UConn Improves in Season Openers

The Huskies improved to 36-8 all-time in regular-season openers and the team owns own a 29-4 mark in regular-season openers since Geno Auriemma took over prior to the 1985-86 season. UConn is a solid 25-2 in season openers dating back to 1990-91 and owns a 22-game winning streak in season openers following the win over Stanford. The Huskies last loss in an opener came on Nov. 19, 1995 - an 83-81 setback vs. Louisiana Tech.

Kia Shoots the Lights Out in Reno

Senior guard Kia Nurse scored 27 points on 9-10 shooting from the field but it was her 8-8 effort from beyond the three-point arc that propelled her into the record books. Nurse made her final two three-point field goal attempts in the Michigan State game as well and, when combined with her 8-8 effort against Nevada, Nurse has tied the UConn record with 10 consecutive made 3FG's. Nurse's 10 consecutive treys ties the school record held by Caroline Doty and Katie Lou Samuelson. The NCAA record for most consecutive made 3FG's is 14.

Dangerfield Shines in Season Debut

Sophomore guard Crystal Dangerfield scored a career-high 24 points and buried a career-best six three-point field goals in UConn's seasonopening victory over No. 10/9 Stanford on Sunday, November 12. Dangerfield also dishedout three assists and did not turn it over once in 34-minutes of action. For her efforts, Dangerfield was honored as the American Athletic Conference Player of the Week for the first time. So far this season, Dangerfield has 31 assists againsts only 10 turnovers

The Series vs. Notre Dame

The Huskies are 35-11 all-time against the Irish, and have won six-straight games in the series by an average of 14.7 points per game.

UConn is 433-16 (.964) all-time when playing as the nation's No. 1 ranked team in the Associated Press Top 25. The Huskies' most recent loss when ranked No. 1 came on November 17, 2014 vs. Stanford. UConn is 99-7 all-time when playing as the No. 2 ranked team. The Huskies have been ranked in the AP Poll for 452 consecutive weeks. (11/27)

The Huskies have been ranked No. 1 (AP) for a record-total of 221 weeks in the program's his-

tory - the most of any program.

UConn's run as the nation's top-ranked squad (2008-11) was the longest in program history and spanned 51 weeks - the longest in the history of the AP Poll.

Geno Auriemma has redefined the meaning of success in women's college basketball in his 33rd year as head coach of the University of Connecticut.

During his illustrious tenure, Auriemma has transformed the UConn program into the standard that all others are measured, both on and off the court.

Under his guidance, the Huskies have been transformed from a program with only one winning season, to its current state, which includes 11 national titles, 18 Final Fours, six perfect seasons (1995, 2002, 2009, 2010, 2014, 2016) and 45 Conference titles, all since Auriemma's arrival in 1985.

Off the court, success means a flawless, 100 percent graduation rate among four-year players and one of the most beloved and followed sports teams in the country.

This unmatched success, which is the standard for collegiate programs nationally, was recognized with Auriemma's induction into both the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame (Springfield, Mass.) and the Women Basketball Hall of Fame (Knoxville, Tenn.) in 2006.

In addition, Auriemma recently finished a successful eight-year term as he was named the head coach of the U.S. National Team, which won the gold medal at the 2012 Olympic Games in London and at the 2016 Olympic Games in Rio. Former Husky greats Sue Bird, Tina Charles, Maya Moore and Diana Taurasi won gold medals in each of the last two games while Swin Cash and Asjha Jones were with Auriemma in 2012 and Breanna Stewart won gold in 2016.

He is the only coach in women's basketball history to guide a team to 10-consecutive Final Four appearances and his 22-6 record in Final Four games, including an 11-0 mark in national championship games is the best in NCAA history.

Auriemma has won a major National Coach of the Year honor in nine different seasons and has been named the conference Coach of the Year 14 times, including the 2016-17 honor.

He reached the 600, 700, 800 and 900-win mark faster than any other coach in the history of college basketball and became the sport's all-time leader in winning percentage when he surpassed Leon Barmore's previous mark of .869

UConn swept both the league regular season and tournament crowns in 19 different seasons - all since Auriemma has taken over the program's reins.

His 32-year overall record stands at **997-135** (.881), the best winning percentage in the history of the sport and he became only the fourth coach all-time to eclipse the 900-win mark when the Huskies defeated Cincinnati on February 3, 2015. Auriemma reached win number 900 in fewer games than any coach in the history of the game.

The Huskies have won the conference tournament crown in 11 of the past 13 seasons. Connecticut extended its streak of consecutive NCAA Regional appearances to 24 straight and advanced to the NCAA Final Four for the 18th time in the program's history. Auriemma also guided UConn to its 22nd 30-win season in 2016-17 and its 22nd in the past 24 seasons.

UConn won the American Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles for the fourth-straight year in 2016-17 and captured its record fourth-straight national champinship after advancing to its ninth-straight Final Four, which extended its own record for most consecutive Final Four trips. UConn went undefeated for the sixth different season in 2015-16 while three Huskies, Moriah Jefferson, Breanna Stewart and Morgan Tuck, were selected as consensus First Team All-Americans.

Stewart was selected as the unanimous National Player of the Year earning honors from the the Associated Press, the WBCA (Wade

Trophy), The LA Athletic Club (Wooden Award) the United States Basketball Writers Association, the Atlantia Tip-Off Club (Naismith Trophy), and was selected as the winner of the Honda Sports Award.

Following the season, the All-America trio were the first triumvirate of teammates in history to be selected with the first three picks in the WNBA Draft.

The Huskies enter 2016-17 on a 75-game winning streak, which is only 15 shy of their own NCAA record of 90-consecutive wins. The team has also won 38-straight road games, which is only six shy of tying the record of 30-consecutive road game wins held by UConn (2007-11) and Notre Dame (2011-15).

Auriemma is a 1981 graduate of West Chester with a B.A. in political science. He resides in Manchester, Conn., with his wife Kathy. They have three children and three grand children.


