Notre Dame Returns To The Road With Weekend Series At Ferris State

- Irish move into top spot in the national rankings for third time in program history.
- Ian Cole and Teddy Ruth selected to 2009 U.S. Junior National Team

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Notre Dame takes to the road this weekend for a pair of games at Ferris State on Dec. 5-6. Game times at Ewigleben Arena are set for 7:05 p.m. both nights. The Irish will put their five-game road winning streak on the line in Friday's contest as they have not lost away from the Joyce Center since the season opener against Denver. The series is the first of three consecutive

road games for the Irish. Notre Dame also is in the midst of a 10-game unbeaten run (8-0-2). For the year, the Irish, who moved into the top spot in the national rankings for the first time this season, are 10-3-2 overall and 6-2-2-2 in the CCHA, good for 16 points, three points behind first-place Miami in the conference standings with two games in hand. The Irish are coming off a win (4-1) and a shootout win (3-3, 2-1) at home against Western Michigan last weekend. The Ferris State Bulldogs open the weekend with a 7-6-3 record overall and are 6-4-2-0 in the CCHA, good for 14 points and a tie for third place with Alaska and Ohio State. The Bulldogs are just two points behind the Irish but have played two more league games. Last weekend, Ferris State traveled to Northern Michigan where the Bulldogs took 6-4 and 2-1 decisions. Following the Ferris State series, Notre Dame will close out the first half with a home-andhome series against Bowling Green on Dec. 12-13. The Irish will then break for finals and the holidays before returning to action at the Shillelagh Tournament in Chicago, Jan. 2-3.

IRISH VERSUS BULLDOGS: Notre Dame and Ferris State have met 63 times in the alltime series with the Bulldogs holding a 37-20-6 record. At Big Rapids, Ferris State is 14-8-2 versus Notre Dame. The last time the Irish won at Big Rapids was Oct. 26, 2007, a 3-2 win. The two teams met seven times last season with the series even at 3-3-1. Ferris State won the regular-season series, 2-1-1. In the CCHA second round series, the Bulldogs won game one of the series only to see the Irish take games two and three to advance to the CCHA finals in Detroit.

WESTERN MICHIGAN RECAP:

Saturday, November 29 - Notre Dame jumped out to a 2-0 first period lead on goals by Christian Hanson (Sr., Venetia, Pa.) and Billy Maday (Fr., Burr Ridge, Ill.) only to see Western Michigan score three unanswered goals to take a 3-2 lead after two periods. Patrick Galivan, Tyler Ludwig (ppg), and Max Campbell scored for the Broncos and moved into the third period with a one-goal lead. Ryan Thang (Jr., Edina, Minn.) would tie the game with a power-play goal at 6:27 of the third and regulation and overtime ended in the 3-3 tie. In the shootout, Notre Dame prevailed, 2-1. Campbell gave WMU a 1-0 lead before Thang tied it with Notre Dame's third shot. After Ben Ryan (So., Brighton, Mich.) was stopped and Galivan missed the net in the first sudden-death round, Erik Condra (Sr., Livonia, Mich.) scored for the Irish and Jordan Pearce (Sr., Anchorage, **Alaska**) stopped Kevin Connauton to give Notre Dame the win. Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, III.) made his second career start for the Irish and played the first 23:15, giving up two goals on eight shots before givig way to Pearce who surrendered one goal on 20 shots. Jerry Kuhn made 35 saves for the Broncos in the contest.

Friday, November 28 - Notre Dame used four power-play goals to roll to a 4-1 win over Western Michigan on Friday night at the Joyce Center. The Irish got a four-point game (2g, 2a) from Calle Ridderwall (So., Stockholm, Sweden) and a three-point contest (0g, 3a) from Christian Hanson in the win. Billy Maday added a goal and an assist and Kevin Deeth (Jr., Gig Harbor, Wash.) added the fourth power-play goal for the Irish. Max Campbell scored the lone Western Michigan goal, giving the Broncos a 1-0 lead at 10:09 of the first period. On the night, the Irish out shot Western Michigan, 49-22. Jordan Pearce had 21 saves in the game while Jerry Kuhn made 45 stops for the Broncos. Notre Dame got one goal in the first period, two in the second and one in the third for the win. The 49 shots on goal were a season high for the Irish.

POWER SURGE: After being held scoreless on the power play on Nov. 14 versus Lake Superior State, the Irish have now gone 16-for-34 (47.1%) on the power play over the last five games. In the last three games versus Bowling Green (6-for-12) and Western Michigan (4-for-4 and 2-for-5), the Irish are 12-for-21 with the man advantage for a 57.1% success rate.

EN FUEGO: Sophomore left wing Calle Ridderwall and senior center Christian Hanson have been on fire over the last five games for the Irish. Ridderwall, who had five goals and two assists for seven points as a freshman in 2007-08, has scored five goals and nine assists for 14 points in his last five games. Hanson has 12 points over the last five games, scoring five goals with seven assists in that span. Freshman right wing Billy Maday isn't far behind. The rookie has scored goals in five consecutive games and has five goals and two assists for seven points in his last five contests.

CCHA HONORS: Sophomore Calle Ridderwall and freshman Billy Maday were honored by the Central Collegiate Hockey Association last week as the conference's offensive player and rookie of the week respectively. Ridderwall helped the Irish to the win and tie versus Western Michigan by scoring two goals and adding three assists for five points. Included was his second consecutive four-point game (2g, 2a) in the 4-1 win over the Broncos on Nov. 28. Maday scored a pair of goals and added an assist for three points on the weekend to take rookie honors. The talented right wing scored a goal and an assist in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan and then added a goal in the 3-3 tie with the Broncos. Maday has been the rookie of the week twice this season.

ON THE SIDELINES: The Irish will be without the services of sophomore goaltender **Brad Phillips** (Farmington Hills, Mich.) for the entire season. Phillips injured his right knee in the pre-

season and will be out of action for the year. He was 4-1-0 as a freshman with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

A CHILL (ING) REUNION: When Calle Ridderwall and freshman Billy Maday were put on the same line with center Kevin Deeth in the second game of the Miami series, it marked the first time that Ridderwall and Maday played together at Notre Dame. The two aren't strangers as they spent the 2005-06 season as linemates with the Chicago Chill Midget AA program, helping the Chill to a second-place finish at the USA Midget AA championships. Maday had 38 goals and 87 assists for 125 points in 74 games with the Chill while Ridderwall had 52 goals and 66 assists for 118 points that season. In 11 games together this season, the duo has combined for 14 goals and and 16 assists with Maday having seven goals and six assists and Ridderwall seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points in those games.

ROAD WARRIORS: As a team, the Irish have now won five games in a row on the road and are 5-1-0 this season away from the Joyce Center. The current five-game road streak is the first for Notre Dame since Feb. 2 - Feb. 17, 2007 when the Irish won a weekend series at Bowling Green and Alaska as part of a five-game road winning streak. At home, the Irish are 5-2-2, 3-0-2 in the last five games.

WINNING TEAMS: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has the winningest hockey program in the nation. Heading into this weekend's series versus Ferris State, Notre Dame ranks first in wins (69) and first in winning percentage (.707). ROOKIE OF THE MONTH: Notre Dame freshman right wing Billy Maday has been named the CCHA rookie of the month for November. In nine games during the month, Maday had seven goals and four assists for 11 points. Included in his seven goals were five power-play markers. Maday scored points in eight of the nine games and was +4 in the month. He finished the month scoring goals in the last five consecutive games, going 5g, 2a in that span.

USA...USA: Irish defensemen Ian Cole (So., Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (So., Naperville, Ill.) have been selected to the 22-man roster for the U.S. Junior National Team that will compete in the World Junior Championships from Dec. 26- Jan. 5 in Ottawa, Ont. The tournament pits the top hockey players in the world under the age of 20 against each other. For Cole, this marks the second time that he has been named to the team as he played in last year's tournament. Ruth becomes the 12th Irish player selected to play for the U.S. Junior National Team. They join fellow defenseman Kyle Lawson (Jr., New Hudson, Mass.) as current Irish players to have played in the tournament during their careers.

UNBEATEN STREAKS: Notre Dame's current 10-game unbeaten streak is the longest for the Irish since they went 8-0-2 from Nov. 6, 1987 to Dec. 4, 1987. The next longest streak for the Irish is a 13-game unbeaten streak (10-0-3) that occured from Dec. 11, 1968 to Jan. 20, 1969.

MR. RELIABLE: Senior goaltender Jordan Pearce has been a regular in the Notre Dame goal over the last two seasons. Since Jan. 5, 2008. Pearce has appeared in 37 of the last 38 Irish games. Of those 37 games, 35 have been starts. Pearce had appeared in 11 straight games since Oct. 18 until last Saturday, Nov. 29 when Tommy O'Brien (Jr., Mokena, Ill.) made second career start. Pearce came on in relief after 23:15 of action as O'Brien surrendered two goals on eight shots. Pearce has appeared in 14 of Notre Dame's first 15 games this season and is 10-3-2 with a 1.82 goals-against average and a .930 save percentage. In his current 10-game unbeaten streak (8-0-2), Pearce has a 1.54 goalsagainst average and a .942 save percentage. His 40-save performance against the Lakers on Nov. 14, was the most saves in his career, surpassing the previous high of 34 set on Feb. 17, 2006 versus Bowling Green in a 7-4 win.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that five players have signed national letters-of-intent to play hockey at Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2009: The list includes two defensemen and three forwards. Joining the Irish for next season are: Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.), Cam Fowler (Farmington Hills, Mich.), Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.), Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.) and Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.). Calabrese, Fowler and Palmieri all play for the USA Under-18 team while Larson plays for Waterloo in the USHL and Sheahan is a member of the St. Catharines Falcons organization in the Greater Ontario Junior Hockey League. Calabrese and Palmieri are eligible for the 2009 NHL Entry Draft next June while Fowler and Sheahan can't be drafted until the June of 2010 draft. Larson was selected in the fourth round of last year's draft by the Calgary Flames.

WE'RE NO. 1: For just the third time in the 41-year history of the Notre Dame hockey team, the Irish are ranked No. 1 in the nation. Both polls, the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and USCHO.com/CBS College Sports polls, had Notre Dame at the top of their lists. This is the first time since the 2006-07 campaign that Notre Dame has been ranked No. 1. During that year, the Irish were tops in the nation for seven consecutive weeks. The first time that Notre Dame was ranked No. 1 was during February of 1977 when the Irish were on top for just one week.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked fourth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO. com/CBS College Sports polls. The Irish finished the 2007-08 campaign ranked third in the *USA Today* poll and 12th in the USCHO.com polls. During the '07-'08 season, the Irish were ranked every week of the season for the first time in the program's 41-year history. Going back to the 2006-07 season, Notre Dame has been ranked in both polls for 46 consecutive weeks, the longest stretch for the Irish icers. During the '06-'07

PICK SIX: Notre Dame had one of the best power-play performances in program history on Nov. 22 at Bowling Green when the Irish went six-for-12 on the night with the man advantage. Prior to that, the last time Notre Dame scored six power-play goals in a game was Oct. 21, 1994 when the Irish had six ppg's in an 8-4 win over Waterloo at the Joyce Center. The last time the Irish had 12 power-play chances in a game was on Oct. 8, 2004 at home against Minnesota-Duluth. The Irish were 1-for-12 on the power play in that game.

FRESHMAN LEADER: Notre Dame rookie **Billy Maday** ranks third on the Irish in scoring with nine goals and six assists for 15 points in his first 15 games this season. He is tops among freshmen scorers in the CCHA with his 15 points and is currently tied for third on the national level. His nine goals and five power-play goals are tops among CCHA freshmen and tops among freshmen nationally.

GOING TO THE GOAL: In Notre Dame's 10-game unbeaten streak, the Irish have outscored the opposition by a 44-17 margin (4.40 to 1.70). Over the last nine games the Irish have had four or more goals in seven of those contests. The two games with less that four were the 3-3 ties with Lake Superior State on Nov. 15 and Western Michigan on Nov. 29.

WEEKLY HONORS: Defenseman Brett Blatchford (Jr., Temperance, Mich.) and center Christian Hanson were selected as the CCHA's defensive and offensive players of the week respectively for the week ending Nov. 23. Blatchford had four assists in the two games, including a three-assist game on Nov. 22 and was +3 in the two wins. This is the second consecutive week that Blatchford has captured the league's top defensive player of the week award. Hanson had four goals and two assists for six points in the two games and was +3 for the series. Hanson scored two goals with one assist in each game for the first three-point games of his career. He also was selected as Inside College Hockey.com's player of the week for his play in the games against the Falcons.

TAKING ADVANTAGE OF THE MAN ADVANTAGE: Prior to Notre Dame's series with Bowling Green (11/21-22), Notre Dame's power-play was hitting at a 15.6% success rate and ranked fifth in the CCHA and 31st in the nation. Since then, the power-play is 14-for-27 against Bowling Green and Western Michigan for a 51.9% success rate. Notre Dame's power play is now 24-for-104 for a 25.0% success rate. That leads the CCHA and is third nationally.

NINE LIVES: The nine-goal output by the Irish in the 9-1 win at Bowling Green on Nov. 22 marked the first time that Notre Dame had scored nine goals in a game since Nov. 10, 2005 when they scored nine versus Bowling Green in a 9-4 victory.

HANSON HEROICS: Senior center Christian Hanson turned in the first three, three-point games of his career and he did it back-to-back to-back games during the Bowling Green series and in the first game versus Western Michigan. Hanson had two goals to go with one assist in

MINELLA MAGIC: Junior right wing Christiaan Minella scored his first career goal, on his first shot in his first collegiate game against Bowling Green on Nov. 11, 2006. It would be 46 games before he would score again, getting the second goal of his career on Oct. 18 of this season against Sacred Heart. The 6-2, 216-pound forward saw his goal streak snapped at three games (Nov. 14-Nov. 21). Since November 14, Minella has four goals and three assists for seven points. His four goals this season are a career-best for Minella and he's done it in just 13 games.

THE PLAYMAKER: Junior defenseman Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.) comes into the series with Ferris State with 14 assists for 14 points in 15 games to lead Irish defensemen in scoring. The smooth-skating defenseman has already exceeded his output of last season when he had 12 assists in 45 games. He is currently second among defensemen in scoring in the CCHA and ninth nationally. His 14 assists tie him for second in the CCHA and tie him for sixth nationally.

RED HOT SWEDE: Sophomore Calle Ridderwall credits his recent offensive exploits to increased confidence. The speedy left wing has seen his game take off in recent weeks as he has

now scored 14 points (5g, 9a) in his last five games. His recent tear started in a game that he didn't get credited with any points, but got the winning goal for the Irish. On Nov. 14, Notre Dame faced Lake Superior in their first-ever shootout and Ridderwall dazzled the crowd with a great move to score the winning goal for the Irish. He followed that with a career-best three-point game (1g, 2a) in the win over the Lakers the following night. Versus Bowling Green, Ridderwall had a pair of assists in the 5-1 win and then added his first career four-point game (2g, 2a) in the 9-1 win over the Falcons on Nov. 22. He didn't wait long to get his second four-point game as he followed the first with another two-goal, two-assist night in the 4-1 win over Western Michigan and then added an assist in the second game versus the Broncos. For the year, Ridderwall is tied for first in scoring with seven goals and 11 assists for 18 points, surpassing his freshman totals of five goals and two assists for seven points.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: Notre Dame picked up its first win of the season against a ranked team when the Irish knocked off No. 2 Boston College, 4-1, on Nov. 7. The Irish are now 1-3-0 versus ranked teams this season. Notre Dame opened the season on Oct. 11 with a 5-2 loss at No. 6 Denver. On the weekend of Oct. 24-25, the Irish lost a pair of games to No. 10 Miami, 2-0 and 3-2. Last season, Notre Dame faced 15 teams that were ranked when they faced the Irish. They were 5-9-1 in those games.

BACK ON TRACK: Senior captain Erik Condra scored a power-play goal to tie the game at 2-2 in the first period of the November 15, 5-2, win over Lake Superior. The goal snapped a seven-game goal-less drought for Condra and was his first goal since scoring on Oct. 18 versus Sacred Heart. He added a short-handed goal in the 9-1 win over Bowling Green, his first of the year in that category and fifth of his career. He now is tied for ninth all-time at Notre Dame with the five short-handed goals. After scoring six points (2g, 4a) in his first five games, Condra has been held to just five points (2g, 3a) in his last 10 contests. He did score the shootout winner versus Western Michigan on Nov. 29.

UNLUCKY SEVEN: Notre Dame has given up just eight power-play goals in the first 15 games this season. The eight goals have actually come in just five games and the Irish are 1-2-2 in those contests. So far this season, the Irish have given up eight power-play goals in 85 chances for a 90.5% success rate. Notre Dame has given up those power play goals to: two to Denver on Oct. 11, two to Miami on Oct. 25, two to the Lake Superior on Nov. 14, one to Bowling Green on Nov. 22 and one to Western Michigan, Nov. 29.

GOING ON THE OFFENSIVE: Notre Dame's defense has gone on the offensive during the first 15 games of the 2008-09 season. Irish defensemen have scored seven goals and 27 assists this year for 34 of the team's 158 points. Brett Blatchford leads the defensemen with 14 points (all assists). He is followed by sophomore Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and junior Kyle Lawson with eight points - Cole (3g, 5a) and Lawson (2g, 6a). Freshman Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.) has two assists while sophomore Teddy Ruth (one goal) and senior Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.) with one assist, have one point each.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's 4-1 win at Boston College's Kelley Rink on Nov. 7 was the third consecutive win for the Irish on BC's home ice. In 2003-04, the Irish handed the then-No.1 Eagles a 1-0 loss. Two years ago (2006-07), Notre Dame downed the top-ranked Eagles, 7-1 and this year, they handed the second-ranked Eagles the 4-1 loss. In the last three wins at Kelley Rink, Notre Dame has outscored Boston College, 12-2. In the last six meetings between the two schools, the Irish are 4-1-1 against the Eagles.

FIRST TIMERS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Northern Michigan (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) marked the first time that the Irish have ever won a two-game series in Marquette, Mich., since the teams began playing during the 1981-82 season. Last weekend's sweep coupled with a 2-1 win on Jan. 5 of last season gives Notre Dame three straight wins at Northern Michigan.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS: Erik Condra is sixth on the team in scoring with four goals and seven assists for 11 points. That has moved him into 23rd on the all-time points list with 131 career points. Condra now has 39 goals and 92 assists for his 131 points. He is tied for 13th on the all-time assists list with 91.

SHORT STUFF: Junior center Kevin Deeth recorded the third short-handed goal of his career in the 4-1 win at Boston College. The Irish now have four short-handed goals this season in the first 13 games. A year ago, the Irish had nine shorties in 47 games. With three short-handed goals for his career, Deeth now ranks 14th on the all-time Irish short-handed goal list.

TWO IN A ROW: The two consecutive losses by Notre Dame to Miami on Oct. 24-25 marked the first time that the Irish have lost two in a row at home since March 3-4, 2006 when they lost both games of their first round, CCHA playoff series to Alaska, 3-1 and 1-0. The last time that Notre Dame was swept at home in a regular-season CCHA series was Nov. 25-26, 2005 when the Irish were swept at the Joyce Center by Ohio State, 4-1 and 5-2.

FIRST TIME OUT: Junior goaltender **Tom O'Brien** became the first Notre Dame goaltender to record a shutout in his first career start when he blanked Sacred Heart, 7-0, making 17 saves in the Oct. 18 contest. The previous earliest shutout was held by **Jordan Pearce** who recorded a shutout in just his second start in 2005. **David Brown '07** had his first shutout in his third game as a freshman in October of 2003.

MOVING UP THE LIST: With his 3-0 shutout of Sacred Heart on Oct. 17, Jordan Pearce recorded the fifth shutout of his career, making 18 saves against the Pioneers. The shutout moves him into third on the all-time shutout list as he trails Morgan Cey '05, who has six, and David Brown '07, who finished his career with 12. Pearce's shutout was the first at the Joyce Center since Dec. 1, 2007 when he whitewashed Nebraska-Omaha, 5-0.

KNOCKING OFF NO. 1: Notre Dame played five games during the 2008-09 season versus teams ranked No. 1 in the nation. On Nov. 9-10, the Irish faced top-ranked Miami in Oxford, Ohio, splitting a weekend series with the RedHawks. In January (18-19), the Irish dropped two games to No. 1 Michigan, losing at Yost Arena and also at the Palace of Auburn Hills. Notre Dame met the top-ranked Wolverines a third time on Apr. 10 at the Frozen Four in Denver, Colo., and knocked off Michigan, 5-4 in overtime to advance to the national championship game. Here's the list of Irish wins versus top-ranked teams in the 41-year history of the program.

CLUTCH SCORER: Ryan Thang's gamewinning goal in the Oct. 18 win over Sacred Heart gives him 12 for his career and moves him into a tie for fourth on the all-time list with David Bankoske '93. He is one off the school record of 13 for his career. Three people - Rob Globke '04, Brian Urick '99 and Dave Poulin '82 - hold that mark.

OPENING ACTS: Notre Dame's seasonopening loss at Denver drops the Irish to 20-19-2 all-time in season openers. In the first road game of the season, they are now 16-22-3 in 41 road openers. Following the home-opening win against Sacred Heart, Notre Dame is now 23-17-1 in home lidlifters.

HOME OPENERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 win over Sacred Heart on Oct. 17 in the home season opener improved the Irish to 23-17-1 in all-time home openers going back to the 1968-69 season.

LOTS OF RUBBER: Notre Dame's 42 shots on goal against Sacred Heart on Oct. 17 were the most in a game for the Irish since a 40-shot game against Northern Michigan on March 22, 2008 in the CCHA third-place game. Notre Dame lost that contest, 2-1. Pioneer goaltender Stefan Drew's 39-save night was the most for an opposing goaltender since Western Michigan's Riley Gill had 42 saves on Feb. 29, 2008, a 3-0 shutout for the Broncos.

THEY HAVE OUR NUMBER: Notre Dame's loss to the University of Denver drops the Irish to just 10-35-3 all-time against the Pioneers. Playing at DU has been a problem for the Irish as they are now 2-22-2 in the all-time series at the Mile High City. The two teams were members of the WCHA from 1971-1981. Since leaving the WCHA following the 1980-81 season, the Irish are just 1-4-1 against Denver and 1-3-0 since Jeff Jackson took over as head coach in 2005-06.

FOUR OR MORE: When the University of Denver scored four times in the third period of the 5-2 win on Oct. 11, it marked just the second time since the start of the 2005-06 season that the Irish had given up four goals in one period. The first time came on Nov. 4, 2005 when Notre Dame surrendered four goals in the third period to Michigan in an 8-5 loss. The four-goal period snaps a streak of 120 games where the Irish held opponents to three goals or less in a period. In fact, in those 120 games, the Irish had just five games (over three seasons) where opponents had three goals in one period. Last season the Irish surrendered five or more goals in a game just twice. They gave up five goals just once in 2006-07 and five times in 2005-06.

FOUR FOR US: After giving up four goals in the third period of the season opener at Denver (10/11), the Irish blitzed Sacred Heart for four goals in the second period of the 7-0 shutout on Oct. 18. The four-goal outburst was the first for Notre Dame since doing it on Dec. 8, 2007, getting four goals in the second period of a 7-0 shutout at Princeton. Notre Dame also scored four goals in a period on November 1, 2007 with four in the second versus Lake Superior State in a 7-3 victory.

NEW KIDS: Four freshmen made their collegiate debuts for Notre Dame at Denver on Oct. 11. Forwards Billy Maday and Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.) and defensemen Nick Condon (Wausau, Wis.) and Sean Lorenz (Littleton, **Colo.)** all saw action in the game. Maday scored a goal, had two shots on net and was +1. Gaul had one minor penalty and was -1 for the night. Condon also had a minor penalty and was even while Lorenz was -1 in the game. Freshman defenseman Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio) made his first career appearance on the Notre Dame blue line on Friday, Oct. 17 against Sacred Heart. The sixth member of the class, Richard Ryan (Toronto, Ont.), saw his first career action on Oct. 25 versus Miami.

DOCTOR, DOCTOR: Seniors Erik Condra and Jordan Pearce don't have much in common on the ice as one is known for shooting pucks and the other for stopping them. Off the ice, the senior duo have a great deal in common as they are both pre-med majors at Notre Dame, balancing the books and hockey and doing both rather well. Condra has a double major in psychology and pre-med whil Pearce has his double major in anthropology and pre-med. On the ice, Condra is the team's top returning scorer as he led the Irish with 15 goals and 23 assists for 38 points as a junior. Pearce started 43 games in goal for the Irish, going 23-15-4 with a 2.04 goals-against average and a .914 save percentage. He had the best goals against in the CCHA with a 1.80 mark in conference games. The native of Anchorage, Alaska was the team's Most Valuable Player and won the Rockne Scholar-Athlete Award while being selected to the CCHA's Scholar-Athlete team and a second team Academic All-American.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE: Nineteen of 22 athletics programs at the University of Notre Dame compiled graduation rates of 100 percent, and none were below 90 percent, according to the fourth year of Graduation Success Rate measurements developed by the NCAA and released on Oct. 11. None of the 119 Football Bowl Subdivision (formerly Division I) programs in the country had a higher percentage of 100 GSR scores than did Notre Dame with its .863 figure (19 of 22). This marked the third time in the four years of the survey that Notre Dame has ranked number one in percentage of teams with 100 scores. Here are the top 10 in that category (only 10 institutions had 50% or more of their sports registering 100 marks):

NCAA figures showed that all 11 Irish women's programs posted a GSR of 100 percent -- basketball, cross country/track, fencing, golf, lacrosse, rowing, soccer, softball, swimming, tennis and volleyball. Among Notre Dame's men's sports, baseball, basketball, cross country/track, fencing, lacrosse, soccer, swimming and tennis achieved 100 percent GSR scores. Ice hockey scored 96 percent, football scored 94 percent, and golf was at 90. Overall, that's one more perfect score than a year ago for the Irish programs, after Notre Dame recorded 18 100 percent GSR scores (of 22 sports) in 2007. In 2005, among the 119 NCAA Division I-A football-playing institutions, Notre Dame had the highest percentage of its sports with 100 percent scores, with a .800 figure (16 of 20). The 2006 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .773 (17 of 22), to rank second behind the U.S. Naval Academy. The 2007 data put Notre Dame's percentage at .818 (18 of 22), which again ranked number one.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN HONORS:

Goaltender Jordan Pearce was selected as an ESPN The Magazine/CoSIDA Academic All-American during the 2007-08 season. Pearce, with a double major in anthropology/pre-med, was a second team selection on the At-Large team. He owns a 3.816 grade-point average and has made the Dean's List in four of his first six semesters. Pearce became the first Notre Dame hockey player to take Academic All-American honors since Dan Carlson '01 and the fifth player overall. He joins Carlson (third team), Andy Jurkowski '00 (third team), Forrest Karr '99 (second team) and Steve Noble '97 and '98 (first team and second team). Two other Irish players were selected to the all-Region V team in '07-'08 - Mark Van Guilder '08 and Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)

BACK-TO-BACK: Following the 2007-08 CCHA regular season, goaltender Jordan Pearce won the league's top goaltender award based on his 1.80 goals-against average in CCHA games. Pearce followed David Brown '07, who had a 1.77 goals-against average to win the 2006-07 award. This marks the fourth time since the 1982-83 season that the same school has won back-to-back goaltending titles with different goaltenders between the pipes. Pearce and Brown are joined on that list by:

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing Erik Condra will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2008-09 season. Joining Condra as alternate captains in '08-'09, are senior center Christian Hanson along with junior left wing Ryan Thang and junior defenseman Kyle Lawson. Condra served as an alternate captain in 2007-08 while this is the first season as captains for Hanson, Thang and Lawson.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - senior forwards Erik Condra and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) and sophomore goaltender Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.) – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork '83 who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. Bjork took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota. Phillips' uncle, is former Irish quarterback Terry Andrysiak '89, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

FAMOUS FATHERS: Two members of the 2007-08 Notre Dame hockey team - senior center Christian Hanson and sophomore goaltender Brian Brooke (Eden Prairie, Minn.) - have hockey in their blood as their fathers played at the highest level in the National Hockey League. Hanson's father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of prossional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson is still involved in hockey as he currently serves as the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh. Brooke's father, Bob Brooke, played seven seasons in the NHL between 1984 and 1990 with the New York Rangers, Minnesota North Stars and New Jersey. A 1983 hockey All-American at Yale, Brooke also was a member of the 1984 U.S. Olympic Team.

MINUTES MAN: Goaltender Jordan Pearce entered the 2007-08 season having played in just 12 games and 622 minutes in the first two years of his Irish hockey career. During the '07-'08 campaign, Pearce showed everyone that he could play as he set Notre Dame goaltending marks for games played (43), games started (42) and minutes played (2,557:46). He finished the season ranked second in the nation in minutes played behind Boston College's John Muse who saw action in 2,725:06 minutes for the Eagles.

TRADING PLACES: Sophomore Irish defenseman **Teddy Ruth** was a second round draft choice of the Washington Capitals in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. The rugged defenseman won't have a chance to play for the Capitals though. At the 2008 NHL trading deadline, Ruth saw his rights traded even up to the Columbus Bluejackets for future Hall of Famer Sergei Fedorov.

LORD STANLEY, LORD STANLEY: Former Irish defenseman Brett Lebda '04 became just the third player in Notre Dame hockey history to play on a Stanley Cup championship team when he helped the Detroit Red Wings to the 2008 Cup. The talented blueliner joins Bill Nyrop '74 and Don Jackson '78 on the list. Nyrop played on the Stanley Cup winners with the Montreal Canadiens (1975-78) and Jackson was a member of three Cup-winning teams with the Edmonton Oilers (1982-85).

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena, located within the Joyce Center is built, the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 56 years, Lefty and his wife, Mickey, are parents of seven living children, with 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.

HOMETOWNS: The 2008-09 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 14 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Sophomore Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) become the first Notre Dame hockey players from Sweden during the 2007-08 season.

LEADER OF THE PACK: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson begins his fourth season behind the Irish bench in 2008-09. In his first three years he has compiled a 72-42-11 (.620) record, highlighted by a 32-7-3 mark in 2006-07 and last season's 27-16-4 record on the way to the first-ever appearance for the Irish in the Frozen Four. The '06-'07 CCHA coach-of-the-year and Spencer Penrose Award winner as the national coach-of-the-year, Jackson enters the '08-'09 season with the best winning percentage among Division I coaches with five or more years. His current overall record stands at 254-94-36 for a .708 success rate. His 254 wins tie him for 17th on the list of active coaches. In six seasons at his previous collegiate stop - Lake Superior State (1990-96) – Jackson's teams were 182-52-25 with two national championships, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA tournament championships. Included in his 254 career wins are 46 postseason victories (46-14 in postseason) and a .767 winning percentage. In nine trips to the CCHA postseason, Jackson's teams are 30-7 (.811). Those totals include a 24-2 mark at Lake Superior and a 6-5 record at Notre Dame. In those nine seasons, Jackson has seen his teams advance to the CCHA finals eight times, winning five tournament championships (four at Lake Superior and one at Notre Dame).

FULL HOUSE: Notre Dame hockey games became a tough ticket during the 2007-08 season as the Irish closed out the regular season with seven consecutive sellouts (2,763) and for the year had sellouts in 11 of 18 home games. For the year, the Irish had 11 sellouts (2,763) in 17 home dates and averaged 2,683 fans per game, the most since the building was reconfigured to 2,713.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: Sophomore defenseman Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) was named to the U.S. National Junior team for 2009 and was joined by fellow sophomore Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.) who becomes the 12th Notre Dame hockey player to participate in the World Junior Championships. Cole, and Ruth, along with Sean Lorenz (Fr., Littleton, Colo.) were invited to the 2009 Junior National Evaluation Camp this past August as they tried out for a berth on this winter's team that will play in Ottawa, Ontario. Cole and Ruth join Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, `78-'79), Ben Simon (`96-'97, `97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98), Dan Carlson ('98-'99), Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01), Brett Henning ('99-'00), David Inman ('99-'00), Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02), Brett Lebda ('01-'02) and Kyle Lawson ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have eight players on the 2008-09 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Just one incoming freshman - defenseman Sean Lorenz – was selected in the 2008 draft as he was picked by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. In the previous draft in June of 2007, Notre Dame saw five of its players selected. Leading the way was current sophomore defenseman Ian Cole who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (Rob Globke '04 was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman Teddy Ruth who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Ryan Thang

They join senior right wing **Erik Condra** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and junior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

USA...USA: Notre Dame will have seven players on the 2008-09 roster who have cut their teeth with the U.S. National Team Developmental Program.
