STORYLINES

- ➔ After dropping a heartbreaker to Cincinnati two weeks ago, Miami rebounded nicely with a 31-14 win at Central Michigan last Saturday.
- ➔ Chuck Martin spent four years at Notre Dame as an assistant coach from 2010-2013.
- ➔ Miami’s defense ranks 27th in the country in total defense (310.8) and 33rd in scoring defense (19.0).
- ➔ The RedHawks were picked to finish second in the Mid-American Conference East Division preseason poll by the conference’s media members. Last season Miami was picked to finish fifth and ended the season 6-2 in conference play for a MAC East co-Championship.

NEED TO KNOW

- Both coaching staffs will be wearing special arm patches in honor of the AFCA’s Coach to Cure MD program. This is the 10th year coaches around the country join together to raise funds and awareness for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy. NEED TO KNOW

- Miami football ranks first all-time in the Mid-American Conference in wins (681), MAC Championships (15) and bowl wins (7).
- In 127 years of Miami football, the RedHawks have had just 33 losing seasons. Since joining the MAC in 1948 (67 years), Miami has had just 16 losing seasons.

ABOUT CHUCK MARTIN

- Head coach Chuck Martin, who earned that title on Dec. 3, 2013, brings an impressive resume to Oxford, Ohio.
- Not only was he 74-7 in six years at Grand Valley State (2004-09), he has coached in seven national championship games in the past 16 seasons. Martin has an all-time head coaching record of 87-35.
- He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year and has been a coordinator on both sides of the ball.
- Martin was inducted into the Hall of Fame at Grand Valley State University on Oct. 23, 2015.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME

Notre Dame is 3-1 on the year and currently ranked in the top-25 of both major polls. Their lone loss came to then No. 15 ranked Georgia. They have wins over Temple, Boston College and Michigan State. Offensively they average 38.8 points and 459.2 yards per game behind a strong rushing attack that averages 293.5 yards per game on the ground. Defensively they allow 18.5 points and 388.0 yards per game and are led by Nyles Morgan, who has 34 tackles on the season.

SERIES VS. NOTRE DAME

Saturday's contest will be the second meeting between the two schools, but the first meeting was over 100 years ago. Notre Dame beat Miami 46-0 back on November 14, 1909 in South Bend, Ind.

NOTRE DAME CONNECTIONS

There are many connections between the two schools, but three come to mind right away with head coach Chuck Martin, former coach Ara Parseghian and Miami University President Greg Crawford.

Chuck Martin: Coached at Notre Dame for four years, serving as the team's offensive coordinator/QB coach (2012-13) and defensive back coach/recruiting coordinator (2010-11).

Ara Parseghian: The College Football Hall of Famer coached at both Miami and Notre Dame. While with Miami he was 39-6-2 in five seasons, winning conference titles in 1954 and 1955. In 11 years with Notre Dame he was 95-17-4. Parseghian passed away on Aug. 2, 2017. The RedHawks will feature a sticker on their helmets with the simple word "ARA" to honor Coach Parseghian.

Greg Crawford: Greg Crawford, Miami's current university president, worked at Notre Dame from 2008-16. He became Miami's president on July 1, 2016.

CENTRAL MICHIGAN RECAP

A win can cure all ailments and a win is what the Miami football team got as it opened Mid-American Conference play with a convincing 31-14 win at Central Michigan last Saturday. Gus Ragland accounted for the RedHawks first three touchdowns on the day and averaged nearly 20 yards per completion, while the defense posted a second half shutout to secure their first league win.

BOUNCE BACK IN A BIG WAY

Last Saturday's win could go a long way to deciding how successful the 2017 season is. The week prior, Miami fell to arch-rival Cincinnati 21-17, despite holding a 17-6 advantage with under four minutes to play.

WHO WERE THOSE GUYS

Prior to the contest with CMU, most fans may have never even heard of Sam Connolly or Matt Merimee, but they know them now. Connolly, starting at middle linebacker for an injured Junior McMullen, had a career-high nine tackles and an interception. Merimee played most of the second half after Tony Reid was ejected (targeting). Merimee came up with a clutch red zone interception to help secure the win.

REID TO MISS FIRST HALF OF NOTRE DAME CONTEST

Senior safety Tony Reid will miss the first half of the contest at Notre Dame after being ejected in the third quarter at Central Michigan. Due to NCAA rules, Reid will miss the first half because of a targeting penalty in the third quarter.

PRESEASON HONORS

Over the past four years, Miami had not received much attention in preseason honors. That has changed in a big way this year. Heath Harding was named to three different watch lists (Bronco Nagurski, Jim Thorpe and Bednarik), Danny Godlevske was honored by the Rimington Trophy, James Gardner earned two awards (Wuerffel and Biletnikoff) and Ryan Smith was named to the John Mackey Watch List.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

While Miami's roster is finally starting to trend toward upper-classmen, the youth of this roster is still shocking. Coming into the 2017 season Miami has 124 players on its roster and just 12 seniors. Roster breakdown includes: Sixth-year seniors (1), fifth-year seniors (5), seniors (6), red-shirt juniors (19), juniors (13), red-shirt sophomores (16), sophomores (9), red-shirt freshmen (22) and freshmen (33).

CLOSE TO 4-0?

You are what your record says you are, but the RedHawks could easily be 4-0 this season. In the loss to Marshall Miami surrendered two kickoffs for touchdowns and a pick-6, yet still had a chance to come away with the win, but failed to convert on a 41-yard Hail Mary as time expired. In the loss to Cincinnati, Miami was up 17-6 with just under four minutes to play, but fell 21-17.

TAKING ITS TIME

Through four games this season Miami ranks 25th in the country in time of possession, holding onto the ball for an average of 32:43 per game. In the opener versus Marshall Miami had the ball for 35:44 and followed that up a week later with a time of possession of 35:31 versus Austin Peay. Against UC, Miami had the ball for just 29:40 and recorded a time of possession of 29:59 in the win over CMU.

DOMINANT DEFENSE

Miami's defense currently ranks 27th in the nation in total defense (310.8) and 33rd in scoring (19.0), but even that doesn't tell the entire story. Versus Marshall, the Thundering Herd had two special teams TD's and a pick-six and the Bearcats added a pick-6 in that contest as well. If you were to remove those 28 points, the Miami defense would rank 11th in the country, allowing just 12.0 points per game.

MOSTLY TWEETABLE DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Overall, the Miami defense has allowed just 48 points in four games.
- Miami has just three sacks this season.
- Miami has six interceptions and three forced fumbles this year, which ranks 13th in the nation in turnovers forced.
- Miami's defense has allowed just nine scores this season (5 TDs and 4 FGs).
- The opponent has reached the Miami red zone just 10 times this season, coming away with two touchdowns (20%) and four field goals (40%). Overall, the Miami red zone defense ranks fifth in the nation (60%).
- Miami has also forced three turnovers in the red zone.

POSITION CHANGE?

While Doug Costin may be a bit big to play defensive back at 6-2, 285 pounds, he still is filling up the stat sheet with pass breakups. Costin currently leads the team with five pass breakups.

GARDNER COMING OUT STRONG

James Gardner entered 2017 with high expectations after finishing as a third-team All-MAC player a year ago, with 45 catches for 750 yards and six touchdowns. This season he has 16 catches for 294 yards and two scores, while averaging 18.4 yards per catch.

MEET LUKE MAYOCK

Filling in for an injured James Gardner versus UC was redshirt sophomore Luke Mayock. Mayock had not seen much time the first two games, but that may now change. Versus the Bearcats, Mayock had career highs in catches (4), yards (74) and his first career touchdown.

IN GUS WE TRUST

After beginning last season 0-6, head coach Chuck Martin turned to quarterback Gus Ragland. Ragland led Miami to six straight wins over Kent State, Bowling Green, Eastern Michigan, Central Michigan, Buffalo and Ball State. The now junior quarterback finished last season, throwing for 1,537 yards, 17 touchdowns and just one interception.

Retired Miami Numbers

#7 Ben Roethlisberger

Ben Roethlisberger took his place in Miami Football history when his jersey No. 7 was retired on October 13, 2007, becoming just the third in program history to have his number retired. Roethlisberger ended his three-year playing tenure (2001-03) as the most prolific passer in program history.

#40 Bob Hitchens

No. 40 was retired in 1973 to mark the accomplishments of tailback Bob Hitchens, who concluded his career as the most prolific runner in Miami history. At the end of his three-year tenure (1971-73), Hitchens owned Miami's season and career records for points, rushing touchdowns, rushing attempts and rushing yards.

#41 Travis Prentice

No. 41 was retired to honor Travis Prentice. Prentice ranks sixth all-time in NCAA history with 5,596 rushing yards and second in total touchdowns with 78. He continues to own four NCAA records.

#42 John Pont

Worn by halfback John Pont through three varsity football campaigns, No. 42 was retired by the Athletic Advisory Council following his senior season in 1951. Pont thus became the first athlete in Miami history to have his jersey retired.

RedHawks in the NFL

There are currently six Miami RedHawks on rosters in the National Football League and two Miami graduates coaching teams in the NFL.

Brandon Brooks - Guard, Philadelphia Eagles

- 76th overall selection of the 2012 NFL draft.
- Has started 46 games since 2013

Ben Roethlisberger - Quarterback, Pittsburgh Steelers

- Selected 11th overall in the 2004 NFL Draft
- Has won a pair of Super Bowls as the starting quarterback of the Steelers

Quinten Rollins - Defensive Back, Green Bay Packers

- Was a 2nd round draft pick of the Green Bay Packers in 2015

JT Jones - Linebacker, Atlanta Falcons

- On practice squad of the Atlanta Falcons

Bryson Albright, Arizona Cardinals

- On practice squad of Arizona Cardinals

John Harbaugh - Baltimore Ravens Head Coach

- Named head coach of the Ravens in 2008.
- Graduated from Miami in 1984

Sean McVay - LA Rams Head Coach

- Was named the youngest head coach in NFL history prior to the start of the 2017 season.
- Graduated from Miami in 2008.

NICE WAY TO START A CAREER

Ragland began his career by throwing 203 consecutive passes before throwing an interception late in the contest versus Mississippi State in the 2016 St. Petersburg Bowl. In all, the Cincinnati, Ohio native has thrown just three interceptions in 325 career pass attempts (1 INT every 108.3 pass attempts).

RAGLAND TIMELINE

- Verbally commits to Miami on Dec. 13, 2013
- Redshirted the 2014 season and played 86 snaps in 2015.
- Suffered an ACL injury in April of 2016 during a spring football practice.
- Came back to start versus Kent State on Oct. 15, 2016 and won six straight games and helped Miami reach a bowl game.

GODLEVSKE AND THOMAS LOST FOR SEASON

Danny Godlevske, Miami's starting center suffered a season ending injury in week one versus Marshall. Godlevske was on the preseason watch list for the Rimington Trophy, given to the nation's top center. Maurice Thomas suffered a season-ending injury versus UC and was Miami's kickoff specialist.

NATE BECKER RETURNS FROM INJURY

While tight end Ryan Smith has been getting much of the national pub to begin the 2017 season, tight end Nate Becker was actually predicted to start last year before suffering a season ending injury during the 2016 fall camp. Becker is now healthy, giving the RedHawks multiple options at the tight end position.

DIAMOND RETURNS FOR SIXTH YEAR

Miami got some great news from the NCAA last spring, when it was announced that Jordan Diamond would be granted a sixth year of eligibility, due to missing two seasons because of injury. Diamond, a transfer from Auburn, started all 13 games at guard last season in his first year with the RedHawks.

BLESSING IN DISGUISE

Back in 2015, Heath Harding was battling an injury earlier in the season that he just couldn't shake, which forced him to miss the final nine games of that season. While missing the season was frustrating for the Dayton, Ohio native, there was also a major positive. The injury allowed Harding to redshirt the 2015 season, giving him a fifth year. Without that injury in 2015, Harding would not currently be a part of this 2017 season.

PRESEASON POLL

The Miami University football team was picked to finish second in the 2017 Mid-American Conference preseason poll. The poll was conducted by 26 MAC media members. Ohio (131 points) edged Miami (129) in the media poll to represent the East Division at the MAC Championship contest in Ford Field. The RedHawks, who had 12 first-place votes, were followed by Bowling Green (88), Akron (79), Buffalo (41) and Kent State (36).

In the West Division, Toledo (142) was picked to win. The Rockets were followed by Western Michigan (107), Northern Illinois (89), Eastern Michigan (74), Central Michigan (62) and Ball State (30).

IF YOU BUILD IT...

Miami's Athletic Director, David Sayler, has been busy in his first 55 months, adding several facilities for the department. The two newest installment can be seen just north of Yager Stadium. The new David and Anita Dauch Indoor Sports Center (DISC) opened in February of 2015 and features a full length 120-yard field and four sprint lanes.

Between Yager Stadium and the DISC is the Athletic Performance Center. The APC provides much-needed upgrades to Miami Football's locker room and offices while also hosting a state-of-the-art medical and athletic training facility that serves all Miami's student-athletes. Miami football moved into the building last Christmas.

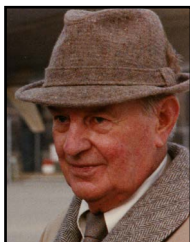
GAME 5 • MIAMI AT NOTRE DAME

Miami University, known world-wide as the “Cradle of Coaches,” contributed four alumni to *Sporting News Magazine’s* 50 Greatest Coaches, dominating all other universities.

PAUL BROWN (‘30) was named as the 12th greatest coach of all time by The Sporting News (TSN). Miamians WALTER ALSTON (‘35) and BO SCHEMBECHLER (‘51) ranked 35th and 36th on the list, while ARA PARSEGHIAN (‘49) was selected as sports’ 44th greatest coach. A fifth man with Miami ties, WOODY HAYES, ranked 27th on TSN’s list. Hayes served as Miami’s football coach from 1949-50.

The August 3, 2009 publication asked a panel of 118 top coaches, media and sports administrators to choose the Top 50 list.

Altogether, only four universities contributed more than one alumnus to the list. Miami’s four alumni topped Alabama (Paul “Bear” Bryant and Bobby Bowden), Minnesota (Bud Wilkinson and Herb Brooks) and Kansas (Dean Smith and Adolph Rupp), which each had two alums ranked among the Top 50. Purdue graduate John Wooden, the famed “Wizard of Westwood”, was ranked as the No. 1 coach of all time.



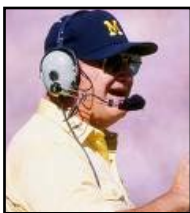
PAUL BROWN

An Ohio native who was a two-year football letter winner (1928-29), **Paul Brown** is a member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and excelled as a coach at the collegiate and professional levels. Brown was head coach at Ohio State (1941-43) and led the Buckeyes to their first national title in 1942. **Brown** then served as head coach at the professional level with the Cleveland Browns (1946-62) and Cincinnati Bengals (1968-75), winning championships in the All-America Football Conference and National Football League. **Brown** was elected into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 1967, and the current home stadium of the Bengals bears his name.



WALTER ALSTON

Always displaying a calm, professional demeanor, the unflappable **Walter Alston** managed the Brooklyn and Los Angeles Dodgers for 23 seasons (1954-76), winning seven National League pennants and four World Series championships. His squads would win 2,040 games during his tenure, the seventh-highest win total among major league managers. He helped to establish a “Dodger Way,” which many of his former players later used to become successful managers themselves.



BO SCHEMBECHLER

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Bo Schembechler** was a two-year letter winner (1949-50) and head coach (1963-68) with the Red and White. During his six seasons as head coach, **Schembechler** led Miami to a 40-17-3 record and back-to-back conference co-championships (1965-66). **Schembechler** then became the head coach at the University of Michigan (1969-89) and led the Wolverines to 13 Big Ten titles.



ARA PARSEGHIAN

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Ara Parseghian** was a football letter winner (1946-47) before moving to the sidelines as an assistant coach (1950) and head coach (1951-55). During his five seasons as Miami’s head coach, **Parseghian** compiled a 39-6-1 record and won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships (1954-55). **Parseghian** went on to coach at Northwestern (1956-63) and Notre Dame (1964-74) where he was named National Coach of the Year in 1964.



WOODY HAYES

A member of Miami’s “Cradle of Coaches” and the College Football Hall of Fame, **Woody Hayes** served as the head coach of Miami during the 1949-50 and 1950-51 seasons. In his last year as head coach he led the RedHawks to a 9-1 record and a MAC Championship, and also led his team to a victory in the Salad Bowl. Hayes went on to coach at the Ohio State University (1951-78) where he became a fixture for the Scarlet and Grey and quickly became recognized as one of the greatest coaches of all time. At OSU he compiled a 205-61-10 record (.761) and led the Buckeyes to five national titles, 13 Big Ten championships, and four bowl victories. He is a three-time winner of the College Football Coach of the Year Award.

In his career, Chuck Martin has more than 20 years in college coaching experience, including 10 years as a head coach. He has twice been named the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) National Coach of the Year, earning the honor in 2005 and 2006, and has coached in seven national championship games in the past 16 seasons. In addition to his head coaching experience, Martin has served as a coordinator on both sides of the ball. Of those seven national championship game appearances, he has been a part of four national championship wins, with two titles under his direction as head coach/offensive coordinator and one as a defensive coordinator.

The one thing missing from Martin's resume, was a program builder. Martin may have answered that question. Martin, who was named the 36th head football coach in Miami history on Dec. 3, 2013, had his hands full when he took over the helm of the RedHawks program.

Miami had just gone 0-12 the year prior to Martin's arrival and many believed the roster was one of the worst in the Mid-American Conference. In three years, Martin's vision of returning Miami football to greatness is in full swing and many believe the RedHawks have already arrived.

While rebuilding the roster from the ground up, Miami took its lumps in 2014 and 2015, going just 2-10 and 3-9. 2016 did not start out much better as Miami lost its first six games of the season, but that is when things changed.

Martin would orchestrate something that had never been done in college football. Miami rattled off six straight wins to become the first team in college football history to begin a season 0-6 and finish 6-6. The six-game win streak also moved Miami to 6-2 in the MAC, finishing in a tie for first in the East and helped the RedHawks advance to the St. Petersburg Bowl versus Mississippi State, Miami's first bowl appearance since 2010.

The Miami rebuild would be complete, adding another highlight to Martin's resume.

Prior to joining Miami, Martin spent four seasons at Notre Dame, serving as the offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach (2012-13) and defensive backs/recruiting coordinator (2010-11). In 2012, he orchestrated an offense that played in the BCS National Championship game versus Alabama. In 2011, he was named one of the top 25 recruiters in the nation by ESPN.com and was named to Rivals.com's Second-Team Assistant Coach Dream Team.

In Martin's two years calling plays, Notre Dame combined to go 20-5 overall and was one of the most balanced offenses in the country, averaging 26.4 points, 170.0 rushing and 235.6 passing per game.

Prior to arriving in South Bend, Martin was head coach and offensive coordinator for Grand Valley State University from 2004-2009 and compiled a 74-7 (.914) record, including an impressive 16-4 record in the NCAA Division II Playoffs. He and the Lakers won back-to-back national championships in 2005 and 2006 and finished runner-up in 2009. He directed Grand Valley State to 48 consecutive regular-season victories and 45 straight wins in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). He also guided the Lakers to a Division II record 40-game winning streak from 2005-07. Martin produced seven Associated Press First-Team All-America players as head coach.

At GVSU, Martin's offenses averaged 35.1 points, 208 rushing and 427 total yards per game. The Lakers ranked among the top-25 nationally in total offense in five of six seasons and ranked in the top-27 in scoring offense in all but one season. In that time, his offense scored at least 30 points in 56 of 81 games and scored at least 40 points in 34 contests.

Many of those offenses were led by quarterbacks who were developed under Martin. In six years, GVSU produced four Harlon Hill finalists, given annually to the NCAA Division II Player of the Year (Cullen Finnerty in 2006 and Brad Iciek from 2007-09). In that span, Laker quarterbacks threw 184 touchdown passes and just 41 interceptions.

His offenses were not just about the quarterback. In all six seasons, he produced a 1,000-yard rusher. In four of those seasons, a running back finished as a top-10 rusher in Grand Valley State history.

Before becoming head coach, Martin served as the defensive coordinator for the Lakers in 2003, helping GVSU win a national championship. Martin's defense allowed just nine total points in the final three games of the playoff run and among the ranked top-10 nationally in scoring, rushing and total defense that season.

Martin served as the defensive backs and outside linebackers coach at GVSU from 2000-02. Prior to arriving in Allendale, Mich., Martin spent time at Eastern Michigan (1998-1999, linebackers), Millikin University (1996-97, defensive coordinator/defensive backs), Wittenberg University (1994-95, linebackers) and Mankato State University (1992-93, graduate assistant/linebackers).

While attending Millikin (1986-90), Martin was an All-American safety and was selected as a GTE Academic All-American. He doubled as an All-American place kicker, received Academic All-District honors for the Millikin baseball team and was inducted into the Millikin Hall of Fame in 2008.

He graduated in 1990 with a degree in accounting and earned his master's degree in physical education from Mankato State University in 1993.

Martin and his wife Dulcie have two children, Max and Emma.

The Miami University football dropped its opening game, 31-26, to Marshall Saturday evening in Huntington, West Virginia.

The RedHawks outgained the Thundering Herd 429-267, but Marshall used two kickoff returns and an interception return for three of its scores.

Redshirt junior quarterback Gus Ragland finished the game 23-for-44 for 298 yards, two touchdowns and one interception. His top target was junior wide receiver James Gardner, who led Miami with eight catches for 111 yards.

Three fourth quarter turnovers by the defense energized the Miami football team and allowed it to pull away with a 31-10 victory over Austin Peay on Saturday afternoon. The RedHawks' (1-1) big plays allowed them to hold the ball for 12:06 in the fourth quarter to allow them to even their record on the season.

Miami outgained Austin Peay 295-270 on the day with both teams ending up with three turnovers. Gardner paced the offense with five catches for 117 yards and hauled in two of Ragland's (11-of-23 for 145 yards) three touchdown passes. Smith finished with 85 yards rushing on 22 carries to lead MU's ground attack. Defensively, Montgomery finished with a team-high nine tackles and forced two fumbles while Reid nabbed an interception and pounced on a loose ball after a kickoff.
