Irish Travel To Western Michigan To Start CCHA Stretch Run

- Notre Dame closes the regular season with five of its final six games on the road.
- Irish coming off a weekend split with Nebraska-Omaha that leaves them in a tie for fourth in the CCHA playoff race.
- Senior alternate captain Kevin Deeth selected as one of 18 nominees for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award.

IRISH TAKE THE HIGHWAY TO START FEBRUARY: The Notre Dame hockey team moves into the final stretch run for the 2009-10 season this weekend when the Irish travel to Kalamazoo, Mich., to face Western Michigan. Game time on Fri.-Sat., Feb 5-6 at Lawson Arena is set for 7:35 p.m. both nights. Notre Dame enters the weekend with a 12-11-7 overall record and is 8-8-6-2 in the CCHA, good for 32 points and a share of fourth place with Lake Superior State. The Irish trail third-place Ferris State (39) by seven points and are just one ahead of sixth-place Michigan and Alaska (31) and two ahead of eighth-place Ohio State and Nebraska-Omaha (30) as just two points separate fourth and ninth place. Western Michigan comes into the series with a 6-15-5 overall record and a 2-14-4-1 mark in the conference. The Broncos enter the weekend last in the CCHA with 11 points and are five behind 11th-place Bowling Green (16). The Irish have played 22 games in the league while Ferris State, Lake Superior, Michigan and Ohio State each have two games in hand with 20 games played to date. Notre Dame plays five of its last six games on the road to close the regular season.

IRISH VERSUS BRONCOS: Notre Dame and Western Michigan have met 70 times in the all-time series with the Broncos holding a 35-29-6 edge. At Lawson Arena, Western Michigan is 22-10-4 against the Irish. Notre Dame is 4-1-1 in the last six meetings and was 1-0-1 last season in two games at the Joyce Center. The Irish also won the shootout, 2-1, in the tie game. The last time the Irish won at Lawson Arena was Nov. 17, 2007, a 5-1 win. The last Bronco win at Lawson came on Feb. 29, 2008, a 3-0 victory in the last meeting between the two schools in Kalamazoo, Mich.

HUMANITARIAN AWARD:

Senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash)** is one of 18 college hockey players (men and women) to be nominated for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award that goes each year to college hockey's top citizen. Deeth, an alternate captain, with the Irish, oversees the team's community service efforts and spearheaded last weekend's "Giving The Shirts Off Their Back," jersey auction that benefited the Wounded Warriors Project. The award will be presented at the Frozen Four in Detroit in April.

SHIRTS OFF THEIR BACKS: The Notre Dame hockey team's special commemorative jersey auction last weekend (Jan. 29-30) proved to be a huge success as it raised a total of \$41,604.60 to benefit Hockey Helpers and the Wounded Warrior Project. The actual jersey auction raised \$16,604.60 for the 28 players' jerseys. With the help of matching gifts from several benefactors, including a former Irish hockey alum, \$25,000 dollars was added to the jerseys for the final total. Senior alternate captain Kevin Deeth's jersey received the highest bid as his jersey went for \$1,575. Following the Jan. 30 game with Nebraska-Omaha, jersey winners in attendance at the game were presented the jerseys on the ice along with a players autograph. The Wounded Warrior Project is a 501(c)(3) non-partisan, non-profit organization that exists to provide tangible comfort and support to the new generation of severely injured service members upon their return home from Iraq, Afghanistan, and other areas around the world. Beginning at the bedside of the severely injured, Wounded Warrior Project provides programs and services designed to ease the burdens of these heroes and their families, aid in the recovery process, and smooth the transition back to civilian life.

NEBRASKA-OMAHA RECAP:

Friday, Jan. 29 -

Nebraska-Omaha snapped a 2-1 Notre Dame lead in the second period, scoring four unanswered goals on the way to a 5-3 win over the Irish on Friday night in front of a sellout crowd of 3,007 at the Joyce Center. Senior captain Jeric Agosto led the Mavericks offensively with two goals and an assist for a three-point game. Matt Ambroz, Dan Swanson and John Kemp had single goals. The Irish scored all three goals on the power play with **Ben Ryan (Jr., Brighton, Mich.)**, **Kyle Palmieri (Fr., Montvale, N.J.)** and **Brett Blatchford (Sr., Temperance, Mich.)** all lighting the lamp on eight tries with the man advantage. The two teams each had 34 shots in the game with **Mike Johnson (Fr., Verona, Mich.)** making 29 saves and UNO's Jeremie Dupont stopping 31 in the win. The Mavericks were 1-for-4 on the power play.

Saturday, Jan. 30 -

Notre Dame jumped out to a 3-0 lead midway through the second period and then held off a late Nebraska-Omaha rally to take a 3-2 win at a sold-out Joyce Center. First period goals by **Calle Ridderwall (Jr., Stockholm, Sweden)** and **Nick Larson (Fr., Apple Valley, Minn.)** gave the Irish a 2-0 lead and **Sean Lorenz (So., Littleton, Colo.)** notched the eventual game winner at 8:25 of the second period for a 3-0 lead. Junior **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** recorded assists on the goals by Larson and Guentzel for his second career two-point game. From there, it was up to **Mike Johnson** to hold off the Mavericks as he made 25 of his 32 saves over the final two periods. UNO got goals from Terry Broadhurst at 14:11 and Rich Purslow at 19:34 (sixth attacker) for the final of 3-2. Notre Dame was out shot in the game, 34-26 with John Faulkner making 23 saves for the Mavericks. The Irish were 1-for-5 on the power play while Nebraska-Omaha was 0-for-5.

SHOOTING IT OUT: The 2008-09 season was the first year that the CCHA used the shootout to determine the winner of games that remained tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime period. During that season, the Irish were involved in three shoot outs, going 3-0 in all three games. In 2009-10, the Irish have been in seven shootouts, including the championship game of the Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 3 versus North Dakota. To date, the Irish are 3-4 this season and 6-4 all-time in shoot outs. Here's a look at Notre Dame's career shoot-out stats.

MR. CLUTCH: Sean Lorenz' goal at 8:25 of the second period versus Nebraska-Omaha proved to be the game winner against the Mavericks. The goal was the second of the year for Lorenz and also his second game-winning goal of the season. On Jan. 2 versus Colgate in the Shillelagh Tournament, Lorenz scored his first collegiate goal and it was the game winner in a 5-2 win over the Raiders. Lorenz has two goals and an assist for three points in 26 games this season.

POWER PLAYS: Notre Dame was 3-for-8 on the power play in Friday's game versus Nebraska-Omaha and then went 1-for-5 on Saturday. Friday's output marked the fourth time this season that the Irish have had three power-play goals in a game. On the year, the Irish are 36-for-175 for a 20.6% success rate to rank 16th nationally in that department and second in the CCHA.

LOST FOR THE SEASON: Just when you thought that Notre Dame's injury situation couldn't get any worse, it did. Junior center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** has been lost for the season due to a shoulder injury. He was tied for third on the team in scoring this season with seven goals and 12 assists for 19 points.

CALL A DOCTOR: The Irish go into this weekend with Western Michigan having missed 64-man games this season due to injuries. The Notre Dame list looks like this:

Calabrese (broken ankle), Ringel (concussion), Ruth (concussion), Maday (shoulder/concussion), Minella (knee) and Cole (concussion) all missed the series versus Nebraska-Omaha. Calabrese has resumed skating.

SLAGGERT HONORED: Irish associate coach **Andy Slaggert** has been honored by the American Hockey Coaches' Association (AHCA) as he was named the winner of the Terry Flanagan Award. The award is named in honor of former New Hampshire player and Bowling Green assistant, Terry Flanagan, and honors an assistant coach for his body of work during his coaching career. Slaggert is in his 17th season as an assistant coach at Notre Dame and is recognized as one of the top recruiters in the nation.

PRACTICE ON THE POND: Notre Dame will hold its annual "Practice on the Pond," at Merrifield Park in Mishawaka, Ind., on Friday, Feb. 12 from 4:00 to 5:30 p.m. The practice is free and open to the public. There will be free hot chocolate and the players will be available for autographs after the practice. Cat Country 99.9 FM will do a live remote from the event.

THE KID IS ALRIGHT: Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** has gotten his collegiate career off to a fast start through the first 30 games of the season. This season, Johnson has appeared in 21 games for Notre Dame, making 19 starts. He is 9-7-4 overall with a 2.13 goals-against average and a .927 save percentage. Two weeks ago, he stopped 71-of-73 shots by Lake Superior while giving up just two goals in a win and a tie to earn CCHA goaltender of the week honors. He owns a pair of shutouts with the first coming on Oct. 16, versus Providence College, and the second on Dec. 13 against Michigan. He is currently fourth in the CCHA and ninth in the nation in goals-against average and second in the league and sixth nationally with his .927 save percentage. In his 19 starts, Johnson has given up 42 goals while the Irish have scored 45.

SCORING WOES: Through the first 30 games of the season, Notre Dame has scored a total of 75 goals. The Irish have scored goals via the power play in 24 of their 30 games and have 36 power-play goals on the year. They also have a pair of short-handed goals to give them 38 special team goals and 37 even-strength markers. For the season, the Irish are averaging 2.50 goals per game to rank tie for 47th in the nation.

JANUARY THAW: After struggling the first three months of the season, Notre Dame saw its offense come to life in January. In the 10 games played during the month, the Irish scored 34 goals for a 3.4 goals-per-game mark. Prior to that, the team had scored 41 over the first 20 games for a 2.05 goals-per-game mark. For the year, Notre Dame is averaging 2.50 goals-per-game, getting 75 goals in 30 games.

DEFENSIVE DANDIES: While the Irish have struggled to score goals, they have done a good job of keeping the puck out of the net through the first 30 games. In those games, Notre Dame's defense has held opponents to two goals or less in 17 of them and has given up three or less in 22 of the 30 contests. For the year, the Irish have given up just 68 goals for a 2.27 goals per game to rank sixth in the nation in team defense.

PENALTY KILLERS: The Irish surrendered one power-play goal in nine chances to Nebraska-Omaha in last weekend's series. Notre Dame has given up just two power-play goals in the last seven games (28-of-30, .933). On the season, Notre Dame leads the CCHA and the nation with a 90.0% penalty-killing rating as they have killed 126-of-140 opponent chances.

PLAYING GAMES: Senior **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** comes into the series with Western Michigan having played in 157 career games and is currently fifth on the Irish all-time games played list. Senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)** moved into the top 10 last weekend, having played in 153 career games. **Ryan Thang (Sr., Edina, Minn.)** and **Brett Blatchford (Sr., Temperance, Mich.)** - have their sights set on the top 10 as they own 151 and 145 games played respectively. OFFENSIVE OUTBURST: Notre Dame's six goals on Jan. 22 and the five-goal second period were season highs for the Irish. Previously, Notre Dame had scored five goals twice on the year (Jan. 2 vs. Colgate and Jan. 15 vs. Michigan State). The last time the Irish scored six goals or more goals in a game was Feb. 13, 2009 when they had nine versus Northern Michigan. The last time Notre Dame had five or more goals in a period was Nov. 22, 2008 when the Irish had six goals in the third period versus Bowling Green.

HAT TRICK HAPPINESS: Junior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** recorded his second hat trick of the season in the 6-1 win over Lake Superior on Jan. 22. The three-goal night proved to be a natural hat trick for Ridderwall as he scored three times in a 6:47 span of the middle period. Notre Dame's leading scorer through 30 games (17-6-23), Ridderwall had his first hat trick on Nov. 28 versus Bowling Green. He becomes the first Irish player to get two hat tricks in a season since **Tim Kuehl '90** accomplished the feat during the 1987-88 season. Ridderwall is tied for second in the CCHA with his 17 goals, while his 10 power-play goals leads the conference.

IRISH VERSUS TOP-RANKED TEAMS: With a win and a tie against Lake Superior State on Jan. 22-23, the Irish improved to 5-6-4 this season versus ranked teams. For the year, the Irish own wins against then No. 3 Boston University (3-0), at No. 14 Alaska (3-2), vs. No. 6 Michigan State (4-1) and a 5-2 win vs. No. 6 Michigan State on Jan. 15. Notre Dame was 5-5 during the 2008-09 season against nationally ranked teams.

DEFENSIVE SCORING: Over Notre Dame's last seven games, the Irish have scored 24 goals (3.43 per game) while giving up 19 (2.71 gpg). In those seven games, Irish defensemen have been active in the scoring, getting three goals and 20 assists for 23 points. **Kyle Lawson** leads the way with a goal and eight assists for nine points. **Brett Blatchford** follows with a goal and six assists for seven points. **Ian Cole (Jr., Ann Arbor, Mich.)** had a goal and two assists for three points before being injured on Jan. 22. **Joe Lavin (Jr., Shrewsbury, Mass.)** has four assists in that seven-game span while **Sean Lorenz** has a goal and no assists.

OVERTIME MARKS: Three of Notre Dame's eight games in January went into overtime and were decided by a shootout. For the season, the Irish are 1-0-7 in overtime games. In the seven shootouts to date, Notre Dame is 3-4. The overtime win on Nov. 27 versus Bowling Green was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-10 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

STREAKING IRISH: Freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri (Montvale, N.J.)** was a member of the gold-medal winning U.S. Junior National Team in January. He returned to the Notre Dame lineup on Jan. 15 versus Michigan State and has scored in every game since then. During his six-game point streak, Palmieri has one goal and five assists for six points. His six-game streak is a career high and is the second longest point streak for the Irish this season.

50/50 CLUB: With a goal and two assists in the 6-1 win over Lake Superior State, senior captain **Ryan Thang** became the 30th player in Notre Dame history to score 50 goals with 50 assists in his career. Thang now has 56 goals and 51 assists for 107 career points. The last player to reach that mark was **Rob Globke '04** who did it in 2003-04 and finished his career with 68 goals and 56 assists. Earlier in January, Thang became the 45th player in the history of the Irish hockey program to score 100 points in his career. Thang's assist on **Ian Cole's** power-play goal in

the first period of the Jan. 10 game with Ferris State gave him 51 goals and 49 assists for his 100th career point.

HOME ICE STRUGGLES: With the weekend split with Nebraska-Omaha (Jan. 29-30), Notre Dame saw its home record remain at 7-7-3 for the first 17 home games this season. During the 2008-09 campaign, the Irish were 13-3-2 at the Joyce Center and over the previous three seasons owned a 37-9-7 mark on home ice.

MR. CLUTCH: With his game-winning goal on Jan. 15 versus Michigan State, **Ryan Thang** became Notre Dame's all-time leader in game winner with 14. The goal snapped a four-way tie for the top spot.

CHART-CLIMBING, PART TWO: Senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson** leads Irish defensemen in scoring and is tied for third among CCHA defensemen with four goals and 17 assists for 21 points. For his career, Lawson is now tied with former Notre Dame All-American **Bill Nyrop** '74 with 89 career points for eighth on Notre Dame's all-time list for points by a defenseman. He has 17 goals and 72 assists for 89 points in 153 career games. Here is the top 10 scoring defensemen for the Irish.

FIRST TIMERS: Two members of the Notre Dame lineup recorded "firsts" in their careers in the 6-1 win over Lake Superior State. Center **Patrick Gaul (So., Pittsburgh, Pa.)** scored his first career goal at 6:34 of the second period to give the Irish a 3-1 lead. The goal came in his 35th career game. Freshman right wing **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** picked up his first career assist on Gaul's goal. His point came in the 11th game of his career.

A NICK OF TIME: Notre Dame freshman left wing **Nick Larson** has proven to be a clutch scorer for the Irish in his rookie year. Among his six goals this season are a pair of game winners and one game-tying goal. His most recent "clutch" goal came on Jan. 23 when he scored the lone goal for the Irish in the 1-1 tie at Lake Superior State. Larson's third-period goal came just 23 seconds after the Lakers had taken the lead. His top game of the season came on Jan. 15 against Michigan State when he collected three points (2g, 1a) in the 5-2 win over the Spartans. His four-point weekend (2g, 2a) against Michi-

gan State earned him CCHA rookie of the week honors on Jan. 18. On the year, he now has six goals and three assists for nine points with two game-winning goals.

BACK BETWEEN THE PIPES: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** stopped 19-of-20 shots in relief of **Mike Johnson** in the 4-4 overtime tie against Michigan State on Jan. 16. Phillips played the final 40:26 of the game. It marked his first appearance in goal for the Irish since Nov. 28 against Bowling Green. Phillips, who missed the entire 2008-09 season due to knee surgery, has appeared in nine games this season, making eight starts. He is 2-3-3 overall with a 2.20 goals-against average and a .921 save percentage with one shutout.

WINNING THE GOLD: Notre Dame freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri** returned to the Notre Dame lineup after helping the U.S. Junior National team win the gold medal at the World Junior Championships. The 5-11, 195-pound right wing was third in scoring on the team with a goal and eight assists for nine points and was +8 in the tournament. He is the first Irish player to win a gold medal in the World Junior Championships. Palmieri sat out the Ferris State series as Coach Jeff Jackson gave him the series off to return home after missing the holiday break.

IRISH MEDALS: A total of 13 Notre Dame players have participated in the World Junior Championships since 1977. In that time, three have been members of U.S. medal-winning teams. Joining **Kyle Palmieri** and his gold medal this season are current Irish defenseman **Kyle Lawson**, who won a bronze medal in 2007, when he was captain of the U.S. team and former standout **Ben Simon '00**, who won a silver medal in 1997.

SWEEPLESS IN SOUTH BEND: For the second time this season, the Irish were swept in a weekend series as Ferris State took two on Jan. 9-10 to join Miami and its Dec. 4-5 sweep against the Notre Dame. The Ferris State sweep marks just the 10th time in the **Jeff Jackson** era (2005-) that the Irish have been swept in a two-game series. Since Jackson took over, the Irish have been swept five times in 2005-06, twice in 2007-08, once last year and twice this season.

BEST OF THE BEST: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Notre Dame hockey program has been among the tops in the nation in wins and winning percentage along with Michigan and Miami. Michigan is one win (103) ahead of the Irish (102) with Miami third with 98 wins. Notre Dame is tops in winning percentage at .695, followed by the Wolverines (.6928) and Miami (.6928). TOUGH TICKET: With a back-to-back sell out crowds of 3,007 and 2,857 versus Nebraska-Omaha, Notre Dame now has recorded 13 sell-outs in its first 17 home games this season. The Irish have recorded sellouts in 22 of their last 26 home games, dating back to Dec. 13, 2008 versus Bowling Green. In 17 home games this season, Notre Dame is averaging 2,755 per game. A sellout is 2,713.

HIGHLY RANKED: Notre Dame freshman center **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** is the top-ranked collegiate hockey player in NHL Central Scouting's mid-term rankings for the 2010 NHL Entry Draft. Sheahan was ranked fifth among all North American skaters. As a freshman at Notre Dame, who only turned 18 on Dec. 7, Sheahan is fifth on the team in scoring with five goals and 10 assists for 15 points in 27 games. Four other players who have signed national letters-of-intent to attend Notre Dame in 2010 or 2011 also have been ranked. Joining Sheahan are defenseman **Stephan Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, ranked 28th; defenseman **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** is 32nd; defenseman **Jarred Tinordi (Millersville, Md.)** checks in at 42nd and forward **Bryan Rust (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.)** is ranked 76th. Johns, Tinordi and Rust play for the U.S. National Development Program while Lind plays for the Chicago Steel in the USHL.

TOMMY O: Senior **Tommy O'Brien (Mokena, Ill.)** made his second start of the season and just the fourth of his career in the 4-2 loss to Ferris State (Jan. 10). In the game, O'Brien made a career-high 29 saves in taking the loss. In three appearances this season, O'Brien is 1-1-0 with a 2.29 goals against average and a .906 save percentage. During his career, the Mokena, Ill., native is 2-1-0 with a 1.97 goals-against average and a .910 save percentage with one shutout.

CLOSE ONES: The January 30, 3-2 win over Nebraska-Omaha, improved Notre Dame to 3-5 in one-goal games this year. Last season, the Irish were 11-2 in games decided by one goal.

HERE COMES THE FUTURE: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that nine players have signed national letters-of-intent to begin playing hockey at Notre Dame over the next two seasons. The list included three defensemen and six forwards. The defensemen are **Stephen Johns, Kevin Lind and Jarred Tinordi** and the forwards include **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.), David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa), Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.), Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.), Bryan Rust and T.J. Tynan (Orland Park, Ill.)**. Three members of the incoming class - Johns, Rust and Tinordi - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other six are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Two members of this group - Costello and Lee - have already been drafted by National Hockey League teams in the 2009 Entry Draft and four - Johns, Lind, Tinordi and Rust are ranked by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in its mid-term rankings. Of the six USHL players, five participated in the USHL all-star game on Jan. 26 in Indianapolis, Ind. Lind, Costello and Lee were with the East team while Tynan and Gerths played for the West. For Costello and Gerths, this is their second all-star appearance.

WELCOME TO NOTRE DAME: Junior defenseman **Joe Lavin (6-3, 200)** joins the Irish lineup for the second half of the season after leaving Providence College following the first semester of the 2008-09 season. He finished that year with the USHL's Omaha Lancers and played the first half of this season in Omaha. In 48 games over a season-and-a half with Providence, Lavin had no goals and eight assists for eight points. After leaving Providence, he played in 33 games for Omaha last season, scoring seven goals with 16 assists for 23 points with 28 penalty minutes. This year, Lavin played in 24 games with five goals and 12 assists for 17 points and was third on the team with a +16. The Lancers were in first place in the USHL's Western Division when Lavin left with a 19-4-1 record. He was a fifth-round pick, 126th overall, of the Chicago Black Hawks in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. Lavin is a product of the USA National Team Development Program where he was a teammate on the Under-18 team with fellow Irish juniors **Ian Cole, Brad Phillips and Teddy Ruth**.

LONG, LONG TIME: Prior to the 2-0 shutout of Michigan on Dec. 13 at the Joyce Center, the last time that Notre Dame registered a shutout versus Michigan came on Dec. 8, 1973 at Yost Arena by a 2-0 score. **Mark Kronholm '74** made 26 saves in that blanking of the Wolverines. It would take 36 years and five days before the Irish would register another shutout against Michigan.

DOUBLE BLANKINGS: The two shutouts by Miami (Dec. 4-5) marked the first time the Irish had been shutout in back-to-back games since Jan. 21-22, 2005 when Wisconsin blanked Notre Dame, 2-0 and 2-0. The last team to shut the Irish out was the RedHawks, who took a 2-0 decision on Oct. 24, 2008 to be the only team to shut Notre Dame out last season.

TORPEDOES AWAY: When Notre Dame faced Michigan on Dec. 11 and 13, the Irish were forced to play the Wolverines with four defensemen out of the lineup due to injuries. Coach **Jeff Jackson** and his staff decided to go with the "Torpedo" system employed often by Sweden. Three forwards - sophomore **Billy Maday**, freshman **Riley Sheahan** and junior **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** - moved back to play defense as the Irish deployed three units with four forwards and one defenseman. Notre Dame gained a split in the series, losing 4-1, before taking a 2-0 shutout on Dec. 13.

PENALTY SHOTS: Miami's Carter Camper was awarded a penalty shot at 2:09 of the second period in the Dec. 4 game with Miami against Notre Dame's **Mike Johnson**. The penalty shot was the first faced by Johnson in his college career and he made the stop. The penalty shot was the first against the Irish since Feb. 28, 2003 when Western Michigan's Vince Bellissimo was awarded one. Notre Dame goaltender **Morgan Cey '05** made the stop in a game the Irish would lose, 4-2.

USA...USA...USA: Freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was selected to the 2010 U.S. Junior National Team after attending a three-day pre-tournament camp in Grand Forks, N.D. A 2009 first round draft choice of the Anaheim Ducks, Palmieri has five goals and two assists for seven points in 19 games for the Irish. Since 2006-07, Notre Dame has had at least one player on the U.S. Junior National Team - **Kyle Lawson (Sr., New Hudson, Mich.)** in 2006-07, **Ian Cole** in '07-'08 and '08-'09 and **Teddy Ruth (Jr., Naperville, Ill.)** in '08-'09.

LENDING A HELPING HAND: Sophomore right wing **Billy Maday** turned in a career high four-point and four-assist game in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green on Nov. 28. His previous best in both categories was two points and two assists. Maday's four-assist game was the first by a Notre Dame player since **Erik Condra '09** had four assists on March 9, 2007. The four-point game was the first by an Irish player since **Ian Cole** had four points (2g, 2a) on Feb. 13, 2009 versus Northern Michigan.

DEETH TOPS 100: Senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** became the 44th player in the 42-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program to reach 100 points for his career on Oct. 23. His assist on **Calle Ridderwall's** first-period goal gave Deeth 32 goals and 68 assists for his 100th career point. He reached that mark in 133 games. Deeth now has 111 career points and is 37th on the all-time points list. Right behind him is senior teammate **Ryan Thang** who is tied for 41st with 104 career points (55g, 49a). He needs just one assist to join the 50/50 club for players with 50 goals and 50 assists in a career.

STEALING THE SHOW: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** made a career-high 34 saves as he handed the Boston University Terriers a 3-0 loss at Agganis Arena. Phillips got all the offensive support he needed in the second period when **Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Ben Ryan** scored 12 seconds apart to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. **Calle Ridderwall** added a power-play goal in the third period for the 3-0 final score. Maday, Ryan and Ridderwall each had a goal and an assist in the game. Phillips made 27 of his 34 saves in the first and third periods, including 17 in the final stanza. BU out shot the Irish, 34-16, in the game. The win was the first-ever for the Friars against Boston University (1-2-0 all-time).

RING(EL) THE BELL: Sophomore defenseman **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** recorded his first career point with the Irish when he assisted on a **Calle Ridderwall** goal in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green. After playing in just six games as a freshman, Ringel has become a regular on the Irish defense, playing in 17 of the team's 18 games.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's game versus Michigan State at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Nov. 22 marked the third time the Irish had played there. They are now 2-1 all-time at the Ft. Wayne building. Notre Dame first played there on Feb. 18, 2005, dropping a 9-2 decision to Michigan in front of 7,948 fans. The Irish returned on Dec. 30, 2006 and defeated Northern Michigan, 4-3, with a crowd of 3,134 on hand for the contest. This time, Notre Dame prevailed, 4-1, on Nov. 22 with a 3,572 in attendance. Notre Dame, the Allen Co. War Memorial Coliseum and the city of Ft. Wayne will serve as cohosts of the 2010 NCAA Hockey Midwest Regional on March 27-28, 2010.

IN ARUT: Notre Dame's 4-1 win over Michigan State (Nov. 19) snapped a four-game winless skid (0-2-2) for the Irish. That was the longest winless streak since Feb. 16-Feb. 29, 2008 when they were 0-2-2 over that four-game span.

STREAK BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 shutout win over Boston University, snapped a streak of 99-consecutive games that the Terriers had not been shutout. The last time BU was shutout came on Dec. 2, 2006 when the Terriers shutout Boston College, 1-0. The win also marked the first time since Jan. 15, 2008 that Boston University lost a non-conference game, a streak of 10 consecutive wins.

A STUNNING START: Prior to **Brad Phillips'** 3-0 shutout at Boston University, freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** showed the way with a 2-0 blanking of Providence College in his rookie debut on Oct. 16. Johnson stopped all 29 shots he faced in blanking the Friars, 2-0, becoming the second Irish goaltender to record a shutout in his first career contest. He joins teammate **Tom O'Brien (Sr., Mokena, Ill.)** who picked up a shutout in his first start last season, a 7-0 blanking of Sacred Heart on Oct. 18, 2008.

LIGHTING THE LAMP: When senior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** scored his power-play goal in the first period of the Oct. 10 game with Alabama-Huntsville, it was his first time lighting the lamp since his freshman year. Blatchford's last goal came on Jan. 20, 2007 when he scored versus Western Michigan. Before that goal, Blatchford went 99 games without scoring. The Temperance, Mich., native would rather set them up than score them as he now has three career goals to go with 54 assists for 57 points. He was second on the team in assists in 2008-09 when he had 25 helpers on the year.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshmen forwards **Riley Sheahan** and **Kyle Palmieri** wasted little time getting on the scoresheet in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 9. Sheahan scored on his first career shot, scoring on the power play at 3:02 of the first period to

give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. He joins **Billy Maday** and **Tim Wallace '06** as recent Notre Dame players to score on the first shots of their college careers. Palmieri joined in with a second-period power-play goal to get his first career score in his first game.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS

AWARD: Notre Dame senior captain **Ryan Thang** has been named one of 20 nominees for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, two members of the Irish hockey team - **Erik Condra '09** and **Jordan Pearce '09** - were selected as one of 10 finalists for the honor. For the 2007-08 campaign, captain **Mark Van Guilder '08** made it to the list of 10 finalists. For the 2006-07 season, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. The list of 20 candidates will be narrowed down midway through the season with the final 10 going on a ballot to select the national winner.

CAPTAINS: Senior left wing **Ryan Thang** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2009-10 season. Joining Thang as alternate captains in '09-'10, are senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**, senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** and junior defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Thang and Lawson served as alternate captains in 2008-09, while this is the first season as captain for Deeth and Ruth.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team - junior goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** and freshmen forwards **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** - have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Phillips' uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988. Nugent's father, **Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78**, played hockey for the Irish between 1974-78, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. Kevin, Jr., becomes the second Notre Dame hockey player to follow his father to South Bend. He follows goaltender **Rory Walsh '06** who followed his father, **Brian Walsh '77** who was a teammate of the elder Nugent, playing for coach Lefty Smith. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08.

ALL-AMERICANS: Two Notre Dame players were selected AHCA/Reebok All-Americans following the 2008-09 season. Current junior defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was selected as a first team All-American while right wing **Erik Condra '09** was selected second team.

The previous times came in 1972-73 when **Eddie Bumbacco '74** and **Bill Nyrop '74** were chosen and again in 1976-77 when **Jack Brownschidle '77** and **Brian Walsh '77** were honored.

HOMETOWNS: The 2009-10 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 15 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces - those listed below, plus: Delaware, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Junior **Calle Ridderwall** (Stockholm) is the first Notre Dame hockey player from Sweden.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: With this year's selection of Kyle Palmieri to the U.S. Junior National Team, the Irish now have 13 players to play for their country in the World Junior Championships. Palmieri joins defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** who were selected to play in the 2009 World Junior Championships in Ottawa, Ont. Last year's team finished fifth with Cole getting two goals and two assists for four points in six games while Ruth was scoreless in six contests. Palmieri, Cole and Ruth join **Jack Brownschidle** ('76-'77, '78-'79), **Ben Simon** ('96-'97, '97-'98), **Joe Dusbabek** ('97-'98), **Dan Carlson** ('98-'99), **Connor Dunlop** ('99-'00, '00-'01), **Brett Henning** ('99-'00), **David Inman** ('99-'00), **Rob Globke** ('00-'01, '01-'02), **Brett Lebda** ('01-'02) and **Kyle Lawson** ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTS: With the addition of **Joe Lavin** (Chicago Black Hawks, 5th round in 2007 Entry Draft) to the Notre Dame roster for the second half of the 2009-10 season, the Irish now have 10 players on the team who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Two freshmen joined the list this season. Left wing **Nick Larson** (Apple Valley, Minn.) was a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall. Right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was a first round pick, 26th overall in the 2009 Draft last June. He became the second Notre Dame player ever selected in the first round. They join defenseman **Sean Lorenz** who also was selected in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. Defenseman **Ian Cole** was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues, who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in 2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan** (Brighton, Mich.) joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** rounds out the group of nine players as he was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, on-campus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.
