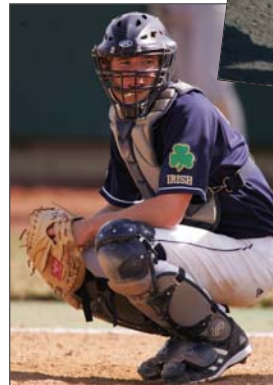

SATURDAY RECAP – Dan Kapala and Tom Thornton became the first ND pitchers since '01 to throw complete-game victories in both ends of a BIG EAST doubleheader, as the Irish baseball team rallied for two runs in the 8th to win the extra-inning opener (3-2) before posting a 7-1 win in the nightcap ... the wins gave 11th-year ND head coach Paul Mainieri 800 victories in his 23-year career as a college baseball head coach ... ND has won four straight BIG EAST games to surge into 3rd-place ... Kapala overcame some unusual moments in the opener to win his second career start in impressive fashion (6 H, BB, 2 Ks, 14 infield outs) ... Thornton (6 H, 0 BB, 4 Ks, 16 IF outs) became the first ND pitcher since All-American Aaron Heilman ('01) to post 9-inning complete games in back-to-back weeks (Heilman and Danny Tamayo were the last ND pitchers with complete-game wins in the same BIG EAST doubleheader, doing so three times in '01) ... ND's 8th-inning rally included pinch-hitter Matt Bransfield's leadoff single, Ross Brezovsky's sac. bunt, singles from Greg Lopez and Sean Gaston and Alex Nettey's sac. fly ... top ND hitters in the doubleheader included Brett Lilley (6-for-7, 2 R, BB), Lopez (4-for-7, 3 RBI, 3 R) and Gaston (4-for-8, RBI) ... ND had 11 runners LOB in the opener (8 after bases loaded) ... Tony Mallozzi (4-for-8, 2 RBI, 2B) was the only UConn hitter with more than 2 hits in the DH (UConn hit .197, ND .369) ... ND hit .435 with 2 outs in the doubleheader (10-for-23, including 8-for-16 in game-2), plus .368 with runners in scoring position (7-for-19).

THE SERIES – ND was won 8 straight vs. UConn for a 16-6 series edge, including sweeps of the previous two series (3-2, 11-4, 6-3 at ND in '03; 4-0, 11-4, 16-8 at UConn in '04) ... the '04 series finale saw ND erupt for 10 hits and 10 runs in the 1st inning (with HRs from Matt Bransfield, Craig Cooper and Matt Edwards, with today's starter Brendan McGinn taking the loss (0.2 IP, 8 H, 9 R/5 ER. K) ... several ND hitters have put up big numbers in their careers vs. UConn: Greg Lopez (.577, 15-for-26, 8 RBI, 6 R, 3B, 3 2B, HBP), Matt Edwards (.419, 13-for-31, 9 RBI, 6 R, 2 HR, 2 2B, 2 BB, 2 SB) and Matt Bransfield (.429, 9-for-21, 4 RBI, 5 R, HR, 2B) ... today's likely second pitcher for ND, Jeff Samardzija, tossed 3 shutout innings last season vs. UConn (2 H, 4 Ks) ... Ryan Doherty has not allowed a run in two previous appearances vs. the Huskies (3.1 IP, 3 H, 3 Ks, 2 HB).

HUSKIES NOTES – UConn returned 15 of 20 letterwinners from its 2004 team that went 26-29 and finished 9th in the BIG EAST (9-17) ... the Huskies entered the week ranked 21st in the nation with a 3.25 staff ERA ... UConn and ND have faced two common opponents this season – with the Huskies beating Central Michigan (10-9) and losing to Bowling Green (3-8; both in Bradenton, Fla.) while the Irish had the opposite results last week at Eck Stadium (14-2 vs. BG, 4-10 vs. CMU) ... UConn last played in the BIG EAST Tournament in 2000 (the final year under the six-team tournament format).

IRISH NOTES – The ND pitching staff has limited the opponent to 0-2 earned runs in five of the past six games while lowering the team ERA from 5.24 to 4.76 in that six-game stretch ... the Irish entered the '05 season with a 20-5-1 mark in their previous 26 extra-inning games but had lost all three of their extra-inning games previously this season (vs. Dayton, Georgetown and Rutgers) before the 3-2 win over UConn ... Paul Mainieri's '03-'05 teams needed just 138 games (100-38) to push his career win total from 700 to 800 (spanning two years and three weeks) ... Lilley's team-best .384 season batting avg. would rank 3rd-best ever by an ND freshman and best since Scott Sollmann's .402 in '94 (Eric Danapilis hit .429 as a freshman in '90) ... ND has lost just three all-time BIG EAST series at Eck Stadium, out of 46 (winning 36, with 7 splits) ... ND players who entered the week among the NCAA stat leaders include Matt Edwards (9th with 11 HRs and 44 RBI, 16th with .730 slugging pct.) and Brett Lilley (2nd with 16 HBPs) while ND as a team ranked 28th with 32 double plays turned ... Tom Thornton picked up his third career BIG EAST pitcher-of-the-week award after last week's complete-game win over Boston College (3-2; 8 H, 2 ER, 5 Ks, 0 BB, 34 BF, 96 pitches) ... just three previous pitchers in BIG EAST history have collected more weekly awards from the conference office (former ND great Aaron Heilman was a 10-time honoree while two pitchers from other teams had four each in their careers) ... junior OF Craig Cooper's .438 career batting avg. in BIG EAST regular-season games in on pace to challenge the record held by former Rutgers player Joe Cirone (.443; '97, '99-'00) ... Edwards is one pace for 19 HRs in the 56-game regular season (the ND record is 20, by Frank Jacobs in 1991) ... Edwards also is on pace for 77 RBI in the regular season, which would rank 6th in ND history and most since 1995 ... freshman Brett Lilley started the first 29 games at 2B before shifting to 3B (where three others also have started this season) ... next week's game vs. Purdue (April 20) will be telecast by Comcast Local, the first of eight upcoming ND games to be telecast by various networks (check und.com soon for full details) ... the ND batters have been hit-by-pitch 69 times this season, putting them on pace for 117 in the regular season (the NCAA record is 125, by Nevada in 1997) ... the Irish are riding the 2nd-longest scoring streak in the program's history (181 games; also 411 of the last 412) ... Cody Rizzo's 59 career HBP rank 9th in NCAA history ... ND owns a 30-28 scoring edge in the 1st inning (77-60 in the 1st-3rd) but the opponents have owned the key middle innings (29-25 in the 5th, 40-23 in the 6th) ... three pitchers coping with rehab and injuries – John Axford, Jeff Manship and Jess Stewart – have combined to log just 20 innings this season.
