#3/#3 Notre Dame Travels To Western Michigan For Series With The Broncos At Lawson Arena

Irish take sole possession of first place in the CCHA after weekend sweep at Lake Superior; CCHA win streak reaches eight straight with victories over the Lakers.

Ryan Thang named CCHA rookie of the week for series versus the Lakers.

ALL ALONE AT THE TOP: The Notre Dame Fighting Irish return to action this weekend with a pair of games at Western Michigan on Jan. 19-20. Game time both nights at Lawson Arena is 7:35 p.m. Saturday's game will be televised live by Comcast Local with Ben Holden and Sean Ritchlin

calling all the action. The games can be seen in South Bend on Comcast's local access channel. Notre Dame enters the weekend with a 19-4-1 overall record and a 13-2-1 mark in the CCHA. The 27 points in league action puts Notre Dame in first place in the conference, two points ahead of the Miami RedHawks with two games in hand. The Irish have a six-point lead on third-place Michigan State with one game in hand and a seven-point lead on fourth-place Michigan. Notre Dame's sweep at Lake Superior State gives the Irish nine wins in their last 10 games going back to Dec. 2nd. Included in that streak are eight straight wins in CCHA play. Notre Dame moved up to third in both the USA Today/American Hockey Magazine and the USCHO.com/CSTV polls. Western Michigan is coming off a split last weekend with Miami as the Broncos lost the series opener on Friday, 5-3, then defeated the RedHawks, 5-3 on Saturday. Western Michigan is 8-12-1 overall and 7-9-1 in the CCHA. Notre Dame has 12 regular-season CCHA games left with six at home and six on the road.

IRISH VERSUS BRONCOS: The two teams have met 62 times in the all-time series with Western Michigan owning a 33-24-5 record. At Kalamazoo, the Broncos are 20-8-4 versus the Irish. The two teams split a home-and-home series last season with Western Michigan winning 4-3 at Lawson Arena and Notre Dame taking a 3-0 win at the Joyce Center. Three of the last four meetings in the series have come at Lawson Arena with the Irish going 1-1-1 in those three games. Notre Dame's last win at Lawson was on Nov. 13, 2004, a 3-2 victory.

THE REAL THANG: Freshman left wing Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.) was named the CCHA rookie of the week for his play in the weekend series at Lake Superior. Thang scored two goals and added an assist for three points in the Irish sweep. The two goals, one in each game, extended Thang's goal-scoring streak to four games, the longest for any Irish player this season. He is now fourth in scoring for the Irish with 13 goals and 10 assists for 23 points this season. Thang has been named rookie of the week twice (Nov. 13) this year.

HOBEY WATCH: Two Notre Dame players - goaltender David Brown (Sr., Stoney Creek, Ont.) and right wing Mark Van Guilder (Jr., Roseville, Minn.) – are among 40 players listed by the Hobey Baker Award website as candidate's for the prestigious honor. Phase one of - Vote For Hobey – is now underway. Fans now have the opportunity to select their favorite candidate for the list of top ten finalists on the new Hobey Baker Award website (www.hobeybaker.com). Fans may vote for one candidate at a time, but can vote multiple times per day. The standings will run concurrently on the Hobey Baker website. Voting in phase one will end on March 4. Phase two will begin on March 15 after the top ten finalists have been announced. To vote, visit the Vote For Hobey link on the Hobey Baker website, or just click on the Vote For Hobey button on the site's homepage. Brown comes into the Western Michigan series with an 18-3-1 record to go with a 1.76 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage. His 18 wins lead the nation while his goals against leads the CCHA and is second in the country. Brown's save percentage is second in the conference and 12th nationally. Van Guilder is in the midst of a career season as he leads Notre Dame with 13 goals with 12 assists for 25 points to rank third on the Irish in scoring. Brown is currently listed by Inside College Hockey.com as its leading candidate for the Hobey Baker Award while CSTV.com's Hobey Watch has Brown listed as second behind Miami's Nathan Davis.

LAKE SUPERIOR RECAP: The Irish traveled to Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., where they took a pair of wins from the Lakers, winning 4-3 in overtime on Jan. 12 and 4-1 on Jan. 13. In the series opener, Erik Condra (So., Livonia, Mich.) scored with 1:36 left in overtime to give Notre Dame a 4-3 victory. The overtime win was the first for the Irish since Dec. 10, 2004, a 3-2 win over Michigan State. The Irish scored first in the game with Evan Rankin (Jr., Portage, Mich.) scoring at 5:41 of the opening period for the only goal of the first period. In the second stanza, the team's traded four goals. Nik Sellers scored his third of the year at 3:58 when his centering pass went of a skate and deflected past David Brown (Sr., Stoney Creek, Ont.) to tie the game at 1-1. Ryan Thang put the Irish ahead 2-1 with his 12th goal of the season at 10:27. Laker defenseman Barnabas Birkeland tied the game at 2-2 with a power-play goal at 14:39. Notre Dame retook the lead at 16:51 when Jason Paige (Sr., Saginaw, Mich.) batted a Garrett Regan (Jr., Hastings, Minn.) centering pass out of the air past LSSU's Jeff Jakaitis for his eighth of the season and a 3-2 Irish lead. That edge would last for 57 seconds in the third period when the Lakers tied it on a Dan Eves goal. In overtime, Lake Superior got the first two shots of the period that Brown stopped. Defenseman Wes O'Neill (Sr., Essex, Ont.) blocked a shot in the slot and Condra picked it up and headed towards the Laker net. With Thang going hard to the net, Condra tucked a wrist shot from the top of the left wing circle inside the left post for the win. The Irish out shot Lake Superior 29-24 in the game. Brown finished with 21 saves while Jakaitis had 25. In Saturday's game, Notre

Dame scored the first three goals of the game on the way to a 4-1 win. Josh Sciba (Sr., Westland, Mich.) got the Irish on the scoreboard first with a power-play goal, his seventh goal of the season, at 11:12 of the first period. Condra made it 2-0 at 11:39 of the second period with a power-play goal, his 10th goal of the year. Thang scored his second goal of the weekend at 3:54 of the third to make it 3-0 with his 13th goal. With over seven-and-a half minutes left in the game, the Lakers pulled goaltender Jeff Jakaitis for a sixth attacker. The move worked at 14:11 of the period with John Scrymgeour scoring off a scramble in front. With the goaltender still on the bench, the Irish sealed the win when Regan scored into the open net for his ninth of the season at 18:02 for the 4-1 win. Notre Dame out shot the Lakers with a season-high 40 shots on goal while Lake Superior had 31. Brown finished with 30 saves in the game. The Irish killed 12-of-13 Laker power-play chances on the weekend.

CCHA WINNING STREAK: Notre Dame comes into the series at Western Michigan with an eight-game winning streak in the CCHA, the longest conference winning streak for the Irish in their 17 years (1981-83, 1992-07) in the league. The previous best win streaks were five games (Oct. 9-Oct. 23, 1998 and Feb. 9-Mar. 2, 2002).

SICK BAY: The Irish will be without the services of sophomore center **Christian Hanson** (**Venetia, Pa.**) for the series with Western Michigan. Hanson is sidelined with mononucleosis and is expected to miss three to four weeks of action.

CLUTCH SCORER: Sophomore Erik Condra made the most of his two goals at Lake Superior. Both of Condra's goals proved to be the game winners each night. His goal on Friday night came in overtime and was his third game winner. On Saturday, a second-period power-play goal proved to be the game winner. Condra now has a career-high 10 goals with four of them

winning games. His four game winners tie him with teammate **Ryan Thang** for the most in the CCHA and tie him for second in the nation. Condra now has 16 career goals with five of them game winners.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 4-3 overtime win at Lake Superior on Jan. 12 marked the third time this season that the Irish played overtime hockey. Notre Dame and Ohio State battled to a 1-1 tie on Nov. 4 after the Irish dropped a 3-2 overtime decision at Minnesota State on Oct. 14. The Irish are now 1-1-1 in extra time this year. The overtime win for Notre Dame was the first since Dec. 10, 2004 when the Irish defeated Michigan State, 3-2, at the Joyce Center. Since that game, Notre Dame was 0-4-7 in overtime. The last time that the Irish won an overtime game on the road was March 9, 2002, a 2-1 win at Nebraska-Omaha in the CCHA playoffs. In 56 overtime games since the start of the 1999-2000 season, the Irish are 8-7-41 in overtime.

IRISH VERSUS TOP 15-RANKED TEAMS: With a pair of wins last weekend over No. 15 Lake Superior State, Notre Dame ran its record to 8-1 versus ranked teams this season, including six in a row. The Irish are 4-1 on the road against ranked teams and 4-0 at home against the top ranked teams in the nation. The wins include two over #15/#15 Lake Superior (4-3 in ot and 4-1), #7/#7 Michigan (7-3 and 4-3), two against #14/#14 Alaska (3-1 and 6-2) and one each against #4/#4 Michigan State (4-1) and #1/#1 Boston College (7-1). The lone loss came at #4/#4 Michigan State (2-0). Last season, the Irish were 0-8-2 in games versus ranked teams.

ROAD SWEEPS: Notre Dame's weekend sweep at Lake Superior on Jan. 12-13 was the first CCHA road sweep for the Irish since Feb. 14-15, 2003 when they won a pair of games at Bowling Green.

ONE IS BETTER THAN TWO: Notre Dame's 19 wins this season are the most for the Irish since a 20-win season in 2003-04 when the Irish advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's history. The 19 wins are also more than the Irish combined to win in the last two seasons. In 2004-05, Notre Dame won five games and followed with a 13-win season a year ago for a two-season mark of 18 wins.

LATEST FOR FIRST: With a 13-2-1 record in the CCHA, Notre Dame find itself in first place in the CCHA standings, two points ahead of second-place Miami with two games in hand. This is the latest in the season that any Notre Dame team has been in first in the CCHA. The previous late date for the Irish to be in first place was Dec. 8, 2003 when the Irish were tied for first with Ohio State.

BETTER THAN LAST YEAR: With 94 goals in the first 24 games this season (3.92 goals-pergame), Notre Dame has already surpassed its goals scored from a year ago when the Irish had 89 goals in 36 games for a 2.47 goals-per-game average.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: Senior goaltender David Brown made the most of his one-game break (Jan. 7 vs. Robert Morris) by returning between the pipes for both games at Lake Superior and winning both contests to run his personal winning streak to nine straight games. Brown has not lost since Nov. 25 at Nebraska-Omaha. In his nine-game winning streak, Brown has a 2.21 goals-against average and a .906 save percentage. Overall, he has now appeared in 22 of Notre Dame's 24 games and has a 1.76 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage to go with an 18-3-1 record. The Hobey Baker candidate is first among CCHA goaltenders in wins (18) and goals-against average (1.76), second in save percentage (.927) and

third in minutes played (1,330:22). He ranks first nationally in wins, second in goals-against average, third in minutes played and 12th in save percentage. His .841 winning percentage is first in the CCHA and third nationally. Brown and the Irish defense are first in the nation, giving up just 1.79 goals-per-game (43 in 24 contests). The senior goaltender now has 43 career wins at Notre Dame to rank fourth on the all-time wins list. Brown has twice been named CCHA goaltender of the week this season (Oct. 23 and Nov. 6) and was also the all-tournament goaltender at the Lightning College Hockey Classic. This season, Brown has taken over Notre Dame's all-time top spot for career goals-against average (2.53), save percentage (.913) and shutouts (8).

THE KID LINE: Notre Dame's line of Ryan Thang, Kevin Deeth (Fr., Gig Harbor, Wash.) and Erik Condra (two freshmen and a sophomore) has been the team's top scoring trio this season. The threesome accounted for four goals and four assists for eight points in the weekend sweep at Lake Superior State. From the left side, Thang had two goals (ppg) and an assist, Deeth, at center, had two assists and Condra (RW) had a pair of goals (1 ppg, 2 gwg) and one assist. For the season the trio now has 34 goals and 48 assists for 82 points. Included in the 34 goals are 14 power-play goals, three short-handed goals and nine game winners. The three players are a combined +52. The trio ranks 1-2-3 in the CCHA in +/- with Condra (+19), Deeth (+18) and Thang (+15).

WILD THANG: Freshman Ryan Thang is fourth on the team in scoring with 13 goals and 10 assists for 23 points. His 13 goals tie him with Mark Van Guilder for the team lead in that category. Thang had two goals and one assist in each of the last two series with Robert Morris and Lake Superior. He ranks fourth among CCHA freshmen in scoring and was selected CCHA rookie of the week for the second time this season this past week. Thang's four game-winning goals tie him for first in the CCHA and are tied for second in the nation. Of Thang's 13 goals, five are via the power play, one came short-handed and four are game winners.

MAD HATTER: Freshman Kevin Deeth recorded his first career hat trick in the Jan. 5, 6-2 win over the Robert Morris. The hat trick was the third of the year for the Irish as Deeth joins Mark Van Guilder and Dan Kissel (Crestwood, III.) with three goal games. The last time the Irish had three hat tricks in a season was the 1991-92 campaign when they had four. Deeth is second on the team in scoring with 11 goals and 15 assists for 26 points. He is tied for the team lead with five power-play goals.

CONDRA CAPERS: Sophomore right wing Erik Condra has picked up where he left off as a freshman when he led the Irish in scoring (6g, 28a) as he again leads the team with 10 goals and 23 assists for 33 points. Condra scored two goals and added an assist in the sweep at Lake Superior with both his goals being game winners and now has four on the season. He recorded a careerhigh five-point game at Robert Morris on Jan. 5, the first five-point game by an Irish player since Dec. 20, 2000 when Brett Lebda '04 had five points (1g, 4a) in a 7-4 win at Nebraska-Omaha. Condra has four games this season with three or more points.

PLAYING IN HIS BACK YARD: Junior right wing Evan Rankin (Portage, Mich.) returns to the area that he grew up - Kalamazoo, Mich. - this weekend when the Irish face Western Michigan. Rankin often skated at Lawson Arena and owns a goal and an assist in four games against the Broncos. On the year, Rankin has three goals and three assists for six points in 17 games for the Irish.

ON A TEAR: Sophomore left wing **Garrett Regan** saw a seven-game point streak snapped on Jan. 5 at Robert Morris but wasted little time in starting a new streak as he has now scored in three straight games. Regan has points in 10 of Notre Dame's last 11 games (6g, 6a) and is now sixth on the team in scoring with career highs in goals (9), assists (7) and points (16). As a freshman, Regan had three goals and four assists for seven points in 30 games.

BACK WITH A BRONZE MEDAL: Notre Dame freshman defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) returned to the Irish lineup at Lake Superior State after missing four games while playing for the U.S. Junior National Team at the 2006-07 World Junior Championships in Sweden. Lawson, an alternate captain for the U.S. team, and his teammates collected a bronze medal in the tournament. Lawson picked up assists in each game versus the Lakers and is tied for first among Irish defensemen in scoring with two goals and 10 assists for 12 points. His +15 is tied for third on the Irish and in scoring among Irish defensemen with two goals and eight assists for 10 points. Lawson is the 10th Notre Dame player to be selected to the U.S. Junior National Team and the first since Rob Globke '04 and Brett Lebda '04 played for the 2001-02 team. Besides Globke and Lebda, the seven other Irish players to play in the world juniors are: Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77 and '78-'79), Ben Simon ('96-'97 and '97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98),

MR. STEADY: Junior center Mark Van Guilder continues to be Notre Dame's steadiest player as he is third on the team in scoring with 13 goals and 12 assists for 25 points and is sixth with a +12. The Hobey Baker Award candidate has been held off the scoresheet just nine times this season and he leads the Irish with eight multiple-point games on the year. Prior to the series with Alaska (Dec. 2-3), Van Guilder moved from center to right wing and responded with three goals against the Nanooks. His 13 goals are a career high, surpassing his eight goals of a year ago. The Roseville, Minn., native now has played in 98 consecutive games in his career.

THE LAST TIME: The last time the Irish won 19 games in a season was the 2003-04 campaign when they finished the year with a 20-15-4 record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. That team won its 19th game on March 12. Only once in the program's history have the Irish recorded 19 wins by the 24th game of the season. The first time came in the 1987-88 season when Notre Dame was 20-2-2 after 24 games on the way to a 27-4-2 record.

The last time the Irish were ranked as high as second before the week of Jan. 2, 2007, came during the 1976-77 season when they reached No. 2 on Jan. 31, 1977 and finished the season ranked third overall.

IRISH RANKING HISTORY: Notre Dame hasn't been ranked often in its 39-year hockey history. During the 1972-73 season, the Irish finished ranked fourth overall in the WMPL radio poll and were ranked for eight weeks during the year. That season, Notre Dame lost to Wisconsin in the WCHA finals. The following year (1973-74), the Irish opened the season ranked second (WMPL) and stayed as high as No. 2 through the first four weeks of the year before dropping out. In 1976-77, the Irish were ranked in the final seven weeks of the season, reaching as high as

No. 2 on Jan. 31, finishing the year ranked third in the WMPL radio poll. They lost to Minnesota in the WCHA playoffs in a total-goal series. Notre Dame would not be ranked again until October 26 of the 1981-82 season when they reached 10th but weren't ranked again. In 1998-99, the Irish spent 16 consecutive weeks (Oct. 19-Feb. 16) in both the *USA Today* and *USHCHO.com* polls, before falling out at the end of the year. In 2002-03, the Irish were ranked for one week and in 2003-04, they were ranked six weeks in total, including the final four weeks in a row to finish 12th in the *USA Today* Poll and 13th in the *USCHO.com* final polls.

PLAYING WITH THE LEAD: Through the first 24 games of the season, Notre Dame has played a total of 1453:09 minutes. In those 24 games, the Irish have trailed for just 150:54 minutes (or 10.4% of the time). On the year, the Irish have been in the lead or tied for 89.6% of the time or 1302:15 minutes. That breaks down to being tied for 479:49 minutes (33.0%) and leading 822:26 (56.6%).

SHARE THE WEALTH: Through the first 24 games of the season, all but two Notre Dame players - defensemen Wes O'Neill (Sr., Essex, Ont.) and Dan VeNard (Jr., Vernon Hills, Ill.) - have scored goals. Notre Dame has nine players with four or more goals so far this season led by Mark Van Guilder and Ryan Thang with 13 goals. Last season, in 36 games, the Irish had just eight players with four or more goals.

SCORING MACHINE: While the Irish own the best defense in the nation (1.79 goals per game), the Notre Dame offense has done its share to help the team to a 19-4-1 overall record. In 24 games, the Irish have recorded 94 goals for a 3.92 average per game to rank sixth in the country. The last time a Notre Dame team averaged 3.92 goals-per-game or better was the 1990-91 season when the Irish had 4.06 goals per contest.

A POOLEY HOMECOMING: Notre Dame associate head coach Paul Poolev made his fourth homecoming of sorts when the Irish visited Lake Superior (Jan. 12-13). He spent three seasons with the Lakers as an associate head coach to Jeff Jackson from 1991-94. During his tenure, the Lakers advanced to the NCAA finals three times, winning the national title in 1992 and 1994. Earlier this season, Pooley returned home to Ft. Wayne, Ind. on Dec. 30 when played Northern Michigan at Ft. Wayne. As a player, Pooley spent the 1986-87 season with the Ft. Wayne Komets, serving as a co-captain of the Western Division championship team that was 48-28-6. He was fourth in scoring with 28 goals and 44 assists for 72 points. In the fall (No0v. 3-4), he had his number as a player at Ohio State retired in a ceremony held on Sat., Nov. 4 when Notre Dame played at Ohio State. The Irish also played in October at Providence College, where Pooley was the head coach for 11 seasons. A 1984 graduate of Ohio State, Pooley is still the Buckeyes' all-time leading scorer with 114 goals and 156 assists for 270 points. A member of the CCHA's all-Decade Team for the 1980s, Pooley

was the CCHA player of the year in 1984 and a first team All-American as he led the nation in scoring with 32 goals and 64 assists for 96 points in 41 games. A three-time CCHA allacademic selection, Pooley was an Academic All-American in his senior year. He began his coaching career at Ohio State as an assistant before joining Jeff Jackson's staff at Lake Superior in 1992. Pooley became the head coach at Providence College in 1994 and was the there for 11 seasons where his teams compiled a 185-187-40 record, won one Hockey East title (1995-96) and advanced to the NCAA tournament twice (1996 and 2001). He was selected to the OSU Hall of Fame in 1994. He is the first Ohio State hockey player to have his number retired.

STREAKING IRISH: Notre Dame's 4-2 loss to Robert Morris on Jan. 7 snapped a seven-game winning streak, the longest for the Irish since Nov. 13 to Dec. 4, 1987. The Irish have now won nine of their last 10 games and 13 of their last 16 since Nov. 10. The Robert Morris loss also ended Notre Dame's eight-game home winning streak to start the season. That was the longest home win streak since Nov. 23, 1990 to Jan. 26, 1991 when that team was in the midst of a 12-game win streak. The Irish are now 8-1-0 at home this season.

IRISH IN NHL BUILDINGS:

Notre Dame's win at Mellon Arena on Jan. 5 improved the Irish to 3-0-0 this season in games played in buildings that host teams from the National Hockey League. In October, the Irish won a pair of games at the St. Pete Times Forum in Tampa, Fla., the home of the Tampa Bay Lighting, winning the Lightning College Hockey Classic with a 3-0 win over Army and a 2-0 win over Air Force on Oct. 27-28. Should Notre Dame advance to the CCHA Championship weekend, the Irish would play in a fourth NHL building - Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

FIRST-PERIOD GOALS: The Irish have given up just eight first-period goals this season while scoring 26 of their own. Notre Dame has scored the first goal of the game 19 times this year and is 15-3-1 in those games. Versus Michigan on Dec. 10, Notre Dame surrendered two goals in

the first period for the only time this season and trailed the Wolverines 2-1 after one period. Notre Dame is 13-2-0 when they lead after one period and 4-2-1 when tied after one period.

TURN THE PAIGE: Senior center Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.) is on pace to surpass his careerbest totals for goals, assists and points this season. Through the first 24 games this year, Paige has eight goals and five assists for 13 points. His previous best season came in 2003-04 when he had 10 goals and six assists for 16 points, all career highs. He recorded the second two-goal game of his career in the win over Michigan State on Nov. 17. His previous two-goal game came on Feb. 27, 2004, in his freshman year against Michigan. He has already surpassed his totals from last season (4g, 1a, 5pts). One of the top defensive forwards in the CCHA, Paige continues as Notre Dame's top face-off man winning 291-of-480 for a 60.6% success rate.

JUST JOSHING: Josh Sciba scored his seventh goal of the season at Lake Superior on Jan.13 in the 4-1 Irish win. He now has seven goals and 10 assists for 17 points to rank fifth on the team. Sciba had a career-best six-game point streak (2g, 5a) snapped in the 2-0 loss at Michigan State (Nov. 18). Nine of his points (4g, 5a) have come on the power play. For his career, Sciba now has 37 career goals with 19 of them coming with the man advantage.

KID STUFF: Notre Dame's freshman class continues to have an excellent rookie season. In the first 24 games, the freshmen have combined for 32 goals and 50 assists for 82 points, 12 power-play goals, three short-handed tallies, seven game-winning goals and are a combined +62. Leading the way is **Kevin Deeth (11g, 15a)** with 26 points. He is tied for the team lead with five power-play goals and is second in the CCHA among rookie scorers. Thang (13g, 10a) follows with 23 points. He now has five power-play goals and four game winners, which is tied for tops in the CCHA and second in the nation. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has two goals and 10 assists on the year and is tied for second on the team with Deeth with a +15. Fellow blueliner Brett Blatchford has ten points on one goal and nine assists and is +7. Left wing Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.) has four goals and three assists for seven points in 11 games. Christian Minella (1g, 3a) scored his first goal in his first game against Bowling Green and added a two-assists game versus Alaska for four points on the year. The freshman class has accounted for eight of Notre Dame's 19 game-winning goals (Thang - 4, Kissel - 2 and Blatchford and Deeth with one each).

FIRST-HALF NUMBERS: For the first 18 games of the 2006-07 regular season, Notre Dame had a 14-3-1 overall record. After 18 games a year ago, the Irish were 6-11-1 for an eight-game improvement this year. In the CCHA, Notre Dame is 9-2-1. That is a five-game improvement over last year's 4-7-1 league record. Notre Dame's +10-point improvement in the CCHA is the biggest among conference teams in the first half. The two closest improvements belong to Alaska and Michigan State as both of those teams enjoyed a +3-point improvement in the conference over last season.

At the break this season, the Irish have scored 70 goals while giving up just 28 for a +42 goal

differential (+2.33 goals per game). Last season after 18 games, the Irish scored 48 while giving up 61 for a -13 differential (-0.72 per game). This season, the Irish scored 22 more goals than a year ago while giving up 33 goals less than last season at the halfway point.

SPORTS ILLUSTRATED: The Notre Dame hockey program was featured – "Puck of the Irish," – in the Dec. 11 issue of *Sports Illustrated*. The story was written by Rick Lipsey and covers the fast start in the 2006-07 season by the Irish hockey program.

TWO-GOAL GAMES OR MORE: Scoring is definitely contagious. Through 24 games this season, the Irish have seen players score two or more goals in a game 12 times. Last season, Notre Dame had a total of seven multiple-goal games, including two hat tricks.

Mark Van Guilder - 3 times 10/12 - 2 vs. Minn. St. 10/20 - 3 at Boston College 12/3 - 2 vs. Alaska

Ryan Thang - 2 times 10/20 - 2 at Boston College 11/10 - 2 vs. Bowling Green

BLATCHFORD BITS: Freshman defenseman Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.) has seen action in 15 games for the Irish and already has one goal and nine assists for 10 points. Versus Michigan, on Dec. 8, Blatchford had a career-high three assists, including an assist on Josh Sciba's second-period game-winning goal. He is fourth among Notre Dame defensemen in scoring and is tied fourth among freshmen on the scoresheet.

SAWATSKE FOR TWO: Senior defenseman Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.) recorded the first two-point game (1g, 1a) of his collegiate career in the 7-3 win over Michigan on Dec. 8. Prior to that game, Sawatske, who played the first two years of his career at Wisconsin, had one point in a game 19 times in 100 career games. He followed that goal with a goal on Dec. 30 in Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Northern Michigan.

TOP 10 MEETINGS: Notre Dame's weekend series (Dec. 8 and 10) with #7/#7 Michigan marked the second time in the two program's histories that both teams were ranked in the nation's top 10 when they faced each other. The only other time came on Jan. 30, 1999 when the 10th-ranked Irish faced fifth-ranked Michigan at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame won the game, 3-2. Already this season, the Irish have played one series - Michigan State, Nov. 17-18 - where both teams were ranked in the top 10. Over the program's history, Notre Dame has played in 32 games when both teams were top-10 teams. Here's a look at the record in those games.

YOST BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 7-3 win on Dec. 8 at Yost Arena snapped an eight-game Michigan winning streak versus the Irish that covered the 2004-05 and 2005-06 seasons. The win was just the first for the Irish at Yost since Nov. 23, 2002 and snapped a five-game Michigan home winning streak. Since a 9-5 Notre Dame win at Yost on Oct. 22, 1982, the Irish have won just three times at Yost (3-23-1).

LUCKY SEVEN: The seven goals scored by the Irish on Dec. 8 in the 7-3 win versus Michigan were the most scored by the Irish against the Wolverines since Oct. 22, 1982 in a 9-5 Notre Dame win at Yost Arena. In that 54-game span, the Irish scored six goals once and five three times, with Michigan winning 42 times, Notre Dame eight, with four ties.

SCORING DEFENSE: The last Irish defenseman to get in the goal-scoring column on the scoresheet came on Dec. 30 when **Tom Sawatske** recorded his second goal of the year in the 4-3 win over Northern Michigan. The Irish defense now has seven goals and 52 assists on the season. Kyle Lawson (2g, 10a), Noah Babin (Sr., Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.) with one goal and 11 assists and Wes O'Neill (Sr., Essex, Ont.) with 12 assists lead the defensemen with 12 points. Freshman **Brett Blatchford** is fourth with a goal and nine assists for 10 points while Sawatske has two goals and two assists. Dan VeNard (Jr., Vernon Hills, Ill.) has four assists and Brock Sheahan (Jr., Lethbridge, Alb.) has a goal and four assists for the year.

POWER-PLAY PRODUCER: Wes O'Neill has recorded 12 assists this season. He has led Irish defensemen in scoring in each of the last three seasons. So far this season, seven of his 12 assists have come on the power play. For his career, O'Neill has scored 10 goals and 31 assists on the power play. In 136 all-time games, the veteran defenseman has 14 goals and 55 assists for 69 career points.

IRISH ADD SEVEN: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** has announced that seven players have signed national letters-of-intent to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2007. The group of seven is made up of one goaltender, two defensemen and four forwards. The goaltender is Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.), who is currently a member of the USA Under-18 team as are the two defensemen. Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.) and Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.). All four forwards are currently playing in the USHL. Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden) is a member of the Cedar Rapids RoughRiders while Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.) plays for the Waterloo Black Hawks. Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden) is with the Tri-City Storm and Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.) is in his second year with the Des Moines Buccaneers. Bergman and Ridderwall are the first two Swedish players to play at Notre Dame. Ridderwall and Maday were midget teammates last season with the Chicago Chill. All seven of Notre Dame's recruits for the 2007-08 season are ranked in the National Hockey League's Central Scouting Mid-term Rankings. Phillips is ranked fourth among 30 North American goaltenders and is the highest rated goaltender who will attend college. Leading the skaters is Ruth who is ranked 34th among 210 North American skaters. He is followed by Ryan (50th), Bergman (97th), Ridderwall (109th), Cole (113rd) and Maday (177th).

FIRST TIMER: Freshman right wing Christiaan Minella (Aurora, Colo.) had to wait until the 10th game of the season to see his first collegiate hockey action but wasted little time making the most of it. Minella scored his first collegiate goal on his first shot at 9:04 of the first period to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. The last Notre Dame player to score on his first career shot was Tim Wallace '06 who did it on Oct. 11, 2002 at Minnesota-Duluth. The hard-hitting right wing added his first career assist in the 4-1 win over Michigan State and then had a pair of assists on Dec. 3 in the 6-2 win over Alaska.

TOURNEY HONORS: Three members of the Irish hockey team were selected to the Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team: goaltender David Brown, defenseman Brock Sheahan (Jr., Lethbridge, Alb.) and center Christian Hanson. Hanson was named the tournament's most valuable player as he scored a goal in each game, including the game winner in the championship game versus Air Force.

BY THE CLASSES: The 26-man Notre Dame hockey roster is made up of eight seniors, five juniors, five sophomore and eight freshmen. The eight seniors are the only remaining Irish players who were on the 2003-04 team that advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's history.

BACK-TO-BACK: The Irish recorded back-to-back hat tricks in the games at Boston College and Providence. In the 7-1 win on Friday night, Mark Van Guilder picked up the second, threegoal game of his career. The following night, Dan Kissel scored three times in the 6-1 win over the Friars. That marked the first time since Feb. 7-8, 1992 that Irish players recorded hat tricks in back-to-back games. On Feb. 7, 1992, Lou Zadra had three versus Western Michigan in a 10-4 loss. The following night, Sterling Black scored three times in a 7-5 loss at Western Michigan.

BEATING THE BEST: Notre Dame has defeated the No. 1 ranked team nine times in the program's 39-year history. Each of the last three times have come at the expense of the Boston College Eagles ('03-'04, '04-'05 and '06-'07). Here's the list of Irish wins versus top-ranked teams in the 39-year history of the program.

FOR OPENERS: With the 6-1 win on Oct. 12 versus Minnesota State, the Irish improved to 20-17-2 in the opening game of the season. The home win gave Notre Dame a 21-17-1 record in home openers. The 3-2 overtime loss on Oct. 14 dropped the Irish to 14-22-3 in road openers. Last season, the Irish dropped both the road opener (3-1 at Colorado College) and the home opener (5-3 to Princeton).

MINNESOTA MAGIC: Notre Dame's five Minnesota natives had strong weekends in the home-and-home weekend with Minnesota State. Junior Mark Van Guilder had two goals and one assist in the 6-1 win on Thursday. Sophomore Garrett Regan had two goals in the 6-1 win against the Mavericks. Freshman Ryan Thang had a goal and an assists in the season opener. Seniors Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.) was +1 on the weekend and T.J. Jindra (Faribault, Minn.) was even. An adopted son, Kevin Deeth who played two years of prep hockey at Shattuck St. Mary's (Faribault, Minn.), also had two goals and an assist in two games versus MSU.

PREMIER PUCKSTOPPER: Senior goal-tender David Brown is off to a fast start in 2006-07. He is 16-3-1 on the year with a stingy 1.74 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage. Of the 35 goals he has given up, 24 have come at even strength. Ten have come via the power play and one was short-handed. Brown stopped 36-of-37 shots he faced in the season-opening win versus Minnesota State. That marked the 13th time in Brown's career that he has made 35 or more saves in a game. Notre Dame is 6-6-1 in those games.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing T.J. Jindra (Faribault, Minn.) will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the second consecutive season. Jindra becomes the first Irish player to serve as captain twice since Evan Nielsen '03 held the responsibility from 2001-03. There have been 14 players to serve as two-time captains with the Irish. Joining Jindra as alternate captains in '06-'07, are senior center Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.) and senior defensemen Wes O'Neill (Essex, Ont.) and Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.). Paige has served as an alternate captain since his sophomore year. O'Neill and Sawatske will be alternate captains for the first time at Notre Dame.

DROP THE PUCK: For the second season in a row, the Irish hockey team opened the season with their annual "Drop The Puck Dinner" that was held on Oct. 11 at the Joyce Center. Former Pittsburgh Penguin coach and current Chicago Blackhawk TV analyst Ed Olczyk served as guest speaker and over 400 Irish hockey fans attended. The first dinner occurred on Sept. 6, 2005 with over 400 fans in attendance and Scotty Bowman serving as guest speaker. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, was also invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weis to address his team at practice on Sept. 6, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) and Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.) – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward Kirt Bjork (*83) who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - Sean Regan - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

ROOKIE SUCCESS: Sophomore right wing Erik Condra led Notre Dame in scoring last season with six goals and 28 assists for 34 points. He became the first Notre Dame freshman to lead the team in scoring since Jamie Ling '96 led the 1992-93 team with 40 points in his first season. He would go on to lead the Irish in scoring four straight seasons. Condra was selected as Notre Dame's rookie of the year and was selected to the CCHA's all-rookie team. He led all CCHA freshmen in scoring and was seventh in the nation among rookie point scorers.

CCHA SCHOLAR-ATHLETE: Senior Jason Paige (Saginaw, Mich.) was Notre Dame's representative on the CCHA Scholar-Athlete team for the 2005-06 season. Paige was one of 12 players (one from each school) selected to the team by the league's faculty representatives. Paige has a 3.71 grade-point average in finance. He follows former Irish captain, Cory McLean ('05), who was selected as the CCHA's first-ever Scholar-Athlete of the Year award winner following the 2004-05 season. McLean was a five-time Dean's List selection and graduated with a degree in Finance from the Mendoza College of Business with a 3.592 grade-point average. To be considered for the CCHA Scholar-Athlete Award, a player had to have a cumulative GPA of 3.25 through the fall term of the selection year to receive the school's Scholar-Athlete award. The award is selected by the 12 faculty representatives, voting based on a system awarding five points for a first-place vote, three points for a second-place vote and one point for a third-place vote. Previously, the CCHA honored an all-Academic team that saw the Irish have at least one honoree in all but one season (2002-03) since their return to the CCHA in '92-'93. The nine first-team selections were: Curtis Janicke and Carl Picconatto ('92-'93), Garry Gruber ('95-'96), Steve Noble ('96-'97, '97-'98), Forrest Karr and Aniket Dhadphale ('98-'99), Andy Jurkowski (99'-'00), Dan Carlson (2000-01), David Inman (2001-02) and Rob Globke (2003-04). During that 12year span, only Western Michigan (14) produced more CCHA All-Academic selections than Notre Dame's 11.

TURNAROUND YEAR: A year ago, the Notre Dame hockey team turned in a 13-19-4 record in Jeff Jackson's first season behind the bench. A closer look at the mark shows vast improvement for the Irish. Through the first 13 games of the season, Notre Dame was 3-9-1. Over the remaining 23 contests, the Irish were 10-10-3. In CCHA play, Notre Dame went from 3-20-5 in '04-'05 to 11-13-4 in '05-'06, a 15-point improvement from one season to the next. Only Miami's 16-point improvement in the standings was better than Notre Dame's 15-point turnaround.

IRON MAN: Graduated right wing **Tim Wallace** (Anchorage, Alaska) finished his Notre Dame career in 2005-06 as the Notre Dame's all-time 'Iron Man." Wallace played in every game of his career, 153 in all. He finished third on the all-time games played list for his four seasons with the Irish. Junior center **Mark Van Guilder** (Roseville, Minn.) is next in line as he now has played in every game in his first two-plus seasons for a total of 94 consecutive games.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame sophomore Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.) is the sixth Irish player whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, Dave Hanson, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar

with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have four players on the 2006-07 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, sophomore right wing Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.) was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators. He is joined by freshman defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall. Condra and Lawson are joined by senior defenseman Wes O'Neill (Essex, Ont.) who was chosen in the fourth round of the 2004 Entry Draft, 115th overall by the New York Islanders. Also selected in 2004 was senior goaltender David Brown (Stony Creek, Ont.) who went in the eighth round, 228th overall to the Pittsburgh Penguins.

PLAYING IN THE NHL: At times during the 2005-06 season, Notre Dame had five former players in the NHL at the same time. The five were: Ben Simon '00 (Columbus), Rob Globke '04 (Florida), Brett Lebda '04 (Detroit), Mark Eaton (Nashville) and Yan Stastny (Edmonton-Boston). Only one other time, have the Irish had five players in the NHL in one season. That came during the 1982-83 campaign when the Irish had five players see time, in the NHL. That group included: Jim Brown '82 (three games with Los Angeles), Jack Brownschidle '77 (72 games with St. Louis), Jeff Brownschidle '81 (four games with Hartford), Don Jackson '78 (71 games with Edmonton) and Dave Poulin '82 (two games with Philadelphia). As of Jan. 9, Eaton (Pittsburgh) and Lebda (Detroit) are skating with their NHL teams. Eaton is out for 10-12 weeks with a dislocated wrist.

HOMETOWNS: The 2006-07 Notre Dame hockey team features players from eight states and two Canadian provinces - Alberta and Ontario. Over the past 12 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Wisconsin, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. This season, the Irish have their first-ever player from the state of Washington – freshman Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor).

RIVALRY CLUSTERS: The CCHA begins its fifth season with the 12 teams grouped in "rivalry pairings." In the pairings, Notre Dame is paired with Bowling Green. The league's other pairings include Michigan-Michigan State, Miami-Ohio State, Lake Superior State-Northern Michigan, Ferris State-Western Michigan and Alaska Fairbanks-Nebraska-Omaha. Each season the teams are divided into three, four-team clusters and play a 28-game conference schedule. Cluster teams will face each other four times during the season with two games against each of the remaining eight teams. In 2006-07, Notre Dame will play Bowling Green, Alaska and Nebraska-Omaha four times with two games at home and two away. The Irish will also play home-and-home series with Michigan and Michigan State. Notre Dame hosts two-game home series with Miami, Northern Michigan and Ferris State while playing two-game road series at Lake Superior, Ohio State and Western Michigan. Last year, the Irish were 4-5-3 against Bowling Green, Ohio State and Miami, the three teams in their cluster.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM:

Notre Dame's current roster includes six players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 16 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes seniors Noah Babin (Palm Beach Gardens, Fla.), Michael Bartlett (Morton Grove, Ill.), Tom Sawatske (Duluth, Minn.) and Josh Sciba (Westland, Mich.). The lone sophomore is goaltender Jordan Pearce (Anchorage, Alaska) while defenseman Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.) represents the freshman class. Other former NTDP players who played at Notre Dame and their years in the national program include: Brett Henning (1997-98), Michael Chin (1997-98), Connor Dunlop (1997-99), Paul Harris (1997-99), John Wroblewski (1997-99), Neil Komadoski (1998-2000). Brett Lebda (1998-2000), Rob Globke (1998-2000), Derek Smith (2000-01) and Tim Wallace (2002-06).
