IN THE BATTERS BOX — Notre Dame opens its BIG EAST home portion of the schedule this weekend with a three-game tilt against Cincinnati. First pitch at Frank Eck Stadium for the series opener on Friday is scheduled for 5:05 p.m., while Saturday and Sunday's games will each begin at 1:05 p.m. All three games can be heard on ESPN Radio 1490 AM as well as UND.com (which will also provide webcasts).

CINCINNATI INSIDER — The Bearcats, led by 12th-year head coach Brian Cleary, enters the series at Notre Dame with a 10-9 overall record and 2-1 BIG EAST mark after winning two mid-week games over Ohio University (14-6) and Toledo (7-3) on Tuesday and Wednesday, respectively. Cincinnati also took two of three games at home against South Florida last weekend. Like the Irish, the Bearcats have played many close games. Nine of its 19 games have been decided by three runs or less.

Cincinnati, who has a 1-3 record on opponents' home fields, is averaging 6.1 runs per game and hitting .284 with a .370 on-base percentage. The Bearcats have also totaled 45 stolen bases in 59 attempts.

Tony Campana is hitting a team-best .346 with 16 stolen bases and nine RBI, while Kevin Johnson is batting .333 with three homers and 13 RBI. Mike Spina leads the club with 17 RBI and James Scott is the team-leader with 17 steals.

The pitching staff has a 4.06 ERA and .263 opponents' batting average along with 145 strikeouts and 48 walks in 162.0 innings pitched. Billy Welsh has an 0.00 ERA in eight relief appearances over 10.2 innings (five strikeouts), while Jake Goglein also has a 0.00 ERA and a team-best three saves in 8.2 innings (eight strikeouts). Cincinnati is fielding at a .965 clip as well.

THE STARTING PITCHERS — Notre Dame will start junior right-hander David Phelps (3-2, 3.41 ERA) in the series opener. The Hazelwood, Missouri native has made five starts for a total of 31.2 innings pitched. He has allowed 26 hits and 10 walks while striking out 31. Phelps has not allowed a home run and opponents are batting .226 against him. He struggled in the season-opening loss to Liberty on Feb. 22, but has rebounded with three consecutive quality starts against Mount St. Mary's (7 IP, 0R, 10 K), Buffalo (7 IP, 1 ER, 4K) and Georgetown (7 IP, 1 ER, 7K). Phelps has gone at least 5.0 innings in 20 of his last 21 starts.

Cincinnati will counter with junior lefthander Dan Osterbrock (1-2, 3.60 ERA) on Friday. The Cincinnati native has made four starts for a total of 25.0 innings pitched. He has allowed 28 hits (.267 opponents' batting average) and five walks with 23 strikeouts.

Senior southpaw Wade Korpi (3-1, 4.15 ERA) will take the mound in game two. Korpi has made five starts for a total of 30.1 innings pitched. The Santuluces, Florida native has allowed 30 hits and 18 walks with 21 strikeouts. He has allowed a team-high five home runs (none over his last three starts) and opponents are batting .261 against him. Korpi, who went 7-2 in 2006 with a 2.00 earned run average, picked up his first victory since Feb. 17, 2007 (a span of 10 starts and 14 appearances) against South Alabama on March 8. He made it three straight victories after his outings against Southern Illinois on March 15 (6 IP, 3 H, 0 R) and Georgetown on March 21 (7 IP, 1 ER, 3 H, 4K).

The Bearcats will counter with junior righty Michael Hill (2-1, 2.49 ERA) on Saturday. The Proctorville, Ohio native has made four starts (one relief appearance) for a total of 25.1 innings pitched. He has allowed 24 hits (.245 opponents' batting average) and six walks with 22 strikeouts.

The Irish will turn to sophomore righty Eric Maust (1-0, 1.93 ERA) for series finale. The Alpharetta, Georgia native has made six appearances (four out of the bullpen) for a total of 23.1 innings. Maust, who made three starts last year, has allowed 20 hits and five walks with 20 strikeouts. He has allowed one home run and opponents are bat-

ting just .238 against him. In Maust's first start of 2008 against Texas Pan-American, he tossed 6.0+ innings and allowed two earned runs on nine hits. Maust fanned five and walked none. He held the Broncos scoreless over the first six innings before allowing back-to-back doubles to open the seventh. Maust got better in his second start, going 8.0 scoreless innings and fanning five against Georgetown on March 22.

Cincinnati will counter with sophomore right-handed hurler Tyler Smith (1-2, 4.18 ERA). The Bryan, Ohio native has made five starts for a total of 28.0 innings pitched. He has allowed 24 hits (.224 opponents' batting average) and five walks with 31 strikeouts.

SERIES NOTES – Notre Dame and Cincinnati have met 28 times on the diamond, with the Irish holding a 16-12 lead in the series dating back to the 1948 season. Last year at Cincinnati, the Bearcats won two of three games, including wins by identical scores of 4-3 and 4-3 before Notre Dame won game-three 9-5. It marked the first ever meeting between the two schools as members of the BIG EAST Conference. The Irish had captured the previous seven meetings and 13 of 16.

The Irish holds a 10-1 lead over the Bearcats in games played at Notre Dame and 3-0 lead at Frank Eck Stadium.

Dave Schrage has a 1-2 record against Cincinnati as Notre Dame's head coach. Schrage was 0-4 against the Bearcats as Northern Illinois' head coach, meaning he has a 1-6 all-time record against Cincinnati.

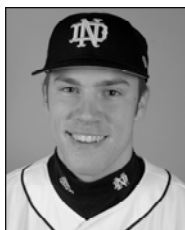

WHO DIDN'T PLAY – Notre Dame played 23 different position players (27 including pitchers) in the 14-3 rout of Wisconsin-Milwaukee on March 26. Junior Sam Elam (Mesquite, Texas), freshman Matt Katich (New Castle, Pa.), sophomore Herman Petzold (Saint Clair Shores, Mich.), freshman Andrew Wiand (South Bend, Ind.) and senior Bill Warrender (Collegeville, Pa.) all made their season debuts. In fact, Katich, Wiand and Warrender made their first career appearance in an Irish uniform. Petzold laced a double in his only at bat and eventually came around to score.

WATCH OUT FOR THE BIG INNING – Notre Dame has registered innings with five or more runs on six different occasions over the last 11 games. The Irish had just one such innings over their first nine games.

MIDDLE INNING SUCCESS KEY TO IRISH STREAK – Notre Dame opened the season with a 4-5 record through its first nine games and was outscored 29-13 in the fourth, fifth and sixth innings respectively, including a whopping 19-3 over the fifth (9-1) and sixth (10-2) innings. The Irish have since gone 8-2-1 and outscored their opponents 49-10 over those same innings (18-4, 4th; 19-3, 5th; 12-3, 6th).

DUPRA DONE RIGHT – Freshman Brian Dupra (1-2) picked up his first career victory in an Irish uniform against Ball State on Tuesday, March 25. The right-handed hurler scattered six hits over 6.0 innings. Dupra allowed just two earned runs and did not walk a single Ball State batter (struck out one). Since opening the season with an earned run average of 10.22 over his first three starts (22 hits, 14 ER in 12.1 IP), he has allowed just four earned runs in 11.0 innings over his last two starts (vs. Central Michigan on March 18 and tonight). Dupra has lowered his ERA to 6.94 and has not walked a batter in 11.1 innings.

POWER SURGE – Notre Dame hit just one home run over its first six games, but the Irish have stroked 13 long balls over their last 14 games. In fact, Notre Dame has hit home runs in seven of its last nine games and has multi-home run efforts in its last three of its last four outings (streak of three straight multi-hit home run games ended against Wisconsin-Milwaukee on March 26). The Irish had not registered two or more home runs in three consecutive games since March 31 (Western Michigan), April 1 (Hillsdale) and April 3 (Villanova) of 2004. The Irish have hit 14 home runs this season (20 games). It took Notre Dame 38 games to hit its 14th home run a season ago.

LONG BALL MARKET FOR IRISH FOES WAY DOWN – Over the home run barrage (13 homers in 14 games), the Irish have allowed just six round trippers and none over their last nine games. A considerable improvement from the start of the season when Notre Dame allowed 12 over its first eight games. The Irish have not surrendered a home run since the eighth inning of the Arizona game on March 9 – a span totaling 78.0 innings.

QUALITY PITCHING HAS INFECTED IRISH STAFF – The Irish pitching staff continued their stellar work against Ball State and Wisconsin-Milwaukee. After Notre Dame allowed just two earned runs the entire weekend in its sweep of Georgetown, the Irish limited the Cardinals and Panthers to four and three runs, respectively. The Irish have limited their opponents to two earned runs or less in six of the last nine games (and could have been eight had Ball State and Wisconsin-Milwaukee not each plated two runs in their respective top of the ninth innings). Over Notre Dame's last nine games (7-1-1), the Irish have posted a team earned run average of 2.57 and opponents are hitting just .231. Notre Dame has yielded only 63 hits in 77.0 innings and struckout 52.

STARTING PITCHING DOING ITS THING – The Irish starting rotation of (David Phelps, Wade Korpi, Eric Maust, Brian Dupra and Ryan Sharpley) have been done right incredible the last two weeks. That quintet has posted a 7-0 record with a 1.42 earned run average over Notre Dame's last nine games (7-1-1). The staff has only yielded 41 hits in 57 innings and opponents are batting just .207. The rotation is averaging 6.1 innings a start, including seven of the nine games with at least 6.0 complete innings.

SHARPLEY GOING OPPOSITE – Junior Evan Sharpley pushed the Notre Dame lead over Ball State to 4-2 on March 25 with his team-best sixth home run of the year. The reigning BIG EAST Player of the Week drilled a 1-0 offering from Brad Piatt over the leftfield wall. Each of his six round trippers has gone to left or center field.

SHARPLEY FINDING BASEBALL GROOVE – Notre Dame junior Evan Sharpley has gone back-and-forth the past two seasons with both football and baseball during the spring. He dedicated most of last spring with football as he competed to earn the starting quarterback job, but Sharpley has turned his attention to baseball almost exclusively this spring and the development is evident. He either leads the Irish or is tied for the team-lead in batting (.404), doubles (6), home runs (6), RBI (18) and slugging (.915).

► Sharpley, the second Irish player to ever throw a touchdown pass and hit a home run in the same academic year, was named BIG EAST Player of the Week on March 24. He carried Notre Dame to a sweep over Georgetown.

► Sharpley started the first and third games of the series (added a pinch hit appearance in the second game) and batted .545 (6-for-11) with three home runs and nine RBI. He registered a pair of three-hit games.

► In the opener, Sharpley went 3-for-5 with a double, home run, two runs scored and six RBI in the 25-1 rout. The six RBI is the second most in Notre Dame single-game history. It was the most RBI for an Irish player since A.J. Pollock also drove in six on April 21, 2007 against West Virginia. Sharpley then closed the weekend and sealed the sweep with another 3-for-5 performance, including a pair of home runs and three RBI, as Notre Dame shutout the Hoyas, 6-0.

► For the weekend, Sharpley posted an absurd 1.455 slugging percentage and .545 on-base percentage. He is the first Irish player to smack three or more home runs in a BIG EAST series since Craig Cooper had three in a series against Rutgers in 2006. The nine RBI for the weekend is also the most for a Notre Dame player since Cooper had nine that same weekend against the Scarlet Knights.

IRISH SETTLED ON A LINEUP – Notre Dame used 10 different batting lineups over its first 11 games (5-6), but the Irish have used just three lineups over their last nine games (7-1-1). The only lineup change over the last eight games is the rotation of junior Evan Sharpley (against RHP) and junior Casey Martin (against LHP) with the exception of Wednesday against Wisconsin-Milwaukee when freshman Golden Tate and freshman Cameron McConnell each were inserted. Since the lineup change, Notre Dame is batting .362 with 21 doubles, five triples, 10 home runs and 78 RBI over the nine games. The Irish batted just .269 with 23 doubles, one triple, four home runs and 52 RBI over the previous 11 games.

Sharpley has faced right-handed pitching, while Martin has played against left-handed pitching. The duo has combined for six home runs and 19 RBI over the last nine games. They have batted .417 (15-for-36) with 12 runs scored, two doubles and one triple.

► The platoon was in full effect in the sweep over Georgetown and could not have delivered better results. Sharpley went 3-for-5 with a double, home run and RBI in the 25-1 victory in the opener against the Hoyas. Martin was then inserted into the lineup in the second game of the series and belted a pair of home runs with five RBI to help Notre Dame win, 7-1. Sharpley answered with another three-hit and multi-home run game of his own (three RBI) in the 6-0 victory in the finale.

FREEBIES UPDATE – Over his years as a head coach, Notre Dame skipper Dave Schrage has utilized a formula to measure how many free bases a team allows during a given year. The formula adds walks allowed,

WEILAND QUICK NOTES – Junior RHP Kyle Weiland returns to the back end of the bullpen in 2008. Due to injuries and lack of depth last year, Weiland was forced to move into the starting rotation. He went 5-3 with a 5.66 ERA over 13 appearances and six starts. As a closer in 2006, Weiland ranked among the nation’s elite freshmen, receiving top Freshman All-America honors from *Baseball America* (one of 14 on the first team), *Collegiate Baseball* and the The Rosenblatt Report/Rivals.com while also being invited to the annual USA Baseball National Team trials. A second team all-BIG EAST selection that year, the lanky 6-foot-4 righthander finished third nationally with a school-record 16 saves and compiled a 2.37 ERA that ranked fourth-best on the Irish staff. His 30 appearances were one shy of the Irish freshman record (31) set by current big-leaguer Aaron Heilman in 1998 (when he led the nation with a 1.61 ERA). In addition to posting nearly a 2.5-to-1 strikeout-to-walk average (48/20) in 2006, Weiland logged 11 more innings (49.1) than hits allowed (39, with only one home run) and limited opponents to a .224 opponent batting average that ranked third-best ever by a Notre Dame freshman behind Heilman’s .198 in ‘98 and the .201 allowed by Larry Mohs in ‘94. Weiland converted all but one of his save opportunities en route to nearly doubling Heilman’s freshman save record (9) while his 16 saves were three better than the previous overall Irish record (13), set by J.P. Gagne in 2003.

LILLEY LITTERED THROUGHOUT IRISH RECORD BOOKS -

Notre Dame senior SS Brett Lilley is all over the Irish career record book. Lilley ranks third all-time in career on-base percentage (.483), seventh in sacrifice bunts (29) and sixth in total sacrifices (37). He is also on pace to finish his career among the top time all-time in the following categories: games played, games started, consecutive games started, at-bats, hits, runs scored, walks and assists.

ON-BASE REGULAR – Senior Brett Lilley entered his final season in 2008 with the chance to etch his name throughout the Notre Dame record book. The feisty infielder has started all 196 games in which he has played over his career (would move into the top 10 of most career starts with 11 more starts) while owning a .345 career batting average and the third-best career on-base percentage (.483) in the Irish baseball record book. A large chunk of his times on base have come via the hit-by-pitch (87), placing him second in NCAA history and five back of the record (his former ND teammate Cody Rizzo is third all-time with 84). Lilley became the seventh Notre Dame baseball player ever to be named all-BIG EAST three or more times, earning third team honors in 2007 while leading the Irish in 11 cat-

egories and ranking second in five others. His BIG EAST-leading .512 on-base percentage in 2007 ranked 11th in the nation and is seventh in Notre Dame history (second-best since the early 1990s) while his 27 HBPs ended up being fourth-most among the nation's players in 2007. Lilley also ended up with the sixth-best batting average among BIG EAST players (.371), also ranking ninth in runs (55) and 11th in walks (31), and he reached base in all but three of the 56 games in 2007— including a stretch to end the season that saw him reach in each of the final 20 games.

MR. DURABLE — Senior SS Brett Lilley takes the term "everyday player" to another level. Lilley has started 196 consecutive games (every game in which he has played over his career). He has started 76 consecutive games at shortstop. Senior Ross Brezovsky has started 185 of 188 games played over his career (including 98 straight).

ON DECK — After Notre Dame opens the conference home schedule with Cincinnati this weekend, the Irish host Western Michigan on April 1 before playing the South Bend Silverhawks in an exhibition on April 2.

RANKINGS — Notre Dame is unranked in each of the four polls. Cincinnati is also unranked.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION – Notre Dame plated 38 runs and recorded 46 hits (.380 batting average) in its series sweep of Georgetown. The 38 runs are tied for the second most ever in the 111 all-time BIG EAST series (tied for most ever away from Eck Stadium), trailing only the 40 runs the Irish scored against Rutgers in a three-game series at Eck Stadium in 2006. Notre Dame also scored 38 runs in a 2004 series at Georgetown. The Irish had 37 runs scored in a 1997 series against Georgetown and 36 runs (twice) against Georgetown (1998) and Pittsburgh (2000).

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Notre Dame baseball squad posted a 3.049 team grade-point average in the 2007 fall semester, led by 26 players at 3.0-plus. Irish players have earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors 25 times since 1977, with an unmatched two honorees every year from 2000-03: second baseman Jeff Perconte (3.76 GPA, economics/government major; ND Law grad) and lefthander Mike Naumann (3.92, pre-professional science; three 4.0 semesters; Baylor Medical School) in 2000; Naumann (joining Perconte as elite first-teamer); and leftfielder Brian Stavisky in '01; third baseman Andrew Bushey (3.43, finance) and Stavisky (3.50, management) in '02; and second baseman Steve Sollmann (3.30, marketing) and righthander J.P. Gagne (3.40, finance) in '03. Sollmann then earned first team honors in '04, capping his career with a 4.0 semester GPA, and shortstop Greg Lopez (3.39, pre-professional/anthropology) was a third team honoree in 2006 – before current senior shortstop Brett Lilley earned first-team honors in 2007 (3.81, accounting). Top 2008 candidates include Lilley (who graduated a semester early and now is pursuing a master's in accountancy; plus junior pitcher David Phelps (3.236, political science/computer applications).

LIGHTS OUT – Not only did Notre Dame approach numerous offensive records in the three-game series sweep of Georgetown, the Irish posted a 0.67 earned run average and limited the Hoyas to a .187 batting average. Georgetown managed just two runs (both earned) the entire weekend. The two runs are tied for the fewest ever allowed by a Notre Dame pitching staff over a three-game BIG EAST series. IRISH SCORE EARLY, OFTEN, AGAIN, AGAIN – Notre Dame totaled 28 hits and set a new school record for runs in a BIG EAST game in its 25-1 rout of Georgetown on March 20.

► The 25 runs are the sixth-most by Notre Dame in the 116 year history of the program. It was the largest scoring output since Notre Dame hammered South Alabama, 25-1, in the 2002 NCAA Regional. It also marked the second time the Irish have eclipsed 20 runs in a BIG EAST game (the 2005 team defeated Pittsburgh, 21-1).

 ► Notre Dame's 28-hit attack and .519 team batting average in Thursday's game produced five big

innings - nine in the second, three in the third, three in the fourth, five in the fifth and three in the eighth. The Irish recorded 11 extra-base hits, including 10 doubles. A total of 13 different Notre Dame players registered hits, including all nine players in the starting lineup (and did so by the fourth inning).

DOUBLE TAKE — Notre Dame freshman RHP Ryan Sharpley and junior 3B Evan Sharpley became the first set of brothers to start the same game (vs. Lehigh and vs. Wisconsin-Milwaukee) since at least 1968. Frank and Bill Orga each earned monograms during the '68 season, but archives can't confirm whether or not they started in the same game. The Irish have had 13 sets of brothers who both have earned monograms with ND baseball. Of those, only four earned monograms for the same season:

- 1968 - OF/1B Frank Orga and OF Bill Orga (Pittsburgh natives)
- 1939 - OF Roy Pinelli and SS Ray Pinelli (San Francisco)
- 1913 - SS Samuel Newning and 3B Harry Newning (Houston)
- 1908-09 - LHP Francis Scanlan and C Ray Scanlan (Syracuse)

There have been only two sets of monogram-winning baseball brothers at Notre Dame since the early 1980s and all four were drafted (Scott and Steve Sollmann/Ryan and Tim Kalita). Scott's career started three years after Steve's final season at Notre Dame and Ryan narrowly missed pitching on the same staff as Tim (who signed in '99, Ryan was a freshman that following fall).

DOUBLE DUTY — The Irish baseball team has historically featured a number of student-athletes that also competed in football. The 2008 season is no different. Junior 1B/DH Evan Sharpley (QB), sophomore RHP Eric Maust (P) and freshman OF Golden Tate (WR/KR) will each make major contributions this spring.

- ▶ A handful of Notre Dame baseball varsity monogram winners also have been starting quarterbacks with the Irish football team. Sharpley became only the second Notre Dame baseball player since the early 1940s to quarterback the Irish football team.
- ▶ Sharpley is first Notre Dame student-athlete since Paul Failla (1993-94) to throw a TD pass and hit a home run in same academic year. Failla had one TD pass in fall of '93 (vs. USC) and then had one HR the following spring ('94). He also hit five HR in '93 and one in '92.
- ▶ Tate was drafted by Arizona Diamondbacks scout and former Notre Dame player Matt Haas (who picked him in the 42nd round of the '07 MLB draft).
- ▶ The most recent Notre Dame baseball player to start at quarterback for the Irish was Paul Failla, in the 1993 win over USC (31-13, at Notre Dame Stadium; Irish were ranked #2, USC was unranked). It was Notre Dame's 11th straight win over USC.
- ▶ Prior to Failla, one has to go way back to the World War II era to find a Notre Dame starting quarterback who also was a monogram winner with the Irish baseball team. That era featured two such multiple-sport talents who were Notre Dame's first Heisman Trophy winners - Anglo Bertelli (1943 Heisman) and Johnny Lujack (1947 Heisman).
- ▶ Bertelli earned a varsity monogram with the Notre Dame baseball team in the spring of 1943, as a catcher and first baseman. He also was known at the time for being one of the best hockey players on the Notre Dame campus.
- ▶ Lujack was a baseball monogram winner in 1944, as an outfielder. He also earned varsity monograms in basketball and track-and-field (as a high jumper) during his time at Notre Dame.
- ▶ Also of note, three Notre Dame quarterbacks have been selected in the Major League Baseball draft, despite never earning a varsity monogram with the Irish baseball team. Those players include Joe Theismann (Minnesota Twins; 1971; 39th round), Tony Rice (California Angels; 1990; 50th round) and Carlyle Holiday (Cincinnati Reds; 2003; 44th round). Each of those players ultimately pursued a professional football career and never played pro baseball.

In 2007, the Irish finished the season with a -47 plate-discipline ratio ... the 2007 team (3.93) averaged nearly the same number of walks per game as the 2006 squad (3.92) but the HBPs were way down (from 1.6/gm to 1.0) and the strikeouts were up (4.5 to 5.8) ... senior SS Brett Lilley continued his remarkable plate discipline with a +30 PDR in 2007 (now +95 for his career) ... senior OF Ross Brezovsky and junior 2B Jeremy Barnes have each improved their plate discipline over every year with the Irish ... Brezovsky finished 2007 with a +1 PDR (after -6 in 2006 and -21 in 2005), thanks to lowering his strikeout total (27 in 56 games, or 0.48/gm; compared to 74 total Ks in 2005 and 2006, or 0.66/gm) ... Barnes ended last season with a -1 PDR (after finishing 2006 at -4) ... sophomore OF/3B A.J. Pollock had a stellar campaign in terms of PDR in 2007 (+17).

IRISH DONE IN BY LONG BALL — Notre Dame surrendered 16 home runs over its first 11 games. The Irish allowed a home run in eight of those 11 games. In fact, Notre Dame yielded multi-home runs on six different occasions in the stretch. The Irish allowed just 20 and 18 home runs, respectively, during the 2006 and 2007 seasons. The most home runs ever allowed by a Notre Dame squad is 55 set during the 1999 season. Ironically, the Irish went 43-18, captured the BIG EAST regular season title and reached the NCAA Regionals.

PHELPS NAMED TO CLEMENS AWARD WATCH LIST – Junior RHP David Phelps has been named to the preseason watch list for the 2008 Roger Clemens Award, given annually to the top pitcher in collegiate baseball. The watch list will be narrowed down to 10 semifinalists in mid-May and then to three finalists in early June. The 2008 winner will be announced in early summer.

IRISH OFFENSE, EARL WEAVER — Notre Dame entered the 2008 season with a total of 23 career home runs from returning players. Of those 23 long balls, 14 or just 60-percent have been of the three-run variety. Senior SS Brett Lilley has drilled four career home runs and three of them have driven in three runs, including his go-ahead bomb against Iowa on Feb. 23. Senior OF Ross Brezovsky has hit eight career bombs and three are three-run taters. Interestingly, five of Notre Dame's seven home runs are solo shots this season.

IRISH NOTES FROM IRISH CLASSIC —

- ▶ Notre Dame took two of three games in San Antonio (marked the first time this year the Irish took two of three over a weekend).
- ▶ The Irish got three consecutive quality starts from David Phelps, Wade Korpi and Eric Maust. The trio tossed 19.0 innings and allowed just three earned runs (good for 1.42 ERA).
- ▶ While the starters pitched extremely well, the Notre Dame bullpen did not perform as it had to this point of the season in the 10-8 loss to UTPA (blowing a 7-0 lead in the seventh inning). The Irish bullpen entered the contest with the Broncos sporting a 4.53 earned run average and 3-0 record. Opponents were hitting just .257 against the group and they had fanned 53 and walked 18 in 49.2 innings of work, UTPA tagged the Notre Dame relievers (Brett Graffy, Steven Mazur, Cole Johnson and Kyle Weiland) for eight earned runs on nine hits. Johnson took the loss – the first for the Notre Dame relief corp this season.
- ▶ Phelps limited Buffalo to just one earned run on four hits. The right-handed hurler struckout four and walked just one. Phelps allowed only one base-runner into scoring position the entire afternoon. He now has eight career starts in which he has gone at least 7.0 innings and surrendered an earned run or less.

IRISH NOTES FROM WHATABURGER CLASSIC —

- ▶ Notre Dame's offense continued to struggle over its three games in Corpus Christi. The Irish managed just two runs in each of their two losses (2-5 vs. Texas A&M CC, 0-16 vs. #1 Arizona). Notre

- Dame batted just .224 (22-for-98) and 10 of those hits came in the 10-4 victory over South Alabama.
- ▶ Arizona knocked around the Irish staff for 16 runs on 20 hits in the victory on March 9. The Wildcats scored in each of their eight at-bats.
 - ▶ The Irish bats did break out in the eight-run fourth inning against South Alabama. Notre Dame sent 12 batters to the plate and scored the eight runs on eight hits. The Irish managed just 14 hits the remaining 25.0 innings.
 - ▶ Notre Dame had more hits in that fourth inning than they did in the 4-2 defeat against Lehigh on March 6 (and nearly topped the total of nine against Texas A&M CC on March 7).
 - ▶ The eight-run inning was the largest outburst in an inning since the Irish plated eight in the fourth inning against Central Michigan on March 21 of last season.
 - ▶ Senior LHP Wade Korpi tossed 5.1 innings and allowed three earned runs on nine hits. The southpaw struckout four and walked four. Korpi recorded his first victory since Feb. 17 of last season (a 15-7 win over Prairie View A&M).
 - ▶ Freshman 3B Greg Sherry provided the final damage in the 10-4 rout with his first career home run - a solo shot in the bottom of the sixth inning.
 - ▶ Notre Dame was hurt by their inability to come through with hits with runners in scoring position against Texas A&M CC on March 7. The Irish went 1-for-8 with runners in scoring position and stranded 10 runners on the night.

IRISH NOTES FROM PALM BEACH CHALLENGE —

- ▶ After walking 18 batters in 28.0 innings over their first weekend, the Notre Dame pitching staff walked just 10 over 46.0 innings in the five games at the Palm Beach Challenge. The Irish also struck out 48.
- ▶ Irish freshman RHPs Todd Miller (Boston College) and Cole Johnson (Maine) each fell victim to the long ball in consecutive games. Ironically, each rookie served up a home run on their first career pitch in a Irish uniform.
- ▶ Notre Dame stranded 14 base runners against Maine on March 4, including three in the fourth and then two in each of the fifth, sixth, seventh, eighth and ninth innings. In fact, Notre Dame had the first two batters reach base in every inning from the sixth through the ninth, but ironically did not in the 10th before Sharpley's gamewinning solo blast.
- ▶ The Notre Dame pitching staff struck out 14 against the Mountaineers. The 14 strikeouts were the most for the Irish since they fanned 14 against USF on May 23, 2006.
- ▶ Junior RHP David Phelps tossed 7.0 scoreless innings in the 5-0 victory over Mount St. Mary's on March 1. He struck 10 and walked just one. He now has whiffed 10 or more on four different occasions over his career. Phelps has recorded four separate outings over his career in which he worked at least 7.0 scoreless innings.

NOTRE DAME NOTES FROM CLEARWATER CLASSIC —

- ▶ Notre Dame dropped its season opener for the first time since the 2001 season - snapping its streak at six straight victories.
- ▶ Junior right-handed pitcher David Phelps struggled in his season opening start against Liberty. He lasted just 4.2 innings and surrendered six earned runs on eight hits. The start was the first for Phelps in which he failed to toss at least 5.0 innings since March 22, 2006 against Central Michigan (a span of 16 starts). The six earned runs were the most allowed by Phelps since he yielded six against Seton Hall on May 13, 2006.
- ▶ Senior shortstop Brett Lilley put together quite a game against Iowa. He went 3-for-5 with three runs scored, five RBI, including a go-ahead three-run home run in the eight and gamewinning, two out, two-run single in the bottom of the 10th inning. Lilley became the second player in Notre Dame history to ever record at least five hits, five runs and five RBI in separate games over his career. Matt Macri is the only other Irish player to do so (five hits, five runs scored and six RBI).
- ▶ The Notre Dame pitching staff struggled mightily over its opening weekend. The Irish allowed 26 earned runs and posted a 8.36 earned run average. Notre Dame had not allowed that many earned runs or a higher ERA over an opening weekend since 2003 when they surrendered 34 and registered a 9.56 ERA over four games (Irish went 2-2). Interestingly enough, the '03 Notre Dame team finished the season with a 43-15 record, captured its second straight BIG EAST Tournament Championship and ultimately fell a game shy of the NCAA Super Regionals. The Irish finished the season with a 3.35 ERA (the second-best over the last 14 years).
- ▶ Notre Dame hit .282 (31-for-110) for the weekend - the highest batting average over the opening weekend since 2004 (the Irish hit .310 in two games). Over the last 14 years, only three teams hit for a higher average over the opening weekend.
- ▶ After struggling defensively throughout the 2007 season, the Irish showed they took tremendous strides in that department. Notre Dame committed just two errors last weekend - the fewest over an opening weekend since 2004 when the Irish committed just one in two games. Notre Dame's .982 fielding percentage is the highest since the same '04 season and second-best over the past 14 seasons.
- ▶ A total of 10 Notre Dame freshmen made their respective Irish debuts, including four (OF Golden Tate, 3B Mick Doyle, DH/1B Ty Adams, DH/1B David Casey) that earned starts in the field and Brian Dupra took the mound against Albany. The remaining rookies that played last weekend were INF Greg Sherry, DH/C Matt Scioscia, C Cameron McConnell, RHP Evan Danieli and RHP Ryan Sharpley.

- ▶ Irish ALERT free text-message updates (three per game) are available to your cell phone or other mobile devices ...see link on the right side blue sidebar on the baseball page at und.com.
- ▶ GameTracker live stats are provided for all home games and most road games (based on phone-line availability) ... when Notre Dame is on the road, the home team typically provides the live stats – with bonus GameTracker stats also provided by the Notre Dame SID office for select road games.
- ▶ Complete coverage of each and every Irish home game through live streaming video.

PHELPS COPS TOP PRESEASON HONOR – Notre Dame junior right-handed pitcher David Phelps - one of two Irish pitchers ever to post 100-plus strikeouts and an ERA under 2.00 during the same season - has been named to the 2008 preseason watch list for the Brooks Wallace Award.

Phelps earned first team all-BIG EAST Conference honors in 2007, joining former All-Americans Aaron Heilman (in '99) and Chris Niesel (in '03) as the youngest Notre Dame pitchers ever named to the BIG EAST's top team (each earned the honor as sophomores). Heilman is the only other Notre Dame pitcher ever to reach 100 Ks while also having a sub-2.00 ERA in the same season (111 Ks, 1/74 ERA; as a senior in 2001).

Phelps finished the 2007 season as the league leader in overall ERA (1.87; good for 14th in the nation) and strikeouts (102; sixth in ND history) while ranking third among BIG EAST pitchers with 110.1 innings pitched, seventh in low opponent batting average (.236) and eighth in wins (8-5). He was one of only six pitchers in the nation who entered the 2007 postseason with an ERA under 2.00, eight or more wins and 90-plus strikeouts.

Phelps posted the 11th-best season ERA in the Notre Dame record book and eighth-best of the aluminum-bat era (since the early 1980s). He led the 2007 Irish staff in ERA, wins, strikeouts, innings, starts (15; sixth in the BIG EAST), Ks looking (42) and groundouts (119), also ranking third in low opp. batting avg. He had 15 more innings pitched than hits allowed (96) and finished with the staff's second-best K-to-walk ratio (3.4; 102/30) - while his nine-inning averages included a team-best 7.1 innings per start, 8.3 Ks (2nd on the team) and 2.5 walks (3rd-lowest on the staff), plus 7.8 hits per 9 IP.

The fifth different Notre Dame pitcher ever to reach 100 strikeouts in a season, Phelps reached double-digit strikeouts three times during the 2007 regular season and then had a 9-K game in the BIG EAST Tournament versus Villanova. He totaled five complete games in the 2007 season and is one of only three Notre Dame pitchers to post four or more nine-inning complete games in a season. The only Notre Dame pitchers to total more strikeouts in a season than Phelps are Heilman (118 in '99 and '00; 111 in '01), Jeff Manship (111 in '06) and Tamayo (106 in '01).

SCHOLARLY STANDOUT – In addition to his impressive accomplishments on the field as a three-time all-BIG EAST performer, senior SS Brett Lilley has reached near-perfection in the classroom during his first three years at Notre Dame. The College Sports Information Directors of America recognized Lilley's excellence as a student-athlete by naming him a first team ESPN The Magazine Academic All-American, in recognition of his 3.81 cumulative grade-point average as an accounting major. Lilley – whose older sister Tricia was an Academic All-America shortstop on the 2006 Purdue softball team – quickly returned to campus following the end of Notre Dame's 2007 season, in order to begin taking the first of three summers-school courses that will allow him to graduate one semester early (following the 2007 fall semester). He then intends to enroll in the intensive one-year master's in accountancy program at Notre Dame, with the plan being to start those classes in the 2008 spring semester before concluding sometime later that calendar year (pending a possible stint in pro baseball during the summer of '08).

Lilley has compiled a 3.95 GPA over his past three semesters at Notre Dame, despite taking an overworked load of 21 classes and 60 credit hours in that three-semester span. His stellar run in the classroom began in-season during the 2006 spring semester, as Lilley posted a 4.0 GPA despite taking an 18-credit load. The following fall, he ramped up to 21 credits but still managed to post a 3.95 (with six A grades and a B-plus) before adding a 3.95 in the recently-completed 2007 spring term (again with 21 credits, with all As except for a B-plus in a 1.5-credit course). Lilley's 21 grades over the span of those three semesters includes 19 As and the pair of B-plus marks while his 36 total classes at Notre Dame now have included 25 As, five A-minuses, four B-plus grades, a B and a B-minus. He is the 18th different Notre Dame baseball player to be named an Academic All-American (10th to be on the first team) and in 2008 could become the seventh ever to repeat that honor. Notre Dame baseball players now have combined to earn Academic All-America honors 11 times in the current

decade. Lilley was among the youngest players among the 13 who were named to the elite 2007 first team Academic All-America squad that included eight seniors and five juniors, meaning that he could be a leading candidate for Academic All-American of the Year candidates in 2008. Phelps – who took a 3.36 cumulative GPA into the 2007 spring semester (as a double major in psychology and computer applications) – earlier had joined Lilley in earning first team Academic All-District honors and thus advanced to the Academic All-America ballot, which produced only three sophomores among the 39 final Academic All-Americans.

ACE PRODUCTION – Despite playing a minimal role as a freshman on the 2006 Notre Dame squad, junior RHP David Phelps returned for a sophomore surge in 2007 that saw him emerge as the unquestioned leader of the Irish pitching staff. As college baseball headed into NCAA Tournament play, Phelps held the rare distinction of being one of six pitchers in the nation with an earned-run average under 2.00 (1.88; 10th-best in the nation), eight or more victories (8-5) and 100-plus strikeouts (102). He ended up leading the BIG EAST in ERA and strikeouts while ranking second with 110.1 innings pitched, sixth in wins and seventh in low opponent batting average (.236). Phelps picked up three of Notre Dame's top wins of the 2007 season – versus #12 TCU, #7 Nebraska and at BIG EAST leader Rutgers (in the series opener) – but he easily could have totaled 12 or more victories, if not for poor run support (the Irish averaged just 5.4 runs in his 15 starts) and untimely defensive breakdowns that saw 12 of the runs charged to him be unearned (three of his losses were due to unearned runs). His 1.88 ERA ranks eighth-best among Irish pitchers during the aluminum-bat era (since the early 1980s) while his 102 strikeouts rank sixth on the Notre Dame season record book. Phelps allowed 0-2 earned runs in 11 of his 15 starts during the 2007 season and only once yielded more than three earned runs in a game (4, vs. Pittsburgh). His nine-inning averages included a team-best 7.1 innings per start while he totaled nearly a 3.5 strikeout-to-walk ratio (102/30; 3.4), had 15 more innings pitched than hits allowed (96), averaged nearly a strikeout per inning (8.6 Ks per 9 IP) and became one of just four Irish pitchers in the past 12 seasons to post four or more nine-inning complete games in a season (4, plus one in which he pitched 8.0 innings). He joined the elite company of former All-Americans Aaron Heilman ('in '99) and Chris Niesel ('03) as the only Notre Dame sophomore pitchers ever named first team all-BIG EAST (no Notre Dame freshman pitchers ever have been first-teamers).

ONE-TWO PUNCH – Notre Dame featured one of the top hitting duos in the BIG EAST during the 2007 season, as sophomore OF/3B A.J. Pollock (.372) and senior SS Brett Lilley (.371) were one of only two pairs of BIG EAST teammates to each hit above .370. The Irish duo actually had the same number of hits (73) but Pollock had one fewer at-bat to narrowly finish atop the team batting charts. The BIG EAST recognized 41 total players with all-conference honors in 2007 and Notre Dame – with Lilley and Pollock – was the only team in the conference that featured both of its left-side infielders on the all-BIG EAST teams.

ROOKIE REWARDS – After narrowly edging Lilley atop the 2007 team batting charts, Pollock became just the fourth freshman ever to lead the Notre Dame baseball team in season batting average (he and Lilley are the only ones to do so since the early 1990s). Pollock's impressive all-around season – which earned him Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball magazine – saw him finish with the third-best season batting average ever by a Notre Dame freshman (best since 1994), with that .372 mark ranking fourth best among all of the BIG EAST players in 2007 (behind two senior sluggers and Todd Frazier of Rutgers, the BIG EAST player of the year). Pollock was one of two players in the entire BIG EAST to total 70-plus hits (73), 30-plus walks (32), double-digit stolen bases (11) and 10 or more sacrifice bunts (10) while also finishing first (6) or second (4) on the Irish team in 10 primary statistical categories, including those listed above plus 39 runs scored and 26 multiple-hit games. The right-handed-hitting Pollock also hit a team-best .406 with runners in scoring position and feasted on left-handed pitching in the 2007 season (.509 batting avg.).

BIG CROWDS RETURN – One season after setting numerous attendance records at Eck Stadium, the Notre Dame baseball team again played in front of a steady stream of fans that featured an average of nearly 2,000 per game (1,958). The late-April series with West Virginia attracted a total of 9,011 fans to Eck Stadium, representing the second-highest attendance for a three-game series in the facility's 14-year history. The 3,927 who were on hand for the Saturday afternoon game versus the Mountaineers (on April 21) broke the previous Eck Stadium single-game record – set one year earlier, to the day (3,507 saw the Friday-night game versus Rutgers on April 21, 2006).

CAPE COD COMPANY – Six Notre Dame players competed in the nation's premier wood-bat summer league in 2007, as junior 2B Jeremy Barnes and senior RHP Tony Langford headed off to join the Cape Cod League's Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox while four Irish pitchers – junior RHP David Phelps, junior RHP Kyle Weiland, junior LHP Sam Elam and junior RHP Brett Graffy – were prepping for a summer together as members of the CCL's Falmouth Commodores. Notre Dame consistently has produced multiple players each summer who compete in "The Cape," including a 2005 summer that saw Gaston earn Cape Cod League All-Star honors as a member of the Cotuit Kettleers.

IRISH TO FACE SEVERAL TOP OPPOSING PLAYERS – Seven pitchers from Notre Dame's 2008 opponents are on the NCBWA Stopper of the Year watch list, including the Arizona duo of LHP Daniel Schlereth and Jason Stoffel, Southern Illinois RHP Bryant George, Connecticut LHP Matt Karl, Georgetown RHP Dan Kennedy, St. John's RHP Colin Lynch and South Florida RHP Shawn Sanford ... Notre Dame's 2008 opponents also include 23 players who are on the Wallace Award watch list, among them are eight players from the BIG EAST: Cincinnati OF Tony Campana, Connecticut INF Matt Karl, Louisville DH Chris Dominguez, RHP Justin Marks, RHP Zack Pitts, South Florida RHP Shawn Sanford, St. John's OF Brian Kemp and RHP Colin Lynch ... others include the Arizona duo of P Preston Guilmet and OF Jon Gaston, Boston College's trio of 3B Eric Campbell, P Terry Doyle and C Tony Sanchez, Central Michigan C Tyler Stovall, IPFW OF Jared Davis, Michigan's duo of P/1B Zach Putnam and OF Derek VanBuskirk, Purdue's P Matt Bischoff and OF Ryne White, Southern Illinois' trio of P Cody Adams, P Bryant George and C Mark Kelly and Western Michigan P Ethan Hollingsworth ... six players from ND opponents also were named 2008 preseason All-Americans by either *Baseball America* or the National Collegiate Baseball Writers, including Putnam, Arizona's quartet of Ryan Perry, T.J. Steeler, Guilmet and C.J. Ziegler, as well as Zack Pitts of Louisville.

FRESHMAN FORCE – Notre Dame's 2008 opening-day lineup included three seniors, two juniors, two sophomores and two freshmen. It marked the second straight season the Irish featured at least two freshmen in the starting nine. Notre Dame had three freshmen in the starting lineup in last year's season opener (just the third time in the past 13 seasons that Notre Dame featured three or more freshman starters:

SUPER SHORSTOPS – Notre Dame's baseball tradition spans nearly 120 seasons but the shortstop role was not well-represented by elite

players, until an impressive run of talent at the position during the past 20 years. Early 1900s player Bobby Lynch and heavy-hitting 1964 All-American Rich Gonski were possibly the most noteworthy shortstops in the first 85 years of the program, followed in the late 1970s by Rick Pullano before an impressive 20-year span that has produced the likes of Tommy Shields, Pat Pesavento, Craig Counsell, Paul Failla, Brant Ust, Alec Porzel, Matt Macri and Greg Lopez at the shortstop position. Senior Brett Lilley has carried the torch each of the last two seasons. Lilley has started 193 games over his career, including 73 straight over the last two seasons at shortstop. He is a career .345 hitter with 168 runs scored, 233 hits and 90 RBI. Lilley has a remarkable .483 career on-base percentage over his career.

NATIONAL FLAVOR — As is usually the case, the Notre Dame baseball roster is made up from players across the United States. This year, however, it's even more apparent as 39 of the 43 players on the roster are from outside the state of Indiana. In fact, 18 different states, including Indiana, are represented. The only Indiana natives on the team are Ty Adams (Indianapolis/Brebeuf Jesuit H.S.), Sean Gaston (Brownsburg/Brownsburg H.S.), Justin Gingrich (Goshen/Northridge H.S.) and Andrew Wiand (South Bend/Riley H.S.).

IRISH PICKED FIFTH BY BIG EAST COACHES — The University of Notre Dame baseball team was picked to finish fifth in the 2008 BIG EAST preseason baseball poll as determined by a vote of the league's 12 head coaches, who were not permitted to vote for their own teams. The Irish received a total of 80 points.
