Irish Take To The Road For Weekend Series At Lake Superior State

- Notre Dame plays seven of its last 10 regular season games on the road.
- Defenseman Kyle Lawson named CCHA defenseman-of-week while freshman left wing Nick Larson takes rookie-of-the-week honors for play in Michigan State series.

ON THE ROAD WITH THE IRISH: Notre Dame moves into the stretch run of its schedule this weekend as the Fighting Irish close out the final six weeks of the regular season with seven of the last 10 games on the road. This weekend, Notre Dame goes to Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., to face one of the CCHA's hottest teams, the Lake Superior State Lakers. The weekend series will be played on Fri.-Sat., Jan. 22-23 at Taffy Abel Arena at 7:05 p.m. both nights. Notre Dame is coming off a win and a tie (shootout loss) to Michigan State last weekend, winning on Friday at the Joyce Center, 5-2, before battling the Spartans to a 4-4 tie on Saturday with MSU taking a 1-0 shootout win. The Irish enter the weekend at Lake Superior with a 10-10-6 overall record and are tied for sixth with Michigan in the CCHA with a 6-7-5-2 record, good for 25 points. Notre Dame is four points behind fifth-place Alaska (29) and five behind fourth-place Lake Superior (30). The Lakers are coming off a home sweep of Nebraska-Omaha and enter the weekend with a 14-8-4 overall record and a 9-7-2-1 mark in the conference, good for 30 points and fourth place. Lake Superior is four points behind third-place Ferris State and five behind second-place Michigan State in the standings. The Lakers are ranked 18th in this week's USCHO.com poll but did not receive any votes in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll.

IRISH VERSUS LAKERS: The two teams have met 53 times in the all-time series with the Irish holding a 24-23-6 edge in those games. At Sault Ste. Marie, the Lakers hold a 13-11-2 advantage against the Irish. Since **Jeff Jackson** took over behind the Notre Dame bench for the 2005-06 season, the Irish are 8-1-2 versus Lake Superior State, including 5-0-1 at Taffy Abel Arena. Last season, the teams met four times with the Irish going 3-0-1 in those games. The last time the Lakers defeated Notre Dame was Dec. 17, 2005, a 4-0 shutout at the Joyce Center. The last time they won at home was Jan. 8, 2005, a 2-1 overtime win.

HOMECOMING: Irish head coach **Jeff Jackson** returns this weekend to his coaching roots when the Irish play at Lake Superior. He spent four seasons as an assistant (1986-90) with the Lakers and then was their head coach for six years (1990-96), compiling a 182-52-25 record, two NCAA titles, two CCHA regular-season titles and four CCHA Tournament championships.

CCHA PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshman left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)** were honored by the CCHA this week as they were named defensive player and rookie of the week respectively for the week ending Jan. 17. Lawson had a hand in five of Notre Dame's nine goals on the weekend with five assists, was +3 in the two games and recorded three blocked shots versus the Spartans. Larson had two goals and two assists in the two games, taking six shots on goal and was +2 on the week. He turned in a career-best three-point game (2g, 1a) in the 5-2 victory over Michigan State on Jan. 15. This marks the second time this season that Lawson has been named defensive player of the week.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION: Notre Dame had its biggest offensive outburst of the season in the weekend series with Michigan State. In the two games, the Irish scored nine goals, a season high for a two-game series. On Friday night, the Irish had five goals in a 5-2 win that saw them fire 46 shots on goal. The following night, Notre Dame rallied from a 3-0 deficit in the second period to go ahead, 4-3, in the third. The Spartans tied the game with under three minutes left, 4-4, and it remained that way at the final buzzer. In the shootout, the Spartans scored the lone goal in a 1-0 win in three rounds.

MICHIGAN STATE RECAP:

Friday, January 15, 2010 -

Freshman left wing **Nick Larson** scored two goals and added an assist while senior captain **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** scored twice and **Dan Kissel (Sr., Crestwood, Ill.)** added a short-handed goal as Notre Dame knocked off No. 6/7 Michigan State, 5-2, at the Joyce Center. The Spartans built a 2-0 lead on goals by Dean Chelios and Brett Perlini before Larson started the Irish comeback. He cut the lead to 2-1 at 7:02 of the second period and then tied the game at 14:36 to close the second-period scoring. In the third, Thang got the eventual winner on a power-play deflection at 4:40. Kissel scored his short-handed goal at 5:59 when he blasted a rocket from the top of the left circle past MSU goaltender Drew Palmisano. Thang closed the scoring at 8:57 for the 5-2 win. Defensemen **Brett Blatchford (Sr., Temperance, Mich.)** and **Kyle Lawson** each had two assists in the game. Notre Dame out shot the Spartans, 46-26 in the game. Palmisano made 34 saves in 48:57 of playing time. Bobby Jarosz had seven stops in 11:03. **Mike Johnson (Fr., Verona, Wis.)** stopped 24-of-26 shots in the win. The Irish were 1-for-6 on the power play while Michigan State was 0-for-5.

Saturday, January 16, 2010 -

Michigan State jumped out to a 3-0 lead at 4:30 of the second period on goals by Nick Sucharski, Daultan Leveille and Brett Perlini. That chased starter **Mike Johnson** in the Irish goal and he was replaced by junior **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**. The Irish broke through on MSU starter Bobby Jarosz at 12:42 of the second with a **Calle Ridderwall (Jr., Stockholm, Sweden)** with a power-play goal to make it 3-1. **Ryan Thang** followed with his first goal (ppg) of the night at 18:12 to make it 3-2 after two periods. **Ben Ryan (Jr., Brighton, Mich.)** tied the game just 37 seconds into the third period with his fifth goal of the season and Thang put the Irish ahead

SHOOTING IT OUT: The 2008-09 season was the first year that the CCHA used the shoot out to determine the winner of games that remained tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime period. During that season, the Irish were involved in three shoot outs, going 3-0 in all three games. In 2009-10, the Irish have been in five shoot outs, including the championship game of the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 3 versus North Dakota. To date, the Irish are 3-2 this season and 6-2 all-time in shoot outs. Here's a look at Notre Dame's career shoot-out stats.

with his second power-play goal of the night and fourth goal of the weekend at 4:51 of the final stanza. The score stayed that way until the 17:39 mark when Derek Grant tied the contest with a power-play goal. In the shootout, MSU's Andrew Grant was the lone scorer as the Spartans won, 1-0. Phillips stopped 19-of-20 shots in the game to pick up the tie. The appearance was his first since Nov. 28 versus Bowling Green. Notre Dame out shot Michigan State, 32-30, in the game. The Irish were 3-for-7 on the power play while the Spartans were 1-for-4.

OVERLOOKED: Irish senior captain **Ryan Thang** was overlooked in the voting for offensive player of the week by the conference. In the win and tie, Thang had four goals and no assists with three goals coming on the power play. One of his goals was a game winner and he was the Perani Cup first star of both games. Thang had eight shots on goal and was +3 for the weekend.

CALL A DOCTOR: Notre Dame's injury list continues to grow. Senior **Christiaan Minella (Aurora, Colo.)** went down with a knee injury versus Michigan State and will be out 6-8 weeks. He joins:

Sam Calabrese - leg injury (2-3 weeks)
Eric Ringel - concussion (day-to-day)
Teddy Ruth - upper body injury (day-to-day)
Billy Maday - shoulder/concussion (6-8 weeks)
Christiaan Minella - knee (6-8 weeks)

Calabrese and Ringel were injured on Dec. 4-5 at Miami and have now missed eight straight games. Ruth and Maday were injured on Jan. 10 versus Ferris State and have missed two games each. Minella did not play in the second game of the Michigan State series.

SCORING WOES: Through the first 26 games of the season, Notre Dame has scored a total of 62 goals. The Irish have scored goals via the power play in 21 of their 26 games, getting a total of 31 power-play goals. Notre Dame has two short-handed goals to give the team 33 special team goals to go with 29 even-strength goals. For the year, the Irish are averaging 2.38 goals-per game and the offensive attack is ranked 51st in the nation.

DEFENSIVE DANDIES: While the Irish have struggled to score goals, they have done a good job of keeping the puck out of the net through the first 26 games. In those games, Notre Dame's defense has held opponents to two goals or less in 14 of them and has given up three or less in 19 of the 26 contests. For the year, the Irish have given up just 59 goals for a 2.27 goals per game to rank sixth in the nation in team defense.

MR. CLUTCH: With his game-winning goal on Friday night, **Ryan Thang** became Notre Dame's all-time leader in game winner with 14. The goal snapped a four-way tie for the top spot.

CHART-CLIMBING, PART TWO: With his five assists in the series against Michigan State, senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** leads Irish defensemen in scoring and is fourth among CCHA defensemen with four goals and 14 assists for 18 points. For his career, Lawson has moved past former defensive standout **Brett Lebda '04**, into 10th on Notre Dame's all-time list for points by a defenseman. He now has 17 goals and 69 assists for 86 points in 149 career games. Here is the top 10 scoring defensemen for the Irish.

A NICK OF TIME: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Nick Larson** picked a great time to have his best game of the season on Jan. 15 against Michigan State. Larson collected three points (2g, 1a) in the 5-2 win over the Spartans. More importantly, he single-handedly brought the Irish back from a 2-0 deficit to tie the game. His first goal came at 7:02 of the second period when he whipped a shot from inside the MSU blue line past goaltender Drew Palmisano. Less than eight minutes later at 14:36, he cashed in on a 2-on-1 with **Kyle Lawson**, beating Palmisano over his glove with a wrist shot. He then helped set up a **Ryan Thang** power-play goal in the third period that put the Irish ahead, 3-2. For the game, Larson had a career-best five shots on goal and was +2 for the contest. On the year, he now has four goals and three assists for seven points with two game-winning goals.

STREAKING IRISH: Notre Dame defensemen **Brett Blatchford** and **Ian Cole (Jr., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** each have career-high scoring streaks that they extended in the series with Michigan State. Blatchford ran his streak to seven straight games (0g, 9a, 9 pts). His streak started on Dec. 11 versus Michigan. Cole ran his streak to six games (2g, 4a, 6 pts). His streak started on Jan. 2 versus Colgate.

THE KID IS ALRIGHT: Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** has gotten his collegiate career off to a fast start through the first 26 games of the season. He saw his streak of nine straight appearances and seven consecutive starts snapped on Jan. 10 when Tom O'Brien got the call in goal. In 17 games, including 16 starts, Johnson is 7-6-3 with a 2.17 goals-against average and a .922 save percentage with two shutouts. Johnson recorded a shutout versus Providence College on Oct. 16 in his first career start and picked up his second with a career-high 38 saves versus Michigan on Dec. 13. His 2.17 goals-against average is 15th in the nation and his .922 save percentage is 15th among all Division I goaltenders. In his 16 starts, Johnson has given up 34 goals while the Irish have scored 32.

BACK BETWEEN THE PIPES: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** stopped 19-of-20 shots in relief of **Mike Johnson** in the 4-4 overtime tie against Michigan State on Jan. 16. Phillips played the final 40:26 of the game. It marked his first appearance in goal for the Irish since Nov. 28 against Bowling Green. Phillips, who missed the entire 2008-09 season due to knee surgery, has appeared in nine games this season, making eight starts. He is 2-3-3 overall with a 2.20 goals-against average and a .921 save percentage with one shutout.

HOME ICE STRUGGLES: With the 5-2 win over Michigan State on Jan. 15, Notre Dame improved to 6-6-3 in the first 15 home games this season. During the 2008-09 campaign, the Irish were 13-3-2 at the Joyce Center and over the previous three seasons owned a 37-9-7 mark on home ice.

HITTING THE CENTURY MARK: Notre Dame senior captain **Ryan Thang** became the 45th player in the history of the Irish hockey program to score 100 points in his career. Thang's assist on Ian Cole's power-play goal in the first period of the Jan. 10 game with Ferris State gave him 51 goals and 49 assists for his 100th career point. He now has 55 goals and 49 assists for 104 career points to rank 41st all-time.

WINNING THE GOLD: Notre Dame freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** returned to the Notre Dame lineup after helping the U.S. Junior National team win the gold medal at the World Junior Championships. The 5-11, 195-pound right wing was third in scoring on the team with a goal and eight assists for nine points and was +8 in the tournament. He is the first Irish player to win a gold medal in the World Junior Championships. Palmieri sat out the Ferris State series as Coach Jeff Jackson gave him the series off to return home after missing the holiday break.

IRISH MEDALS: A total of 13 Notre Dame players have participated in the World Junior Championships since 1977. In that time, three have been members of U.S. medal-winning teams. Joining **Kyle Palmieri** and his gold medal this season are current Irish defenseman **Kyle Lawson**, who won a bronze medal in 2007, when he was captain of the U.S. team and former standout **Ben Simon '00**, who won a silver medal in 1997.

SWEEPLESS IN SOUTH BEND: For the second time this season, the Irish were swept in a weekend series as Ferris State took two on Jan. 9-10 to join Miami and its Dec. 4-5 sweep against the Notre Dame. The Ferris State sweep marks just the 10th time in the **Jeff Jackson** era (2005-) that the Irish have been swept in a two-game series. Since Jackson took over, the Irish have been swept five times in 2005-06, twice in 2007-08, once last year and twice this season.

TOUGH TICKET: With a crowd of 3,007 on Jan. 15 against Michigan State, Notre Dame now has recorded 11 sellouts in its first 15 home games this season. The Irish have recorded sellouts in 20 of their last 24 home games, dating back to Dec. 13, 2008 versus Bowling Green. In 15 home games this season, Notre Dame is averaging 2,732 per game. A sellout is 2,713.

HIGHLY RANKED: Notre Dame freshman center **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** is the top-ranked collegiate hockey player in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings for the 2010 NHL Entry Draft. Sheahan was ranked fifth among all North American skaters. As a freshman at Notre Dame, who only turned 18 on Dec. 7, Sheahan is fifth on the team in scoring with five goals and nine assists for 14 points in 25 games. Four other players who have signed national letters-of-intent to attend Notre Dame in 2010 or 2011 also have been ranked. Joining Sheahan are defenseman **Stephan Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, ranked 28th; defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** is 32nd; defenseman **Jarred Tinordi (Millersville, Md.)** checks in at 42nd and forward **Bryan Rust (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.)** is ranked 76th. Johns, Tinordi and Rust play for the U.S. National Development Program while Lind plays for the Chicago Steel in the USHL.

TOMMY O: Senior **Tommy O'Brien (Mokena, Ill.)** made his second start of the season and just the fourth of his career in the 4-2 loss to Ferris State (Jan. 10). In the game, O'Brien made a career-high 29 saves in taking the loss. In three appearances this season, O'Brien is 1-1-0 with a 2.29 goals against average and a .906 save percentage. During his career, the Mokena, Ill., native is 2-1-0 with a 1.97 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage with one shutout.

CLOSE ONES: The Dec. 4, 1-0 loss to Miami, dropped Notre Dame to 2-5 in one-goal games this year. Last season, the Irish were 11-2 in games decided by one goal.

OVERTIME MARKS: Six of Notre Dame's last 10 games have gone into overtime with one game decided in the extra session and five going to a shootout. For the season, the Irish are 1-0-6 in overtime games. In the six shootouts to date, Notre Dame is 3-3. The overtime win on Nov. 27 versus Bowling Green was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-9 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

Game times on March 27 are set for 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. with the regional championship on March 28 set for 8:00 p.m.

WELCOME TO NOTRE DAME: Junior defenseman **Joe Lavin** (6-3, 200) joins the Irish lineup for the second half of the season after leaving Providence College following the first semester of the 2008-09 season. He finished that year with the USHL's Omaha Lancers and played the first half of this season in Omaha. In 48 games over a season-and-a-half with Providence, Lavin had no goals and eight assists for eight points. After leaving Providence, he played in 33 games for Omaha last season, scoring seven goals with 16 assists for 23 points with 28 penalty minutes. This year, Lavin played in 24 games with five goals and 12 assists for 17 points and was third on the team with a +16. The Lancers were in first place in the USHL's Western Division when Lavin left with a 19-4-1 record. He was a fifth-round pick, 126th overall, of the Chicago Black Hawks in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. Lavin is a product of the USA National Team Development Program where he was a teammate on the Under-18 team with fellow Irish juniors **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)**, **Brad Phillips (Jr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth**.

PENALTY KILLERS: Notre Dame's penalty-killing unit ranks first in the CCHA and second in the nation. To date, the Irish have killed 110-of-123 opponent power-play chances for an 89.4% success rate. That puts them on top of the CCHA list and second in the nation behind Air Force (90.3%, 102-of-113).

LIGHTING THE LAMP: Sophomore defenseman **Sean Lorenz** did something he has never done in college hockey versus Colgate on Jan. 2. At 8:36 of the second period, Lorenz took a drop pass from fellow defender **Brett Blatchford** and drilled a 50-foot shot past Raider goaltender Charles Long for the first goal of his Notre Dame career. The goal snapped a streak of 56 consecutive games without a goal for the 6-1, 202-pound defender.

BEST OF THE BEST: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Notre Dame hockey program has been among the tops in the nation in wins and winning percentage along with Michigan and Miami. Michigan is one win (101) ahead of the Irish who picked up their 100th win on Jan. 15. Miami is third with 93 victories. The Wolverines moved ahead of the Irish with a .698 winning percentage while Notre Dame is at .697. Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

GOAL-SCORING MACHINE: Junior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** scored his team-best 13th goal of the year in the 4-4 tie with Michigan State (Jan. 16). The goal came on the power play and was his ninth of the year with the man advantage. Ridderwall is currently tied for third in the CCHA with 13 goals while leading the league with nine power-play tallies. Over the last two seasons, he has scored 30 goals for Notre Dame with 20 of them coming via the power play. Ridderwall's hat trick on Nov. 28 versus Bowling Green was the first for an Irish player since Jan. 5, 2007 when **Kevin Deeth (Sr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** scored three in a win over Robert Morris at Mellon Arena in Pittsburgh.

LONG, LONG TIME: Prior to the 2-0 shutout of Michigan on Dec. 13 at the Joyce Center, the last time that Notre Dame registered a shutout versus Michigan came on Dec. 8, 1973 at Yost Arena by a 2-0 score. **Mark Kronholm '74** made 26 saves in that blanking of the Wolverines. It would take 36 years and five days before the Irish would register another shutout against Michigan.

DOUBLE BLANKINGS: The two shutouts by Miami (Dec. 4-5) marked the first time the Irish had been shutout in back-to-back games since Jan. 21-22, 2005 when Wisconsin blanked Notre Dame, 2-0 and 2-0. The last team to shut the Irish out was the RedHawks, who took a 2-0 decision on Oct. 24, 2008 to be the only team to shut Notre Dame out last season.

HERE COMES THE FUTURE: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that nine players have signed national letters-of-intent to begin playing hockey at Notre Dame over the next two seasons. The list included three defensemen and six forwards. The defensemen are **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.), Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.) and Jarred Tinordi (Millersville, Md.)** and the forwards include **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.), David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa), Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.), Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.), Bryan Rust (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.) and T.J. Tynan (Orland Park, Ill.)**. Three members of the incoming class - Johns, Rust and Tinordi - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other six are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Two members of this group - Costello and Lee - have already been drafted by National Hockey League teams in the 2009 Entry Draft and four - Johns, Lind, Tinordi and Rust are ranked by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in its mid-term rankings. Of the six USHL players, five have been selected to play in the USHL all-star game on Jan. 26 in Indianapolis, Ind. Lind, Costello and Lee will play for the East team while Tynan and Gerths will be in action for the West. For Costello and Gerths, this is their second all-star appearance.

TORPEDOES AWAY: When Notre Dame faced Michigan on Dec. 11 and 13, the Irish were forced to play the Wolverines with four defensemen out of the lineup due to injuries. Coach **Jeff Jackson** and his staff decided to go with the "Torpedo" system employed often by Sweden. Three forwards - sophomore **Billy Maday**, freshman **Riley Sheahan** and junior **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** - moved back to play defense as the Irish deployed three units with four forwards and one defenseman. Notre Dame gained a split in the series, losing 4-1, before taking a 2-0 shutout on Dec. 13.

PENALTY SHOTS: Miami's Carter Camper was awarded a penalty shot at 2:09 of the second period in the Dec. 4 game with Miami against Notre Dame's **Mike Johnson**. The penalty shot was the first faced by Johnson in his college career and he made the stop. The penalty shot was the first against the Irish since Feb. 28, 2003 when Western Michigan's Vince Bellissimo was awarded one. Notre Dame goaltender **Morgan Cey '05** made the stop in a game the Irish would lose, 4-2.

MR. CLUTCH: Irish freshman **Nick Larson** has proven to be a clutch scorer for Notre Dame over his first 20 games in an Irish uniform. The Apple Valley, Minn., native has scored a pair of goals this season - one versus Providence and one against Michigan - with both being game winners. The rugged left winger has scored both of his goals in a pair of 2-0 shutouts by fellow freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson**.

USA...USA...USA: Freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was selected to the 2010 U.S. Junior National Team after attending a three-day pre-tournament camp in Grand Forks, N.D. A 2009 first round draft choice of the Anaheim Ducks, Palmieri has five goals and two assists for seven points in 19 games for the Irish. Since 2006-07, Notre Dame has had at least one player on the U.S. Junior National Team - **Kyle Lawson (Sr., New Hudson, Mich.)** in 2006-07, **Ian Cole** in '07-'08 and '08-'09 and **Teddy Ruth (Jr., Naperville, Ill.)** in '08-'09.

DEETH TOPS 100: Senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** became the 44th player in the 42-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program to reach 100 points for his career on Oct. 23. His assist on **Calle Ridderwall's** first-period goal gave Deeth 32 goals and 68 assists for his 100th career point. He reached that mark in 133 games. Deeth now has 111 career points and is 37th on the all-time points list. Right behind him is senior teammate **Ryan Thang** who is tied for 41st with 104 career points (55g, 49a). He needs just one assist to join the 50/50 club for players with 50 goals and 50 assists in a career.

STEALING THE SHOW: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** made a career-high 34 saves as he handed the Boston University Terriers a 3-0 loss at Agganis Arena. Phillips got all the offensive support he needed in the second period when **Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Ben Ryan** scored 12 seconds apart to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. **Calle Ridderwall** added a power-play goal in the third period for the 3-0 final score. Maday, Ryan and Ridderwall each had a goal and an assist in the game. Phillips made 27 of his 34 saves in the first and third periods, including 17 in the final stanza. BU out shot the Irish, 34-16, in the game. The win was the first-ever for the Friars against Boston University (1-2-0 all-time).

RING(EL) THE BELL: Sophomore defenseman **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** recorded his first career point with the Irish when he assisted on a **Calle Ridderwall** goal in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green. After playing in just six games as a freshman, Ringel has become a regular on the Irish defense, playing in 17 of the team's 18 games.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's game versus Michigan State at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Nov. 22 marked the third time the Irish had played there. They are now 2-1 all-time at the Ft. Wayne building. Notre Dame first played there on Feb. 18, 2005, dropping a 9-2 decision to Michigan in front of 7,948 fans. The Irish returned on Dec. 30, 2006 and defeated Northern Michigan, 4-3, with a crowd of 3,134 on hand for the contest. This time, Notre Dame prevailed, 4-1, on Nov. 22 with a 3,572 in attendance. Notre Dame, the Allen Co. War Memorial Coliseum and the city of Ft. Wayne will serve as cohosts of the 2010 NCAA Hockey Midwest Regional on March 27-28, 2010.

IN ARUT: Notre Dame's 4-1 win over Michigan State (Nov. 19) snapped a four-game winless skid (0-2-2) for the Irish. That was the longest winless streak since Feb. 16-Feb. 29, 2008 when they were 0-2-2 over that four-game span.

CCHADIFFERENCES: With the start of Notre Dame's CCHA schedule this weekend, there are a couple differences to remember with the final results of a game. First is the shootout - should a game remain tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime, a winner will be decided via a shootout. Each team will select three shooters who will go one-on-one versus the opponent's goaltender with the winner being the team that scores the most. If the game remains tied after the first three shooters, single shooters will continue until a winner is found. The team

winning the shootout will receive two points in the standings while the loser just one. On the national level, the game is still considered a tie. Secondly, the standings in the conference will be different. A regulation or overtime win will see the winning team awarded three points with the loser none. If the game goes to a shootout, both teams will get one point with the shootout winner getting the extra point in the standings.

STREAK BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 shutout win over Boston University, snapped a streak of 99-consecutive games that the Terriers had not been shutout. The last time BU was shutout came on Dec. 2, 2006 when the Terriers shutout Boston College, 1-0. The win also marked the first time since Jan. 15, 2008 that Boston University lost a non-conference game, a streak of 10 consecutive wins.

A STUNNING START: Prior to **Brad Phillips'** 3-0 shutout at Boston University, freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** showed the way with a 2-0 blanking of Providence College in his rookie debut on Oct. 16. Johnson stopped all 29 shots he faced in blanking the Friars, 2-0, becoming the second Irish goaltender to record a shutout in his first career contest. He joins teammate **Tom O'Brien (Sr., Mokena, Ill.)** who picked up a shutout in his first start last season, a 7-0 blanking of Sacred Heart on Oct. 18, 2008.

LIGHTING THE LAMP: When senior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** scored his power-play goal in the first period of the Oct. 10 game with Alabama-Huntsville, it was his first time lighting the lamp since his freshman year. Blatchford's last goal came on Jan. 20, 2007 when he scored versus Western Michigan. Before that goal, Blatchford went 99 games without scoring. The Temperance, Mich., native would rather set them up than score them as he now has three career goals to go with 54 assists for 57 points. He was second on the team in assists in 2008-09 when he had 25 helpers on the year.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshmen forwards **Riley Sheahan** and **Kyle Palmieri** wasted little time getting on the scoresheet in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 9. Sheahan scored on his first career shot, scoring on the power play at 3:02 of the first period to give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. He joins **Billy Maday** and **Tim Wallace '06** as recent Notre Dame players to score on the first shots of their college careers. Palmieri joined in with a second-period power-play goal to get his first career score in his first game.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Notre Dame senior captain **Ryan Thang** has been named one of 20 nominees for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, two members of the Irish hockey team - **Erik Condra '09** and **Jordan Pearce '09** - were selected as one of 10 finalists for the honor. For the 2007-08 campaign, captain **Mark Van Guilder '08** made it to the list of 10 finalists. For the 2006-07 season, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. The list of 20 candidates will be narrowed down midway through the season with the final 10 going on a ballot to select the national winner.

CAPTAINS: Senior left wing **Ryan Thang** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2009-10 season. Joining Thang as alternate captains in '09-'10, are senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**, senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** and junior defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Thang and Lawson served as alternate captains in 2008-09, while this is the first season as captain for Deeth and Ruth.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – junior goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** and freshmen forwards **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.)** – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Phillips' uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988. Nugent's father, **Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78**, played hockey for the Irish between 1974-78, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. Kevin, Jr., becomes the second Notre Dame hockey player to follow his father to South Bend. He follows goaltender **Rory Walsh '06** who followed his father, **Brian Walsh '77** who was a teammate of the elder Nugent, playing for coach Lefty Smith. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08.

ALL-AMERICANS: Two Notre Dame players were selected AHCA/Reebok All-Americans following the 2008-09 season. Current junior defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was selected as a first team All-American while right wing **Erik Condra '09** was selected second team. That marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish had two players selected All-American in the same year. The previous times came in 1972-73 when **Eddie Bumbacco '74** and **Bill Nyrop '74** were chosen and again in 1976-77 when **Jack Bronschidle '77** and **Brian Walsh '77** were honored.

LORD STANLEY, LORD STANLEY: For the second consecutive season, a former Notre Dame defenseman played for a Stanley Cup winning team. This time it was Pittsburgh defenseman **Mark Eaton** who became the fourth Notre Dame player to hoist the Stanley Cup. Eaton, who played just one season for the Irish in

1997-98, joins **Brett Lebda '04** who won the Stanley Cup versus Eaton's Penguins in 2008. They follow two other Notre Dame defenseman who have their names etched on the Cup three times - **Bill Nyrop '74** and **Don Jackson '78**. Nyrop played on three Stanley Cup winners with the Montreal Canadiens (1975-78) and Jackson was a member of three Cup-winning teams with the Edmonton Oilers (1982-85). The Pittsburgh defenseman was honored by Notre Dame at halftime of the season-opening game versus Nevada on Sept. 5.

HOMETOWNS: The 2009-10 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 15 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Junior **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm)** is the first Notre Dame hockey player from Sweden.

Last year's team finished fifth with Cole getting two goals and two assists for four points in six games while Ruth was scoreless in six contests. Palmieri, Cole and Ruth join **Jack Bronschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79)**, **Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98)**, **Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98)**, **Dan Carlson ('98-'99)**, **Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01)**, **Brett Henning ('99-'00)**, **David Inman ('99-'00)**, **Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02)**, **Brett Lebda ('01-'02)** and **Kyle Lawson ('06-'07)** as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: With the addition of **Joe Lavin** (Chicago Black Hawks, 5th round in 2007 Entry Draft) to the Notre Dame roster for the second half of the 2009-10 season, the Irish now have 10 players on the team who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Two freshmen joined the list this season. Left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)** was a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall. Right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was a first round pick, 26th overall in the 2009 Draft last June. He became the second Notre Dame player ever selected in the first round. They join defenseman **Sean Lorenz** who also was selected in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. Defenseman **Ian Cole** was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues, who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** rounds out the group of nine players as he was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, on-campus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla.,

their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
