BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. MOUNTAINEERS

1	Notre Dame was the only Associated Press Top 25 team to begin the 2017-18 season on the road and on an opponent's home court. Texas A&M, West Virginia and UCLA all began the season away from home, but on a neutral court.
2	A Basketball Times panel, combined with five different rankings criteria, recently named Notre Dame the second-best men's basketball program in the country. See page 5 for more details.
6	The run to the ACC Championship game last season improved Notre Dame's ACC tournament record to 6-3 since joining the league for the 2013-14 campaign. Only Duke (8-3), North Carolina and Virginia (both 7-3) have better records in the league tournament over the past four seasons.
7	Notre Dame won seven NCAA tournament games over the past three seasons, matching the 1976-79 teams for the most over a four-year stretch in the program's history.
8	At one point in the second half at DePaul, Notre Dame connected on eight consecutive three-point field goals, keying the game-winning run. The Irish eventually finished 9-of-12 from behind the arc in the second half of the victory (the 75% three-point shooting a best-of-the-Brey-era mark in a second half).
10.1	The 2016-17 rebounds-per-game average for All-American Bonzie Colson , which led the ACC and finished 17th in the country. Colson also led the ACC in overall double-doubles (19) and 10-rebound performances (20).
11.5	Senior Matt Farrell finished the 2016-17 season with a 14.1 ppg scoring average, improving his scoring output 11.5 points from the 2015-16 season. That improvement ranks 17th all-time for ACC players.
21	Sophomore T.J. Gibbs led Notre Dame to a victory at DePaul with a career-high 21 points in a career-best 38 minutes of action.
27	Senior Matt Farrell has connected on at least one three-point field goal in 27 consecutive games, the longest streak of any ACC player entering the 2017-18 season. Shooting 5-for-9 at DePaul, Farrell moved his career three-point field goal average to .405.
43	Victories in four years of ACC play for Notre Dame (10.8 per season). Only Virginia, North Carolina and Duke have more regular-season ACC wins during that same span.
82	Program-record number of victories over the past three seasons for the Irish.
701	Career rebounds for Bonzie Colson, the 12th Irish player to reach the 1,200-point, 700-rebound career plateau.

Mike Brey is closing in on the all-time wins record at Notre Dame, needing 11 more victories to establish a new school record.

NOTRE DAME AND MOUNT ST. MARY'S MEET IN MAUI INVITATIONAL REGIONAL GAME

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team will begin its 2017-18 home schedule and start the 2017 Maui Jim Maui Invitational on Monday, Nov. 13, taking on Mount St. Mary's (0-1) at Purcell Pavilion (9,149). Game tip off is set for 7:00 p.m. ET.

Mount St. Mary's suffered its first loss of the season at Marquette on Friday, Nov. 10, its first game of the Maui Invitational. The Mountaineers will face North Florida at Wofford on November 18th and York on November 21 to cap its regional game slate.

While the statistics for Monday night's game will not be counted toward the tournament games held in Maui next week, the game outcome record for both teams will be reflected in its final tournament record at the end of the Maui Invitational.

NOTRE DAME EARNS ANOTHER ARENA DEDICATION GAME IN STATE OF ILLINOIS

Notre Dame's season-opening 72-58 victory at DePaul on Saturday, November 11, marked the dedication game of Wintrust Arena in downtown Chicago. The win marked Notre Dame's second consecutive victory in an arena dedication game in the state of Illinois, as the Irish defeated Illinois 84-79 in the State Farm Center dedication on Dec. 2, 2015 (also a part of the ACC-Big Ten Challenge that season).

The Irish have now participated in the opening of five arenas on the road in program history. Here is a list of those contests, which also includes the Joyce Center/Purcell Pavilion dedication game with UCLA in 1968.

Saturday was not the first dedication that has taken place during a Notre Dame - DePaul game. On December 14, 2003, the Irish and Blue Demons met at Allstate Arena for the dedication of Ray and Marge Meyer Court - honoring the Hall of Fame DePaul coach and former Irish basketball team captain. Notre Dame won that meeting 82-69.

Also on January 29, 1934, Notre Dame was part of the first college basketball doubleheader ever played in Madison Square Garden. The Irish lost to NYU 18-26, while St. John's lost to Westminster 37-33 in front of 16,138 fans.

SEASON OPENERS

Notre Dame is now 18-0 all-time in season openers during the Mike Brey era (2000-01 to present) after debuting the season on the road for the first time under Brey last Saturday at DePaul.
Historically, the Irish are 95-18 (.841) in season openers.
Notre Dame as the only Associated Press Top 25 team to begin the 2017-18 season on an opponents team court this season.

HOME OPENERS

Notre Dame is 17-0 in home opening games under Mike Brey (since 2000-01). The Irish have outscored their opponents 83.3 - 55.3 on average in those 17 victories. The 2017-18 season marks the first time that the Notre Dame home opener is not the first game of the season, as the Irish defeated DePaul 72-58 on Saturday, Nov. 11, at Wintrust Arena in Chicago, Illinois.

COLSON A CONSENSUS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Bonzie Colson, the top returning rebounder and second-leading returning scorer in the ACC, has been named a 2016-17 Preseason All-American by a majority of the publications and websites that cover college basketball. The Associated Press, Sports Illustrated, The Sporting News, The Athletic and Blue Ribbon Yearbook all placed Colson on their preseason first team.

In addition, Colson was named the preseason national player of the year by the Blue Ribbon Yearbook and the ACC Preseason Player of the Year.

COLSON NAMED TO ASSOCIATED PRESS PRESEASON ALL-AMERICA TEAM

The Associated Press has announced its 2017-18 Preseason All-America Team and senior forward Bonzie Colson was the second-leading vote getter on the five-person team. Colson is a consensus preseason All-American for the 2017-18 season after averaging 17.8 points and 10.1 rebounds per game in 2016-17.

NOTRE DAME ENTERS SEASON 14th IN BOTH NATIONAL POLLS

The Irish enter the 2017-18 season with their highest preseason national poll rankings since the 2008-09 season. Both the Associated Press and USA Today/Coaches Poll have Notre Dame ranked 14th in their respective preseason rankings.

This marks the 22nd time Notre Dame has appeared in the AP preseason poll, tied for the 12th best in the history of the listing dating back to 1949. The Irish, Michigan State and Oklahoma have all been ranked in the preseason poll 22 times, with the Irish average of 12.59 and highest preseason ranking of third in 1979.

Notre Dame has been either ranked or receiving votes in 11 of 18 AP polls in the Mike Brey era, including four of the last five seasons. Notre Dame entered the 2008-09 season ranked ninth in each poll.

NOTRE DAME PICKED THIRD IN ACC PRESEASON POLL

The University of Notre Dame men's basketball team has been selected to finish third in the Atlantic Coast Conference for the 2017-18 season. The poll was conducted as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25.

The third-place preseason team poll position marks the high mark for the Irish in the ACC (Notre Dame joined the league for the 2013-14 season) and highest preseason conference mark since the 2012-13 team was selected to finish third in the BIG EAST Conference. The third-place recognition matches the top preseason conference ranking in program history. The Irish also were selected to finish third in the BIG EAST in 2003-04.

The preseason poll also points out just how difficult the ACC schedule will be for the Irish this season. Notre Dame is the only conference school with road games at Duke (1st), North Carolina (2nd) and Virginia (6th).

BONZIE COLSON NAMED ACC PRESEASON PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Senior forward Bonzie Colson was overwhelmingly voted as the Atlantic Coast Conference Preseason Player of the Year as part of the league's annual media day activities in Charlotte, North Carolina, on Wednesday, October 25. Colson, who led the league in rebounding (10.1) during the 2016-17 season and finished ninth in scoring (17.8), received 49 of the 69 possible votes for the preseason player of the year nod. He was the lone ACC player to average a double-double per game last season.

Colson is the first Notre Dame player to earn a preseason conference player of the year award since Luke Harangody repeated as the BIG EAST preseason player of the year in 2008-09 and 2009-10. Colson also joins Jerian Grant (2013-14, 2014-15) and Demetrius Jackson (2015-16) as Irish players selected to the preseason all-ACC team.

Other previous Notre Dame preseason conference player of the year selections include Pat Garrity (BIG EAST, 1997-98) and Troy Murphy (BIG EAST, 2000-01). Murphy ended up earning the BIG EAST Player of the Year award at the end of the 2000-01 campaign.

Colson was also named to the Preseason All-ACC First Team.

A SEASON OF MILESTONES AHEAD FOR MIKE BREY

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey is poised to reach three key milestones in his coaching career this season. Brey is 11 wins away from becoming the all-time wins leader at Notre Dame (383 current, 393 is the record). Brey is 17 wins away from 400 at Notre Dame, which would make him the 13th active coach to have 400 wins at his current school. Brey is 18 wins away from 500 in his coaching career, on pace to become the 31st active coach to reach 500 career wins. Should Brey reach the 500-win barrier, he will join Mike Krzyzewski, Jim Boeheim, Roy Williams, Greg Kampe, Tony Shaver, Tom Izzo, Fran Dunphy, Bob McKillop, Jay Wright and Mark Few as the only current coaches to win 500 or more games while coaching at just one or two schools.

COLSON LEADS ACC IN REBOUNDING IN HISTORIC FASHION

Senior forward Bonzie Colson has been labeled as 'under-sized,' due to his listed 6-6 height measurement. The New Bedford, Massachusetts, native does boast a 7-2 wing span, however, which helped the Irish captain lead the ACC in rebounding at 10.1 per game.

Colson became the shortest ACC player to lead the league in rebounding since South Carolina's Grady Wallace grabbed 14.4 rebounds per game in 1957 - a span of 60 years.

Since 1958 (Pete Brennan, North Carolina) Colson is the only player under 6-7 to lead the ACC in rebounding.

Colson also became the second consecutive Notre Dame player to lead the ACC in rebounding, joining Zach Auguste (10.7 in 2015-16).

BREY AMONG THE BEST IN CRUNCH TIME

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey was recently declared the second-best 'crunch time' college basketball coach by The Athletic's Ken Pomeroy. Using his win probability model, Pomeroy assessed a coach's ability to make halftime adjustments. He looked at every game coached over the past eight seasons to determine if a team won more games than it should have based on its halftime win probability.

Here are the top five on the list for post-halftime performance (minimum 150 games, win percentage is relative to expectation).

617 AND COUNTING

Notre Dame has made at least one three-pointer in 617 straight contests dating back to the 1998-99 campaign. The Fighting Irish have made at least one three pointer during every game of the Mike Brey era. The last time an Irish team failed to hit a three-pointer in a game was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on Jan. 12, 1999. Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in that contest.

BASKETBALL TIMES PROCLAIMS NOTRE DAME ONE OF THE TOP PROGRAMS IN THE NATION

The Basketball Times, utilizing a blue ribbon panel and five different ranking criteria, named Notre Dame the second-best college basketball program in the nation on November 1, 2017. With input from a panel of basketball writers, the five criteria - winning percentage over the past 10 years, NBA players, the federal graduation rate of the last four-year class, the U.S. News and World Report analysis of best colleges (graduation rate with perceived value of a diploma) and program cleanliness, the Irish finished with an average of 9.3, behind Duke and ahead of Wisconsin (9.5), Gonzaga (10.2) and Villanova (10.5).

The Basketball Times also ranked head coaches across the country, with Mike Brey taking up the fourth spot in a ranking of 35 coaches.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

The 2016-17 season marked the most significant shake up of Mike Brey's staff at Notre Dame, when Martin Ingelsby accepted the head coaching position at Delaware while Anthony Solomon moved to an assistant position at Georgetown (he is now currently at Dayton).

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 standout shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

MIKE BREY, HEAD COACH

18th Season at ND | George Washington '82 | Career Record: 482-239 | ND Record: 383-187



In 17 seasons as the men's basketball coach at the University of Notre Dame, Mike Brey has guided the Fighting Irish to 382 victories and is poised to become the all-time winningest coach in the history of the program during the 2017-18 season.

The Irish are enjoying a recent stretch of success that ranks among the best in the 112-year history of basketball under the Golden Dome. Notre Dame was the only school in the nation to make back-to-back appearances in the NCAA Championship Elite Eight at the end of the 2015 and 2016 seasons, claimed an Atlantic Coast Conference title in 2015 and has made two ACC title game appearances in four years of ACC competition.

Brey was named head coach at Notre Dame on July 14, 2000. In his first season with the Irish, his team claimed the 2001 BIG EAST West Division championship and returned to the NCAA Championship for the first time in 12 seasons. Notre Dame soon became a regular in the NCAA tournament by making 12 appearances in 17 seasons with Brey on the sidelines.

In 2011, Brey was the recipient of both the Associated Press and the Henry Iba/USBWA National Coach of the Year award. He was named BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 2007, 2008 and 2011 and three of his players have been named BIG EAST Player of the Year.

Before arriving at Notre Dame, Brey was the head basketball coach at the University of Delaware, where he compiled a 99-52 mark from 1995-2000 and won America East Co-Coach of the Year honors in 1998. Prior to his time at Delaware, he was an assistant coach at Duke University. During his eight years at Duke, the Blue Devils advanced to the Final Four six times and won back-to-back national championships in 1991 and 1992.

Brey graduated from George Washington University in 1982. He played for and coached with legendary high school coach Morgan Wootten at DeMatha High School.

Brey serves on the Coaches vs. Cancer National Council and has helped raise over two million dollars for the organization. He has also partnered with the American Heart Association to create the Men of Heart initiative, raising funds and awareness for men's heart health. Brey is on the National Advisory Board of the Positive Coaching Alliance. He has been inducted into the University of Delaware and George Washington University Halls of Fame.

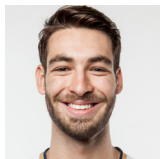
