HEAD COACH MIKE CORRADO

The 2010-2011 season marks Mike Corrado's fifth year as the head coach at Villanova and his 16th overall with the program. Corrado was appointed head coach during the summer of 2006 after being named the associate head coach one year earlier.

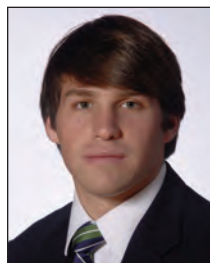


The 2009 and 2010 back-to-back CAA and BIG EAST Coach of the Year has led the Wildcats to unprecedented success in recent seasons. During the past four years, Corrado has garnered a .542 overall winning percentage while posting a .656 winning percentage the past two seasons. His career record currently stands at 33-28 following the conclusion of the 2010 campaign, while posting a 21-11 record the last two years.

GAME NOTES

SETTING THE STAGE

• No. 8 Villanova (7-2, 0-1) travels to South Bend, Ind. this weekend to face No. 2 Notre Dame (6-0, 1-0) for the continuation of their BIG EAST schedule. The Wildcats are coming off a 5-4 defeat versus No. 1 Syracuse on March 26th and face the two top-ranked teams in the nation back-to-back.

SERIES HISTORY

• Saturday's contest will mark the 15th overall meeting between the two schools, with ND holding the 9-5 advantage in the all-time series. Villanova claimed the latest victory in the series on April 3rd, 2010 in a 9-8 win at Villanova Stadium. The Irish last won on March 31st, 2009, 9-7 in South Bend.

VILLANOVA THIS SEASON

• The Wildcats enter Saturday's contest with a 7-2 record after their six-game win streak was broken by No. 1 Syracuse this past Saturday.
 • Three of Villanova's seven wins have come against opponents ranked at the time of their meetings: the Wildcats bested No. 16 Drexel, 14-13, in a Philadelphia showdown, and also topped No. 9 Penn, 9-8 in VU's lone overtime game of the season. Against No. 11 Princeton, Villanova claimed their first-ever win against the Tigers, 10-9, in the Class of 1952 Stadium.

A LOOK AT NOTRE DAME

• Notre Dame will bring a perfect 6-0 record into Saturday's showdown against the Wildcats. The Fighting Irish are coming off a BIG EAST victory vs. Rutgers, 5-4, on March 27th and have claimed wins over No. 5 Duke (12-7), Penn State (6-2), No. 16 Drexel (11-7), No. 14 Denver (10-9) and No. 20 Ohio State (8-7).

IRISH OFFENSE

• The Fighting Irish average 9.17 goals per game on offense and surrender 5.83 goals per game defensively. Junior Sean Rogers leads the team with 16 points through 10 goals and six assists while freshman Westy Hopkins, senior Zach Brenneman and junior Max Pfeifer follow closely behind with seven points apiece.

IRISH DEFENSE

• Defensively, sophomore goalkeeper John Kemp has started all six games in goal and records a perfect 6-0 record. He posts a 5.83 goals-against average (3rd best in the NCAA) and a .628 save percentage (4th best in the NCAA).

THE LAST MEETING

• The No. 15 Villanova Wildcats secured their first-ever BIG EAST win with a four-goal fourth quarter performance to rally over No. 18 Notre Dame, 9-8, at Villanova Stadium on Saturday afternoon. Kevin Cunningham led the team with three goals and one assist while Paul Webber and Mark Scioscia each contributed with two goals apiece in front of the biggest home crowd of the season with 1,293 fans in attendance. With the victory, Villanova reached their ninth consecutive home win dating back to March 14, 2009 and gained their first win over the Irish since 1992.

LOWE'S SENIOR C.L.A.S.S. AWARD

• Senior Brian Karalunas has been selected as one of 10 finalists to be chosen for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in men's lacrosse. In addition to his many athletic honors, Karalunas holds a 3.93 grade-point average as an Honors and Philosophy major and is a member of the Phi Kappa Phi honor society, the National Society of Collegiate Scholars and the Interdisciplinary Honors Program at Villanova. He was chosen as the 2010-2011 American Eagle Outfitters BIG EAST Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year and the 2010 BIG EAST Scholar-Athlete Sport Excellence Award Winner.

A NIGHT OF FIRSTS

- On Saturday, March 26th vs. Syracuse, Villanova hosted the first-ever men's lacrosse matchup between two schools ranked in the top-10.
- Prior to the contest, Villanova reached their highest ranking in program history, claiming the No. 7 position in the USILA Coaches poll.
- The 6,289 people in attendance was the most-attended Villanova men's lacrosse home game in history.

BEATING THE BEST

• Three of Villanova's seven wins have come against opponents that were ranked at the time of the meetings. The Wildcats bested No. 16 Drexel (14-13) in a Philadelphia showdown, and also topped No. 9 Penn (9-8 OT) and No. 11 Princeton (10-9). VU was defeated in the final six seconds of the game vs. No. 1 Syracuse (5-4).

DEFENSIVE DAMAGE

• Villanova's defense has been forcing opponents into major scoring droughts this season. Versus No. 1 Syracuse, the Wildcats held the Orange scoreless for 40:06 and vs. Princeton, for 31:11.

BIG EAST ACCOLADES

• Five Villanova players have earned weekly accolades from the BIG EAST Conference so far this season. Brian Karalunas was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Week on March 21st, while Kevin Cunningham and Jack Rice have garnered Offensive Player of the Week honors on Feb. 28 and March 14th, respectively. Nolan Vihlen (March 7), Billy Hurley (Feb. 21) Cunningham (Feb. 28, March 21) and Karalunas (March 14, March 28) have all been named to the weekly honor roll thus far in 2011.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

• Villanova has had 13 different players contribute on offense this season and is highlighted by the offensive scoring from the sophomore and junior classes. The junior class has produced 54% of the teams total points on the season, while the sophomores have contributed to 42% of total team production. The senior and freshman classes combine for only 4% of total team points. Junior attackman Kevin Cunningham, Villanova's point leader, is responsible for 24% of total team points.

TAMING THE TIGERS

• Brian Karalunas had a career-high eight caused turnovers and eight ground balls against No. 11 Princeton on March 15th. The victory marked Villanova's third win over top-20 opponents and the first Wildcat victory in the all-time series between the two schools; the teams last met 22 years ago in 1989. Villanova held Princeton scoreless for 31:11 - more than half the game - while Karalunas held Princeton's leading scorer, freshman Tom Schreiber, without a goal or assist and with just two shots.

WINNING PHILADELPHIA

• With Villanova's victories over Lehigh, Drexel, Penn State and Penn, the Wildcats went 4 for 5 in contests against in-state rivals. The lone Pennsylvania loss comes in a 10-8 defeat at Bucknell on Feb. 26th, 10-8. With the 9-8 overtime win against Penn on March 12th, the Wildcats claimed the unofficial Philadelphia title, beating both Drexel and Penn for the city rivalry.

PASSING PENN STATE

• The 17-5 victory over Penn State on March 8th matched Villanova's highest scoring differential dating back to April 6th, 2002 in an 18-6 win over Lafayette. C.J. Small tallied a career-high four goals while Kevin Cunningham and Michael Vigilante each contributed four points on the evening.

BIG START FOR HURLEY

• Sophomore goalkeeper Billy Hurley (Morristown, N.J.) opened the season with an eight save effort against Lehigh in the 9-8 victory, including four stops in the fourth quarter to stifle a late-attempt comeback by the Mountain Hawks. For his efforts, Hurley was named to the BIG EAST Honor Roll for the first week of the season. The award was the second BIG EAST accolade of his career.

RACKING UP POINTS

• Junior attackman Kevin Cunningham has a team-best 34 points this season. His goal (21) and assist (13) totals both lead the team. Cunningham has scored points in every game for Villanova this season and currently ranks seventh in the NCAA averaging 4.13 points per game. His seven points at Drexel on March 1st, 2011 was a career high.

FACING OFF

• The Wildcats boast a .578 (108-187) faceoff winning percentage this season. Freshman Thomas Croonquist is 37-56 (.661) in the faceoff circle, while junior Nolan Vihlen is 68-119 (.571). The duo currently combines for the 12th best face-off win percentage in the NCAA.

SHOOTING DOWN THE COMPETITION

• Villanova has out shot its opponents 296-252 this season. That includes a 192-141 advantage in shots on goal. The Wildcats average 32.9 shots per game, while allowing just 28.0.

QUALITY COMPETITION

• The Wildcats have five teams on their 2011 slate that have been ranked during the season in the USILA Coaches poll and Nike/Inside Lacrosse media poll. Villanova fell to current No. 18 Bucknell in the second game of the season, 10-8, and to No. 1 Syracuse, 5-4 on March 26. The Wildcats won at then-No.16 Drexel 14-13 on March 1st and against then-No. 9 Penn, 9-8 in overtime on March 12th. Villanova also defeated then-No.11 Princeton, 10-9, on March 15th. Villanova will face No. 2 Notre Dame on April 2.

'NOVA NATION

• Villanova's 39-man roster hails from 10 different states. The states most represented are New Jersey with 11 and New York with eight.

OPENING WITH A WIN

• A third-quarter rally prompted by four Villanova scorers made the difference as the Wildcats tallied a 9-8 victory over the Lehigh Mountain Hawks. Junior Kevin Cunningham led the team with two goals and two assists while sophomore Will Casertano posted two goals and an assist of his own for the balanced offensive effort. With the win, the Wildcats improved their lead in the all-time series to 14-9 over the Mountain Hawks.

VILLANOVA TO HOST CHAMPIONSHIP

• Villanova will serve as the first-ever host of the 2012 BIG EAST Men's Lacrosse Championship. The sites were awarded by the BIG EAST Championship and Competition Committee. Included in the site selections was the announcement of the locations of the first two BIG EAST Men's Lacrosse Championships. The first championship will be hosted by Villanova at Villanova Stadium May 3 and 5, 2012, while Syracuse will host the 2013 championship at the Carrier Dome May 2 and 4.

WILDCATS NAME 2011 CAPTAINS

• Seniors Chris Ficke (D), Brian Karalunas (LSM) and T.J O'Donnell (M) are captains for the 2011 Wildcats. Ficke and Karalunas return for their second season captaining the squad while O'Donnell makes his season debut in the leadership role.

50 YEARS OF TRADITION

• Villanova is celebrating its 50th year of men's lacrosse this season after the sport was founded in 1961. Since its inception as a varsity sport in 1981, the Wildcats have an all-time record of 236-202 (.539). Michael Corrado is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Wildcats. He has a record of 40-29 (.580) during his Villanova tenure. Over the past three years, Corrado has amassed a record of 28-12 (.700).

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

• Villanova's Brian Karalunas was named a Second Team Preseason All-American after a standout junior season in 2010, where he earned a USILA Honorable Mention All-America nod and recorded a team-best 55 caused turnovers and team-second 55 ground balls. The LSM also led the NCAA averaging 3.47 caused turnovers per game.

The seven conference schools that participate in the league are Georgetown, Notre Dame, Providence, Rutgers, St. John's, Syracuse and Villanova. The teams play a six-game single round-robin regular-season schedule. • In 2012, Marquette will be the eighth program to join the BIG EAST in men's lacrosse. • Men's lacrosse is the BIG EAST's 11th men's sport while the Conference conducts 13 women's sports. Villanova already is a member of the BIG EAST in 22 other sports. • Villanova was a member of the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) from 2002-2009. The Wildcats made six CAA post-season tournament appearances in addition to winning the CAA title in 2009 over Towson, 10-9.

LOOKING BACK

• Villanova went 10-5 overall and 4-2 in BIG EAST play one season ago. The Wildcats were honored for their season with multiple post-season accolades, including BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year in Paul Webber and BIG EAST Co-Defensive Player of the Year in Brian Karalunas. Head Coach Mike Corrado was tabbed as the inaugural BIG EAST Coach of the Year, just one year after being named the Colonial Athletic Association Coach of the Year in 2009. Karalunas and Webber were also both named USILA Honorable Mention All-Americans upon conclusion of the 2010 season. The 2010 Wildcats arguably captured their best season in recent history, finishing with a record of 10-5 overall, 4-2 in the BIG EAST. The team earned its highest ranking in program history at No. 9 in the Inside Lacrosse Magazine and USILA polls and were ranked for the last seven weeks of the regular-season.

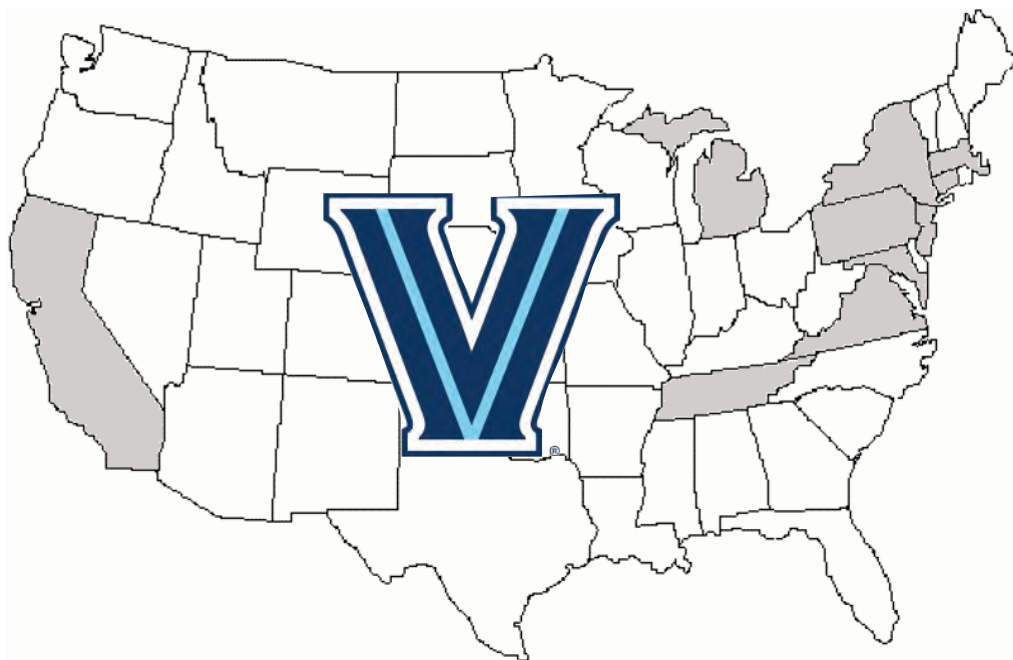

GAME 9

No. 1 SYRACUSE 5, No. 7 Villanova 4
Saturday March 26, 2011, Villanova, Pa.

Senior Brian Karalunas made the play of the game with under a minute left on the clock, stripping Syracuse's JoJo Marasco of the ball and assisting on Kevin Cunningham's goal with 57 seconds left to play, but the Orange clinched the nail-biter with six seconds remaining to secure the 5-4 victory.

With a school-record crowd of 6,289 in attendance, No. 7 Villanova (7-2, 0-1 BIG EAST) played their best defensive game of the season despite falling in their first BIG EAST matchup of the year against the Orange. The loss moves Villanova to 7-2 overall and 0-1 in conference, while Syracuse improved to 7-0, 2-0, respectively.

The match also marked the first lacrosse game between two top-10 teams in Villanova Stadium.

Head coach Mike Corrado states, ""We're disappointed with the outcome, but we're very proud of the way our guys played tonight. We had a great opportunity when we tied it up 4-4. We had been facing off well, they won that last face-off and got the last possession, they just made a play and pulled it out in the end."

The Wildcats held Syracuse scoreless for 39:56 - the longest scoring drought Villanova has held opponents to this season. Villanova also kept Princeton scoreless for 31:11 on March 15th.

The high-scoring first quarter would be the most either team would see all evening, with VU's C.J. Small getting the Wildcats on board first from a Michael Vigilante assist at the 12:12 mark. SU would respond with goals from Stephen Keogh and Marasco, the latter coming on the tail-end of a SU EMO opportunity to give the Orange a 2-1 lead with 8:24 remaining.

Less than two minutes later, Vigilante found himself driving through the SU defense to beat keeper John Galloway for an unassisted goal, tying the game at 2-2.

A Villanova turnover would result in the final goal of the quarter by SU's Kevin Drew, giving the Orange a slight 3-2 lead at the end of the period.

The back-and-forth possession style game settled down in the second stanza, with Small notching his 12th goal of the season at the 7:19 mark to tie the game at 3-3. The score would stand going into halftime.

At the break, both teams had tallied 10 turnovers each in the back and forth match, with VU dominating face-offs and winning 5 of 8 attempts for the half.

After a scoreless third quarter for both sides, Syracuse would break their goal drought at the 10:24 mark when Jovan Miller found an opening in the VU defense for the 4-3 lead.

Nearly nine minutes would pass before the Wildcats found their

rhythm off a gutsy Karalunas play, stripping Marasco of possession near the midfield line before taking a fast break to the Syracuse goal. The long-stick midfielder would connect with Cunningham for the 1-2 feed, while the junior attacker would finish the sequence with a rocket to the low right of the net to tie the game at 4-4.

With overtime on the horizon, Syracuse solidified the regulation-win with six seconds on the clock when Marasco capitalized off a Miller feed for the 5-4 victory.

Villanova dominated at the face-off X, with freshman Thomas Croonquist winning 5 of 7 attempts while junior Nolan Vihlen went 3 for 6. Karalunas let the team with six caused turnovers and two ground balls while close defensemen Chris Ficke and Chris Creighton combined for 10 ground balls and three caused turnovers.

Villanova keeper Billy Hurley captured six saves in the defeat while SU's John Galloway made 11 in the victory.

The 15th ranked Villanova Wildcats (7-1, 0-0) secured a 10-6 victory over Manhattan (1-8, 0-0) on Saturday afternoon, earning their sixth straight win of the season. Junior C.J. Small tied a career-high performance with four goals while classmate Kevin Cunningham tallied five points for the day.

Villanova dominated the Jaspers, outshooting Manhattan 32-20 and winning 14 of 20 face offs. Freshman Thomas Croonquist led the team with six ground balls and had a near-perfect day from the X, winning 11 of 12 attempts, good for a win percentage of 92%.

The Wildcats would solidify the victory with three unanswered scores from Max Hart, Small and Rice to finish the contest, giving Villanova the 10-6 win.

Tuesday March 15, 2011, Princeton, N.J.

The Wildcats scored seven unanswered goals to bridge the second and third quarters as No. 15 Villanova (6-1, 0-0 BIG EAST) toppled No. 11 Princeton (1-3, 0-0 Ivy) 10-9 in the Class of 1952 Stadium.

Senior Brian Karalunas had a career-high eight caused turnovers and eight ground balls while sophomore Jack Rice led VU with four goals. Junior Matt Bell added three assists in the effort.

The victory marks Villanova's third win over top-20 opponents and their fifth straight. It was the first Wildcat victory in the all-time series between the two schools; the teams last met 22 years ago in 1989.

Head Coach Michael Corrado states, "This game was an all-around team effort and marked a big win for us as we prepare to open our BIG EAST schedule in the coming weeks. Jack Rice was a huge threat on offense and Karalunas had one of the best games of his career tonight. Billy Hurley had another huge effort in goal; he kept us in the game in the first quarter and shut down the Princeton attack."

The first quarter found Princeton in familiar territory as they went up 3-0 on the Wildcats to start the game. For what has now been four times in four games, Princeton built a three-goal first quarter lead, and for the third time, that lead got away.

Villanova held Princeton scoreless for 31:11 - more than half the game - while Karalunas held Princeton's leading scorer, freshman Tom Schreiber, without a goal or assist and with just two shots.

Villanova rallied in the second and third quarters to come back from a three-goal deficit. Kevin Cunningham began the Villanova run, beating Princeton's Tyler Fiorito to his left side for the score. Just over four minutes later, sophomore Will Casertano followed suit after the Wildcats found themselves up two men to get the 'Cats to within one at 3-2.

Senior Andrew Henrich rounded out the quarter with his first goal of the season, finding himself wide open at the perimeter to even the score to three-all going into halftime.

At half, Hurley had captured five saves off of eight shots on goal while Fiorito had stopped six.

Villanova carried their momentum into the third quarter, notching four more unanswered goals off of looks from Rice, Cunningham, Nick Doherty and Max Hart. The scores would put VU up, 7-3, going into the final stanza. Villanova continued to maintain possession with the additional help from Karalunas and the Villanova defensive unit stifling any Princeton attempts.

Princeton, down 7-3 going to the fourth, scored six times in the final 15 minutes. After taking 17 shots in the first three quarters combined, Princeton took 17 more in the fourth quarter alone.

Princeton began the late comeback with scores from Chris McBride, Forest Sonnenfeldt and Cliff Larkin to get the Tigers to within two, but Rice was there for the VU response, notching two goals to put the score at 10-6 in favor of Villanova with 3:45 remaining in the contest.

The Tigers wouldn't go quietly, as Tyler Moni scored his second of the game, and Princeton cut the Villanova lead to 10-9 on a pair of Larkin goals with 26 and 13 seconds to go. In the final seconds, Princeton's Jeff Froccaro would win the final face-off, but Karalunas forced a turnover to shut down any last-minute heroics.

Vihlen was a major force once again from the face-off X, winning 12 of 18 attempts while freshman Thomas Croonquist was 3 for 5. Hurley finished the game with 10 saves in the victory while Fiorito captured 10 in the defeat.

Small tallied a career-high four goals while Kevin Cunningham and Michael Vigilante each contributed four points on the evening.

The 17-5 victory matches Villanova's highest scoring differential dating back to April 6th, 2002 in an 18-6 win over Lafayette.

Head Coach Michael Corrado states, "Tonight was a great win for us and we played our most complete game of lacrosse that we've had all season. C.J. Small had a great game, Cunningham was there, Nolan Vihlen was great at face-off, it really was an all-around effort. We took a lot of high percentage shots that really made the difference for us."

Villanova got off to a rolling 6-0 lead taking them into the second quarter, with Vigilante, Nick Doherty, Will Casertano, Cunningham and Small all notching unanswered scores though the 13:47 mark of the second stanza.

HEAD COACH MICHAEL CORRADO

The 2010-2011 season marks Mike Corrado's fifth year as the head coach at Villanova and his 16th overall with the program. Corrado was appointed head coach during the summer of 2006 after being named the associate head coach one year earlier.

The 2009 and 2010 back-to-back CAA and BIG EAST Coach of the Year has led the Wildcats to unprecedented success in recent seasons. During the past four years, Corrado has garnered a .542 overall winning percentage while posting a .656 winning percentage the past two seasons. His career record currently stands at 33-28 following the conclusion of the 2010 campaign, while posting a 21-11 record the last two years.

In 2010, Corrado guided Villanova to a 10-5 overall and 4-2 conference record in the inaugural season of BIG EAST men's lacrosse, finishing in third place in the league. During that time, Villanova reached their highest ranking in program history at No. 9 in the Nike/Inside Lacrosse and USILA polls while being ranked for the last seven weeks of the regular-season. It also marked just the third time in program history that Villanova had won at least 10 regular-season games since its inception as a varsity sport in 1981.

In 2009, Villanova made their first NCAA Tournament appearance after winning the CAA Championship by defeating Towson, 10-9, in the conference finals. The Wildcats then faced lacrosse powerhouse UVA in the first round of NCAA competition.

Corrado has led several players to individual accolades since being appointed head coach. Under his defensive tutelage, Brian Karalunas was named a two-time USILA Honorable Mention All-American, 2010 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year, First Team All-BIG EAST, Preseason Honorable Mention All-American and named to the Tewaaron Trophy Watch List. In 2009, Karalunas was also named the CAA Defensive Player of the Year.

On the offensive end, 2010 saw Paul Webber named as a USILA Honorable Mention All-American, BIG EAST Midfielder of the Year and an unanimous selection for First Team All-BIG EAST honors. Mark Scioscia and Kevin Cunningham were also named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team.

In his time at Villanova, Corrado has served in several capacities including mentoring the defense and serving as the recruiting coordinator. His expertise specifically lies with coordinating defensive efforts, and in 2003 and 2004, the Wildcats scoring defense ranked first and seventh in the nation, respectively. In 2005, Villanova improved to fourth in the country,



allowing just 7.13 goals per game.

A former standout defenseman for the Wildcats, Corrado is in his second stint at Villanova, having also served as an assistant under former Head Coach Randy Marks from 1992-95. Upon leaving Villanova, Corrado took a position at Conestoga High School before accepting a head coaching position with the Haverford High School varsity men's lacrosse team.

In November of 2005, Corrado was inducted into the Villanova Varsity Club Hall of Fame, being just the fourth lacrosse player to ever receive this honor. Previous inductees from the men's lacrosse program include Bob Adams (Class of 1980), Bill Hook (1980) and teammate Drew Cunningham (1985).

As a student-athlete, Corrado was a four-year starter at Villanova from 1984-1987. He was the team's Rookie of the Year in '84 and named co-captain and Most Valuable Player in his senior season when he collected a team-high 93 ground balls. For his career, Corrado tallied four goals and five assists from the defensive end of the field and was an All-County player for Islip (N.Y.) High School prior to becoming a Wildcat.

Upon graduation in 1987, Corrado served four years in the U.S. Navy where he was based out of Norfolk, Va. He is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War and recently retired as a Commander from the Naval Reserves.

Corrado received his Master's degree in Education from Temple University in 2002. Michael and his wife, Valerie, live in Drexel Hill, Pa. with their son, Matthew.
