TOURNEY TIME: Notre Dame returns to action for the second half of the season this weekend when the Irish play host to the second Shillelagh Tournament on Jan. 2-3, 2010 at the Sears Centre Arena in Hoffman Estates, Ill. The Irish welcome Colgate University (ECAC) Niagara University (CHA) and North Dakota (WCHA) to this year's holiday action. The Niagara Purple Eagles will face off against the North Dakota Fighting Sioux in the tourney opener on Jan. 2 in a 3:05 p.m. (CT) contest. Niagara brings a 3-10-2 overall record into the tournament and is tied for third in the CHA with a 1-3-1 league mark. The Buffalo, N.Y. based school will face a North Dakota squad that is 9-6-3 on the year and 6-6-2 in the WCHA standings, good for sixth place. The Sioux are currently ranked sixth in both the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* and the USCHO.com polls. Game two of Saturday's doubleheader will have Notre Dame (CCHA) battling Colgate (ECAC) at 6:05 p.m. (CT). The Fighting Irish are now 8-8-4 overall and 5-5-4-2 in the CCHA, good for 22 points and sixth place in the league standings. The Irish are ranked 20th in the USCHO.com poll. The Raiders enter the tournament with a 7-6-4 overall record and are tied for third in the ECAC with a 5-3-1 mark in conference play. Saturday's games will begin at 3:05 p.m. and 6:05 p.m. (CT).

IRISH TOURNAMENT INFORMATION: The Shillelagh Tournament is in its second season as the Irish will look to defend its title won a year ago. Notre Dame knocked off Union College (3-1) and Minnesota-Duluth (3-1) last January 2-3. The Shillelagh Tournament marks the 32nd in-season tournament for the Irish in the program's 42-year history. In the previous 31 tournaments, Notre Dame owns a 25-34-3 all-time record. The Irish have finished first (seven times), second (six times), third (seven times) and fourth (11 times) in those tournaments. Notre Dame has faced both Colgate and Niagara in tournament play. Both times the Irish have faced Colgate was in an in-season tournament as they faced the Raiders in the 1985 Phoenix Mutual Tournament in Hartford, Conn. and then the following season in the Syracuse Invitational in Syracuse, N.Y. In the only meeting between the two schools, Notre Dame and Niagara played in the third-place game of the Maverick Shootout in Omaha, Neb. The game ended in a 3-3 tie with the Irish winning a shoot out to decide third place.

FRIEND AND FOE: Notre Dame's Kyle Palmieri (Fr., Montvale, N.J.) and North Dakota's Danny Kristo will be missing the Shillelagh Tournament this year as both are members of the U.S. Junior National Team playing in the World Junior Championships being held in Saskatoon, Sask., this week. The two were teammates with USA Hockey's National Team Development Program the last two years and have skated in the World Juniors on the same line at times in the tournament. Through the first three games of the tournament, Palmieri has recorded six assists, including four versus Latvia in the 12-1 U.S. win on Dec. 29. Kristo has three goals and one assist for four points in the tournament. The U.S. is 3-0 as of Dec. 30 and has clinched a spot in the quarterfinals. They face Canada in the final game of the round-robin portion of the tournament on Dec. 31.

LOCAL IRISH CONNECTIONS: Notre Dame has seven players on the current roster with connections to the Chicago area. The group includes seniors **Dan Kissel (Crestwood, Ill.)** and **Tom O'Brien (Mokena, Ill.)**, juniors **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)** and **Joe Lavin (Shrewsbury, Mass.)**, sophomores **Billy Maday (Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm, Sweden)** plus freshman **Sam Calabrese (Park Ridge, Ill.)**. Kissel, a left wing, played midget hockey with Team Illinois and Mission AAA before playing junior hockey in the USHL with the Chicago Steel. O'Brien, a goaltender, played his midget hockey for the Chicago Young Americans. Ruth, a defenseman, played his midget hockey for Chicago Mission and Team Illinois while Joe Lavin, another defenseman, who transferred to Notre Dame from Providence College, was a 2007 fifth-round draft pick of the Chicago Black Hawks. Maday, a right wing, is a product of the Chicago Chill midget program where he teamed with Ridderwall, a left wing, in 2005-06 to lead the Chill to the USA Midget AAA championship game. Calabrese, a defenseman, played for Team Illinois during his midget career.

WELCOME TO NOTRE DAME: Junior defenseman **Joe Lavin** (6-3, 200) joins the Irish lineup for the second half of the season after leaving Providence College following the first semester of the 2008-09 season. He finished that year with the USHL's Omaha Lancers and played the first half of this season in Omaha. In 48 games over a season-and-a-half with Providence, Lavin had no goals and eight assists for eight points. After leaving Providence, he played in 33 games for Omaha last season, scoring seven goals with 16 assists for 23 points with 28 penalty minutes. This year, Lavin played in 24 games with five goals and 12 assists for 17 points and was third on the team with a +16. The Lancers were in first place in the USHL's Western Division when Lavin left with a 19-4-1 record. He was a fifth-round pick, 126th overall, of the Chicago Black Hawks in the 2007 NHL Entry Draft. Lavin is a product of the USA National Team Development Program where he was a teammate on the Under-18 team with fellow Irish juniors **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)**, **Brad Phillips (Jr., Farmington Hills, Mich.)** and **Teddy Ruth**.

SHOOTING IT OUT: The 2008-09 season was the first year that the CCHA used the shoot out to determine the winner of games that remained tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime period. During that season, the Irish were involved in three shoot outs, going 3-0 in all three games. In 2009-10, the Irish have been in four shoot outs, including back-to-back games versus Northern Michigan and Michigan State. To date, the Irish are 2-2 this season and 5-2 all-time in shoot outs. Both players were injured in the series at Miami, Dec. 4-5 and missed both games of the Michigan series (Dec. 11 and 13).

LAST TIME OUT: Notre Dame closed out the first half of the season in fine form on Dec. 13 before a sellout crowd at the Joyce Center, knocking off Michigan, 2-0, behind a career-high 38-save performance from freshman **Mike Johnson (Verona, Wis.)**. Johnson got all the offense he needed in the second period on goals by freshman **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)** and junior **Calle Ridderwall** for the 2-0 win. The Irish had dropped the first game of the series at Ann Arbor, 4-1, on Friday, Dec. 11.

NOTRE DAME VS. COLGATE: The Irish and the Raiders have met just twice in the all-time series, playing twice in tournaments. The first meeting came in the Phoenix Mutual Tournament in Hartford, Conn., on Jan. 5, 1985 in the third-place game with Colgate taking a 13-4 decision. The following year, the team's met in the Syracuse Invitational on Dec. 27, 1985, in an opening round game. The Raiders won that contest, 8-7. Irish volunteer assistant **Mike McNeill '84** played in both of those games.

NOTRE DAME VS. NIAGARA: The Irish and the Purple Eagles met in the third-place game of the 2000 Maverick Stampede in Omaha, Neb. and battled to a 3-3 overtime tie in the only meeting between the two schools. Notre Dame won the shootout, 2-1, to decide third place for the tournament.

NOTRE DAME VS. NORTH DAKOTA:

These two teams have met 32 times in the all-time series, but not since the 1998-99 season when they faced off in a weekend series in Grand Forks, N.D. Of the 32 games played, 30 of them came while the two teams were members of the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) from 1970-81. The Irish lead the all-time series, 16-15-1 with the Fighting Sioux holding a 10-1-1 mark in the last 12 meetings. The last time the two school's met was Jan. 2-3, 1999. North Dakota was ranked No. 1 in the country and the Sioux handed Notre Dame an 8-1 loss in the opening game of the series before the Irish bounced back for a 4-3 win in the second game.

TORPEDOES AWAY: The last time the Irish were in action, Dec. 11-13, they were forced to play Michigan with four defensemen out of the lineup due to injuries. Coach **Jeff Jackson** and his staff decided to go with the "Torpedo" system employed often by Sweden. Three forwards - sophomore **Billy Maday**, freshman **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.)** and junior **Ryan Guentzel (Woodbury, Minn.)** - moved back to play defense as the Irish deployed three units with four forwards and one defenseman. Notre Dame gained a split in the series, losing 4-1, before taking a 2-0 shutout on Dec. 13.

LONG, LONG TIME: The last time that Notre Dame registered a shutout versus Michigan came on Dec. 8, 1973 at Yost Arena by a 2-0 score. Mark Kronholm '74 made 26 saves in that blanking of the Wolverines. It would take 36 years and five days before the Irish would register another shutout against Michigan.

SCORING DROUGHT: Through the first 20 games of the season, Notre Dame has scored a total of 41 goals. The Irish have scored goals via the power play in 15 of their first 20 games, including one in each game versus Michigan. Notre Dame now has 20 power-play goals and one short-handed goal to go with 20 even-strength goals. The Irish have scored four or more goals in just two games this season. For the year, the Irish are averaging 2.05 goals-per game and the offensive attack is 53rd in the nation.

DEFENSIVE DANDIES: Through the first 20 games this season, the Notre Dame defense has held opponents to two goals or less in 12 of them and has given up three or less in 17 of the 20 contests. For the year, the Irish have given up just 39 goals for a 1.95 goals per game to rank third in the nation in team defense. The trio of Irish goaltenders - junior **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)**, freshman **Mike Johnson** and senior **Tommy O'Brien (Mokena, Ill.)** own a 1.91 goals-against average and a .930 save percentage to go with the 8-8-4 overall record.

THE KID IS ALRIGHT: Freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** has gotten his collegiate career off to a fast start through the first 20 games of the season. He has appeared in six straight games for the Irish, making four consecutive starts heading into the Shillelagh Tournament. In 12 games, including 11 starts, Johnson is 5-5-2 with a 1.70 goals-against average and a .940 save percentage with two shutouts. Johnson recorded a shutout versus Providence College on Oct. 16 in his first career start and picked up his second with a career-high 38 saves versus Michigan on Dec. 13. His 1.70 goals-against average is third in the nation and his .940 save percentage leads all Division I goaltenders. In his 11 starts, Johnson has given up 20 goals while the Irish have scored 17.

SWEEPLESS IN SOUTH BEND: Miami's sweep against Notre Dame on Dec. 4-5 marked just the ninth time in the **Jeff Jackson** era (2005-) that the Irish have been swept in a two-game series. The RedHawks were the last team to do it, winning a pair from the Irish on Oct. 24-25, 2008 at the Joyce Center. Since Jackson took over, the Irish have been swept five times in 2005-06, twice in 2007-08, once last year and once this season.

HOME ICE STRUGGLES: Notre Dame's win over Michigan on Dec. 13 improved the Irish to 5-4-3 in their first 12 home games this season. During the 2008-09 campaign, the Irish were 13-3-2 at the Joyce Center and over the previous three seasons owned a 37-9-7 mark on home ice.

Senior CLASS Award

GOAL-SCORING MACHINE: Junior left wing **Calle Ridderwall** scored his team-best 11th goal in the 2-0 win over Michigan (Dec. 13). The goal was his seventh power-play goal of the year. Ridderwall is currently tied for third in the CCHA with 11 goals while his seven power-play tallies lead the league and tie him for third nationally. Over the last two seasons, he has scored 28 goals for Notre Dame with 18 of them coming via the power play. Ridderwall's hat trick on Nov. 28 versus Bowling Green was the first for an Irish player since Jan. 5, 2007 when **Kevin Deeth (Sr., Gig Harbor, Wash.)** scored three in a win over Robert Morris at Mellon Arena in Pittsburgh.

DOUBLE BLANKINGS: The two shutouts by Miami (Dec. 4-5) marked the first time the Irish had been shutout in back-to-back games since Jan. 21-22, 2005 when Wisconsin blanked Notre Dame, 2-0 and 2-0. The last team to shut the Irish out was the RedHawks, who took a 2-0 decision on Oct. 24, 2008 to be the only team to shut Notre Dame out last season.

PENALTY SHOTS: Miami's Carter Camper was awarded a penalty shot at 2:09 of the second period in the Dec. 4 game with Miami against Notre Dame's **Mike Johnson**. The penalty shot was the first faced by Johnson in his college career and he made the stop. The penalty shot was the first against the Irish since Feb. 28, 2003 when Western Michigan's Vince Bellisimo was awarded one. Notre Dame goaltender **Morgan Cey '05** made the stop in a game the Irish would lose, 4-2.

HIGHLY RANKED: Notre Dame freshman center **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharine's, Ont.)** is the lone CCHA player with an A ranking in NHL Central Scouting's preliminary rankings of players in the NCAA. The highly ranked freshman has four goals and eight assists for 12 points in his first 19 games this season.

Previously, the Irish turned in a win and a tie versus sixth-ranked Michigan State on Nov. 19 and 22nd. Notre Dame has defeated #3/#3 Boston University, 3-0, on Oct. 20 before dropping a 3-2 decision on Oct. 23 to #15/#14 Boston College. On Nov. 6-7, the Irish split a pair with #14/#13 Alaska in Fairbanks, winning 3-2 before dropping a 3-1 decision in the closing game of the series. Notre Dame was 5-5 during the 2008-09 season against nationally ranked teams.

MR. CLUTCH: Irish freshman **Nick Larson** has proven to be a clutch scorer for Notre Dame over his first 20 games in an Irish uniform. The Apple Valley, Minn., native has scored a pair of goals this season - one versus Providence and one against Michigan - with both being game winners. The rugged left winger has scored both of his goals in a pair of 2-0 shutouts by fellow freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson**.

TOUGH TICKET: Notre Dame's last home game on Dec. 13 saw the Irish record the eighth sellout crowd (2,802) in the first 12 home games this season. The Irish have now sold out 17 of their last 21 home games dating back to Dec. 13, 2008 versus Bowling Green. This season's opening night crowd of 2,994 against Alabama-Huntsville is the largest crowd to see a home opener since 1995 as the building's seating capacity was reconfigured following that year with 2,713 being a sellout since then. Through 11 games, the Irish are averaging 2,695 per game.

BEST OF THE BEST: Since the start of the 2006-07 season, the Notre Dame hockey program has been among the tops in the nation in wins and winning percentage followed by Michigan and Miami. The Irish head into the Shillelagh Tournament tied with Michigan with 98 wins over that period. Miami is third with 93. Notre Dame's .705 winning percentage leads Michigan (.693) and Miami (.693). Here are the top five teams by wins and winning percentage since 2006-07.

OVERTIME MARKS: Four of Notre Dame's last six games have gone into overtime with one game decided in the extra session and three going to a shoot out. For the season, the Irish are 1-0-4 in overtime games. In the four shoot-outs to date, Notre Dame is 2-2. The overtime win on Nov. 27 versus Bowling Green was the first for the Irish since Feb. 20, 2009 at Nebraska-Omaha, a 4-3 win. Notre Dame is now 3-0-7 in overtime since its last overtime loss, a 2-1 decision to Miami on March 21, 2008, in the CCHA semifinal game.

CLOSE ONES: The Dec. 4, 1-0 loss to Miami, dropped Notre Dame to 2-5 in one-goal games this year. Last season, the Irish were 11-2 in games decided by one goal.

USA...USA...USA: Freshman right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was selected to the 2010 U.S. Junior National Team after attending a three-day pre-tournament camp in Grand Forks, N.D. A 2009 first round draft choice of the Anaheim Ducks, Palmieri has five goals and two assists for seven points in 19 games for the Irish. Since 2006-07, Notre Dame has had at least one player on the U.S. Junior National Team - **Kyle Lawson (Sr., New Hudson, Mich.)** in 2006-07, **Ian Cole** in '07-'08 and '08-'09 and **Teddy Ruth (Jr., Naperville, Ill.)** in '08-'09.

PENALTY KILLERS: Notre Dame's penalty-killing unit ranks among the best in the CCHA and the nation. To date, the Irish have killed 87-of-96 opponent power-play chances for a 90.6% success rate. That ranks them second in the CCHA behind Ferris State and third in the nation behind Ferris State and Air Force.

AT THE POLLS: Notre Dame's 8-8-4 record has seen the Irish fall out of the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* rankings for the first time since the 2006-07 season, a span of 64 weeks. The Irish are currently ranked 20th in the USCHO.com poll. Notre Dame has been ranked in that poll for 66 consecutive weeks. Week-by-week with the Irish this season:

All four NCAA hockey regionals will sell tickets in three-game packages only. If Notre Dame is selected to participate in the 2010 NCAA Division I Men's Ice Hockey Championship, they will be assigned to play in the Midwest Regional at Ft. Wayne, Ind.

Game times on March 27 are set for 4:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. with the regional championship on March 28 set for 8:00 p.m.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Notre Dame has lost three-straight games on the road, dropping the Irish to 2-4-1 this season away from the Joyce Center. Last year, the Irish were 14-2-2 on the road, the best road record in the program's 42-year history.

LENDING A HELPING HAND: Sophomore right wing **Billy Maday** turned in a career high four-point and four-assist game in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green on Nov. 28. His previous best in both categories was two points and two assists. Maday's four-assist game was the first by a Notre Dame player since **Erik Condra '09** had four assists on March 9, 2007. The four-point game was the first by an Irish player since **Ian Cole** had four points (2g, 2a) on Feb. 13, 2009 versus Northern Michigan. Maday currently leads Notre Dame in scoring with four goals and 12 assists for 16 points.

DEETH TOPS 100: Senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** became the 44th player in the 42-year history of the Notre Dame hockey program to reach 100 points for his career on Oct. 23. His assist on **Calle Ridderwall's** first-period goal gave Deeth 32 goals and 68 assists for his 100th career point. He reached that mark in 133 games. Deeth now has 106 career points and is 39th on the all-time points list. Right behind him is senior teammate **Ryan Thang** who has now played in 141 career games, scoring 51 goals with 47 assists for 98 points. He needs just three assists to join the 50/50 club for players with 50 goals and 50 assists in a career.

CHART CLIMBING: Senior captain **Ryan Thang** recorded his third power-play goal of the season on Nov. 28 versus Bowling Green as he scored the game-tying goal at 11:06 of the third period. The goal was the 24th power-play goal of Thang's career and moved him into a tie for eighth on the all-time list with **Brian Walsh '77**. The top nine on the list look like this:

BACK BETWEEN THE PIPES: The second half of Notre Dame's 1-2 punch in goal - junior **Brad Phillips** - has had a successful return to the Notre Dame lineup this season. The 6-2, 182-pound goaltender missed all of last season due to a knee injury suffered in the 2008-09 preseason that required surgery. Phillips, who made five starts in his freshman year (2007-08) and was 4-1-0 with a 1.53 goals-against average and a .923 save percentage to go with one shutout, has started eight games this season and is 2-3-2 with a 2.26 goals-against average and a .919 save percentage with one shutout.

STEALING THE SHOW: Junior goaltender **Brad Phillips** made a career-high 34 saves as he handed the Boston University Terriers a 3-0 loss at Agganis Arena. Phillips got all the offensive support he needed in the second period when **Billy Maday (So., Burr Ridge, Ill.)** and **Ben Ryan** scored 12 seconds apart to give the Irish a 2-0 lead. **Calle Ridderwall** added a power-play goal in the third period for the 3-0 final score. Maday, Ryan and Ridderwall each had a goal and an assist in the game. Phillips made 27 of his 34 saves in the first and third periods, including 17 in the final stanza. BU out shot the Irish, 34-16, in the game. The win was the first-ever for the Friars against Boston University (1-2-0 all-time).

HERE COMES THE FUTURE: Notre Dame head coach Jeff Jackson has announced that nine players have signed national letters-of-intent to begin playing hockey at Notre Dame over the next two seasons. The list included three defensemen and six forwards. The defensemen are **Stephen Johns (Wampum, Pa.)**, **Kevin Lind (Homer Glen, Ill.)** and **Jarred Tinordi (Millersville, Md.)** and the forwards include **Jeff Costello (Milwaukee, Wis.)**, **David Gerths (Ankeny, Iowa)**, **Anders Lee (Edina, Minn.)**, **Garrett Peterson (Manhattan, Ill.)**, **Bryan Rust (Bloomfield Hills, Mich.)** and **T.J. Tynan (Orland Park, Ill.)**. In making the announcement, Jackson said, "We're very excited about this class of players and over the next two years they will have an impact on the next phase of our program. This class gives us a nice balance of skill, grit and size for the future." Three members of the incoming class - Johns, Rust and Tinordi - play for USA Hockey's National Team Developmental Program. The other six are all currently playing in the United States Hockey League (USHL). Two members of this group - Costello and Lee - have already been drafted by National Hockey League teams in the 2009 Entry Draft and four are currently listed by the National Hockey League's Central Scouting in their preliminary rankings - Johns, Rust, Tinordi and Kevin Lind. RING(EL) THE BELL: Sophomore defenseman **Eric Ringel (Hinckley, Ohio)** recorded his first career point with the Irish when he assisted on a **Calle Ridderwall** goal in the 4-4 tie with Bowling Green. After playing in just six games as a freshman, Ringel has become a regular on the Irish defense, playing in 17 of the team's 18 games.

HOME AWAY FROM HOME: Notre Dame's game versus Michigan State at the Allen County War Memorial Coliseum on Nov. 22 marked the third time the Irish had played there. They are now 2-1 all-time at the Ft. Wayne building. Notre Dame first played there on Feb. 18, 2005, dropping a 9-2 decision to Michigan in front of 7,948 fans. The Irish returned on Dec. 30, 2006 and defeated Northern Michigan, 4-3, with a crowd of 3,134 on hand for the contest. This time, Notre Dame prevailed, 4-1, on Nov. 22 with a 3,572 in attendance. Notre Dame, the Allen Co. War Memorial Coliseum and the city of Ft. Wayne will serve as cohosts of the 2010 NCAA Hockey Midwest Regional on March 27-28, 2010.

IN A RUT: Notre Dame's 4-1 win over Michigan State (Nov. 19) snapped a four-game winless skid (0-2-2) for the Irish. That was the longest winless streak since Feb. 16-Feb. 29, 2008 when they were 0-2-2 over that four-game span.

MADAY TO THE RESCUE: Trailing 2-0 to Northern Michigan on Nov. 15, the Irish turned to sophomore **Billy Maday** to jump start the offense. His power-play goal at 8:42 of the second period cut the lead to 2-1 and his four-on-four tally at 2:36 of the third tied the game at 2-2. In the shoot out, Maday scored Notre Dame's first goal of the shoot out (he's scored on four of seven shoot out attempts in two seasons) as the Irish picked up the extra point with a 2-1 win. The two-goal game was the second of Maday's career. He leads the team in scoring with four goals and 11 assists for 15 points.

CCHA DIFFERENCES: With the start of Notre Dame's CCHA schedule this weekend, there are a couple differences to remember with the final results of a game. First is the shootout - should a game remain tied after 60 minutes of regulation and a five-minute overtime, a winner will be decided via a shootout. Each team will select three shooters who will go one-on-one versus the opponent's goaltender with the winner being the team that scores the most. If the game remains tied after the first three shooters, single shooters will continue until a winner is found. The team winning the shootout will receive two points in the standings while the loser just one. On the national level, the game is still considered a tie. Secondly, the standings in the conference will be different. A regulation or overtime win will see the winning team awarded three points with the loser none. If the game goes to a shootout, both teams will get one point with the shootout winner getting the extra point in the standings.

STREAK BUSTERS: Notre Dame's 3-0 shutout win over Boston University, snapped a streak of 99-consecutive games that the Terriers had not been shutout. The last time BU was shutout came on Dec. 2, 2006 when the Terriers shutout Boston College, 1-0. The win also marked the first time since Jan. 15, 2008 that Boston University lost a non-conference game, a streak of 10 consecutive wins.

A STUNNING START: Prior to **Brad Phillips'** 3-0 shutout at Boston University, freshman goaltender **Mike Johnson** showed the way with a 2-0 blanking of Providence College in his rookie debut on Oct. 16. Johnson stopped all 29 shots he faced in blanking the Friars, 2-0, becoming the second Irish goaltender to record a shutout in his first career contest. He joins teammate **Tom O'Brien (Sr., Mokena, Ill.)** who picked up a shutout in his first start last season, a 7-0 blanking of Sacred Heart on Oct. 18, 2008.

LIGHTING THE LAMP: When senior defenseman **Brett Blatchford (Temperance, Mich.)** scored his power-play goal in the first period of the Oct. 10 game with Alabama-Huntsville, it was his first time lighting the lamp since his freshman year. Blatchford's last goal came on Jan. 20, 2007 when he scored versus Western Michigan. Before that goal, Blatchford went 99 games without scoring. The Temperance, Mich., native would rather set them up than score them as he now has three career goals to go with 54 assists for 57 points. He was second on the team in assists in 2008-09 when he had 25 helpers on the year.

FRESHMEN FIRSTS: Notre Dame freshmen forwards **Riley Sheahan** and **Kyle Palmieri** wasted little time getting on the scoresheet in the 3-2 loss to Alabama-Huntsville on Oct. 9. Sheahan scored on his first career shot, scoring on the power play at 3:02 of the first period to give Notre Dame a 1-0 lead. He joins **Billy Maday** and **Tim Wallace '06** as recent Notre Dame players to score on the first shots of their college careers. Palmieri joined in with a second-period power-play goal to get his first career score in his first game.

LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Notre Dame senior captain **Ryan Thang** has been named one of 20 nominees for the 2009-10 Lowes Senior CLASS Award. The award is given annually to an NCAA Division I student-athlete in nine sports based on achievement's in the "Four C's" of classroom, character, community and competition. CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. Last season, two members of the Irish hockey team - **Erik Condra '09** and **Jordan Pearce '09** - were selected as one of 10 finalists for the honor. For the 2007-08 campaign, captain **Mark Van Guilder '08** made it to the list of 10 finalists. For the 2006-07 season, goaltender **David Brown '07** was selected as the first winner of the hockey award. The list of 20 candidates will be narrowed down midway through the season with the final 10 going on a ballot to select the national winner.

CAPTAINS: Senior left wing **Ryan Thang** will serve as Notre Dame's captain for the 2009-10 season. Joining Thang as alternate captains in '09-'10, are senior defenseman **Kyle Lawson (New Hudson, Mich.)**, senior center **Kevin Deeth (Gig Harbor, Wash.)** and junior defenseman **Teddy Ruth (Naperville, Ill.)**. Thang and Lawson served as alternate captains in 2008-09, while this is the first season as captain for Deeth and Ruth.

FAMILY GUYS: Three members of the Notre Dame hockey team – junior goaltender **Brad Phillips (Farmington Hills, Mich.)** and freshmen forwards **Kevin Nugent (New Canaan, Conn.)** and **Riley Sheahan (St. Catharines, Ont.)** – have family ties to the Irish athletics program. Phillips' uncle is former Irish quarterback **Terry Andrysiak '89**, who played at Notre Dame from 1985 to 1988. Nugent's father, **Kevin Nugent, Sr. '78**, played hockey for the Irish between 1974-78, scoring 54 goals with 75 assists for 129 career points. Kevin, Jr., becomes the second Notre Dame hockey player to follow his father to South Bend. He follows goaltender **Rory Walsh '06** who followed his father, **Brian Walsh '77** who was a teammate of the elder Nugent, playing for coach Lefty Smith. Sheahan is a second cousin of former Irish defenseman **Brock Sheahan '08** who played for the Irish from 2004-08.

ALL-AMERICANS: Two Notre Dame players were selected AHCA/Reebok All-Americans following the 2008-09 season. Current junior defenseman **Ian Cole (Ann Arbor, Mich.)** was selected as a first team All-American while right wing **Erik Condra '09** was selected second team. That marked the third time in the program's history that the Irish had two players selected All-American in the same year. The previous times came in 1972-73 when **Eddie Bumbacco '74** and **Bill Nyrop '74** were chosen and again in 1976-77 when **Jack Brownschilde '77** and **Brian Walsh '77** were honored.

CLUTCH SCORER: During his first three seasons at Notre Dame, senior left wing **Ryan Thang** has proven to be a clutch player. In those three seasons, Thang has amassed 13 game-winning goals, getting six in 2006-07, five in 2007-08 and two last season. He is currently tied for the top spot with 13 game-winning goals. That ties him with **Rob Globke '04**, **Brian Urick '99** and **Dave Poulin '82**, with all three having 13 game winners.

DROP THE PUCK: For the fifth year in a row, Notre Dame hockey opened its season with the annual "Drop The Puck Reception" at the Joyce Center for season ticket holders and fans. This year's event was held on Oct. 6 and featured Garth Snow, the general manager of the New York Islanders. A goaltender with the Islanders from 2001-06, Snow was on Long Island when Jeff Jackson was an assistant coach there. Snow joins Brian Burke, who was the executive vice-president and general manager of the Anaheim Ducks at the time and the G.M. of the 2010 U.S. Olympic hockey team in 2008, Detroit Red Wings' player and current team vice-president Steve Yzerman (2007), Chicago Black Hawk

and Versus/NBC TV analyst Ed Olczyk (2006) and Hall of Fame coach Scotty Bowman, who handled the honors at the first Drop The Puck reception on Sept. 6, 2005 with over 400 fans in attendance. Bowman, who won nine Stanley Cups in his illustrious coaching career, also was invited by Notre Dame head football coach Charlie Weiss to address his team at practice that day, just four days prior to the upset win at Michigan.

LORD STANLEY, LORD STANLEY: For the second consecutive season, a former Notre Dame defenseman played for a Stanley Cup winning team. This time it was Pittsburgh defenseman **Mark Eaton** who became the fourth Notre Dame player to hoist the Stanley Cup. Eaton, who played just one season for the Irish in 1997-98, joins **Brett Lebda '04** who won the Stanley Cup versus Eaton's Penguins in 2008. They follow two other Notre Dame defenseman who have their names etched on the Cup three times - **Bill Nyrop '74** and **Don Jackson '78**. Nyrop played on three Stanley Cup winners with the Montreal Canadiens (1975-78) and Jackson was a member of three Cup-winning teams with the Edmonton Oilers (1982-85). The Pittsburgh defenseman was honored by Notre Dame at halftime of the season-opening game versus Nevada on Sept. 5.

NATIONAL JUNIOR TEAM: With this year's selection of Kyle Palmieri to the U.S. Junior National Team, the Irish now have 13 players to play for their country in the World Junior Championships. Palmieri joins defensemen **Ian Cole** and **Teddy Ruth** who were selected to play in the 2009 World Junior Championships in Ottawa, Ont. Last year's team finished fifth with Cole getting two goals and two assists for four points in six games while Ruth was scoreless in six contests. Palmieri, Cole and Ruth join Jack Brownschidle ('76-'77, '78-'79), Ben Simon ('96-'97, '97-'98), Joe Dusbabek ('97-'98), Dan Carlson ('98-'99), Connor Dunlop ('99-'00, '00-'01), Brett Henning ('99-'00), David Inman ('99-'00), Rob Globke ('00-'01, '01-'02), Brett Lebda ('01-'02) and Kyle Lawson ('06-'07) as former Irish players to play in the World Junior Championships.

NHL DRAFTEES: With the addition of **Joe Lavin** (Chicago Black Hawks, 5th round in 2007 Entry Draft) to the Notre Dame roster for the second half of the 2009-10 season, the Irish now have 10 players on the team who have been selected in the National Hockey League's Entry Draft. Two freshmen joined the list this season. Left wing **Nick Larson (Apple Valley, Minn.)** was a 2008 selection of the Calgary Flames in the fourth round, 108th overall. Right wing **Kyle Palmieri** was a first round pick, 26th overall in the 2009 Draft last June. He became the second Notre Dame player ever selected in the first round. They join defenseman **Sean Lorenz** who also was selected in the 2008 draft by the Minnesota Wild in the fourth round, 115th overall. Defenseman **Ian Cole** was a first-round selection of the St. Louis Blues, who took him with the 18th pick overall. Cole became the first Irish player ever selected in the first round and was selected earlier than any other Notre Dame player (**Rob Globke '04** was the previous highest selection when he was picked 40th overall by Florida in

2002). Cole was followed by fellow defenseman **Teddy Ruth** who went in the second round, 46th overall to the Washington Capitals. **Ryan Thang** was selected in the third round, 81st overall by the Nashville Predators. Sophomore center **Ben Ryan (Brighton, Mich.)** joined Thang when the Predators made him the 114th pick (fourth round). Goaltender **Brad Phillips** rounded out the Notre Dame selections in the 2007 draft when the Philadelphia Flyers selected him in the seventh round, 182nd overall. Defenseman **Kyle Lawson** rounds out the group of nine players as he was selected in the 2005 NHL Draft by the Carolina Hurricanes in the seventh round, 198th overall.

HOMETOWNS: The 2009-10 Notre Dame hockey team features players from 10 states, one Canadian province and Sweden. Over the past 15 seasons, the Irish have had monogram winners from 21 different states and provinces – those listed below, plus: Delaware, Massachusetts, Maryland, New York, North Dakota, Alberta, Prince Edward Island, Quebec, Saskatchewan and British Columbia. Junior Calle Ridderwall (Stockholm) is the first Notre Dame hockey player from Sweden.

NEW HOME FOR THE IRISH: The University of Notre Dame announced on Feb. 12, 2009 that construction on a new, freestanding, on-campus ice arena designed to meet both the needs of the nationally ranked Irish hockey team and the local community would begin next year.

The announcement was made by Notre Dame executive vice-president **John Affleck-Graves** and athletics director **Jack Swarbrick**. The construction is expected to begin in the spring of 2010 on a projected 5,000-seat arena - with the venue ready for play to start the 2011-12 season.

The University's Board of Trustees approved the project at its meetings on campus during the first week of February.

"We're thrilled about the plans for a new ice arena on our campus, particularly based on the superb job **Jeff Jackson** and our hockey team have done to position our program as one of the

best in the nation," said Swarbrick.

"In addition to providing a first-rate home for our hockey team, this new facility will be made available whenever possible to our community as a whole, and, in particular, to the many area youth hockey and figure skating programs that are in need of an additional venue," Affleck-Graves said.

"This is the most important and missing piece of the puzzle to this hockey program. The new building will create an environment that our fans, the students, the players, and our hockey alumni can be proud of," said Irish coach Jeff Jackson.

The new ice arena will be located south of the Joyce Center, just north of Edison Road, and just west of where the new Irish track and field facility is being constructed. In addition to the track and field project, the University currently is in the process of building new stadia for both soccer and lacrosse (both scheduled for completion this year) - in addition to the ongoing Joyce Center arena addition and renovation that began in September 2008.

The majority of the general public arena seating will be of the chair-back variety. The facility will include two sheets of ice (one of them Olympic-sized), with limited seating availability for the second sheet.

The plan also will include offices and locker room and weight and cardio training facilities for the Notre Dame hockey program. Locker rooms also will be available for campus and community use of the facility.

The new ice arena will replace the Joyce Center fieldhouse as Notre Dame's home for ice hockey. The Joyce Center was dedicated in December 1968 as the Athletic and Convocation Center. It was renamed in 1987 in honor of **Rev. Edmund P. Joyce, C.S.C.**, Notre Dame's executive vice president and chair of the Faculty Board on Athletics from 1952 to 1987.

LEFTY'S RINK: When Notre Dame's new ice hockey arena is built the new ice hockey rink will be named the Charles W. "Lefty" Smith, Jr., Rink, in honor of the first coach in the program's history, **Charles "Lefty" Smith**. The announcement was made in April of 2008 at the team's annual awards banquet.

The plans for naming the new ice surface in honor of Smith were made possible by the generosity of the John and Mary Jo Boler family of Inverness, Ill., and Sanibel Island, Fla., their daughter Jill Boler McCormack '84 and her husband, Dan; and their son Matthew Boler '88 and his wife, Christine. They were joined by the family of Frank '57 and Mary Beth O'Brien of Albany, N.Y., who have six children who all graduated from Notre Dame. Their late son, Frankie, played both lacrosse and hockey for the Irish from 1984-88.

Smith came to Notre Dame in 1968 to start the varsity hockey program and coached the Irish for 19 years, retiring in 1987 with 307 career victories. Under his tutelage, Notre Dame produced six All-Americans but most importantly, all 126 student-athletes who played for him completed their collegiate eligibility and earned college degrees.

Smith, who continues to work as the director of the Loftus Sports Center on campus, served two years as the president of the American Hockey Coaches Association. He was inducted into the Minnesota Hockey Coaches Association Hall of Fame in 1992. He played an integral role in bringing the International Special Olympics to Notre Dame in 1987.

Married for 57 years, Lefty, who lost his wife, Mickey on Nov. 9, is the father of seven living children, 16 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.
