Irish Set To Open 2006-07 Season This Weekend In Minnesota

Fresh off one of the most successful seasons in the nearly 80-year history of the program, Notre Dame will look for an encore when it tees off the 2006-07 season this weekend at the Gopher Invitational, hosted by the University of Minnesota. The Irish are the three-time defending BIG EAST Conference champions and have made three consecutive NCAA regional appearances, most recently charting a 17th-place showing at the 2006 NCAA East Regional in Orlando.

Notre Dame will be a much younger team in 2006-07, with four seniors graduating off last year's most recent regional qualifying squad. In their place, the Irish welcome four freshman to the fold, including **Doug Fortner**, a top-50 junior golfer who was tabbed as a "Freshman To Watch," according to the recently-released *Golfweek* College Preview.

Senior co-captain and two-time all-region selection **Cole Isban** will be the standard bearer for Notre Dame this season. A legitimate All-America candidate in 2006-07, Isban is winding down arguably the finest individual careers in school history, already holding Irish records for single season stroke average (72.97 in 2005-06) and career stroke average (74.10), while seeing more than 92 percent of his 103 competitive rounds count to the Notre Dame team score.

Quoting Coach Kubinski ...

"Our team heads to Minnesota for our opening event this weekend. The field will be a great initial test for us. There are several Big 10 teams competing and a couple (host Minnesota and Northwestern) that played well at the NCAA Championships last June. In addition, there are so many other strong teams from across the country (such as Stanford and SMU) that will be very competitive.

"The golf course is in superb condition. In fact, it's likely the greens at Spring

Did You Know?

Notre Dame has ties to two of the most famous players in golf history.

Billy Casper won 51 PGA Tour titles, including three majors (1959 & 1966 U.S. Open; 1970 Masters) and was sixth on that tour's all-time victories list upon retirement. He also logged nine wins on the Senior PGA Tour (now the Champions Tour), was an eight-time member of the U.S. Ryder Cup Team and was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1978. However, before turning pro, Casper attended Notre Dame in 1950 and won the Western Junior National Championship, which was contested at the old Notre Dame Golf Course. His Irish career was cut short when he was called away to military service in the Korean War.

Walter Hagen, Jr., was a three-year monogram winner at Notre Dame from 1938-40, helping the Irish to three consecutive NCAA Championship berths, including a sixth-place finish in 1938. If the name sounds familiar, it should be — his father, Walter Hagen, Sr., won 40 PGA titles, including 11 major championships (five PGA Championships, four British Opens and two U.S. Opens) in his storied career, ranking third behind Jack Nicklaus and Tiger Woods. The elder Hagen also was a six-time U.S. Ryder Cup captain, and five years after his death in 1969, he was part of the inaugural induction class for the World Golf Hall of Fame.

"Overall, we're still a young team. I think this event will offer us a chance to see where we are as a team and identify areas to improve. I think we'll be competitive, but I look at this fall season as a developmental time. I do think we can have an opportunity to win come Sunday if our top players play well and our younger guys give us a couple of solid rounds."

Dates and Times

Teams will play two rounds (36 holes) on Saturday, with the opening round teeing off via a shotgun start at 8:30 a.m. CDT (9:30 a.m. EDT in South Bend). The second round will begin immediately following the conclusion of round one. Competitors will then return to the course Sunday at 7:30 a.m. CDT for the final round, with a split-tee start from the first and 10th holes.

Following The Irish

Live scoring for the Gopher Invitational will be available through the Golfstat web site (www.golfstat.com). Complete results following each day's action also will be posted on the official Notre Dame athletics web site (www.und.com). In addition, the latest information on the Irish, including results from the Gopher Invitational, will be available on the Notre Dame Sports Hotline (574-631-3000).

New this year is the Irish ALERT system, which provides fans with free updates on Notre Dame's progress through text messages sent right to their cell phone. For more information or to register for this service, visit the official Notre Dame athletics web site (www.und.com).

The Tournament Format

A total of 12 five-man teams (60 participants, with the possibility of some teams fielding additional golfers on an individual basis) will be taking part in the Gopher Invitational. Conventional collegiate golf team scoring rules will apply, with the lowest four scores in the five-man lineup for each round counting toward the team total. Scores by golfers competing on an individual basis do not count to the team score.

The Teams

Besides Notre Dame and host Minnesota, the remaining teams in the Gopher Invitational field are: Denver, Georgia Southern, Indiana, Lamar, Michigan State, Northwestern, Ohio State, SMU and Stanford. In addition, a squad from Finland is scheduled to compete this weekend, rounding out the 12-team field.

According to last year's final GCAA/Bridgestone Top 25 poll (determined by the NCAA Championship standings), three Top 25 teams will be competing in this weekend's tournament — No. 3 Minnesota, No. 9 Lamar and No. 25 Northwestern. No other teams received votes in the final coaches' poll of 2005-06.

Meanwhile, last year's final ratings in the *Golfweek*/Sagarin Performance Index show that six of the top 50 teams will be competing this weekend at Minnesota. Leading the way is No. 18 Lamar, followed closely by No. 23 Minnesota and No. 24 Northwestern. Also on the first page of the *Golfweek* ratings were No. 34 SMU, No. 40 Stanford and No. 47 Indiana. Four others squads were just outside the Top 50 at the end of last season — Michigan State (54th), Notre Dame (55th), Georgia Southern (58th) and Denver (59th).

In addition, the year-end Golfstat rankings from the 2005-06 season indicate three of this weekend's participants appearing in that service's Top 25. Lamar is tops at No. 8, with Minnesota ranked 10th and Northwestern standing 20th.

Head-To-Head

Last year, Notre Dame faced all but one of the other 10 college teams in the field at the Gopher Invitational, sporting a combined 14-12 (.538) record against those squads (meeting all but Denver). The Irish record in 2005-06 vs. the Gopher Invitational field breaks down as follows: Georgia Southern (2-1), Indiana (1-2), Lamar (0-1), Michigan State (2-1), Minnesota (1-3), Northwestern (1-2), Ohio State (3-0), SMU (2-1) and Stanford (2-1).

The Course

Opening in 1999, the Spring Hill Golf Club is a challenging par-72, 7,020-yard layout designed by noted architect Tom Fazio. The course was rated as one of the top five private courses in the state of Minnesota, according to the 2005-06 *Golf Digest* rankings, and continues to live up to that reputation. It puts a premium on shot-making ability, especially around the greens, which will be among the most difficult that many of the golfers in this weekend's field will face all year.

Noting The Irish At The Gopher Invitational

- ◆ Notre Dame is making its second appearance in as many years at the tournament hosted by Minnesota. Last year, the Irish teed off their 2005-06 season with a fifth-place finish in their first-ever visit to the event, firing a 29-over par 893 (309-297-287). **Scott Gustafson** was Notre Dame's top individual, tying for sixth place in the 66-man field with a two-over par 218 (73-73-72).
- ◆ Senior co-captain and All-America candidate **Cole Isban** played at last year's Gopher Invitational, tying for 22nd place with an eight-over par 224 (80-74-70).
- ◆ Junior **Mike King**, who also is on the Notre Dame lineup, will get his second look at the Spring Hill Golf Club layout after appearing in last year's tournament. King tied for 58th place with a three-round total of 26-over par 242 (80-81-81).
- ◆ Freshman **Doug Fortner** makes his college debut this weekend at the Gopher Invitational. Fortner was ranked among the top 50 junior golfers in the country (and top 20 seniors) during the summer of 2006 by *Golfweek*, and was tapped by that service during its annual College Preview as a "Freshman To Watch" for the 2006-07 season. Fortner was a U.S. Open sectional qualifier this summer, and posted a 73.11 stroke average en route to three top-20 finishes in as many events on the American Junior Golf Association (AJGA) circuit.

Last Time Out: 2006 NCAA East Regional

Showing the grit and determination that has made the 2005-06 season one of the most successful in school history, Notre Dame posted its best score of the three-day NCAA East Regional with a final-round 289 (+1) on May 20, finishing 17th in the 27-team field at the Lake Nona Golf & Country Club (par 72/7,179 yards) in Orlando. The Irish wrapped up their third consecutive NCAA regional appearance (and 33rd postseason visit in program history) at 33-over par 897 (300-308-289), placing almost exactly where they had been seeded (16th) at the start of the competition.

Notre Dame's third-round 289 was its second-best single-round score ever in an NCAA postseason event, and best ever on a par-72 course. It also continues a recent trend of Irish success in the final round of NCAA regional competition, as Notre Dame shot a 282 to close the 2005 NCAA Central Regional on its own par-70 Warren Golf Course in South Bend.

Individually, junior tri-captain **Cole Isban** was the top Irish finisher, doing his best to erase the memory of two difficult rounds with a sizzling final-round 68 to move up to a 52nd-place tie at eight-over par 224 (79-77-68). Isban's third-round 68, which featured six birdies and only 24 putts, tied the school's 18-hole record for NCAA postseason play and set a new mark with relation to par.

Warren Golf Course Named One Of Nation's Top 15 College Courses

The University of Notre Dame's Warren Golf Course has been chosen as one of the top 15 college courses in the nation, according to a feature article in the September 2005 issue of *Golf Digest*. The magazine used a variety of criteria in rating the various layouts, including shot values, resistance to scoring, design variety, memorability, aesthetics, conditioning, ambience and bonus walking points. The Warren Golf Course was ranked 15th in the country and is one of the newest courses on the 2005 *Golf Digest* list.

Co-designed by Bill Coore and PGA Tour veteran Ben Crenshaw, the Warren Golf Course opened on May 1, 2000 and has played host to a 2004 U.S. Amateur Championship sectional qualifier, the 2005 NCAA Central Regional, two Western Amateur Championship qualifiers and four BIG EAST Conference Championships. In addition, the par-70, 7,011-yard tree-lined layout has welcomed numerous junior golf tournaments and serves as the home course for the Notre Dame men's and women's golf teams.

"This is a remarkable honor for us when you consider the age of this course," said **John Foster**, General Manager and Head PGA Professional at the Warren Golf Course. "The emergence of our course is due in no small part to the commitment shown by **Bill Warren** to make this the nation's premier golf facility. We're also extremely fortunate to have a talented and dedicated staff that have helped make this course what it is today, led by our course superintendent, **Matt Cielen**."

"I am very pleased with, and appreciative of, *Golf Digest* for recognizing our Warren Golf Course as one of the top 15 college golf courses in the country," Notre Dame head men's golf coach **Jim Kubinski** said. "To be recognized with other top courses after having opened just five years ago is a tremendous honor. It's a great test of golf for all players, and I know our team feels the course tests every facet of their games."

Notre Dame Set To Dedicate New Training Facility

On Sept. 30, the University of Notre Dame will hold a dedication ceremony for the new **Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility** at the Warren Golf Course. The recently-completed \$2.1 million building is located adjacent to Warren's No. 2 tee box, with access via the roundabout at Douglas and Twyckenham Roads on the north edge of the Notre Dame campus.

The 10,333-square foot Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility now serves as the home of the Notre Dame men's and women's golf teams, adding a new dimension in the growth of both programs, which have combined to win five BIG EAST Conference titles and make five NCAA regional appearances in the past four seasons alone.

The cornerstone of the Robert and Marilyn Rolfs Family All-Season Varsity Golf Facility is an expansive 4,820-square foot indoor putting green and chipping area, complete with a sand bunker. In addition, six heated indoor/outdoor "tee stations" allow players to use the driving range in all seasons, while the Irish coaches are able to study players' swing techniques through the use of the latest in video equipment and software analysis.

Some of the other highlights of the facility include: separate locker rooms for the Irish men's and women's teams with custom-made wood lockers for each player, a spacious 890-square foot player lounge with state-of-the-art amenities such as wide-screen plasma televisions and computers with high-speed Internet access, offices for each member of the respective coaching staffs, and an on-site equipment room with stations for customized club fitting and repair.

Freshman **Josh Sandman** was one stroke behind his teammate **Isban** in a tie for 59th place at nine-over par 225 (75-77-73). His final round was another adventurous one for the Irish rookie, who carded two birdies and an eagle at the par-five 11th hole (one of only three recorded on that hole during the course of the three-day regional). However, he closed out with a bogey at No. 17 and a double bogey on the 18th after his approach shot barely skipped off the left fringe of the green and took an unlucky bounce behind a small wooden retaining board near a hazard.

Senior tri-captain **Mark Baldwin** wrapped up his college career in a tie for 68th place with a 10-over par 226 (75-79-72). The veteran collected four birdies in his final round and was poised to end his Irish tenure in red numbers before his par putt on No. 18 lipped out and brought him back to level ground for the day. Like Baldwin, senior tri-captain **Scott Gustafson** also ended his career this weekend, tying for 82nd place at 13-over par 229 (72-77-80). A third Irish senior, **Tommy Balderston** also put the cap on his college tenure in a 95th-place tie at 15-over par 231 (78-77-76).

Things You Should Know About The Irish

- ◆ Notre Dame is the three-time defending BIG EAST Conference champion, winning the 2006 title with a dramatic 12-stroke comeback (second-largest in school and league history) in the final round to defeat Louisville on the first playoff hole. The Irish joined St. John's as the only programs in the 26-year history of the BIG EAST Championship to win three consecutive titles on two separate occasions. The Irish recorded their first hat trick from 1995-97, while St. John's posted a pair of "four-peats" from 1981-84 and 1986-89.
- ◆ Notre Dame set numerous school records in 2005-06, including a new standards for season stroke average with a 292.97 mark that obliterated the old mark by more than five shots (298.29 in 1999-2000). The Irish also broke school records for 18 (272, -16) and 54 holes (842, -22) with their performance at the BIG EAST Championship, and on a larger scale, registered six of the top-10 single-round scores in school history during the '05-06 campaign.
- ◆ Notre Dame had four players finish end last season with sub-74 stroke averages, the first time that has happened in the 77-year history of the program. **Cole Isban** carded a school-record 72.97 average, followed by **Mark Baldwin** (73.17), **Josh Sandman** (73.40) and **Scott Gustafson** (73.53).
- ◆ The Irish achieved another milestone on May 1, 2006 when they were chosen as the *Golfweek* National Team of the Week. The honor came following Notre Dame's memorable 12-shot comeback in the final round of the BIG EAST Championship and subsequent playoff victory over Louisville.
- ◆ Notre Dame's impressive resurgence of late has been augmented by its play against nationally-ranked opponents. In fact, since **Jim Kubinski** took over as head coach in January 2005, the Irish have toppled 12 ranked teams (according to *Golfweek*), including seven last season.
- ◆ Senior **Cole Isban** is a prime candidate to become Notre Dame's first All-American since 1980 (John Lundgren - honorable mention), coming off consecutive selections to the PING All-Midwest Region Team. Isban owns the school's single-season and career stroke average (see chart on page 3) and has qualified for the last three U.S. Amateur Championships.

Next Up: Fighting Irish Gridiron Golf Classic (Oct. 9-10)

Notre Dame returns to the familiar surroundings of its own Warren Golf Course for the first-ever Fighting Irish Gridiron Golf Classic, to be held Oct. 9-10. The Irish will be hosting a regular-season home tournament for the first time since September 2004 (Notre Dame Invitational/Central Regional Preview), with Augusta State, Baylor, Florida State, Lamar and Vanderbilt among the other featured squads at the 12-team event.

Head Coach • Third Year at Notre Dame Springfield College (1993)

One of the nation's top young golf teachers, **Jim Kubinski** begins his third season as the head coach at Notre Dame. Having assumed the post on Jan. 28, 2005, Kubinski is just the sixth head coach in the 77-year history of the Irish men's golf program, inheriting a storied tradition that now includes the 1944 national championship, 19 top-10 NCAA Championship finishes and 33 NCAA postseason appearances.

"We feel Jim is one of the rising stars in the golf coaching community and someone who can continue to develop our program into a perennial national contender," Notre Dame director of athletics **Kevin White** says.

It hasn't take long for Kubinski to make his mark at Notre Dame and reward White's confidence in his abilities. In his first tournament at the helm of the Irish, just one month after setting foot on campus, Kubinski helped guide Notre Dame to the championship of the 2005 NOKIA Sugar Bowl Tulane Invitational, winning the title on the first hole of a sudden death playoff against UNC Wilmington. It was the first of two tournament crowns in the 2004-05 season for Notre Dame and made Kubinski the first Irish men's golf coach since 1961 to win the opening event of his career. That season, Rev. Clarence Durbin, C.S.C., led the Irish to a 23.5-6.5 dual-match win over Western Michigan.

That was the start of what has been a magical two-year run for the newest Notre Dame coach, who has piloted the Irish to consecutive BIG EAST Conference titles and NCAA regional appearances, not to mention a 150-122-8 (.550) record and 12 wins over teams ranked in the top 25 by *Golfweek*. What's more, Notre Dame has regularly collected votes in the GCAA/Bridgestone Coaches Top 25 poll and rose as high as No. 12 in the *Golfweek* rankings (Oct. 2, 2005) before an inadvertent rules violation and subsequent team DQ at the 2005 CordeValle Collegiate (resulting in 15 losses being charged to the team's overall record) temporarily stunted the Irish march up the national charts.

Under Kubinski's guidance, Notre Dame has registered nine top-five finishes in 19 tournaments, including three tourney titles (two coming in sudden-death playoffs). The Irish also have carded two of the top six single-season stroke averages in school history, following a 299.89 mark in 2004-05 (sixth all-time) with a school-record pace of 292.97 last year. In addition, Notre Dame has fired six of the top-10 single-round scores in school history since Kubinski arrived on campus, including impressive final-round postseason efforts at the 2005 NCAA Central Regional (282, +2) and the 2006 BIG EAST Championship (school-record 272, -16). The latter score highlighted a 12-stroke comeback victory, the second-best rally in the storied history of the program, and led the Notre Dame's selection as the *Golfweek* National Team of the Week (May 1, 2006) for the first time in program history.

Individually, Kubinski has produced impressive results with several Irish players in a short span of time. Senior All-America candidate **Cole Isban** is the school record holder for single-season stroke average (72.97 in 2005-06) and career stroke average (74.10), and he is the first Notre Dame golfer in 25 years to earn regional or national accolades, garnering a spot on the last two PING All-Midwest Region Teams. Sophomore **Josh Sandman** got a late start to his college career in 2005-06 due to an injury, but once he hit the links he was superb, posting a 73.40 stroke average in 15 rounds for the fifth-lowest single-season average in school history.

"As a lifelong Notre Dame fan, I couldn't ask for a greater opportunity than to be the head coach of the Fighting Irish," Kubinski said. "It's certainly a special time to play for Notre Dame and be a part of this great university. I'm looking forward to an exciting time ahead and feel that we're building something here that will be a great source of pride for our players and our university in the years to come.

"Notre Dame exemplifies the best of everything in a college environment, both academically and athletically," Kubinski continued. "It's my goal to ensure that we are a perennial top-10 program on the course and in the classroom, consistent with the best traditions of Notre Dame, and I truly believe we can achieve this goal."

Kubinski, 36, came to Notre Dame after spending a year and a half as the assistant men's and women's golf coach at Duke. During his playing days, he was a three-year letterman and two-year team captain at Springfield (Mass.) College before graduating in 1993. A two-time all-Northeast 10 Conference selection in 1991 and 1992, he also received the Springfield College Maroon Club Award for academic and athletic achievement in 1992. His playing experience continued on the North Atlantic Tour where he tied for sixth place at the '95 Boston Open, and he also competed in the Carolinas Section PGA.

Born May 4, 1970 in Springfield, Mass., Kubinski and his wife, Sarah, now live in South Bend. The couple was married in Durham, N.C., on Oct. 15, 2005.
