FEATURED CLINICIAN



DOUG COLLINS' accomplishments in the NBA as a player and coach are many. His eight-year coaching career includes a .536 winning percentage (332-287), five post-season appearances, including a trip to the Eastern Conference Finals in 1988-89 with the Chicago Bulls, and a victory as head coach of the Eastern Conference in the 1997 NBA All-Star Game. A student of the game, Collins combined a defensive-orientated mentoring approach in helping develop the games of NBA All-Stars Michael Jordan, Scottie Pippen, Grant Hill, Allan Houston, Theo Ratiff and Jerry Stackhouse.

After an outstanding career at Illinois State, Collins was selected as the number one overall pick in the 1973 NBA and ABA Drafts by the Philadelphia 76ers and the New Jersey Nets, respectively. He was named to four NBA All-Star Games (1976-79) during his eight-year career, all with the Sixers, and was a key member of the 1972 U.S. Olympic team that earned a controversial silver medal at the Munich Games.

Widely considered the NBA's premier color analyst, Collins now works for TNT.

Head Coach MIKE BREY



MIKE BREY begins his sixth campaign as head coach of the Fighting Irish. A 18-year veteran of the college coaching ranks, he was the head coach at Delaware (1995-2000) before coming to Notre Dame. He also served as an assistant coach at Duke from 1987-95. Under Brey, Irish teams have compiled an 102-56 record and have played in the NCAA tournament in three of those seasons. In 2003, Notre Dame advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA tournament for the first time since 1987.

While serving as an assistant coach under Mike Krzyzewski at Duke, Brey was instrumental in helping the Blue Devils advance to six Final Fours and two NCAA title games seasons. In 1991 and '92, Duke won back-to-back national championships. Coach Brey was instrumental in the Blue Devils advancing to 6 final fours, 4 NCAA Title games, and winning the National Championship in 1991 & 1992. Coach Brey began his coaching career at his alma mater, DeMatha High School, under Hall-of-Fame Coach Morgan Wooten. In October of 2003, he received DeMatha High School's Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Known throughout the country in basketball circles for his game management abilities and practice organization, he is one of the nation's most respected coaches.

The practice session and discussion with Coach Brey will be invaluable as you prepare your team for the upcoming season!

Take the I-80/I-90 toll road east to the US-31/US-33 exit #77. Turn right after you exit onto US-33 heading South. Turn left onto Douglas Rd. (just past the Inn at St. Mary's) Turn right onto Juniper Rd. The Joyce Center will be on your left.

FROM OHIO:
Take the I-80/I-90 toll road west to US-31/US-33 exit #77. Turn right after you exit onto US-33 heading South. Turn left onto Douglas Rd. (just past the Inn at St. Mary's) Turn right onto Juniper Rd. The Joyce Center will be on your left.

NOTRE DAME BASKETBALL

Associate Head Coach SEAN KEARNEY

SEAN KEARNEY begins his 25th year in coaching, 20th on the college level! Sean enters his sixth year at Notre Dame after spending the previous nine years at the University of Delaware, leading the Blue Hens to 4 NCAA Tournaments. Prior to his arrival at Delaware, Sean served as an assistant at Providence, Philadelphia Textiles and Northwestern. During his one season on Rick Pitino's staff at Providence, the Friars advanced to the 1987 Final Four. A 1981 graduate of Scranton (PA), Sean began his coaching career at his alma mater, Cardinal O'Hara (PA) HS.

Assistant Coach LEWIS PRESTON

LEWIS PRESTON is entering his eighth year of college coaching after an outstanding professional career in Europe. Lewis will enter his sixth season at Notre Dame after spending the previous two seasons at Coastal Carolina. A 1993 graduate of the Virginia Military Institute, Lewis was a two time all-Southern Conference selection, and is still the Keydets all-time leading shot blocker. Lewis played professionally for Palma Ahn (Luxembourg), the Tolka Rovers (Ireland), and Lahden Namika (Finland) where he averaged over 20 ppg., 11 rpg., 3 blks.

Assistant Coach ROD BALANIS

ROD BALANIS is entering his tenth year in college coaching, sixth on Mike Brey's staff at ND. Rod came to Notre Dame after four years as an assistant at Colgate University. While with the Red Raiders, Rod coached four All-Patriot League post players including Adonal Foye, the 7th pick in the 1997 NBA Draft. Rod played at Georgia Tech for Bobby Cremins where he helped the Yellow Jackets to 1 NIT and 4 NAAs, including the 1990 Final Four. Rod is a DeMatha High School product, where he played for the legendary Morgan Wooten.

Coordinator of Basketball Operations MARTIN INGELSBY

MARTIN INGELSBY begins his third season as the programs' coordinator of basketball operations. Ingelsby returned to his alma mater in the summer of 2003 after serving as an assistant coach at Wagner College during the 2002-03 school year. During that season, the Seahawks posted a 21-11 overall record and 14-4 mark in conference play which marked the most successful season in the school's history. Ingelsby started for the Irish from 1997-2001 and served as the team captain in his final season. A member of the Big EAST All-Rookie Team as a freshman, he led the Irish to the league's West Division title in his senior season and to its first NCAA Tournament berth in more than a decade. Ingelsby ranks among the school's all-time career leaders in six categories.
