GAME NOTES - Notre Dame is coming off a season-high 20-hit effort in Thursday's 13-3 win over IPFW junior 2B Steve Sollmann has missed the last two games due to a sprained wrist and is listed as day-to-day the Irish had been outscored 17-16 in the first inning of its previous 39 games before pushing across six runs in the 1st vs. IPFW ... freshman LF Brennan Grogan snapped out of his recent 2-for-19 slump by batting 3-for-4 vs. IPFW (in his first start as the No. 3 batter), also adding an RBI double and hustling around for three runs scored .. ND entered the week ranked 27 th in the nation for team ERA (3.55) but has sliced that number to 3.35 , after allowing just one earned run in each of the three games this week .. senior CF Kris Billmaier is batting 7 -for-18 (.389) with eight RBI in the last five games (after a 1-for-20, 2-RBI slump) ... junior 1B Matt Edwards has similar numbers in his last four games (6-for-12, 6 RBI), after an 0-for-12, 1-RBI drought ... junior SS Matt Macri's 12game surge (17-for-38, .447) has pushed his season batting average to . 308 ... freshman RF Cody Rizzo had been 3-for-16 in the previous five games before a 2 -for-3 night vs. IPFW ... freshman IF Matt Bransfield is batting 6 -for-13 in his last five games played ... the Irish owns a 55-8 season scoring edge in the 2nd inning ... ND has posted 18 "big wins" (margin of 5-plus runs), just three shy of the entire 2002 total of 21 big wins ... ND also has racked up 16 "big innings" (5-plus runs) this season (13 in the last 20 games) ... senior RHP Brandon Viloria has allowed just one earned run in 15.1 innings pitched this season (0.59 ERA), with his 2.49 career ERA (in 76 IP) now tied with Jack Mitchell ('59-'61) and former teammate Aaron Heilman for 2nd place in the ND record book (min. 60 IP) behind Nick Palihnich's 2.36 ('59-'61) ... Viloria likewise has yet to walk a batter this season, with his career walk average (1.30 BB per 9 IP) well on its way to besting the ND record set by 1993 grad. Alan Walania (1.64) ...V iloria's stellar control also includes just one wild pitch and four hit batters in his career (no WP or HBs in '03) ... sophomore RHP John Axford has won his last 12 decisions with the Irish (13-2 career mark) and became the 17th ND pitcher to post 12-plus Ks in a game (12 vs. WMU) ... just two pitchers in the country entered the week with a better undefeated mark than Axford's 8-0 ... ND has posted a 54-7 combined record in April the past three seasons and is $36-4$ in its last 40 home games ... the Irish faced a daunting early schedule but have won 29 of the last 34, including a 17-game win streak (2nd-longest in ND history) that ended vs. Eastern Michigan (3-5) ... sophomore RHP Chris Niesel (9-1), Axford (12-2) and senior RHP Ryan Kalita (12-0) have combined for a 33-3 career record with the Irish ... SS Matt Macri (elbow) and 3B/1B Matt Edwards (broken leg) missed most of '02 due to injury (first-year catcher Javi Sanchez served as the Irish SS in '02)... J.P. Gagne (24-14, 14 SV) has joined Chris Michalak and Aaron Heilman as the only ND pitchers ever to post 20-plus wins and 10-plus saves ... head coach Paul Mainieri picked up his 700th career win this season vs. Georgetown ... the Irish own an overall record of 130-40-1 over the course of the 2001-03 seasons ... four freshmen - and now senior Kris Billmaier - have started in CF this season for the Irish (Steve Stanley started at CF in all 256 games from '99-'02) .. Kalita (1.67, 4-0, $27 \mathrm{IP}, 23 \mathrm{Ks}, 7 \mathrm{BB}, .167 \mathrm{opp}$. batting), Axford (2.12, 3-0, $17 \mathrm{IP}, 17 \mathrm{Ks}, 14 \mathrm{BB}, .148$ ) and Niesel (2.63, 3-0, 27.1 IP, $28 \mathrm{Ks}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, .262$ ) have formed a dominating rotation in BIG EAST games ... Sollmann ranks 7th in ND history with 52 career stolen bases, two behind former teammate Paul O'Toole ... Cody Rizzo's 18 times hit-by-pitch already has bested the ND record previously held by Eric Danapilis (15, in 1993).

THE SERIES: Notre Dame holds an 8-6 series edge vs. UConn (since joining the league in 1996) - but the Huskies swept last season's series in Storrs (4-3, 9-8 in 11 innings and 13-6), which remains one of just two times that ND ever has been swept in a three-game BIG EAST series (also by Seton Hall in 1997) ... the Irish won the 2001 series at Eck Stadium (6-1, 13-12, 12-19) ... the first game of that series saw ND's Aaron Heilman post 10 strikeouts to land on 400 for his career while the Irish rallied for three 9th-inning runs in the nightcap (Steve Stanley hit a 2 -run, game-tying triple and scored the winning run) ... the loss ended the 2001 ND team's BIG EASTrecord winning streak at 18 games.

2002 RECAP - UConn scored the go-ahead run in the 4-3 opener on a fifth-inning passed ball before rallying to tie the nightcap with a five-run 8 th ( $9-8$ in 11) ... ND stranded 15 baserunners in the doubleheader while dropping its BIG EAST opener for just the second time since joining the league in '96
Grant Johnson (5IP, 4 R/3 ER, 4 H, 5 BB) and Chris Niesel ( $7.1 \mathrm{IP}, 8 \mathrm{R}, 6 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 4 \mathrm{Ks}$ ) drew the starts for ND, with Niesel taking a 3 -hitter into the 8th while J.P. Gagne was tagged with the hard-luck loss (2.1 IP, unearned run in the 11th) ... Jesse Carlson ( $7 \mathrm{IP}, 7 \mathrm{H}, 6 \mathrm{BB}$ ) won the opener and Erik Drown (4 IP, $2 \mathrm{H}, \mathrm{BB}$ ) won the nightcap in relief of Pat Sperone ... UConn struck early with three 1st-inning runs in the opener but the Irish chipped away ... the Huskies also staked a 3-0 lead in the nightcap, with ND scoring five in the 5th and going ahead 8-3 on Paul O'Toole's 3-run blast in the 7th (Dan Trubia's grand slam later tied the game) ... a two-base fielding error gave UConn its chance in the 11th and Brett Burnham sent the gameending single to left-center ... UConn again took an early lead in the finale and worked out of several jams for the 13-6 win ... ND stranded 16 baserunners in the loss and left 31 on base in the series ... the Huskies posted just a 14-13 edge in hits but many came in timely fashion, including Mike Leonard's basesclearing double ... three ND errors led to four unearned runs for UConn, with John Axford ( 5 IP, 5 R, 7 H, 3 BB, 3 Ks ) taking the loss ... Nick tucci (2.1 IP, R, 2 H, $2 \mathrm{BB}, 2 \mathrm{Ks}$ ) picked up the win in releif of Peter Soteropoulos (4.2 IP, 3 R, $6 \mathrm{H}, 4 \mathrm{BB}, 6 \mathrm{Ks}$ ).

# Midseason Checkup Yields Plenty Of Answers 

With 40 games in the books, here's a look at how Notre Dame has answered 10 major preseason questions:

Who would emerge as the new leadoff hitter, at a spot held the previous four seasons mostly by Steve Stanley (and fellow 2002 grads Ken Meyer and Paul O'Toole)?

Sophomore SS Matt Macri and freshman OF Cody Rizzo were tried at the leadoff spot in the first seven games before ND moved junior 2B Steve Sollmann up from the 2-hole into the top spot ... Sollmann has responded by batting .388 as the leadoff hitter (42-for108, 34 R, 23 RBI, 3 HR, 3 3B, 7 2B, 12 BB, 16 SB ) and reaching base in 54 percent of his leadoff plate appearances (any inning) since the lineup shift (he leads the team with a .574 overall leadoff OB pct.).

Who would fill the gap in center field, where Stanley started all 254 games from 1999-2002?

Freshmen Craig Cooper and Cody Rizzo were tried in center during the first two weeks of the season before their classmate Brennan Grogan started 21 of the last 22 games at CF ... another freshman, Alex Nettey, then started three games in center - with senior RF Kris Billmaier making the shift to CF in the last six games.

Who would step into the No. 3 batting order spot, occupied in ' 02 by LF Brian Stavisky (who signed as junior 6th-round pick of the Oakland A's)?

Junior corner IF Matt Edwards has made 29 starts in the 3-hole while ranking as one of the team's most pivotal players in 2003 ... Edwards - who missed most of the '02 season with a broken leg - is batting .361 with 48 RBI and 7 home runs in 39 games played, comparable to Stavisky's 2002 production (.394, 57 RBI, 9 HR in 50 GP).

How would sophomores Matt Macri (SS) and Matt Edwards (3B/1B) return from the injuries that held them out for most of the 2002 season?

Edwards (see previous note) has been arguably the key factor to ND's first-half success (with Steve Sollmann's production again meeting his usual high standard) while Macri - who missed most of '02 with ACL elbow surgery - has overcome a slow start to hit . 4 and make just three errors in his last 12 games (he made four Es in the first four games and was batting just .211 in late March, now .308) ... Macri also has showcased his arm strength to throw out several batters.

Who would meet the challenge as the staff's No. 3 starter, after the preseason surgery to ace Grant Johnson?

Ryan Kalita has stepped up as the No. 3 starter in the past month, helping overcome the loss of both Johnson and Kalita's fellow senior RHP Peter Ogilvie (just returned from sore shoulder reehab) ... Kalita (12-0 in his ND career) is 5-0 with a 3.97 ERA and .229 opp. batting avg. this season ( $35 \mathrm{Ks}, 21 \mathrm{BB}$, 38 H in 45.1 IP ).

Would the Irish experience a dropoff in power, most notably due to the loss of O'Toole (11 HRs in '02) and Stavisky (9)?

The 2003 team's current home run total (22) actually is on pace to fall short of the HR total by the ' 02 squad (53) and the Irish may not have a double-digit HR hitter on the '03 squad, with Matt Edwards (7) the current long-ball leader ... ND's current $27-5$ run is all the more noteworthy when considering that the cleanup spot has produced just one home run in the last 38 games.

Would the Irish have speed and good basestealing ability, after the loss of Stanley and O'Toole?

The return of sophomore SS Matt Macri and the addition of freshmen such as Brennan Grogan, Cody Rizzo, Craig Cooper and Greg Lopez has added some quality baserunners to the 2003 lineup - with the current SB total (55) close to surpass ing the SB total for all of 2002 (63) ... the combination of junior 2B Steve Sollmann (23), Grogan (11) and Cooper (8) gives the 2003 Irish a group of three players who are in the range of swiping 10-plus bases (Stanley's 32 and O'Toole's 11 were ND's only double-digit SB players in '02).

How would junior Javi Sanchez handle the position switch from the middle infield to catcher?

Sanchez - a prep 2B who filled in at SS in '02 - has made an impressive transition behind the dish while doing a solid job batting mostly in the 5-hole for the Irish (.305, 27 R, 17 RBI, HR, 3B, 10 2B) ... Sanchez has cut down his passed balls and has made major strides in throwing out attempted basestealers, due to his strong arm and agility behind the plate.

How quickly and to what degree would the freshman position players make an impact?

Five freshman position players - RF Cody Rizzo, LF Brennan Grogan, 3B Greg Lopez, DH Steve Andres and OF/DH Craig Cooper - played key roles in the first half of the 2003 season, combining to make 99 starts (after 29 games) while batting a combined . 318 (114-for-358) ... their biggest statistical contributions (at the 29-game mark) included $62 \%$ of Notre Dame's times hit-bypitch, $50 \%$ of the team's triples, $43 \%$ of the stolen bases and $42 \%$ of the runs scored ( 94 of 224).

Would the offense do its share to complement the talented core of veteran pitchers?

The 2003 team (.311) - which has taken on a more righthanded slant (after the departure of five lefthanded-hitting position starters) - is lagging behind the 2002 team's final batting average (.321) but the Irish have been able to bunch together their hits ti the tine of 16 "big innings" (5-plus runs) and 18 wins by 5 -plus runs (just three shy of the 2002 team's total of wins by 5 -plus) ... seven of the team's nine starting position players currently are batting above .285 .
