No. 10 Notre Dame Closes Out Regular Season Versus No. 15 Cornell

• Irish look to improve NCAA Tournament chances versus the Big Red

- Notre Dame drops heartbreaker in BIG EAST Tournament, a 15-14 loss to Georgetown in three overtimes.
- Caitlin McKinney selected BIG EAST midfielder of the year; Tracy Coyne is BIG EAST coach of the year.

SENIOR DAY AT NOTRE DAME: The Notre Dame women's lacrosse team closes out the 2008 regular season by playing host to the Cornell Big Red. The two teams will meet on Saturday, May 3 at 12:00 noon at Notre Dame's Alumni Field, home of the Irish soccer teams. Notre Dame (11-6) will look to bounce back from last Friday's heartbreaking, 15-14, three-overtime loss to Georgetown in the BIG EAST semifinals. Cornell comes into Saturday's game with a 10-5 overall record after defeatting Harvard last Saturday, 12-9, to finish the Ivy League schedule with a 5-2 record, good for second place in the conference. The Irish enter the weekend ranked 10th in both the IWLCA and the *Inside Lacrosse* polls. They are currently ranked 13th in the NCAA RPI. Cornell is ranked 15th by the IWLCA and 14th by *Inside Lacrosse*. The Big Red are ninth in the NCAA RPI rankings.

NOTRE DAME VS. CORNELL: The Irish and Big Red have met seven times in the all-time series with Notre Dame holding a 4-3 edge. At home, the Irish are 3-1 while at Ithaca, N.Y., they are just 1-2. The last time the two teams met at Notre Dame was on May 14, 2006, in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, with the Irish taking a 16-8 win. Last year, the Irish won for the first time in three games at Ithaca, taking a 13-9 win on March 4, 2007.

SENIOR DAY: Five Notre Dame seniors will play their final home game on Saturday afternoon against Cornell. The group includes midfielder **Caitlin McKinney (Lafayette Hill, Pa.)**, attack **Heather Ferguson (Newtown Square, Pa.)**, defender **Lindsey Ferguson (Newtown Square, Pa.)**, attack **Julie Foote (Suffern, N.Y.)** and defender **Becky Ranck (Radnor, Pa.)**. During their Notre Dame careers, the group has a record of 40-28 with a trip to the NCAA Women's Lacrosse Final Four in 2006.

BIG EAST TOURNAMENT RECAP: Notre Dame played host to the 2008 BIG EAST Tournament, held at Notre Dame Stadium on April 25 and 27 with the tournament featuring Syracuse, Georgetown, Rutgers and the Irish. In the opening semifinal game, Syracuse handed Rutgers a 22-7 loss. In the nightcap, Notre Dame and Georgetown hooked up for a thriller with the Hoyas prevailing, 15-14, scoring the winning goal at 71:14. The Irish jumped out to 8-1 and 9-2 leads in the opening half only to see Georgetown cut the margin to 10-6 at halftime. The Hoyas would score five of the first six goals in the second half to tie the score at 11-11 with 18:51 left. Jillian Byers (Jr., Northport, N.Y.) scored with 11:21 left to give the Irish a 12-11 lead only to see Mary Beth Brophy and Jordy Kirr score the next two goals for a 13-12 Hoya lead. Caitlin McKinney (Sr., Lafayette Hill, Pa.) scored on a free-position shot with 1:17 left to tie the game at 13-13. In the first overtime, Gina Scioscia (So., Summit, N.J.) scored first at 2:52 only to be answered by Kirr at 2:37. From there, the defenses and goalkeepers took over, holding the game scoreless until 46 seconds remained in the second sudden-death period when Molly Ford scored her fourth of the game for the game winner. Shavlyn Blaney (Fr., Stony Brook, N.Y.) led the Irish with a career-high five goals. McKinney added three goals and an assist and Scioscia scored once with four assists for a five-point night. Jane Stoeckert (Jr., Mendham, N.J.) had two goals and one assist while Byers, Heather Ferguson and Shannon Burke (Jr., Baltimore, Md.) had one goal each. The two teams each took 33 shots on goal. Erin Goodman (Jr., Cortlandt Manor, N.Y.) had 14 saves in the game. In the championship game on Sunday, the Syracuse Orange defeated Georgetown, 12-6, to win their second consecutive BIG EAST title.

THE LONGEST GAME: Notre Dame's overtime sudden-death loss to Georgetown on April 25 was the second-longest game in the program's history as the team's played 71:14 before deciding a winner. The teams played the two regulation, three-minute periods, one full sudden-death period and 2:14 of a second sudden death before Molly Ford scored for the Hoyas with 46 seconds left. The longest game in the program's histor came on April 12, 2002, when the Irish played 71:45 in a 10-9 loss at home to the Duke Blue Devils.

BIG EAST HONORS: Senior midfielder Caitlin McKinney and Irish head coach Tracy Coyne were among the major award winners at the BIG EAST postseason banquet held on April 24. McKinney was named the BIG EAST midfielder of the year. The speedster is second on the team in scoring with 38 goals and 22 assists for 60 points and ranks fifth in the conference this season. She is the third Notre Dame midfielder to be named the conference's midfielder of the year, joining Danielle Shearer '03 in 2002 and Abby Owen '04 in 2004. Coyne was selected as BIG EAST coach of the year for the third time in her 12 seasons at Notre Dame. She guide the Irish to the No. 2 seed in the BIG EAST Tournament and an 11-6 overall and 4-1 mark in the conference. She was also named coach of the year in 2004 and 2006.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Freshman **Shaylyn Blaney** and senior **Caitlyn McKinney** were selected to the BIG EAST all-tournament team for their play in the 15-14 triple-overtime loss to Georgetown. Blaney led the Irish with a career-high five-goal game while McKinney chipped in three goals and added an assist for four points in the contest.

TEWAARATON TROPHY NOMINEES: Notre Dame senior midfielder Caitlin McKinney and junior attack Jillian Byers are among 18 women's lacrosse players nominated for the Tewaaration Trophy that is awarded to the top player in the nation each year. The dynamic duo joins Crysti Foote '06 and Meredith Simon '04 as Irish players nominated for the award. Byers comes into the Cornell game, leading Notre Dame in scoring with 62 goals and 13 assists for 75 points while McKinney has 38 goals and 22 assists from her spot in the midfield. Earlier this season, both players went over 200 points for their careers with McKinney ranking second and Byers third. Byers also became the school's all-time goal-scoring leader with 174. McKinney became Notre Dame's all-time assist leader versus Georgetown and now has 77 for her career.

HEAD COACH TRACY COYNE: Tracy **Coyne** is in her 12th season at Notre Dame and her 21st year in collegiate lacrosse. Coyne brings a 224-102 (.687) career record into the regularseason finale with Cornell. On Sunday, Feb. 17, she recorded her 100th career win at Notre Dame with the 16-4 win over Duquesne. As the only head coach in the Notre Dame program's **BIG EAST HONORS:** Notre Dame saw five of its players honored by the BIG EAST Conference at the league's postseason Awards Banquet on April 24. The Irish had two unanimous first team selections and three players chosen second team. Senior **Caitlin McKinney (Lafayette Hill, Pa.)** and junior **Jillian Byers (Northport, N.Y.)** were the unanimous selections for the third consecutive year. They were joined on the second team by defensive stalwarts **Becky Ranck (Sr., Radnor, Pa.)** and **Shannon Burke (Jr., Baltimore, Md.)**. Freshman midfielder **Shaylyn Blaney (Stony Brook, Pa.)** was a second team choice in her rookie year.

history, Coyne is 109-76 (.589). A 1983 Ohio University graduate, Coyne recorded her 200th career win at the end of the 2006 season with a 16-8 win over Cornell in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament. She has guided Notre Dame to three NCAA tournament appearances (2002, 2004, 2006), including the school's first-ever NCAA finals appearance in 2006. In her first 20 years of coaching, Coyne was 23-5 in two seasons at Denison (1988-89), 91-21 in seven years at Roanoke (1990-96) and 109-76 in 12 seasons at Notre Dame. The Pittsburgh, Pa., native led Denison (1988) and Roanoke (1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1996) to the NCAA Division III tournament during stops at those schools. Covne also has coached on the international level as the head coach for the Canadian women's lacrosse national team from 1999-2005. In June of 2005, she led Team Canada to a fourth-place finish at the 2005 World Cup, her second fourth-place finish (2001) as Canada's field boss. Coyne is 4-3 all-time against Cornell.

VERSUS THE BEST: Cornell comes into this weekend's game ranked #15/#14 on the year and will be the seventh team the Irish have faced this season that was ranked. For the year, they are 2-4 versus ranked teams after losing to Georgetown, 15-14 (3ot) on April 25. The Irish also have losses to Vanderbilt, Northwestern and Syracuse on the year. Both wins against ranked teams have come on the road as the Irish own wins at Duke and Georgetown. The 2008 schedule features six teams that are currently ranked in the April 29 IWLCA rankings. 200-POINT CLUB: Senior Caitlin McKinney and junior Jillian Byers became the second and third players in Irish history to go over 200 points in their careers this season. McKinney goes into the game with Cornell with 152 career goals and 77 assists for 229 points to rank second on the all-time list. Byers has 174 goals and 45 assists for 219 career points to rank third overall. Crysti Foote '06 is the all-time leader with 237 career points.

THE PLAYMAKER: Sophomore Gina Scioscia recorded four assists and five points in the BIG EAST Tournament versus Georgetown. The four helpers moved her into second on Notre Dame's single-season assist list. In just two seasons, Scioscia now has 37 career assists and that ranks her eighth all-time at Notre Dame.

THE ROOKIE: Not to be outdone by the elder statesmen on the team, freshman midfielder Shaylyn Blaney has quietly putting together a solid rookie season. Blaney is fourth on the team with 48 points, scoring 40 goals with eight assists. Her 40 goals are the ninth best singleseason mark for the Irish and the second-best total by a freshman, trailing just Jillian Byers (54 in 2006). Her 48 points are the second best freshman total behind Byers' 78-point freshman year in 2006. Blaney has nine games this season with three or more goals and leads the team with

DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

Junior Shannon Burke was named BIG EAST defensive player of the week for the week ending April 20. In the loss to Vanderbilt, Burke had a career-high five caused turnovers and added four draw controls while picking up her first career assist. In the win at Rutgers, she scored a freeposition goal, had three ground balls and added three draw controls in the win.

STREAK BUSTERS: The two goals scored by Notre Dame in the 16-2 loss at Northwestern on April 9 were the fewest ever scored by the Irish in a game in the program's 12-year history. That game also saw the end of two long scoring streaks for the Irish. Caitlin McKinney was held off the scoresheet for the first time since April 16, 2005, a span of 51 games that saw her score 124 goals and 61 assists for 185 points. Jillian Byers also saw her 29-game streak stopped versus the Wildcats. She had 120 goals and 19 assists for 139 points in that span. McKinney's 51-game streak was the second-longest streak in the nation.

LIGHTING IT UP: With five goals versus Rutgers, junior Jillian Byers now has nine games this season with four or more goals. Byers now has 62 goals on the season and is just the second Notre Dame player to score 60 or more goals in a year as she joins Crysti Foote '06 who had 74 in 2006. Byers is the only Irish player to score 75 or more points in a season twice and is the only Notre Dame player to score 50 or more goals in three consecutive years. Her 75 points this year are the third highest total in the program's history behind Foote (114 in 2006) and her own 78-point season in 2006.

MAKING THE STOPS: Junior goalkeeper Erin Goodman has picked up 11 wins this season, giving her 22 for her career. That total ranks her third all-time at Notre Dame in career wins. In 2007, she had an 11-6 overall record and a 10.32 goalsagainst average with a .444 save percentage. She finished just one win behind Carol Dixon '06 for the most wins by an Irish goalkeeper in her first year as a starter as Dixon had 12 in 2004. Goodman set a BIG EAST record on March 25, 2007 when she held Loyola (Md.) to just one goal in an 11-1 Irish win, setting the league mark for the fewest goals given up in a game. Goodman set a career mark with 15 saves in the win over Georgetown. Her previous best was 14 saves. something she has done four times in her career - vs. Cornell (13-7 win), vs. Yale (9-7 win) and against Lovola (11-1 win) last season and on March 13 versus Delaware. As a junior, Goodman is 11-6 with a 10.47 goals-against average and a .470 save percentage. She had 14 saves in the marathon, overtime loss to Georgetown in the BIG EAST Tournament.

RANCK AND FILE: Senior defender **Becky Ranck (Radnor, Pa.)** is second on the team with 27 caused turnovers, trailing team leader **Shannon Burke** who has 29. Ranck ranks third all-time at Notre Dame with 81 career caused turnovers in her career. Both are ranked in the top five in the BIG EAST. As a team, the Irish have caused 203 turnovers while the opposition has just 118. Notre Dame ranks third in the nation in caused turnovers with 11.53 per game.

OVERTIME NUMBERS: Notre Dame's overtime loss to Georgetown on April 25 was the second overtime game of the year for the Irish as they also lost to Syracuse on March 13. Notre Dame has now played in 15 overtime games in the program's 12-year history and is 6-9 in those games. Last year, the Irish were 2-0 in overtime, taking a triple-overtime win versus James Madison (10-9) in the season opener on Feb. 18. In the second game of the year, on Feb. 24, at home, Notre Dame pulled off a 12-11 double overtime win against Stanford.

QUICK ON THE DRAW: Juniors **Shannon Burke** and **Jillian Byers** have combined this season to win 93 of Notre Dame's 242 draw controls this season. Byers leads the team with 47 while Burke is one behind with 46 on the year. The duo is in hot pursuit of Notre Dame's single-season mark of 51 that was set last season by Kaki Orr '07. Careerwise, both are now in the top 10 at Notre Dame. Byers is fifth with 94 while Burke is eighth with 85.

FIELD OF DREAMS: Ground was broken on the new home of the Notre Dame men's and women's lacrosse teams - Arlotta Stadium - on Friday, April 18. Arlotta Stadium will become the new home of the Notre Dame men's and women's lacrosse programs upon completion in June of 2009. Construction of the facility will begin in August of 2008. Conceptual plans suggest a 2,000 seat, lighted stadium that would include an artificial-turf field, locker rooms, restrooms and concession areas. The state-of-the-art facility is named after Notre Dame graduate John Arlotta, president and chief executive officer of Denverbased Coram, Inc. He and his wife, Bobbie, pledged the lead gift toward the stadium that will be built to the east of the Joyce Center as part of the University's new athletics quadrangle. The Arlotta children - Mindy, Andy and Jon - have pledged and additional gift from the Arlotta Family Foundation toward the project. In addition to their generous donation, alumni and friends of the lacrosse programs have donated over two million dollars.

FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING: Notre Dame's 10-8 win over Georgetown marked the first-ever win for the Irish over the Hoyas at Washington, D.C. The loss in the BIG EAST Tournament drops the Irish to 3-9 all-time against the Hoyas. In each of the last three seasons, the two teams have met twice, once in the regular season and once in the postseason. The Irish are now 1-4 all-time at Georgetown and 2-3 at Notre Dame with an 0-2 record on neutral fields. The Irish have now won three of the last five games in the all-time series.

DOUBLE-DIGIT WINS: With 11 wins during the 2008 season, the Irish have now recorded three consecutive double-digit win seasons for the first time in the program's history. Notre Dame had 15 wins in 2006 and 11 last year. Over the last three seasons, the Irish are 37-16 (.698) record.

LOWEST OF LOWS: The two goals scored by Notre Dame versus Nortwestern were the fewest goals ever scored by the Irish in the 12-year history of the program. The previous low was three goals with the Irish being held to that total, three times during the 2000 season.

VERSUS NO. 1: Notre Dame's game with Northwestern on April 9 marked just the fourth time that the Irish have played the No. 1 ranked team in the country in the 12-year history of the program. With the loss to the Wildcats, the Irish are now 0-4 versus top-ranked teams. They have faced Northwestern three times as a No. 1 team with Princeton being the fourth team ranked No. 1 when the Irish faced the Tigers in the 2002 NCAA Tournament.

WEEKLY HONORS: Freshman **Shaylyn Blaney** and junior goalkeeper **Erin Goodman** were honored for their play in the win against Georgetown. On April 12, Blaney was named rookie of the week for the second week in a row by Womens Lax.com after scoring three goals in the win over Georgetown. Goodman was named *Inside Lacrosse*/Nike player of the week for her play in the win over Georgetown. Goodman had a career high 15 saves in the win.

MORE ON DRAWS: Junior **Beth Koloup** (**Phoenix**, **Md.**) grabbed a career-high six draw controls in the loss at Northwestern and now has 27 on the season. She started the year with just two draw controls in her career.

BIG EAST PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Notre Dame has seen two of its players selected as BIG EAST offensive and defensive players of the week over the past four weeks. Junior attack **Jillian Byers (Northport, N.Y.)** was named BIG EAST offensive player of the week for the week ending March 30 and freshman midfielder Kailene Abt (Huntington, N.Y.) was the BIG EAST defensive player of the week for March 23. Byers took honors last week by scoring 11 goals with two assists for 13 points in wins over Hofstra and Connecticut. She had four goals with one assist in the 14-13 win over Hofstra and then equaled her season best with an eight-point game (7g, 1a) in the 18-11 win at Connecticut. She had one ground ball, seven draw controls and one caused turnover in the two games. Abt took defensive honors the previous week, playing a key role off the bench in the 13-10 win over Loyola (Md.). In that game, Abt scored a goal, caused four turnovers, had two ground balls and two draw controls as the Irish limited the Grevhounds to just four second-half goals in the game.

SETTING THE MARK: Gina Scioscia cleared some space in the Notre Dame record books with her five-assist game versus Delaware on March 13. The five assists is the most by an Irish player in a home game and breaks a mark held by 12 different players, including current teammates **Caitlin McKinney** and **Jillian Byers**. McKinney was the last to do it, getting four helpers on April 14, 2007 at Moose Krause Stadium against Georgetown. The Notre Dame record for assists in a game is six and was set by **Kerry Callahan '99** on March 17, 1999 against Gannon. Scioscia added her second five-assist game in the win at Rutgers on April 20.

HOME SWEET HOME: The loss to Vanderbilt on April 16 dropped the Irish to 4-2 on the year at home in the Loftus Center. Last season, Notre Dame was 6-3 at home, going 3-2 at the Loftus Sports Center and 3-1 at Moose Krause Stadium. In 2006, the Irish were 9-0 at home and are now 19-5 (.792) between the Loftus Center and Moose Krause Stadium over the last three years.

GETTING INTO THE ACT: Senior attack Heather Ferguson is in the midst of a strong senior season that has her ranked fifth in scoring on the team with 16 goals and 10 assists for 26 points. Her point total is the second best mark in her career. Versus California on March 8, she equaled her single-game assist and points marks with a goal and three assists for four points. Against Delaware, Ferguson equaled her singlegame marks for goals (3) and points (4) while chipping in another assist for four goals and four assists for eight points in the two games. For her career, Ferguson now has 55 goals and 34 assists for 89 points in 68 career games.

On March 16 against Syracuse, Maggie Zentgraf (So., Charlottesville, Va.) came off the bench to get her first career goal in the second half, converting a Scioscia pass with 13:33 left for a 12-11 lead. Another first came against Delaware with Shannon Burke had the first two-goal game of her career.

CLOSE ONES: The 15-14 overtime loss to Georgetown on April 25 was the second one-goal loss for the Irish this season. On March 6, Notre Dame dropped a 14-13 decision to Oregon as the Ducks scored with three seconds left in the game. The Irish are 1-2 in one-goal games this season after defeating Hofstra, 14-13 on March 25. Notre Dame is now 15-18 all-time in onegoal games.

HISTORIC STADIUMS: During the 2008 women's lacrosse season, Notre Dame has played at two of college football's most historic stadiums. On March 8, the Irish played California, in the Rose Bowl, in Pasadena, Calif. Last weekend, the Irish hosted the BIG EAST Tournament at Notre Dame Stadium, home of the Fighting Irish football team. The tournament was held at Notre Dame Stadium due to construction at Moose Krause Stadium on the Irish campus.

BAD NEWS BILLINGS: Junior Alicia Billings (Potomac, Md.) scored her eighth goal of the season in the loss to Vanderbilt and now has a career-high eight goals on the season. For the year, Billings has eight goals and three assists for 11 points on the year. Earlier this season, she had a six-game point scoring streak.

PRESEASON HONORS: Senior midfielder Caitlin McKinney and junior attack standout Jillian Byers have been named to the Tewaaraton Trophy preseason "Watch List." They also were selected preseason All-Americans by Inside Lacrosse on Feb. 19. The dynamic duo were unanimous preseason all-BIG EAST selections earlier this winter.

TOP-RANKED PLAYERS: Senior midfielder Caitlin McKinney (Lafayette Hill, Pa.) and junior attack standout Jillian Byers (Northport, N.Y.) have been ranked among the top 20 players by Inside Lacrosse magazine in its preseason edition. McKinney, a two-time All-American was ranked as the 14th best player in the country. Byers, also a two-time All-American, was ranked as the ninth-best player in the nation by the magazine. Both players also have been selected as unanimous preseason all-BIG EAST selections in voting by the league's coaches.

THE CAPTAINS: Seniors Caitlin McKinney and Becky Ranck (Radnor, Pa.) have been selected team captains for the 2008 season. McKinney was second on the team in scoring last year with 44 goals and 21 assists for 65 points and was a second team IWLCA All-American. Ranck is the leader of the Notre Dame defense and a three-time monogram winner during her career. In three seasons, she played in 47 career games with 46 ground balls, 29 draw controls and 54 caused turnovers in her career.

USA...USA...USA: Notre Dame freshman Shaylyn Blaney helped the U.S. Under-19 team win the gold medal at the Under-19 World Championships this past summer. The three-time U.S. Lacrosse high school All-American scored 16 goals with one assist for 17 points in six games to help the U.S. team to the gold medal. Blaney became the first Notre Dame player to play on the Under-19 team since Kelly McCardell '03, was a member of the 1999 Under-19 team. Fellow freshmen Kailene Abt (Huntington, N.Y.) and Lauren Fenlon (Dayton, Md.) were alternates for the Under-19 team.

BIG EAST SCHOLAR ATHLETE: Senior midfield/attack standout Caitlin McKinney has been selected as Notre Dame's female BIG EAST/Aeropostale Scholar-Athlete Award winner. She received the honor along with baseball player Brett Lilley and will receive a \$2,000 award toward graduate studies. McKinney owns a 3.522 grade-point average with a double major in sociology and film, television and theatre at Notre Dame. A two-time IWLCA All-American, McKinney was selected to the IWLCA academic honor roll following the 2007 season.

WELCOMEBACK: Head coach Tracy Coyne welcomed a new assistant coach to her staff during the summer, but she is no stranger to Irish women's lacrosse fans. Former Notre Dame standout Meredith Simon '04 joined Covne's staff on July 18 after three seasons at Towson University. Simon replaces another former Irish player, Alissa Moser '02, who was married over the summer and is now attending law school. With the Irish, Simon will work with the Irish attack on a daily basis while assisting with recruiting and team travel in addition to the dayto-day office operations. While at Notre Dame as a player (2000-04), Simon became the school's first-ever, first-team IWLCA All-American as she set a then-Notre Dame single-season scoring mark with 74 points on 46 goals and 28 assists while leading the Irish to the NCAA tournament in 2004. During that season, Simon also became the first Notre Dame player to be a Tewaaraton Trophy nominee as the top player in the nation. A two-time first team All-BIG EAST selection (2003, 2004), Simon was the BIG EAST co-attack player of the year in 2004. A team captain as a senior, Simon finished her Notre Dame career ranked first in games played (64), third in goals (109), fourth in assists (49), third in points (158), fourth in ground balls (123) and third in draw controls (91). She ended her career with the fifth-longest point-scoring streak in the program's history as she scored in 28 straight games, recording 68 goals and 35 assists for 103 points between March 25, 2003 and May 13, 2004. During her career, Simon was a member of Notre Dame's first two NCAA tournament teams in 2002 and 2004.

SECOND TIME AROUND: Also rejoining the Notre Dame coaching staff as a volunteer assistant coach is former All-American **Kathryn Lam** '02. Currently working as an executive assistant in the Dean's Office of the Graduate School, Lam last served as a volunteer assistant in 2006 when the Irish advanced to the Final Four. The first All-American, along with **Danielle Shearer '03**, in the program's history in 2002, Lam will work with the Notre Dame defense.

SISTER ACTS: Notre Dame has had eight sets of sisters in the program's 12-year history and has one sister duo on this year's team. In fact, this year's sister tandem are twins - seniors Heather and Lindsey Ferguson (Newtown Square, Pa.). Three other members of this year's team have sisters who played at Notre Dame. Senior Julie Foote (Suffern, N.Y.) was preceded by her sister, Crysti '06 while junior Lauren deMello (Manlius, N.Y.) was preceeded by her sister Meghan '06 and sophomore Maggie Zentgraf (Charlottesville, Va.) follows her sister, Lena '07. Other sister duos to play for the Irish include: Kelly and Kristen Gaudreau '04, Carol '06 and Angela '03 Dixon and Mary '06 and Annemarie McGrath. The sisters that started the tradition are Amy ('98) and Mara ('98) Grace who played in 1997 and 1998.
