Tonight's Game:

Notre Dame (17-11) plays host to Holy Cross (24-6) in the opening round of the National Invitation Tournament ... Notre Dame is making its second straight appearance in the tournament and ninth overall ... The Irish are making their sixth straight postseason appearance ... Notre Dame teams own a 22-8 overall record in NIT games ... The Joyce Center has played host to the NIT on several occasions and Irish teams are 11-2 in those contests ... The two losses were both in the third round to Michigan (67-66 in a 1997) and Oregon (65-61 in 2004) ... Notre Dame finished sixth in the final BIG EAST regular-season standings with a 9-7 mark in conference play ... Holy Cross won the Patriot League regular-season championship with a 13-1 record, but lost to Bucknell 61-57 in the title game ... The I rish are coming off of a 72-65 loss to Rutgers in the first round of the BIG EAST Championships ... Notre Dame's 9-7 finish in BIG EAST play marks the fifth straight year that the Irish have finished with a winning record in conference play ... Only one other program — Syracuse - has finished above the .500 mark each of the last five seasons ... Five of Notre Dame's 11 losses this season have been by five points or less ... Also, five games have been decided by a single point and the Irish are 3-2 in those contests.

Celebrating 100 Seasons:

The 2004-05 season marks the 100th season for the Notre Dame men's basketball program ... Notre Dame is one of 13 Division I schools celebrating its 100th season of basketball this year ... The others include: Dayton, Delaware, Duke, Georgia, Howard, Illinois, Miami (Ohio), Northwestern, Oregon, Virginia, William and Mary and Wyoming.

Notre Dame played its first varsity game on January 29, 1898 (a 64-8 loss to First Regiment) ... The Irish played two other games that season and finished with a 1-2 record ... The following year, they played two games in 1899 and then did not field a team again until the 1907-08 campaign.

Record Watch:

Chris Thomas needs three three-pointers to break the career three-point field goal mark of 301 held by Matt Carroll (1999-2003) ... Thomas enters the game with 299 career three-pointers ... Jordan Cornette needs one block to break the record of 200 career blocked shots shared by he and LaPhonso Ellis (1988-92).

Brey Gets Number 200:

Head coach Mike Brey captured his 200th career victory in Notre Dame's 62-61 defeat of Providence on February 19 ... In 10 seasons and 308 games, he has compiled a 201-107 record for a .653 winning percentage ... Brey compiled a 99-52 mark at Delaware (1995-2000) in five seasons before coming to Notre Dame ... In his first game as Notre Dame's head coach, he won his 100th career game on Nevember 18, 2000 in a 104-58 victory over Sacred Heart.

100 And Counting:

Notre Dame's 70-64 victory against Georgetown on February 16 gave I rish head coach Mike Brey his 100th at the school ... He reached that mark coaching in his 151st game, becoming the second Notre Dame coach to reach the 100-win mark in 151 games ... He owns a 102-55 career mark (.650) at Notre Dame.

Another Unbeaten Falls At The Joyce Center:

Notre Dame's 68-65 win over fourth-ranked and previously unbeaten Boston College (20-0) on February 8 marked the third time in 25 years that an unbeaten team with 20-plus wins suffered a defeat at the Joyce Center ... Prior to that victory, the last time Notre Dame knocked off an undefeated team with 20 or more wins was on February 27, 1980 when No. DePaul brought an unblemished 25-0 record into the Joyce Center ... On that day, the Irish defeated the Blue Demons 76-74 in double overtime ... That game came three years after No. 1 ranked San Francisco come into the Joyce Center on March 1, 1977 with a 29-0 record and left with its first loss of the season (a 93-82 Irish victory).

Irish Finish 2-4 In Stretch Against Ranked Foes:

In six of its last 11 games, the Irish have played opponents who have been ranked ... Notre Dame is 2-4 versus ranked foes this season ... In a four-game stretch, (Jan. 30-Feb. 12) against Connecticut, Syracuse, Boston College and Pittsburgh, all four opponents were ranked ... The last time a Notre Dame team played four consecutive games against ranked opponents was during the the 1977-78 campaign when that Irish team played five ranked foes during the '78 NCAA Tournament ... That squad was 3-2 in those contests and advanced to the Final Four.

Six Straight Postseason Appearances:

Since the 2000, Notre Dame has appeared in either the NCAA or NIT tournaments each of the last six years ... The Irish played in the 2000 NIT and then earned three consecutive NCAA tournament berths — 2001, 2002 and 2003 — followed by NIT appearances in 2004 and 2004 ... This is the longest stretch of postseasons appearances for Irish teams since making six straight from 1983-90 — (NIT in 1983 and 1984 and NCAA from 1985-90).

Starting The Season Ranked:

For the second consecutive year and 24th time in the program's history, Notre Dame began the season ranked — 20th in the Associated Press and 21st in the ESPN/USA Today preseason rankings ... This marks the third time a Notre Dame team under head coach Mike Brey has been ranked ... His first I rish team, the 2000-01 squad, started the year tied for 15th in the AP Poll and were 17th in the ESPN/USA Today ranking ... Last season's 2003-04 squad was 21st and tied for 19th, respectively in the two polls at the start of the year ... Notre Dame climbed to 20th in the AP and 19th in the ESPN/USA Today rankings earlier this season.

Thomas Reaches 2,000-Point Milestone:

With his 16-point performance against West Virginia on January 19, Chris Thomas became the sixth player in Notre Dame history to score 2,000 points ... Thomas has 2,174

career points in 126 career outings and is third on the all-time scoring list ... He ranks behind Austin Carr (2,560) and Adrian Dantley (2,223) and ahead of Pat Garrity (2,085), David Rivers (2,058) and Troy Murphy (2,011).

BIG EAST 1,000:

With his 19-point performance against Boston College on February 8, Chris Thomas became the second player in Notre Dame

history and 25th player overall to score 1,000 points in BIG EAST play (regular-season games only) ... In 64 career BIG EAST games, he scored 1,099 points for a 17.2 career average ... The only other player to score 1,000 points in league play was Pat Garrity who scored 1,107 points in 54 league contests from 1995-98 for a 20.5 scoring average.

BIG EAST 400:

Chris Thomas became the third player in BIG EAST history with 400 career assists ... He finished with 413 career assists in 64 games to rank second all-time ... Sherman Douglas (Syracuse - 1985-89) who holds the record with 426 in 61 games ... Sean Miller (Pittsburgh - 1987-92) is third on the list with 401 in 66 career contests.

Thomas Earns Third Team All-BIG EAST Honors:

Chris Thomas earned BIG EAST all-conference honors for the fourth time in his career when he was named as a third-team selection ... As a freshman in 2001-02, he also was selected as a third-team honoree ... As a sophomore and junior, he garnered second-team accolades.

Thomas In The Record Books:

Chris Thomas has made a record 127 consecutive starts and has not missed a game during his I rish career ... When he sat out the first eight minutes of the second half against St. John's on January 15 with a concussion sustained in the first half, it marked the first time in his career that he missed any part of a game due to injury ... The consecutive games started mark was formerly held by Pat Garrity (1994-98) who started all 111 contests of his career ... Thomas also holds career record for assists (824) and steals (243).

The Captains:

For the second time in school history and for the second consecutive year, Notre Dame has four captains ... Seniors Chris Thomas and Jordan Cornette are captains again along with juniors Torin Francis and Chris Quinn.

Road Warriors:

In Mike Brey's four-plus seasons, his Irish teams have compiled a road record of 43-33 (.566) ... That includes a 28-24 (.538) in true road games and a 15-9 (.625) in neutral site contests.

Scouting the Irish:

Notre Dame has struggled defensively in its last five games as the Irish have yielded 75.2 points per game ... Overall, opponents are averaging 63.6 points ... Prior to the back-to-back losses to Connecticut and UCLA, Notre Dame's previous seven losses had been by a combined 32 points and

Thirteen of the 17 BIG EAST contests the Irish have played have been decided by less than 10 points ... The only double-digit decisions were a 70-57 win at West Virginia, an 88-74 loss at Connecticut and a 66-56 win over Rutgers at the Joyce Center ... Notre Dame is 13-4 at the Joyce Center this season ... The 88 points the Irish gave up to Connecticut on Monday night were the most that they had given up al l season ... Defensively, the Irish have held eight of their opponents to 57 points and under ... The 6.3.6 scoring average is the fewest ever allowed by the Irish during the Mike Brey era ... On eight occasions this season — DePaul (84), Marist (73), Villanova (72), Syracuse (70), Connecticut (74 and 88), UCLA (75), Pittsburgh (85) and Rutgers (72) — have Irish opponents scored more than 70 points this season ... Notre Dame is averaging 67.1 points, the lowest total during Brey's tenure ... Three players are averaging double figures — Chris Thomas (14.0), Chris Quinn (12.6), Colin Falls (12.4), while Torin Francis is averaging 9.4 ppg. and Dennis Latimore 7.3 ppg. ... Francis leads the team in rebounding with 8.0 rebounds ...Thomas also leads the team in both assists (6.6) and steals (2.1), while Jordan Cornette is the team leader in blocks (45).

Irish In The National Statistics:

Chris Thomas stands 13th in assists (6.6 aspg.), while the I rish as a team are 18th in three-point field goals made (8.6).

Series Record vs. Holy Cross:

Tonight's game will be the first meeting between the two schools since January 16, 1985 when Notre Dame defeated Holy Cross 96-61 ... This evening's matchup is the 13th all-time and the first-ever in the postseason ... The I rish lead the series 10-2 and are 3-0 versus the Crusaders at the Joyce Center ... Holy Cross' last win in the series was an 84-72 on December 12, 1955.

Notre Dame Vs. Patriot League:

Holy Cross will be the second Patriot League opponent the I rish have faced this season \dots On December 19, Notre Dame defeated Army 71-52 at the Joyce Center \dots Notre Dame is 39-4 (.907) all-time versus Patriot League opponents.

The Irish All-Time:

In 100 seasons, Irish teams have posted a 1565-862 mark (.645).

Thomas A Finalist Senior Class Award:

Chris Thomas is finalist for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School) Award ... The award is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year for NCAA Division I men's and women's basketball ... I rish women's basketball player Jacqueline Batteast is also a finalist on the women's side.

Special Company:

Chris Thomas reached a milestone against UCLA on February 27 that only two other players in NCAA history have accomplished ... With 2,174 points and 824 assists to his credit, Thomas is the third player in NCAA history with 2,000 points and 800 assists ... Sherman Douglas (Syracuse - 1985-89) finished his career with 2,060 points and 960 assists, while Gary Payton (Oregon State - 1986-90) had 2,172 points and 939 assists.

Home Sweet Home:

Since the inaugural season (1968-69) at the Joyce Center, Notre Dame owns a 444 -135 record all-time for a .767 winning percentage ... The Irish are 59-20 (.747) at the Joyce Center during Mike Brey's five seasons, and since the 1996-97 campaign, they own a 107-36 mark for a .748 winning percentage ... Notre Dame's 13-4 mark at home already this season marks the seventh time in eight years that the Irish have won 10 or more home games.

Irish Medical Update:

Since March of 2004, five I rish players have had some type of surgical procedure ... Forward Torin Francis had back surgery on March 8 to repair a herniated disc ... He returned to the basketball court in June and was able to play with the team during its summer off-season conditioning program ... Point guard Chris Thomas underwent arthroscopic surgery on his left knee on April 9 for a tear on his left kneecap ... He was cleared to return to the court in August ... Rick Cornett had surgery for a stress fracture (broken left foot) on July 23 ... Rob Kurz had surgery on September 14 for a fractured jaw and walk-on Greg Bosl had surgery to remove a screw in his foot after suffering a break in August.

BIG EAST Distinction:

Notre Dame and Syracuse are the only two schools to post winning conference records in BIG EAST play each of the last five seasons ... Notre Dame has gone 11-5 (2000-01), 10-6 (2001-02), 10-6 (2002-03), 9-7 (2003-04) and 9-7 (2004-05), while Syracuse has posted marks of 10-6 (2001-01), 9-7(2001-02), 13-3 (2002-03), 11-5 (2003-04) and 11-5(2004-05).

BIG EAST Season No. 10 for Irish:

The 2004-05 campaign marks Notre Dame's 10th year as a member of the BIG EAST Conference ... In nine-plus seasons as a conference member, Notre Dame owns a 84-84 record all-time in conference regular-season play for a .500 winning percentage ... In their first five years, Irish teams were 35-53 (.398), but since Mike Brey took over the program, Notre Dame has compiled a 49-31 (.613) mark in regular-season play.

BIG EAST Formula For Success Under Brey:

Since his arrival at Notre Dame, Mike Brey has led Notre Dame to a 49-31 (.605) record in BIG EAST regular-season games and a 2-5 mark in tournament play for an overall of 51-36 (.586) against league foes ... In Brey's first season, the Irish posted their first-ever winning record in BIG EAST play and won the BIG EAST West Division title with an 11-5 mark ... Prior to Brey's arrival at Notre Dame, Irish teams had a 35-53 (.398) regular-season record since joining the league in 1995-96.

Over The Century Mark:

Notre Dame has scored 100-plus points five times during the Mike Brey era \dots The last 100-point effort by an Irish team was in a 101-96 overtime decision at Boston College on January 25, 2003.

Heart and Soul

Chris Thomas has long been regarded as the heart and soul of the Irish team by his teammates ... Thomas' performance in the win against St. John's on January 15 proved that ... Thomas suffered a concussion after colliding with a Red Storm player at the end of the first half and missed the first eight minutes of the second half ... It marked the first time that he had ever missed any portion of a game for injury ... Returning to the lineup, he played the final 12 minutes ... Thomas hit 3-4 from the free-throw line and then hit the game-winning shot — a three-pointer with six seconds remaining — that marked his only field goal attempt of the second half.

Finally...Victory In Bloomington:

Notre Dame's win against Indiana was about as good as it gets for the Irish, who had not beaten the Hoosiers in 31 years in Bloomington ... The last time a Notre Dame team defeated Indiana at Assembly Hall was on December 11, 1973 ... The win snapped a 13-game skid in Bloomington and also ended an eight-game losing streak (the longest in the series history) ... Notre Dame had not beaten Indiana since November 29, 1994, and heading into the contest, had lost 13 of the previous 14 matchups ... The 45 points allowed by Notre Dame were the fewest in the series since December 12, 1931 (a 23-12 Indiana victory) spanning 58 games ... Irish head coach Mike Brey remarked after the game that the last time Notre Dame defeated Indiana in Bloomington, he was 14 years old and listening to the Bee Gees.

Down To The Wire:

Five of Notre Dame's 28 games have been decided by a single point ... Notre Dame is 3-2 in those contests ... Irish teams are 9-4 overall during Mike Brey's tenure in one point games ... 13 of Notre Dame's 17 BIG EAST contests have been decided by less than 10 points.

Nothing But Net:

Notre Dame's 19-19 performance from the free-throw line against Villanova was the best ever for an Irish team at the Joyce Center ... Prior to that game, the record for highest free-throw percentage for an Irish team in a game at the Joyce Center was .944 on two occasions – vs. Butler (17-18) on February 14, 1977 and vs. Loyola (17-18) on February 27, 1992 ... Notre Dame also had an impressive outing from the charity stripe against Georgetown at the Joyce Center, connecting on 26-29 (.897).

All About The Threes:

Notre Dame's 14 three-pointers against Pittsburgh in the first meeting between the two teams marked a season-high ... Earlier in the campaign, the Irish registered 13 from beyond the arc in back-to-back games against St. John's and West Virginia ... The Irish shot a season-best 55.0 percent from three-point range against Boston College, hitting 11-20, including 5-8 (.625) in the second half and against Pittsburgh were 14-29 (.483), 8-16 in the second half ... Notre Dame is 84-211 (.398) in its last eight games from three-point range ... The Irish were 155-385 (.408) from three-point range in BIG EAST play and are 241-628 (.384) overall ... As a team, Notre Dame is averaging 8.7 three-point field goals made per game ... Of the 241 three-point field goals made, Chris Thomas (48), Chris Quinn (66) and Colin Falls (89) have combined for 84.2 percent of those three-pointers.

Late-Game Heroics:

Notre Dame used late-game heroics to pull out three of its BIG EAST wins \dots 14 of the last 17 games have been decided by less than 10 points \dots

- vs. Seton Hall Colin Falls hits game-winning three-pointer with four seconds remaining after Pirates had taken a 65-63 lead with 20 seconds remaining for the 66-65 victory.
- vs. Villanova With the game tied at 70-70 with 1:45 remaining, Dennis Latimore gives the Irish a 72-70 advantage on two free throws ... Following a missed Villanova shot, Chris Thomas gives the Irish a four-point lead (74-70) with a jumper along the baseline as the shot clock is about to expire ... Villanova pulled to within two with 41 seconds and then Colin Falls and Thomas sealed the win with two free throws each in the final 38 seconds of the game.
- vs. St. John's Chris Thomas' three-pointer with six seconds remaining his only shot attempt of the second half gives the Irish a 67-66 victory over St. John's ... Jordan Cornette blocks Daryll Hill's drive to the basket as time expires ... It marked the first gamewinning shot of Thomas' career.

The 2004-05 campaign marks the 100th season for the Notre Dame basketball program. As part of the season-long celebration, a 25-man All-Century Basketball Team was announced. All-time leading Fighting Irish scorer Austin Carr headed the list of honorees. The voting was done during the past summer on Notre Dame's athletic department web site (www.und.com).

Notre Dame's centennial celebration will culminate with the Centennial Gala to be held March 5, 2005, at the University's new Performing Arts Center.

The 25 former and current Irish players named to the All-Century Basketball Team were: Bob Arnzen, Austin Carr, Matt Carroll, Adrian Dantley, LaPhonso Ellis, Pat Garrity, Tom Hawkins, Collis Jones, Leo Klier, Edward 'Moose' Krause, John Moir, Troy Murphy, Paul Nowak, Kevin O'Shea, John Paxson, Ron Reed, David Rivers, Dick Rosenthal, Walt Sahm, John Shumate, Jack Stephens, Chris Thomas. Kelly Tripucka, Bob Whitmore and Monty Williams.

A special, oversized, full-color commemorative yearbook titled "100 Seasons of Basketball: A Celebration of Irish Players and History." has been published. The publication contains features on the 25 members of the All-Century Team, a foreword by Austin Carr, an afterword by Chris Thomas, as well as lots of other stories and photos documenting Irish

basketball history. It's a production of Notre Dame Sports Properties, PSP and the University's sports information office.

Notre Dame will hold its Centennial Gala on the night of Saturday, March 5, 2005, at the new DeBartolo Center for the Performing Arts on campus. The event follows Notre Dame's final home men's basketball game that afternoon (2:00 p.m. EST tip) at the Joyce Center against Pittsburgh (CBS Sports will nationally televise the game). The Centennial Gala will feature hors d'oeuvres and beverages at the PAC followed by a specially-produced package of video and remarks highlighting Notre Dame's 100 seasons of men's basketball. All 25 members of the All-Century Team and their families will be invited to attend and will be featured and introduced. Tickets to the Centennial Gala will be available to the general public, with details to come.

A DVD series on Notre Dame's 100 seasons of basketball is in the works through Atlas Technologies. Details of availability will be available soon.

A 100th season logo has been produced and will appear on the Irish uniforms throughout the 2004-05 season. The logo is also visible on a panel on the Joyce Center scorer's table, as well as on merchandise available through the Notre Dame Bookstore.

On The Short End:

While Notre Dame has pulled out three one-point victories, they have also suffered two losses by one point \dots

- vs. Michigan Michigan converts a three-point play with 20 seconds remaining to take a 61-60 lead ... After the Wolverines miss the front end of a one-and-one with four seconds remaining, Notre Dame's three-point attempt is blocked.
- ${f vs.}$ Georgetown Notre Dame takes a 54-53 lead on Colin Falls three-pointer with six seconds remaining, but the Hoyas defeat the Irish 55-54 on Roy Hibbert's dunk at the buzzer.

Oh So Close:

Notre Dame's eight loss in BIG EAST gamaes have been by a total of $49 \text{ points} \dots$ The Irish held leads in six of those contests \dots

- vs. Syracuse (1/10) After trailing by four at halftime, Notre Dame leads 51-43 with 14:12 remaining, but the Orange close out the game by outscoring the Irish 27-10 for the final 71-60 count ... The nine points is the largest defeat
- at Georgetown (1/23) Colin Falls' three-pointer with six seconds remaining gives the Irish a 54-53 lead, but Roy Hibbert's dunk at the buzzer give the Hoyas a 55-54 victory.
- at Villanova (1/26) Notre Dame leads 37-30 at the break, but the Wildcats outscored the Irish 35-23 in the second half ... The Irish held a 52-46 advantage with 11:48 to play, but is held to just eight points for the remainder of the game.
- at Syracuse (2/5) Notre Dame leads by six at the break and extends the lead to 11 (50-39) with 6:05 to play in the contest before the Orange close out the game with a 21-7 run for the final 60-57 margin.
- at Pittsburgh (2/12) The Irish overcome a five-point halftime deficit to take a 49-44 lead with 12:55 remaining ... The Panthers retake the lead and jump out to a 59-50 advantage with 7:05 to play ... Notre Dame grabs a one-point lead 62-61 with 2:01 to play before the Panthers regain a three-point lead with 1:04 ... The Irish tie the game at 65-65 on a Chris Quinn three-pointer with 42 seconds ... Carl Krauser gives Pittsburgh a 67-65 lead ... Notre Dame has a chance to tie the game with three seconds remaining, but Rick Cornett misses the first of two free throws and the Panthers make one of two free throws with two seconds remaining.
- vs. Rutgers (3/9) After trailing for most of the game, Russell Carter's three-pointer gives the Irish a 65-64 lead with 1:36 to play, but the Scarlet Knights close out the game with an 8-0 run.

Stingy Defense:

Irish opponents are averaging 63.6 points per game ... Notre Dame held its first five opponents to 61 points and under with three of those opponents scoring 45 points or less ... Overall, the Irish have limited their opponents to 45 points and under on four occasions ... In the two wins prior to the loss at Michigan (60-61), the Irish held IPFW (73-45) and Charleston Southern (54-38) to under 50 points ... The last time time that occurred was during the 2002-03 season when the Irish held their first three opponents — Belmont (76-48), IUPUI (89-45) and Bucknell (73-42) — to under 50 points ... The 38 points scored by Charleston Southern in Notre Dame's win on November 26 were the fewest allowed by an Irish team under head coach Mike Brey and the second fewest ever scored by an Irish opponent since the opening of the Joyce

Thomas In Elite Scoring Company:

Chris Thomas has a career scoring average of 17.1 points per game and is third on the all-time Notre Dame career scoring list with 2,174 career points in 127 career outings ... Heading into this season, Thomas had scored 1,783 points in 99 career outings ... Only four other players scored more points in the first three seasons of their careers — Austin Carr (2,560 points in 75 games), Adrian Dantley (2,223 points in 86 games), Troy Murphy (2,011 points in 94 games) and Tom Hawkins (1,820 points in 79 games) .

Record- Setting Three-Point Performance:

With his eight three-pointers against Pittsburgh, Colin Falls tied the Notre Dame single-game record ... He now shares the record with Keith Friel (vs. Syracuse on Jan. 21, 1998) and Matt Carroll (vs. Syracuse on March 4, 2003) ... Also, his 89 three-pointers this season are the most ever by an Irish player in his sophomore season ... Falls is within reach of Matt Carroll's single-season mark of 99 set during the 2002-03 campaign.

Ironman:

Chris Thomas has started in a Notre Dame record 127 consecutive games and has never missed a game during his career ... His 112th consecutive start on January 10 against Syracuse set the record for consecutive games started ... The record of 111 was formerly held by Pat Garrity (1994-98) ... John Paxson (1979-83) stands third all-time with 85 consecutive starts (86 total during his career) ... Paxson started every game in his final three seasons ... Thomas has never missed a game during his Irish career and has averaged 37.6 minutes per game in those contests and been on the court 93.4 percent of the time in those 127 games having played 4,774 of a possible 5,114 minutes

No Doubting Thomas:

In games against Marist (Dec. 22) and Western Illinois (Dec. 30), Chris Thomas flirted with recording his second and third career triple-doubles ... Against Marist, he finished with 18 points, nine assists and eights rebounds before following that up with 21 points, nine assists (all in the first half) and nine rebounds in the win over the Leathernecks.

Scoring Streak Snapped:

Chris Thomas' two-point performance against Michigan snapped a 19-game double-figure scoring streak for the Irish guard and also marked his lowest scoring output in the 103 games he had played at the time ... Thomas has netted double figures in 109 of 126 career contests.

He Keeps Going And Going And Going...:

Chris Thomas has been on the court an amazing 93.4 percent of the time during his career and has played all but 340 minutes ... Thomas has played 30-plus minutes in 123 career contests and 40-plus minutes on 43 occasions in three-plus seasons.

Lending The Assist:

Chris Thomas has led the Irish in assists in each of his four seasons (a single-season school record 252 in 2001-02, 236 in 2002-03, 150 in 2003-04 and 186 in 2004-05) ... Currently the school's career assist leader with 824, he will become just the third player in Notre Dame history to lead the Irish in assists during all four of his seasons ... Rich Branning was the first player to do so as he led Notre Dame from 1976-80 and finished his career with 466 (currently sixth on the all-time list) ... David Rivers (1984-88) also led the Irish during all four of his seasons ... Rivers finished as the school's all-time career assist leader with 586 and held that record until last season, when it was eclipsed by Thomas in February of 2004.

Francis Posts 23rd Double-Double:

Torin Francis posted his sixth of the season and second in as many contests in the loss to Rutgers when he scored a season-high 21 points and grabbed 13 rebonds ... He recorded his fifth double-double of the season and the 22nd of his career in the loss to Pittsburgh when he scored 16 points and grabbed 10 rebounds ... Francis' four other double doubles were in wins at Indiana (11 points/13 rebounds) and Seton Hall (15 points/10 rebounds) and in losses at Villanova (19 points/13 rebounds) and against Pittsburgh (15 points/11 rebounds) at the Joyce Center.

Cornett Collects First Double-Double:

Rick Cornett registered the first double-double of his Fighting I rish career with a 14-point and 14-rebound performance at Providence on Feb. 19.

Thomas Registers 14th Career Double- Double:

Chris Thomas' and 10 points and 12 assists against Rutgers (on March 2) marked his 14th career double-double and his second of the season ... He had a double-double earlier this season when he scored 10 points and dished 11 assists in the win over IPFW ... That game marked the first time he registered double figures in both points and assists since his sophomore season when he scored 21 points and dished off 13 assists against Virginia Tech on February 22, 2003 ... Thomas' lone double-double in 2003-04 season was a 23-point and 11-rebound effort in a loss to Providence on February 24, 2004 ... He has dished 10-plus assists in 18 games during his career.

Cornette Ties Blocked Shot Mark:

In four seasons spanning 125 career games, Jordan Cornette has 200 career blocked shots which ties as the all-time career leader ... Against Pittsburgh in the regular-season finale, he tied LaPhonso Ellis' (1988-2002) career mark of 200 ... Cornette's four blocks against Western I llinois moved him past Ryan Humphrey (2000-02) in Notre Dame history ... Humphrey stands third on the all-time list with 166 blocked shots ... Cornette stands third all-time with a 1.6 blocked shots average.

Transfer Of Influence:

Dennis Latimore is the third transfer to play under head coach Mike Brey ... He transferred to Notre Dame in the summer of 2003 after two seasons at the University of Arizona ... Ryan Humphrey was the first transfer to play for the Irish ... He played his first two seasons at the University of Oklahoma ... During his two-year career from 2000-02, he played in 60 games and averaged 16.6 points (997), 9.95 rebounds (597) and 2.8 blocked shots (166) ... Humphrey was a first-team all-BIG EAST selection in his senior season and earned second-team All-America honors from *Basketball Times* ... Dan Miller played one year (2002-03) after transferring from the University of Maryland and averaged 13.9 points and 5.7 rebounds.

Latimore Nets Double Figures In Three Straight Games:

Dennis Latimore's three consecutive double-figure outings against Army (15), Marist (10) and Western Illinois (18), marked the first time in his career that he has scored in double figures in three straight contests ... Latimore also recorded three straight double-figure outings against Connecticut (12), Syracuse (10) and Boston College (10) ... Contests at Michigan and Indiana earlier this season produced back-to-back double-figure scoring efforts for the first time in his career ... Heading into the season, Latimore, had only scored in double figures twice in 57 games at Arizona ... This season, he has registered 10-plus points in 11 games and played 30-plus minutes in five contests ... Latimore is averaging 21.1 mpg. ... At Arizona, he averaged 10.9 and 12.0 minutes during his freshman and sophomore seasons, respectively.

Latimore Posts Second Career Double- Double:

Dennis Latimore registered his second career double-double and first in a BIG EAST game in the win over Villanova as he scored 12 points and grabbed 11 rebounds ... He posted his first career double-double, scoring 12 points (tying a career-high) and grabbing a personal best 11 rebounds ... In two seasons at Arizona, where he played 57 games, he only twice scored in double figures (22 versus California and 10 against Arizona State) and never had 10-plus rebounds in a game.

In The Spirit Of Giving:

Chris Thomas' unselfish play is one of the reasons why the Irish have been successful while he has been in the Notre Dame backcourt ... In the 127 games he has directed Mike Brey's teams, Thomas has helped the Irish compile a 82-45 record for a .631 winning percentage ... As a freshman, he averaged 7.64 assists to rank fifth nationally ... Thomas then dished off 6.9 assists (eighth in the nation) as a sophomore ... He is the only player in Notre Dame history to record 200-plus assists in consecutive seasons ... Thomas has distributed 10-plus assists in 17 games during his career ... This season, he is averaging a 6.5 assists, after dishing off just 4.7 during the 2003-04 campaign.

Francis Returns:

Torin Francis was back in the lineup for the first time since the Connecticut game (February 9, 2004) last year in the season opener against Harvard ... Francis missed the final 12 games of the '03-'04 campaign with a herniated disc ... In the three games prior to being sidelined with his back injury last season, he scored six points versus Boston College (29 minutes), four points against Pittsburgh (nine minutes) and did not score against Connecticut (seven minutes) ... Francis has scored in double figures in 14 games overall this season, including a season-high 21 points against Rutgers ... He has started all 82 games that he has played in and has grabbed nine or more rebounds in 14 games this season.

Quinn has scored 20-plus points in three games — a 21-point performance against Marist (seventh 20point performance of his career) in which he finished 7-8 from the field and connected on all four of his three-point field goal attempts and a 20-point effort in the season opener against Harvard ... He tied a career-high in the Pittsburgh game scoring 25 points as he connected on 10-15 field goals and 5-6 three-pointers ... Last season, Quinn led the I rish in scoring on three occasions — in the Quinnipiac (25 points), Boston College (25 points) and Purdue (21 points) games ... While averaging 35.2 min-

Last season he committed just 37 turnovers and dished off 104 assists and owned a BIG EAST best 2.81 assist-to-turnover ratio ... Also during the season, Quinn had a stretch of 159:00 minutes on the floor without a turnover.

Hot Shot:

Colin Falls scored a career-high 28 points in the loss to Pittsburgh on March 5, marking the fourth time this season that he scored 20-plus points in a game ... Against the Panthers, he was 8-16 from the field overall and 8-14 from three-point range ... Previously, he matched his career-high with a 23-point outing against Boston College when he connected on 8-14 shots from the field and was 7-12 from three-point range (his seven three-pointers were a career best) ... Falls also scored 23 points against St. John's as he connected on 7-16 from the field and 6-13 from beyond the arc ... Falls has been in double figures in 11 of the last 18 games and in 14 contests overall ... Before a three-point performance against Villanova on January 26, he had scored in double figures in the six previous outings (the first time that he had scored in double figures in six straight games) ... Earlier this season in contests against DePaul and Army, Falls shot 63.2 percent from the field (12-19) and 57.1 percent from three-point range (8-14) ... He also averaged 18.0 points, scoring a career-high 20 against DePaul and 16 versus Army ... Against DePaul, he connected on 7-10 shots from the field and 5-7 from three-point range, and followed that up by shooting 5-9 from the field and 3-7 from beyond the arc against Army ... In Notre Dame's defeat of Western Illinois, Falls knocked down 5-9 shots from beyond the arc to finish with 17 points, and he scored a team-high 19 on 3-6 shooting from downtown in the BIG EAST-opening victory at Seton Hall ... He buried three shots from beyond the arc en route to a 16-point effort in the Villanova contest ... His 89 three-pointers are the second most by a Notre Dame sophomore.

Threes The Key For Falls:

Eighty-nine of Colin Falls' 97 field goals have come from three-point range ... It wasn't until the DePaul game that he connected on a two-point field goal ... Prior to the contest, all eight of his field goals and all 20 of his attempts had come from three-point range ... Falls connected on three three-pointers against IPFW and Michigan as he finished with nine points in both of those games ... During his freshman season, Falls' favorite shot was from beyond the arc ... 126 of his 144 career field goals made (.875) have come from three-point range, while 309 of his 364 attempts (.849) have been from the three-point line or beyond.

In Select Company:

When Jordan Cornette recorded his 100th career steal in the Army game, he joined former I rish standout Troy Murphy as the only two players in school history with 100 career blocks and 100 career steals ... Cornette has 200 blocks and 122 steals in three-plus seasons, while Murphy ended his career with 126 and 113, respectively.

Counting On Colin:

Colin Falls' game-winning shot (from three-point range) against Seton Hall on January 5 with four seconds remaining, marked the second game-winning shot of his career (44 games) .. . In the first round of the BIG EAST Championship last year, Falls' three-pointer with 15.8 seconds remaining lifted the Irish to a 65-64 victory over West Virginia.

Russell Roars:

Russell Carter turned in the top performance of his career in the loss to Rutgers as he scored a career-high 12 points in 22 minutes off the bench ... It marked the second time

in his career that he reached double figures ... He also registered double figures with an 11-point and seven-rebound performance against Samford earlier this season..

Rookie Roll Call:

Sophomore Omari Isreal has seen action in 19 games, while freshman Rob Kurz has played in 13 games ... Isreal, who missed all of last season while recovering from the ACL surgery he had in February of 2003, had his best outings against Charleston Southern when he scored four points and grabbed three rebounds and in the Connecticut game on the road when he played 18 minutes and grabbed six rebounds ... Isreal has played 10-plus minutes in four games ... Kurz played a season-high 12 minutes against IPFW and a career-high three points against Marist.

Keeping It Close:

In the 55 losses suffered by Irish teams in Mike Brey's four seasons, only 15 have been by 10 or more points and have been by a combined 393 points for an average of 7.1 points ... Notre Dame's biggest losses have been on the road at Pittsburgh (72-55 on January 6, 2003) and against Arizona (88-71 on March 27, 2003) in the West Regional semifinal in Anaheim, Calif... Prior to those two setbacks, the worst defeat was a 16-point decision at Connecticut during Brey's first season ... Notre Dame's 11 losses during the 2001-02 season were by a combined 49 points for an average margin of defeat of 4.5 points ... Only one loss that season (versus Georgetown at the Joyce Center) was by double figures, while eight of those setbacks were by five or less points.

Block Party:

The Irish frontcourt provides many shot-blocking opportunities ... The 2002-03 team set the single-season mark with 189 blocked shots for a per game average of 5.59 ... The former mark of 178 was set during the 2000-01 season in which Notre Dame averaged 5.93 blocks ... The Irish finished the 2001-02 campaign with 163 blocks for an average of 4.94 per game ... Last year, the Irish had 139 blocks for an average of 4.34 per game ... Under head coach Mike Brey, Notre Dame averaged 5.17 blocks per game in his first four seasons ... The single-season totals each of the past four years are among the top five block totals in school history ... The Irish have 116 blocked shots in 28 games (4.1).

207 And Counting:

Heading into tonight's game against Holy Cross, Notre Dame has hit at least one three-pointer in 207 straight games, a mark that dates back to the the 1998-99 campaign ... The last time an I rish team failed to hit a three-pointer was in a 101-70 loss to Connecticut at the Hartford Civic Center on January 12, 1999 as Notre Dame finished 0-7 from beyond the arc in the game.

Steady As They Go:

Notre Dame's backcourt tandem of Chris Thomas and Chris Quinn has combined for 744 of the team's 1,878 points (.396) and dished off 272 of its 401 assists (.678).

All In The Family:

Freshman Rob Kurz' younger sister Laura is a freshman on the Duke women's basketball team. As a matter of fact, she played a regular-season contest on the Joyce Center floor 48 hours before her brother's home opener. The Irish women's basketball team hosted the Blue Devils in semifinal action of the Women's National Invitation Tournament on November 17 ... Notre Dame won the game 76-65.

Irish Add Four In Early Signing Period:

Mike Brey signed four players to national letters of intent during the early signing period ... Joining the Irish in the fall of 2005 will be Ryan Ayers (Blue Bell, Pa./Germantown Academy), Zach Hillesland (Toledo, Ohio/St. John's Jesuit), Kyle McAlarney (Staten Island, N.Y./Moore Catholic) and Luke Zeller (Washington, Ind./Washington) ... Ayers, a 6-7, 200-pound combination guard/forward, is the son of former Ohio State and Philadelphia 76ers head coach Randy Ayers ... His team finished this season with 24-6 record, losing in the Inter-Academic League championship game ... Ayers averaged 17.0 points, 7.0 rebounds and 3.0 assists and finished his career with 1,370 points ... He also was a three-time member of the all-Inter-AC first team ... Ayers was honored with the Markward Club Award as the top player in the Philadelphia area ... McAlarney, a 6-1, 170pound point guard, ranks as the all-time leading scorer in Staten I sland prep history with 2,528 career points and is fifth on the New York state scoring list ... He has led his team to a 15-10 record and owns a 34.8 scoring average \dots Hillesland 6-8, 220-pound forward, led his team to its fourth straight Toledo City League title as he netted 20 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the championship game ... Team wons a 17-3 record and ranked fifth in the state.

Irish Find Success In The Classroom:

For the second straight semester, Irish basketball players excelled in the classroom ... Overall, the Irish earned a 3.056 semester average, the second-highest semester average since the fall semester of 1992, after earning a 3.115 cumulative grade point

<u>Luke Zeller Named To 2005</u> McDonald's All-American Team

Incoming Notre Dame freshman Luke Zeller, who signed a national letter of intent in November of 2004, has been one of 24 players named to the 2005 McDonald's All-American Team. The 6-11, 245-pound power forward/center will play in the McDonald's All-American game at the Joyce Center on March 30, 2005. The game will be televised live on ESPN at 8:00 p.m. (EST).

The Washington, Ind., native was chosen to participate in this prestigious game, which showcases the top talent in the country. Selected from a pool of more than 2,500 nominees. Zeller will be a member of the West squad.

The McDonald's All-American game will be one of two all-star contests for Zeller. He recently was selected to play in the EA Roundball Classic in Chicago, Ill., on March 22.

A four-year starter, Zeller has led his Washington Hatchets to a 20-2 mark in 2004-05. He is averaging 20.0 points and 8.8 rebonds in his senior season while shooting 58.9 percent from the field (162-275) and 34.1 percent (15-44) from three-point range. Zeller owns a 74.1 percent accuracy from the free-throw line (100-135). He also has dished off 74 assists, blocked 43 shots and made 25 steals.

Earlier this season, Zeller broke the Washington school boys scoring record and has led his teams to a 70-18 record (.795) while at the school. One of the top players at his position in the country, he is an excellent student. Zeller owns a 4.00 grade point average and will graduate as his school's co-validictorian this spring. A candidate for Mr. Indiana Basketball honors, he was an all-state, all-sectional and all-conference honoree in his first thre seasons. As a junior, he averaged 19.8 points and 9.4 rebounds per game as a junior.

Fourteen Notre Dame players have been named to the McDonald's All-American Team, including current Irish standouts Chris Thomas (2001) and Torin Francis (2002). The previous 12 honorees have been Tim Andree (1979), Ken Barlow (1982), LaPhonso Ellis (1988), Ryan Humphrey (1997), Tracy Jackson (1977), Tim Kempton (1982), Dan Miller (1998), John Paxson (1979), David Rivers (1984), Keith Robinson (1986), Tom Sluby (1980) and Barry Spencer (1980).

In five seasons, I rish head coach Mike Brey has had the opportunity to coach four McDonald's All-Americans — Humphrey, Miller, Thomas and Francis.

Notre Dame Rises To Top Spot In Directors' Cup Standings

Notre Dame stands first in the final set of fall sports standings released in the 2004-05 United States Sports Academy Division I Directors' Cup all-sports competition sponsored by the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (formerly known as Sears Directors' Cup) ... This marks the first time in the 12-year history of the all-sports program that Notre Dame has ranked number one ... The previous highest ranking for the Irish was second in the 2004-05 second set of fall standings ... Fall NCAA competition earned the Irish 337 points based on their NCAA title in women's soccer (100 points), their fourth-place finish in women's cross country (80), 11th-place finish in men's cross country (57) and second-round NCAA appearances in men's soccer and volleyball (50 each) ... Michigan (333 points) stands second, followed by Stanford (332), Duke (327) and UCLA (297) ... The current standings include results from NCAA fall competition in volleyball, field hockey, men's water polo, men's and women's cross country, and men's and women's soccer and football ... In previous years in which the Directors' Cup competition has been held, Notre Dame has finished 11th in '93-'94, 30th in '94-'95, 11th in '95-'96, 14th in '96-'97, 31st in '97-'98, 25th in '98-99, 21st in '99-'00, 11th in '00-'01, 13th in '01-02 and '02-'03 and 19th in '03-'04.

Notre Dame Basketball Honored As One of Greatest College Basketball Programs

The Notre Dame men's basketball program was recognized by *Street & Smith's* as one of the top 100 basketball programs of all-time ... Notre Dame's program was rated the 39th best of all-time ... Kentucky topped the list, followed by UCLA, North Carolina, Kansas, Duke, Indiana, Louisville, Arkansas, Connecticut and Cincinnati.

average following the 2004 spring semester \dots The team also boasts a 3.028 cumulative grade index, which also reflects the highest average since Notre Dame's Office of Academic Services For Student-Athletes began keeping track of semester grade point averages at the start of the 1992-93 school year \dots Seven players — Greg Bosl, Rick Cornett, Dennis Latimore, Chris Murphy, Ben Nickol, Chris Quinn and Chris Thomas – earned semester grade point averages of better than 3.00.

Notre Dame played a record 15 games on national television during the regular season and tonight's game on ESPN2 marks the 16th of the season Last year, the Irish also made 13 national appearances during the regular season and appeared on either CBS, ESPN or ESPN2 a total of 16 times ... Since the 2000-01 season under head coach Mike Brey, Notre Dame teams have appeared on national television during the regular and post-season a total of $\bf 68$ times (average of $\bf 13.6$ per year) – it's the most television appearances in a five-year period in the program's history.

Joyce Center Sellouts:

Since the 2000-01 campaign, there have been 38 sellouts at the Joyce Center \dots Notre Dame enjoyed 10 sellouts during the 2002-03 campaign, the most since the 1985-86 season \dots The 29 sellouts from 2000-04 were the most in a four-year period since the 1983-87 campaigns.


