

In an effort to ensure that you enjoy the games and have a safe, comfortable and memorable experience, we ask that you carefully note the following items.

GATE ASSIGNMENTS. *All students must enter the stadium through entrance E.*

- The student entrance will open 90 minutes prior to kick-off.
- A CURRENT STUDENT I.D. CARD MUST BE PRESENTED WITH YOUR STUDENT SEASON TICKET BOOKLET FOR ADMISSION INTO THE STADIUM.
- For a fee, lost or stolen I.D. cards can be reissued at the card services office on the lower level of the South Dining Hall.

ALCOHOL. Intoxicating substances are **prohibited** in Notre Dame Stadium. Stadium ushers and police officers will strictly enforce this rule. Students who are intoxicated or who are in possession of alcohol will be removed from the stadium and reported to the Office of Student Affairs.

RESALE/COUNTERFEITING OF TICKETS. Students are advised that the resale or counterfeiting of student booklets is strictly prohibited.

- If resale of a booklet is detected, the booklet will be confiscated. Further, ticket privileges will be revoked and the owner subject to disciplinary action by the Office of Student Affairs.
- *Please assist us in this effort and do not purchase tickets from any unauthorized ticket sellers.*
- **du Lac states:** “If a student is found to have sold his/her season ticket booklet, or individual game tickets, for an amount greater than the face value of the tickets, or have sold his/her tickets to a ticket broker/agency who in turn resells the tickets for an amount greater than face value, he/she will lose his/her ticket privileges for a minimum period of one (1) year and reimburse the University for the amount greater than face value. The student may face additional disciplinary action. Repeat offenders will be subject to stricter penalties up to and including permanent revocation.”

RESTORATION FEE. The restoration fee for student booklets confiscated, lost or stolen is \$245.00 for Notre Dame students and \$320.00 for Saint Mary’s students.

MARRIED STUDENT TICKETS. Spouse/child booklets are non-transferable. They are for the personal use of you and your spouse (or your child, 16 years of age or younger). Transfer of the booklet will result in confiscation. Your spouse (or your child) must be accompanied by you for admission into the stadium. Both you and your spouse (or your child) will be required to show I.D. to enter the stadium.
