Irish Return Home To Face Ohio State In Two-Game Series At The Joyce Center

- Notre Dame picks up three-of-four points on the road at Alaska and is 3-1-2 over the last six games.
- Mark Van Guilder named one of 10 finalists for Lowe's Senior CLASS Award.
- Irish now 10-5-1 on the road; just ninth time in program's 40-year history that team has won 10 or more away from home.

IRISH LOOK TO CLINCH FIRST ROUND BYE: Notre Dame returns home from their weekend in Alaska, looking to clinch fourth place in the CCHA and a first-round bye in the playoffs when they play host to the Ohio State Buckeyes. The two teams will meet on Fri.-Sat., Feb. 22-23 at the Joyce Center. Friday's game has a 7:35 p.m. starting time and Saturday's contest will begin at 7:05 p.m. The opening game of the series will be televised live by Comcast Local with Ben Holden and Sean Ritchlin calling the action. That game can be seen in South Bend on Comcast Cable channel 3. Saturday's game will have live video streaming that is free on the Notre Dame website at und.com. The Irish enter the week with a 21-10-3 overall record and are 14-7-3 in the CCHA, good for 31 points with four games left to play. They are four points behind Miami and Michigan State as both teams are tied for second with 35 points. First-place Michigan has 40 points. Notre Dame leads fifth-place Nebraska-Omaha (26) by five points and have two games in hand. The Irish can not be caught by the Mavericks. They lead sixth-place Bowling Green and Ferris State (24) by seven points. Any combination of Irish wins or ties or Falcon losses or ties equaling one point will eliminate Bowling Green while the Irish need any combination of two points versus Ferris State to clinch the spot. Ohio State is currently 10-21-3 overall and 6-16-2 in the conference. The Buckeyes have 14 points and are in 10th place.

IRISH VERSUS BUCKEYES: Notre Dame and Ohio State have met 55 times in the all-time series with the Buckeyes holding a 25-23-7 edge. In games played at the Joyce Center, the series is even at 11-11-2. The teams met twice last season on Nov. 3-4, in Columbus with the Irish winning, 4-2, and then getting a 1-1 tie in the second game. Over the last three meetings, Notre Dame is 2-0-1 vs. OSU. The three-game unbeaten streak that started in 2005-06, ended a seven-game Ohio State winning streak and a span of 17 games from 2000-01 to '05-'06 that saw the Irish win just one game (1-13-3). Notre Dame has not won at the Joyce Center against the Buckeyes since Oct. 23, 1998 (3-0), going 0-6-2 in the last eight games played in South Bend, Ind. The last time Ohio State won at the Joyce Center was the last time the Buckeyes played there, Nov. 26, 2005, a 5-2 victory.

REMAINING SCHEDULE: Notre Dame plays three of its final four games at home. The Irish play host to Ohio State this weekend (Feb. 22-23) before closing out the season with a home-and-home series with Western Michigan. On Feb. 29, the two teams will meet at Kalamazoo with the regular-season finale set for March 1 at the Joyce Center.

MAGIC NUMBERS: With four games left to play on the 2007-08 schedule the Irish have their sights set on capturing one of the top four spots in the CCHA to get a first-round playoff bye and home ice in the second round. Here's the magic numbers (total points needed via Irish wins or opponent losses) for the Irish to clinch the fourth spot.

MILESTONE: Notre Dame head coach **Jeff Jackson** needs just two more wins to give him 250 for his nine-year collegiate coaching career. Jackson brings a 248-88-35 overall record into Saturday's game with Alaska. His .716 winning percentage is tops among active Division I coaches. In three seasons behind the Notre Dame bench, Jackson's teams own a 66-36-10 record.

NINTH IN THE NATION: Notre Dame remains ninth in the nation in both *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls, following a 2-1 win and a 1-1 tie at Alaska last weekend.

ALASKA RECAP:

Friday, Feb. 15 - Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** scored with 5:11 left on the clock on Friday night to give Notre Dame a 2-1 win over Alaska. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** found Thang in the slot with a back-hand pass and the Irish left wing scored his team-high 15th goal of the year. **Garrett Regan (Jr., Hastings, Minn.)** gave Notre Dame the early lead when he scored a first-period power-play goal at 17:15 for his seventh lamplighter of the year. The Nanooks got the equalizer at 10:19 of the third period on Nathan Lawrence's sixth goal. **Jordan Pearce (Jr., Anchorage, Alaska)** equaled a season high with 32 saves. Wylie Rogers stopped 28-of-30 Notre Dame shots in the game as Alaska out shot the Irish, 33-30, in the game.

Saturday, Feb. 16 - Senior **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)** scored the game-tying goal at 9:55 of the third period to give Notre Dame a 1-1 tie in Saturday's game with the Nanooks. Alaska got its only goal of the game at 8:24 of the first period on a Landon Novotney power-play goal. Goaltender Wylie Rogers made the 1-0 lead standup until Van Guilder scored his power-play goal. On the night, Notre Dame out shot Alaska by a 41-14 margin. Rogers made 40 saves in the tie while **Jordan Pearce** made 13 for Notre Dame. The Irish were 1-for-8 on the power play while the Nanooks were 1-for-5.

NANOOKS NUMBER: The win and the tie at Alaska improved Notre Dame to 7-0-1 in its last eight meetings with the Nanooks. The Irish were 6-0-0 in 2006-07, playing Alaska in four regular-season games and two CCHA playoff contests.

GOING HOME: Irish goaltender **Jordan Pearce** had a successful return to his home state last weekend, picking up a win and a tie versus Alaska. The Anchorage, Alaska native is now 2-0-1 in his three games at the Carlson Center. He won his first game there last season, a 3-2 overtime game.

THE LEADER: In CCHA conference games this season, Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** leads the conference with a 1.81 goals-against average. In 22 CCHA games (1,290:54 minutes), Pearce has given up 39 goals. He leads Michigan's Billy Sauer and Michigan State's Jeff Lerg as both have 1.93 goals-against averages in conference play.

CLUTCH SCORER: **Ryan Thang's** goal with 5:11 left in Friday's win over Alaska proved to be the game-winning goal. On the season, Thang now has 15 goals with five coming as game winners and one as a game-tying goal. On Jan. 13, he scored with 38 seconds left versus Michigan State for a 1-1 tie. In 76 career games, the sophomore left wing has 35 goals with 16 coming on the power play and 11 of them game winners. His 11 game winners rank him sixth all-time at Notre Dame in the game-winning goals department for the Irish.

VAN GUILDER IN FINAL 10: Notre Dame team captain **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** has been selected as one of the 10 finalists for the Lowe's Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award. Selected along with Van Guilder are: Mark Dekanich (Colgate), Bryce Hollweg (Army), Peter Mannino (Denver), Marty Mjelleli (St. Cloud State), Justin Pesony (St. Lawrence), Kevin Porter (Michigan), Frank Schiavone (Air Force), Topher Scott (Cornell) and Landis Stanki-vech (Princeton). The 10 players will go on a ballot for nationwide voting that will begin on Feb. 14 and conclude on March 28. Fan balloting is available on the award's website at www.seniorclassaward.com. The CLASS award was designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elects to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. This award provides a fitting honor for a senior leader that has stood up to the challenge. In the end, the award hopes to recognize the prestige and dignity of being a senior hockey player at the college level. Former Irish goaltender **David Brown '07** won the Lowe's Senior CLASS award following the 2006-07 season.

IRON MAN: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** has his sights set on Notre Dame's all-time record for most consecutive games played. The record of 153 straight games was set by **Tim Wallace '06** who played in every game of his career - 153 straight. Van Guilder has now played in every game of his career - 150 consecutive games played through the first 34 games this year.

SECOND HALF NUMBERS: After starting the 2007-08 season with a 16-4-0 record through Dec. 8, the Irish are 5-6-3 during the second half. Over the last six games, Notre Dame is 3-1-2. During the second half of the season that started on Dec. 29, the Irish have now scored 32 goals (2.29) while giving up 31 (2.21). In the first half of the year (20 games) the Irish averaged 3.55 goals per game and were ranked third in the country in scoring. They are now 17th, averaging 3.03 goals-per-game.

TAKE THE HIGHWAY: With the win and tie at Alaska, Notre Dame is now 10-5-1 (.656) on the road this season. A year ago, the Irish were 12-4-1 (.735) away from the Joyce Center. The 12 road wins equaled a school record (1979-80 and 1997-98) for road wins. Only the 1983-84 team's 10-3-1 road mark (.750) is better. The 10 road wins mark the ninth time in the program's history that the Irish have had 10 or more road wins in a season.

ALL TIED UP: Notre Dame's 1-1 overtime tie with Alaska was the third overtime game for the Irish this season. They have a 2-2 tie at home with Ferris State (Feb. 9) and a 1-1 tie at Michigan State (Jan. 13). A year ago, Notre Dame was 3-1-3 in overtime. The three overtime wins were the most for the Irish in a single season. In two-plus seasons under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, Notre Dame is 3-1-10 in extra play.

BACK ON TRACK: Junior left wing **Garrett Regan** snapped a 12-game goal less drought in Friday's 2-1 win over Alaska. Regan had not scored in a regular-season game since Dec. 8 at Princeton. He did have a goal and an assist in Notre Dame's 2-1 overtime exhibition win against the U.S. Under-18 team on Feb. 1.

PERSONAL STREAK: Notre Dame goaltender **Jordan Pearce** is now 3-1-2 in his last six starts. In those games, he has a 1.79 goals-against average and a .929 save percentage. Earlier this season, Pearce had a personal seven-game winning streak between Nov. 16 and Dec. 8. During the streak, Pearce was 7-0-0 with a 1.72 goals-against average and a .902 save percentage. For the season, Pearce is 17-9-3 with a 1.97 goals-against average and a .915 save percentage with two shutouts.

ON THE PLUS SIDE: Senior defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** is one of the CCHA's top defensive defensemen. As a junior, he was a finalist for the conference's top defensive defenseman award. This season, Sheahan continues to be a force on the Irish blue line. He is currently +20 for the year to lead the team in that category. His +20 mark ranks him sixth overall in the CCHA.

ONE-GOAL GAMES: Notre Dame's 2-1 on Feb. 15 was the 11th one-goal decision that the Irish have been involved in this season. They started the year by going 6-0 in one-goal games and are now 8-3 on the season.

THE GOOD AND THE BAD: Through the first 32 games of the season, when the Irish are good, they are very good. In the 21 wins, Notre Dame has scored 85 goals (4.05 per game). In the 10 losses and three ties, Notre Dame has scored just 18 goals for a 1.38 goals-per game mark. In the 21 wins, the Irish have given up just 30 goals (1.43 goals-against average) while in the 10 losses and three ties, they have given up 39 goals (3.00 goals against). The 2-1 loss to Northern Michigan on Jan. 4 marked the first time all season that the Irish lost a game when giving up two goals or less.

THE CENTURY CLUB: Notre Dame's "Century Club" added its newest member on Nov. 24 when junior all-CCHA, All-American and Hobey Baker candidate **Erik Condra** recorded an assist versus R.P.I. In 112 career games, Condra is now 33rd on the all-time points list with 115 career points. His 83 assists rank him 21st on the all-time assist list. For the third season in a row, Condra leads the Irish in scoring as he now has 12 goals and 21 assists for 34 points in 32 games. Here's who is ahead of Condra on the all-time points list.

MR. CONSISTENT: Sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** has proven to be one of the CCHA's most consistent defensemen this season. A two-time CCHA defenseman of the week this season, Lawson leads all Notre Dame defensemen in scoring with three goals and 15 assists for 18 points. In the series against Alaska, Lawson set up Ryan Thang's game winner in the Feb. 15, 2-1 win, then set up Mark Van Guilder's game-tying goal in the 1-1 tie on Feb. 16. Already this year, he has a power-play goal and a pair of game-winning goals. Lawson's 18 points ranks him eighth among CCHA defensemen this season. He is fourth on the team with a +10 on the year.

BALANCED ATTACK: Notre Dame comes into the weekend series with Ohio State ranked 17th in the nation in scoring with 3.03 goals per game. With 103 goals in 34 games, the Irish have just three players with 10 or more goals this season - **Ryan Thang** with 15, **Erik Condra** with 12 and **Mark Van Guilder** with 10. The Irish have accumulated their 103 goals this year with 10 players on the roster having five goals or more.

THE PENALTY KILL: Through the first 34 games of the season, Notre Dame ranks first in the CCHA and is tied for fourth in the nation in killing penalties. The Irish have killed 139-of-156 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate. The Irish also are tied for second on the national level with eight short-handed goals.

20 WINS: Notre Dame comes into the series with Ohio State with 21 wins on the season. Combined with last year's 32-win year, Notre Dame now has back-to-back 20-win campaigns for the first time in the program's 40-year history.

BIG MAC GOAL: **Brock Sheahan's** first goal in 34 games on Friday, Feb. 8 not only brought a smile to the senior defenseman's face, but made 2,857 fans happy also. Sheahan's goal in the final minute of the second period earned each fan a free Big Mac courtesy of "McDonald's Magic Minute," promotion that is a regular in-game promotion at all Irish home games.

HOT HANDS: Notre Dame's trio of left wing **Dan Kissel (So., Crestwood, Ill.)**, center **Christian Hanson (Jr., Venetia, Pa.)** and right wing **Evan Rankin (Sr., Portage, Mich.)** all have career highs offensively for the Irish this season. Kissel ranks sixth on the team in scoring with six goals and 11 assists for 17 points. He is followed by Hanson who has career highs in goals (9), assists (7) and points (16). Rankin has six goals and nine assists for 15 points, all career highs.

GETTING THE BOUNCES: Sophomore center **Kevin Deeth** is fourth on the Irish in scoring with eight goals and 13 assists for 21 points. Over his last 17 games, the speedy Deeth has scored eight times and added five assists for 13 points. Four of his eight goals have come on the power play while one was short-handed.

HOME SWEET HOME: After 12 home games this season, Notre Dame is 8-2-2 (.750) at the Joyce Center. A year ago, Notre Dame was 13-2-2 at home for an .824 winning percentage. That was the best mark since the 2003-04 season when the Irish were 14-2-2 at the Joyce Center for an .833 winning percentage. Only two other Irish teams have had better home records - 1987-88 team was 18-2-0 (.900) and the 1969-70 team was 12-1-1 (.893).

FRIENDLY CONFINES: Notre Dame has had eight sellouts (2,713) in its first 13 home games (including the exhibition game against the U.S. Under-18 Team) and just missed a ninth against Bowling Green on Nov. 20 with a crowd of 2,711 in attendance. The Irish have had four consecutive crowds of 2,857 with six of the eight sellouts being standing room only (2,857). The 2,857 are the largest crowds to watch a Notre Dame hockey game since March 3, 1995 when 3,310 saw the Irish defeat Illinois-Chicago. Following that season, new seating was installed, reducing capacity at the Joyce Center. At the beginning of November, a new section of seating was added to the student section to increase the capacity. Through 13 games this year, the Irish are averaging 2,705 fans per game.

MORE THAN FIVE: The five goals given up by **Jordan Pearce** in the 5-3 loss to Ferris State on Feb. 8 marked the first time that an Irish goaltender had given up five goals or more in a game since Nov. 4, 2005 when **David Brown '07**, surrendered seven in an 8-5 loss to Michigan at the Joyce Center.

DEFENSIVE SCORING: Irish defensemen **Brock Sheahan** and **Ian Cole** each scored goals in the weekend series with Ferris State, giving Notre Dame defensemen 15 goals this season. Through the first 34 games, Notre Dame's defense has accounted for 15 of the team's 103 goals (14.6%), 47-of-163 assists (28.8%) and 62-of-266 points (23.3%). **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** leads the group with 3-15-18 and is followed by Sheahan with one goal and 10 assists for 11 points. **Dan VeNard (5-5-10)**, **Cole (4-5-9)** and **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** with nine assists all have nine points on the year. Each have nine assists for nine point on the year. **Teddy Ruth (Fr., Naperville, Ill.)** checks in with a goal and two assists while **Luke Lucyk (Jr., Fox Point, Wis.)** has a goal and an assist.

FIRING AWAY: The 36 shots on goal that Ferris State recorded in Friday's 5-3 loss for Notre Dame were the most shots given up by the Irish in a game this season. The previous season high was 35 at Miami on Nov. 10.

FIVE-GOAL NIGHTS: The five goals scored by Ferris State on Feb. 8 marks just the third time in the last two seasons that Notre Dame has given up five goals in a game and the Bulldogs have done it twice. On Feb. 23, 2007, Ferris State defeated Notre Dame, 5-2. On Jan. 19 of this season, Michigan downed the Irish, 5-1, for the third time its happened. Under head coach **Jeff Jackson**, the Irish have given up five or more in a game just eight times in his three seasons (110 games) behind the bench.

ON A ROLL: Notre Dame's two-game series sweep of Bowling Green on Jan. 25-26 gives the Irish a 12-game unbeaten streak (11-0-1) against the Falcons. That streak started with the 2005-06 season. The Irish are also 8-0-0 versus Bowling Green over the last two campaigns.

HOBEBY HOPEFULS: Fan voting has begun for the 2008 Hobey Baker Award at www.hobeybaker.com. Two Notre Dame players are on the ballot - junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** and senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder (Roseville, Minn.)**.

PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Two Irish players were honored by the CCHA as players of the week for the week ending Jan. 27. Defenseman **Brock Sheahan (Sr., Lethbridge, Alb.)** was selected as the conference's defenseman of the week. Freshman right wing **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** was selected as the CCHA rookie of the week. In the Bowling Green series, Sheahan had an assist in each game, blocked three shots and was +3 while playing a key role in a 12-for-12 penalty-killing weekend. Ryan had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2. He had an assist in the 6-1 win on Friday and then had a career-best three-point game (2 ppg, 1 assist) in the 4-1 win on Saturday night.

BAD BOYS: Notre Dame and Bowling Green combined for 51 penalties and 157 minutes in the two-game series on Jan. 25-26. On Friday night, the two teams had 23 penalties for 97 minutes with the Falcons getting 10-for-44 and the Irish a season-high 13-for-57. On Saturday, Notre Dame had just seven for 14 minutes while the Falcons had an opponent's season high of 11-for-46 minutes.

SHINNY ANYONE?: On Monday, Jan. 21, Notre Dame's practice had a different look. The Irish went back to their hockey roots that day as they ventured to nearby Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind., to play a little shinny on the outdoor rink. Complete with temperatures in the single digits, stocking caps, hot chocolate and a great deal of laughter, the Irish spent some time having fun playing the game they love. Smiles were the number one priority and Monday's practice was a smashing success in that area.

THE KISSEL EFFECT: Sophomore left wing **Dan Kissel** has career highs in assists (11) and points (17) this season. For his career, Kissel has played in 50 games with 12 goals and 14 assists for 26 points. Of his 12 goals, he has two power-play goals, two shorthanded tallies and four game winners.

HOCKEY HUMANITARIAN: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was one of 22 nominees for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award that goes to college hockey's "top citizen". The list was cut to 10 on Jan. 28 and VeNard did not advance. The Irish alternate captain has been heavily involved in community service work in and around the Notre Dame campus during his career. He also serves as the president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).

BUMP IN THE ROAD: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** saw his four-game winning streak snapped on Jan. 19 in the 5-1 loss to Michigan. The rookie netminder played 35:16 of the game, giving up four goals on 19 shots. In the first four starts of his career, Phillips was 4-0-0 with a 0.75 goals-against average and a .958 with one shutout. His numbers are currently 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage.

RANKINGS UPDATE: Notre Dame opened the 2007-08 season ranked ninth in the nation by both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and USCHO.com/CSTV polls. The Irish finished the 2006-07 season ranked fourth in the final *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll that included the NCAA tournament. The Irish finished the year first in the USCHO.com/CSTV polls that ended with the end of the CCHA Tournament. In all, Notre Dame was ranked for 20 consecutive weeks and was ranked No.1 for seven straight weeks from Feb. 5 to March 25. The Irish have been ranked every week so far this season. RECORD STREAK: Notre Dame's nine-game winning streak from Nov. 16 through Dec. 8 was the longest for the Irish since a 14-game streak from Dec. 11, 1987 to Feb. 13, 1988. During that time, the Irish were a Division I Independent. The streak is the longest for the Irish as a member of the CCHA or the WCHA.

THREE PPG AGAINST: In the 4-3 loss to Massachusetts on Dec. 29, the Irish gave up three power-play goals to the Minutemen, the first time that has happened since Dec. 17, 2005, in a 4-0 loss to Lake Superior.

VERSUS THE BEST: Notre Dame failed to record a win in the weekend series with top-ranked Michigan last weekend, the second time this year that the Irish faced the nation's top-ranked team. On Nov. 9-10, Notre Dame met No. 1 ranked Miami twice in Oxford, Ohio, defeating the RedHawks, 2-1, on Nov. 9 before dropping a 3-1 decision at Miami on Nov. 10. The Nov. 9 win marked the 10th time in the program's history that the Irish knocked off a top-ranked team. Before losing on Nov. 10, Notre Dame had won four straight versus top 10 teams. BERGMAN RETURNS TO USHL: Freshman left wing **Robin Bergman (Stockholm, Sweden)** has left the Notre Dame hockey team and returned to the United States Hockey League (USHL). He will play for the Cedar Rapids Rough Riders, the team he played for last season. In 20 games at Notre Dame, Bergman had one goal and six assists for seven points and was +3 on the year. With Cedar Rapids last season, Bergman had 26 goals and 17 assists for 43 points to finish fourth on the team in scoring.

WELCOME BACK: Freshman defenseman **Ian Cole** returned to the Notre Dame lineup at Michigan State (Jan. 11) after participating in the World Junior Championships with the U.S. Junior National Team. At the World Championships, Cole played in all six games and had no points with six penalty minutes as the United States finished fourth in the tournament. He missed four games – the two games at the Lightning College Hockey Classic and the Northern Michigan series. Also returning on Friday night was fellow freshman defender **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Ruth missed five games (Princeton, Lightning College Classic and two with Northern Michigan) due to an injury.

THE REPLACEMENTS: With **Ian Cole** at the World Junior Championships and **Teddy Ruth** sidelined with an injury, junior **Luke Lucyk (Fox Point, Wis.)** and sophomore **Stewart Carlin (Jeannette, Pa.)** stepped into the Notre Dame lineup and did yeoman's work on the blue line between Dec. 8 and Jan. 5. In five games, Lucyk had a goal and an assist, had one shot on goal and was +3. Carlin played in four games, had eight shots on goal and was +1 in his playing time. He remained in the lineup for the Jan. 11 game at Michigan State.

NO GOALS FOR YOU: Junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce** recorded his second shutout of the season in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. The shutout also was the fourth of his career and moved him into a tie for third with **Mark Kronholm '74** on Notre Dame's all-time shutout list. He trails just **Morgan Cey '05** (2nd with 6) and **David Brown '07** (first with 12). Pearce's first career shutout came in his second career game, a 2-0, 27-save win over Princeton on Oct. 28, 2005. Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** recorded his first career shutout on Dec. 8 with a 24-save, 7-0 whitewashing of the Princeton Tigers.

LETTERS OF INTENT: Irish head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that three players have signed national letters of intent in the early signing period to attend Notre Dame beginning in the fall of 2008. The trio - defenseman **Sean Lorenz (Littleton, Colo.)** and **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** and forward **Patrick Gaul (Pittsburgh, Pa.)** - will join **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** who signed in Nov. of 2007 but deferred until next fall. Lorenz and Gaul are members of the U.S. National Team Development Program's Under-18 team. Ringel plays in the North American Hockey League for the Mahoning Valley Phantoms and Maday is a member of the Waterloo Black Hawks of the United States Hockey League (USHL). Ringel was ranked 163rd (sixth round) among North Americans in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings that were released in January.

TOURNAMENT VETS: The Lightning College Hockey Classic was the third in-season tournament for the Irish this season. They opened the year at the Lefty McFadden Classic in Dayton, Ohio, losing to Wisconsin, 4-1, before defeating Mercyhurst, 4-0, to take third place. Over Thanksgiving, the Irish played in the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, taking the championship with wins over Alabama-Huntsville (4-1) and Rensselaer (4-3). At Tampa, Notre Dame dropped a 4-3 decision to Massachusetts and then took third place with a 3-1 win over Rensselaer.

TOURNEY RESULTS: Notre Dame has now participated in 30 in-season tournaments in the program's 40-year history, winning six times and finishing second, six times. The Irish have been third a total of seven times and there have been 11 fourth-place finishes. Notre Dame has now won two of the last four in-season tournaments that the Irish have played in, winning the 2006 Lightning Collegiate Hockey Classic in Oct. of 2006 in Tampa, Fla and the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament, Nov. 24-25, 2007 in Troy, N.Y. All time, the Irish are 23-34-3 in tournament play.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Notre Dame placed two players on the 2007 Lightning College Hockey Classic all-tournament team. Irish forward **Erik Condra** and defenseman **Luke Lucyk** were named to the all-tournament team after helping Notre Dame to a 1-1 record. Condra had two goals and one assist in the tournament, took nine shots and was +3 on the weekend. Lucyk had one goal in two games and was +2 in the two games. They were joined by RPI goaltender Mathias Lange, Colorado College defenseman Nate Prosser and Colorado College forwards Chad Rau and Jimmy Kilpatrick. UMass forward Matt Burto, who scored the game winner in the championship game was the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

CCHA DEFENSEMAN OF THE WEEK: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)** was named the CCHA defenseman of the week for the week ending Dec. 9. In the weekend sweep at Princeton, VeNard had two goals and two assists for four points and was +2 on the weekend. His three-point game on Dec. 8 in Notre Dame's 7-0 win was a career high for the blueliner. He now has five goals and three assists for eight points in 20 games this year. In 71 career games prior to this season, VeNard had two goals and six assists for eight points.

TWO SHORTIES: **Mark Van Guilder** and **Ryan Thang** each scored short-handed goals in the 5-0 win over Nebraska-Omaha on Dec. 1. That marked the first time the Irish had scored a pair of short-handed goals in a game since Dec. 20, 2000 when **Brett Lebda '04** and **Dan Carlson '01** scored short-handed goals in a 7-3 win at Nebraska-Omaha. As a team, the Irish have seven short-handed goals, the most of any team in the nation.

NIFTY NOVEMBER: Notre Dame finished November with a 9-1-0 record, including wins in the last six straight. Some other numbers for the month: The Irish were 7-1-0 in the CCHA and 5-0-0 at home while going 3-1-0 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites ... the Irish out scored the opposition by a 38-19 margin (3.8 gpg to 1.9 gpg) ... Notre Dame out shot the opposition by a 31.0 - 20.1 margin ... the Irish were 13-for-52 on the power play (25.0%) and killed 41-of-46 opponent power plays for an 89.1% success rate ... **Erik Condra (Jr., Livonia, Mich.)** led the team in scoring with six goals and 10 assists for 16 points and was followed by **Kevin Deeth (So., Gig Harbor, Wash.)**, **Mark Van Guilder (Sr., Roseville, Minn.)** and **Kyle Lawson (So., New Hudson, Mich.)** with 10 points each ... **Jordan Pearce** was 7-1-0 with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .900 save percentage ... **Brad Phillips (Fr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** was 2-0-0 with a 1.00 goals-against and a .935 save percentage.

TWO-TIMER: Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** has been named the CCHA defenseman of the week twice this season (Nov. 25 and Nov. 18). Lawson, who helped the Irish to three wins from Nov. 20-24, had one goal and three assists for four points and was +2. In the Nov. 20, 2-1 win over Bowling Green, Lawson was +1 and scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 victory. Versus Alabama-Huntsville on Nov. 23, Lawson was even and set up one goal. In the championship game against Rensselaer, Lawson set up two goals, including **Ryan Thang** game winner with 3:56 left in the game and was +1.

TOURNAMENT HARDWARE: Three Notre Dame players were named to the all-tournament team at the Rensselaer Holiday Tournament. Junior right wing **Erik Condra** recorded three assists on the weekend and was the lone Irish forward selected. Defensemen **Brett Blatchford (So., Temperance, Mich.)** and **Ian Cole** joined Condra on the team. Sophomore left wing **Ryan Thang** was named the tournament MVP after scoring the game-winning goal in each of Notre Dame's victories.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Notre Dame's 44 shots in the Nov. 16 win over Western Michigan are a season high for the Irish. The 11 shots given up by Notre Dame on Nov. 17 are the fewest the Irish have given up this season. Notre Dame's 11 power-play chances against Western Michigan (Nov. 16) were also a season high.

ON THE MARK: Senior center **Mark Van Guilder** recorded the second four-point game of his career on Nov. 1 against Lake Superior State. Van Guilder scored twice and set up two others in the game. His previous four-point night came at Bowling Green on Feb. 17, 2006 as a sophomore when he had three goals and an assist against the Falcons. The Notre Dame captain is second in goals (8) and leads the team in power-play goals (5) this season.

LONG TIME COMING: Notre Dame's 4-3 win over Denver on Oct. 18 snapped a 10-game (0-9-1) winless streak for the Irish against the Pioneers. The last time they had beaten Denver was Nov. 3, 1978, a 3-2 win at the Joyce Center. Notre Dame and Denver played in the WCHA for 10 years from 1971-81 before the Irish left for the CCHA. Prior to last weekend's series, the two teams had met just three times with Denver going 2-0-1.

CAPTAINS: Senior right wing **Mark Van Guilder** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2007-08 season. Joining Van Guilder as alternate captains in '07-'08, are senior defensemen **Brock Sheahan (Lethbridge, Alb.)** and **Dan VeNard (Vernon Hills, Ill.)**. They will be joined by junior forward **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)**. This is the first season for all four players to serve as captains at Notre Dame.

MR PRESIDENT: Senior defenseman **Dan VeNard** has been named president of Notre Dame's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) for the 2007-08 school year. VeNard served as hockey's representative to the group last season and was selected president by the group in M. The committee represents Notre Dame's student-athletes with the Irish athletic department.

NHL DRAFTEES: The Irish have seven players on the 2007-08 roster who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Last June, a total of five Notre Dame players were selected. Leading the way was freshman defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** who was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow freshman defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. Sophomore **Ryan Thang (Edina, Minn.)** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Incoming freshman **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**

rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the last draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Those five join junior right wing **Erik Condra (Livonia, Mich.)** who was selected in the seventh round, 211th overall by the Ottawa Senators in 2006 and sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** who was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

FAMILY MATTERS: Two members of the Notre Dame hockey team – forwards **Erik Condra** and **Garrett Regan (Hastings, Minn.)** – have family ties to the Irish hockey program. Condra's uncle is All-American forward **Kirt Bjork ('83)** who played at Notre Dame from 1979-83. He scored 76 goals with 85 assists for 161 career points in 141 career games. He took All-America honors in 1983 when he had 29 goals and 34 assists for 63 points. Regan's uncle - **Sean Regan** - was a defenseman for the Irish from 1981-83 before finishing his career at the University of Minnesota.

MORE FAMILY MATTERS: Freshman goaltender **Brad Phillips** also has a family connection to Notre Dame. His uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak** who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988.

PUTTING ON THE FOIL: Notre Dame junior **Christian Hanson (Venetia, Pa.)** is the sixth player to play for the Irish whose father played in the National Hockey League. His father, **Dave Hanson**, played 10 years of professional hockey between 1974-75 and 1983-84, including stints with the Detroit Red Wings and the Minnesota North Stars and the World Hockey Association's (WHA) Minnesota Fighting Saints and the New England Whalers. Fans might also be familiar with Dave Hanson, as one of the famed Hanson Brothers, made famous in the hockey movie - Slapshot. Hanson currently is the director of the Island Sports Center, home of Robert Morris University's hockey team, in suburban Pittsburgh.

THE IRISH AND THE U.S. NATIONAL TEAM DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM: Notre Dame's current roster includes five players who have past experience with USA Hockey, as members of the National Team Development Program (NTDP). Since the program began, the Irish have had a total of 19 NTDP alums grace their roster. The current contingent includes junior goaltender **Jordan Pearce**, sophomore defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** and freshmen defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** plus goaltender **Brad Phillips**. Other NTDP alums who played at Notre Dame include: **Brett Henning (1997-98)**, **Michael Chin (1997-98)**, **Connor Dunlop (1997-99)**, **Paul Harris (1997-99)**, **John Wroblewski (1997-99)**, **Neil Komadoski (1998-2000)**, **Brett Lebda (1998-2000)**, **Rob Globke (1998-2000)**, **Derek Smith (2000-01)** and **Tim Wallace (2002-06)**, **Noah Babin (2003-07)**, **Michael Bartlett (2003-07)**, **Tom Sawatske (2005-07)** and **Josh Sciba (2003-07)**.
