#### THE GAME

- Boston College will play its final two regular season games on the road beginning at #19/13 Notre Dame Wednesday night.
- The game will be televised by the ACC Network/NESN and can be heard on the BC IMG Sports Radio Network.
- Notre Dame won the first meeting this season on Valentine's Day, 84-76, at Conte Forum.
- In that game, freshman Ky Bowman went for 29 points and nine rebounds.
- The Eagles have lost 14 of their last 15, including a 91-75 setback against Virginia Tech on Saturday.
- The Irish enter the game having won five straight, including a 64-60 triumph over Georgia Tech on Sunday.
- Notre Dame is 15-2 at home this season.

### THE SERIES

- Notre Dame is 18-10 in 28 all-time meetings between the two programs.
  The Irish have won eight in a row and 12 of the last 13 dating back to the 1998-99 season.
- Notre Dame won the first game between the two this season on February 14, 84-76.
- Boston College is 3-10 all time at Notre Dame, with the last win coming on January 11, 1997.
- The Irish have won all seven meetings since it joined the ACC for the 2013-14 season.
- The last Boston College win in the series was on February 4, 2004 a 76-69 victory in Conte Forum.
- The series dates back to February 7, 1963 when Notre Dame won the first-ever meeting, 74-66, in the old Roberts Center.

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson ranks third in the ACC in scoring (19.4).
- His 17 games of 20+ points lead the ACC and are the second-most among the Power 5 and Big East conferences.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** is one of just five freshmen in the nation with three 30-point games this season.
- He is averaging 21.7 points, 6.2 rebounds and 3.5 assists in six games against ranked opponents this year.
- Bowman ranks fourth among freshmen in the major conferences in scoring (17.8) during league games.
- Robinson and Bowman combine for 36.2 points per game in conference play which ranks fourth among backcourts in the major conferences.

# EAGLES LOSE HOME FINALE TO VIRGINIA TECH

- Sophomore **Jerome Robinson** led Boston College with a game-high 25 points as Boston College lost to Virginia Tech, 91-75, on Saturday at Conte Forum.
- Robinson was 8-for-17 from the field, including 4-of-8 from downtown. He also had five assists.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** ended the day with 16 points and four rebounds.
- Sophomore Jordan Chatman chipped in with 13 points after scoring 30 earlier in the season against the Hokies
- Virginia Tech started the game with a 14-2 run which forced a Boston College timeout.
- Following the timeout, the Eagles responded with 11 unanswered points to make it a one-point game. Chatman had eight of the points.
- Neither team led by more than five the rest of the half and BC led at the break, 40-38.
- With the game tied, 50-50, Virginia Tech scored ninestraight which ignited a 21-6 run to give the Hokies a 71-56 lead. The run lasted five minutes.
- Virginia Tech led the rest of the way as the Hokies scored 53 second-half points.

#### LAST TIME VS. NOTRE DAME

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** recorded 29 points and nine rebounds as Boston College lost to #25/20 Notre Dame on February 14, 84-76, at Conte Forum.
- Bowman was one point shy of his fourth 30-point game and one rebound short of his second doubledouble.
- Graduate student **Mo Jeffers** posted 12 points and seven rebounds.
- Sophomore **Jerome Robinson** recorded 11 points, six assists and five rebounds.
- Boston College opened the game with a 17-9 run in the first 4:18. Bowman had nine of those points and hit three 3-pointers.
- The Eagles led the rest of the half and used a 9-2 spurt to build their biggest lead, 44-31, with 1:54 to go.
- · BC had a 49-39 halftime lead.
- The Eagles had a 58-48 lead before Notre Dame went on a 21-3 run to take an eight-point lead. It was the Irish's first lead of the night.
- Boston College responded with five-straight points to cut it to 69-66.
- Bowman hit a pair of free throws with 56 seconds left to make it a two-point game, but that is as close as the Eagles got.

#### A DOMINANT DUO

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson and freshman Ky Bowman have emerged as one of the top scoring backcourts in the country in conference play.
- The pair combine for 36.2 points per game (Robinson 18.4; Bowman 17.8) which ranks fourth among the major conferences and is the best in the ACC.
- Bowman ranks fourth among freshmen in the major conferences in scoring during league games.
- They also average 8.9 rebounds and 6.8 assists together in conference action.

#### **BOWMAN'S LAST 18 GAMES**

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** is averaging 18.6 points, 6.3 rebounds and 3.6 assists in the last 18 games.
- He is also shooting .515 (121-for-235) from the field and .462 (48-for-104) from beyond the arc.
- Bowman had 33 points, eight rebounds and five assists against Fairfield on December 21.
- Those 33 points are the 19th-most scored by a freshman in the country this season and the third-most in the ACC.
- He was 13-for-21 from the field in that game and those 13 field goals are the second-most by a freshman in the nation behind Malik Monk's (Kentucky) 18 vs. North Carolina.
- In BC's win over Providence, Bowman scored all 16 of his points in the second half and was a perfect 7-for-7 from the floor after halftime.
- Bowman then went for 30 points and nine assists against Syracuse on January 1. He was 7-for-8 from long range in the win.
- He scored 19 points in games at #8/8 Duke and against NC State.
- Bowman scored 33 points again, this time vs. #9/9 North Carolina, on January 21.
- He was 13-for-19 from the field and 7-for-9 from 3-point land.
- The Havelock, N.C., product is just one of five freshmen in the country this season with multiple 30-point games.
- Malik Monk (Kentucky), Markelle Fultz (Washington), Dennis Smith, Jr. (NC State) and Preston Parks (The Citadel) are the only other players in the country to do that.
- Bowman recorded his first double-double with 17 points and 10 rebounds at Virginia Tech.
- He then had 18 points in games against Wake Forest and #6/7 Louisville.

#### **BOWMAN'S LAST THREE**

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** has had huge numbers in the last three games, including against a pair of nationally ranked opponents.
- He posted 29 points and nine rebounds against #25/20 Notre Dame on February 14.
- He was one point shy of his fourth 30-point game.
- The Havelock, N.C., product then recorded his second double-double of the year at #19/20 Florida State, going for 24 points and 11 boards.
- He then had 16 points vs. Virginia Tech on Saturday.
- He averaged 23.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists in those three games.
- He shot .500 (24-for-48) from the field and .923 (12-for-13) from the charity stripe in those contests.

#### ROBINSON ALL OVER THE FLOOR

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson has posted numbers all along the stat sheet.
- He has averaged 19.4 points, 3.9 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.7 steals this season.
- He currently ranks third in the ACC in scoring and steals.
- In ACC contests, he ranks seventh in the league in scoring (18.4) and fifth in steals (1.4).
- The Raleigh, N.C., product has set a new career high for scoring four different times this season.
- His new career best is 32 points that he scored against Sacred Heart on December 18.
- His 17 games with 20 or more points this year is the best in the ACC.
- He recorded his first career double-double against Auburn with 23 points and 11 rebounds.
- He was the first BC guard to record a double-double in points and rebounds since Olivier Hanlan had 17 and 12 vs. Providence on December 22, 2012.

#### ROBINSON IS CONSISTENT

- Sophomore **Jerome Robinson** has scored 20 or more points 17 times this season including a stretch of eight straight that ended at Syracuse.
- His 17 games reaching 20 points are the secondmost among players in the Power 5 and Big East conferences.
- Markelle Fultz (Washington) has 18 such games.
   Frank Mason III (Kansas) also has 17 while Malik Monk (Kentucky) has 15.
- Robinson's eight-straight games with 20 or more points is also the best among those conferences.

# THE BACKCOURT VS. THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson (Raleigh) and freshman Ky Bowman (Havelock) both hail from the Old North State.
- Boston College has played five games against teams from the state of North Carolina, and both Robinson and Bowman have shined.
- Bowman is averaging 20.6 points in the five games while Robinson is averaging 20.4.
- Bowman is also averaging 5.2 rebounds, 3.6 assists and 1.8 steals in those games.
- He is shooting .529 (36-for-68) from the field, .500 (15-for-30) from long range and .800 (16-for-20) from the foul line.
- Bowman matched a season high with 33 points against #9/9 North Carolina on January 21. He was 13-for-19 from the field and hit seven 3-pointers.
- He also scored 19 points in games at Wake Forest and #8/8 Duke.
- He posted 18 points, seven rebounds and five assists against the Demon Deacons on Tuesday night.
- Robinson is averaging 3.4 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.2 steals against North Carolina teams.
- He is shooting .833 (20-for-24) from the charity stripe.
- He has scored 20 or more points in three of the five games and had 26 vs. NC State in a win. He was 10-for-18 from the floor in that game.

#### CHATMAN GOES OFF

- Sophomore Jordan Chatman's nine 3-pointers at Virginia Tech on January 29 tied the Boston College record that Dana Barros set at Pittsburgh back on January 7, 1989.
- His nine 3-pointers are the third-most in ACC history and the most ever allowed by Virginia Tech.
- Chatman's .818 percentage from deep was the best in ACC history for a player that hit at least nine 3-pointers (17 occurrences).
- Syracuse's John Gillon went 9-for-10 from distance three days later at NC State.
- It is the 15th-most 3-pointers in the nation this season and tied for the most among major conference players.
- Chatman hit his first nine 3-point attempts in the game and his first 10 shots overall.

#### CHATMAN'S FOUR-GAME RUN

- Sophomore **Jordan Chatman** averaged 17.3 points in four games from Janaury 31 to February 11.
- He was 21-for-33 (.636) from the field, 16-for-25 (.640) from long range and a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line.
- His 52 combined points against Virginia Tech and Wake Forest are the fourth-most in consecutive games this season for BC.
- Prior to the Virginia Tech game, Chatman was averaging 7.0 points per game.

#### TURNER STAYS SOLID

- Sophomore A.J. Turner has put up some solid numbers this season.
- He is third on the team in scoring (8.4) and leads BC in assists (92).
- Those assists come with just 30 turnovers and his 3.07 assist/turnover ratio is the best in the ACC (13th nationally).
- In 16 ACC games, he has 39 assists with 12 turnovers.
- The Mt. Clemens, Mich., product has scored in double

figures in 11 of the last 22 games.

- Turner had a career-high 16 points against Syracuse on January 1. He also had six assists and no turnovers.
- He had 15 points at Miami on January 25. Twelve of them came after halftime when he was 5-for-8 from the field.

#### POP BREAKS OUT

- Freshman **Nik Popovic** played 13 minutes against Stony Brook and made them all count.
- He was 6-for-7 from the field for 13 points and recorded five rebounds. His six field goals and 13 points are season highs.
- He also contributed on the defensive end with his first two blocks of the season.
- Popovic missed three games after taking a hard elbow to the head against Kansas State. He played eight minutes vs. Hartford in his return.
- He made a huge impact in his second game back vs. Auburn with eight points and five rebounds. He also notched the game-winning basket with 0.2 seconds on the clock.
- The Bosnian product had 11 points, six rebounds and a pair of assists in the win against Syracuse.
- He played a season-high 25 minutes against the Orange.
- In the rematch with Syracuse at the Carrier Dome, he matched a season high with 13 points while grabbing a season-best seven rebounds.
- Popovic grabbed a new season-high eight rebounds against #16/16 Virginia.

#### **BOWMAN SHINES VS. AUBURN**

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** recorded 15 points, two rebounds, two assists and two steals in the 72-71 win against Auburn at Madison Square Garden.
- He was 5-for-10 from the field and 3-for-5 from beyond the arc.
- Bowman went on an 8-0 personal run with a steal and breakaway dunk, and consecutive 3-pointers to give Boston College a 24-14 lead.
- He was also the catalyst for **Nik Popovic's** gamewinner, as he drove to the bucket in the final moments. His missed layup bounced to Popovic for the tip-in.

# BOWMAN NAMED FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK FOR SECOND TIME

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** was named the ACC Co-Freshman of the Week on January 3, earning the award for the second consecutive week.
- Bowman shared the honor with Georgia Tech's Josh Okogie.
- Both players are the only two in the conference to earn multiple Freshman of the Week accolades.
- Bowman posted 30 points, nine assists and five rebounds in Boston College's lone game, a 96-81 victory over Syracuse on January 1.
- Bowman was 11-for-17 from the field and 7-for-8 from long range.
- His .875 3-point percentage against the Orange is the best in a game in the ACC this season (minimum five made) and his seven 3-pointers rank second in a single game in Conte Forum history.
- Eighteen of his 30 points came in the second half where he went 6-for-7 from the field and hit all five of his 3-point attempts.

## BOWMAN NAMED ACC FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Freshman of the Week on December 26.
- Bowman averaged 24.5 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.5 steals in the Eagles' two games that week. He was 20-for-29 (.690) from the floor in the two contests.
- Bowman erupted for season highs in points (33), rebounds (8), assists (5) and steals (3) against Fairfield at Mohegan Sun Arena. He was 13-for-21 from the field and 6-for-7 from the foul line.
- Bowman then scored 16 points all in the second half
   in BC's 79-67 win over Providence. He was a perfect
  7-for-7 from the field after halftime. He matched his
  season high with eight rebounds as well.

## ROBINSON NAMED ACC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson was named the Atlantic Coast Conference Co-Player of the Week on December 19.
- Robinson shared the honor with North Carolina's Justin Jackson.
- Robinson averaged 27.5 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.0 steals, 1.5 assists and 1.0 block in a pair of Boston College victories. He shot 19-for-28 (.500) from the field in the two games. Robinson recorded his first career double-double with 23 points and a career-high 11 rebounds in a win against Auburn at Madison Square Garden. He also had three steals in that game. He was 8-for-18 from the floor and 6-for-9 from the foul line.
- The Raleigh, N.C., product then poured in a careerhigh 32 points and added a career-high five steals in a win against Sacred Heart. He was 11-for-20 from the field and 9-for-11 from the charity stripe against the Pioneers.
- Robinson's 32 points are the sixth-most in a game in the ACC this season while his five steals are the second most.

## BACKCOURT LEADS EAGLES TO WIN OVER NC STATE

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson recorded 26 points and five assists as Boston College beat NC State on January 11, 74-66, at Conte Forum.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** added 19 points and seven rebounds.
- Graduate student **Connor Tava** matched a season high with 13 points and added six boards.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner posted 10 points, scoring in double figures for the fifth-straight game.
- BC went 18-for-19 from the foul line after entering the game shooting at a 65 percent clip.
- Bowman converted two quick 3-pointers to spark a game-opening 8-2 run in the first 1:36.
- NC State scored seven unanswered points take a 12-10 lead with 12:25 remaining in the first half.
- The Wolfpack held a 29-24 lead with 4:40 to play in the half, but BC closed it out by scoring six of the last seven points to take a 34-32 lead into the break.
- BC generated a 7-1 run, capped by a Robinson jumper that gave the Eagles a 57-53 lead with 9:02 left in the game. Robinson scored five points in the stretch.
- The Eagles stretched their lead to 63-56 at the 6:21 mark with six-straight points.
- The Wolfpack cut BC's lead to 70-66 in the final minute, but Tava's and Turner's late free throws clinched the victory.

# BC TAKES DOWN SYRACUSE BEHIND BOWMAN. ROBINSON

- Freshman **Ky Bowman**, the reigning ACC Freshman of the Week, recorded 30 points, a season-high nine assists and five rebounds as Boston College beat Syracuse on January 1, 96-81.
- He was 7-for-8 from the 3-point line.
- Sophomore **Jerome Robinson** posted 22 points and was 9-for-12 from the field.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner scored a career-high 16 points while adding six assists with no turnovers.
- Graduate student **Connar Tava** had nine points, 10 rebounds and a season-high seven assists.
- Freshman **Nik Popovic** chipped in with 11 points and six rebounds off the bench.
- Boston College shot 16-for-26 (.615) from 3-point territory and went 10-for-14 (.714) in the second half. Those 16 3-pointers are a Conte Forum record.
- The Eagles finished the game with a 28 assists on 36 baskets.
- Bowman led BC's offense early, scoring 10 points as the Eagles took a 22-14 lead with 11:11 left in the first half.
- Popovic scored two baskets on a 7-2 BC stretch that gave the Eagles a 39-26 lead with 3:24 left in the opening half.
- BC entered halftime with a 44-33 lead.
- Bowman's hot shooting continued in the second half. He made two 3-pointers on an 8-0 BC run that gave the Eagles a 59-41 lead with 15:56 left in the game.
- The lead reached as many as 22 points in the second half.

#### NOTING THE SYRACUSE WIN

- Boston College broke the Conte Forum record with 16 3-pointers against Syracuse.
- The Eagles' 28 assists are the second-most ever in the history of the building which opened for play in 1988.
- BC's 96 points were the most allowed by Syracuse since 2009.
- It was also the most points an Eagle team has scored since December 23, 2008 against Maine (99).
- Boston College's win over Syracuse was its first ACC victory since March 7, 2015 against Georgia Tech.
- The Eagles had lost 20-straight games (including ACC Tournament) against ACC opponents prior to the win.

# FIVE EAGLES REACH DOUBLE FIGURES IN WIN OVER PROVIDENCE

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson led five players in double figures with 21 points and added a career-high eight assists as Boston College defeated Providence on December 23, 79-67.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** scored all 16 points of his points in the second half and matched a season high with eight rebounds. He was 7-for-8 from the field and a perfect 7-for-7 after halftime.
- Graduate student **Mo Jeffers** had a season-high 13 points to go along with eight rebounds and three blocks.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner finished with 12 points and six assists.
- Sophomore **Jordan Chatman** chipped in with 11 points off the bench, hitting three 3-pointers.
- Boston College shot 20-for-28 (.714) in the second half and was 8-for-12 (.667) from 3-point range.
- Boston College had a 22-16 lead, but Providence scored 10 unanswered points to take a 26-22

- advantage with 2:20 left in the first half.
- The run lasted 3:09 and the Friars took a 29-25 lead into the locker room.
- Providence led 48-45, but BC got hot and went on a 25-2 run over a span of 6:28 to build a 70-50 lead. The Eagles hit eight-straight shots in the run, including five 3-pointers.
- Jeffers had nine points in that spree while Robinson had seven.
- Providence applied some pressure and responded with 14 unanswered points of its own in the next 1:25 to cut its deficit to six points, but the Eagles scored the next seven to seal the win.

## ROBINSON SCORES 32 IN WIN OVER SACRED HEART

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson recorded career highs with 32 points and five steals as Boston College beat Sacred Heart, 82-75, on December 18.
- He was 11-for-20 from the field and 9-for-11 from the foul line.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** tallied 12 points, five rebounds and three assists.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner had 10 points, four rebounds and three assists.
- Boston College forced nine turnovers in the first seven minutes and jumped out to a 21-12 lead thanks to an 11-4 run.
- Sacred Heart scored seven unanswered points over 1:22 to pull within 29-26, but BC responded with 10-straight of its own to build the lead back to 39-26 with two minutes left in the half. Robinson had seven of the points.
- The Eagles took a 41-30 lead into the break.
- Sacred Heart started the second half with a 16-2 run over the first eight minutes to take a 46-43 lead. Those 16 points went unanswered as BC scored the half's first bucket.
- Boston College scored seven-straight points to regain a 54-48 lead with 8:27 to play.
- With BC on top, 65-59, at the 3:49 mark, sophomore **Jordan Chatman** converted consecutive 3-pointers to put the game out of reach.

# POPOVIC GETS GAME-WINNER VS. AUBURN WITH 0.2 SECONDS LEFT

- Freshman **Ky Bowman** drove the lane and missed a layup, but classmate **Nik Popovic** got the rebound and tipped it in with 0.2 left to give Boston College a 72-71 win against Auburn at Madison Square Garden.
- Sophomore Jerome Robinson recorded his firstcareer double-double with 23 points and 11 rebounds. He also had three steals.
- Bowman scored 15 points, including eight in a personal 8-0 run in the first half to put BC up, 24-14.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner had 13 points and four assists
- Popovic had eight points and five rebounds off the bench, including the game-winning shot with 0.2 on the clock
- Boston College went on a 9-2 run midway through the first half to take a 24-14 lead. Bowman scored eight-straight points with a steal and breakaway dunk, and consecutive 3-pointers.
- Auburn responded with an identical 9-2 run to make it a 26-23 lead. BC took a 43-39 lead into halftime.
- The Eagles' lead reached 50-42 before the first media timeout of the second half, but Auburn chipped away at the lead and it was 54-51 BC at the 12:40 mark.

- Auburn took its first lead of the game, 61-60, with 6:46 to go and then had a 69-65 with two minutes left.
- Bowman and Popovic hit consecutive buckets to tie it.
- Turner hit one of two free throws with 19 seconds left and then Auburn's Danjel Purifoy connected on a pair to give the Tigers a 71-70 lead, setting up Popovic's game-ending heroics.

#### THE LAST LAST-SECOND WIN

- Freshman **Nik Popovic's** game-winning basket with 0.2 seconds left was the first Boston College game-winner with less than a second left since Rakim Sanders on January 31, 2009 against Virginia Tech.
- In similar fashion, Sanders also corralled an offensive rebound off of a Tyrese Rice miss.
- Sanders grabbed the offensive board in the lane and before hitting the ground, shot the ball and notched the winning bucket with 0.4 on the clock.

#### **GETTING TO THE LINE**

- Boston College attempted 30 or more free throws in consecutive games against Stony Brook and Towson.
- It marked the first time BC has done that since January, 2013.
- The Eagles' went 23-for-36 against Stony Brook which were the most attempts in the **Jim Christian** era.
- BC then went 27-for-30 against Towson, including a perfect 20-for-20 in the second half.
- The 36 free throw attempts vs. the Seawolves were the most by an Eagle team since they had 42 on March 1, 2014 against Wake Forest.
- The Eagles went to the line a season-high 41 times against Sacred Heart on December 18.

## ROBINSON NETS 27 AGAIN IN WIN OVER DARTMOUTH

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson scored a game-high 27 points in the second game in a row to lead Boston College to an 88-70 victory over Dartmouth.
- He was 10-for-16 from the field and 4-for-7 from long range.
- · Robinson also had four assists and three steals.
- Freshman **Ty Graves** scored 13 points off the bench, going 5-for-7 from the floor and connecting on all three 3-point attempts. He also had four assists.
- Sophomore **Jordan Chatman** chipped in with 12 points. Ten of his points came in the second half.
- Boston College started the game with an 11-4 run, but Dartmouth closed the gap by scoring six-straight a little later to make it 17-16 at the 12:01 mark.
- From there, the Eagles went on a 15-3 run over the next 6:19 to build a 32-19 lead with 5:42 left in the half.
- BC took a 41-33 lead into the locker room.
- The Eagles led, 65-56, with 11:44 left in the game and then scored 13 unanswered points over the next four minutes to extend the lead to 22 points.

#### NOTING THE DARTMOUTH WIN

- Boston College recorded 23 assists on 34 baskets against the Big Green.
- It was the most assists by a BC team since it had 23 against Wake Forest back on March 6, 2011.
- The Eagles shot .557 from the field including a .600 clip (18-for-30) in the second half.
- It was the best performance shooting since the Eagles shot .568 from the floor against NC State on February 28, 2015.
- BC's 88 points were the second most under head coach Jim Christian. It scored 91 against Maine last season.

### ROBINSON SCORES 24 IN WIN OVER TOWSON

- Sophomore **Jerome Robinson** led all scorers with a new career high of 24 points as Boston College beat Towson, 80-70, at Conte Forum on November 22.
- Graduate student **Connar Tava** recorded 13 points and eight rebounds.
- Freshman **Ky Bowman** scored a season-high 14 points and was 9-for-11 from the foul line.
- · Sophomore Jordan Chatman added 10 points.
- Boston College shot 90 percent (27-for-30) from the foul line and was a perfect 20-for-20 in the second half.
- Boston College started the game with a 10-2 run in the first 4:23.
- Robinson hit a 3-pointer to increase the Eagles' lead to 33-20 with 7:33 left in the half.
- Towson cut it to four points late in the half, but BC scored the final four points to take a 45-37 lead into the break.
- Towson started the second half with a 16-5 run to take a 53-50 lead with 13:24 on the clock. It was the Tigers first lead of the game.
- BC responded by scoring the next six points to regain a 56-53 advantage. Robinson had all six points and took a charge on the defensive end.
- The Eagles were ahead, 66-65, and then scored eight unanswered points over the next 2:17 to build a 74-65 lead with 59 seconds left.
- BC converted on all of its foul shots down the stretch to seal the win.

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson recorded career highs with 22 points and eight rebounds while adding five assists as Boston College beat Stony Brook, 82-75.
- Freshman **Nik Popovic** scored 13 points off the bench and grabbed five boards in 13 minutes. He was 6-for-7 from the field.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner (12) and graduate student Mo Jeffers (10) also scored in double figures. Jeffers added eight rebounds.
- BC shot 65.4 percent (17-26) from the field in the first half and 54 percent (27-50) for the game.
- Boston College scored eight unanswered points over a 1:57 span to build an 18-9 lead midway through the first half. Popovic had six of those eight points.
- That sparked a longer 34-12 run that gave the Eagles a 44-21 lead with 2:21 left in the half. Robinson scored seven-straight BC points during that span.
- BC took a 46-30 lead into halftime.
- Stony Brook started the second half with an 18-9 run to cut the BC lead down to 55-48 with 12:49 remaining, but BC scored eight of the next 10 to push it back to 63-50.
- The Eagles led by as many as 18 points with 7:26 left, but Stony Brook made it a 74-70 game with 54 seconds to go.
- BC connected on all eight of its foul shots down the stretch to seal the win.

# EAGLES REBOUND WITH WIN AGAINST MARYLAND EASTERN SHORE

- Sophomore Jerome Robinson led all scorers with 16 points while adding seven rebounds, four assists and three steals as Boston College beat Maryland Eastern Shore, 73-57.
- Graduate student **Mo Jeffers** grabbed a career-high 13 rebounds, including four on the offensive glass.

- Classmate **Connar Tava** had 10 rebounds and half of those were on the offensive end.
- Sophomore A.J. Turner scored 13 points while freshman Ky Bowman chipped in with 11 off the bench.
- Boston College outrebounded the Hawks, 49-33, in the game.
- The Eagles had 22 assists on 30 baskets and all 11 players that saw the floor had a field goal.
- Boston College led in the early going, 15-9, and then scored seven unanswered points in a minute to take a 22-9 lead 7:15 into the game.
- Maryland Eastern Shore scored the next six points to cut it to a seven-point lead.
- The Hawks cut the lead to five with 3:50 left in the half, but BC pushed the lead to 41-31 at the break.
- MDES cut the BC lead down to 49-42, but the Eagles rattled off nine unanswered points to build it back up to 58-42 with 8:08 remaining.
- Boston College led by double digits the rest of the way.

#### BC GUARDS CAN SCORE

- Boston College is the only team in the ACC to have a guard rank in the top 10 in scoring in each of the last four seasons. Olivier Hanlan finished in the top five in each of his three seasons at The Heights.
- Hanlan finished fifth in scoring as a freshman in 2012-13 (15.4), third in 2013-14 (18.5) and then led the ACC in 2014-15 (19.5) as a junior.
- That trend continued last year as graduate student Eli Carter finished 10th in the league in scoring at 16.0.
- Right now, sophomore **Jerome Robinson** ranks third in the ACC in scoring (19.4).

#### A HISTORY OF GREAT GUARDS

- Boston College has become a place where guards flourish
- Since 1980, BC has had eight point guards drafted into the NBA which ranks fifth in the country, tied with Kansas and Kentucky.
- The chart on the side shows you how Boston College stacks up nationally in that category.
- Four of those eight drafted from BC have been firstrounders which ranks eighth nationally.
- The eight Eagles drafted include: John Bagley (12th overall, 1982), Michael Adams (third round, 1985), Dominic Pressley (fifth round, 1986), Dana Barros (16th overall, 1989), Howard Eisley (second round, 1994), Troy Bell (16th overall, 2003), Reggie Jackson (24th overall, 2011) and Olivier Hanlan (second round, 2015).

## **EAGLES IN THE NBA**

- There are currently two former Eagles playing professionally in the NBA.
- Jared Dudley was the 22nd overall pick of the 2007 draft, taken by the Charlotte Bobcats. He played for the Phoenix Suns from 2008-13 before he was traded to the LA Clippers for the 2013-14 season. He played for Milwaukee and Washington before returning to Phoenix this season.
- Reggie Jackson was drafted 24th overall by the Oklahoma City Thunder in 2011 and was traded to the Detroit Pistons on February 19, 2015.
- He led the Pistons to the NBA playoffs last season, averaging 18.8 points and 6.2 assists.
- Other former Eagles playing professionally around the world include Troy Bell (Argentina), Eli Carter (Greece), Dennis Clifford (D-League), Olivier Hanlan (France), Patrick Heckmann (Germany), Sean Marshall (Turkey), Tyrese Rice (Spain), Danny Rubin (Israel) and Joe Trapani (Spain).

#### EAGLES ON THE SIDELINES

- There are also nine farmer Eagles now on the sidelines serving on coaching staffs.
- Tim O'Shea is the head coach of Bryant, while Bill Curley is the head coach at nearby Emerson College.
- Biko Paris and Louis Hinnant are both assistant coaches at UMass Lowell under head coach Pat Duquette, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles.
- Dwayne Pina is an assistant coach at Brown while Mike Cotton is the associate head coach at Kennesaw State under former BC head coack Al Skinner.
- Duane Woodward serves as an assistant coach at Monmouth while Howard Eisley is an assistant coach for the New York Knicks
- Eagle great Dana Barros was hired as the head coach at nearby Newbury College on April 18, 2016.

#### TROY BELL NAMED ACC LEGEND

- Former star guard **Troy Bell** will be honored as Boston College's representative in the 2017 class of Atlantic Coast Conference Basketball Legends presented by New York Life.
- The Legends will be recognized during the 2017 New York Life ACC Tournament, which will be held March 7-11 at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, N.Y.
- Bell is Boston College's career scoring leader with 2,632 points. As a senior in 2002-03, he earned Big East Player of the Year honors and was the USBWA District I Player of the Year after averaging a conference-best 25.2 points per game. The 781 points he scored that season is still the Boston College record. Bell earned Associated Press All-America accolades that season, averaging 27.8 points per game in Big East play, which set the conference's single-season record.
- Bell still holds Boston College career records in 3-pointers (300), free throws (810) and free throw percentage (.868). He is also second in steals (272). He was the leading scorer for the Eagles in all four of his seasons, averaging 18.8 as a freshman, 20.4 as a sophomore, 21.6 as a junior and 25.2 as a senior. He also led the team in steals every year at The Heights.
- Bell led Boston College to the 2001 Big East Tournament title and was named the tournament MVP. He was a two-time All-American, three-time All-Big East First Team honoree and the Big East Rookie of the Year.
- Bell was selected with the 16th overall pick of the 2003 NBA Draft by the Boston Celtics. He has spent 12 seasons playing internationally in Spain, Germany, Italy, France and Argentina.

# BC RETIRED JERSEYS OF DANA BARROS. JOHN BAGLEY

- Boston College retired the jerseys of former standout guards **Dana Barros** (1985-89) and **John Bagley** (1979-82) at halftime of the Virginia Tech game on Saturday, Feb. 25.
- Barros was the first Boston College player to reach the 2,000-career point mark in the 1988-89 season and still ranks third on the all-time list with 2,342 career points. He was a three-time All-Big East performer, twice named to the second team and earning first team honors as a junior in 1988. He was also a three-time all-district first team player selected by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). Barros was named the 1986 Big East Rookie of the Year after averaging 13.7 points per game in his freshman season.
- Barros scored 30 or more points 18 times which is tied for the most in program history. He ranks second all-time at Boston College in field goals made (824) and 3-pointers (291), third in free throw percentage (.841), fourth in scoring average (19.7), seventh in steals (181), and 10th in assists (438). He holds the top two marks in 3-pointers made in a single season, sinking 109 in 1987-88 and 112 as a senior in 1988-89. Barros also has two of the top three most prolific scoring seasons in the record books with 692 as a senior and 723 as a junior.
- Barros was selected with the 16th overall pick by the Seattle Supersonics in the 1989 NBA Draft. He played 13 seasons in the NBA with Seattle, Philadelphia, Boston and Detroit. In his career, he averaged 10.5 points and 3.3 assists per game. His best season was the 1994-95 campaign with the 76ers, when he started all 82 games and averaged 20.6 points, 7.3 assists and 3.3 rebounds.
- Bagley was a two-time All-Big East player and was the first Eagle to earn Big East Player of the Year honors in 1981. He was a two-time NABC All-District first team player and was an All-America third team selection as a junior. He averaged 20.4 points per game as a sophomore in 1981 and led the Eagles to the NCAA Tournament Sweet 16. He then averaged 21.1 points as a junior and guided BC to the Elite Eight.
- Bagley, who averaged 20.7 points in his sophomore and junior seasons (17.9 career), ranks 14th on the all-time Boston College scoring chart with 1,629 points. He also ranks eighth at The Heights in scoring average. The 257 field goals he made as a junior are the second-most in a single season in BC history and he holds the Eagles' record for most points in an NCAA Tournament game when he poured in 35 in a win over Wake Forest on March 15, 1981. He ranks second in program history with 137 points in the NCAA Tournament.
- Bagley declared for the NBA Draft after his junior season and was taken 12th overall by the Cleveland Cavaliers in 1982. He played 11 seasons in the NBA for Cleveland, New Jersey, Boston and Atlanta. He averaged 8.7 points and 6.0 assists in his professional career and his best seasons were from 1985-88. He came close to averaging a double-double in 1985-86 with the Cavaliers with 11.7 points and 9.4 assists. He averaged double figures in points the following two seasons as well, including a career-high 12.0 in 1987-88 in his first season with the Nets.
- Barros and Bagley will be the fifth and sixth men's basketball players in Boston College history to have their jerseys retired. They will join John Silk (1949-53), Gerry Ward (1960-63), Terry Driscoll (1966-69) and Michael Adams (1981-85) in the Conte Forum rafters.







Jim Christian, who was hired as the 12th head basketball coach at Boston College on April 3, 2014, enters his third season on The Heights.

Christian was a two-time Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year and led teams to eight postseason appearances in his 12 seasons as a head coach at Ohio, TCU and Kent State. He has coached four All-Americans, three MAC Players of the Year and 31 all-conference honorees.

In his first season at Boston College, Christian guided guard Olivier Hanlan to First Team All-ACC and honorable mention All-America honors. Hanlan was the leading scorer in the ACC (19.5) which ranked 22nd in the country. He also led all major conference players in scoring average during league play (21.9). In addition, Hanlan led the ACC in 3-point percentage (.436) and ranked third in 3-pointers made (2.83), fifth in free throw percentage (.810), sixth in field goal percentage (.483) and 10th in assists (4.00) during conference action.

Hanlan was drafted by the Utah Jazz in the second round (42nd overall) of the 2015 NBA Draft.

Prior to moving to Chestnut Hill, Christian spent the previous two seasons as head coach at Ohio, leading the Bobcats to a 49-22 record in that time. In his first season at the helm, Ohio went 24-10 and earned a bid to the NIT. The Bobcats won their first regular season MAC title since 1994 and they tied a program record with 14 league wins and seven road victories. He was named the NABC District 14 Coach of the Year.

Ohio led the nation in assists per game (17.5) in 2012-13 and ranked seventh in the country in turnover margin (+4.7). Under his guidance, guard D.J. Cooper ranked seventh in the nation in assists and was the first MAC Player of the Year from Ohio since 1995.

In 2013-14, the Bobcats went 25-12 and advanced to the quarterfinals of the College Insider Tournament. It was just the third time in school history that an Ohio team reached 25 wins.

Christian, who also spent six seasons at Kent State from 2002-08, is the all-time leader in winning percentage (.700) in Mid-American Conference history and reached 20 wins in all eight of his seasons in the conference.

Prior to his time at Ohio, Christian was the head coach at TCU from 2008-12. While in Fort Worth, he had a record of 56-73 (.434) and led the Horned Frogs to their first postseason appearance since 2005 when they played in the 2012 College Basketball Invitational. He coached six All-Mountain West players while in Fort Worth.

One of those players was guard Hank Thorns, Jr., who earned first team honors after ranking in the top 12 in the country in both assists and assist/turnover ratio, the only player in the nation to accomplish that feat in 2010-11.

Christian began his head coaching career at Kent State where he compiled a record of 138-58 (.704). He led the Golden Flashes to five postseason appearances in his six seasons at the helm. He earned MAC Coach of the Year accolades in 2006 and 2008, both times leading Kent State to the conference title and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament. The Golden Flashes earned NIT berths in each of his first three seasons.

Kent State won 20 games every year that Christian was the head coach and he guided it to its first-ever top 25 ranking in both the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls.

The 2007-08 season was one of the best in Kent State history. The Golden Flashes finished 28-7 with a school-record 25 regular-season wins and won the Mid-American Conference regular-season and tournament championships. Christian guided Kent State to a No. 9 seed in the NCAA Tournament which was the best seed in program history.

While in Kent, Christian mentored two honorable-mention All-Americans (Antonio Gates, DeAndre Haynes), two MAC Players of the Year (DeAndre Haynes, Al Fisher), three MAC Defensive Players of the Year (Demetric Shaw, John Edwards, Haminn Quaintance), one MAC Sixth Man of the Year (Kevin Warzynski) and a total of 19 All-MAC selections, including six first teamers.

Christian served as an assistant coach for the Golden Flashes in 2001-02 when they advanced to the Elite Eight. Prior to his time in Kent, Christian was a college basketball talent evaluator at Octagon Sports Marketing and Management.

Christian served as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh from 1996-99 under Ralph Willard. He guided the development of Vonteego Cummings, a two-time All-Big East player who went on to play for the Philadelphia 76ers and Golden State Warriors.

Christian served as an assistant coach under former Miami (Ohio) and current Arizona State head coach Herb Sendek during the 1995-96 campaign. The RedHawks recorded a 21-8 overall record, including a 12-6 mark in conference action, and earned a berth in the NIT.

Christian worked at Western Kentucky for the 1994-95 season as the Hilltoppers went 27-4, including a 17-1 record in the Sun Belt Conference. That season, Western Kentucky recorded the fourth-most wins in program history and earned a berth in the NCAA Tournament after winning the conference tournament.

Christian's first full-time assistant coaching position came at St. Francis (Pa.). In his two seasons with the Red Flashes, Christian guided the development of two-time All-Northeast Conference performer Deon George and Jason Roberts.

A native of Bethpage, N.Y., Christian was an all-state guard at St. Dominic High School while playing under Ralph Willard. Christian was recruited by current Louisville head coach Rick Pitino to Boston University where he played two seasons before transferring to Rhode Island.

Christian played his final two campaigns under Tom Penders at the University of Rhode Island where he helped the Rams reach the Sweet Sixteen in the 1988 NCAA Tournament.

The standout guard led the Rams to victories over Missouri and Syracuse before losing a 73-72 game to Duke for the right to advance to the Elite Eight. After graduation, Christian spent one season playing professionally in Australia for the Sydney City Comets.

Christian earned his bachelor's degree in consumer affairs from the University of Rhode Island in 1988. He and his wife, Patty, have three children, MacKenzie, Zach and Jay.


