Leading Off... Best Start Since 2002

At 9-4 and winners of four of their last five and five of their last seven games, the Spartans are off to their best start since the 2002 season when they went 11-2 to start the year. As a team, the Spartans have hit .311, while holding opponents to a conference best .273. Another reason for MSU's early season success has been its defense as it has committed just eight errors to its opponents total of 35.

MSU Meets Notre Dame For Three

Michigan State will be in South Bend, Ind., for a three-game set with Notre Dame, beginning with a doubleheader on Saturday at noon. Notre Dame enters the series at 7-8 on the year while MSU is 9-4. Friday's first game of the three-game set will be first meeting between the schools since 1998 - a game the Spartans won, 4-1. The Spartans lead the all-time series, 72-53.

Spartans Go 4-2 on Shortened Spring Trip

Despite having two games cancelled due to weather, th Spartans had a successfull spring trip by going 4-2. The Spartans defeated Southeast Missiouri State, twice, and ended the trip with consecutive wins over Samford and Jacksonville State. The Spartans put up at least seven runs in each of their four victories and outscored their opponents by an average of seven runs in all four wins.

Solid All Around

The major reason for the Spartans' strong start has been their play in all facets of the game. At the plate, MSU's .311 batting average (third), .442 slugging percentage (second) and .407 on-base percentage (second) all rank in the top three in the conference. The Spartan pitching staff is holding opponents to a conference-low .273 batting average. Defensively, the Spartans have committed just eight errors, four fewer than the next closest team in the Big Ten. Their .984 fielding percentage is tops in the league.

Felt Leadinig by Example

With a Big Ten-leading 19 RBIs, senior outfielder Bo Felt has been one of the Spartans' clutch hitters and major offensive forces this season. His .364 batting average is tied for tops on the team and he has had a hit in all but three games this season.

Achter Paces Pitching Staff

Junior pitcher A.J. Achter has settled into the role of No. 1 starter quite well so far this season. Through four starts, the righty leads the Spartan starters with an ERA of 2.49, which is ninth-best in the Big Ten. His 23 strikeouts are currently third best in the league.

Despite solid performances in his first three starts, it took Achter until his fourth game of the year to get his first win. Achter got plenty of run support as he went seven complete innings in the Spartans' 17-2 romp over Jacksonville State on March 11.

Young Infield Up to the Task

Through 13 games, the Spartan freshman trio of Torsten Boss, Andrew Carpenter and Ryan Jones have combined to start every game at second and third base. Carpenter, a redshirt freshman, has a team-high seven-game hitting streak this season and has made just one error in 11 starts at third base. Jones, also a redshirt freshman, has made eight starts at second base and is hitting .333 and has made just one error. Boss, a true freshman, has made a total of seven starts, including five at second base, and is currently hitting .286.

Spartan Bats Off to Much Better Start

The Michigan State offense is off to a far better start this season than in 2009. As a team, MSU is currently hitting .311, compared to last season when it was hitting under .250 through 13 games. The Spartans enter the weekend with six starters (Jonathan Roof, Bo Felt, Jeff Holm, Eli Boike, Brandon Eckerle and Ryan Jones) hitting .300 or better.

Wunderlich Named Big Ten Co-Pitcher of the Week

Junior Kurt Wunderlich was named Big Ten Co-Pitcher of the Week March 1 by the conference office. Wunderlich improved to 2-0 with a seven-inning shutout performance in MSU's 17-5 win over West Virginia. The right-hander struck out a career-high seven and limited the Mountaineers to just four hits and one walk.

The honor was the first of Wunderlich's career and he was the first Spartan to earn the honor since Nolan Moody (April 6) last season.

Carpenter Named to Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge All-Tournament Team

Redshirt freshman third baseman Andrew Carpenter earned a spot on the Big Ten/BIG EAST Challenge All-Tournament Second Team after going 6-for-13 with four RBIs and three runs scored. Carpenter drove in two runs in the Spartans' 5-3 win over Seton Hall and then two more in the 17-5 romp over West Virginia.

Roof Leads Spartans on Opening Weekend; Honored by Big Ten

Junior shortstop Jonathan Roof played a major role in the Spartans' opening weekend success as he went 7-for-11 with two homers, three RBIs and four runs scored in three games. For his efforts, he was named the Big Ten Player of the Week for the first time in his career and became the first Spartan to earn the award since Chris Roberts in May 2007. Roof went 3-for-5 in the season opener against Furman, including an RBI double. He then posted a pair of 2-for-3 performances that each included a solo home run against No. 15 Clemson and Miami (Ohio), respectively.

Defensively Sound

With a total of just eight errors through 13 games, the Spartans are the top fielding team in the Big Ten. MSU has gone errorless in seven of their 13 games this season. At this year's Big Ten/ BIG EAST Challenge, the Spartans went errorless in all three games, marking the first time they had done so since a three-game series at UNC Wilmington (2/27-28/09) last season.

Coach Boss Enters Year Two

MSU head coach Jake Boss Jr. enters his second season at the helm of the Spartan baseball program after taking the Green and White to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2004. Under Boss' direction in 2009, the Spartans won their most games at home (15) and matched their longest conference-game winning streak (7) in the past five seasons. The Spartans swept three Big Ten series in 2009 and took two of three games from intrastate rival Michigan for the first time since 2002.



Head Coach Jake Boss Jr. Second Season

Jake Boss Jr. was appointed the 16th head coach in Michigan State baseball history on July 1, 2008, and took little time making his mark on the program as in his first season he guided the Green and White to its highest Big Ten

finish and first trip to the Big Ten Tournament since 2004. A Lansing native with 18 years of coaching experience, including 14 at the collegiate level, Boss was named the 2008 Mid-American Conference Coach of the Year and led Eastern Michigan to the NCAA Regionals in his first year as a head coach. His successful season catapulted him to East Lansing, where he now directs the one program he has wanted to coach his entire career.

Under Boss' direction in 2009, the Spartans won their most games at home (15) and matched their longest conference-game winning streak (7) in the past five seasons. The Spartans swept three Big Ten series in 2009 and took two of three games from intrastate rival Michigan for the first time since 2002.

In just one season as head coach at EMU in 2008, Boss made an immediate impact, guiding the Eagles to their second consecutive MAC West Division crown and first NCAA Regional appearance since 2003. The Eagles swept through the MAC Tournament, winning all four games by a combined 21 runs, to notch the school's fourth tournament title. The conference title capped a remarkable turnaround, as Eastern Michigan - picked to finish fifth in the division - closed the season on a hot streak, claiming 25 of 40 games and earning a berth in the NCAA field.

For his efforts, Boss was selected the 2008 MAC Coach of the Year and made history by becoming just the second coach in league history to win the MAC Tournament and advance to the NCAA Tournament in his first season. Overall, the Eagles finished the season 15-8 in conference play and 25-34 overall. The Eagles were one of the top offensive teams in the MAC, ranking among the league leaders in hits (third with 615), home runs (fourth with 64), runs (fourth with 300) and RBI (fifth with 372).

Boss, who played baseball at Alma from 1989-93, earned his bachelor's degree in English in 1993. He completed his master's degree in physical education from Eastern Michigan in 2000.

Challenging Start

Similar to last season, the Spartans opened the 2010 campaign against tough opponents as they faced two teams that competed in last year's NCAA Tournament. MSU fell to traditional powers Clemson and Louisville earlier this season; the Spartans were scheduled to face Alabama but the game was cancelled due to rain. Last year, seven of the Spartans' first 13 games came against three teams (UNC Wilmington, Bethune-Cookman and Clemson) that competed in the NCAA Tournament the previous year.

Corcoran, Boike Named Co-Captains

Following last year's season-ending loss to Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament, seniors Kyle Corcoran and Eli Boike were elected captains for the 2010 campaign. Corcoran, a left-handed pitcher, saw action in 13 games last season and made eight mid-week starts. Boike, who is one of three returning starters in the outfield, is the Spartans' top-returning slugger as he hit .310 and drive in 36 a season ago.

Friendly Confines

The Spartans finished their 2009 home slate 15-4, giving them their most wins at home since the 2004 team won 21 games. MSU started the season a perfect 10-0 at home, its best since 2004 when it went 12-0 to start the year.

Spartans Get a New Home

McLane Baseball Stadium, which MSU opened on April 4, 2009, enhances one of the most pristine settings in college athletics and was made possible with the generous gift of Elizabeth and Drayton McLane who committed \$4 million toward the project. Drayton McLane earned his masters in food marketing management in 1959 from MSU and is currently Chairman and CEO of the Houston Astros. The Stadium was dedicated on May 2, 2009.

In the Spartans' opening game at McLane Baseball Stadium on April 4 in game one of a doubleheader with Northwestern, former Spartan Nolan Moody threw the first MSU no-hitter in over 16 years. Moody pitched brilliantly and carried a perfect game into the eighth inning before issuing a two-out walk. The East Lansing native received spectacular defense all day and got a double play to end the game in the ninth, giving MSU a 2-0 win.
