### Notre Dame Plays Host To Irish Invitational On Saturday

Notre Dame will have one final chance to tune up before the BIG EAST Championship when it plays host to the Irish Invitational on Saturday at the Warren Golf Course. The one-day, 36-hole tournament is the first regular-season spring event hosted by Notre Dame since 2005 and revives a tradition that began with the advent of stroke play tournaments in 1967-68.

Junior **Josh Sandman** (73.28) is among the hottest players in the BIG EAST, if not the nation, heading into this weekend's tournament. Sandman has placed in the top 10 in his last three events, the first Irish player to pull off that feat in more than eight years. As a team, Notre Dame is shooting 295.96 this season with a pair of top-five finishes to its credit.

### Quoting Coach Kubinski...

"It's always exciting to host an event on our historic campus here at Notre Dame. Whenever you walk down a fairway at the Warren Golf Course and see our Golden Dome shining in the distance, you can't help but feel the spirit. I look for our lineup to play with great determination on Saturday. We'd like to build some momentum for the BIG EAST Championship.

"**Josh (Sandman)** is coming off a string of three consecutive top-10 finishes and playing very well. He'll set the tone at the top for us. **Doug Fortner** has played his best golf of the spring over his last four rounds and plays very well here. **Carl (Santos-Ocampo)** has played consistently for us and is gaining confidence with each event. **Dustin (Zhang)** played a very solid 36 holes in Tucson and is a very capable young player. **Mike King** will round out our lineup in his final regular season event for us. I think he'll be inspired by the opportunity and give us a low round or two."

### Did You Know?

Notre Dame has ties to two of the most famous players in golf history.

Billy Casper won 51 PGA Tour titles, including three majors (1959 & 1966 U.S. Open; 1970 Masters) and was sixth on that tour's all-time victories list upon retirement. He also logged nine wins on the Senior PGA Tour (now the Champions Tour), was an eight-time member of the U.S. Ryder Cup Team and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1978. However, before turning pro, Casper attended Notre Dame in 1950 and won the Western Junior National Championship, which was contested at the old Notre Dame Golf Course. His Irish career was cut short when he was called away to military service in the Korean War.

Walter Hagen, Jr., was a three-year monogram winner at Notre Dame from 1938-40, helping the Irish to three consecutive NCAA Championship berths, including a sixth-place finish in 1938. If the name sounds familiar, it should be — his father, Walter Hagen, Sr., won 40 PGA titles, including 11 major championships (five PGA Championships, four British Opens and two U.S. Opens) in his storied career, ranking third behind Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods. The elder Hagen also was a six-time U.S. Ryder Cup captain, and five years after his death in 1969, he was part of the inaugural induction class for the World Golf Hall of Fame.

### Dates and Times

The tournament is a one-day, 36-hole event, featuring continuous play throughout the day. The first round will tee off at 9 a.m. (ET) with a shotgun start, with the Irish starting five scheduled to begin on holes 1-4 at the Warren Golf Course. The remaining Notre Dame players (who will compete as individuals) are slated to begin on the back side of the course at holes 15-18.

### Following The Irish

There will be no live scoring for Saturday's tournament. However, complete results will be posted on the official Notre Dame athletics web site ([UND.com](http://UND.com)). The latest information from the tournament, including results, scheduling updates and weather delays, also will be available on the Notre Dame Sports Hotline (574-631-3000).

Furthermore, results will be available via the Irish ALERT text-message system, which provides fans with regular updates on Notre Dame's progress at the Irish Invitational through text messages sent to their cell phone. For more information or to sign up, visit the men's golf page of the official Notre Dame athletics web site ([UND.com](http://UND.com)).

### The Tournament Format

A total of nine five-man teams (45 participants, plus 14 additional golfers from the competing schools who will be playing on an individual basis) will be taking part in the Irish Invitational. Conventional collegiate golf team scoring rules will apply, with the lowest four scores in the five-man lineup for each round counting toward the team total. Scores by golfers competing on an individual basis do not count to the team score.

### The Teams

Besides tournament host Notre Dame, the remaining schools in the nine-team field for the Irish Invitational are: Bucknell, Cleveland State, Columbia, George Washington, IPFW, Northwestern, Pennsylvania and Youngstown State.

Monday's ratings in the *Golfweek*/Sagarin Performance Index show that the highest ranked teams in the field will be Northwestern (65th) and Notre Dame (74th). The Wildcats and Irish also are the leaders among this week's field in Wednesday's new Golfstat rankings, with Northwestern standing 61st and Notre Dame at No. 77.

### Head-To-Head

It's a completely new field for Notre Dame this weekend, as the Irish have not played any of the other eight teams this year. For the season, Notre Dame is 44-71-6 (.388) against Division I varsity opponents, with a 7-49-2 (.138) record against *Golfweek* Top 50 clubs (2-27-2 vs. the Top 25).

### The Course

A par-70, 7,023-yard layout designed by PGA Tour veteran (and 2002 World Golf Hall of Famer) **Ben Crenshaw** and **Bill Coore**, the Warren Golf Course on the Notre Dame campus is based on a traditional walkable Irish and American courses favored around the turn of the 20th century. The course winds its way through 250 wooded acres and is based on subtleties rather than special effects, including small, undulating greens and 88 strategically-placed bunkers which were recently renovated as part of a course-wide improvement project.

The Warren Golf Course has been rated one of the nation's top 15 collegiate courses by *Golf Digest* (Sept. 2005 issue) and has played host to several championship events. Among the more notable tournaments to be played at the course since its debut seven years ago are: the 2005 NCAA Central Regional,

two U.S. Amateur sectional qualifiers (2004, 2007), three Western Amateur qualifiers (2005-07), five BIG EAST Conference Men's Golf Championships (2000, 2002-05) and three BIG EAST Women's Championships (2003-05).

### Noting The Irish Invitational

- ◆ Saturday's tournament is a revival of Notre Dame's spring competition that was held annually from 1968-73, as well as in 1980 and 2005.
- ◆ The 2005 Irish Invitational was the only one held off-campus, taking place in Howey-in-the-Hills, Fla., at the Mission Inn Resort (Campeon Course). Wichita State won the tournament at 885 (+21), four shots clear of Colorado State, with Notre Dame tying for fourth place at 919 (+31).
- ◆ As a rookie in 2005, current senior tri-captain **Greg Rodgers** led Notre Dame with a 14th-place tie at the Irish Invitational, carding a 12-over par 228 (76-75-77). Classmates and fellow captains **Eddie Peckels** (t-56th, 77-83-84=244) and **Mike King** (t-68th, 79-78-90=247) also competed that weekend as individual participants.
- ◆ Notre Dame won three of the first four Irish Invitationals (1968, 1970, 1971), was the tournament runner-up in 1969 and 1972, and took fourth place in 1973 and 2005. Records for the 1980 tournament are incomplete.
- ◆ The Irish Invitational is the first regularly-scheduled 36-hole tournament for Notre Dame since Oct. 20-21, 2003, when the Irish placed second at The Tillinghast (hosted by St. John's). Notre Dame did play in a pair of weather-shortened 36-hole tournaments last season — the Boilermaker Invitational (hosted by Purdue) and the Kepler Intercollegiate (hosted by Ohio State).
- ◆ Due to regular course maintenance, the yardage for Saturday's tournament will be slightly shorter (6,930 yards) than the normally-listed yardage of 7,023 yards for the Warren Golf Course.
- ◆ Freshman **Dustin Zhang** (Calgary, Alberta) cracked the Notre Dame starting lineup for the first time in his career on March 23-25 at the National Invitational Tournament. Zhang is the first foreign-born player to crack the Notre Dame lineup since April 28-29, 2001, when **Alex Kent** (Asuncion, Paraguay) wrapped up his career at the BIG EAST Conference Championship in East Providence, R.I.

### Last Time Out: National Invitational Tournament

Junior **Josh Sandman** posted his third consecutive top-10 individual finish, helping Notre Dame tie for 10th place at the National Invitational Tournament, which concluded March 25 at the Omni Tucson National Golf Club (par 72/7,330 yards) in Tucson, Ariz. The Irish carded their best score of the spring season at 19-over par 883 (296-291-296), tying with Tulsa in the 15-team event, which was won by TCU at 854.

Sandman tied for 10th place on the individual ladder at two-under par 214 (71-71-72), becoming the first Notre Dame golfer in eight years to register three consecutive top-10 finishes. **Steve Ratay** was the last to pull off that feat, doing so during the final three tournaments of the fall 1999 season at the Legends of Indiana (1st), Xavier Invitational (tie-5th) and Louisville Intercollegiate (2nd).

During his current three-tournament run, Sandman has fired an average score of 71.78, ending up tied for third at the USC Collegiate Invitational (220), and tied for sixth at the Schenkel E-Z-GO Invitational (career-low 212) prior to his 10th-place tie at the NIT. Tulsa's Nicolas Geyger, Kent State's David Markle and Houston's Ben Moser shared medalist honors at eight-under par 208 atop the 81-man field.

Sophomore **Doug Fortner** moved up 10 spots on the final day of action, sharing 34th place at five-over par 221 (75-74-72) to log his best 54-hole score

## Irish Among Nation's Elite Programs In *Golf Digest* Rankings

The Notre Dame men's golf program has been rated ninth in the nation, according to the latest in-depth *Golf Digest* rankings released in the August 2007 issue of the magazine. The Irish were cited for their impressive combination of athletic and academic success, as well as the quality of the program's new facilities and the accomplishments of its coaching staff.

Notre Dame was ranked among the top 35 in all three categories evaluated in the *Golf Digest* study. In the "golf-first" rating, which heavily weights a program's performance on the course through both adjusted scoring average and player growth during the past four seasons (2003-04 through 2006-07), the Irish checked in at No. 35. Under the "academics-first" classification, which depends largely on the school's standing in the latest *U.S. News & World Report* rankings and the golf program's graduation rates, Notre Dame was 14th in the nation. However, when combining those two rankings and factoring in facilities, coaching and climate (location) — the components of the "balanced" *Golf Digest* ranking — the Irish made their biggest impression, placing ninth in the country, second among all programs north of the Mason-Dixon Line, and tops in the BIG EAST Conference.

"We are understandably thrilled with the 2007-08 *Golf Digest* program rankings," Notre Dame head coach **Jim Kubinski** said. "We think this only confirms what we've believed for quite a while — that we have the pieces in places to compete as one of the elite programs in the country, both on the course and the classroom. The greatest days for Fighting Irish golf are still to come and we couldn't be more excited about what lies ahead."

In addition, Notre Dame's facilities were singled out as the third-best college golf footprint in the nation with a 98 rating — only Stanford and Duke had higher totals. The Irish have made tremendous strides in their physical plant during the past decade, beginning with the 2000 debut of the on-campus Warren Golf Course, designed by Bill Coore and PGA Tour great Ben Crenshaw and rated among the nation's top college and public layouts. The course already has hosted five BIG EAST Championships, the 2005 NCAA Central Regional, a 2004 U.S. Amateur Championship qualifier, and three Western Amateur Championship qualifiers in its eight-year existence.

Notre Dame's latest facility addition opened in September 2006, with the completion of the \$2.1 million, 10,333-square foot Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility, located on the grounds of the Warren Golf Course. The Rolfs Facility features a 5,000-square foot indoor short game area, six covered tee stations that include state-of-the-art video equipment for instant coaching feedback, office space for the Irish men's and women's coaching staffs, and a fully-furnished lounge area with separate locker room areas for both teams.

Sophomore **Carl Santos-Ocampo** and freshman **Dustin Zhang** tied for 48th place at eight-over par 224 — Santos-Ocampo shot rounds of 76, 74 and 74, while Zhang wavered a bit in his final round, winding up with scores of 74, 72 and 78. Senior tri-captain **Eddie Peckels** rounded out the Irish scoring in 71st place at 16-over par 232 (77-75-80) in his first spring event.

### Young Guns

Notre Dame has gotten a significant boost from its underclassmen, with five of its six lowest scorers being either freshmen or sophomores. Freshman **Jeff Chen** (73.67), who has played exclusively as an individual or "B" team member, ranks second on the squad behind junior **Josh Sandman** (73.28), while sophomore **Doug Fortner** (73.80) has teamed with Sandman to form the cornerstone of the Irish varsity squad. Sophomores **Kyle Willis** (75.08) and **Carl Santos-Ocampo** (75.28), and freshman **Tyler Hock** (75.79) also have contributed on the Notre Dame travel squad.

### Captains Courageous

Notre Dame's three seniors have been selected as team captains for the 2007-08 season. **Mike King**, **Eddie Peckels** and **Greg Rodgers** all are serving in that capacity for the first time in their careers.

### The .500 Rule

According to a new rule passed by the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee, teams must finish with a winning head-to-head record (i.e. better than .500) against Division I varsity opposition to be considered for a berth in postseason play. Notre Dame currently has a 44-71-6 (.388) record this season.

### Things You Should Know About The Irish

- ◆ Notre Dame has won six BIG EAST Conference titles in its 12-year league affiliation, stringing together three consecutive crowns from 1995-97 and again from 2004-06. The Irish also have made 33 NCAA postseason appearances in their history (most recently in 2006 with a trip to the NCAA East Regional), winning the 1944 national title and finishing second in 1937.
- ◆ Notre Dame has taken its play to new levels in recent years, posting three of the top seven single-season stroke averages in school history since head coach **Jim Kubinski** took over as head coach in January 2005. The Irish also have carded nine of the top 12 tournament scores (54 holes) in program history during the Kubinski era, including a school-record 842 (-22) at the 2006 BIG EAST Championship.
- ◆ Notre Dame's impressive resurgence of late has been augmented by its play against nationally-ranked opponents. In fact, since Kubinski arrived under the Golden Dome, the Irish have defeated 15 Top 25 teams (according to *Golfweek*) and posted 14 top-five tournament finishes, including three event titles (most recently the '06 BIG EAST Championship).
- ◆ Kubinski himself was nominated for a place on the 2007 *GOLF Magazine* Top 100 Teachers List, after being placed into consideration by the Indiana Section of the PGA. Approximately 400-500 people are chosen annually from the 30,000 PGA professionals nationwide for a few select places on the *GOLF Magazine* list, whose membership includes such notables as Hank Haney, Butch Harmon, David Leadbetter and Rick Smith.

### Next Up: BIG EAST Championship (April 20-22)

Notre Dame will look to regain its place atop the BIG EAST Conference when it takes part in the BIG EAST Championship April 20-22 at the Traditions Golf Club in Hebron, Ky. (located outside Cincinnati). The Irish have won six league titles (most recently in 2006), and finished second to Louisville a year ago.

# JIM KUBINSKI

## Head Coach • Fourth Year at Notre Dame Springfield College (1993)

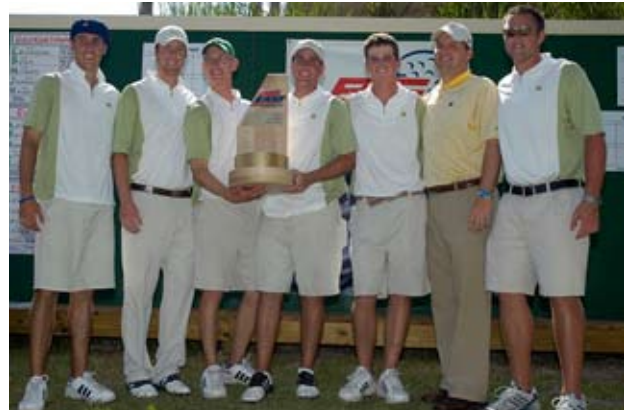
One of the nation's top young golf teachers, **Jim Kubinski** is in his fourth season as the head coach at Notre Dame. Having assumed the post on Jan. 28, 2005, Kubinski is just the sixth head coach in the 78-year history of the Irish men's golf program, inheriting a storied tradition that includes the 1944 national championship, 19 top-10 NCAA Championship finishes and 33 NCAA postseason appearances.

"We feel Jim is one of the rising stars in the golf coaching community and someone who can continue to develop our program into a perennial national contender," Notre Dame athletics director **Kevin White** said.

It hasn't taken long for Kubinski to make his mark at Notre Dame and reward White's confidence in his abilities. In his first tournament at the helm of the Irish, just one month after setting foot on campus, Kubinski helped guide Notre Dame to the championship of the 2005 NOKIA Sugar Bowl Tulane Invitational, winning the title on the first hole of a sudden death playoff against UNC Wilmington. It was the first of two tournament crowns in the 2004-05 season for Notre Dame and made Kubinski the first Irish men's golf coach since 1961 to win the opening event of his career. That season, **Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C.**, led the Irish to a 23.5-6.5 dual-match win over Western Michigan.

That was the start of what has been a solid four-year run for the Notre Dame skipper, who piloted the Irish to consecutive BIG EAST Conference titles in 2005 and 2006, and back-to-back NCAA regional appearances both years. He also has an overall record of 269-279-16 (.491) record and 15 wins over teams ranked in the *Golfweek* Top 25. What's more, Notre Dame has regularly collected votes in the *Golf World*/Nike Golf Top 25 poll and has risen as high as No. 12 in the *Golfweek* rankings (Oct. 2, 2005).

Under Kubinski's guidance, Notre Dame has registered 14 top-five finishes, including three tourney titles (two coming in sudden-death playoffs). The Irish also have carded three of the top seven single-season stroke averages in school history, following a 299.89 mark in 2004-05 (seventh all-time) with a school-record pace of 292.97 in '05-06 and a 295.71 mark last season (second all-time). In addition, Notre Dame has fired nine of the top 12 single-round scores in school history since Kubinski arrived on campus, including impressive final-round postseason efforts at the 2005 NCAA Central Regional (282, +2) and the 2006 BIG EAST Championship (school-record 272, -16). The latter score highlighted a 12-stroke comeback victory over Louisville, the second-best rally in the storied history of the Irish men's golf program, and led the Notre Dame's selection as the *Golfweek* National Team of the Week (May 1, 2006) for the first time in program history.



Individually, Kubinski has produced impressive results with several Irish players in a short span of time. **Cole Isban** became the first three-time PING All-Midwest Region selection (2005-07) in program history under Kubinski's tutelage, and graduated in May 2007 as the school record holder for single-season stroke average (72.71 in 2006-07), and career stroke average (73.76). Junior **Josh Sandman** got a late start to his college career in '05-06 due to an injury, but since he hit the links, he has been superb, posting a 73.59 career stroke average in 74 rounds (26 tournaments) that puts him on pace to threaten Isban's school record. Thus, it's no wonder Kubinski was nominated for the 2007 *GOLF Magazine* Top 100 Teachers List, honoring the nation's pre-eminent golf instructors.



"As a lifelong Notre Dame fan, I couldn't ask for a greater opportunity than to be the head coach of the Fighting Irish," Kubinski said. "It's certainly a special time to play for Notre Dame and be a part of this great university. I'm looking forward to an exciting time ahead and feel that we're building something here that will be a great source of pride for our players and our university in the years to come.

"Notre Dame exemplifies the best of everything in a college environment, both academically and athletically," Kubinski continued. "It's my goal to ensure that we are a perennial top-10 program on the course and in the classroom, consistent with the best traditions of Notre Dame, and I truly believe we can achieve that goal."

Kubinski was a three-year golf letterman and two-year team captain at Springfield (Mass.) College before graduating in 1993. A two-time all-Northeast 10 Conference selection in 1991 and 1992, he also received the Springfield College Maroon Club Award for academic and athletic achievement in 1992. His playing experience continued on the North Atlantic Tour where he tied for sixth place at the '95 Boston Open, and he also competed in the Carolinas Section PGA.

Born May 4, 1970 in Springfield, Mass., Kubinski and his wife, **Sarah**, now live in South Bend. The couple celebrated the birth of their first child, daughter **Kelly**, in September 2007.
