AT THE HELM

Karen and Kevin Keyes head coach Muffet McGraw embarks on her 31st season at the helm of the Irish (775-228) and 36th overall (863-269) as a head coach. McGraw ranks 10th all-time among NCAA Division I coaches in career wins and sixth among active coaches.

McGraw is also just one of six coaches (men's or women's basketball) in NCAA Division I history with 800 wins, seven Final Fours and five NCAA title games. The prestigious list includes Pat Summitt, Geno Auriemma, Duke men's coach Mike Krzyzewski, the late North Carolina men's coach Dean Smith and current North Carolina men's coach Roy Williams.

This past fall, McGraw took her rightful place among the game's elite when she was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, becoming the 32nd woman ever to do so.

NEW PURCELL PAVILION SCORING CHAMP

Forward Jessica Shepard produced a historic outing vs. DePaul on Dec. 17, securing her fourth double-double on the year with 11 rebounds and a career high 39 points, lifting the Irish to a 91-82 victory over the visiting Blue Demons. The junior's stellar performance broke the Purcell Pavilion women's scoring record, originally set by Ruth Riley, who garnered 36 points on two separate occasions back in 1999 and 2000.

Overall, Shepard's 39 points stood as the fourth most in

program history, trailing only Jewell Loyd's 41 points at DePaul on 12/10/14, Ruth Riley's 41 at Providence on 1/30/99 and Katryna Gaither's 40 vs Ohio on 11/29/97.

Shepard, who entered the DePaul game with a season high 19 points and career high 35, shot out of the gates with 12 points in the first quarter, which marked a new season best for the opening period. Shepard had 26 points at the half on an already career high tying 13 made field goals. The Nebraska native ultimately finished an efficient 17-of-22 from the field as her 17 made field goals tied for second most in program history.

Shepard's 39 points currently stands as the best individual scoring performance during regulation (40 min) among all ACC players. Furthermore, Notre Dame is the only ACC school to boast two individual 30+ point performances when factoring in Arike Ogunbowale's 32 points at Michigan on Nov. 29.

Lastly, due to her impressive effort, Shepard received her first ACC Player of the Week honor.

WHO'S HOT

Marina Mabrey has reached double-digit points in back-to-back games, starting with 15 points at Penn on Dec. 9, followed by a 13-point effort vs DePaul. Mabrey posted a complete game vs the Blue Demons, tying or setting new season highs in rebounds (8), free-throws made (8) and attempted (8), assists (6) and blocks (2), marking her first 5-5-5 game of the season.

Furthermore, the junior has been aggressive on the glass, setting a career high eight rebounds at Penn before tying that exact mark against DePaul. Thus, Mabrey is averaging 14.0 points and 8.0 rebounds over the last two games.

Next, Katherine Westbeld is certainly in the ‘heating up’ category, coming off of a season high 10 points vs DePaul on 4-of-5 shooting from the field. It marked the second straight game in which Westbeld tallied four made field goals, going 8-for-11 in that span for 18 total points. When looking over the last three games, Westbeld is 10-for-13 for 24 points, and when looking at the five straight games she has started, the senior has averaged 6.4 points on an impressive 76.5 percent shooting (13-of-17).

THE STARTER AND THE CLOSER

Jessica Shepard has acted as the spark that ignites Notre Dame's offense at the start of games this season. The junior is coming off of a 12-point first quarter performance vs DePaul on Dec. 17, which marked a season best. In fact, Shepard leads all Irish players by averaging 5.7 points in the first quarter this season.

However, if Shepard is the starter, then Arike Ogunbowale is undoubtedly the closer, averaging 6.1 points in the fourth quarter, with two double-digit scoring efforts in the final period.

Ogunbowale scored 9 of her 21 points in the fourth vs DePaul on Dec. 17, helping the Irish to a 91-82 win. Before that, she scored the first nine points in the fourth quarter at Penn on Dec. 9, ultimately recording 13 of her 20 points in the period to seal the 66-54 victory inside The Palestra. Lastly, Arike scored 9 of her 21 points in the fourth quarter to ice the victory against USF on Nov. 25.

FREE-THROW STREAK

Mabrey has quietly been dominant at the free-throw line, making all 21 of her last attempts, which dates back to the second quarter of ETSU on Nov. 24. As a result, she has risen her free-throw percentage to .893, which leads the ACC.

ARIKE ACHIEVEMENTS

Eleven games played this season and 11 straight games in double-digit points for Ogunbowale. The junior now ranks second in the ACC and No. 22 in the nation in scoring with her 20.7 points per game. In addition, Ogunbowale's eight games of 20 or more points leads all players in the ACC.

Ogunbowale's eight 20+ point performances through 11 games already tops her total of seven during her sophomore campaign. Furthermore, the Milwaukee native has solely produced more 20-point games than all individuals combined who have faced Notre Dame

As a result of her stellar start, Ogunbowale has been recognized by the following: Naismith Trophy Watch List, John R. Wooden Award Preseason Top-30 list, WBCA Wade Trophy Watch List, Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Top-20 Watch List, 15th Best Player by espnW and Preseason All-ACC.

BLOCK PARTY

Multiple block parties have been thrown in December, starting at Penn on Dec. 9, when Jessica Shepard recorded a career best six blocks, doubling her original personal best of three set back on Dec. 3, 2015, vs NC State.

It was the first six-block performance by an Irish player since Brianna Turner collected seven vs Boston College on Feb. 23, 2017. The six blocks also tied Felicia Aiyeotan of Virginia, Kylee Shook of Louisville and Yacine Diop of Pitt for highest in a game this season by an ACC player.

Shepard also recorded her first 5+5+5 game with the Irish thanks to her nine points, six blocks and eight rebounds.

The next block party occurred on Dec. 17, when the Irish

collected a season high 13 blocks vs DePaul, marking the second double-digit block effort by Notre Dame this season. Young led the way with a career high four blocks, while Thompson tied her career high with two.

NON-CONFERENCE, NON-PROBLEM

Over the last five years (counting this season), the Irish are an impressive 60-5 in non-conference regular season games. If Notre Dame were to defeat Marquette and Tennessee, it would cap a 12-1 non-conference season, securing the fifth straight year in which the Irish produced at least 12 non-conference wins.

Finally, looking even further back, the Irish have notched a 121-11 record in non-conference regular season games over the past decade.

ROAD WARRIORS

With the win at Penn on Dec. 9, the Irish procured its seventh win away from home this season, which led all Division-I schools in the country at the time.

From Nov. 14-Dec. 3, the Irish played seven straight games away from the friendly confines of Purcell Pavilion, matching the longest streak of non-home games in regular season history. The only other time the Irish played seven straight regular-season games away from home came in 1996-97.

Now Notre Dame has played a total of eight away from home, travelling 10,470 round-trip miles in the process.

ANOTHER TOP-25

When Notre Dame challenged No. 1 UConn in Hartford it marked their fourth straight top-25 opponent, and fifth overall, all of which had been on the road. Only UConn's schedule matched that stat.

Furthermore, both Notre Dame and UConn are the only two schools to currently boast at least four top-25 ranked victories.

NOTRE DAME'S RESPONSE

After the 80-71 loss at No. 1 UConn, the Irish responded with a dominant 90-59 performance over Michigan State on Dec. 6, displaying its defensive prowess as well. Notre Dame started the game on a 19-4 run and held the Spartans to their lowest first quarter output with nine points. The Irish defense performed even better in the second quarter, holding MSU to without a field goal for the final 8:21 of the half, as the Spartans only mustered seven points in the period. Furthermore, Notre Dame's 31-point lead at the half (47-16) marked its biggest advantage at the midway point this season.

More impressive was the fact that Notre Dame kept Michigan State's starters in check, as the Spartan starting five recorded only two points combined at the half and 12 points by the final whistle.

FOREVER YOUNG

There has been no sophomore slump for Jackie Young in the 2017-18 season, only a triumphant emergence thus far. In fact, Young has nearly doubled her scoring average from last year (7.3 ppg) with her 13.5 ppg, which ranks third on the team.

Young first broke out on Nov. 19 at Oregon State, setting a then career best of 21 points, in what was just her second career game leading the Irish in scoring. Young then stepped up even more in the Gulf Coast Showcase, setting a new personal best of 23 points on 8-of-16 shooting vs USF on Nov. 25, also tying her career high mark of seven made free-throws. The sophomore then followed that with her first career double-double, 22 points and 10 rebounds, vs South Carolina on Nov. 26, earning Gulf Coast Showcase MVP honors.

Young then notched her second straight double-double with 18 points and a career high 14 rebounds at Michigan on Nov. 29.

Ultimately, Young recorded the first back-to-back 20+ point performances of her career, and recently capped a career long stretch of seven straight games with double-digit points, finishing with just five at UConn on Dec. 3.

Young currently ranks in the top-15 in the ACC in four major stat categories: 12th in rebounds (7.6), 9th in free-throw percentage (.830), 2nd in offensive rebounds (3.6) and 14th in minutes (31.7).

RUNNING IRISH

Basketball can sometimes be described as a game of 'runs,' and the Irish have outshone its opponent in that very category. When looking at runs of 10-0 or more, Notre Dame has achieved that feat eight times and have limited its opponents to just one - when UConn scored 11 straight in the fourth quarter. Notre Dame's biggest run of the season came on Dec. 6, when the Irish scored 16 straight points vs Michigan State.

PAINTING A WINNING PICTURE

Fans have witnessed Notre Dame utilizing four guards on the court at once this season, but it hasn't stopped the Irish from dominating in the paint. In fact, Notre Dame is averaging 47.1 points in the paint - nearly doubling what its opponent is averaging at 26.9.

The Irish have reached the 50 points in the paint mark four times this season, including 58 points inside vs then No. 3 South Carolina, and its season best of 68 vs Mount St. Mary's.

REMEMBER, REMEMBER, THE WINS IN NOVEMBER

The Irish capped off a perfect 7-0 record in the month of

November, which has become the norm at Notre Dame. In fact, the Irish have won 39 straight games in the month of November and are 42-1 over the past seven seasons.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

Purcell Pavilion has become one of the toughest venues for opposing teams to play in. Last year, the loyal lime-green fans made sure the Irish ranked sixth nationally in average attendance (8,104).

Notre Dame is 454-92 all-time inside Purcell Pavilion, good for an .831 winning percentage. In addition, the Irish currently boast a 13-game win streak at home.

Most notably, however, has been how dominant the Irish have been in league play at home. Notre Dame has won a school-record 42 consecutive home conference games, beginning with a 66-47 win over Providence on Feb. 14, 2012, in BIG EAST play.

Notre Dame is 32-0 at Purcell Pavilion in ACC play, going 8-0 in 2013-14, 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. In fact, the Irish have never lost at home to an (active at game time) ACC team in Muffet McGraw's 30 years at the helm. The last time Notre Dame lost at the Joyce Center to a team representing the ACC was a 69-48 setback against No. 20 Maryland on Jan. 10, 1987.

POLL POSITION

The preseason AP Poll placed the Fighting Irish in the all too familiar spot among the nation's top-10, starting the year at the No. 6 spot, before moving to its current position at No. 2. The Irish have been in the AP Poll for 200 consecutive weeks (fourth best in the nation), including 130 straight polls inside the top-10. The last time the Irish were out - a No. 11 ranking on Jan. 17, 2011. Taking it a step further, the Irish have spent 150 total weeks in the AP's top-five, the seventh most all-time.

Speaking of, Notre Dame has now been ranked in the top-10 for the 229th time, marking the 10th-most AP top-10 appearances all-time.

The current AP Poll also solidified the fact that Notre Dame's 2017-18 schedule will undoubtedly rank among the top in the country. Currently, the Irish will challenge a total of nine schools ranked inside the top-25, including six ranked inside the top-15.

GULF COAST SHOWCASE CHAMPS

Three games, three days, three wins for the Irish, as Notre Dame claimed the 2017 Gulf Coast Showcase championship in Estero, Florida, over Thanksgiving weekend. The Irish first surged past ETSU in the first round before knocking off No. 17/16 USF, 76-66. Then, the Irish notched a dramatic come-from-behind victory over No. 3/2 South Carolina, trailing by 12-points in the second quarter before recording a 25-point swing,

ultimately securing the title with a 92-85 win.

Notre Dame joins the likes of previous Gulf Coast Showcase champions Baylor (2016), Stanford (2015), UConn (2014) and Middle Tennessee (2013).

Lastly, Arike Ogunbowale was named to the All-Tournament Team while Jackie Young was named MVP after averaging 19.3 points and 7.7 rebounds.

FOUR IRISH LAND ON NAISMITH WATCH LIST

On Nov. 29, the Atlanta Tipoff Club announced 50 women's basketball players to its Citizen Naismith Trophy Watch List with Arike Ogunbowale, Jackie Young, Jessica Shepard and Marina Mabrey all selected. The Irish's four candidates marked the second most of any school, while the ACC made the top mark of all conferences with 10. The Naismith Trophy annually recognizes the top men's and women's collegiate basketball players of the year. A list of the midseason top-30 team will be released on Feb. 12, 2018, and players who do not make the Watch List are still eligible to be selected for the midseason 30 list.

YOUNG REELS IN THE HARDWARE

A day after earning Gulf Coast Showcase MVP honors and spearheading the charge to Notre Dame's upset over South Carolina, sophomore guard Jackie Young continued to reel in the accolades. This time, the ACC office came calling and presented Young with her first career Player of the Week honor.

Young averaged 19.3 points and 7.7 rebounds over the three games in Florida, shooting 50.0 percent from the field. Young set a career high 23 points vs USF on Nov. 25, finishing the game strong with nine points in the fourth quarter. The Indiana native then followed that up with her first career double-double in upset win over South Carolina, recording 22 points and 10 rebounds. It also marked the first back-to-back 20-point games of Young's career.

STREAK STOPPER

Knocking off No. 3/2 South Carolina, 92-85, did more than just secure the Irish the Gulf Coast Showcase trophy. First, Notre Dame put a stop to the defending national champion's 17-game win streak. Second, Notre Dame's 92 points marked the most against the Gamecocks since Dec. 20, 2009, when North Carolina won 93-85 in Myrtle Beach. Third, it marked Notre Dame's first top-5 ranked win since previously knocking off South Carolina in the 2015 Final Four in Tampa.

ACC / BIG TEN CHALLENGE

With an 83-63 win over Michigan on Nov. 29, the Irish moved to 5-0 in the ACC/B1G Challenge.

Previously, Notre Dame defeated No. 10 Penn State, 77-67, in 2013 in Happy Valley - downed No. 15 Maryland,

92-72, in 2014 in Fort Wayne – beat No. 10 Ohio State, 75-72, in 2015 in Purcell Pavilion – then last year, topped Iowa, 73-58, in Iowa City.

Overall, the ACC owns eight challenge titles (8-0-3) and boasts an 81-55 record in challenge games since its inception in 2007. In addition, the ACC has won at least six games in every challenge.

COMEBACK KIDS

Twice now, on the road, vs top-20 ranked teams, Notre Dame has found itself trailing by double-digits and rallied to win the game.

The Irish trailed 44-33 at 8:01 in the third quarter at Oregon State, before fighting back to win 72-67.

In the Gulf Coast Showcase championship game vs South Carolina, the Irish went down 30-18 at 8:53 in the second, before going on to outscore the Gamecocks 48-27 in the middle two periods, ultimately winning 92-85.

ANOTHER HOT START

After Notre Dame's fourth top-25 win at Michigan, the Irish improved to 7-0 on the season, marking the fifth straight year in which they've done so. The list below shows Notre Dame's win streak to open the season:

A ROAD LESS TRODDEN

The Irish have not only garnered tough road victories but also doing so in tough venues. In front of 7,570 Oregon State fans, the Irish emerged with the 72-67 victory. Since the start of the 2013-14 season, Oregon State is 62-7 at home, and of those seven losses, two were now caused by Notre Dame.

On Nov. 14, Notre Dame defeated Western Kentucky, 78-65, in front of 5,061 fans – the largest inside Diddle Arena for a non-Education Day game in 12 years. More impressive is that Bowling Green, Ky., ranks in the top-10 for toughest places to play in the nation, as WKU is one-of-11 programs with a winning percentage over 80 percent in its home city.

Before the ACC/B1G matchup in Ann Arbor, Michigan had won 30 of its past 31 games inside the Crisler Center. The Irish then went on to earn an 83-63 victory.

BOUNCE BACK

Over the course of Marina Mabrey's career, the junior has scored 5 points or less in 15 games. Yet, what's impressive is that in those 15 instances, Mabrey has always bounced back in a major way, averaging 15.3

ppg in the very next game.

BOARDING SCHOOL

Jessica Shepard and Jackie Young have been dynamic on the offensive glass through 11 games. Young leads the way with her 3.6 offensive boards per game, which ranks second in the ACC. Young reeled in a career high seven offensive rebounds at Michigan on Nov. 29. In addition, Shepard follows right behind with her 3.3 offensive rebounds per game, which is tied for fourth in the league.

ARIKE'S STREAK

Ogunbowale started the year with back-to-back games of 21 points against Mount St. Mary's and WKU. Ogunbowale had previously recorded 32-point and 25-point performances in the NCAA Tournament last season, thus earning a career best four straight games with 20 or more points. However, the four-game streak came to an end in Corvallis where Ogunbowale tallied 15 points.

The junior then came one-point shy of immediately matching the four-game stretch, scoring 21 points vs USF, 23 points vs South Carolina, 32 points at Michigan, then 19 points at UConn. Now, Ogunbowale has a chance to match said streak again vs Marquette on Dec. 20.

Finally, Ogunbowale is still the only Irish player to score in double figures in all 11 games this season.

ACCOLADES FOR ARIKE

On Nov. 29, the WBCA announced its **Wade Trophy Watch List** with junior Arike Ogunbowale making the 25-candidate list. The Wade Trophy — now in its 41st year — is the oldest and most prestigious national player of the year award in college women's basketball. The committee will review the list in January to determine if additional players will be added based on their play during the first half of the 2017-18 season. The WBCA will then announce the four finalists for the honor in mid-March.

On Nov. 14, the **John R. Wooden Award** presented by Wendy's announced Arike Ogunbowale as part of its Women's Preseason Top-30 list, naming the early front-runners for the prestigious award. Ogunbowale was 1-of-6 ACC players selected to the Top-30 list, tying the Pac-12 for most honorees of any conference.

The Milwaukee native was previously named to the **Inaugural Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Top-20 Watch List**. The newly minted award will honor the top shooting guard in all of women's NCAA Division I basketball.

In addition, espnW listed its top-25 most talented players in the game today with Ogunbowale landing in the No. 15 spot. Analyst Charlie Creme noted:

"Never lacking in confidence with the ball in her hands, Ogunbowale has become one of the most creative and exciting players in the game. She is equal parts deep shooter, innovative slasher and skilled post-up player, making her a difficult matchup for any defender. Ogunbowale was Notre Dame's most accurate 3-point shooter and also got to the free throw line more than anyone on the team last season except forward Brianna Turner."

OPPULENT OFFENSE

Notre Dame currently boasts one of the top offenses as their 83.4 ppg ranks No. 24 in the country and third in the ACC. The Irish are shooting 48.4 percent from the field (13th in nation) and are outscoring their opponents by 16.8 points. Also to put in perspective, the Irish are only averaging 4.3 three's a game.

A DYNAMIC DEBUT

Notre Dame's offense flew out of the starting gate in its season opener on Nov. 11, rolling over Mount St. Mary's by the score of 121-65. The 121 points marked the third most points in a single-game in Irish history and most since it scored 120 versus Pittsburgh on Jan. 17, 2012.

The final tally also marked the most in a season opener since Notre Dame defeated Liberty, 113-35, on Nov. 24, 1989. Furthermore, it tied for the second best offensive showing in all of Division I women's basketball the entire opening weekend, matching Baylor's 121-62 victory over Lamar and only trailing UCLA's 129-69 rout over San Jose State.

THOMPSON ASSUMES POINT

After eight combined years of stability at the point guard position between Irish greats Skylar Diggins-Smith and Lindsay Allen, Coach McGraw turned to transfer Lili Thompson to take the mantle for the 2017-18 season. In the season opener versus Mount St. Mary's, Thompson nearly netted a double-double with 10 points and eight assists, as the latter tied for the most assists by a Notre Dame player in a season opener over the past 15 years – joining the likes of Diggins-Smith, Allen (2x) and Megan Duffy (2x).

In fact, Thompson's eight assists marked the highest debut of any ACC point guard in a season opener this year.

After 11 games, Thompson boasts a 4.9 assists per game average, which ranks sixth in the ACC.

In addition, on Dec. 6 vs MSU, Thompson recorded her first ever double-double with a season high 12 points and a career best 10 rebounds.

At Stanford, Thompson was a two-time All-Pac-12 selection, and became the 36th Stanford player to reach 1,000 career points during the 2015-16 season after averaging 14.7 ppg on 37.5 percent shooting.

1,000-POINT CLUB WELCOMES NEW MEMBER

Notre Dame's 1,000-career point club welcomed its 37th member on Nov. 11, as junior Arike Ogunbowale joined the list of Irish elite after scoring a team high 21 points vs The Mount. Ogunbowale needed just 73 games to reach the milestone, ending the day with 1,007 career points.

Then fellow junior guard Marina Mabrey became member No. 38 at UConn on Dec, when she surged for a season high 21 points to finish the day at 1,006 career points.

One does not have to look back far when researching the last time two players crossed the 1,000-point plateau together, as Brianna Turner and Lindsay Allen accomplished the feat just last season. Before that, Kayla McBride and Natalie Achonwa each hit the mark in 2013. In fact, seven other Irish teams saw two players hit the milestone while the record of three was set back in 1985 by Trena Keys, Mary Beth Schueth and Carrie Bates.

K-MAC IN THE RING OF HONOR

On Nov. 11, Notre Dame's Ring of Honor welcomed its newest member and banner to the Purcell Pavilion rafters, as Kayla McBride became the fifth women's basketball player to be inducted. McBride joined the ranks of Ruth Riley, Skylar Diggins-Smith, Niele Ivey and Beth (Morgan) Cunningham.

McBride played a pivotal role in one of the most successful four years in Notre Dame history. She helped lead the Irish to four consecutive Final Fours (2011-14), including three title game appearances. In addition, her senior class recorded the second-most wins (138) of any other class in history. McBride was a two-time All-American, including a consensus first team choice in 2014, the 2014 ACC Player of the Year and the 2014 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament Team honoree, to name just a few.

When all was said and done, McBride ranked first all-time in career free-throw percentage (.882) and sixth in scoring with her 1,876 career points. The Erie, Pennsylvania, native went on to be drafted No. 3 overall by the San Antonio Stars (now Las Vegas), earning WNBA All-Rookie Team honors in 2014 and was named a WNBA All-Star in 2015.

STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT FOOT

Notre Dame has been nothing short but dominant in its season openers, specifically when opening at home. In fact, the Irish have now won each of their last 23 season openers, stretching back to a loss at No. 25 Seton Hall on Nov. 26, 1994.

The Irish have also won each of its last 18 home season

openers, not losing since an 86-70 defeat to No. 3 Penn State on Nov. 22, 1991. The only time Notre Dame has ever lost a season opener at home to an unranked team came on Nov. 22, 1980, with a 67-60 loss at the hands of South Dakota. For historical perspective, that game came the day after Muffet McGraw made her collegiate assistant coaching debut, helping St. Joseph's to a, 84-57 win over Duke on Hawk Hill.

WHO'S THAT GIRL...IT'S JESS!

On Nov. 1, just hours before tip-off of Notre Dame's exhibition, junior transfer Jessica Shepard received word that her waiver had been approved by the NCAA and she was eligible effective immediately.

Shepard was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2016 and claimed a spot on the all-Big Ten team during each of her two seasons with Nebraska. As a sophomore in 2016-17, she averaged 18.6 points per game and 9.8 rebounds per game, totaling 15 double-doubles. Shepard earned a spot on the Naismith Award's Mid-season Top 30 list, a list that also included Notre Dame teammates Arike Ogunbowale and Brianna Turner.

As a freshman, Shepard set a Big Ten record by being named the freshman rookie of the week 10 times en route to her Big Ten Freshman of the Year accolade. Shepard earned two Big Ten Player of the Week awards that season and was the espnW National Player of the Week on Jan. 25, 2016, after recording the first 30-point, 20-rebound game in school history -- scoring 35 points and grabbing 20 boards in a win over Michigan.

IF IT AIN'T BROKE, DON'T FIX IT

On Oct. 19, the ACC Blue Ribbon Panel and head coaches' poll were in agreement - Notre Dame returns as the preseason favorite for the 2017-18 season.

For the fourth consecutive year, Notre Dame was recognized as the team to beat in the ACC. The Irish claimed 35 first-place votes and 858 points to claim the top spot. Meanwhile, Louisville (5 first-place votes, 809 points), Duke (10, 799) and Florida State (10, 752) followed in said order.

Since joining the conference for the 2013-14 season, the Irish have posted an impressive 62-2 record in regular season league play.

Last season, the Irish secured their fourth consecutive conference regular season and tournament title sweeps, and if the Irish were to claim their fifth straight in 2018, a new record would be set.

In addition, Ogunbowale and Mabrey received Preseason All-ACC nods for the first time in their respective careers while senior transfer Lili Thompson was named to the Newcomer Watch List.

MCGRAW SIGNS FOUR IN CLASS OF 2018

During the early signing period, Coach McGraw signed guards Katlyn Gilbert, Abby Prohaska and Jordan Nixon, along with post Danielle Cosgrove. ESPNW ranked the signing class No. 6 in the nation.

Gilbert - 5'10" guard from Indianapolis, ranked 25th overall and sixth in position. An AP All-State First Team selection and National Gatorade Player of the Year candidate, Gilbert is coming off her best season, averaging 16.8 points and 7.5 rebounds per game as a junior, while shooting 52.0 percent from the floor.

Prohaska - 5'10" guard from Liberty Township, Ohio, ranked 78th overall and 20th by position. An AP Division I All-State honoree, Prohaska averaged 11.4 points and 7.1 rebounds last year, in addition to earning a bronze medal at the FIBA U17 World Championship with the USA U17 squad in 2016.

Nixon - 5'8" guard from New York, New York, ranked 56th overall and 12th by position. Nixon averaged 20.1 points, 8.0 assists and 10 rebounds as a junior, earning Naismith Trophy High School Girls All-America Honorable Mention along with NYSSWA Second Team Class AA All-State in 2017. Over this past summer, Nixon led her iEXCEL AAU team to three national titles.

Cosgrove - 6'4" forward from Holbrook, New York, ranked 64th overall and 12th by position. Averaged a double-double as a junior with 17.3 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. Cosgrove is just the ninth player in Sachem history to reach 1,000 career points, and ultimately ranks fifth in district history with her 1,211 career total.

TORN APART

The Notre Dame bench will slightly be more crowded for the 2017-18 season after torn ACL injuries have now claimed three members in the year 2017.

Starting last March, the Irish lost three-time All-American Brianna Turner to a torn ACL in the NCAA Championships. Later, in September, in a decision to come back stronger and be able to compete in a full season, Turner chose to redshirt the 2017-18 season.

Next, senior guard Mychal Johnson tore her ACL in practice on Oct. 23, just weeks before the start of the 2017-18 season.

Lastly, freshman forward Mikayla Vaughn tore her ACL in practice on Nov. 28. Vaughn had played in six games, averaging the second most minutes off the bench at 13.2. The freshman also averaged 8.0 points and 4.3 rebounds.
