SETTING THE SCENE

- ▶ LSU opens the season on the road for the sixth time under head coach Fran Flory. The Tigers have registered a 25-10 mark [.714] during its first tournament with Flory at the helm, including nine consecutive winning opening weekends dating back to the 2000 season.
- ▶ LSU went 2-1 at the Bluejay Invitational in Omaha, Neb. to start 2008. The Tigers edged Texas A&M and host Creighton before falling to No. 16 Minnesota.
- ► LSU LSU's .714 winning percentage ranks 14th nationally over the last four seasons. An in-depth chart is available on page 2.
- ► LSU's returning arsenal is highlighted by Brittnee Cooper, Lauren DeGirolamo, Marina Skender and Michele Williams.
- ► Together, the high octane quartet boasts 53 career accolades, including 2007 and 2008 AVCA All-American Honorable Mention status for both DeGirolamo and Cooper, respectively.

STREAKS, STORYLINES & SIDEBARS

- LSU is receiving 20 votes in the AVCA Top 25. It marks the third consecutive season that the Tigers have appeared in the preseason poll. LSU was ranked No. 23 and No. 21 in 2007 and 2008, respectively.
- The Tigers won four of its five matches last season when Angela Bensend reached double-digit kills. 108 of Bensend's 151 kills came during SEC play.
- Brittnee Cooper slapped double-digit kills in 10 of her last 11
 matches, including her last five outings. She posted over a
 .300 attack percentage in eight of those matches and her .336
 attack percentage ranked fourth in the SEC.
- Cooper, a 2008 AVCA All-American Honorable Mention selection and 2009 Preseason All-SEC honoree, notched at least five or more blocks in eight of her last 15 matches. Her 1.21 blocks per set paced the SEC.
- LSU compiled a 7-3 record last season when Sam Dabbs passed out 40 or more assists. The Tigers won both matches that Dabbs eclispsed the 50-assist plateau. Dabbs' 9.22 assists per set were fourth in the SEC.
- Dabbs, the 2008 LSWA Newcomer of the Year, registered six double-doubles and posted a triple-double in last season's opener against Texas A&M (Aug. 28). It was the Tigers first triple-double since Regan Hood against Mississippi State (Oct. 31) during the 2003 season.
- Before her season-ending injury, Lauren DeGirolamo connected on a .300 attack percentage or better in six straight matches, including over a .375 clip on four occassions.
- DeGirolamo, a 2007 AVCA All-American Honorable Mention pick, tallied 22 double-digit kill performances in 2007. She cranked 23 kills and added five blocks during a 3-2 triumph against Notre Dame (Oct. 23).
- Brittney Johnson recorded five or more kills in her last five matches to conclude 2008. She added four or more blocks in four of those matches.
- Johnson also saw action at setter and distributed double-figure assists four times. She passed out a season-best 32 assists at No. 11 Florida (Sept. 21).
- Tania Schatow provided seven or more kills and added three

- or more blocks on eight occassions off the bench last season.
 After sitting out last season due to injury, Marina Skender looks to regain her 2007 form where she powered home 378 kills and reeled in 416 digs.
- Skender ripped double-digit kills 20 times in 2007. She totaled 13 double-doubles, including 14 kills and matched a career-best 25 digs against Notre Dame (Oct. 23).
- Lauren Waclawczyk was used as an extra passer and serving specialist in 2008. She tallied double-figure digs twice and is slated to start at libero following two-time AVCA All-American Honorable Mention member and SEC Defensive Player of the Year Elena Martinez.
- Michele Williams moved from outside hitter to middle blocker after DeGirolamo's injury and pounded double-digit kills in 10 of her last 12 matches. She attacked at a .375 clip or higher in seven of her last nine matches, while her .302 attack percentage during league matches was 10th in the SEC rankings.
- Williams, a unanimous selection to the 2008 SEC All-Freshmen Team, added an ace in 11 matches last season. She popped multiple aces nine times and her 0.33 aces per set ranked sixth in the SEC.

GOING THE DISTANCE

- LSU has won 14 of its 19 five-set decisions over the last two season, including a 5-1 mark in 2008.
- LSU has gone 6-2 in five-set matches on opening weekend under head coach Fran Flory.
- The Tigers upended Texas A&M (20-18) and Creighton (15-10) in 2008. Angela Bensend and Brittnee Cooper teamed for 10 kills on 10 swings against the Aggies.

LSU VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- LSU is 4-40 against ranked opponents under Fran Flory and have dropped seven straight decisions. 20 of the 40 setbacks have come against Top 10 teams.
- All four of LSU's wins have come since the 2005 season, including a 3-2 triumph over No. 8 Notre Dame (Sept. 18).
- Marina Skender knocked 18 kills on a .432 attack percentage to go along with eight assists and five blocks against the Fighting Irish.

POSITION PREVIEW: OUTSIDE HITTERS

LSU has no shortage of options as Marina Skender, Angela Bensend and Madie Jones can succeed at either the outside or right side hitting positions.

The trio is joined by Brittney Johnson, Ally Judkins, Tania Schatow and Michele Williams, who are additional candidates that could see time on the outside when not in their traditional positions.

A dangerous server, powerful hitter and consistent passer, Skender's versatility combined with her experience, makes her one of the most complete players in the SEC. She enters 2009 after racking up 1,097 kills, 954 digs, 247 blocks and 165 aces over her first three seasons.

Bensend had a strong finish to the 2008 season, connecting on 108 of her 151 kills against SEC opponents. Her steady passing also will be important as she looks to return to her form that brought her 2007 All-SEC Freshmen Team accolades.

Madie Jones is physical opposing player who played both outside and right side hitter in high school. She was chosen as one of PrepVolleyball.com's Class of 2009 Top 50 recruits and tallied a second-place finish at the 2008 USA Volleyball Junior Championships with her club team taking home All-America honors.

POSITION PREVIEW: MIDDLE BLOCKERS

LSU returns three of its strongest weapons in middle blockers Brittnee Cooper, Lauren DeGirolamo and Michele Williams. Cooper and DeGirolamo earned AVCA All-America Honorable mention status in 2007 and 2008, respectively.

Cooper has spent the offseason in each of the last two seasons training with the U.S. National A2 Team. She won medals on both occasions and returns as one of the most-respected players in the SEC. The Houston native popped 302 kills on a .336 hitting percentage and paced the league averaging 1.21 blocks per set in 2008.

DeGirolamo's 2008 season was cut short due to injury, but she will rely on her proven ability to hit and block consistently to bounce back this season. She slapped 430 kills on a .332 hitting percentage to go along with 1.51 blocks per set in 2007.

Williams, a unanimous pick to the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2008, knocked 162 of her 191 kills in SEC action registering a .302 hitting percentage and will be looked upon to reach even greater heights in her sophomore campaign.

Additionally, Tania Schatow is a physical blocker that continues to build her game and will battle for playing time in the middle. She notched 48 blocks over 23 matches last season.

Ally Judkins, a 2008 TSWA All-State First-Team pick in Texas, enters LSU as one of PrepVolleyball.com's Class of 2009 Top 50 recruits. She brings a strong swing and notable blocking ability that will be an asset at the net for the Tigers.

POSITION PREVIEW: SETTERS

LSU's setting tandem of Sam Dabbs and Brittney Johnson returns for 2009 after passing out a combined 11.18 assists per game last season. Both players contribute valuable understanding of the game and possess familiarity with the LSU hitters after working extremely hard during the offseason.

Dabbs, the 2008 Louisiana Newcomer of the Year, contributed six double-doubles which included LSU's first triple-double since the 2003 season. She registered 40 or more assists on 10 occasions and ranked inside the SEC's Top 5 in assists per set.

Johnson split time at setter and offered versatility to the Tiger lineup taking swings from the right side. The Baton Rouge native was the only player to post over a kill, an assist and a dig per set last season. She also showcased her athleticism as a consistent blocker.

POSITION PREVIEW: DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

With the departure of the reigning two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Year and AVCA All-American defensive specialist Elena Martinez, LSU will undeniably have a hole to fill in one of the most crucial position on the court.

Lauren Waclawczyk along with freshmen Sam Delahoussaye and Meghan Mannari are set to anchor the LSU back row. Waclawczyk saw action in 27 matches accounting for 1.46 digs per set last season, while Delahoussaye and Mannari arrive on the Bayou after extremely decorated prep careers.
