COUNTDOWN TO KICKOFF

515	With 515 rushing yards at Boston College, it marked the third-most by any Irish team in a game since 1969 when they ran for 597 yards against Navy. It was good for a 10.1 yards per rush average, breaking the modern Notre Dame record (10.0) set against Great Lakes in 1942.
76	Miami (Ohio) becomes the 76th different opponent to face the Irish in Notre Dame Stadium. Notre Dame owns a record of 59-15-1 against first-time visitors to the Stadium.
19	Notre Dame is 19-for-19 this season when entering the red zone. The Irish are one of just 17 FBS programs to still be perfect on the season, but have converted on more opportunities than all but one of the other 16 teams.
10	With the season-opening win over Temple, the Irish improved to 10-2 since 1985 when a first-time starting quarterback made his debut start at Notre Dame Stadium. All told, the Irish have won six straight games with a first-time starter at QB and are 18-6 in starting debuts since '85.
9	The Notre Dame defense has forced nine opponent turnovers this season, with the Irish turning those miscues into 56 points. For the year, Notre Dame holds a 56-3 edge in points off turnovers over its opponents.
8	Notre Dame has conceded just eight TDs through four games this season. A year ago through four games, the Irish had allowed 19 opponent TDs.
7	QB Brandon Wimbush notched his seventh rushing TD of the season at Michigan State. The junior is already closing in on the single-season school record for rushing TDs by a quarterback of 10, set by DeShone Kizer in 2015.
6	With a "pick six" at Michigan State, CB Julian Love became the first Irish player to return an interception for a touchdown since Andrew Trumbetti in 2015. Love was the first Notre Dame defender to accomplish the feat in a true road game since Bennett Jackson at Purdue in 2013.
5	Five different Notre Dame players have scored rushing TDs in four games this season. QB Brandon Wimbush is joined in that group by RBs Josh Adams, Tony Jones Jr., Dexter Williams and Deon McIntosh.
4	QB Brandon Wimbush ranks fourth in the nation with seven total touchdowns this season. He is the second-ranked QB in the category, trailing only Georgia Tech signal-caller Jaquon Marshall.
3	Shaun Crawford forced three turnovers against Boston College, intercepting two passes and recovering a fumble. He's the first Irish defender to force three turnovers in a game since Harrison Smith made three interceptions in the 2010 Sun Bowl, a 33-17 victory over Miami (Fla.). Crawford added a forced fumble and fumble recovery the next week at Michigan State.
2	National titles won by late Irish coach Ara Parseghian, who's legacy will be celebrated Saturday. Parseghian won championships as head coach at Notre Dame in 1966 and 1973 and graduated from Miami University, where he played football, basketball and baseball.
1	For the first time in school history, Notre Dame had two players eclipse 200 rushing yards in the same game at Boston College. RB Josh Adams went for 234 yards, while QB Brandon Wimbush ran for 213 yards.
0	Not a single ticket has remained for a Notre Dame home game since 1973. The Miami (Ohio) contest will be the 258th consecutive sellout at Notre Dame Stadium. The upcoming date with Southern Cal is also sold out, but fans can purchase tickets to the remaining three home games at UND.com/BuyTickets .

ERA OF ARA

- The University of Notre Dame will celebrate the legacy of late Irish coach Ara Parseghian throughout the weekend. Parseghian won a pair of national titles while coaching the Irish from 1964-74 and was a two-time graduate from Miami University (1949 and '54), where he played football, basketball and baseball. Parseghian passed away on Aug. 2, 2017.
- Parseghian's wife, Katie, will present the colors prior to the national anthem and the coach is the focal point of both the commemorative coin used at the coin toss and on the gameday magazine.
- In addition, the Notre Dame Stadium will feature four in-game moments celebrating the legacy of the coach.
- This is in addition to season-long tributes which have included "Ara" featured on the front of the helmets, Notre Dame Stadium field goal posts and warm-up shirts worn by the team in pregame.

NEW TEAM, FAMILIAR FACES

- Miami (Ohio) becomes the second first-time visitor to Notre Dame Stadium this season on Saturday, but the RedHawks will be led by a familiar face.
- Miami head coach Chuck Martin was an assistant at Grand Valley State under now-Irish head coach Brian Kelly from 2000-03. When Kelly departed to become the head coach at Central Michigan, Martin took over the Lakers from 2004-09, winning a pair of Division II national titles. Martin then rejoined Kelly in 2010 and stayed with the Irish until 2013. He coached defensive backs and safeties his first two seasons, while also serving as the recruiting coordinator. He spent his second two years as the offensive coordinator and QBs coach.
- Martin will lead Miami to Notre Dame for the first time since 1909. That year the Irish defeated Miami, 46-0, at Cartier Field, as part of a 7-0-1 campaign. It was the same year the Notre Dame Victory March debuted.
- Miami (Ohio) is the second first-time visitor to Notre Dame Stadium (opened 1930) this year following Georgia. The Irish are 59-15-1 (.793) against opponents playing their first contest inside "The House That Rockne Built." On Oct. 28, NC State will become the 77th different opponent to visit Notre Dame Stadium.

FINISH THE JOB

- Notre Dame has scored on all 19 red zone trips this season after four-for-four at Michigan State last week.
- There are 17 FBS programs still perfect in the red zone this season. Of the group of 17, only Louisiana has more red zone scores than Notre Dame at 22 (Stanford also has 19).
- With 14 of the 19 scores having been rushing TDs, Notre Dame has successfully run for more red zone touchdowns than any school in FBS except Oregon (19 red zone rushing TDs).
- The area was a point of emphasis for the Irish after scoring at an 83.3 clip last season to rank 72nd in FBS.

SPARTAN SHUTDOWN

- In Notre Dame's 38-18 victory to claim the Megaphone Trophy versus Michigan State last week, the Irish stepped-up in a rivalry game.
- Notre Dame put up 28 points in the first half, marking the most first-half by the Irish in the series with the Spartans since 1992.
- With a 21-point halftime lead, it was the largest deficit at intermission for Michigan State since the Capital One Bowl on Jan. 1, 2011, when the Spartans trailed Alabama 28-0 at the break.
- Notre Dame scored on the opening drive and followed with a pick six on Michigan State's first drive, en route to never trailing. It marked the first time Michigan State

- never had a lead in a game since Sept. 15, 2012, when Notre Dame took a 20-3 decision at Spartan Stadium.
- Coupled with Notre Dame's 49-20 win at Boston College the previous week, it marked the first time since 1983 the Irish scored wins by at least 20 points on the road in consecutive weeks. That year, Gerry Faust's teams won 27-3 at Colorado and 30-6 at South Carolina.
- Notre Dame has now won five of its last seven games in East Lansing, Michigan.

CRAWFORD MAKING THE MOST

Notre Dame junior CB Shaun Crawford has played in basically five and a half games during his collegiate career. He missed his entire freshman season (2015) with a torn ACL and then suffered a torn achilles in the first quarter of the second game of his sophomore season (2016). In that limited time he has:

- Returned a blocked PAT for a two-point conversion to tie Texas, 37-37, with just over three minutes remaining
- Three interceptions
- Two fumble recoveries
- A forced fumble at the goal line to negate a certain touchdown
- Five passes defended

LOVE THE END ZONE

- When Irish CB Julian Love returned an interception 59-yards for a touchdown on Michigan State's first drive, he became the first Irish player with a pick six since 2015 when Andrew Trumbetti returned an interception for a score against Wake Forest.
- Love was the first player to accomplish the feat in a true road game since 2013 when Bennett Jackson had a pick six against Purdue. Jackson's return was also the last time an Irish CB had an interception return for a TD.

RUNNING DOWN RECORDS

- Notre Dame ran for over 400 yards in two of the season's first three games. Prior to this year, that number had been reached once previously in the Brian Kelly era.
- At Boston College, the Irish went for 515 on the ground. It was the third-most since Notre Dame ran for 597 against Navy on Nov. 1, 1969, while also trailing a 545-yard day against Army in 1974 and a 526-yard performance against Navy in 1972.
- The 515 on 51 carries was good for an average of 10.1 yards per rush, setting a modern-day record. The previous top mark was 10.0 yards per rush against Great Lakes Naval Station on Dec. 5, 1942.
- The BC game was the first time in school history the Irish had a pair of runners eclipse 200 yards on the ground in the same game. RB Josh Adams went for 229 yards on 18 carries, while QB Brandon Wimbush picked-up 207 yards and ran for four scores.
- They were the first players to eclipse 200 yards since Julius Jones ran for 218 at Stanford in 2003.
- Adams led the charge against Temple in the opener, as three Notre Dame players eclipsed 100 yards on the ground for what is believed to be the first time in school history (confirmed since at least 1954). Adams led the charge with 161 yards, followed by Dexter Williams at 124 and Wimbush at 106. As a team, the Irish totaled 422 yards.
- Adams hit the 100-yard mark on just his sixth carry of the day, matching the fewest carries in his career to reach that plateau. It was the first time over 100 yards for both Williams and Wimbush.
- The group did this behind an offensive line anchored on the left side by captains Mike McGlinchey (LT) and Quenton Nelson (LG), as well as center Sam Mustipher and right guard Alex Bars. Those four entered the season with a combined 75 starts, allowing the line to welcome newcomers Tommy Kraemer and Robert Hainsey, who split time at right tackle in the opener.

DOUBLE DOMERS

- The duo of RB Josh Adams and QB Brandon Wimbush each breaking 200 yards rushing at Boston College was not only the first time the feat had been accomplished in school history, it was just the seventh time in FBS history and only the fourth time the feat had been accomplished against a major program (ND+Power Five).
- It marked the first time the feat had been accomplished against a major program since the 2012 Big Ten Championship Game, when Melvin Gordon and Montee Ball both eclipsed 200 against Nebraska.
- It last happened in college football last season, when Middle Tennessee had I’Tavius Mathers and Richie James break the mark against Florida Atlantic.

ADAMS QUICKLY MOVING UP THE CHARTS

- In addition to rushing for over 200 yards for the first time in his career at Boston College, RB Josh Adams became the 17th player in school history to eclipse the 2,000 career rushing yards mark. Doing so in 316 carries, Adams hit the mark quicker than any player in school history.
- Through the Michigan State game, Adams now totals 2,267 career yards. That total slots him 12th in school history.
- He can quickly pick up a few more slots, as just ahead of him are Tony Brooks (2,274 yards) and Randy Kinder (2,295 yards). Adams will enter the top-10 all-time when he passes Kinder.
- Adams owns the Notre Dame record for rushing yards as a freshman (835) and is the first back in school history to eclipse 800 yards in each of his first two seasons.
- In terms of quickest to the 2,000-yard club, Adams edged out George Gipp, who hit the mark in 323 carries. In terms of games, Adams was seventh-quickest. Allen Pinkett made it to 2,000 in 22 games, but on 384 carries.
- With 499 yards on the year, Adams ranks ninth nationally in rushing yards, while his 124.8 rushing yards per game rank 14th in the country.

WIMBUSH ON THE RUN

- With 207 rushing yards and four TDs in the win at Boston College, QB Brandon Wimbush had a recording setting day for Irish signal callers.
- He is the first quarterback in school history to put together a 200-yard rushing performance, as he topped the school record of 146 set by Bill Etter against Navy on Nov. 1, 1969.

- With four rushing TDs, it was the first time any Irish player went for four scores on the ground since Emmett Mosley score four rushing TDs against Navy on Oct. 22, 1994. He was the first QB in school history to score four times on the ground.
- Wimbush ranks third in the nation with seven rushing TDs, trailing only Oregon RB Royce Freeman (10) and Georgia Tech QB Taquon Marshall (eight).
- His 366 total rushing yards on the year rank 26th in the nation, but are fourth among QBs. He trails only triple option specialists from Navy (Zach Abey at 471), Army (Ahmad Bradshaw at 439), and Georgia Tech (Taquon Marshall at 386).

DEFENSE ON THE RISE

- Under first year defensive coordinator Mike Elko, the Notre Dame defense is showing steady improvement after four weeks of the season.
- After four games, the Irish defense has allowed 74 points and 1,552 yards. While those numbers rank just slightly better than average nationally, they are ahead of last year’s pace. Following the first four games of 2016, Notre Dame had conceded 1,851 total yards and 134 points.
- Even compared to the entirety of 2016, the defense is showing signs of progress. The Irish allowed 27.8 points per game last season and have that number down to 18.5.
- The Irish have also forced nine turnovers through four games, with the most recent highlight being a pick six by Julian Love at Michigan State.
- Shaun Crawford and Daeline Hayes each have a pair of fumble recoveries. Notre Dame is the only team in FBS with two players to have multiple fumble recoveries on the year.
- The trademark of Elko’s defense has been the ability to get to the quarterback. The Irish have recorded eight sacks. Last year, Notre Dame recorded just 14 sacks and ranked 117th in the country.

YOON HITS FOR FOUR

- K Justin Yoon made all four of his field goal attempts against No. 15 Georgia, connecting from 39, 42, 37 and 28 yards.
- It was the a career-best performance by Yoon, who is a career 33-for-41 on field goals and 114-for-118 on PATs.
- It was the first time an Irish kicker connected for four field goals in a game since 2008 when Brandon Walker hit four in a four-overtime loss to Pittsburgh. Walker was 4-for-5, making his first four kicks before missing a 38-yarder in the fourth extra frame.

IRISH OPEN 2017 WITH QUICK STRIKE

- The Irish recorded their quickest offensive touchdown to open the season since at least 1963 (when records consistently show times of scores).
- Josh Adams broke a 37-yard run to the end zone just 33 seconds into the opener against Temple.
- It marked the quickest points of any kind by Notre Dame to open a season since 1993 when Pete Bercich returned an interception for a touchdown on the first play from scrimmage against Northwestern. That score occurred in just eight seconds.

WIMBUSH WINS IN STARTING DEBUT

- Junior Brandon Wimbush became the sixth-straight Notre Dame signal caller to win in his first career start, joining Dayne Crist (2010 vs. Purdue), Tommy Rees (2010 vs. No. 15 Utah), Everett Golson (2012 vs. Navy), Malik Zaire (2014 vs. No. 22 LSU) and DeShone Kizer (2015 vs. No. 14 Georgia Tech).
- Including his tenure at Cincinnati, head coach Brian Kelly has now seen each of the last nine quarterbacks he has started emerge victorious from their debut starts.
- Wimbush not only completed 17 of 30 passes for 184 yards and two TDs, but the signal caller rushed for 106 yards on 12 carries and one TD. Wimbush became the first Irish quarterback responsible for three or more touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) in his first career start since Rees (three passing) against No. 15 Utah in 2010. Since 1985, only Wimbush, Rees, Matt LoVecchio (two passing, one rushing against Stanford in 2000) and Ron Powlus (four passing against Northwestern in 1994) can claim that distinction in their first career start.
- Wimbush was Notre Dame's 24th different starting quarterback since 1985. The Irish are 18-6 (.750) in those games featuring a first-time starter under center. Notre Dame improved to 10-2 (.833) in such games at Notre Dame Stadium.
- From 1985-98, Notre Dame was victorious in nine straight games in which an Irish quarterback was making his first career start, including four coming in a season opener. Those openers were won by Rick Mirer (No. 1 Notre Dame def. No. 4 Michigan 28-24 in '90), Kevin McDougal (No. 7 Notre Dame def. Northwestern 27-12 in '93), Powlus (No. 3 Notre Dame def. Northwestern 42-12 in '95) and Jarious Jackson (No. 22 Notre Dame def. No. 5 Michigan 36-20 in '98).
- Notre Dame's nine-game, first-start streak ended in the 10-0 loss at USC on Nov. 28, 1998, when Eric Chappell started in place of the injured starter Jackson (then-freshman Arnaz Battle also played a large chunk of that game).
- Following the 1998 meeting with USC, the Irish won three consecutive games under first-time signal callers. In fact, all three came during the same season, 2000, and occurred over the year's first five contests. Battle (Notre Dame def. No. 24 Texas A&M, 24-10), Gary Godsey (Notre Dame def. Purdue, 23-21) and Matt LoVecchio (No. 25 Notre Dame def. Stanford, 20-14).
- The Irish then dropped four straight contests with a first-time starting quarterback under center.
- Notre Dame used a trio of first-time signal callers in 2007, including one in each of the first two games of the season. Demetrius Jones (Georgia Tech def. Notre Dame, 33-3), Jimmy Clausen (No. 14 Penn State def. Notre Dame, 31-10) and Evan Sharpley (No. 13 USC def. Notre Dame, 38-0) all failed to walk away with a victory.
- Dayne Crist snapped that five-game skid with a victorious debut against Purdue on Sept. 4, 2010.

WIMBUSH WINS BY LAND AND AIR

- In passing for 184 yards and rushing for 114 in the season opener, Irish QB Brandon Wimbush proved his potential as a dual threat quarterback.
- Wimbush is believed to be the first Irish QB since at least 1942 to break 100 yards in both passing and rushing in his first career start.
- He is just the sixth different Notre Dame quarterback to hit the century mark in both categories.
- Paul Hornung, Joe Theismann and Tony Rice were the first three to accomplish the feat, while Jarious Jackson and DeShone Kizer each hit the mark twice.
- Kizer's first such performance also came against Temple in 2015.
- Wimbush scored Notre Dame's only TD in the one-point loss to No. 15 Georgia on a one-yard run.

POSITIONAL BREAKDOWN

QUARTERBACKS

- Brandon Wimbrush has emerged as one of the most successful rushing quarterbacks in the nation in the early going. He leads non-option QBs and is 26th among all players with 366 rushing yards. His seven rushing TDs this season rank third in the country and against BC he became the first Irish QB in modern history to rush for over 200 yards and score four rushing TDs.
- Ian Book is the backup for Wimbrush. Book has seen limited action this season. He made his collegiate debut against Georgia while Wimbrush had an issue with a contact lens. Book then saw action at the end of the victory at Boston College.

RUNNING BACKS

- Josh Adams leads a strong Irish rushing game with 499 yards on the year. He’s 11th nationally at 7.68 yards per carry. Against BC, he became the 17th back in school history to reach 2,000 career yards and he moved to 12th all-time at Notre Dame with 2,267 yards following the Michigan State contest.
- Dexter Williams, Tony Jones Jr. and Deon McIntosh provide depth at the position. Williams and McIntosh both scored rushing TDs at Michigan State last week, with Jones missing the contest due to injury (ankle). Williams added a TD reception against the Spartans.

WIDE RECEIVERS

- Equanimeous St. Brown leads a group of wide outs looking to grow in experience in 2017. St. Brown is the leader among the position group with 11 catches for 160 yards and a TD. He led the team with nine TD grabs last season, ranking sixth nationally among freshmen and sophomores.
- Cam Smith, Chris Finke and Chase Claypool have emerged as the next threats. Claypool had four catches for 56 yards at Michigan State and now has seven catches for 80 yard son the year. Smith owns seven receptions for 54 yards while Finke has three catches.
- The group took a hit entering the BC game when transfer Freddy Canteen was lost for the year (labrum).

TIGHT ENDS

- Notre Dame maintains its legacy as Tight End U with five tight ends who have seen action the first three weeks.
- Durham Smythe is the incumbent starter. He’s made four catches for 88 yards thus far. Alizé Mack has returned after missing the 2016 season and has 11 catches for 116 yards as the team’s second-leading receiver. Senior Nic Weishar has the lone TD among the group and totals three catches for 20 yards.
- The Irish welcomed in arguably the best tight end class in the country and both true freshmen have seen action. Brock Wright entered as the No. 1 tight end according to ESPN and Rivals, while Cole Kmet was ranked No. 3 by both groups. Both have played in all three games, with Wright occasionally lining up at fullback and Kmet seeing heavy action on special teams.

OFFENSIVE LINE

- With four returning starters, Notre Dame’s offensive line has paved the way for the Irish to go for over 400 rushing yards in two games.
- Led by preseason All-Americans Mike McGlinchey (tackle) and Quenton Nelson (guard) on the left side, the group also returns center Sam Mustipher and Alex Bars, who has moved from right tackle to right guard. Tommy Kraemer and Robert Hainsey have split time at right tackle.
- Led by offensive line coach Harry Hiestand, the offensive line has helped the Irish to a rank of seventh nationally in rushing offense (293.5 per game), while they have been especially adept at helping the offense convert on red zone opportunities. While the Irish are a perfect 19-for-19 in the red zone this season, 14 of the 19 trips have ended with rushing touchdowns.

DEFENSIVE LINE

- Under the tutelage of assistant head coach Mike Elston, the defensive line will have a new look this season. Jerry Tillery, Jay Hayes, Jonathan Bonner and Daelin Hayes have been the starters, while Andrew Trumbetti, Julian Okwara, Myron Tagovailoa-Amosa and Kurt Hinish saw heavy action, as well.
- Against No. 15 Georgia, the group three TFLs and a sack while holding the Bulldogs to two or fewer yards rushing on 21 of their 43 rushing attempts.
- On the year, the line has four sacks, a forced fumble (Okwara) and a fumble recovery.

LINEBACKERS

- The Irish linebackers have found success under the new look of Mike Elko’s defense.
- Greer Martini (buck), Nyles Morgan (mike) and Drew Tranquill (rover) have been the starters for all four games, while Te’Von Coney has seen a large share of playing time, as well.
- Those four are the team leaders in tackles, as Morgan leads the way with 34, followed by Coney at 32, Martini at 29 and Tranquill at 20.
- In addition, Coney and Morgan both have sacks, while Tranquill leads the team with 4.5 TFLs.

SECONDARY

- Julian Love and Nick Watkins have started all four games at cornerback. Love, a 247 Freshman All-American in 2016, has a interception, 17 tackles and four pass break-ups, while Watkins has 16 tackles to go along with a pair of break-ups.
- Shaun Crawford has provided depth at corner and had a breakout performance at BC. He two interceptions and a fumble recovery in the win over the Eagles, while also registering two tackles and a pass break-up. Crawford followed with a forced fumble and fumble recovery at Michigan State.
- At safety, it’s been Nick Coleman and Jalen Elliot as starters for all four games. Coleman has made 15 tackles, while Elliott has contributed 11.

SPECIAL TEAMS

- On special teams, the Irish return veterans at kicker, punter and holder, while breaking in a new long snapper.
- Justin Yoon has been the kicker since stepping on campus. He had his first four-for-four FG performance against Georgia this season and owns a career long of 52 yards.
- Tyler Newsome is in his third year as the Irish punter. He ranks 13th in the nation in punting after four weeks with an average kick of 45.6 yards.
- Senior QB Montgomery VanGorder continues as the team’s holder.
- The Irish welcome a new long snapper to the mix this season, as John Shannon has made his debut at the position after not playing as a freshman.

FRESH LOOK FOR STAFF

- The Dick Corbett Head Football Coach Brian Kelly welcomes six new staff members to the fold in 2017.
- The group includes new coordinators for all three phases (OC Chip Long, DC Mike Elko and ST Brian Polian), with new position group coaches for the wide receivers (Del Alexander), quarterbacks (Tom Rees) and linebackers (Clark Lea).
- As part of the staff changes, Mike Elston has shifted to coaching the defensive line while also being promoted to assistant head coach.
- Polian has taken over the role of recruiting coordinator in addition to his special teams responsibilities.
- Holdovers on Kelly's staff include Elston, running backs coach Autry Denson, offensive line coach Harry Hiestand and the Pat and Jana Eilers Family Defensive Backs Coach, Todd Lyght.
- With the addition of Rees, Kelly's staff now includes three former Notre Dame football players, as he joins Denson and Lyght.

ON THIS DATE

- Notre Dame will be looking to improve on a 12-2 mark all-time on Sept. 30, including a 10-0 mark at home when playing on this date.
- The Irish shutout their first six opponents on Sept. 30, blanking Michigan State (1899), Chicago North Division High School (1905), Case Tech (1916), Kalamazoo (1922), Purdue (1939) and Pittsburgh). North Carolina broke that streak in 1950, but the Irish still finished Sept. 30 undefeated thanks to a 14-7 victory.
- The Irish defeated Oklahoma, 19-6, in the 1961 season opener, before Purdue handed Notre Dame it's first Sept. 30 loss, 28-21, in West Lafayette, Indiana, in 1967. That contest snapped a 12-game winning streak for Ara Parseghian's squad as it was looking to defend a national title in 1966.
- The Irish then won three straight Sept. 30 games, all against Purdue, before falling at Ohio State on Sept. 30, 1995. The 15th-ranked Irish led the No. 7 Buckeyes, 17-14, at halftime, but three second-half turnovers helped Ohio State dominate the second half en route to a 45-26 win. Lou Holtz's team rebounded from that loss to win its last six games and earn an Orange Bowl berth.
- The most recent Sept. 30 game was a 35-21 win over Purdue. No. 12 Notre Dame was led by 316 passing yards and two touchdowns from Brady Quinn as the Irish won the second game in an eight-game winning streak which helped the Irish secure a Sugar Bowl invitation.

THE MIAMI (OHIO) SERIES

- Notre Dame and Miami (Ohio) will meet for the first time since 1909 on Saturday.
- On Nov. 13, 1909, the Irish shutout Miami, 46-0, at Cartier Field on the Notre Dame campus.
- Miami head coach Chuck Martin served as an assistant coach for Brian Kelly at Grand Valley State before becoming head coach of the Lakers when Kelly took the head job at Central Michigan. The pair was reunited at Notre Dame from 2010-13, with Martin serving as recruiting coordinator from 2010-11 while coaching the DBs in '10 and the safeties in '11, before becoming the offensive coordinator in 2012 and '13.
- Brian Kelly is 4-0 in his career against the RedHawks. He defeated them once while at Central Michigan before winning all three contests for the Victory Bell at Cincinnati.
- Akron and Western Michigan are the only other members of the Mid-American Conference Notre Dame has faced on the gridiron, although this will be just the second meeting between the Irish and one of those institutions since the formation of the MAC in 1946.
- In 1910, Akron visited Cartier Field, with the Irish winning, 51-0.
- The Irish faced Western Michigan in 1919 and '20, winning by margins of 53-0 and 41-0. The Broncos traveled to Notre Dame Stadium in 2010, the first meeting between Notre Dame and a current MAC member, with the Irish winning, 44-20.
