 24-22-2 all-time in season-opening games.

▶ Under Head Coach Jeff Jackson, Notre Dame is 5-6-0 in season openers.

ARIZONA STATE AT A GLANCE

▶ The Sun Devils will begin their first full season of NCAA Division I play on Friday night at the Compton Family Ice Arena.

▶ Playing a mixed schedule last season, Arizona State went 5-22-2 against NCAA teams in 2015-16, including wins over Alaska and Lake Superior State.

► The Sun Devils are coached by Greg Powers (Arizona State '99).
 ► The 2016-17 ASU roster features three NHL Draft picks including senior forward Robbie Baillargeon (a Boston University transfer), junior forward Wade Murphy (a North Dakota transfer) and freshman goaltender Joey Daccord.
 ► ASU's leading returning scorer is sophomore forward Jordan Masters, who had eight goals and 14 assists for 22 points as a freshman.
 ► Notre Dame will play college hockey's two newest programs early in the 2016-17 season, including Arizona State (2015) and Penn State (2012).

USNTDP EXHIBITION RECAP: W, 5-1

► The Irish built a 3-0 first period lead and went on to post a 5-1 win over the U.S. National Team Development Program (U18) in exhibition action on Oct. 2 at the Compton Family Ice Arena.
 ► Notre Dame's 3-0 lead came on two goals by Jordan Gross and a Dylan Malmquist tally.
 ► Logan Cockerill scored for Team USA at 19:13 of the second, but Jack Jenkins answered with a goal just 18 seconds later to make it a 4-1 game after two periods of play.
 ► Jenkins went on to close the scoring at 13:01 of the third period when he notched his second of the night.
 ► Cal Petersen finished with 20 saves on the night, while Adam Scheel made 32 saves in the Team USA net.
 ► Notre Dame's power play finished 3-for-9 on the night, while the Irish penalty kill was a perfect 8-for-8.
 ► Head Coach Jeff Jackson served as the first head coach of the USNTDP from 1996-2000.
 ► Associate coach Andy Slaggert's son, Graham, played in the game for the USNTDP team.

PETERSEN WEARING THE "C"

► Junior goaltender Cal Petersen will be the first goaltender in program history to wear the captain's "C" for the Irish in 2016-17.
 ► Petersen started all 37 games in 2015-16 and led the nation in percentage of team minutes played while posting a 19-11-7 record.
 ► He finished 2015-16 with a 2.20 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage, which ranked 12th in the country.
 ► His .927 save percentage ranked as the third-best, single-season mark in program history, while his 2.20 goals-against average was the sixth-best, single-season total in the Irish record book.

ALTERNATES: BJORK, EVANS, RIPLEY

► Petersen's classmates Anders Bjork, Jake Evans and Luke Ripley will serve as alternate captains this season, creating an all junior class leadership core for the Irish.
 ► Bjork led the Irish in scoring in 2015-16, posting 35 points on 12 goals and 23 assists in 35 games (his 12 goals and 23 assists were career-high totals).
 ► Evans had a breakout year offensively for the Irish in 2015-16 as he scored eight goals and added 25 assists for 33 points in all 37 games.
 ► Ripley skated in all 37 games last season, scored a goal and added six assists for seven points.
 ► Ripley also finished the season with a +12 rating, which ranked second on the team among defensemen, and blocked 56 shots.

NBC SPORTS BACK FOR FOURTH SEASON

► The NBC Sports Group will once again provide coverage of Notre Dame hockey throughout the 2016-17 season.
 ► As part of NBC Sports Group's fourth season presenting Notre Dame hockey, NBCSN, the NBC Sports app and NBCSports.com will combine to deliver all 21 Fighting Irish hockey home games.
 ► Eight games will be telecast on NBCSN and an additional 13 games will be streamed live via the NBC Sports app and NBCSports.com.

► Defensemen Tory Dello and Andrew Peeke, forwards Cal Burke, Felix Holmberg, Mike O’Leary, Cam Morrison and Luke Novak, as well as goaltender Cale Morris comprise the eight-member freshman class.

FRESHMEN PAIR IN NHL DRAFT

► Cam Morrison (Second Round, 40th overall by the Colorado Avalanche) and Andrew Peeke (Second Round, 34th overall by Columbus) were each selected in the 2016 NHL Entry Draft.

► It marked the first NHL draft in which two Irish hockey players were selected within the first 40 picks.

► Peeke and Morrison also become the 78th and 79th Irish hockey players to be selected in the NHL Entry Draft.

► Additionally, at least one Notre Dame player has now been drafted in each draft dating back to 2004 (12 seasons).

NOTRE DAME IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

► Last season, the Fighting Irish made their eighth all-time appearance in the NCAA Championship field, including their sixth since 2008.

► Under Head Coach Jeff Jackson, the Irish made Frozen Four trips in 2008 and 2011.

2015-16 HOCKEY EAST HONORS

► Anders Bjork and Jordan Gross were named Second Team Hockey East All-Stars (March 17, 2016), becoming the fourth and fifth Notre Dame players to be named a first or second team Hockey East All-Star (Vince Hinostroza - First Team, 2015; Robbie Russo - First Team, 2015; and Stephen Johns - Second Team, 2014).

► Gross finished the regular season as Hockey East’s leading scorer among defensemen in all games (34 GP, 8-22-30) and in Hockey East games (22 GP, 6-16-22).

► Gross’ 22 points in Hockey East play were the most by defensemen since 2012-13, when current Chicago Blackhawks defenseman Trevor van Riemsdyk (UNH) also had 22 points.

► Defenseman Bobby Nardella was named to the All-Rookie team (March 16), becoming the

third Notre Dame player to earn Hockey East All-Rookie Team honors, joining Cal Petersen (2015) and Vince Hinostroza (2014).

► Cal Petersen were named Honorable Mention Hockey East All-Stars.

NOTRE DAME & HOCKEY EAST

► The 2016-17 season will mark Notre Dame’s final season in Hockey East before joining the Big Ten Conference as an affiliate member in men’s ice hockey.

► In Notre Dame’s previous three seasons in Hockey East, the Irish have finished the regular season tied for seventh (2014), fifth (2015) and third (2016).

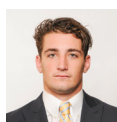

Head Coach JEFF JACKSON

► The 2015-16 hockey season marks University of Notre Dame hockey coach Jeff Jackson's 12th season behind the Irish bench. The highly regarded Jackson now has over 30 years of coaching experience.

► Notre Dame's Jeff Jackson era began in 2005 when the University searched for a man who could move the program among the elite hockey schools in the country.

► The veteran coach owned a resume packed with success at the collegiate, junior hockey, professional and international levels.

► During his 11-year run, Notre Dame has become one of the nation's top teams, winning the Central Collegiate Hockey Association's (CCHA) regular-season title twice (2006-07 and 2008-09) while earning three Mason Cup championships ('07, '09 and the final one in 2013).

► During Jackson's tenure, his teams have made seven trips to the NCAA Tournament (2006-09, 2010-11, 2012-14 and now 2016), advancing to the Frozen Four twice, playing in the 2008 title game and the 2011 national semifinals.

► Then in 2013-14, the team's first season in Hockey East, the Irish upset the conference's top team - Boston College - in the quarterfinals to advance to the TD Garden (Boston, Massachusetts) for the Hockey East semifinals

► Between 2006-09, the Irish turned in win totals of 32, 27 and 31 for three consecutive seasons of 25 or more wins and three consecutive NCAA tournament appearances, a first in program history.

► Jackson's success on the ice also has had a major impact off the ice for the Irish. With the wins came a commitment from the University that led to the new home of Irish hockey - The Compton Family Ice Arena - one of the finest college hockey facilities in the nation. The new venue opened for business on Oct. 21, 2011.

► Since Jackson's arrival, the Irish have had 32 players selected in the National Hockey League Entry Draft, including three first round selections. In that same span, 20 players from USA Hockey's National Team Developmental

Program have matriculated to Notre Dame.

► During his tenure, the Irish have had five players garner All-America honors -- Robbie Russo in 2015, Anders Lee in 2013, Ian Cole and Erik Condra in 2009 and David Brown in 2007.

► In addition, 14 of Jackson's players have gone on to play in the NHL (most recently Vince Hinostroza and Stephen Johns in 2015-16).

► In Jackson's first 11 seasons with Notre Dame, the Irish have played with poise and discipline, relying on team defense, strong goaltending and excellent special teams play. They also laid the foundation for future seasons with major success on the recruiting trail.

► In taking over the Irish coaching duties in 2005, Jackson became the first Notre Dame head coach to have won an NCAA Division I championship with another program before being hired as an Irish head coach.

► Success is nothing new for Jackson at the NCAA Division I level. In six years as the head coach at Lake Superior State (1990-96), Jackson's teams won two NCAA titles in 1992 and 1994 (also advancing to the finals in 1993), two CCHA regular-season championships (1991 and 1996) and four CCHA Mason Cup trophies (1991, 1992, 1993 and 1995).

► A 1978 graduate of Michigan State University with a degree in communications, Jackson followed with an education degree from Michigan State in 1979.

► In May 2003, Inside College Hockey, ranked Jackson 12th on its list of the 16 greatest college coaches of all-time with only five of the 16 still active in coaching.

► Jackson is a member of the USA Hockey Coaches Achievement Program, the American Hockey Coaches Association and the National Hockey League Coaches Association.
