IRISH SPLASHES

IRISH STORM THE NCAA POOL

A host of Notre Dame student-athletes have punched their tickets to the NCAA Championships, which will be held Wednesday through Saturday in Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Three Notre Dame swimmers have qualified for individual events at this week's NCAA men's meet. **Justin Plaschka** will race in both the 50 freestyle and 100 butterfly events, entering the meet ranked 23rd nationally in the 50 free and 11th nationally in the 100 fly.

Rob Whitacre will compete in both the 200 backstroke and the 200 IM during the 2018 NCAA Championships for Notre Dame. Whitacre set an Irish program record in the 200 back earlier this season, ranking 13th nationally. His top 200 IM effort of is the 34th-fastest time in the country thus far in 2017-18.

Zach Yeadon enters his first career NCAA Championships meet in the midst of a historic freshman season for Notre Dame. Yeadon, a two-time ACC Men's Swimmer Selection of the Week (Oct. 10 and Jan. 30), will race in the 500 and 1650 freestyle events. To date, his Irish record time in the 500 free ranks seventh in the country and earned him an automatic invitation to the NCAA meet. Yeadon's school record 1650 free swim is slotted third in the country on the eve of NAAs, with his additional record split in the 1000 free ranking sixth in Division I men's swimming.

On the relay schedule, Notre Dame will be represented in the 200 and 400 freestyle relay events, along with the 200 and 400 medley relay preliminary heats. The Irish posted NCAA A-cuts in both the 200 (1:17.61) and 400 (2:51.62) free relays earlier this season to earn automatic bids to the NCAA Championships.

In diving, **Joe Coumos** returns to the NCAA Championships for the fourth time in his career and will dive off both the 1-meter and 3-meter boards. Coumos was the ACC runner-up in the 1-meter event at the conference championships meet last month with a score of 391.90 points.

IRISH REWRITE THE RECORD BOOKS

A total of eight Notre Dame program records have been established during the 2017-18 season on the road to the 2018 NCAA Division I Men's Swimming and Diving Championships. Seven individual swimming events and one diving high score off the 3-meter board set the pace in Irish program history, with the oldest top time in the Notre Dame record book now dating back only as far as 2014.

Justin Plaschka threw down the fastest Notre Dame 50 freestyle in history, placing fourth in the 'A' final at the ACC Championships with a time of 19.30. Plaschka added the top 100 butterfly mark ever by an Irish men's swimmer during the ACC meet, touching the wall in :45.41 for an NCAA A-cut and automatic slot in the national meet. Plaschka previously set the Notre Dame 100 freestyle (:42.78) last season.

Zach Yeadon etched his name into three places on the Notre Dame record book during his freshman season. His runner-up time of 4:12.74 in the 500 freestyle at the ACC Championships was good for the fastest in Irish history and a silver medal. Yeadon added his second silver finish at the ACC meet with a time of 14:34.60 in the 1650 freestyle, with his 8:51.16 1000 free split also on the top of the all-time Notre Dame list.

Rob Whitacre has enjoyed a standout senior season for the Irish in the backstroke, putting his name on the top 100 and 200 back swims in program history this season. Whitacre swam a prelim time of 46.46 in the 100 backstroke at the ACC Championships before finishing seventh in the event final to extend his team mark. He was also the top seed in the 200 back at ACCs following a Notre Dame record time of 1:40.17 in his prelim session.

Off the 3-meter diving board, **Joe Coumos** extended his own team record with 419.80 points on his way to victory at the Shamrock Invitational. Coumos also holds the top Notre Dame score in the 1-meter dive with a score of 420.00 points in 2017.

IRISH RIDING HIGH IN 2018

Racking up a 9-2 record in dual meets earlier in the season, Notre Dame staked its claim as one of the top teams in the ACC on its way to a fourth-place finish at the conference championship meet. The Irish downed No. 7 Louisville (Oct. 7), No. 23 Purdue (Oct. 27) and No. 20 Florida State (Jan. 19-20) in dual action, adding a first-place result in a talented Shamrock Invitational field that featured two additional ranked foes in January and a third-place finish at a loaded Ohio State Fall Invitational last November.

In addition to the key dual victories, Notre Dame scored a fourth-place finish at the ACC Swimming and Diving Championships in February to build off its third-place result in 2017. The Irish scored 941 points during the meet, with top finishes earned in the 500 and 1650 freestyle by **Zach Yeadon** (second place), a runner-up result for **Rob Whitacre** in the 200 backstroke and a silver medal for **Joe Coumos** off the 1-meter diving board. Whitacre added a fourth-place result in the 200 IM to his conference meet weekend, while **Justin Plaschka** was fourth in the ACC in the 50 freestyle.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - For what is believed to be the first time in school history, the Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams downed a top 10 foe in dual meet action as the No. 17 Notre Dame men beat No. 7 Louisville, 153.5-146.5, while the No. 25 Irish women beat the ninth-ranked Cardinals, 181.5-118.5, on Saturday afternoon.

Sophomore Abbie Dolan won the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle events, while also adding a leg to the champion 400 freestyle relay team, to help guide the Notre Dame women to victory. Dolan's wins in the 100 and 200 freestyle came impressive over tight competition from Louisville's Mallory Comerford, a gold medalist at the 2017 FINA World Championships.

Freshman Zachary Yeadon broke a pair of Rolfs Aquatic Center records in his collegiate dual meet debut, winning the 500 and 1000 freestyle in the process.

Other Irish individual double-event winners against the Cardinals were Justin Plaschka (50 freestyle and 100 butterfly), Lindsay Stone (500 and 1000 freestyle) and Rob Whitacre (100 and 200 backstroke). "Obviously this is a great win for both of our programs," Irish head coach Mike Litzinger said. "I'm truly happy with the total team effort that both groups put in. While there were some shining individual moments, the reality of it is our group works very hard. They rely on each other. Today was a perfect example of true team swimming."

Irish duo named ACC and national men's and women's Swimmers of the Week

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - The Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams both beat a top 10 team in a dual meet for the first time in school history on Saturday, dropping ACC rival No. 7/9 Louisville. A pair of swimmers who combined to win five individual events also made program history on Tuesday.

Freshman Zachary Yeadon and sophomore Abbie Dolan were named the national swimmers of the week on Tuesday for their respective genders -- both a first in Irish lore while also claiming matching ACC swimmer of the week accolades.

Dolan (Sunfish Lake, Minn.) won the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle events, while also adding a leg to the champion 400 freestyle relay team, to help guide the Notre Dame women to a convincing, 181.5-118.5, victory. Dolan's wins in the 100 and 200 freestyle came impressively over tight competition from Louisville's Mallory Comerford, a gold medalist at the 2017 FINA World Championships.

Yeadon (San Antonio, Texas) broke a pair of Rolfs Aquatic Center records which were previously held by Olympians in his collegiate dual meet debut, winning the 500 and 1000 freestyle in the process.

By swimming a 9:02.47 in the 1000 freestyle, Yeadon topped a 9:02.50 swam by Connor Jaeger of Michigan in 2013. Jaeger represented the United States in both the 2012 and 2016 Olympic Games, winning silver in Rio in the 1500 meters. With a 4:21.66 in the 500 freestyle, Yeadon beat out the pool record of 4:21.98 which had been set by Denver's Blake Worsley in 2009. Worsley represented his native Canada in the 2012 Olympics in London.

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. - The No. 14/10 Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams completed a historic month of October by claiming their second top-25 wins of the month on Friday afternoon as the men's team beat No. 23 Purdue, 169-131, and the Irish women beat No. 16 Purdue, 163-137, in West Lafayette.

Abbie Dolan led the charge for Notre Dame's women's team, winning three individual events as she touched the wall first in the 50, 100 and 200 freestyle competitions. Alice Treuth also claimed two wins for the Notre Dame women, topping the field in the 100 and 200 backstroke. Notre Dame added some hard-earned points in women's 1-meter diving behind Claire Andrews and Erin Isola's one-two punch.

On the men's side, the Irish had a trio of double individual winners in Aaron Schultz, Rob Whitacre and Zach Yeadon. Whitacre also swam the opening leg of the winning 200 medley relay team for Notre Dame while Schultz contributed to the 400 freestyle relay which took first place.

Both Notre Dame squads wrapped up their impressive Octobers at 4-1 overall, 2-0 in ACC competition, and laying claim to the highest team rankings in school history. The dual victories over the Boilermakers mark the second ranked wins of the year for each team, the others coming on Oct. 7 when Notre Dame claimed what is believed to be both teams' first ever top-10 wins, beating No. 7/9 Louisville at the Rolfs Aquatic Center.

BLOOMINGTON – A competitive tri-dual meet headed toward the final competition of the fall semester did little to slow down the University of Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams on Thursday. The No. 18 Irish women swept the day against No. 9 Indiana and Cincinnati, beating the host Hoosiers 123-120 and the Bearcats 205-38. The No. 13 Notre Dame men's squad added a spirited split, downing Cincinnati 182-61 while staying neck-and-neck with No. 1 Indiana in a 146-95 defeat.

On the men's side, Zachary Yeadon was a double-winner in both the 500 free (4:26.24) and 1000 free (9:05.21) events. Daniel Speers added a win in the 50 free, swimming a season-best time in competition of 20.22 for the race victory. Jack Montesi paced a 1-2 Notre Dame (5-2) finish in the 100 back by touching the wall in 49.16.

The Notre Dame (6-1) women's squad featured strong performances across the board in its meet sweep. The 'A' entry in the 200 free relay of Abbie Dolan, Rachel Wittmer, Katie Smith and Carly Quast clocked in at 1:32.08 to take the event win over host Indiana. Dolan and the Irish claimed the top-four spots in the 100 free, as the Notre Dame sophomore posted a 49.30 time for the race victory. Dolan was a double-winner individually after adding a title in the 200 free, notching a season-best with a time of 1:45.94. Erin Sheehan claimed a share of the top time in the 100 fly, swimming a season-best 54.27 to tie for first place. Lindsay Stone added a Notre Dame win in the 1000 free, clocking a winning time of 9:56.17.

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. – Complete team competition and effort allowed the University of Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams to take a day one lead at Florida State. More of the same followed for the No. 22 Irish on Saturday, as Notre Dame claimed a crucial Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) sweep over the No. 20/25 Seminoles by way of a 191-162 men's score and a 193-160 decision on the women's side at the Morcom Aquatics Center.

The Irish men's squad (7-2) rode six race victories and a pair of NCAA B-cut times to pull away from the 20th-ranked Seminoles on Saturday. Senior Rob Whitacre was a triple-winner for Notre Dame on the day, taking the 200 backstroke and 200 IM titles along with swimming in the triumphant 400 medley relay. Junior Tabahn Afrik added wins in the 100 free and with the 400 medley relay, while freshman Zach Yeadon swept the meet's distance events with an NCAA B-cut win in the 500 freestyle. Senior Joe Coumos completed the weekend diving double with a win off the 1-meter board.

The Notre Dame women's team (9-1) was vaulted ahead by three event wins and a number of point-earning swims to defend its sizeable lead from day one. Both junior Alice Treuth (200 backstroke) and sophomore Abbie Dolan (100 freestyle) posted Saturday victories for the Irish, while freshman Lindsay Stone put on another stellar performance in a 500 freestyle win.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. – Not wanting to rest on their laurels from a dynamic Friday performance to open the weekend, the University of Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams brought that same level of intensity to the final day of the 2018 Shamrock Invitational. Behind record times and NCAA B-cut qualification swims, the No. 22 Irish swept the Saturday invitational showcase on Senior Day at Rolfs Aquatic Center.

The Notre Dame men's squad scored 988.50 points to defeat No. 18 Ohio State (933.50 points) No. RV Iowa (691 points), Wisconsin (601 points) and Missouri State (409 points). NOTRE DAME, Ind. – With a successful weekend at the Shamrock Invitational in the rearview mirror for the University of Notre Dame men's and women's swimming and diving teams, the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) took notice of strong Irish performances in the water at the Rolfs Aquatic Center. Freshman Zach Yeadon was tabbed as the ACC Men's Swimmer of the Week, sophomore Abbie Dolan brought home ACC Women's Swimmer of the Week honors and senior Joe Coumos repeated as ACC Men's Diver of the Week on Tuesday.

The three weekly ACC citations pushed the Irish total to eight conference weekly accolades earned thus far in the 2017-18 season, with each athlete now a multi-time winner. Yeadon added Tuesday's award to his recognition as the top men's ACC swimmer on Oct. 10, Dolan has been the ACC's standout women's swimmer three times with Tuesday, Oct. 10 and Nov. 14 on her résumé, and Coumos brought home top ACC men's diver plaudits on Oct. 24 and Jan. 23 to go along with this week.

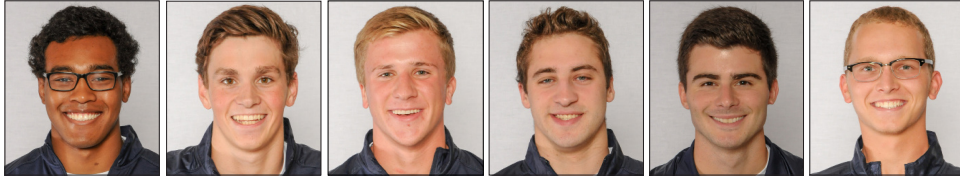

GREENSBORO, N.C. – An additional two silver medals and team records for the University of Notre Dame men's swimming and diving team added to the final Irish score line on Saturday at the 2018 Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) Swimming and Diving Championships. The No. 19 Irish scored 941 points over four days to place fourth at the conference championship meet inside the Greensboro Aquatic Pavilion.

Zach Yeadon re-established the Notre Dame program record in both the 1000 and 1650 freestyle on his way to his second runner-up finish of the meet, while Rob Whitacre placed second in the 200 backstroke by also lowering his own Irish team mark. The Notre Dame 400 freestyle relay of Tabahn Afrik, Justin Plaschka, Aaron Schultz and Daniel Speers added an NCAA A-cut to punch an Irish ticket to the 2018 NCAA Championships.

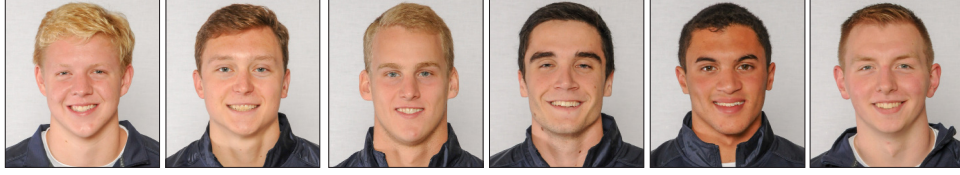

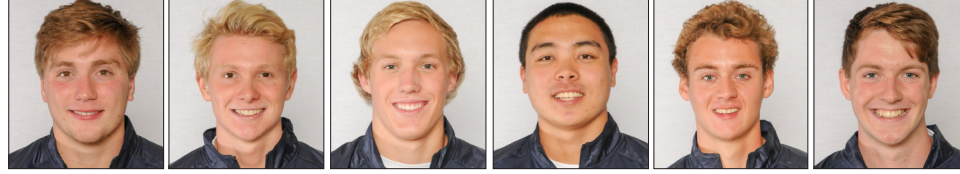

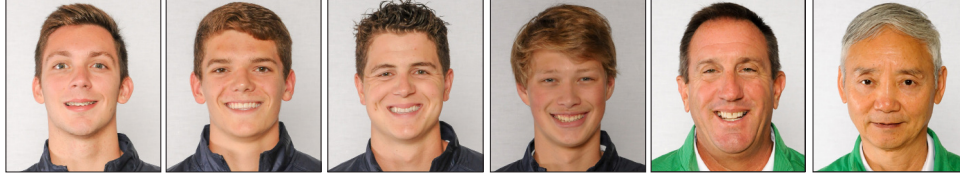
