BY THE NUMBERS: IRISH VS. SEMINOLES

1	Notre Dame is 5-0 in the ACC, the only team with an unblemished record in league play this season.
1.85	Assist-to-turnover ratio for Notre Dame this season, the best in the nation.
2	Senior Steve Vasturia earned his second weekly award from the ACC in his career on Monday, named co-ACC Player of the Week. Vasturia averaged 15.0 ppg, 5.0 rpg and 5.0 apg in Notre Dame's two road victories last week. Vasturia was named ACC Rookie of the Week on Jan. 6, 2014.
3	ACC road victories for the Irish this season - the most in the conference thus far in 2016-17. Notre Dame owns three of the 12 road victories earned in the league this year (as of Jan. 16).
3.1	Team grade-point-average (rounded up from the official number of 3.096) for the Irish in the fall semester of 2016, the best combined group average posted by a Notre Dame men's basketball team since the spring of 2009.
9.4	Turnovers-per-game average for the Irish this season, second-best in the nation.
10.9	Rebounds-per-game average for Bonzie Colson , which leads the ACC and is 10th in the country (as of Jan. 16). Colson also lead the ACC in double-doubles (11) and 20/10 games (four).
11.5	Improved points-per-game scoring average for junior Matt Farrell (14.1 this season compared to 2.6 from 2015-16), the best mark in the ACC and the second-best for a player from the Brey era (1st, +14.4, Tim Abromaitis, 2009-10, 3rd, Chris Quinn, +10.4, 2003-04).
14	Since the start of the 2014-15 season, Notre Dame, North Carolina and Virginia lead the league in ACC road victories with 14. Duke is fourth with 12 road wins.
15	Associated Press and Coaches Poll ranking for the Irish this week, the highest of the year and highest since the team finished the 2014-15 season ranked fifth.
16	Notre Dame's 16-2 record matches the 2014-15 team for the best start in the Mike Brey era. Before the 14-15 season, the most recent 16-2 start for the Irish basketball program occurred in 1978-79.
45	Notre Dame has finished its first five ACC wins on a 45-11 run over the game's final minutes (11:27 combined) to post a 5-0 conference record for the first time in program history. See page 3 for more details.
82.8	Free-throw percentage for Notre Dame this season, the best in the nation.
99	Consecutive games started by Steve Vasturia , dating back to the final seven games of the 2013-14 season. Vasturia will become the fourth Irish player to start 100 consecutive games on Wednesday at Florida State.
372	Victories at Notre Dame for head coach Mike Brey , the second-most in Notre Dame history and 21 away from the all-time record (393).
3,963	Air miles traveled by the Irish for their three-game road trip (at Miami, at Virginia Tech and at Florida State). Only Miami (at Pittsburgh, at Wake Forest, at Duke) will travel farther (4,982 miles) for three consecutive road games in conference this season.

IRISH CONTINUE ROAD TRIP AT #10/12 FLORIDA STATE:

The No. 15/15 University of Notre Dame men's basketball team (16-2, 5-0 ACC) ends a three-game road swing on Wednesday, Jan. 18, when the Irish head to Tallahassee, Florida, to face No. 10/12 Florida State (16-2, 4-1 ACC) in a battle for first place in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

NOTRE DAME vs. FLORIDA STATE SERIES HISTORY:

Notre Dame and Florida State will be meeting for the fifth time on Wednesday evening. The Seminoles lead the all-time series 3-1, including two victories at the Tucker Center.

Florida State has won 15 consecutive games at the Tucker Center entering the game Wednesday night.

CLOSING TIME:

Notre Dame has shown a knack for finishing games in its first five ACC victories of the season.

Against Pittsburgh, trailing by five with 2:42 remaining, Notre Dame finished regulation on a 6-1 run to force overtime, then finished overtime on an 8-2 run over the final 2:25 to earn a 78-77 victory. The runs continued in the next four ACC victories for the Irish, leading to Notre Dame outscoring its first five ACC opponents 45-11 in the final 11:27 (combined) of its first five conference wins.

5-0 CONFERENCE START:

Notre Dame's 5-0 start to the 2016-17 ACC marks the best five-game start to conference play in school history. The 2014-15 season saw the Irish start 3-0 in conference before a loss to Virginia.

This season, the Irish have now posted the best overall start of the Mike Brey era (9-0) and best conference start (5-0) in school history.

16-2 START MATCHES BEST OF BREY ERA:

Notre Dame has matched the 2014-15 season for the best start of the Mike Brey era, winning 16 of the first 18 games in 2016-17.

Previous to the 2014-15 season, Notre Dame was last 16-2 in the 1978-79 season.

The 2014-15 team started the season 16-2 and eventually won 20 of its first 22 games.

STREAK BUSTERS:

Notre Dame's three-game road swing will see them face three teams with impressive home win streaks.

The Irish ended Miami's 21-game win streak at the Watsco Center with a 67-62 victory on Jan. 12, 2017.

Notre Dame ended Virginia Tech's 15-game streak at the Cassell Coliseum on Jan. 14, 2017 with a 76-71 victory.

Florida State boasts a 15-game win streak at the Tucker Center entering Wednesday night's game.

FARRELL - MOST IMPROVED IN THE ACC:

Junior guard Matt Farrell has made a case as the most improved player in the nation this season. After starting Notre Dame's final four games of the 2015-16 season (his first four career starts as the Irish advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight) Farrell has stepped up his game even further in 2016-17.

Averaging 14.1 points per game (along with 5.4 assists per game and .404 3FG%) Farrell joins Georgia Tech's Ben Lammers as the most improved player, in terms of points-per-game average, in the ACC with an 11.5 improvement.

BREY REACHES 700-GAME MILESTONE:

Notre Dame head coach Mike Brey coached his 700th career game on Saturday, Jan. 7, in the victory over Clemson. Brey is the 35th active Division I head coach to reach the 700-game plateau.

Brey entered the 2016-17 season 30th on the winningest active coaches list (.665 percentage, currently .670 with a 14-2 record this year) and 36th on the active total wins list.

Brey is 21 wins away from the all-time mark at Notre Dame of 393 victories and coached his 550th game at Notre Dame against Miami on Thursday, Jan. 12. He also is approaching the school record for games coached at Notre Dame (590).

BEACHEM CLOSING IN ON 1,000 POINTS

Senior forward V.J. Bechem needs 57 more points this season to reach 1,000 in his career. He would join classmate Steve Vasturia in the 1,000-point club (Vasturia reached the mark against Northwestern earlier this season) and would become the 60th Notre Dame player to score 1,000 points in a career.

Junior Bonzie Colson could become the third member to reach 1,000 career points this season. Colson is currently at 864 career points.

COLSON FILLING UP THE BOXSCORE:

Junior forward Bonzie Colson recorded his 11th double-double of the season at Virginia Tech with 14 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. He leads the ACC in rebounding (10.9), double-doubles and 20/10 performances (four) this season.

Colson has scored double-figure points in 17 of 18 games this season, and bested Jerian Grant's run of 15 games with double-figure points to start the 2014-15 season by cracking double digits in points scored for the first 16 games this season.

Colson is the first non-guard to accomplish that feat since Luke Harangody in 2009-10, who scored double-figures in the season's first 25 games before an injury vs. Seton Hall ended his scoring streak.

VASTURIA = CLUTCH:

Notre Dame's first four ACC victories would not be possible without three clutch plays at the end of each game from Steve Vasturia.

In the ACC opener at Pittsburgh, Vasturia's two FTs pushed the game to overtime and his three pointer with 2.5 seconds remaining proved to be the game winner in the 78-77 OT victory.

Vasturia would end the Pittsburgh game scoring 10 of Notre Dame's final 12 points while assisting on the other field goal.

Against No. 9/9 Louisville, Vasturia poured in a career-best 24 points, none more important than his runner in the lane with :19 seconds remaining to put the Irish ahead to stay 73-68 in the eventual 77-70 victory.

In the win over Clemson, Vasturia nailed a corner three-point field goal at the shot clock buzzer off an inbounds play with 1:45 remaining, pushing the Irish ahead 70-68 in an eventual 75-70 victory.

On the road at Miami, Vasturia's drive to the basket with :08 seconds remaining pushed the Irish ahead 65-62 in an eventual 67-62 victory.

Vasturia followed up the clutch score against Miami to score 20 points at Virginia Tech and was named the co-ACC Player of the Week on Monday, Jan. 16.

VASTURIA REACHES CAREER MILESTONE:

Senior captain Steve Vasturia entered the Legends Classic final against Northwestern needing 18 points to reach 1,000 points in his career.

Not only did Vasturia reach that milestone, he might have played the best all-around game of his career against the Wildcats. The Medford, New Jersey, native grabbed eight rebounds to go along with 18 points, three assists and three steals.

Vasturia is the 59th Notre Dame player to reach the 1,000-point plateau.

USE INK TO PUT VASTURIA IN THE STARTING LINEUP:

Senior guard and team tri-captain Steve Vasturia, who head coach Mike Brey has said keeps him calm on the sidelines while in the lineup, has started 99 consecutive games for the Irish. As a freshman guard, Vasturia's first start came at Maryland on Jan. 15, 2014, but he entered the starting line up permanently on February 16, 2014, playing 30 minutes and scoring seven points in a victory at Boston College. The Philadelphia, Pa., native has not left the Irish starting five since that game.

Vasturia is on pace to become just the fourth Notre Dame player to start 100 consecutive games in a career at Florida State on Jan. 18, 2017.

NOTRE DAME REACHES 1800-WIN MILESTONE:

Notre Dame's 84-79 victory at Illinois on Dec. 2, 2015 marked the 1800th win in program history. The Fighting Irish are 1835-986 (.649) all-time in 112 seasons.

Notre Dame entered the season ranked seventh in Division I in all-time program wins behind Kentucky, Kansas, North Carolina, Duke, Temple and Syracuse. The Irish have improved five spots in the all-time wins list since Mike Brey took over the program for the 2000-01 season, surpassing Indiana, Oregon State, Pennsylvania and St. John's.

Notre Dame is the only NCAA program to rank in the top 10 for men's basketball and football victories.

POSTSEASON SUCCESS:

Not only did Notre Dame advance to the NCAA Championship Elite Eight for the second consecutive season for the first time since 1978-79, but the Irish combined for six NCAA tournament wins over the past two seasons - the most in program history over a two-year stretch. The previous high was Notre Dame's three wins in 1978 (the team's lone appearance in the Final Four) and two victories the next season.

The Irish were the only team in the nation to advance to the Elite Eight in both the 2014-15 and 2015-16 seasons and the back-to-back regional final games are a first for the program since the NCAA tournament expanded to 64 or more teams in 1985.

FORMER STANDOUTS RETURN TO THE IRISH BENCH:

For the first time in the Mike Brey era, the Irish head coach was tasked with replacing two assistant coaches in the same season. Long time aides Martin Ingelsby accepted the Delaware head coaching job (the same first-time Division I job Brey assumed in 1995-96) while Anthony Solomon joined the Georgetown coaching staff in the offseason.

Brey immediately looked to his former players, hiring 2002 Notre Dame graduate and All-American Ryan Humphrey and 2009 stand out shooting guard Ryan Ayers to fill his two coaching vacancies. Three-time team captain Eric Atkins, a 2014 Notre Dame graduate, then came aboard as the video coordinator.

Joining long time director of basketball operations Harold Swanagan (2002 Notre Dame graduate), Brey's staff now features four of his former players on the game day bench.

LEGENDS CLASSIC CHAMPIONS:

Notre Dame claimed its first in-season tournament title since 2010 with a 70-66 victory over Northwestern on Tuesday, Nov. 22, in the championship game of the 2016 Legends Classic at the Bardays Center in Brooklyn, New York.

The four victories for the Irish in the tournament (over Bryant, Seattle, Colorado and Northwestern) mark the most the Irish have ever won in an in-season tournament. The trophy was the first in-season award claimed by the Irish since they won three games in 2010 to claim the Old Spice Classic at Disney's Wide World of Sports. Previous to the 2010 Old Spice victory, Notre Dame's most recent in-season tournament title came at the Hawaii-Pacific Thanksgiving Classic in 2001.

LEGENDS CLASSIC MVP:

Bridgewater, New Jersey, native Matt Farrell enjoyed his return to the Barclays Center, not far from the area where he played during his prep career, for the Legends Classic semifinal and final victories over Colorado and Northwestern, respectively.

Farrell, whose first two career starts came in Notre Dame's two NCAA tournament victories over Michigan and Stephen F. Austin in the Barclays Center during March of 2016, played a career-best game in the semifinal over Colorado, scoring 20 points with six assists and three steals.

He followed up that performance with 18 points and six assists against Northwestern in the championship game, including scoring Notre Dame's final five points in the come-from-behind victory.

With a 19 point-per-game average in the two games at Barclays Center, along with 6.0 assists and 2.0 steals per game, Farrell was the easy choice as the tournament's most valuable player.

FARRELL LOVES NEW YORK/NEW JERSEY:

Junior guard Matt Farrell has made a claim as one of the most improved players in the nation this season, leading the team in assists (65, 5.9 per game) while scoring 13.8 points-per-game and converting on all 27 of his free throw attempts.

Farrell's stellar play in the 2016 Legend Classic tournament games at Barclays Center in Brooklyn, New York, earned him the tournament MVP award and his impressive performance against No. 1/1 Villanova on Dec. 10 in the Never Forget Tribute Classic in Newark, New Jersey, proved that the Bridgewater, New Jersey, native loves to compete in front of his hometown fans.

NOTRE DAME HELPS LEAGUE WIN THE ACC/BIG TEN CHALLENGE:

Notre Dame boasts a 3-1 record in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge and avenged its only loss in the event with a 92-78 victory over Iowa on Tuesday, Nov. 29.

The Irish hosted the event for just the second time at Purcell Pavilion in the win over the Hawkeyes, with their other two victories coming last season at Illinois, where the Irish spoiled the dedication game of the State Farm Center with a victory over the Illini and in 2014 over #19/18 Michigan State in overtime at home.

The ACC ended up taking the ACC/Big Ten Challenge with a 9-4 record, claiming a victory in the event for the first time since 2008.

RIVERS NAME TO BE RAISED IN RING OF HONOR:

David Rivers, an All-American guard at Notre Dame, first-round NBA draft selection and Euroleague Championship Most Valuable Player, will be inducted into the Notre Dame Athletics Ring of Honor at halftime of Notre Dame's contest with Syracuse on January 21, 2017.

The sixth-leading all-time scorer at Notre Dame, Rivers led the Irish to four consecutive NCAA tournament appearances from 1984-88 while scoring 2,058 points and handing out 586 assists. Rivers' arrival on campus prompted a move to an up-tempo attack for the Irish during his four seasons, where he dazzled Irish fans with his ability to score in the open floor, shoot from long distance and make behind-the-back passes look routine.

Rivers was selected as the 25th overall selection in the first round of the 1988 NBA Draft by the Los Angeles Lakers. He played for the Lakers and Los Angeles Clippers during his NBA career before moving to Europe and developing into one of the most noteworthy American players to ever compete in the Euroleague. As a member of Olympiacos in Greece, Rivers was named the 1997 Euroleague Final Four MVP when his squad became the first Greek team to win the Euroleague Championship.

Rivers, who served as a team captain during his sophomore, junior and senior seasons, will forever be remembered for his amazing recovery from a life-threatening automobile accident before his junior season at Notre Dame. On August 24, 1986, he was thrown from the passenger seat of a van that swerved to avoid a drunk driver and suffered a 15-inch gash across his abdomen. An emergency surgery at Elkhart General Hospital saved his life and Rivers returned to the court just 90 days later to play 34 minutes in Notre Dame's season-opening game of 1986-87. Rivers would go on to lead the team in minutes played that season and earn honorable mention All-America honors.

Rivers currently runs 'David Rivers Camps,' a program designed to encourage higher learning in pursuit of academic excellence through clinics, motivational speaking and camps in Italy, France, Greece and Rivers' hometown of Jersey City, New Jersey.

The Ring of Honor was established in 2010 by the University of Notre Dame Athletics Department to honor former and present men's and women's basketball and volleyball coaches and players who have made distinguished and noteworthy contributions during their careers at the University.

Previous Ring of Honor inductees include Austin Carr, Luke Harangody, Adrian Dantley, Digger Phelps, Tom Hawkins and Troy Murphy for men's basketball, while Ruth Riley and Skylar Diggins represent the women's basketball team. The women's team will add current assistant coaches Niele Ivey and Beth Cunningham to the Ring of Honor this season as well.

2017 INFINITI COACHES CHARITY CHALLENGE:

Irish head coach Mike Brey is taking part in the 2017 Coaches Charity Challenge. Voting begins on Monday, Jan. 2 and continues through the completion of the first round on Jan. 22, 2017. After four rounds of voting, the winning coach will receive a 100,000 dollar donation to a charity of his choice, with Coach Brey hoping to send money to Coaches vs. Cancer.
